National Herbal Park opens in Nay Pyi Taw

NAY PYI TAW, 5 Jan — Hailing the 60th Anniversary Independence Day the National Herbal Park was opened at the park, here, yesterday.

Present on the occasion were Commander of Nay Pyi Taw Command Maj-Gen Wai Lwin, the ministers, the chief justice, the attorney-general, the

deputy ministers, officials, the secretary of Nay Pyi Taw Development Committee and members and national races.

Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation Maj-Gen Htay Oo, Minister for Health Dr Kyaw Myint and Minister for Forestry Brig-Gen Thein Aung formally opened the park.

Next, Commander Maj-Gen Wai Lwin and Minister for Progress of Border Areas and National Races and Development Affairs Nay Pyi Taw Mayor Col Thein Nyunt formally unveiled the signboard of the National Herbal Park and sprinkled scented water on it.

The commander, the

ministers and party went to herbal nursery of the Ministry of Forestry and inspected herbal plants used in production of medicines for cholera, diarrhoea and dysentery in the park. They also observed rare herbal and medicinal plants from Kachin State and species of medicinal plants.

Altogether 3,065 plants of 208 rare species from Kachin, Kayah and Shan States and Sagaing, Taninthayi, Yangon and Ayeyawady Divisions are grown.

The commander and the ministers inspected medicinal plants of the herbal park of the Ministry of Health and medicines.

Altogether 8,425 plants of 424 species from Mon and Kayin States are grown. They are used in treatment of hypertension and diabetes.

The commander and the ministers inspected herbal plants of Mandalay, Magway and Bago Divisions and Rakhine and Chin States. They are used in treatment of malaria and tuberculosis. The Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation carries out conservation of the herbal plants. The ministry grows 13,340 plants of 87 species in the garden.

The 200-acre National Herbal Park was set up near the Nay Pyi Taw-Taungnyo Road by the Ministry of PBANRDA with the aim of establishing a herbal park of international level with variety of plants. The public can visit the park. —MNA

Preserve and safeguard cultural heritage

Myanmar has been a culturally civilized country for thousands of years. And it has stood tall with own monarchs. Therefore, its own culture, way of life and customs have remained flourishing up to now.

Now, the government is revitalizing and preserving cultural sites and monuments systematically. The process includes renovation of religious edifices, excavation of the ancient palaces and city walls of Myanmar kings, excavation of ancient cities and doing research on them, and collecting and maintaining historic artifacts, stone plaque with inscriptions and palm-leaf manuscripts.

The palaces of Myanmar monarchs have been excavated in accordance with historical evidences and stone plaques of inscriptions without infringing their original styles. So far, Kanbawzathadi palace in Bago, Shwebon Yadana Mingala palace in Shwebo and Mya Nan San Kyaw palace in Mandalay have been rebuilt.

Archaeologists have excavated the palace of King Anawrahta, founder of the First Myanmar Empire, and conducted research on it. Myanmar architects reconstructed the palace according to the evidences of its foundation, wall paintings, and architecture.

Maha Yaza Thiri Zeya Bumi palace in Bagan archaeological region was opened on 2 January. Bagan Palace has been rebuilt in accordance with the style of Bagan Period together with archaeological edifices and handicraft in Bagan Archaeological Region, and it reflects national prestige and integrity and dynamism of patriotic spirit of national people.

Pakistan bars British envoy seeing detained lawyer

ISLAMABAD, 4 Jan — Pakistani police stopped British High Commissioner Robert Brinkley from meeting on Thursday a detained lawyer who spearheaded opposition to President Pervez Musharraf, the British High Commission said.

Aitzaz Ahsan, a former member of the National

Assembly for the party of assassinated opposition leader Benazir Bhutto, was detained after Musharraf imposed emergency rule on 3 November. He is being held under house arrest at his home in the eastern city of Lahore.

The British envoy went to Ahsan's home but police posted there

did not allow him in to see the lawyer. Police did not give a reason, a British High Commission spokesman said. "We just wanted to underline the fact that we're still calling for the release of all those detained under the state of emergency," the spokesman said.

Road accidents kill 369 in Thailand during New Year

BANGKOK, 4 Jan — Road accidents in the past six of seven most dangerous days during the New Year holiday have killed 369 people and injured 4,514 throughout Thailand, according to the Interior Ministry on Thursday.

Bangkok has had the most casualties of all provinces, followed by Khon Kaen and Nakhon Pathom Provinces. Twenty people were killed in the capital.

According to Interior Ministry, drunk driving caused 42 per cent of the incidents. Speeding, reckless driving and motorcyclist not wearing helmets were blamed for the rest.

December 30, 2007 saw the highest rate of deaths with 85 people killed.

Last year, more than 5,000 road accidents were monitored across the country. The death toll was at 480 and the number of injured victims was at 4,900 during the period. —MNA/Xinhua

Explosion in Istanbul garbage bin wounds three

ISTANBUL, 4 Jan — An explosion in a garbage bin in Istanbul wounded three people on Wednesday, private broadcaster CNN Turk reported on its website.

State news agency *Anatolian* said two people had been injured in the explosion in Istanbul's Kucukcekmece District, the same district where a bomb blast killed a woman last week.

That bomb attack had come just a day after a 25-year-old man carrying a backpack filled with explosives was arrested outside an underground station in central Istanbul, Turkey's largest city.

Authorities have stepped up security in the main cities around the Eid holiday and New Year's celebrations, and tensions are running especially high because Turkey has been carrying out cross-border military strikes in northern Iraq aimed at the separatist Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK). —MNA/Reuters

Israeli troops kill five Palestinians in Gaza clashes

GAZA, 4 Jan — Israeli troops killed three Palestinian gunmen and two civilians on Thursday during a raid into the Gaza Strip, the Army and hospital officials said. An Army

spokeswoman said troops searching for militants who fired rockets into Israel came under attack by armed Palestinians east of the town of Khan Younis, near the Hamas-ruled territory's

border. The soldiers shot two gunmen dead. Palestinian medical officials were not immediately allowed to approach and identify the bodies.

In a separate incident, witnesses said an Israeli tank fired a shell at a home near Khan Younis, killing two women occupants and a gunman who was outside the building. The Islamic Jihad militant group claimed the slain fighter as its own. —MNA/Reuters

11-year-old boy reaches Aconagua's mountain peak

BUENOS AIRES, 5 Jan — Argentina's National Police (PN) reported on Friday they are concerned because Jordan Romero, a 11-year-old citizen of the United States, reached Aconagua's 6,969-metre-high mountain peak, and it is against the law.

Argentine provincial officials are unhappy and concerned about Romero's mountain feat because this may start a race to see who can break his record and it definitely endangers youngsters' lives, reknown mountain climber Pablo Perello and head of Mendoza's Protected Areas said.

Aconagua mountain is located in Argentina's Mendoza Province, near

the Chilean border and children under 14 years old have been restricted from entering it since 1990 through resolution

0115 after a family tried to climb it with a 4-year old youngster, the PN added.

Cosmetics and Health

With the upcoming civilization and rapid industrialization our present world is facing day-to-day, we cannot avoid the by-products being formed during the development of commercial products that we use every day. Such includes dangerous chemicals that can come to contact every day from both our environment and our work as well as in using personal care products and cosmetics.

There is no one who does not feel the love of beauty and it will be extremely rare to find a woman who has not used a cosmetic. Both the production and the use of modernized cosmetic products such as skin care products, cleaning products, etc., has risen up alarmingly. During production, cosmetic manufacturers invariably have to use chemical ingredients to promote the quality of their products and to attract more consumers and most of the chemical ingredient used in cosmetic, soaps and shampoos are now concerned with the development of some forms of cancer, birth defects and other health problems.

Chemicals mostly used today include phthalates, ethylene dioxide, 1,4-dioxane, formaldehyde, nitrosamines and acrylamide. Lead is used in lipsticks to brighten the colour and for long-lasting effect and 1,4-dioxane is used in shampoo. Since these cosmetics are used almost daily, even little amount of chemicals in them can give harm over a long period. For example, daily use of nail-polish can affect health because of its chemical ingredients and such fact has often been overlooked. Over and above, most countries do not have protective laws for safe production of cosmetics and no action has been taken to test whether the toxic chemicals in them can adversely affect health.

The Problem of lead in lipstick (Poison Kiss)

The use of lead in lipsticks, as mentioned above, has now been questioned from many aspects. People noticed that it is necessary to know the lead levels in lipstick if we wish to choose a safe product. It has been found that more than half of 33 top-branded lipsticks tested contained detectable levels of lead ranging from 0.03 to 0.65 ppm. Lead levels in some lipsticks can be as high as 10 to 20 ppm, and one third of the lipsticks in the market exceeded the 0.01 ppm, which is the FDA lead limit for candy.

Lead is a proven neurotoxin that can cause learning language and behavioral problems and is also linked to infertility and miscarriage. There is no

safe level of lead and no amount of exposure is without harm. Therefore, pregnant women should avoid using lead containing lipsticks because lead can enter the fetus through the placenta. Lipsticks from Cover girl, L'Oreal and Christian Dior were found to have high lead level exceeding the limit of 0.1 ppm in candy, yet the FDA has neglected to set a lead limit for lipsticks. Lipsticks produced even from highly popular companies does not guarantee safe product. Ideally, the lead level in a lipstick should be undetectable. Lipsticks, like foodstuffs, are ingested directly into the body.

There are two possible ways that lead gets into lipsticks. From colorants used in lipstick, which may contain lead or from raw materials such as zinc oxide, titanium dioxide, mineral wax or paraffin, mineral oil and petrolatum which are used in its production.

Perfumes and Health

Of the many ingredients identified, some are considered non-toxic while others are known to be toxic to skin, mucous membrane, respiratory tract, reproductive and nervous system, on entering the body from various routes including skin absorption and inhalation. Additionally, two ingredients (phenyl methyl acetic acid ester and 2,6-bis (1,1-dimethyl ethyl)-1-methyl-phenol) were indentified as carcinogens.

Cosmetics and Cancer

In the US, more than 38,000 cosmetic injuries requiring medical attention are reported annually. Ingredients in shampoos, tooth pastes, skin creams and other personal care products, fabric softeners, make-up, hair-care products, colognes, perfumes and other scented products can be dangerous to your health. Regularly used cosmetics like soaps, sunscreens, deodorants, lipsticks and perfumes are capable of causing an allergic reaction or asthma attack and contact dermatitis is extremely common.

Carcinogens and other dangerous chemicals in cosmetics and personal care products include sodium lauryl sulfate (SLS), sodium laureth sulfate (SLES), propylene glycol, dicthanolamine (DEA), cocamide DEA, lauramide DEA, fluoride, alcohol, alpha hydroxyl acid (AHA), aluminum, butane, dioxin, formaldehyde, mineral oil, petrolatum, propane, talc and hundreds more. All these chemicals can cause cancer, birth defects, central nervous system disorders, allergic

respiratory reactions, irritation of the skin and eyes.

Soap, cleaning products, and personal care products including lotions, shampoo, hair conditioners, contain ethylated alcohol, polysorbate and laureths. These ingredients are generally contaminated with high concentration of the highly volatile 1,4-dioxane. The carcinogenicity of dioxane in rodents was first reported in 1965 and subsequently confirmed in other studies by the National Cancer Institute in 1978. The predominant sites of cancer were nasal passages in rats and liver in mice. Epidemiological studies on dioxane-exposed furniture makers have also reported suggestive evidence of excess nasal passage cancer. About 97% of hair relaxers, 57% of baby soaps, and 22% of other cosmetics have been found to be contaminated with 1,4 dioxane.

The top seven carcinogenic impurities common to personal care product ingredients are hydroquinone, ethylene dioxide, 1,4-dioxane, formaldehyde, nitrosamines, PAHs and acrylamide. Hair dyes, particularly black and dark brown colors, are associated with increased incidence of human cancer including Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, multiple myeloma and Hodgkin's disease.

Inhaling cosmetic talc and using it in the genital area can increase the risk of ovarian cancer (American Journal of Medicine, March, 1997). Colouring bath products can concentrate in bladder possibly raising the risk of bladder cancer. Hair dyes may be responsible for 20% of non-Hodgkins lymphoma in women. Hair dressers are in an occupation associated health hazard with a high risk for cancers. Deodorants containing antiperspirants commonly cause inflammation of sweat glands and the formation of cysts under the arm. Some ingredients in Mascara can cause blindness. Nowadays, people can plump up and de-wrinkle their faces by means of simple lotion without injecting substances as previously required. However, there is a need to know if the ingredients of such products are compatible to prevent allergic reaction, contact dermatitis, bleeding from uterus, inflammation and cancers.

In conclusion, it is needed to take caution in using cosmetics because daily use of them may lead to health hazards. It is more important to understand the safety of ingredients in cosmetics you are using rather than using a popular or expensive brand out of ignorance. Youth should avoid dying hair and using cosmetics with hazardous chemicals. Pregnant mothers should realize the dangers of chemicals and try not to use them for the sake of babies. Cosmetics from natural products like coconut oil, Thana-khar, Ta-yaw kin-mon are harmless yet giving economic and health benefits to the user. Therefore, use of natural and domestic products should be encouraged. The FDAs worldwide agreed that a cosmetic manufacturer must neither use ingredients and raw materials not approved by it nor market the final products in any country without prior approval by the government. The protective laws for safe production of cosmetics are urgently needed to take actions and restrict manufacturers in using lead and cancer-causing chemicals as ingredients in cosmetics.

There is no one who does not feel the love of beauty and it will be extremely rare to find a woman who has not used a cosmetic. Both the production and the use of modernized cosmetic products such as skin care products, cleaning products, etc., has risen up alarmingly. During production, cosmetic manufacturers invariably have to use chemical ingredients to promote the quality of their products and to attract more consumers and most of the chemical ingredient used in cosmetic, soaps and shampoos are now concerned with the development of some forms of cancer, birth defects and other health problems.

China bans online sale of lotteries
to ensure regulation

BEIJING, 4 Jan — No institutions will be allowed to sell lotteries on the Internet any more in China, said a circular issued Wednesday jointly by the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Civil Affairs and the General Administration of Sports.

Those beginning to sell

lotteries online prior to the issuance of the circular will stop the activity immediately as of the day when the document was issued.

Those failing to stop online sale on time will be penalized by telecommunication regulators according to related

laws and rules.

Perpetrators of online sale of illegal lotteries, or those who intercepted money from lottery sale or gambled online, will be prosecuted.

According to Wang Xuehong, head of the research institute of lottery under the Beijing University, there are honesty and security problems in the area of online lottery sale. It is difficult for buyers to tell legal websites from illegal ones.—MNA/Xinhua

Cargo ship sinks in Sea
of Azov, at least three dead

SOFIA/ KIEV, 4 Jan — A Bulgarian cargo ship with 11 crew on board sank in rough weather in the Sea of Azov on Thursday, drowning at least three seamen, rescue officials said.

The ship sank near the narrow Kerch Strait, between the Sea of Azov and the Black Sea, where a dozen vessels, some carrying oil products, went down or were damaged in a storm in November.

One Bulgarian seaman was rescued alive, Russian news agencies reported, but efforts to save more crew from the vessel, called the Vanessa, were hampered by stormy conditions, and rescuers ceased for the night.

Interfax agency reported the rescued sailor as saying he saw four crew managing to reach a life raft, raising hopes more would be found alive.

Beijing's top universities
remain popular

BEIJING, 4 Jan — Graduate schools of famous universities in Beijing still enjoy huge popularity among applicants in spite of the dropping number of postgraduate applications this year.

Some 214,450 students have registered to take the postgraduate entrance exams for universities and research institutes in

Beijing in 2008, 3.2 per cent down from last year, the Beijing Authority of Education and Examinations said.

Analysts say that the decline has been a result of fiercely competitive job market in which master-degree holders are no longer attractive to employers. But, first-tier institutions of higher learning in Beijing do not

seem to be affected, according to a survey by the China Youth Daily published on Wednesday.

Four universities including Peking University, Renmin University of China, Beijing Normal University and Tsinghua University have each received more than 10,000 postgraduate applications this year, it said.—MNA/Xinhua

Nicaragua seizes 20 tons
of cocaine in 2007

MANAGUA, 4 Jan — Nicaraguan anti-narcotics agents confiscated over 20 tons of cocaine and 186 kilogrammes of heroine and arrested 900 suspected drug traffickers in 2007, National Police spokesman Alonso Sevilla said on Wednesday.

The confiscations and arrests, carried out in 2,000 operations across the

country, marked a record figure in the whole Central American region, the spokesman said. Of the operations, 44 were carried out against alleged international drug traffickers and the rest against local drug traffickers, Sevilla said.

The detainees included Nicaraguans, Mexicans, Guatemalans and Salvadoreans, all with alleged links to drug cartels in Colombia and Mexico,

Sevilla added. Some six million US dollars, two small airplanes, many boats, vehicles and communication equipment were also seized in the operations, according to Sevilla.

In recent years, Nicaragua has become an important channel for drugs smuggled from South America to Mexico and the United States.

Fire ravages Manila
shopping mall, no casualties

MANILA, 4 Jan — A fire in a shopping mall in the Philippine capital Manila burned through most of the day on Thursday, sending a thick pall of black smoke into the air that was visible across the city of 12 million people.

No one was injured in the fire at the mall in the crowded Baclaran neighbourhood in the heart of the city. Officials said the fire began at around dawn in an air conditioning

unit and engulfed the mall before it was brought under control 10 hours later.

The smoke was visible from many parts of the city, including from the international airport.

France warns against excessive mobile phone use

PARIS, 4 Jan— The French Health Ministry on Wednesday issued a warning against excessive mobile phone use, especially by children, though it recognized science had not proved cellular technology was dangerous.

The appearance on the market of mobile phones designed for children has raised concern since youngsters would be particularly vulnerable to any possible health

effects, the Ministry of Health, Youth and Sports said in a statement.

“As the hypothesis of a risk cannot be entirely excluded, precaution is justified,” the ministry said. It recommended using mobile phones in moderation, especially among children, and gave advice on how users could reduce their exposure to any possible risk.

“One should use a mobile phone with good judgement, avoid calling

when reception is poor, or during high speed travel, and finally, keep the telephone away from sensitive areas of the body by using a hands-free kit,” the ministry said.

Health Minister Roselyne Bachelot-Narquin said on France 2 television that mobile phones given to children could be useful safely items, but parents should be cautious about frequent use.

Czechs to build 15 green houses in Antarctica

PRAGUE, 4 Jan — Czech scientists want to build 15 little green houses in the Antarctica to simulate the process of warming and the emergence of primitive plants in what were originally life-unfriendly conditions, Czech biologist Milos Bartak said on Wednesday.

The first results of the experiment are expected in five years, the Czech news agency CTK quoted Bartak, a biologist from Masaryk University in Brno as saying. Four such green houses have yet been built on James Ross Island, Antarctica, for the time being. The scientists will wait for the green houses to become green with algae, mosses and lichen, CTK said.

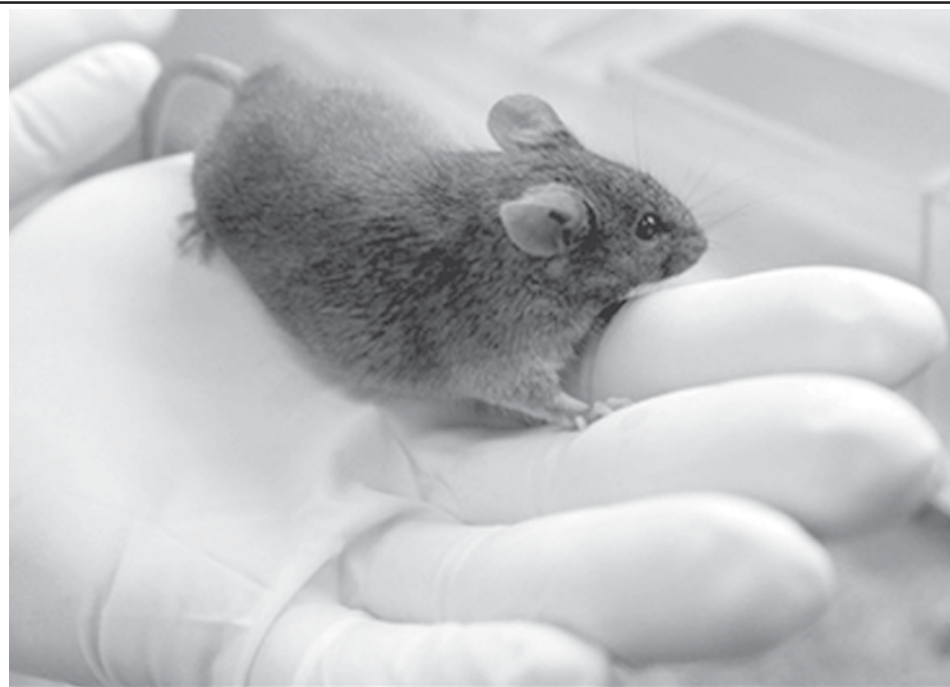
“Each little green house, spreading on about 1.5 square metre, contains a small recording device connected to 12 sensors

monitoring changes in the green house,” Bartak said. Although the green houses lack roofs, the temperature inside is two degrees Centigrade

higher than outside.

The enclosed space is protected from wind-storm, but not from rain and snowfall.

BRUSSELS, 5 Jan— ViroClinics, a small company run by the Erasmus Medical Centre in Rotterdam, has tested a vaccine against bird flu developed by a British pharmaceutical firm on 20 ferrets, which have bronchial tubes similar to

those of humans, Dutch newspaper *De Volkskrant* reported Thursday.

The vaccine against the lethal H5N1 bird flu virus on animals was developed by British pharmaceutical firm GSK.

The vaccine offers protection to those ferrets

against not only the H5N1 virus but several other bird flu viruses that occur worldwide.

The H5N1 virus has killed millions of poultry in the last three years, mainly in Asian countries.

Moderate quake jolts Bali Island

NZ tourism could be hit badly by gas emissions

WELLINGTON, 4 Jan — A new research has suggested gas emissions could have far-reaching implications on New Zealand's tourism industry, local media reported on Thursday.

The study conducted by New Zealand's Otago University and released recently found greenhouse gas emissions generated by visitors travelling to New Zealand are far greater than had been previously

thought, and the scale of emissions could have far-reaching implications for the tourism industry, according to a report on the website of radio Newstalk ZB.

Researcher Craig Rodger said as tourism is New Zealand's number one export earner, the findings give cause for concern. Emissions work out at about eight million tons a year.

Finger length could predict arthritis

BEIJING, 5 Jan — A study of more than 2,000 people, published in the journal *Arthritis and Rheumatism*, suggests that people — particularly among women — whose index finger is shorter than their ring finger are up to twice as likely to suffer from the condition, which is the most common form of arthritis. □□□

Index to ring finger length ratio (referred to as 2D:4D) is a trait known for its differences between the sexes. Men typically have shorter second than fourth digits; in women, these fingers tend to be about equal in length. Previous studies had linked smaller ratio to athletic and sexual prowess. And now researchers at the University of Nottingham have discovered that

arthritis could be connected to the fingers. □□□ Professor Michael Doherty, lead researcher, said, “The 2D:4D length ratio appears to be a new risk factor for the development of OA. Specifically, women with the “male” pattern of 2D:4D length ratio—that is, ring finger relatively longer than the index finger — are more likely to develop knee OA.”

Holders Sevilla drawn against Barcelona in Cup

MADRID, 5 Jan — Holders Sevilla have been handed the tie of the round in the last 16 of the King's Cup after being paired up with Barcelona during Friday's draw.

The UEFA Cup winners, who beat Getafe in last season's final, will play the first leg at home next week and the return at the Nou Camp on 16 January.

Sevilla staged a heart-stopping comeback to defeat Denia 5-4 on aggregate in midweek, while Barcelona completed a

5-2 win over another third division side Alcoyano despite being held 2-2 at the Nou Camp.

"It is a tie that will really test the level of the team," Sevilla defender Daniel Alves told a news conference. "But we know that we always play better against the big sides and we need to make sure that happens in this match."

The winner of the tie will meet either Recreativo Huelva or Villarreal in the quarter-finals.

League leaders Real Madrid were drawn against Real Mallorca, who defeated the nine-times European champions on their way to winning the Cup in 2003.

Wenger says Beckham did not figure in club's plan

LONDON, 5 Jan — David Beckham sported the Arsenal strip as he joined the squad in training on Friday, but manager Arsene Wenger said the former England captain did not figure in the Premier League club's plans.

The LA Galaxy midfielder wore the full Gunners kit for the workout, including the squad number 23 he donned for Real Madrid as well as for his current MLS side, but Wenger said it was to help Beckham reach fitness in time for his return to the US.

"He is working to be fit (in readiness for) when he is moving (back) to Los Angeles in February, so now, in January, we are giving him assistance with his fitness," Wenger told a news conference.

Wenger, whose side leads the Premier League and faces an FA Cup trip to Championship side (second division) Burnley on Sunday, said Beckham's presence did not signal any future intentions on the part of Arsenal.

Asked if he was tempted to sign Beckham during the transfer window, Wenger said simply: "No."

Beckham, who has won 99 England caps and retains hopes of being selected by new coach Fabio Capello for his first fixture, at home to Switzerland next month, has a home close to the Arsenal training ground in Hertfordshire.— MNA/Reuters

Dortmund says Lehmann mulling offer

BERLIN, 5 Jan — Borussia Dortmund have held talks with unsettled Arsenal goalkeeper Jens Lehmann and were "cautiously optimistic" he would accept an offer to return to his former club, the Bundesliga side's managing director said.

"In my view it was a very positive chat. Jens

said he would think about (the offer), but also asked that he not be put under pressure to make a decision, which is fine by us," managing director Hans-Joachim Watzke told a news conference.

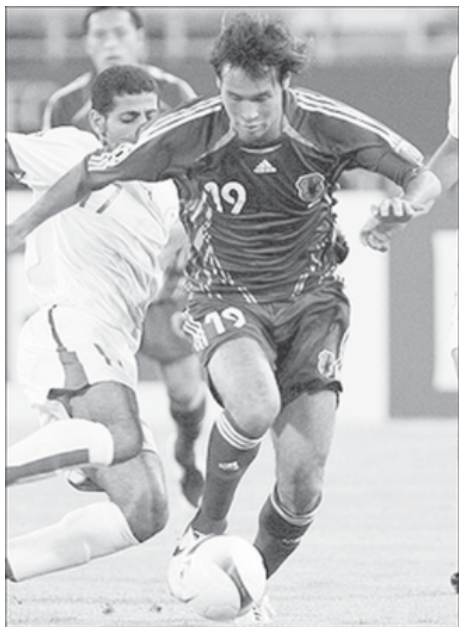
"I don't know when a decision will come ... but I can say that we are cautiously optimistic about

both the talks and the decision." But Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger poured cold water on the prospect of Lehmann returning home, saying he remained firmly part of the Premier League club's plans.

"I know nothing about it, so it would have surprised me if a player who was under contract was announced somewhere else today," Wenger told reporters on Friday.

"That would have been a big surprise to me. As far as I am concerned, Jens Lehmann will be in goal at Burnley (in the FA Cup on Sunday). He is playing at Burnley."

Germany's first choice keeper at the 2006 World Cup, Lehmann is keen to keep his place in the national team for the European Championship finals in Switzerland and Austria in June. — MNA/Reuters

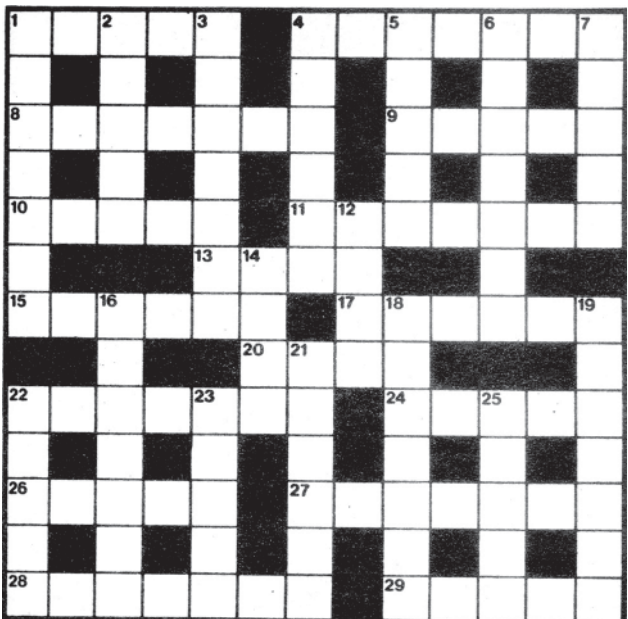
Celtic sign Germany defender Hinkel from Sevilla

Fernandes investigated after nightclub incident

MADRID, 5 Jan — Valencia midfielder Manuel Fernandes is under investigation by a local court after being involved in an incident at a nightclub in the early hours of Friday morning.

Fernandes, whose agent has said he is poised to join Premier League side Everton, appeared in front of the magistrate after being taken into custody when police were called to deal with a fracas at a nightclub in the city. He was later released.

The magistrate decided against carrying out a fast-trial and ordered further investigation into allegations by police officers that they had been injured in the incident. Fernandes's team mate and fellow Portugal international Miguel told reporters after training on Friday morning that the two players had been involved in the incident after being falsely accused of stealing a watch. — MNA/Reuters

Cambodia suffers worst dengue epidemic, 407 dead

PHNOM PENH, 5 Jan — Cambodia suffered its worst ever outbreak of dengue fever last year and it killed 407 people, most of them children, the highest toll in nearly a decade.

Dengue, which causes fever, head-aches and agonising muscle and joint pains, had infected nearly 40,000 people since the first outbreaks last May, Ngan Chantha, director of the Health Ministry's anti-dengue programme, said on Friday.

"It is the worst number of infectious cases ever in Cambodia," he said, noting the disease infected 16,000 people and killed 424 in 1998.

Thousands of sick

children sought free treatment at four Swiss-funded hospitals last year, but doctors said they did not have enough resources to treat everyone.

The World Bank, the World Health Organization and the Red Cross have provided pesticides to kill mosquitoes, while the Asian Development Bank (ADB) gave 300,000 US dollars to the anti-dengue programme.

Cambodia, whose health care system was devastated in 30 years of civil war, spends about three US dollars per person on health a year, according to the World Bank.

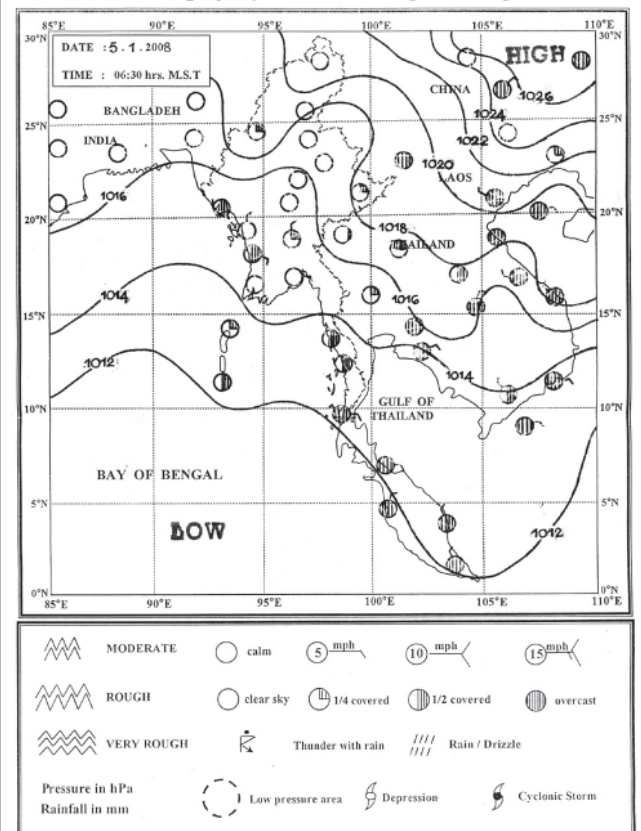
Moderate quake jolts Indonesia's S-E Sulawesi
