Ayeyawady River stops 25 cm above danger mark, water likely to recede today

THE level of water in the ▲ Ayeyawady River, which crossed the danger mark on 21 July in Mandalay, is expected to recede over the next few days, according to the upper Myanmar weather bureau.

"The river stopped rising on Sunday. We forecast the water level will recede about 2 centimetres on 22 July. It will fall below the danger mark after 24 July,"

said U Kyaw Lwin Oo, the Director of the Upper Myanmar Meteorological and Hydrological Department.

On Saturday, the water reached 1,285 cm, 25 cm above the danger mark, but the level remained unchanged the rest of the day.

had reached a record 1,382 cm in 2004.

"The embankment in Mandalay is safe until the river water reaches 50 cm above the danger mark. But, areas where the embankment is lower, especially in Amarapura Township, should be on alert for floods," U Kyaw Lwin Oo added.

The current water level does The water level in the river not pose a threat to residents as the embankment is higher than in 2004, he said.

The Mandalay City Development Committee has collected over 30,000 sand bags as part of preparedness for possible flood-

Swollen Ayeyawady forces five schools to close in Myinmu

With the water from the Ayeyawady River entering low-lying areas in Myinmu, Sagaing District, five schools have been closed as of 21 July.

The authorities are making arrangements to help ensure that the studies of more than 840 school children from the five schools are not disrupted.

Yesterday, the water level in the river had reached 1,146 cm, 4 cm below the danger mark.— Khaing Sat Wai/ Aung Soe Pe (Myinmu) (Translated by KZL)

Cash for rice, supplies provided to flood victims in Katha

AID including cash for rice, rescue equipment and utensils were distributed to flood victims in Katha yesterday.

Sagaing Regional Department of Disaster Management, Staff Officer's Office and Township General Administrative Department went in the field and handed over money for rice and rescues equipment to people in flooded area, villages in upper Ayeyarwady River.

In Katha, the Ayeyarwady River crossed its danger mark and reached 1088cm. Tone Ye, Late Tone, Painnal Chaung, Thet Kal Kyin villagers in low-lying area were flooded.

Officials from the Department of Disaster Management distributed the family kits and cash for rice to 800 people from 17 households who have not sifted to temporary shelters.

Speaker of Magway Region Hluttaw U Than, Regional Hluttaw Representative, U Nyi Nyi Tun, Director of Regional Department of Disaster Man-

agement, U Sa Willy Frank also toured the flood-hit areas and met with flood victims and gave necessary suggestion. On 17 July, officials disbursed cash and relief supplies to flood victims from villages located along the Ayeyarwady River in Katha Township.

With the high level of water in the Ayeyarwady River in July, a total of 2,468 villagers in Katha Township were shifted to relief camps for shelter. —Naing Lin Htet (Translated by Alphonsus)

Bank erosion destroys five houses in MraukU Township

FIVE houses in three villages collapsed due to bank erosion that was triggered by the swollen Laymyo River during the downpour that lasted from 8 to 14 July in MraukU Township, MraukU District, Rakhine State.

Officials of the Disaster Management Department of the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement presented financial and material assistance to the families of the collapsed homes on 20 July at a ceremony held at its office in MraukU.

Officials presented rice, Ks 56,700 and 15 kinds of relief items, and Ks 500,000, Ks 100,000 for rebuilding each collapsed house, to the 27 persons of five households of Thahtaygon, Akyitawma and Konchaung villages.—District IPRD (Translated by TMT)

AA group fires two rockets at three navy boats near Yathedaung

AA group fired two rockets at three navy boats anchored near Mayu River bank west of Yathedaung on 20 July morning. There was no casualty or damage, according to the Office of the Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services.

The three boats of the Tatmadaw (Navy) were anchored near Mayu River bank about 3,000 metres west of Yathedaung to conduct emergency rescue and aid operations in case any passenger vessel running along the coast in the My-

anmar waters in Rakhine State faced mechanical breakdown or any natural disaster hits the area. When the AA group launched the attack, the navy boats returned the fire. There was no casualty or damage. When the place where

the attacked was launched was combed three 107mm Type 63 shells, already connected to battery through the wires were found, and were defused.

AA group also attacked a tugboat, anchored near the mouth of

Hsantyoe creek east of Sittway with three similar rockets on 22 June, according to the news report released by the Office of the Commander-in-Chief of Defence Services.—MNA (*Translated by TMT*)

Trade deficit narrows sharply to \$1.2 bln as exports spike, imports plummet

A plunge in imports coupled with a spike in exports over the last nine months of the current fiscal year has helped trimmed Myanmar's trade deficit to US\$1.2 billion from \$3.14 billion in the corresponding period of the 2017-2018FY, according to data from the Ministry of Commerce.

Between 1 October, 2018 and 5 July, 2019, Myanmar's external trade increased to \$26.6.7 billion from \$26.58 billion recorded in the same period of the previous FY, with an increase of \$74.3 million.

As of 5 July in current fiscal year, exports were estimat-

ed at \$12.7 billion and imports were valued at \$13.9 billion. Compared to the previous fiscal, exports have increased by \$1 billion, while imports have fallen by \$931.6 million.

Myanmar exports agricultural products, animal products, minerals, forest products, and finished industrial goods, while it imports capital goods, intermediate goods, CMP raw materials, and consumer goods.

The country's export sector relies more on the agriculture and manufacturing sectors. While export earnings from the CMP (cut, make and pack) garment businesses are rising, the country's reliance on natural resources such as natural gas and jade is lessening.

The government is trying to reduce the trade deficit by screening luxury import items and boosting exports.

Myanmar's trade deficit was pegged at \$1.3 billion in the last mini-budget period, \$3.9 billion in the 2017-2018FY, \$5.3 billion in the 2016-2017 FY, and \$5.4 billion in the 2015-2016 FY, according to statistics released by the Central Statistical Organization. — Htet Myat

Authorities to develop 2,600 acres of teak, hardwood plantations in Sagaing

THE Forest Department of Sagaing Region is implementing a plan to develop 2,600 acres of teak and hardwood plantations in forest reserves within 13 townships of five districts across the region in the 2018-2019 Financial Year, said Daw Kyawt Kyawt Aung, the Assistant Director of the department.

As of June, the Forest Department has planted 1,655 acres of teak and 200 acres of Pyingadoe, a marketable variety of hardwood, totalling 1,855 acres, in the region, starting this monsoon. Under the plan, the department has planted teak saplings on 400 acres of land in the Thaw forest reserve of Kantbalu Township; 125 acres in Kawlin Township; 150 acres in the Gahe forest reserve of Htigyaing Township; 80 acres in the Nantbaran forest reserve of Pinlebu Township; and 135 acres in the Phile forest reserve of Wuntho Township.

In addition, the authorities

Special economic zones pull in over \$208 mln in investment

MORE than 110 enterprises, including four domestic businesses, invested US\$208 billion in the Special Economic Zones (SEZs), under the Special Economic Zone Law, as of 10 July in the current fiscal year, according to figures released by the Directorate of Investment and Company Administration.

Singapore topped the list of foreign investors, accounting for more than 37 per cent of the overall investment, followed by Japan and Thailand. FDI also flowed into the SEZs from the Republic of Korea, Hong Kong, the UK, the UAE, Malaysia, Austria, China (Taipei), Panama, China, Brunei, Viet Nam, Australia, France, Switzerland, and the Netherlands.

Currently, 74 businesses are operational in the Thilawa SEZ and 18 businesses are beginning to export goods. The SEZ is employing over 20,000 workers, including permanent and construction workers, according to the management committee.

The Myanmar Thilawa SEZ Holdings Public Limited's annual report for 2017-2018 stated that 97 per cent of Thilawa Zone A and 61 per cent of Zone B have been sold. Over 60 per cent of businesses in Thilawa are domestic-oriented manufacturing enterprises, while 40 per cent are export-oriented manufacturers, according to a press statement issued by the company in June this year.

A company exporting at least 75 per cent of the production in value is registered as a Free Zone investor, and is exempt from paying corporate tax for 7 years from the time it starts commercial operations.

Companies such as logistics which support export-oriented manufacturing can also be free zone companies. Domestic-oriented manufacturing companies are regarded as promotion zone companies and they are eligible for a five-year holiday on corporate tax.

There are other tax incentives for free zone and promotion zone investors on import of capital goods, raw materials, and merchandise, and consigned goods and vehicles. Further details about the tax system are available on http://www.myanmarthilawa.gov.mm.

While the manufacturing sector has absorbed the largest share of foreign investments, FDI has also flowed into the trading, services, transportation and logistics, real estate, and hotel sectors in the past years.

Myanmar is currently implementing three Special Economic Zones — Thilawa, Kyaukpyu, and Dawei. Out of the three, Thilawa is leading with better infrastructure and successful businesses.--Ko Htet (Translated by EMM)

Myanmar-Bangladesh border trade down by 30% over nine months

BILATERAL trade between Myanmar and Bangladesh from borders stood at US\$17.8 million as of 5 July in the current Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019, down by \$8.544 million or 32.43 per cent, from the corresponding period last 2017-2018 FY, the Ministry of Commerce report-

At this time last FY, Myanmar-Bangladesh trade through border gates was pegged at \$26.349 million, with exports worth over \$24 million and imports amounting to \$2.2 million.

Usually, Myanmar's exports to Bangladesh surplus its imports in bilateral border trade. In bilateral border trade,

goods are delivered mainly through two border gates— Sittway and Maungtaw.

Between 1 October and 5 July this FY, trade via the Sittway gate was pegged at \$11.169 million, with \$9.95 million in exports and \$1.219 million in imports, whereas trade from the Maungtaw gate reached \$14.5 million, including \$2.245 million in imports.

Marketable goods at the Myanmar-Bangladesh borders contain bamboos, ginger, peanuts, saltwater prawns and fish, dried plums, garlic, rice, mung beans, blankets, candy, plum jams, footwear, frozen foods, chemicals, leather, jute products, tobacco, plastics, wood, knitwear and beverages.

According to the ministry's annual statistical data, the total border trade with Bangladesh was over \$29 million in the 2017-2018 FY. According to the annual statistical report of the ministry, the bilateral border trade was \$3.83 million in 2012-2013 FY, \$22.8 million in 2013-2014 FY, \$14.3 million in 2014-2015 FY, \$11.5 million in 2015-2016 FY, \$1.6 million in 2016-2017 FY.

The public sector's export in the 2018 mini-budget period (April-September) totalled \$755.25 million.—Swe Nyein

Traders call for import regulation as yellow peas flood local markets

YELLOW peas are continuing to enter domestic markets in spite of a ban on their importation, said traders adding that the flow of peas from foreign markets is illegal and needs to be strictly controlled. "The authorities can combat illegal inflow of yellow peas. A 12-wheeled truck can carry 320 bags of peas, and it would not be difficult to seize any illegally imported goods by conducting raids," said U Thein Oo, a depot owner from Monywa town.

"After commodity depots raised several objections, the importation of chick peas and yellow peas was reportedly suspended. Chinese yellow peas must not enter the domestic market. There are 40 vermicelli factories in Monywa. They have begun to use yellow peas instead of locally produced chick peas. The vermicelli produced from chick peas tastes better, but the one made from yellow peas is cheaper. Thus, the price of chick peas has become positively linked with the import of yellow peas," he said. "At present, imports of yellow peas are illegal. But, they are still being brought in through the Sino-Myanmar border gate, resulting in a tax loss for the country," said traders from Monywa town. "A basket of yellow peas is currently priced at K23,000, while chick peas are fetching K27,000 per basket. Yellow peas are flowing into the country illegally through the border trade channels," said

A plan to issue import permits for yellow peas has been suspended as many traders were opposed to imports to protect the interests of farmers. With large quantities of yellow peas from China entering the Mandalay market in recent days, traders said they are facing losses. The news of possible importation of 50,000 tons of yellow peas from foreign markets had created chaos among traders in early July.

"Although the commodity depot associations from central Myanmar have forwarded their request not to allow such dumping practices, yellow peas from China are entering the Mandalay market on an enormous scale. Therefore, the traders are suffering. As Mandalay mills process yellow peas as substitutes for chickpeas, a glut of yellow peas in the local market brings down prices of chickpeas as well. Growers of not just yellow peas but also chickpeas are facing hardships due to large inflows of yellow peas," said U Soe Win Myint, a depot owner from Mandalay. "Yellow peas are cultivated in Mandalay and Sagaing regions and Kachin State for domestic consumption alone, and Myanmar is self-sufficient in yellow peas production. Therefore, imports are not required. Traders are facing losses due to the recent imports of peas," he said. - Myo Win Tun, Aung Phyo Kyaw (Translated by EMM)

Ukraine's Zelensky looks to consolidate power in parliament vote

KIEV — Ukrainians went to the polls on Sunday to elect a new parliament as comedian-turned-president Volodymyr Zelensky seeks to consolidate power and bring in other political newcomers.

Opinion polls show Zelensky's Servant of the People party — named after the sitcom in which he played the president — expected to win roughly half of the vote, well ahead of any rivals.

The 41-year-old TV star faced a hostile parliament following his shock win in April's presidential election. He quickly called a snap election and has promised to bring in a new generation of politicians to lead the country.

Even with a loyal parliament, Zelensky faces a slew of challenges in a country heavily dependent on foreign aid and scarred by years of war with Russia-backed separatists.

His victory in April was seen as a rejection of the country's traditional elite for failing to end the separatist conflict, revive the economy or tackle widespread corruption.

Casting his ballot at a Kiev polling station, Zelensky rejected any coalition with the

"old authorities" and said he look for a coalition partner in into parliament.

would be looking for a "professional economist" to become prime minister. He was dressed in a casual blue shirt, reflecting a change in style that saw Zelensky walk to his inauguration and announce plans to relocate the presidential administration from a hulking Soviet-era building.

Coalition with rock star?

Zelensky is expected to

another fresh movement — the new Golos (Voice) party of Svyatoslav Vakarchuk, the 44-year-old lead vocalist of one of Ukraine's most successful rock bands, Okean Elzy.

Vakarchuk set up his party in May and opinion polls show it with support of between four and seven percent. It will need to cross a threshold of five percent to make it

The rock star smiled and gave the thumbs-up as he cast his ballot, saying: "I voted for the future, I voted for new politics... All Ukrainians are disappointed (in politics), so we need to change it." Both Zelensky and Vakarchuk have packed their parties with young people new to politics and banned candidates who had previously served as lawmakers.— AFP

SOS Mediterranee relaunches migrant rescue missions off Libya

PARIS — Humanitarian group SOS Mediterranee said Sunday it has relaunched rescue efforts off Libya seven months after it abandoned operations using its ship Aquarius and despite a refusal by European ports to accept the migrants.

The Norwegian-flagged Ocean Viking will "conduct

search and rescue activities in the central Mediterranean" for SOS Mediterranee and Doctors Without Borders (known by its French initials MSF), the group said in a statement.

"As people are still fleeing Libya on one of the most perilous sea crossings in the world, and with almost no available rescue assets present in the central Mediterranean, it has been an imperative for both SOS Mediterranee and MSF to return at sea following the ending of their operations with the Aquarius in December 2018."

After nearly three years of operations in which it rescued some 30,000 migrants, the Aquarius was forced to cease operations because of what the group said was obstruction by some European countries.

The International Organization for Migration says at least 426 people have died trying to cross the central Mediterranean this year.

SOS Mediterranee said the migrants were attempting "to escape the escalating conflict in Libya and the deplorable conditions of Libyan detention centres".

The new operation comes

a month after the arrest in Italy of Carola Rackete, the German captain of the Sea-Watch 3, for docking without permission to land rescued migrants.

Rackete was held for several days after the Sea-Watch 3 hit an Italian police speed-boat while entering the port of Lampedusa island despite being banned from entering Italian waters. She argued that she was compelled to avert a human tragedy and bring ashore 40 migrants who had been rescued in the Mediterranean on 12 June.

'Harsh campaign'

"For a year now we have been witnessing a deterioration in the European Union's response in the evolving human tragedy in the central Mediterranean," said the head of operations at SOS Mediterranee, Frederic Penard.—AFP

Citizen journalist among 11 civilians killed in northwest Syria

KHAN SHEIKHUN (Syria) — A young citizen journalist was among 11 civilians killed in air raids on Syria's Idlib region Sunday, rescue workers and a monitor said, as he filmed the Russia-backed regime bombardment of the battered enclave.

Anas al-Dyab, a photographer and videographer in his early 20s, was a member of the White Helmets who also contributed to AFP.

He was killed in Russian air strikes in the town of Khan Sheikhun, rescuers and the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said.

The White Helmets, rescue workers in rebel areas named after their distinctive hard hats, said the group "mourns the fall of a hero Anas al-Dyab, a volunteer and media activist with the Syrian Civil Defence Centre in Idlib," in a Twitter post.

An AFP journalist saw White Helmet members gather to bid farewell to their friend, whose body was laid on a thick red blanket. —AFP

S.African leader to challenge 'flawed' graft report in court

PRETORIA – South Africa's President Cyril Ramaphosa said Sunday he will challenge in court a watchdog body's "fundamentally and irretrievably flawed" findings concerning a donation to his 2017 campaign to head the ruling party.

"After careful study I have concluded that the report is fundamentally and irretrievably flawed," Ramaphosa told reporters, adding that he has "decided to seek an urgent judicial review" of the findings concerning a controversial 500,000 rand (\$36,000) donation. The country's ombudswoman, Busisiwe Mkhwebane, said in an explosive report on Friday that Ramaphosa "deliberately misled the National Assembly" when he responded to an opposition question in parliament last November.—AFP■

Thai farmers on the cash trail with snail slime

BANGKOK — Giant snails inch across a plate of pumpkin and cucumber in central Thailand, an "organic" diet to tease the

prized collagen-rich mucus from the molluscs, which to some cosmetic firms are now more valuable than gold. The snails at Phatinisiri Thangkeaw's farm were once the scourge of rice farmers, loathed for eating the buds of new crops.

"Farmers used to throw them on the road or in the rivers," Phatinisiri told AFP. "But now they sell them to me to earn extra money."

With her 1,000 snails, the teacher makes an extra \$320 to \$650 a month.

It is one of more than 80 farms in Nakhon Nayok province, two hours from the capital Bangkok, cashing in on the global snail beauty market, estimated at \$314 million, according to research group Coherent Market Insights.

The precious slime is patiently "milked" from the glands of the snail by dripping water over it using a pipette.

Its raw form is sold to Aden International, a Thai-based cosmetics company that primarily ships its products to Korea and the US.

The sole snail slime producer in Thailand, Aden was started three years ago as a business-savvy solution to the snail infestation in Nakhon Nayok, said founder Kitpong Puttarathuvanun.

And his bet paid off — Kitpong sells the serum under the Acha brand, but also supplies Korean and American cosmetic companies with a dried powder at 1.8 million baht (\$58,200) per kilogram, he said.

Gold is currently worth \$46,300 a kilogram.

Compared to Aden's snail slime, the mucus produced in China — milked daily instead of once every three weeks in Thailand — is valued at about 80,000 baht (\$2,600) per kilogram, Kitpong said.

"We found that our slime was very intense because the snails eat everything, including vegetables, grains and even mushrooms... producing good quality slime," he told AFP, explaining that the mucus can be used to heal sunburn and "heal wounds".

French wine production hit by heatwave

PARIS — Wine production in France this year will be down by between six and 13 per cent over 2018, notably because of the ongoing heatwave, the agriculture ministry said Saturday.

France, one of the world's top wine producers and exporters, was hit hard by poor weather conditions, including a heatwave at the end of June.

That and other factors meant that production should be between 42.8 and 46.4 million hectolitres — the lowest figures in the last five years, said the ministry, based on estimates drawn up on 12 July.

Unfavourable weather conditions hit the flowering of the vine, particularly in the western wine regions of France, such as Val de Loire, Charente, Bordelais the wines of the southwest.

In southern France, the heatwave broke records, with temperatures in some places as high as 46 degrees Celsius (115 degrees Fahrenheit).

The heat damage meant lost production in three regions: the Gard, Herault and Var, the ministry added.

Hailstorms also affected some vines but they did less damage nationally.

Another heatwave has been forecast for most of France in the coming week.

France, along with Spain and Italy, is one of the world's top three wine producers and exporters, according to industry figures released last week.

LDP gains, new party Reiwa makes splash among swing voters

TOKYO—Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's Liberal Democratic Party won the most support from swing voters in the proportional representation section of Sunday's upper house election, while newcomer Reiwa Shinsengumi finished ahead of some bigger opposition parties, Kyodo News exit polls show. Among those unaffiliated with any party, 23.5 percent voted for the LDP, followed by 20.6 percent for the leading opposition Constitutional Democratic Party

In the previous House of Councillors election in 2016, the now-defunct Democratic Party led with 23.2 percent, while the LDP garnered 22.3 percent.

Such swing voters accounted for 19.6 percent of those polled.

Reiwa Shinsengumi, a grassroots party created in April by actor-turned-lawmaker Taro Yamamoto that ran on a platform of social inclusion and raising the

Iran says its tanker held in Saudi Arabia released

TEHRAN—An Iranian tanker held in Saudi Arabia since being forced to seek repairs at Jeddah port has been released and is returning to the Islamic republic, a minister said Sunday.

The Happiness 1 tanker "has been released following negotiations and is now moving toward Persian Gulf waters," said transport minister Mohammad Eslami, quoted by state news agency

IRNA.

The ship had been forced to seek repairs in Saudi Arabia in early May after suffering "engine failure and loss of control", the Iranian oil ministry's SHANA news agency said at the time.

The rare docking came despite escalating tensions between staunch enemies Iran and Saudi

"The tanker is moving towards the Persian Gulf with the permission of the Jeddah port, towed by two Iranian tug boats."

According to a July 2 report by Mehr News Agency, Iran paid "over \$10 million to Jeddah port for repairs and maintenance" of the tanker. Passengers would have to pay 50 rupees (about US\$0.31) per bag for the wrapping, Nusrat said in a statement.

"For this purpose, new plastic-wrapping machines are being installed on an urgent basis," he added.

Pakistan's frequent flyers cast scorn on the edict, suggesting it had been introduced to enrich an unnamed company tasked with doing the wrap-

"What is the logic for this

requirement ...if this isn't legalized corruption," one angry traveller tweeted.

Asif Nawaz Shah, another social media critic, called the new policy a "corrupt profit-making endeavour".

Others suggested the quantity of plastic that would be needed was wasteful.

"Why is the #CAA destroying the #environment," tweeted Ayesha Tammy Haq, a lawyer and broadcast journalist.

Luggage-wrapping machines are a feature at many airports in Pakistan -- and elsewhere in the world -- but are usually used by passengers to prevent theft by light-fingered baggage handlers. — AFP ■

1,300 firefighters battle Portugal wildfires

AMENDOA - Planes and helicopters joined more than a thousand firefighters in central Portugal Sunday to battle huge wildfires in a mountainous region where over 100 people died in huge blazes in 2017.

By 12:30 pm (1130 GMT), one of the biggest mobilisations ever seen in the area - including 1,300 firefighters and 400 vehicles - had been deployed to fight the blazes in the heavily forested Castelo Branco region, 200 kilometres (120 miles) north of Lisbon, the rescue services said.

Around 20 people were injured in the blaze, including eight firefighters and 12 civilians, according to interior ministry figures. One badly burned civilian was evacuated by helicopter to Lisbon.

The biggest effort -800firefighters, 245 vehicles and 13 planes and helicopters -- battled to douse flames in the municipality of Vila de Rei, which had spread nearly 25 kilometres. -AFP

Tens of thousands march through Hong Kong in fresh antigov't rally

HONG KONG - Tens of thousands of people marched through Hong Kong on Sunday in an ongoing effort to push the government into totally withdrawing a now-suspended bill that would have allowed extraditions to mainland China.

"No extradition to China!" the protesters chanted as they marched in the sweltering heat, while others called for Hong Kong Chief Executive Carrie Lam to step down and the implementation of democratic reforms.

Millions of people have been drawn to protests in recent weeks against the bill, which could arguably undermine the judicial independence of the former British colony, which returned to Chinese rule in 1997.— Kyodo ■

British Airways, Lufthansa suspended flights to Cairo for security concerns

LONDON—British Airways and German airline Lufthansa, two of Europe's largest airlines, announced Saturday to suspend flights to Cairo for unspecified security reasons. British Airways announced that the flights are suspended "as a precaution to allow for further assessment."

Lufthansa said in a statement that "as safety is the number one priority of Lufthansa, the airline has temporarily suspended its flights to Cairo today as a precaution."

The British carrier said it cancelled flights to the Egyptian capital for seven days. The German airline said normal operations would resume Sunday.Ahmed Fawzi, chairman of the Cairo Airport Company, told Egyptian newspaper Al Shorouk that British Airways did not inform them of any concerns regarding airport security prior to the cancellation.

He said Cairo airport had not received any noti-

fication of British Airways' decision and the cancellation was "an internal affair inside the company."

Egypt's Ministry of Civil Aviation said in a statement Saturday that it had confirmed that the decision to suspend the flights was not issued by Britain's transport or foreign ministries.

Officials from the ministry said the decision was one of "security and political measures that are concerned with internal affairs, and not those of Egypt."

The ministry said that Cairo airport, as well as Egypt's second busiest Hurghada airport, resulted in "excellent ratings" in a recent security check conducted by British airlines, and that other airlines were operating as usual.

The Egyptian ministry added that it will increase the capacity of EgyptAir flights to London starting Sunday "to facilitate transporting passengers during this period."—Xinhua ■

Cage's action packer "Jiu Jitsu" is, along with adventure flick "S.O.S: Survive or Sacrifice" featuring US actor William Baldwin, the first foreign film to take advantage of the incentive plan dubbed "Olivewood".

The scheme was launched by the government, which tasked Invest Cyprus to implement it in cooperation with the tourism and finance ministries, in a bid to attract foreign investment to the European Union member: "Cyprus is considered by a lot of people as a studio, a physical, natural (film) studio," says Invest Cyprus chairman Michalis Michael. The island offers deep blue seas and is endowed with white sandy beaches, rolling hills planted with olive trees, archeological sites and traditional mountain resorts—plus vear-long sunny skies.

Academy Award winner Cage, who got the 1996 Oscar for best actor in "Leaving Las Vegas", told reporters in Cyprus that the island "has been a good spirit for me". —AFP ■

WASHINGTON—Global heat maps of extreme poverty show Africa in deep red. And the problem will only accelerate as population on the continent grows in coming decades."The problems are very real and are large," newly installed World Bank President David Malpass told AFP in an interview. The International Monetary Fund and World Bank have had a mixed record in addressing the longstanding challenge of poverty on the continent since the institutions were founded 75 years ago.

Now they must confront the need for massive investment in infrastructure and job creation in the coming years just to keep pace with the growing population on the continent—all while simultaneously managing the threat posed by climate change in a region perhaps least

able to confront the costs. Malpass has made that mission a priority."I have put emphasis on having the bottom 40 percent of the population see more jobs, more cash income but also more of the inputs to a better living standard," Malpass said."That might mean access to healthcare, to education. And that would be better environmental practices—all of that contributing to a more prosperous ... society."

In the most recent numbers available, World Bank data show extreme poverty fell worldwide to a new low of 10 percent in 2015. The number of extremely poor people —those who live on \$1.90 a day or less—has fallen by more than one billion since 1990.—AFP ■

Africa poses critical UK finance minister to quit if Johnson becomes PM

LONDON—British finance minister Philip Hammond said Sunday he would make a point of resigning before Boris Johnson became prime minister, saying he could never agree to his Brexit strategy. Johnson is widely expected to win the governing, centre-right Conservative Party's leadership

contest on Tuesday and be named as prime minister once Theresa May resigns the premiership on Wednesday.Hammond has become an increasingly fierce critic of Johnson's Brexit strategy -- leaving the European Union with or without a deal on October 31 - and would never have expected to remain as chancellor of the Exchequer in a Johnson government.

But the fact that the second-most senior figure in the government is making a point of resigning rather than wait to be moved on in the incoming prime minister's reshuffle is a significant gesture

-and an indicator of the opposition Johnson could face in pursuing his Brexit strategy."I'm sure I'm not going to be sacked because I'm going to resign before we get to that point," Hammond told BBC television.

"Assuming that Boris Johnson becomes the next prime minister, I understand that his conditions for serving in his government would include accepting a no-deal exit on the 31st of October."That is not something that I could ever sign up to."It's very important that the prime minister is able to have a chancellor who is closely aligned with him in terms of policy, and I therefore intend to resign to Theresa May before she goes to the palace to tender her own resignation on Wednesday." —AFP ■

Garden of Buddha also known curiously as **Poem Graveyard**

HEN I was in Shan State (East) Kengtung town, locals directed me to visit Poem Graveyard. Even without knowing exactly what it was, the name attracted me and I hastily made arrangements to visit it. Once there, I found that it was quite a pleasant place where I felt longing for something or someone without being able to specify exactly what or who. I wrote about this place briefly in my travelogue to Kengtung and now I'll write more in detail about it.

How to reach it

From Kengtung along the

Kengtung-Tachilek Road an hour by motorcycle or 45 minutes by car would bring you to Pan Kwe Village, a rest area with shops and stalls for cars, buses and trucks. Among the shops and stalls, you'll see an entrance gate to Abaya Raza Muni Buddha image. After passing through the entrance gate, a small road going uphill will take you to the Buddha image. The uphill road was rather steep but the views along the way were pleasant with farm land, plantations and natural sceneries making the walk up the path less tiring.

Paying homage to Buddha

image before going on to Poem Graveyard


Before reaching the Poem Graveyard, I first arrived at the Buddha image. As the Buddha image was on top of a small hill, it looks more imposingly higher than it actually was. There were two doors or rather an entry and exit at the side of the Buddha image allowing devotees and visitors to enter the interior of the Buddha image just like the Daibutsu (Great Buddha) in the city of Kamakura in Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan. I don't know what was inside the Daibutsu but the interior of this Buddha image had the life story of Gautama Buddha sculptured on

marble slabs.

From there, continuing along the tree shaded mountain path will take you to the Poem Graveyard.

Poem Graveyard

The place was called Garden of Buddha and was also known as Poem Graveyard. Both names seem to be a bit contradictory or unrelated but were enough of an attraction for anyone like me who first heard it. The place was said to be constructed by devotees of a well known Sayadaw according to an imaginary vision of the Sayadaw. Looking down at the "garden" or "graveyard" as I approach it, the enclosed building and small structures inside the compound seems like an ideal place to meditate. The compound surrounded by a rock wall had roses planted outside. The walled compound can be entered through a small archway gate. All along the inside wall and on the small tomb-like ledges hung or stuck were poems. The fact that the poems were hung or stuck on the small tomb-like ledges may be the reason why the place was called Poem Graveyard. But my mind came up with a name like "Garden where poems bloom" that I thought would be more appropriate. The poems were

of diverse subjects covering religion, philosophy, patriotism, life etc. Poems were written in Myanmar and Shan languages. It was a serene peaceful place with natural surrounding that was outstandingly beautiful. It was one of my most favorite places in and near Kengtung.

Returning from Poem Graveyard

The road back to Kengtung took me through the same scenic places as well as Panlot Village where local rice wine or liquor was being fermented and

distilled. Upon passing through it on the way to Garden of Buddha or Poem Graveyard, I knew from the smell that rice wine or liquor was being fermented and distilled there. So, on the way back to Kengtung I stopped by to taste it and ended up buying some. Many visitors were also said to like this rice wine or liquor and bought it on their way back home.

Whenever you are in Kengtung, give some time to visit this curiously named Garden of Buddha or Poem Graveyard. Translated by Handytips


Moe Yun Gyi Wetland Wildlife Sanctuary attracts holidaymakers, bird watchers

OE Yun Gyi Wetland Wildlife Sanctuary is one of the popular attraction sites for picnickers, naturalists, botanists, bird watchers and sightseers.

Moe Yun Gyi Wetland Wildlife Sanctuary is located near Pyinpongyi model village in Bago City, with an area of 103 square kilometre and about 70 miles from Yangon City. It is a real paradise for nature lovers and holidaymakers and has admission fees like other popular places in Myanmar. Moe Yun Gyi Wetland Wildlife Sanctuary is within easy reach of the car. The sanctuary opens to visitors from 8 am to 5 pm and boats and guides can be hired on a first come, first served basis.

You also can study wetland environment by a boat equipped with different bird watching equipment. Moe Yun Gyi Wildlife Sanctuary is packed with local visitors and foreigners during the public holidays. It became an attraction spot for international travellers as well as local visitors. Floating restaurants and booths displaying a wide range of locally-made handicrafts are put on sale for the sightseers. You will have an opportunity to watch 42 water bird species, 33 shorebird species, 20 species of aquatic grass and hundreds of resident and migratory water

About 35 species of winter birds used to migrate to the sanctuary at the end of November, according to sanctu-

ary administrator's office that compiles and documents the list of migratory birds. From October to March, it hosts over 20,000 migratory birds and most of the migratory birds leave the sanctuary in March and April, said a ranger from the sanctuary. In an attempt to prevent poachers from hunting and killing rare bird species, an awareness campaign is being conducted by the forestry officials in cooperation with respective government organizations.

The sanctuary was designated as Ramsar site in Myanmar in 2014. The sanctuary, established in 1896, used to be a reservoir which changed naturally into wetlands with the extension of 40 square miles.
