YANGON, 29 Nov-Bus fares have been prescribed at the rate of 60 pyas per mile for the convenience of commuters and posted in each bus of the bus lines. The Yangon Division Peace and Development Council said complaints may be made through telephone numbers 291285, 289736, 552771 and 291308 if bus conductors overcharge bus fares or refuse to accept coupons of government employees.

If complaints are made for overcharging bus fares or if a bus is investigated to have done so, the bus in question will be fined K 5,000 the first time, K 10,000 the second time and K 15,000 the third time. The bus will be confiscated for one month or permanently for the fourth time offence.

The Yangon Division Peace and Development Council has asked the public to render assistance in the checks on bus lines beginning December.

(8) F&R beat Dong Thap 43 in 17th Asian Club Soccer Championship
