

#### Budget allocations of Home Affairs Ministry

Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Major General Aung Thu said that the Union Government has allocated K24,581.9 million from the emergency fund to the ministry for reconstruction and renovation of facilities under Myanmar Police Force and border guard forces in Rakhine, Kachin, Chin, Sagaing, Mandalay and Shan.

He also affirmed that the ministry will spend the budgets in accordance with financial procedures.

The Speaker of Pyidaungsu Hluttaw announced to put the report of this budget into the records.

The MP said that in the book of Nation Education Strategic Plan (2016-2021) developed by the Ministry of Education, the State Counsellor has instructed to reform the national education system that is required to support the young generation with new technologies and knowledge, skills, creation, analytical thinking, appreciation on culture and disciplines.

He also suggested the National Education Policy Commission and the National Curriculum Committee to put the moral discipline courses into the curriculum.

U Nyan Hein, MP of Thanbyuzayat constituency, also suggested to include the essence and practices of democracy in the curriculum of various level as a move in developing the future generation of the country.

U Tin Hla, MP of Danubyu constituency, supported the report of National Education Policy Commission to the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw, while it is recognized as a roadmap for future expectation of Myanmar education sector, based on strategic reforms of the National Education Strategic Plan (2016-2021).

Then, 16 MPs discussed the report, and the Speaker announced the remaining MPs are to discuss it at the meeting on 13 August.—Mawsi, Hmay Kyu Zin



# Permanent Secretary receives Ambassador of Bangladesh to Myanmar

U MYINT THU, Permanent Secretary of the Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar received Mr Manjurul Karim Khan Chowdhury, Ambassador of Bangladesh to Myanmar at 12 noon on 9 August 2019 at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Yangon.

The Permanent Secretary informed the Ambassador that Myanmar is ready to receive the first batch of verified returnees from the list of 3,450, whose village-wise lists have already been dispatched to the Bangladeshi side. Any new list of returnees should be sent through the diplomatic channel and they will be repatriated two weeks from the receipt of the list. Furthermore, the Permanent Secretary reiterated that both sides need to comply with the Physical Arrangement signed between the two countries.

During the call, the Permanent Secretary also handed over a letter addressed to Mr. Md Shahidul Haque, Foreign Secretary of Bangladesh from Mr Kenzo Oshima, Member of the Independent Commission of Enquiry (ICOE) and Team Leader of the ICOE's Advance Team, to the Ambassador of Bangladesh. The Advance Team of the ICOE has proposed to visit Bangladesh in August 2019.—MNA

# Death toll in landslide reaches 10 in Paung; 27 injured

A LANDSLIDE induced by torrential rains struck a village in Paung Township of Mon State yesterday, with 10 persons reportedly dead and 27 injured so far, according to the local authorities.

Mon State Chief Minister Dr Aye Zan and officials inspected the conditions at the scene and directed that soil and debris be removed within a day with the use of all machinery in the township.

The landslide also wreaked havoc between the 184/5 and 184/6 mileposts on the Yangon-Mawlamyine Road.

Following the landslide, three backhoes and two bulldozers were brought in to clear soil and debris, and their task is expected to be complete by

Before inspecting the site affected by the deadly landslide, the chief minister and his party visited temporary relief camps where flood-victims from low-lying areas of Mawlayine are being sheltered and spoke words of encouragement to them.

committee and made arrangements for providing aid to the flood victims.

The disaster destroyed 14 houses and some residents are still missing at Thanbyu Ward of Thalphyuline village in Paung Township. Some 85 members of local fire stations from Thaton, Paung, Bilin and Kyaikto, together with 35 rescue persons, evacuated the people at the site. The rescue works were joined by 10 police members of Mon state in searching for the missing people in flood.-MNA

# Myanmar has granted 568 foreigners PR status in four years

UNION Minister for Labour, Immigration and Population U Thein Swe said that a total of 568 foreigners, out of 611 applicants, have been granted Permanent Residency status from 29 January 2015 to 8 August 2019.

U Thein Swe, in his capacity as the Chairman of the Implementation Central Committee (ICC) for Permanent Residency, presided over the coordination meeting of the committee held in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday morning.

The Union Minister also said that the initial PR applications were accepted either in the country or at other Myanmar embassies abroad and urged to do the process in line with the existing laws.

An officer of ICC explained the ongoing procedures of the committee, including the identification process, the number of applicants, the term of residency certificate and interviews in person with the applicants.

The committee, then, agreed to promote three former Myanmar nationals holding Permanent Residency of foreigners in Myanmar into the Myanmar citizenship.

Moreover, 1 investor, 11 former Myanmar nationals and 5 foreigners who are related to nationals, totally 17 persons, were approved for PR status foreigners in Myanmar.

Myanmar has created four categories in granting PR for experts, investors, former Myanmar nationals and foreigners who were related to nationals.—MNA (*Translated by Aung Khin*)

## Smart car parking lots to be built next year in downtown Yangon

SMART CAR parking lots will be built next year in downtown Yangon, said U Lin Khine, the Head of the Engineering Department (Roads, and Bridges), Yangon City Development Committee (YCDC).

Private companies were asked to submit expressions of interest (EOI) for building the parking lots. A total of 26 companies submitted EOIs, and six of them were selected, according to the YCDC.

"Tenders will be invited from the six selected companies. Currently, the rules for the tender system are being formulated. The tenders will be invited very soon," said U Lin Khine.

"We will invite interested bidders through an announcement in the newspapers. Then, we will give the bidders oneand-a-half or two months to prepare their bids. Afterwards, we will scrutinize all the tender applications and make the selection. We will complete the

project next year," said U Lin Khine.

"Initially, the smart car parking lots will be built in six downtown townships of Yangon. If the project is successful, then more parking lots would be constructed in the remaining townships in the city," said Daw May May Thwe, committee member-5 of YCDC. "Yangon Region is facing car-parking space scarcity problem. So, smart car parking lots have to be built," said U Phyo Min Thein, Chief Minister of Yangon Region.

"To solve the problem of scarcity of car parking space in Yangon Region, smart car parking lots will have to be built," U Maung Maung Soe, the Mayor of Yangon Region, had remarked at the 2nd Yangon Region Hluttaw's sixth regular meeting, held on 15 February, 2018.

"Previously, the YCDC collected car parking fees on roads. It has removed collection agents on the roads," he had said.

"We have been holding these meetings biannually since 2008. Our aim for convening these meetings is to get back our Myanmar trafficked victims safely. We have already

welcomed 800 victims back, and we are discussing the return of another 600 victims from Thailand," said Daw Khine Su Lwin, the Assistant Director of the Protection of Trafficked Victims Division under the Rehabilitation Department.

Victims trafficked from Myanmar to Thailand are returning through three routes: Myawady-Mae Sot, Tachilek-Mae Sai, and Kawthoung-Ranong, she added.

The 24th coordination meeting for the return of Myanmar trafficked victims will be held in Thailand.—Myint Maung

## Union Minister U Thaung Tun visits Daewoo Bus Factory in Mingaladon Tsp

UNION MINISTER of the Ministry of Investment and Foreign Economic Relations and Chairman of the Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) U Thaung Tun, accompanied by five Commission members visited Daewoo Bus Myanmar Factory in Mingaladon Township, Yangon in this morning.

The Daewoo Bus Myanmar Company is a joint venture between Myanmar and Korean partners. It is currently producing 2 models of buses under a pilot program with the approval of the MIC. The factory is staffed by 200 local workers and has a capacity to produce 500 units annually.

The Union Minister and party were welcomed at the factory by the Managing Director of Daewoo Bus Myanmar Co., Ltd. U Kyaw Kyaw Aung.

The factory is producing buses under the Complete Knocked-Down (CKD) system. The factory is expected not only to provide modern buses for the local market but also for export.—MNA

# YCDC to introduce online submission system for building permits

A TRIAL is currently on to allow online applications to issue building permits in Yangon, according to the Yangon City Development Committee (YCDC).

The YCDC and the International Finance Corporation, a member of the World Bank group, launched the Pilot Test Phase for the new Yangon Building Permit System (YBPS) during a ceremony on Friday morning at the City Hall.

At the event, the Chief Minister of Yangon Region, U Phyo Min Thein, said that this is the first time an online submission system is being tested for construction permits.

"Earlier, there was a delay in applying for construction permits in Yangon Region. Once the automated system is launched in Yangon Region, the difficulties will be resolved," he said.

He also said that he believed that the system will boost the development of Yangon City.

A risk-based system will be used in granting of construction permits, instead of a floor-based system. There will be three types of risk assigned to buildings, low, medium, and high. Low risk building projects will be limited to three-storey, medium risk buildings will have more than three floors, and high-risk building projects will involve construction of hotels, stadiums, and other types of buildings.

"Construction permits will be issued only to licensed architects and engineers. Although people who live in Yangon Region will be able to apply for a construction permit through the online submission system, the paperwork for the construction permits is currently available, and the permissions for low and medium risk projects will start in December," said Daw Hlaing Maw Oo, the Secretary of the YCDC.

"At present, over 500 permits are being issued monthly and over 5,000 permits are being granted annually. With the number of construction projects increasing year over year, it will now take only five days to apply for a permit. The charges for the online permits can be cleared online through banks," said U Tin Maung Kyi, the secretary of the YCDC Building Department. —Myint Maung Soe

# Mandalay Chamber meets with Thailand Board of Investment for better economic ties

THE Thailand Board of Investment, led by Mr Worakan Kosolpisikul, and including 15 representatives from 13 Thailand companies, met with representatives from the Mandalay Region Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MRCCI) yesterday to promote business relations.

At the meeting, the secretary of the MRCCI explained the potential for investment in the region to the Thailand representatives. Entrepreneurs from the two countries exchanged ideas on promotion of tourism, healthcare services, construction businesses, importation of construction equipment, scholarship opportunities, food and household goods, agricultural businesses, ICT and telecommunications, and arts and crafts sectors.

During the nine months (October-June) of the current fiscal year, nine Thailand-listed enterprises brought an estimated capital of US\$197.59 million into Myanmar, according to figures released by the Directorate of Investment and Company Administration.

During the period, the value of trade between Myanmar and neighbouring Thailand reached \$4.13 billion, with exports worth \$2.96 billion and imports valued at \$1.67 billion, according to data released by the Ministry of Commerce.

Thailand also topped in the regional trade line-up with the largest trade value. Myanmar primarily exports fishery products such as crab, fish and shrimp, as well as onions, sesame, dried tea leaves, coconut, and turmeric, while it imports consumer goods, cosmetic machinery, food products, agricultural equipment, and track cars from Thailand. — Thiha Ko Ko/ Htet Myat

# Shwebo Pawsan price up K7,000 per bag in seven months

THE PRICE of Shwebo Pawsan, a superior variety of local rice, has reached K55,000 per bag, an increase of K7,000 per bag in the last seven months, according to the Myanmar Rice Federation (MRF).

This year, the price of Shwebo Pawsan was K48,000 per bag in January, K50,000 in February and March, K52,000 in April, and K55,000 in May. The price continued to increase in the months of June and July.

While a bag of Shwebo Pawsan rice cost K43,500 in 2014, the price rose to K55,000 between May and July this year, an increase of more than 20 per cent in six years.

According to the MRF, rice price has seen a record increase

between 2014 and July, 2019. Ayeyawady Pawsan fetched K35,000 per bag and Shwebo Pawsan K43,500 per bag in the local market in 2014. Meanwhile, Ayeyawady Pawsan was priced at K43,000 and Shwebo Pawsan K55,000 in 2019.

The price of Eimahta 25 Marks rice was K15,500 per bag in 2014, and increased to K18,000 in 2019.

In 2015, a 180-pound Shwebo Pawsan rice bag cost K47,000, Ayeyawady Pawsan K38,000, Eimahta 25 Marks K16,500, and Nga Sein 25 Marks K17,000.

In 2016, a 180-pound Shwebo Pawsan rice bag was selling for K43,000, Ayeyawady Pawsan K36,000, Eimahta 25 Marks K20,000, and Nga Sein 25 Marks K20,500.

In 2017, a 180-pound Shwebo Pawsan rice bag cost K46,000, Ayeyawady Pawsan K38,000, Eimahta 25 Marks K20,000, and Nga Sein 25 Marks K18,300.

In 2018, a 180-pound Shwebo Pawsan rice bag was priced at K65,000, Ayeyawady Pawsan K53,000, Eimahta 25 Marks K19,700, and Nga Sein 25 Marks K22,000, according to the MRF.

As of August, 2019, the price of Pathein Pawsan was ranging between K40,000 and K44,000 per bag, Pyapon Pawson between K38,000 and K40,000, Eimahta between K19,000 and K20,000, and Nga Sein between K19,000 and K19,700. —Aye Cho

# Time to eliminate rabies

ABIES is preventable through vaccination and post-exposure immunization. Yet, nearly 70,000 people still die from the disease every year across Uthe world, mostly in rural areas

With the opening of special care units for dog bites at the Yangon General Hospital, North Okkalapa People's Hospital, and Thingangyun People's Hospital, the number of deaths from rabies in Myanmar has reduced from 152 in 2014 to 71 in 2018.

Despite the downward trend in dog bite cases from about 15,000 a month in 2017 to 1,000 a month in 2019, the number of dog bites is still high. The Ministry of Health and Sports has spent about K15 billion in tackling the zoonotic disease from the 2016-2017 fiscal year to the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

The time has come to map dog-bite prone areas or townships, and to reinforce the fight against the rabies.

In fact, to tackle this disease, a multi-sectoral response

is needed. Given that 99 per cent of human infections are acquired from dog bites, mass vaccination of dogs - combined with the management of stray dogs and responsible dog ownership — is the most cost-effective way to eliminate the disease.

Vaccinating 70 per cent of dogs can reduce human cases to zero, and the cost of dog vaccines is much lower than that of post-exposure prophylaxis for human beings.

Starting from 2013, about 150,000 dogs have been vaccinated on average per year. The vaccination campaign from 2019 to 2021 against dogs in Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon, Mandalay, Bago regions, and Rakhine State by the Four Paws International, in cooperation with the ministry to mark World Rabies Day, which falls on 28th September, bodes well for us.

According to a 2018 survey, there are over 4 million dogs in Myanmar, and this number is too high for our country. Nonetheless, if we ensure that human vaccines and immunoglobulin are affordable and accessible, we can reduce the fatality rate, which is almost 100 per cent if post-exposure prophylaxis

is not given before symptoms develop. The education of local communities is also a key priority to ensure that people who get bitten seek prompt treatment.

To achieve a target of no rabies deaths by 2030, we must recognize that rabies elimination is a health priority.

Successful implementation of anti-rabies efforts will depend on political will, coordination between human and animal health sectors, support from donors and stakeholders in the public and private sectors, and community engagement. The time to act is now.

# **Physically and Mentally Fit Youth for the Brighter Future**

YANMAR has adopted the concept of health promotion in school settings since the beginning of Global School Health Initiatives in 1996. Health -promoting school programme was introduced into existing school health services aiming to promote health standards for all students, the skills, and knowledge needed for adoption of healthy lifestyle. In principle, a health promoting school encompasses healthy school policies; school's physical and social environment; health education, skills, literacy, and health services; and community engagement. Dual benefits of the implementation of health promoting school are to achieve "health for all" and "education for all" as health condition of students contributes greatly to education performance, and numbers of health-related activities attract school enrolment and on the other hand, education can improve health condition of the whole population, extended from students, to parents, teachers, and communities. Many of the international and national commitments made on education and health sectors have emphasized the school health as one of the vital agenda.

#### **Recent National Seminar on Strengthening Health Pro**moting School in Myanmar

National Seminar on Strengthening Health Promoting School titled "Physically and Mentally Fit Youth for the Brighter Future" was held at the Myanmar International Convention Center-2 on June 12, 2019 in Nay Pyi Taw. State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi attended the seminar and gave opening speech. The State Counsellor called for efforts for various issues including prevention and control of drugs, cigarettes, betel nuts and alcohol in basic education schools and universities, decreasing traffic accidents, reducing excessive gaming, encouraging habits for healthy living, and including comprehensive reproductive health education in school lessons. She also called for cooperation among related ministries, parents, teachers, students,

international organizations, NGOs and ethnic organizations to get physically and mentally fit youth for the brighter future. Speaking at the seminar, Union minister for Health and Sports Dr. Myint Htwe said the activities for strengthening health promoting School programme are as important as the National Health Plan(2017-2021), the road map for the health sector of the country. He called on other related ministries, NGOs and civil society organizations for cooperating in the implementation of health promoting school programme activities under the leadership of the Ministry of Education as the Ministry of Health and Sports alone can not bring success to the programme. Union Minister for Education Dr. Myo Thein Gyi aslo gave keynote address and called on faculties of the Ministry of Education, parents and students to cooperate the best with related ministries and MPs in implementing the health promoting school programme which ensure the student youth free from drugs, tobacco, alcohol and can promote the healthy lifestyles and can reduce game addict. The

two-day seminar was attended by related Union Ministers, deputy ministers, Hluttaw representatives, members of the Nay Pyi Taw councils, state/regional ministers for social affairs, facilitators for the panel discussions, ministerial permanent secretaries and departmental heads, experts attending to give lectures, officials from international organizations, representatives of student unions, and students from basic education schools in Nay Pyin Taw. This 2-day National seminar took place with various sessions covering prevention and nut control of drugs, cigarettes, betel nuts and alcohol and road accidents, comprehensive sexual education, healthy life styles, computer game issue and health promoting school approaches.

**Current situation of School** Health in Myanmar

Ministry of Health and Sports in collaboration with Ministry of Education has implemented School Health services since 1920. The school health activities improve children's health condition physically and men-

tally. As a result, not only school enrolment rate increases, but also attendance rate improved. However, challenges remain in reaching the hard to reach population, where enrolment is low and retaining students for higher education and skill development are difficult. Contributing factors are low GDP per capita, inadequate resources for trained personnel, for health services and facilities in all schools, and lack of education and awareness on some crucial health issues, social stigma, myths and other social and economic barriers. Health promoting school approach were utilized in a fragmented manners depend on resources availability. Recent 2016 Myanmar Global

School-based Student Health Survey (GSHS) demonstrated that the prevalence of unhealthy behaviors such as unhealthy dietary habits including eating junk foods (46%) and drinking carbonated soft drinks (45%), physical inactivity (30.2%), alcohol drinking (4.3%), and using tobacco (6.6%) among 13-17 year students become increased. Concerning mental health indicators among

students; consider suicide, plan to suicide and attempted suicide are also increasing about seven times in recent decade. Hence we can conclude that as compared to previous survey conducted in 2007, the trend of unhealthy behaviours as well as mental health issue among students has been rising up. Moreover, in the report of Myanmar Health Management Information System, in 2015, only 38.8% of schools covered health promoting school activities.

Lessons learnt from past experiences in implementation of school health in Myanmar reveals the following needs:

1) Recognized importance of schools in nurturing and instilling healthy behaviour of population, health promotion in school is critically important for early development of health behaviour and health literacy. Integrated health in academic curriculum will enhance the practice of school health initiatives in Myanmar.

2) Health promoting schools needs to have comprehensive programme and supportive structure and systems for schools to be active institutions that bring

change for better health of students, teachers, and families in a long term

3) Basic infrastructure such as drinking water and utilities, functional toilet, weight and high scales, appropriate lighting (natural or others) in classroom, safe playground and walk ways, sanitized canteen or clean food areas, and safe building structure are prerequisite for school health programmes and activities.

4) Information system linkage between health and education sector will be a foundation to develop proper supports for school health activities as well as harmonize health and education outcomes. 5) Comprehensive school health services should be standardized with basic/minimum health packages that address not only health programmes but also infrastructures and factors that affect health of students, teachers and school staffs.

6) Comprehensive school health applies health promoting school approach that taken whole-ofschool social and physical environment that contributing to health and well-being.

7) Current practices of health promoting school activities are fragmented and need to be harmonized.

8) Implementation gaps across regions reflect the social and economic conditions of the region/ states. Strategic actions toward closing the gaps will enhance education, health, and other determinants of health and well-being of the students in the most vulnerable areas,

The comprehensive school health strategy (2017-2022) was developed based on the context of National Health Plan (2017-2021 )for younger generation which come from both education and health sector. Myanmar National Comprehensive School Health Strategic Plan (2017-2022) is crafted to improve quality of education and health of students through holistic health promoting school approach, along with factors influencing health of students especially from families and communities.

Cash, aid provided to flood victims in Nyaunglebin, Shwegyin, Bago townships

U WIN THEIN, the Chief Minister of Bago Region and officials from departments concerned on Thursday morning disbursed cash and relief supplies to flood victims in Nyaunglebin, Shwegyin, and Bago townships. A team first visited relief camps in monasteries in Madauk Town, Nyaunglebin Township and gave K8.9 million in cash for rice and three relief supplies, including medicines and necessary aids, to 4,254 victims from 776 households. Other private donors also contributed three items of aid, including 100 rice bags, 100 shirts, and 40 raincoats. Later, in Shwegyin Township, the Chief Minister and a team donated K10 million in cash for rice; five donors gave K5.6 million in cash and 10 rice bags; the Health Department dis-

tributed 6,000 packs of electrolyte, 92 raincoats, and 150 clothes to flood victims; and, the Naylawon company donated 100 rice bags to victims. Additionally, the Chief Minister handed over certificates of honor to private donors.

As the river water in Shwegyin increased, the wards and villages in Shwegyin Township were submerged. The 9,228 flood victims in Shwegyin Township are currently being sheltered at 34 relief camps. In the afternoon, a team inspected relief camps in Phayargyi Town of Bago Township, and provided K275,100 in cash for rice to 131 victims, and K30,000 for every child under 6 months, and comforted the flood victims. — Tin Soe (Bago)

# Police seizes drugs in surprise checks in several towns

POLICE SEIZED nearly 16,000 stimulant tables in separate search in Kawthoung and Bokepyin recently.

A combined team comprised of local police and an anti-drug squad in Kawthoung searched the house of Myo Min Khaing, on Shweminwun Street, Padauk Shwewah Ward in Kawthoung on 7<sup>th</sup> August and seized 1,793 stimulant tablets, K34,000 and one mobile phone.

Similarly, a local combined team in Botepyin searched the house of Tin Maung Latt in Yayngan Village on 8<sup>th</sup> August and discovered 14,200 stimulant tablets.

Police in Paungte, Pyay District, Bago Region, acting on a tip-off, searched the house of Kyaw Thu Win (a) Kyaw Gyi and discovered 37 stimulant tablets. In connection with the case, the police searched the house of Ohn Myint in Zay Ward-2 and discovered 90 stimulant tablets, 4 g of marijuana, 0.2 g of ice and K84,500.

The team also searched his another house in the same ward and discovered 2,260 stimulant tables hidden in a trash bin at the house.

Similarly, the forces of the Tatmadaw, acting on a tip-off, searched a house near Chinmalin Village in Laukkai Township and discovered 18,000 stimulant tablets, 8.5 kilos of Ammonium chloride, one kilo of Methanol and accessories which are used for making the stimulant tablets.

On 8<sup>th</sup> August, a local anti-drug squad and police found 12.72 kilos of opium, K180,000, one mobile phone, three ATM cards, from a Toyota Crown driven by Yauk Chan Hsan at Yaypu Check Point in Hsenwi, Lashio District.

Similarly, police in Mabein searched a motorcycle driven Ma El Me Kyi (a) Cho Cho Thaung near Mabein-Pinkyein Village and seized 4,000 stimulant in the search.

Action has been taken against all the suspects under the Anti-Narcotic Drug and Psychotropic Substance Law, according to the Myanmar Police Force.—MNA

# NASA engineers test cameras on Mars 2020 rover

LOS ANGELES — NA-SA's Mars 2020 rover, which is equipped with visionary science instruments, underwent an "eye" exam after the installation of several cameras on it, according to the latest release of the space agency's Jet Propulsion Laboratory

#### (JPL).

The rover contains an armada of imaging capabilities, from wide-angle landscape cameras to narrow-angle high-resolution zoom lens cameras.

"We completed the machine-vision calibration of the forward-facing cameras on the rover," said Justin Maki, chief engineer for imaging and the imaging scientist for Mars 2020 at the JPL.

"This measurement is critical for accurate stereo vision, which is an important capability of the vehicle." —Xinhua

# Scientists discover fossil of world's largest parrot in New Zealand

SYDNEY — The fossil of a giant parrot that stood up to 1 metre tall and weighed about 7 kilograms was discovered in New Zealand, scientists said.

Although long-extinct, the Heracles inexpectatus — so named because of its great size and strength as well as its unexpected discovery — was found among fossils dating back 19 million years in Central Otago, in the southeast of New Zealand's South Island.

The Heracles inexpectatus was roughly twice the size of the critically endangered kakapo, a flightless bird also from New Zealand that is the world's largest living parrot.

Trevor Worthy, associate professor at Flinders University in Adelaide, said in a statement that while New Zealand is well known for its giant birds, including the now-extinct flightless moa, "until now, no one has ever found an extinct giant parrot — anywhere."

Researcher Mike Archer, a professor at the University of New South Wales in Sydney, said the ancient bird's size meant it would have sat higher in the food chain compared to other parrots.—Kyodo News



# India urges Pakistan to review ties downgrade over Kashmir

NEW DELHI — India on Thursday urged Pakistan to review its decision to downgrade diplomatic ties with New Delhi in response to India's decision to scrap Kashmir's special status.

"The government of India regrets the steps announced by Pakistan yesterday and would urge that country to review them so that normal channels for diplomatic communications are preserved," India's foreign ministry said in a press release

On the decision to scrap Article 370 of the Constitution, which granted special status to Kashmir, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi said it is "the beginning of a new era."

"Article 370 did not give anything more than terrorism and corruption. It was used by Pakistan as a weapon," Modi said in an address to the nation on Thursday evening.

Pakistan on Wednesday expelled the Indian envoy in Islamabad and announced a five-point plan which included downgrading ties with its neighboring country.

India's foreign ministry statement said that the intention behind Pakistan's measures "is obviously to present an alarming picture to the world of our bilateral ties."

The statement also justified the Indian government's decision Monday to revoke the measure of autonomy given to Indian-administered Kashmir, saying the move is based on a commitment to extend to the country's only Muslim-majority state opportunities for development which were earlier denied.—Kyodo News


# Cambodia, Sri Lanka sign 2 deals to boost bilateral ties

"During the meeting, the two leaders also agreed to work together to promote bilateral cooperation in education, culture, tourism, trade, and civil aviation," Sophalleth told reporters after the meeting. Sirisena arrived in Phnom Penh on Wednesday for a four-day state visit at the invitation of Cambodian King Norodom Sihamoni.—Xinhua

## Huawei unveils own operating system with block to Android looming

SHANGHAI — Chinese telecom giant Huawei Technologies Co. said Friday that it has developed its own operating system, amid concerns it could be blocked from accessing globally used Android systems operated by US Google LLC.

The announcement came as the US government continues to voice anxiety that Huawei products may facilitate spying, sparking speculation that the Chinese firm's access to Google's Android systems could be removed.

In May, Washington declared a national emergency to ban American companies from using telecom technology and servic-

es provided by entities considered a national security threat, a move apparently countering Huawei.

In late June, President Donald Trump once promised to ease the restrictions, but US media have recently reported that the White House is holding off on a decision about licenses for U.S. firms to resume business with Huawei amid an escalating trade war between Washington and Beijing.—Kyodo News

# McConnell says won't recall US Senate to pass new gun laws after shootings

WASHINGTON — US Senate majority leader Mitch McConnell said Thursday he would not recall lawmakers from their summer break to pass gun control legislation in the wake of two mass shootings that left 31 dead.

More than 200 US mayors earlier wrote to McConnell to demand that the chamber reconvene to approve bills passed by the lower House requiring background checks for all gun purchases and regulation of secondary sales after the shootings in El Paso and Dayton.

But McConnell told local radio in Kentucky that while gun legislation would be "front and center" in the Senate's next session, he would not order the recall and instead wanted to wait for "bipartisan discussion" between Republicans and

Democrats.

"I want to make a law, not just see this political sparring going on endlessly," he told News-Radio 840 WHAS, adding that a possible ban on assault weapons would "probably be discussed as

well" when lawmakers returned in September.

McConnell has stifled congressional efforts to expand gun controls amid Republicans' fears that they could suffer at ballot box in next year's elections.—AFP

# The four legendary structures of Managements

Maung Tha (Archaeology)

URING our short visit to Sagaing or Zeyapura, which was founded 700 years ago, we visited Laykyunmanaung Pagoda on the bank of Ayeyawady River and viewed the river boat, Kalaw Pandaw, anchored at a jetty. The river cruise ship had sleeping rooms and dining rooms along its long body.

Afterwards, we travelled to Mingun, an archaeological zone in Sagaing Division. Mingun is located 12 miles north of Sagaing. We travelled on the road that ran parallel to the wide Ayeyawady River. We enjoyed the breathtaking view of the sunset.

On the way we saw a lot of cars returning from Mingun, and many of them were carrying foreigners. The road was smooth, as Mingun was a tourist destination. Visitors could also travel to Mingun by boat from Mandalay along the Ayeyawady.

Mingun is located at a place lying at the centre of Avevawady River and Minwun mountain range. During the ancient times it was called Minywa. King Badon or King Bodaw Phaya issued an order to change the name to Mingun. Kyilaygyi (the four legendary structures) in Mingun is one of the famous tourist hotspots of Sagaing Region, which possesses a large number of ancient heritages. Kyilaygyi includes the Pahtodawgyi, a huge unfinished pagoda, a big bronze bell, the two large lion statues and the Kandawgyi, a large lake.

On arrival at Mingun, we first visited Mya Theindan Pagoda. While observing the artifacts, we saw tourists taking pictures at the pagoda.

Prince of Sagaing built the pagoda. It took about six years, from 1163ME to 1169ME, to complete the pagoda. The shape of the pagoda resembles the mythical Myinmoh Mountain. The prince donated an emerald stone, valued at Ks 100,000 at that time, to build the pagoda. So it is called Mya (emerald) Theindan (worth Ks 100,000). Some call it Hsinbyu (white elephant) Pagoda as it is located on the hill by the name

Sudhammacari. Renowned as the Mingun Sayadaw, Sayadaw U Vicitta, holder of the Tipitaka Dhara Dhamma Bandakarika Title, played the leading role in the Sixth Buddhist Synod. A total of 95 religious buildings including pagodas and monasteries are lying on the Moemeikkon hillock. It has also the Moemeik Pagoda. The 109.6 feet high pagoda was built by a son of King Bodaw Phaya, who was administer of Momeik town under the title – Maha Dhamma Yaza.

The Tinapitakanikaya Paritta School in Moemeikkon is famous for bringing out prominent Phaya built the lake at a place five miles south of Pahtodawgyi Pagoda in 1179ME. The lake is called Kyetdaunkkan for its location in the west of Kyetdaunk village. At present, it is a dry lake. It has only very few visitors. We did not go there.

Mingun Home for the Age lies in a 3.75-acre plot bordering Myatheindan pagoda and Pahtodawgyi pagoda between Ayeyawady River and Minwun Hill. The Home is caring and catering septuagenarians free of charge. Daw Oo Zun founded the Home in 1276ME. First she built

Paritta learners including Sayadaw U Vicitta. Sayadaw U Vicitta is the first monk in Myanmar who could memorize the Three Pitaka treatises. A statue of the Sayadaw is placed in the Madame Tussauds Museum in London as the person with the best memory in the world.

The original name of Kandawgyi, one of the legendary places of Mingun, is Kyetdaunkkan Lake. King Bodaw three small meditation cabins on the 12 waning day of the Myanmar month Pyatho in 1276ME to look after an elderly man and an elderly women. Later, she built the Home.

Sagaing, founded by Athinkhaya Sawyun, son of Tasishin Thihathu, the builder of Pinya, in 1315 AD is now 700 years old. Throughout the 700 years, Sagaing saw the rule of successive kings, who build a large number of religious and cultural edifices. So Sagaing is now dotted with ancient buildings, which are the country's heritage. Of them 28 are in Mingun area.

The Pahtodawgyi, the Mingun Bell and the Lion Statues are the most attractive ancient heritages of Mingun area which is always crowded with visitors. Mingun will be famous internally and internationally as long as we preserve its legendary structures. (Translated by Tin Maung Than)

white elephant. Some records say

that it was named after the queen by the name Hsinbyu Mae. The diameter of the foot of the pagoda is about 321 feet.

Afterwards, we proceeded to the twin lion statues facing the Ayeyawady River. King Bodaw Phaya built the statues in 1793 AD. Each statue is 95 feet tall and has fingers, 5.5 feet in length and 4.5 feet in circumference. About 200,000 bricks were used in building the statues. Sadly the frontal part of the statues collapsed when an earthquake hit the area.

Then we went to the Pahtodawgyi, which was built by King Bodaw Phaya in 1790 AD. The King stopped building the pagoda as a prophecy appeared saying that the King would die if the pagoda was complete. Some historical records say that the King died before he could finish the pagoda.

The King has a wish to build the largest religious edifice in Myanmar, and in accord with the wish, he built the pagoda at a place now call Mingun. Although the original plan was to build a 500-feet tall pagoda, it collasped when the height reached 160 feet, according to historian Dr. Than Tun. According to palm leaf treatise, the diameter of the pagoda is about 400 feet and height is 528 feet. But the diameter stated in the stone inscription kept at Maha Muni Pagoda in Mandalay is 450 feet. There were stairs to climb over to the top of the Mingun Pahtodawgyi. But we went to the big bonze bell, which is called Mingun Bell. In the past the bell stood under the open sky. But now it is systematically kept in a grand building.

The King also built the Pondaw Pagoda, a scale-model of the Pahtodawgyi. The 15 feet tall pagoda was named Naungdawgyi (elder brother) Pagoda. If the Pahtodawgyi was complete, its design would be the same as that of the Naungdawgyi although the latter is much smaller.

Mingun Bell is the largest of the bells of the world that can produce a ringing sound. It is the second largest bell in the world. Cast at a place called Nandaw Kyun, the weight of the bronze bell is 55555 viss.

According to Myanmar belief, the number "five" represents Thursday. The British estimated the weight of the bell at 80 tons. But according to a Myanmar record, the bell weighs 55555 viss which is equal to 90.52 tons. The bell produces a beautiful ringing sound.

According to history recorded during the Konboung period, the bell was cast on the 5<sup>th</sup> waxing day of the Myanmar month of Kason 1170ME. Its roundabout measurement is 46 feet in diameter, 50 feet in width, 20 feet in length.

After visiting the bell, we went to Moemeikkon hillock. Moemeikkon is famous as the land of religious literature because of the brilliant religious accomplishments of the two eminent persons - Sayadaw U Vicitta and Nun Daw



# Lukaku hails 'world's best' Conte after Inter move

ROME — Romelu Lukaku said on Friday that having the chance to play for Antonio Conte drove him to join Inter Milan, hailing the Italian as the world's best coach after arriving from Manchester United. Asked by club media how the arrival of former Italy boss Conte at Inter this summer had influenced his decision to move to Serie A, he replied "a lot... he's the best manager in the world"

"He's somebody that can make players better all the time. You can see his record," said Lukaku. Conte has been a longtime admirer of Lukaku and tried to sign him for Chelsea before the Belgian's move from Everton to United in 2017. The 26-year-old completed his long-awaited move to Inter on Thursday, joining a club with ambitions of breaking fierce rival Juventus' stranglehold on domestic honours. Belgium's all-time top scorer with 48 goals, he will be at the centre of Inter's attack, taking the number 9 shirt away from former club captain Mauro Icardi after the Argentina international was frozen out last season following a bitter and public contract row. He hadn't played a single minute in United's pre-season campaign after being sidelined by Ole Gunnar Solskjaer despite scoring 42 times in all competitions while at Old Trafford. "I think Inter is a club with a lot of upsides. I think for me it was something I needed," Lukaku said. "I needed a challenge where I could help a team build for the future. For me, everything is present here to help me and I wish I can help my teammates with my hard work dedication to the game." Milan-based Gazzetta Dello Sport reports that he will earn 8.5 million euros a season at Inter, and claims that Inter will pay United an initial 65 million

euros (\$73 million) over five years with a further 10 million in potential add-ons, contrasting with reports in Britain that the Premier League club brought in 80 million euros. They have strengthened a squad that finished fourth in Serie A last season by signing veteran Uruguayan international defender Diego Godin and promising midfielder Nicolo Barella.

Inter are also reportedly close to bringing in Edin Dzeko, with the Bosnian international pushing for the move away from the Italian capital and Roma trying to retain him after failing to find an adequate replacement. Other targets reportedly include Barcelona's Ivan Rakitic and Lazio star Sergej Milinkovic-Savic, although the club also need to offload Icardi, who is reportedly only interested in a move to Juventus despite interest from Napoli and Roma.—AFP

### Pochettino concerned by transfer window 'mess'

LONDON — Mauricio Pochettino fears the decision to shut the Premier League transfer window before many of the other major leagues could "create a mess" at Tottenham Hotspur.

Pochettino signed Fulham's Ryan Sessegnon and Giovani Lo Celso from Real Betis on Thursday's deadline day after breaking their transfer record on Lyon's Tanguy Ndombele earlier in the window. But clubs in Italy, Spain and Germany, who all start their domestic seasons later than the Premier League, still have several weeks to sign players from England. With Tottenham stars Christian Eriksen, Toby Alderweireld, Danny Rose and Jan Vertonghen all linked with moves this summer, Pochettino is worried that his players will be distracted and potentially end up leaving without replacements being available.

"All the personal situations, it is not right to talk. There is a lot of rumours. We cannot waste time talking about every rumour that appeared on the news," Pochettino told reporters on Friday. "That is another point to argue that we are at a disadvantage with European clubs because they have 20 days more, because I think it is a big mistake for the Premier League to allow that.

"In this situation we open the door for clubs in Europe to try and create confusion in the club. The Premier League cannot give this advantage to European clubs because we are going to compete with them ... they can create a mess in a club like us."—AFP
