Secretary-1 delivers speech at opening of 14th Myanmar Traditional Cultural Performing Arts Competitions



Endeavours for producing food surplus

Now the population is increasing day after day. Most of the nations still face food problem. Therefore, arrangements are being made for eradication of starvation and ensuring food sufficiency.

Myanmar has favourable conditions for agriculture, and the government is building agrobased economic life. Myanmar has a population of over 55 million. The livelihood of most of the population is related to agriculture, livestock breeding and forestry sectors. There is food sufficiency in the country as the government has made efforts for boosting production in these three sectors.

Altogether 189 dams and 298 river water pumping stations were built nationwide. Cultivation of paddy and double and mixed cropping were extended and crops production has increased. The increase of irrigated farmland contributes towards greening of the nearby regions.

The government has also undertaken reclamation of highland cultivation in Shan and Chin States and Magway Division. Increase of cultivable lands also benefits regional development, cultivation of substitute crops and conservation of the environment.

Fish and meat sector has also developed thanks to the encouragement and assistance of the government. Fish and prawn breeding has become modernized. There is sufficiency in local consumption as off-shore and inshore fishing and fish market grow wider and surplus can be exported.

Myanmar with rich natural resources has to continue to make efforts for boosting agrobased production. Such endeavours will surely contribute towards the local food sufficiency as well as food supply in the region.

No quick end to Thai martial law

Thailand's Defence Minister says the state of martial law imposed after the country's recent coup should remain in place for at least another month

BANGKOK, 13 Oct -Bunrod Somtad, who was sworn in with the rest of the new Cabinet on Monday, said the situation was not yet stable.

The news is unlikely to be welcomed by the international community, which has urged Thailand to lift the restrictions as soon as possible.

Martial law curbs Press freedoms and limits political and public gatherings.

When the Thai military took over the country in a bloodless coup, they were broadly welcomed, especially in the capital Bangkok.

Many Thais were tired of months of political instability, and were pleased that their future now seemed clear.

But the international community was less impressed, seeing the coup as a setback to democracy. Since the takeover, the military has been anxious to allay these concerns.-Internet

Cuba calls for int'l support to end US blockade

HAVANA, 14Oct—The International Relations Commission of Cuba's legislature, the National Assembly of People's Power, on Thursday urged the international community to act against the US blockade on the Caribbean country.

United States has applied systematic, uninterrupted and ferocious sanctions against Cuba," the commission said in a statement, describing it as

"For 47 years, the ted States has applied designed to subject the Cuban people to hunger and desperation".

The statement said that the economic, trade and financial blockade had worsened and strengthened despite nearunanimous opposition from across the world.

The statement added that the blockade had met the UN definition of "an act perpetrated with the intention of partially or wholly destroying a national, ethnic, racial or religious group."

Cuba estimates that the blockade has caused 86 billion US dollars' worth of damage to the island's economy to date.

On 8 November, Cuba will present a report on the blockade to the UN General Assembly, seeking an immediate end to the blockade.

Murders, robberies up in US cities

WASHINGTON, 14 Oct — Latest evidence has shown that homicides and robberies are continuing to increase in dozens of US cities, less than a month after the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) reported that violent crime rates had risen across the nation in 2005.

A review of 55 cities' crime data from the first six months of this year indicated the overall number of homicides had

Robberies rose by nearly 10 per cent and aggravated assaults were up slightly. Of the 55 cities surveyed by the police group, 19 had double-digit percentage increases in homicides. More than 40 reported jumps in robberies.

While emphasizing the need to prevent terrorism, the US Justice Department has acknowledged that crime is continuing to rise

in some cities this year. But Deputy Attorney General Paul McNulty and other officials said it was too soon to tell whether or not the increases were a significant departure from the historically low crime rates of the past decade, the newspaper reported. *MNA/Xinhua*

China-made counter-terrorist robot showcased in Beijing

BEIJING, 14 Oct — China's new counter-terrorist robot was drawing crowds on Wednesday at the ongoing 2006 International Conference on Intelligent Robots and Systems in Beijing.

Looking like a cross between a tank and a crane, the robot was put through its paces at a mock danger zone at the conference centre.

Suddenly, a detonatorlike object emerges in its sight and the robot immediately locks on target. Rushing toward the danger, it adroitly clamps on to the suspicious object with its silvery white arm, throwing it into an explosive disposal container.

The 56-kilo robot is named RAPTOR-EOD (explosive ordnance disposal) and is a latest product of Beijing Universal Pioneering Technology Co Ltd.

The robot is able to move freely and make tight turns on different surfaces, said Han Guang, production president of the company.—*MNA/Xinhua*



Mexican archaeologists find largest Aztec figure

MEXICO, 14 Oct—Mexican archaeologists unveiled the largest Aztec idol ever discovered and said it could be a door to a hidden chamber at a ruined A A A A

temple under the heart of Mexico City.

The Aztecs, a warlike and deeply religious people who built numerous monumental works, ruled an empire stretching from the Gulf of Mexico to the Pacific Ocean and encompassing much of modern-day central Mexico.

The 12.4 tonne stone slab, 14 metres in surface area, was partially uncovered this month at the main Templo Mayor on the edge of the capital's central Zocalo square. Aztecs used the temple for worship and human sacrifice.

Excavators have beendiastonished by the size ofthe piece and its elaboratecoengraving of the earthmgod Tlaltecuhtli as they15uncovered more of thecoslab in recent days.sigAsked if it was the mostde

important Aztec piece found, anthropologist Alvaro Barrera said: "For its size, yes, for the importance ... we have to wait to see what we discover and its context". When it was discovered, officials said the monolith and an adjacent 15th Century altar comprised the most significant Aztec find in decades. —Internet



China's trade surplus in first nine months hits \$109.85b

BELJING, 14 Oct — China's trade surplus in the first nine months of this year hit 109.85 billion US dollars, higher than the total of 101.88 billion US dollars for the whole year in 2005.

Statistics released on Thursday by the General Administration of Customs showed that the monthly trade surplus slipped slightly to 15.3 billion US dollars in September from the monthly record of 18.8 billion US dollars in August. Statistics show exports in September rose 30.6 per cent over the same month of last year to 91.64 billion dollars, and imports increased 22 per cent to 76.34 billion dollars.

volume reached 1.27 trillion dollars in the first three quarters of the year. Exports rose 26.5 per cent to 691.2 billion dollars, and imports increased 21.7 per cent to 581.4 billion dollars.

Statistics also show that the European Union, the United States, Japan and the Association of South-East Asian Nations remained the four largest trade partners of China. The large growth in trade surplus has strained relations between China and its major trading partners and exerted greater pressure on the country to appreciate its currency value.

"It is unrealistic to reverse the trend in the short term so China's trade surplus against the United States continues to mount up," said Mei Xinyu, an expert with the Chinese Academy of International Trade and Economic Cooperation affiliated to the Ministry of Commerce.—*MNA/Xinhua*

WASHINGTON, 14 Oct — A Republican congressman pleaded guilty on Friday in the Jack Abramoff political corruption investigation, becoming the first lawmaker convicted in an election-year scandal that has reached into Congress and the Bush Administration.

Representative Bob Ney of Ohio admitted he had illegally accepted trips, meals, drinks, tickets to concerts and sporting events and other items worth tens of thousands of dollars in return for official acts performed on behalf of the lobbyist Abramoff and his clients.

Ney, who abandoned his reelection race in August as the US Justice Department investigated his links to the convicted Abramoff, said he was ashamed of the way his public service career was ending and will resign from Congress in the next few weeks.

But with the election less than a month away and with Democrats increasingly optimistic about winning control of the US Congress, the White House and House Republican leaders urged Ney to step down immediately.

"What Congressman Ney did was not a reflection of the Republican Party. It was a reflection of Congressman Ney and he ought to step down," White House spokesman Tony Snow said.

1,800-year-old painted coffin discovered in north China

HOHHOT, 14 Oct— Chinese archaeologists have discovered an ancient coffin painted with coloured drawings dating back to the Eastern Han Dynasty (AD 25-220) in the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region.

The funeral objects had already been robbed when the coffin was discovered from a tomb in Siziwang Banner. The coffin, in delicate appearance, was well preserved during excavation of the tomb.

"The colour drawings, painted at inner sides of the coffin, feature daily life and hunting activities," said Wang Dafang, an official with the Inner Mongolia

Autonomous Regional Cultural Relic Bureau. The most valuable painting on the coffin is

an episode on a horse pulling with five carriages. According to cultural experts, it might be one of ancient people's ideal imaginations of a train. The hunting-related drawings consist of animals ranging from goats, deer, dogs as well as the hunters.

Although further research is still needed to identify the specific age about the coffin, archaeologists had concluded that the coffin belongs to the Eastern Han Dynasty. *MNA/Xinhua*

Discussions of pensioners-20

After having lunch served by the family of a friend of ours, we came into the sitting room and began our discussions.

"The statement of China's UN representative, a member of the Security Council, made on 15-9-2006 was right. He said the UNSC had to deal with matters on peace and security only. If the council allowed to discuss such issues as human rights, refugees, drugs and AIDS, it would have to put every nation with such situations on the agenda. Myanmar's neighbouring countries and ASEAN nations did not believe that situations in Myanmar pose a threat to international peace and security. It was preposterous because the move was submitted to the council not by a country in the region but by a country from far region. Formal discussion on internal affairs of a country at the UNSC is contrary to Article 24 of the UN Charter."

"It is obvious that China and Myanmar are good and friendly neighbouring countries upholding the five principles of peaceful coexistence. If the UNSC wrongly makes a decision to take action against Myanmar, it is believed that China will continue to stand firmly by Myanmar. The stance of Russia is important as it is a permanent member that has the veto power. It is also a country that views the Myanmar issue correctly. It is assumed that Russia will not accept such unfair pressure on our country."

"Non-Aligned Movement comprising 118 countries sent a letter to the Chairman of the UNSC on 10-7-2006 stating that Myanmar issue should not be put on the council's agenda. Moreover, Non-Aligned Movement Summit held in Havana, Cuba on 17-9-2006 stated that putting Myanmar on the UNSC agenda was beyond the rights of the Council. We learnt that a paragraph was in the Final Document describing that decision by the Security Council to initiate formal or informal discussion on the situation in any member state of the UN or any issue that does not constitute a threat to international peace and security is contrary to Article 24 of the UN Charter."

"It is heartening to note that Non-Aligned Movement comprising 118 countries of 191 UN member countries supported Myanmar."

"According to the study of two economists of Harvard University, developing countries that succeed in winning a seat on the UN Security Council may reap economic benefits from rich countries particularly the US, that are willing to buy their votes."

"Foreign aids receipts to those countries may increase in time of conflicts and political crises around the world because the US would need their votes, the two Harvard economists said."

"On average, a non-permanent member of the Council enjoys a 59 percent increase in total aid from the US and eight percent increase in total development aid from the UN." to reach a decision with the help of the countries it has organized, the nations that often stand firmly on the world issues would use their vetoes to reject that decision. Don't worry about it."

"According to the opinion of Indonesian Ambassador to the UK broadcast on BBC, the reply was wise and remarkable."

"How did he reply?" "He said the move should be submitted to the Council only if the Myanmar issue actually posed international peace and security. The Security Council should not handle all the world issues. He said he feared that the role of the UNSC would fade away."

"Yes, of course. Attempts to create domestic affairs into a regional or international issue could lead the role of the UNSC to be distrustful and looked down upon."

"There are 148 issues to discuss at the UNSC. But Myanmar issue is not included in the top ten. It is obvious that it is not a kind of success that the expatriates, NLD and anti-government terrorist groups would be pleased."

"The people of our country have also learnt much about the stance of the government and the people. They also knew the actual situations after reading the articles and they can judge rightly the statements of internal and external elements."

"The people should be aware of the fact that foreign broadcasting stations are creating the situation like "88" disturbances through connections inside and outside the country."

NLD, so-called "88" generation student leaders and so-called veteran politicians began to take steps to create disturbances, some diplomats of big nations frequently came to NLD headquarters. We think that they would give instructions, hold coordination meeting and arrange contacts with external and internal elements.

"Right. In the "88" disturbances, internal and external destructive elements in collusion with some foreign broadcasting stations were manufacturing fabricated news. Such acts are like fanning up the flame to burn more and more. Such situation should never be forgotten."

"At that time, unless the Tatmadaw stepped in and controlled the situation the people would surely suffer much more than the situation in Iraq."

"Here, we didn't understand why the US harboured a grudge against our country."

"I had already said before. According to the geographical location, our country shares borders with the two most populous and strong nations. It can serve as a link between the South Asia and South-East Asia. From that territorial waters of the country a power can take control of the Strait of Malacca. The country has a long stretch of territorial waters. This point is something that meets the fancy of the powerful nation which longs for overwhelming and controlling the world. A powerful nation would be in a position to have a strategic location if it is able to set up its military base in our country."

"In my school days one thing still in my mind is that the US offered to build the Yangon-Mandalay highway free of charge. Its aim seemed to be the plot to land its aircraft there. It was likely that this was noticed by a big neighbouring nation. That big nation thus offered to grow flowery plants free of charge in the middle of the highway. As such, that project could not be materialized."

"We don't understand why the NLD wants to rely on external elements. It is time the NLD served the interest of the State."

"It is just to grasp power. The NLD has never served any interest of the State since its birth. Far from serving the national interest, it has called for imposing four sanctions on the country in synchronization with expatriates. In consequence, it is known to all that the US imposed economic sanctions on the country."

"The NLD cannot bear to see the prosperity of the State and the people but it wants the State and the people to get into trouble and hardship that could lead to unrest. It constantly intends to grab power through shortcut by creating disturbances and chaos in the nation. Those who rely on external elements would surely come to a sticky end."

"Therefore, the resignation of the NLD members is seen in the newspapers almost every day."

"The NLD is demanding for a dialogue only. It has been sticking to the 1990 election results. Apart from that, it is not engaged in any task for national development."

"The Head of State himself met with Daw Suu Kyi four times and the ministerial level officials 20 times. She was given chances time and again to cooperate with the government in the interest of the State. Relying on external elements and being controlled by dollars provided to her as awards, Daw Suu Kyi has been giving priority to own interest rather than national interest."

"If everything is done with the aim of serving the national interest rather than own interest with goodwill and understanding it will be beneficial to all."

"Looking at the People's Republic of China, one can see to what extent it is developing in the practice of communism, socialist-market economic system and socialist-democracy. Such development is usually followed by democracy and human rights."

"Our nation will see unprecedented progress at such a time when relentless efforts are being made unless sanctions have been imposed on her. Such national development based on strong economy will surely bring about human rights and democracy aspired by the people."

"It is time parties and politicians understood this. They are to call for immediately lifting sanctions to bring about national development instead of selling the nation and being under the influence of external elements in order to grasp power. If they do so, they with common goals with the government will be able to sort out differences between one another, thereby resulting in the emergence of a peaceful, modern and developed nation." After the discussion, I on my way home pondered that a peaceful, modern, developed and disciplineflourishing democratic nation will emerge as soon as possible if every politician puts the national interest in the fore rather than his own interest and the party's interest. And I wish every politician be able to assess himself and amend his attitude and deeds in order that he may serve the national interest.

Afghan gunmen seize Italian journalist

KABUL, 15 Oct — Gunmen kidnapped an Italian photojournalist in southern Afghanistan on Saturday, accusing him of spying, an Afghan news agency reported.

The Pajhwok agency named the journalist simply as Gabriele and reported a call to his mobile phone had been answered by someone who said: "We are the Taleban and we have abducted the foreigner on charges of spying."

The Italian online newspaperPeaceReporter, which specializes in reports from conflict

zones, said Torsello had confirmed by phone he had been kidnapped. PeaceReporter said he had spoken briefly on the phone to the head of security at a hospital in Lashkar Gah run by the Italian relief organization Emergency. He said he did not know where he was being held.

According to Peace-Reporter, Torsello said he had been kidnapped on Thursday, while travelling on a public bus.

Pajhwok quoted Gholam Mohammad, who said he had been travelling with the journalist, as saying they had been stopped by five gunmen on the road from the capital of Helmand Province to the capital of neighbouring Kandahar Province.

Experts warn three bln people to suffer water shortage by 2025

XIAMEN, 14 Oct-Three billion people, or 46 per cent of the world's population will suffer water shortages by 2025, experts warned here Thursday.

The prediction was made by Professor Jan C Schippers, a researcher with the UNESCO-IHE Institute for Water Education, and was echoed by other participants at the International Forum for Coastal Cities, opened Thursday in Xiamen, a southeastern city in China.

Currently, about one billion people around the globe are plagued by water shortages and that number continues to climb.

Water shortages, which are especially acute in North China, North Africa and East Asia, have been worsened by drought, pollution, waste and bad management, according to Schippers.-MNA/Xinhua

Ban, 62, is the first Asian leader since Myanmar's U Thant led the United Nations from 1961 to 1971. Asian nations had insisted it was their turn for the job to succeed Kofi Annan, a Ghanaian who has led the world body for the past decade.

OSLO, 4 Oct — The birds and the bees may be gay, according to the world's first museum exhibition about homosexuality among animals.

of gay or lesbian behaviour among giraffes, penguins, parrots, beetles, whales and dozens of other creatures, the Oslo Natural History Museum concludes human homosexuality cannot be viewed as "unnatural".

"We may have opinions on a lot of things, but one thing is clear homosexuality is found throughout the animal kingdom, it is not against nature," an exhibit statement said.

Geir Soeli, the project leader of the exhibition entitled "Against Nature", told *Reuters*: "Homosexuality has been observed for more than 1,500 animal species, and is well documented for 500 of them."

The museum said the exhibition, opening on Thursday despite condemnation from some Christians, was the first in the world on the subject. Soeli said a Dutch zoo had once organized

"The sexual urge is strong in all animals.... It's a part of life, it's fun to have sex," Soeli said of the reasons for homosexuality or bisexuality among animals.

One exhibit shows two stuffed female swans on a nest — birds sometimes raise young in homosexual couples, either after a female has forsaken a male mate or donated an egg to a pair of males.

One photograph shows two giant erect penises flailing above the water as two male right whales rub together.

Another shows a male giraffe mounting another for sex, another describes homosexuality among beetles.





Thousands protest against cuts in health service in Britain

LONDON,15 Oct — Thousands of people took to the streets on Saturday in southern Britain to protest against cuts in the national health service (NHS) scheme.

The demonstrations in Oxford, Brighton and Haywards Heath followed huge rallies across Britain. Police said about 7,000 protesters were at Haywards Heath in southeast England.

Unions and campaign groups fear that up to 60 main acute hospitals could be closed or downgraded because of financial cuts, reported the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC).

Geoff Martin, head of campaigns at the pressure group Health Emergency, said people who joined the national protest against the government's NHS cuts programme know that "the planned axing of front line services has nothing to do with a rational planning process and everything to do with hacking back the NHS budget."


A spokesman from the Department of Health said everyone knows that hospital services are changing.

"The White Paper 'Our Health, Our Care, Our Say', set out plans to shift some into the community to ensure faster, better and more convenient access for patients," he said, adding "this followed the biggest public engagement exercise ever and the plans are based on what the public told us they want from local health services.

But it did not "mean wholesale closures of district general hospitals", and NHS clinicians and managers needed to work with local communities to decide on the best organization of services for patients in their areas, noted the spokesman. *MNA/Xinhua*

Mon Peace Group (Myeik Region) condemns US for putting Myanmar on the agenda of UNSC

NAY PYI TAW, 15 Oct—Mon Peace Group (Myeik Region) on 28 September issued the declaration on its stance over the decision to put Myanmar on the agenda of the United Nations Security Council.

The following is the full text of the declaration.

The declaration of Mon Peace Group (Myeik Region) on condemnation of US interference in Myanmar's internal affairs using the UN. 28 September 2006

1. Owing to the submission of the US permanent representative to the UN, a decision was made on 15 September to put Myanmar on the agenda of the UN Security Council accusing the country of posing a threat to regional stability.

2. Today is the time when the government hand in hand with the entire national people is making all-out efforts for prevalence of peace and stability, economic development and flourishing of democracy aspired by the people.

3. The government has laid down the seven-point Road Map and is convening the National Convention based on the already-achieved infrastructures necessary for a future democratic nation. Hence, there is no reason for Myanmar to pose a threat to regional stability.

4. The accusation of the US using the UN is just a plot to impede the efforts for prevalence of peace and stability, economic development and flourishing of democracy. That is way the peace group declares that it condemns the act of the US in the strongest terms.
