## Union Minister for Education meets Kachin State basic education personnel

UNION Minister for Education Dr. Myo Thein Gyi together with Kachin State Minister for Social Affairs U Nay Win and Department of Technical and Vocational Education and Training Deputy Director General Dr. Nay Myo Tun met with Kachin State basic education personnel at Kachin State Putao District head of administration office hall on 18 March.

In his opening address the Union Minister said the ministry was striving towards all school-age children to attend school and prioritizing education development in regions where transportation was difficult. Education personnel were urged to cooperate with relevant government organisations toward all school-age children to attend school, remain in school,

continue education and teach the students patiently. Students who had completed Grade-3 must be able to read and write Myanmar language and conduct mathematical calculation. The teaching method must encourage a discerning mind as well as instill a desire for continuous learning. School development funds were to be used together with parents-teachers association

transparently and effectively according to financial and auditing procedures. Township Education heads must carefully study and fulfill the requirements of the schools and difficulties faced by the teachers. In-school sports competitions, maintaining and developing ethnic literature and culture need to be conducted more while libraries were to be supported. Teachers play an im-

portant role in raising the education quality. Only qualified teachers were to be employed under a fair and competitive system. The ministry was also ensuring the full provision of salary, daily and travel allowances for teachers, provision of text books and teaching aids in a timely manner and conducting summer training courses for teachers to start using new text books in Grade-3 and Grade-6 said the Union Minister.

Next Kachin State Minister for Social Affairs U Nay Win discussed about education status in far and remote Khaunglanphu region and fulfilling requirements in education.

The Union Minister then responded to questions raised by teachers and coordinated on the discussions made.

Afterwards the Union Minister handed over text books to Khaunglanphu Township Education Head. The meeting was attended by Kachin State, district/township education heads, schoolmaster/mistress, teachers and relevant officials.—MNA ■

Since the establishment of diplomatic relations between Myanmar and Thailand on 24 August 1948, the two countries had maintained and valued friendship, good neighborliness and mutual understanding. Last year the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of establishing diplomatic relations was held and had upgraded the bilateral relations to Natural Strategic Partnership level. Great emphasis had been placed on bilateral relations and Myanmar has always been ready to work together with Thailand to increase the benefits to the peoples of the two countries, said the State Counsellor.

The State Counsellor then took the opportunity to share on how Myanmar-Thai Friendship Bridge 2 came into existence. The bridge spans the Moei/Thaungyin River and connects Myawady Township on the Myanmar side with Mae Sot District, Tak Province on the Thai side.

A joint inspection was conducted in May 2012, stake driving ceremony was held in August 2015 and the bridge came into existence after four years of joint efforts and the people of the two countries would greatly benefit from the bridge.

The friendship bridge not only connected the two coun-

tries physically but also increased the connection and relations between the peoples of the two countries.

The bridge was believed to become a major link that connects Southeast Asian countries over the Greater Mekong Sub-Region economic corridor. The bridge would also ease traffic congestion on the Myanmar-Thai Friendship Bridge 1 and allow free movement of goods and people between the two countries.

Due to the construction of the bridge, bilateral trade, investment, travel, cultural exchange, transport, relations between people and regional trade would increase and expand cooperation. It would be a friendship bridge that created wellbeing and development of countries in the region.

It was heartening to see bilateral relations and cooperation develop in an increasing momentum in the past few years. It was also a joy to note that mutual cooperation was not only among governmental organizations but also among the private sector and peoples of the two countries.

The State Counsellor reiterated that Myanmar would cooperate with Thailand not only for peace, stability and development in the region but also in the world too.

Thailand's efforts and sincerity to deepen and bring closer the bilateral friendship and cooperation that had existed for long was appreciated and recognized and prayed that this might increase many folds, said the State Counsellor.

Afterwards the Thai Prime Minister spoke of his happiness on the completion of the bridge and hoped that the bridge would bring many benefits to the peoples of the two countries.

After delivering the speeches, State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi and Thai Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha un-

veiled a plaque commemorating the successful completion of the Myanmar-Thai Friendship Bridge 2 by pressing a button.

## State Counsellor, Kayin State Govt hold meeting

Later in the afternoon, she attended the opening ceremonies of the 55.34 miles long 230 KV Mawlamyine-Myawady transmission line and the 230/66/11 KV 11 MVA Myawady primary sub-station.

At these ceremonies, she said that ever since the begin-

ning of this government's term road communication and electricity were designated as priority matters. Having electricity did not mean having some light once the sun sets. The aim was to develop the livelihood of the people with the use of electricity.

Earlier this morning in Myawady, the Myanmar-Thai Friendship Bridge was opened and was aimed at friendship between the two countries. It was to raise the development of our people's livelihood through increasing friendship and cooperation between the two countries. Whatever we did, the main aims were for the development of the livelihood of our people. Progress and development meant changing things according to the time and era.

Our priority was to provide road communications and electricity that the people needed.

The Union Government, Hluttaw and State government participated in the day's ceremonies. This was an indication of our country's federalism and democracy. Requirement for electricity was high in Myanmar. The expectation was for Ministry of Electricity and Energy to fulfill 50 per cent of the country's electricity requirement before the end of this year. It was our strong belief that this would be done. Through this power line and power station more than 90,000 households would have electricity in Kayin State. This showed progress. Progress must be everywhere and efforts were being made towards improving road communication and electricity in the entire country, the 7 states and 7 regions.

As she came here, she noticed that road communication had improved very much. The roads were straight and were very convenient to travel. The

# AA attacks military convoy, MraukU district police office

AA GROUP on Monday attacked a convoy carrying military personnel conducting security operations in MraukU Township, and the MraukU district police office, according to the Myanmar

Police Force.

AA members positioned themselves inside civilian homes and opened fire at the military convoy at the entrance of MraukU at 7:35 p.m. on 18 March. The

gunfight lasted about 30 minutes. The security forces also retaliated to the firing, said police.

In a separate incident, security forces and AA members reportedly clashed after AA

members entered homes in Htamariz Ward in MraukU Township and launched an attack on the district police office, using small arms and RPGs.

In a bid to disrupt stability in MraukU Township, which is home to ethnic Rakhine people,

the AA has been using ancient pagodas and houses to carry out destructive acts intentionally, according to the Myanmar Police Force.—MNA ■

3. Out of the information sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, so far a total of 560 cases have been opened files as of 16-3-2019. A total of 888 people, including 746 men and 142 women had been arrested with seizures of 5838.98 g of heroin, 72.14 g of ICE, 38699.74 g of opium, 329.6 g of low-quality opium, 18800.28 g of speciosa powder, 7363.99 g of speciosa, 1.5 liters of opium tincture, 223239 stimulant tablets, 6414.22 g of marijuana, 0.1 liter of opium tincture, 513.26 g of opium block, 60 g of poppy seeds, 3.45 g of crushed ecstasy powder, 0.001 g of Ecstasy, 16 firearms, 257 cartridges and one grenade. Efforts for fighting the drug trafficking have been stepped up and the ministry will report on furthered exposed cases.

4. In addition to the investigations and arrests conducted on drug related complaints mentioned above, the Tatmadaw and Myanmar Police Force have also carried out separate investigations on drug complaints, search and arrests at border gates, and searches of vehicles acting upon given information.

# Tabaung, The Beauty Queen Month of Myanmar Lunar Calendar

**T**ABAUNG Corresponding to March is the Beauty Queen Month of the twelve months in Myanmar Lunar Calendar. The twelve months are divided equally into three seasons, namely Summer [Geinman] Tabaung, Tagu, Kasone and Nayon [March, April, May and June respectively]. Raining Season or Monsoon [Wasan] Waso, Wakhaung, Tawthalin and Thidinkyut [July, August, September and October respectively]. Winter [Heiman] Tazaungmon, Nattaw, Pyatho, Tabodwe [November, December, January and February respectively].

Tabaung is a transition month from winter to summer. So it bears a dual characteristics of cold season and warm season. In daytime Tabaung is warm but at night it is cold. Hence Myanmar saying goes. "နေပူလို့ ညချမ်းတပေါင်းလ၊ လသာရမ်း"

Day time Tabaung is warm Night time it's cold So unruly it runs.

Tabaung is the spring time in Myanmar. The entire comes out of its hiding in winter. As the old life passes away, the new life comes at the heel. Withered fallen leaves are blown away by breeze and wind. Tender yellow green leave buds peep out on the branches with flower buds or fruit buds. Especially colourful blooms of let pan [cotton tree] Pauk, Ngu, Padauk, Sein ban and Sein ban pyar [Jacaranda] paint the environment with red, scarlet, pink, orange, gold yellow, light blue colours, emitting faint fragrance. Under the bright blue sky in the warm sunshine, their beauties are beyond description of writer, poet or composer.

In Myanmar literature Tabaung enjoys pride of place and priority in prose poem and drama of all Myanmar historic periods till today. The word Tabaung itself carries its literal and figurative meanings. Ta means "yearning" "reminiscence"

Forests-landscapes, sky scapes and waterscapes were painted in poetic language inducing Lord Gotama Buddha to return to his father's kingdom by land journey through the forests of the Hymalan mountain Ranges.

His famous 64 Pali poems became the model in Myanmar literature. To cite but one outstanding example is the Tawla poem of monk Shin Ottamakyaw of Inwa Period of Myanmar Literature. In addition to the skillful composition

The sight of bullock carts travelling in a row attract photographers from other regions and states. Photographers usually come to the pagoda festival to capture the cultural traditions on display. ## Five wildlife sanctuaries to set up in Sagaing Region

"Reserved forests and the protected areas are the existing natural habitats. We do our utmost to conserve the forests in the most effective manner. It means that there will be no more timber extraction when the forests become the natural habitats.

The trees are not felled anymore; even the state owned Myanmar Timber Enterprise has suspended all sorts of extraction of timber. Authorities has restricted all the the entrepreneurs from timber extraction," he added.

## CMP garment exports fetch nearly \$2 bln in Oct-Mar

EXPORTS of garments manufactured under the cut-make-pack (CMP) system reached nearly US\$2 billion in the period from 1 October to 1 March in the current fiscal year, an increase of \$880 million from the same period in the 2017-2018FY, according to data from the Ministry of Commerce.

Myanmar's manufacturing sector is largely concentrated in CMP garments and textiles, which contribute to the country's GDP to some extent.

The garment sector is among the prioritized sectors driving up exports. The CMP garment industry has emerged as a promising one, with preferential trade from Western countries. The majority of Myanmar's garment factories operate under the CMP system, and those engaged in this industry are striving to transform CMP into the free-on-board (FoB) system, according to the Myanmar Garment Manufac-

turers Association.

The export value of CMP garments was only \$850 million in the 2015-2016 fiscal year, but it has tripled over the last two FYs. In the 2016-2017FY, about \$2 billion was earned from exports of CMP garments. The figure increased to an estimated \$2.5 billion in the 2017-2018FY and \$2.2 billion in the last mini-budget period (from April to September, 2018), according to the Commerce Ministry.

Myanmar mainly exports CMP garments to markets in Japan and Europe, along with the Republic of Korea, China, and the US. With demand from foreign trade partners growing, imports of CMP raw materials are rising year by year. There are more than 400 garment factories in Myanmar. Myanmar's cheap labor attracts investments from foreign manufacturers to the country. — Ko Khant

## Annual inflation rate registers a rise in Feb, climbs to 7%

THE annual rate of inflation in Myanmar, based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), reached 7.07 per cent in February, up from 6.94 per cent in January, according to a report released recently by the Central Statistical Organization (CSO), under the Ministry of Planning and Finance.

For the period between March, 2018 and February, 2019, the average inflation rate in March indicated the lowest level of 4.03 per cent, while the rate in February is the highest recorded this year.

In the last 12 months, the year-on-year inflation rate was the highest in October at 8.85 per cent. The year-on-year inflation rate in February was registered at 6.69 per cent, while core inflation, which strips out volatile

food and energy prices, was 6.33 per cent.

In February, Mandalay City recorded the highest inflation rate at 10.72 per cent, followed by Magway Region at 10.64 per cent, and Rakhine State at 10.05 per cent. The year-on-year inflation rate fluctuated with a maximum rate of 11.89 per cent in Magway Region and a minimum rate of 1.4 per cent in Kachin State.

Last month, there was a remarkable increase in CPI in the food group, non-food group, household goods and maintenance group, transportation group, other commodities group, clothing, health, education services, recreation and culture, except telecommunications, tobacco and beverages group, and housing group.

In February, the Kyat

strengthened against the US dollar compared with January. But, transportation costs also rose due to soaring fuel oil prices, thereby hiking up commodity prices.

Earlier, the inflation rate was calculated based on a 2006 survey. The base year was later changed to 2012. The Central Statistical Organization conducted a Household Income and Expenditure Survey in 82 townships in November, 2012. To reduce the inflation rate, the concerned authorities have been making efforts on the basis of policies on finance, currency, trade, and foreign currency control, in keeping with the second five-year National Development plan. — Htet Myat

# UN patent data shows Asia innovation surge

GENEVA (Switzerland) — More than half of all international patent applications filed last year came from Asia, a further sign of innovation shifting “from west to east,” the United Nations said Tuesday.

In the latest annual breakdown of patent filings released by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), the United States remained the leading individual country for applications in 2018.

But on a regional basis, Asia’s surge continued.

“Asia is now the majority filer of international patent applications via WIPO, which is an important milestone for that economically dynamic region and underscores the historical geographical shift of innovative activity from west to east,” the agency’s director general Fran-

cis Gurry said in a statement.

WIPO’s complex system of registering international patents involves multiple categories.

In the main category -- the Patent Cooperation Treaty -- the US led the way with 56,142 applications, followed by China (53,345) and Japan (49,702).

Germany and South Korea came in a distant fourth and fifth, with fewer than 20,000 applications each.

India registered the largest innovation jump of any country last year. Patent applications jumped more than 27 percent — from 1,583 in 2017 up to 2,013.

Chinese telecommunications behemoth Huawei also set new record for the number of patent applications filed a single corporation in one year with 5,405.—AFP ■

## Germany launches 5G auction amid row with US over Huawei

BERLIN (Germany) — Germany launched its auction Tuesday for the construction of an ultra-fast 5G mobile network as a transatlantic dispute rages over security concerns surrounding giant Chinese telecoms equipment maker Huawei.

The United States has warned it could scale back the sharing of sensitive information with Berlin if it does not exclude hardware made by Huawei from the infrastructure, arguing that Chinese equipment could help Beijing spy on Western companies and governments.

On Tuesday, Angela Merkel ruled out blocking Huawei from Germany’s 5G network, but said stringent telecommunications laws will be drafted.

“So far, lots of countries have

used Huawei technology,” said Germany’s chancellor at a conference in Berlin. “That’s why the federal government has not taken the approach of simply ruling out any contractor or stakeholder, but we have set standards for those bidding for 5G technology.

“We will also write these standards legally into our telecommunications laws... We will give everyone a chance, but shouldn’t be naive, instead we see that there are very different laws in China.”

‘5G’ — ‘fifth generation’ — is the latest, high-speed generation of cellular mobile communications and Berlin will require winning bidders to offer the service to at least 98 percent of German households and along motorways and rail lines.—AFP ■

## UK supermarkets pledge price cuts amid merger doubts

LONDON (United Kingdom) — British supermarket giant Sainsbury’s and Walmart-owned Asda on Tuesday vowed to slash prices to overcome regulatory concerns and secure a blockbuster merger.

The Competition and Markets Authority watchdog last month warned that the planned merger raised “extensive competition concerns” and could spark higher prices and less choice.

The warning, contained in early findings of the CMA’s in-depth probe, has sparked heavy criticism from the two supermarket firms, particularly over

the level of competition in the sector. “Sainsbury’s and Asda strongly disagree with the CMA’s provisional findings,” the pair said in a statement on Tuesday, adding that the regulator’s initial verdict contained “significant” economic and legal errors.

“The two businesses are proposing to merge so that they can lower prices for customers in an increasingly competitive market, while improving quality and service.” They vowed “to deliver £1.0 billion of lower prices annually by the third year post-completion”, in a move that they said would lower consumer prices by ten percent on every-

day items. The price-slashing investment will be funded by an estimated £1.6 billion in cost savings.

Sainsbury’s and Asda, the nation’s second and third biggest supermarket chains respectively, unveiled merger plans in April 2018 to create a retail king that would leapfrog UK number one Tesco. Long-established UK retailers are battling sliding consumer sentiment and Brexit uncertainty alongside a broader economic slowdown. They also face fierce competition from online US titan Amazon — as well as German-owned discounters Aldi and Lidl.—AFP ■

## UK unemployment rate hits 44-year low: official data

LONDON (United Kingdom) — The British unemployment rate has struck a 44-year low, official data showed Tuesday, despite a broader economic slowdown as Brexit looms.

The jobless rate — or proportion of the workforce that is unemployed — hit 3.9 percent in the three months to the end of January, the lowest level since 1975, the Office for National Statistics said.

That followed 4.0 percent in the three months to December, the ONS added in a statement, while expectations had been for no change.

The total number of unemployed people slid by 35,000 to 1.34 million in the year to January, which was 112,000 lower than a year ago.

Economists said the labour market update painted a bright picture, despite a slowing economy with Britain scheduled to leave the European Union next week. “A much stronger labour market report than expected — and particularly impressive given recent slower UK economic activity, heightened Brexit uncertainties and a weaker global economy,” said EY economist Howard Archer.

“The latest strong jobs data is somewhat surprising as some surveys had indicated that a growing number of employers are now adopting a ‘wait-and-see’ approach on employment given the current heightened uncertainties.”

The ONS added that wage growth continued to outpace inflation. Average earnings including bonuses increased by 3.4 percent in the year to January from a year earlier.

That handed another boost to the purchasing power of workers’ salaries.—AFP ■

## Japan Olympic chief facing corruption probe to step down

TOKYO (Japan) — The head of Japan's Olympic Committee said Tuesday he would step down in June, as French authorities probe his involvement in payments made before Tokyo was awarded the 2020 Summer Games.

"Considering the future of the JOC, I think the most appropriate thing is to leave things to a new leader from the next generation so that they can host the Olympics and carve a new era," Tsunekazu Takeda told a meeting of the Japanese Olympic Committee (JOC) in Tokyo.

He said his decision had "nothing to do with the investigation". The 71-year-old said he would also be stepping down from the International Olympic Committee. Takeda has come under pressure not to seek an additional term when his current mandate ends in June after it was revealed that French authorities believe they have evidence of corruption in the awarding of the 2020 Games to Tokyo. Current JOC rules require candidates for the top post to be 70 or younger at the time of their candidacy, but there had been rumours the committee was considering a change to allow Takeda to stay on through 2020.

In recent months however, the investigation into Takeda has become an unwelcome distraction for organisers of the Games, with less than 500 days until the opening ceremony.

Takeda said: "I really feel sorry for causing this sensation, but I think I'm responsible for fulfilling my chairmanship until my term ends."

Takeda has denied any in-

volvement in corruption and again protested his innocence on Tuesday. "As I have said, I did not do anything wrong. I will continue to make an effort to prove my innocence," he told journalists.

### 'a judicial process in France'

In January, it was revealed that Takeda was facing a judicial process in France over two payments totalling 2.8 million Singapore dollars (US\$2.1 million at today's exchange rate). He has been placed "mis en examen", a legal step that roughly translates as being charged. It does not automatically trigger a trial but means that prosecutors believe there is strong or corroborated evidence of wrongdoing. Takeda has said he was "never involved in any decision-making process" over the payments and that the money was legitimate reimbursement for "a consultancy contract signed through appropriate approval procedures."

The French investigation, launched in 2016, centres around two payments made to Singapore-based firm "Black Tidings", a firm linked to Papa Massata Diack. Diack is the son of the former head of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), Lamine Diack, and is also embroiled in a bribery scandal. He is suspected of having received several million euros in bribes, either for sponsorship contracts or to favour the Rio de Janeiro and Tokyo Olympic bids.

He has been on Interpol's most-wanted list since 2015, but the Senegalese government has refused to extradite him to France despite pleas from IOC chief Thomas Bach.—AFP ■

## China's Xi to visit Europe amid disquiet over Silk Road, Huawei

BEIJING (China) — Chinese President Xi Jinping heads to Europe on Thursday as the continent is divided over his cherished Belt and Road trade infrastructure project and under US pressure to shun telecom giant Huawei.

Xi will start his trip in Italy before heading to Monaco — the first visit by a Chinese president to the posh principality — and cap his five-day journey in France.

His visit comes a week after the European Union released a 10-point plan outlining a shift to more assertive relations with Beijing, warning that China was a "rival" to the bloc as well as its biggest trading partner.

But Xi is expected to secure a non-binding agreement for Italy to join the \$1 trillion Belt and Road Initiative.

China has financed maritime, rail and road projects in Asia, Africa and Europe through BRI, but critics warn that it mainly benefits Chinese firms while setting up a "debt trap" in finan-

cially vulnerable countries.

Italy's would be the first G7 nation to join the ambitious venture, raising eyebrows among Western allies. EU members Greece and Poland have also embraced the "New Silk Road" but others in the bloc fear it could lead to growing Chinese government influence on the continent.

A White House official, Garrett Marquis, last week tweeted that there was "no need" for Italy to endorse "China's infrastructure vanity project".

French President Emmanuel Macron said EU countries should have a "coordinated approach" to Beijing and urged for cooperation based on the "spirit of equality (and) reciprocity".

But Italian Prime Minister Giuseppe Conte, who will meet Xi, dismissed the concerns, saying there were no risks.

"For us, collaborating with China on Belt and Road is a choice of a purely economic or commercial nature, perfectly compatible with our position in

the Atlantic alliance and in the EU," Conte told Corriere della Sera newspaper.

A draft of the non-binding memorandum of understanding published in Italian media reveals broad undertakings for cooperation in logistics, infrastructure investment, financial and environmental sectors.

Beijing has been eyeing investment in the Italian ports of Trieste and Genoa that offer easy access to Europe's markets, Giuliano Noci, a China expert at Milan Polytechnic business school, told AFP.

He said any deal should ensure that the "ports remain Italian" warning Rome must avoid the model of the Greek port of Piraeus, which was taken over by Chinese shipping giant Cosco in 2016. Xu Tiebing, professor of international relations at Communication University of China, said Italy has maintained a supportive attitude towards Beijing despite "some pressure from the United States".—AFP ■

## Dutch police arrest suspect after three shot dead on tram

UTRECHT (Netherlands) — Dutch police on Monday arrested a Turkish-born suspect over a shooting on a tram in Utrecht that left three people dead in what officials said was a possible terror attack.

Police had earlier launched a huge manhunt for Gokmen Tanis, 37, issuing a picture of the suspected gunman and warning the public not to approach him following the attack, in which five other people were wounded.

Mosques and schools were closed across the Netherlands' fourth-largest city following the bloodshed, before heavily armed officers surrounded a building and arrested him.

Dutch authorities said they were still investigating a likely terrorist motive for the shooting but Prime Minister Mark Rutte said they "cannot exclude" other motives, including a family dispute.

"We have just heard that the suspect we are looking for has been arrested," Utrecht police chief Rob van Bree told a dramatic press conference seconds after being handed a piece of

paper with news of the arrest.

The city's mayor Jan van Zanen told the same news conference it was a "black day for Utrecht", while prosecution officer Rutger Jeurken said that "it looks like what we are dealing with is a terrorist motive".

### 'Questions and rumours'

The drama began when gunfire broke out on a tram near the 24 Oktoberplein square, sending people fleeing from the tram and triggering a huge police response. One witness told broadcaster NOS they saw an injured woman running out of

the tram with blood on her hands and clothes who then fell to the ground. "I brought her into my car and helped her. When the police arrived, she was unconscious," the witness, who was not named, told the broadcaster.

A body covered in a white sheet could later be seen lying on the tram tracks. Police then launched a massive manhunt during which the suspected gunman is believed to have carjacked a Renault Clio before being arrested about seven hours later, around three kilometres (two miles) from the attack site.—AFP ■

## Ryan Giggs determined to win over Wales doubters

LONDON (United Kingdom) — Ryan Giggs is determined to win over his doubters and believes that the 2020 European Championship campaign will define his time as Wales manager.

Wales start their Euro 2020 qualifiers at home to Slovakia on Sunday, with the jury still out on Giggs's 14 months in charge since he succeeded Chris Coleman.

Giggs has a record of three wins, one draw and five defeats from his nine games in charge.

But the former Manchester United star has fast-tracked an exciting group of young players into the senior set-up, and the 4-1 demolition of Ireland in the Nations League last September saw Wales produce some scintil-

lating football.

Wales eventually finished second in their Nations League group behind Denmark and Giggs said: "I put myself under pressure last year so whether it's a honeymoon period or not, I'm not too sure. "I put myself under pressure.

That's the only pressure I feel really. "I think I will be judged on the qualifying games, I knew that going into the job. Getting Wales to a major championships, that's how I will be judged." Coleman guided Wales to the semi-finals of Euro 2016, the country's first appearance at a major tournament for 58 years but his six-year stay came to an end after Wales failed to qualify

for the 2018 World Cup in Russia. "People do expect (qualification), understandably because of what we achieved at Euro 2016," said Giggs ahead of Wednesday's pre-Slovakia friendly with Trinidad and Tobago in Wrexham. "But it's been once in 60 years, so we don't qualify on a regular basis. That's what my job is now, to qualify or at least compete. We didn't qualify for the World Cup, but we competed.

"In the past we nearly got somewhere and in the next campaign we were nowhere near. We want to be competing or getting close on a consistent basis. If we do that then we will get to more championships than not." Giggs's commitment, or the perceived

lack of it, has attracted criticism from some quarters in Wales given his ambassadorial, business and consultancy interests around the world. The 45-year-old is involved with a football academy in Vietnam and is also an ambassador for the Champions League,

as well as holding various commercial interests. "My primary job is to get Wales to a European Championship," he said. "I have other commitments, but I take the job of managing Wales very seriously and I'm 100 per cent committed," he added.—AFP ■

## Sanchez wants to bring 'joy' to Manchester United fans

LONDON (United Kingdom) — Manchester United forward Alexis Sanchez is determined to succeed at the club and says he still believes in himself despite a disappointing first year at Old Trafford.

The Chile international, who is likely to be sidelined for another month with a knee injury, has

endured a frustrating time since his move from Arsenal in January 2018. He has managed just five goals in 41 appearances for the club, with only two in 23 in this current injury-troubled season.

But with the team's fortunes transformed since caretaker manager Ole Gunnar Solskjaer replaced the sacked Jose Mour-

inho in December, Sanchez is looking towards a better future.

"I want to keep showing my love for football. I know what I can do. I have belief in my ability," he told Inside United magazine.

"United are such an important club, not only in England but on a global level, and I would love to help bring a trophy to the supporters."

"Obviously, I want to make the United fans really happy," the 30-year-old added. "I want to score goals. I want to bring them joy. I want to win silverware.

"When we lost last year's FA Cup final to Chelsea, I was not happy. Not happy at all. In fact, I was sad because I just wanted to make our wonderful supporters happy.

I saw the fans who had come to pack out Wembley Stadium. They were all around me — all red. I liked it. Wembley was all red."—AFP ■

## Spain midfielder Ruiz ruled out with flu for Euro qualifiers

MADRID (Spain) — Spain midfielder Fabian Ruiz has been hospitalised with flu and will miss the team's Euro 2020 match against Norway on Saturday.

The Napoli player was suffering from a fever and left

team-training Monday for treatment for flu symptoms, the Spain squad said in a statement.

"If his condition improves he could leave the hospital sometime Tuesday and return to Napoli" for further treatment and convales-

cence at home, the statement added. Spain coach Luis Enrique has called Saul Niguez of Atletico Madrid into the squad to replace Ruiz ahead of the Norway game in Valencia and the Malta match on March 26 in Ta' Qali.—AFP ■

## Austrian ski star Hirscher still undecided on retirement

VIENNA (Austria) — Austrian ski legend Marcel Hirscher said on Tuesday that he would decide "relatively soon" if he would retire or call it quits after winning a record eighth consecutive overall crystal globe this season.

Hirscher said he felt "very, very tired" at the season's end and wanted to see how quickly he would recover.

"I'm now 10 years in the World Cup circus. I want to see how I feel going into summer and if it's physically and mentally possible to have another such (strong) season."

"I surely notice that I'm 30. I'm not 18 anymore... I want to race for the big globe. For that one really needs 100 percent" of physical and mental stamina, he said in a press conference in Vienna. Austria's slalom sensation finished outside the top 10 in the men's World Cup season finale having already secured the discipline's small globe.

The performance at the end of his strong season reminded him it is not a given to win every race, he said Tuesday.

He said he stood currently at "49-51", but declined to say if he leaned toward retiring or staying on. Hirscher now has two more overall World Cup wins than the second most successful skier in history, another Austrian Annemarie Moser-Proell, who

won six large globes. The most successful man had been Marc Girardelli of Luxembourg, with five. American Lindsey Vonn and Austrian Hermann Maier both won four. Earlier this year, Vonn marked her retirement at age 34, following Norwegian skiing legend and her close friend, Aksel Lund Svindal, 36, who skied his last race in February.

Hirscher has often talked of retirement over the last year, previously saying he wanted to spend more time with his family. His wife gave birth to a son last October. So far, Hirscher has celebrated 67 World Cup victories — falling short of the record of 86 set by Sweden's Ingemar Stenmark — out of a total of 138 World Cup podiums. He has also won two gold medals at the 2018 Pyeongchang Winter Olympics, eclipsing his previous best, a slalom silver from Sochi four years earlier.

Hirscher, who has also secured seven world championship golds, is feted in Austria as one of the country's favourite sporting sons. He was born in Annaberg with his family spending summer seasons in an alpine hut in the mountains around the city of Salzburg, according to a media interview with his father. He started to ski at the age of two taught by his father, who has been by his side and coached him throughout his career.—AFP ■
