(5) Japanese Government donates \$ 50,000, relief supplies for flood victims

YANGON, 12 Sept- Japanese Government presented US \$ 50,000 and relief supplies- blankets, towels, gasoline, batteries, soap, and washing powder-worth Yen 11. 75 million for victims of floods which occurred in some regions of the country in July and August.

The ceremony to hand the cash and kind was held at the Department of Relief and Resettlement this afternoon and attended by Charge d' Affaires of Japanese Embassy Mr Koichi Kawakami and officials, Director-General U Saw Thein of DRR and officials.

Mr Kawakami handed the donations to Director General U Saw Thein.

U Saw Thein thanked the donor and said so far the Myanmar Government has provided relief supplies worth over K 30.87 million to the victims.

(6) Special Envoy of Australian Foreign Minister calls on Chairman of NCCWC

YANGON, 12 Sept- Mr John Dauth, Special Envoy of Australian Foreign Minister, called on Member of National Convention Convening Commission Chairman of National Convention Convening Work Committee Chief Justice U Aung Toe at his office this morning.

He was accompanied by Ambassador of Australia Ms Lyndall Alexandra Mclean.

Also present were members of NCCC Vice-Chairman of NCCWC U Tha Tun, Secretary U Aye Maung and Joint Secretary-1 U Thaug Nyunt.

The members of NCCC replied to Mr Dauth's questions on National Convention and presented publications on National Convention to him.

(7) K 3.7 m relief goods distributed to flood-hit villages in Bago Division

YANGON, 12 Sept-Cash and relief goods were provided to the flood victims of DaikU, Nyaunglaybin and Shwekyin Townships in Bago Division for the second time from 5 to 7 September.

From the K 19.3 million donated by the public for the flood victims, the second cash assistance and relief goods were distributed to the 72 flood-hit villages of 37 village-tracts in the three townships.

The voluntary teams to distribute the relief goods to the villages were led by Col Khin Aung of the Office of Strategic Studies and the Directorate of Defence Services Intelligence.

The K 3.7 million relief goods included 300 bags of rice for five villages of four village-tracts of Nyaunglaybin Township, 1,350 bags of rice for 58 villages of 27 village tracts of Shwekyin Township, medicines, kitchen utensils, blankets, longyis, plastic sheets, personal goods and cash.
