### (6) National Workshop on Myanmar Agenda 21 opens

YANGON, 7 May - The National Workshop on Myanmar Agenda 21 was opened with ceremony at the International Business Centre at 8 am today.

It was attended by Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs U Nyunt Swe, Deputy Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation U Tin Hlaing, Deputy Ministers for Mines U Hlaing Win and U Myint Thein, Deputy Minisyer for Labour U Kyaw Aye, officials of various Ministries, diplomats, officials of UN Agencies, experts and guests.

## (7) Tatmadaw columns size heroin refineries in Shan State

YANGON, 7 May-The Tatmadaw is carrying out tasks to eradicate narcotic drugs as a national duty.

A Tatmadaw column led by Commanding Officer Lt-Col Myint Lwin of North-East Command raided a heroin refinery in Muse Township, north of Shan State, (map ref: P-078644) about 9.05 am on 23 April.

After clashing with an armed group, the Tatmadaw column seized six huts used as heroin refinery, one M-22 rifle, 13.15 kilos of heroin, 117.5 kilos of raw opium, 150 gallons of opium liquid and chemicals-165 gallon's of acetic anhydride, 172 gallons of Lysol, 58 gallons of hydrochloric acid, 40 gallons of chloroform, 48 gallons of ether, 375 kilos of ammonia chloride and 200 kilos of sodium carbonic-and utensils used in refining heroin in the huts.

Similarly, on that morning, another Tatmadaw column of the same Command raided a heroin refinery (map ref: P-078638) and seized one M-22, two M21 and four huts used as heroin refinery after clashing with an armed group.

The column seized 12.35kilos of heroin, 23.7 kilos of grade-3 heroin, 47.7 kilos of grade-2 heroin, 22.5 kilos of heroin liquid, 367.7 kilos of raw opium and chemicals-30 gallons of Lysol, 12 gallons of hydrochloric acid, 15 gallons of chloroform, 16 gallons of ether and 54 gallons of acetic anhydride and utensils used in refining heroin in the huts.

At 6.30 am on 24 April, a Tatmadaw column raided a heroin refinery (map ref: P073629) and seized 13 huts and 6.6 kilos of heroin, 12.8 kilos of grade-3 heroin, 107.1 kilos of opium and chemicals-80 gallons of Lysol, 15 gallons of hydrochloric acid, 60 gallons of chloroform, 35 gallons of ether and 1,323 gallons of acetic anhydride, 800 kilos of ammonia chloride, 1,825 kilos of sodium carbonic and utensils used in refining heroin in the huts.

In the above-mentioned cases, the Tatmadaw columns seized a total of 32.10 kilos of heroin, 23.7 kilos of grade-3 heroin, 60.5 kilos of grade-2 heroin, 22.5 kilos of heroin liquid, 592.3 kilos of opium and 1,542 kilos of acetic anhydride and-other chemicals.
