Prime Minister visits factories in Kyaukse Industrial Region Development of industrial sector important for nation's wealth

NAY PYI TAW, 21 Jan — Prime Minister General Thein Sein inspected factories in Kyaukse Industrial Region on 19 January.

After attending the ceremony to open Myanmar Pharmaceutical Factory (Inyaung), the Prime Minister and party went to the ceramic and steel ware factory (Minsu) of Ministry of Industry-1. At the factory, the Prime Minister inspected ceramics and steel ware produced by the factory and production process of the factory. Minister for Industry-1 U Aung Thaung and officials concerned conducted them around the factory.

The factory has a capacity to produce 750 tons of ceramics and 500 tons of steel ware includ-

ing medical equipment per year. The factory will also produce basins, cookers, vacuum flasks, steel pipes and other ware. Afterwards, the Prime Minister and party went to the agriculture machinery factory of Agricultural Mechanization Depart-

ment under Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation and inspected engines and machinery produced by the factory.

During the inspection tour of the factory, Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation Maj-Gen Htay Oo and Lt-Gen

Tin Aye, Member of the State Peace and Development Council reported to Prime Minister General Thein Sein. Next, Director-General of the Agricultural Mechanization Department U Win Maw reported on production capacity and the number

of employees of the factory, and possession of power reapers and tillers for farmers.

After hearing reports, Prime Minister General Thein Sein gave instructions. Afterwards, the prime minister and party inspected production of engines and machinery parts, test-run of engines, foundry works, power reapers and power tillers produced by the factory and bio lubricants produced from physic nut oil.

This factory has

already manufactured 2,307 tractors, 2307 diesel engines ranging from 16 to 22 HP, 45 reapers, 2307 ploughs, 501 two-blade harrows, three-blade harrows, 5 farm trucks and 3 combine-harvesters until the end of December of 2007-2008 fiscal year, it is learnt.

Upon arrival at Hsinmin Cement Plant, the Prime Minister heard reports on conditions of electric power and natural gas presented by Member

Enhance health care services of the entire nation

In an effort to enhance health care services and ensure uplift of health and fitness of the entire nation the government is producing specialists, doctors and nurses. And it is nurturing and training technicians for systematic application of advanced equipment. In the meantime, it is building modern pharmaceutical factories, hospitals and other related facilities.

More pharmaceutical factories are being established in order to meet the demand of medicines of the growing population in addition to Myanmar Pharmaceutical Factory (Yangon) that produces quality medicines.

Myanmar Pharmaceutical Factory (Inyaung) of the Ministry of Industry-1 in Kyaukse Industrial Region, Mandalay Division was opened on 19 January. The newly-opened factory will produce disposable syringes, intravenous fluids and injection. The emergence of the facility contributes much to development of health care services provided for local people in central and upper Myanmar.

At present, medicines and medical equipment are being produced by MPF (Inyaung), MPF (PyinOoLwin), MPF (Yangon), MPF (Yangon) Extension as well as MPF (Sagaing), Hepatitis-B Vaccine Factory, Special Medicine Factory No 1 and No 2.

With the emergence of more pharmaceutical factories officials concerned are to try their utmost in producing quality medicines and enabling the public to have easy access to the medicines. Only then, will uplift of health and fitness of the entire nation be possible.

Clinton slams 'shameless' pro-Obama ad in Nevada

ELKO (Nevada), 21 Jan — Democratic presidential hopeful Hillary Clinton called on her chief rival Barack Obama on Friday to denounce ads being run on Spanish-language radio that accuse Clinton of not respecting Hispanic

people. "They're shameless and offensive," Clinton said of the ads after a rally in the Nevada mining town of Elko, a day ahead of caucuses that are next in the state-by-state process to choose presidential

nominees. The ad backs Illinois Senator Obama and says that "Hillary Clinton does not have respect for our people," referring to a lawsuit aimed at stopping voting taking place at Las Vegas casinos on Saturday.

Casinos workers, who are largely represented by a union that endorsed Obama, will be able to vote at their workplaces after a judge rejected the lawsuit, a result that Clinton's campaign called disappointing.

Hispanic voters are a key demographic in Nevada, and many work in Las Vegas's plethora of casinos, hotels and restaurants.

Clinton won the New Hampshire primary this month after losing to Obama in Iowa, setting up a close race for the Democratic nomination to run in the 4 November election.—MNA/Reuters

Seven killed in Kenya's new deadly, ethnic clashes

NAIROBI, 21 Jan—Seven people were killed, many of them on Sunday, in clashes in the Kenyan capital and western region as the country reeled from deadly opposition protests against President Mwai Kibaki's re-election, police said. Police recovered three bodies in Nairobi's Mathare slums after overnight clashes between rival gangs, bringing to 45 the number of deaths over the past five days of unrest. Police commander Paul Ruto said a man was hacked the death in Sunday afternoon fighting, bring the Mathare toll to four.

"Members of one community started terrorising members of the rival community," Ruto said.

"These people are criminals. They are armed with pangas and pistols but our officers are on the ground," Ruto added.—INTERNET

Iraq's Sadr followers reconsidering ceasefire

NAJAF (Iraq), 21 Jan—Shiite cleric Moqtada al-Sadr's Mehdi Army militia might not renew its six-month ceasefire, a key cause of the decline in violence in Iraq, unless attacks against it stop, a Sadr aide said on Saturday.

Salah al-Ubaidi, a senior official in Sadr's political movement in the holy Shi'ite city of Najaf, accused "criminal elements" inside Iraqi security forces of attacking Sadr's followers and Mehdi Army fighters.

"If the government security forces do not stop their campaigns of detention and arresting our followers, we may recon-

sider our decision to freeze the Mehdi Army," Ubaidi told Reuters. The six months of the declared ceasefire run out next month. Sadr announced it

after clashes between his followers and police during a pilgrimage in Kerbala, another holy Shi'ite city in southern Iraq, in August. MNA/Reuters

Hizbollah chief warns to beat back any Israeli attack

BEIRUT, 21 Jan—Lebanese Hizbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah warned on Saturday that his group will beat back any attack from Israel.

Any violation from Israel to the Lebanese territories or the civilians in the country's south will not pass without any actions from our side, Nasrallah told a southern Beirut rally marking Shiite religious festival of

Ashura. Talking about threats of a new Israeli war against Lebanon, Nasrallah said "the Israeli command and the Israeli Army do not have the capabilities to launch a war, but in return, we are committed to the resistance and we are capable and ready". He, meanwhile, confirmed

that his guerilla group possessed body parts of Israeli soldiers left on southern Lebanon's battlefields during the July war in 2006. Addressing the Israelis, Nasrallah said "your Army is lying to you ... your Army has left the body parts of your soldiers in our villages and fields."

LA police cracking down on paparazzi

LOS ANGELES, 21 Jan—Los Angeles law enforcement agencies are cracking down on celebrity photographers after some high-profile incidents, the Los Angeles Times reported on Friday.

The crackdown was prompted by increasing complaints about paparazzi tactics which were intensifying as paparazzi become ever more competitive in their quest for the perfect tabloid photos, said the report.

"Their numbers—and aggressiveness—have grown exponentially," said Los Angeles Sheriff's Department spokesman

Steve Whitmore, who cited a case this week in which West Hollywood Sheriff's deputies were called to a gym after paparazzi brought traffic on Melrose Avenue in downtown Los Angeles to a standstill as they jostled to photograph a film star.

Both the Sheriff's Department and the Los Angeles Police Department have begun keeping a running record of complaints about paparazzi, including names and the agencies that employ problem photographers, said the report.

200 anti-globalization demonstrators detained in Bern

GENEVA, 21 Jan— Police in the Swiss capital Bern used tear gas and rubber bullets against leftwing anti-globalization demonstrators and detained about 200 of them on Saturday, the semiofficial Swissinfo website reported.

The event, which came four days before the annual meeting of the Geneva-based World Economic Forum (WEF) in the alpine resort of

Davos, had been banned by local authorities for fear of violence.

But the organizers of the demonstration, the “Alliance for a Global Opposition”, said they would not respect the ban, with their leader, Giovanni A Schumacher, claiming that the group wanted a march that was calm and without violence.

The group, which criticizes “the World Economic Forum, the

capitalist system and repression”, had originally been allowed to demonstrate by city officials, but the authorities reversed their decision after remarks made by Schumacher in a television interview.

Schumacher was among about 200 people detained by the police. Several hundred are said to have taken part in the demonstration.

Man dies after shot from police Taser gun

LONDON, 21 Jan — A man has died after being shot by a Taser stun gun in Bedford, police said on Sunday.

Officers were called to a house in The Spinney, in the Goldington area of the city, at around 7 pm on Saturday evening, following reports of a domestic dispute between a mother and son.

Outside the property, they found an injured man, aged in his 30s, armed with a knife, a spokeswoman for Bedfordshire Police said. The man threatened officers and was shot with a Taser.

He retreated inside the property, where officers later found him in need of urgent medical treatment.

He was taken by ambulance to Bedford Hospital, where he was pronounced dead. A post-mortem will be carried out on Monday.

The case has been referred to the Independent Police Complaints Commission.

Civilian killed in Baghdad bombing

BAGHDAD, 21 Jan— A civilian was killed and two policemen were injured in a bomb attack in Baghdad on Sunday morning, an Interior Ministry source said.

“A roadside bomb struck a police patrol near the Passport Office in Baghdad’s eastern neighbourhood of Zaiyounah, killing a bystander and wounding two policemen,” the source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

The blast damaged a police vehicle and several nearby buildings and cars, the source said.

Also in the capital, the source said that police patrols collected two unidentified bodies dumped in two different areas in Baghdad during the past 24 hours.—MNA/Xinhua

Taleban bomb kills five civilians in Afghanistan

KANDAHAR (Afghanistan), 21 Jan — A Taleban roadside bomb killed five Afghan civilians and wounded two others in the south of Afghanistan, a provincial official said on Sunday. Taleban insurgents killed more than 950 civilians last year in suicide attacks, roadside bombs and ground assaults, the Afghanistan NGO Safety Office said in a report.

The bomb hit a van in the Panjwai District, west of the main southern city of Kandahar, on Saturday.

“The bomb was planted by the Taleban to attack foreign or Afghan forces’ convoys in the Panjwai District but it killed poor civilians,” said a District police official, Ghulam Mohammad.

Bomb hoax evacuates Bulgarian airport

SOFIA, 21 Jan — Bulgaria’s Sofia airport was temporarily evacuated and flights suspended for over an hour on Sunday, after a bomb threat which proved a hoax, police said.

Authorities received the threat from an anonymous female caller but a bomb squad found nothing suspicious after checking the airport’s terminals.

“It turned out to be a false alarm. The airport was evacuated for about an hour. There are only three outgoing flights that were slightly delayed,” a police spokeswoman said. The airport was operating normally now.

McCain beats Huckabee in South Carolina primary

WASHINGTON, 21 Jan— Senator John McCain of Arizona beat former Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee in South Carolina’s Republican primary Saturday, according to preliminary results.

With 97 per cent of precincts reporting, McCain has won 33 per cent of the votes, beating former Governor Mike Huckabee of Arkansas, who grabbed 30 per cent of the votes.

Huckabee has conceded his defeat and congratulated McCain.

Former Senator of Tennessee Fred Thompson and former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney came

in the 3rd and 4th places, with 16 per cent and 15 per cent of votes each.

The state’s Grand Old Party (GOP) primary voters have picked their party’s eventual nominee in every election since 1980, but with the race so volatile, that may not hold true this year.

McCain said his victory in the South Carolina primary is an evidence that his campaign “can carry right through” Florida into the Super Tuesday on 5 February, when 22 states hold primary elections.

But he cautioned that there is still “a long way to go.”

Bulgaria denies US, EU pressure on gas pipeline project

SOFIA, 21 Jan—Bulgaria's Regional Development Minister Asen Gagauzov rejected claims that the government was under pressure from the United States and European Union against signing the agreement for the South Stream gas pipeline project with Russia, local Press reported Saturday.

The Bulgarian Government managed to strike a deal for joining the project

during the two-day visit of Russian President Vladimir Putin in Sofia, which ended Friday.

"What is good for Bulgaria is also good for Greece, as well as the whole European Union," Gagauzov cited his Greek counterpart in an interview.

The minister added that during his meetings with representatives of the US business, he

was shown interest and support for both the South Stream gas project and BurgasAlexandroupolis pipeline, which is to take Caspian oil to the Mediterranean.

Gagauzov said Bulgaria also takes active part in the Nabucco project, which proposes to take gas from Azerbaijan's Caspian Sea coast toward Austria through Bulgaria.

BP signs clean energy agreement with China

BEIJING, 20 Jan—British Petroleum (BP) announced it had signed a series of agreements with China on Friday, including those in clean energy and wind power generation, during British Prime Minister Gordon Brown's visit to China. Brown and Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao attended the signing ceremony.

Under the agreement, BP and the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS), will study the feasibility of setting up a joint Clean Energy Commercialization Centre (CECC) later this year.

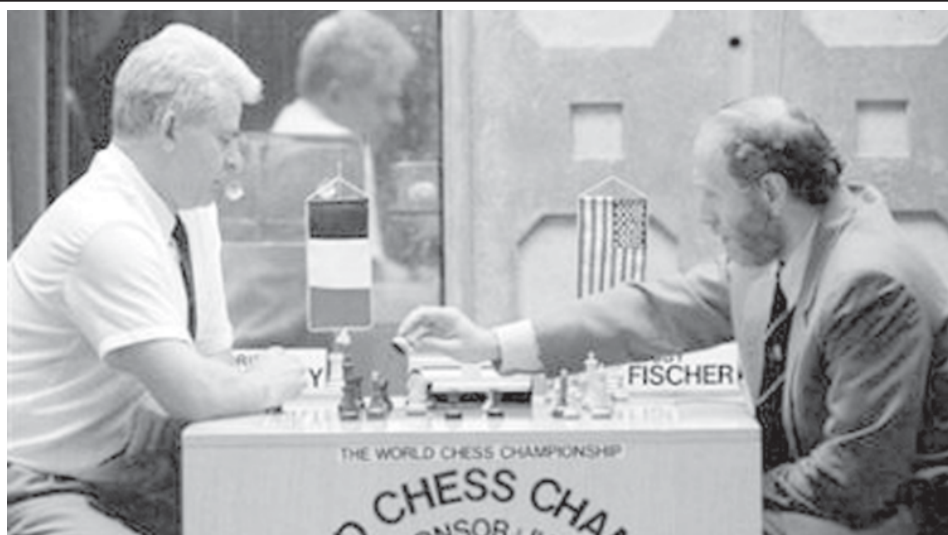
The CECC, proposed last year, aims at commercializing clean energy technologies, including coal gratification, coal to liquids, coal to chemicals, carbon capture and storage.

The two sides would use the centre as a platform to promote research and development in the near zero emissions clean coal initiative and launch related pilot programmes.

Malaysia to cut foreign worker numbers

KUALA LUMPUR, 21 Jan—Malaysia wants to cut its Army of foreign workers, sending home at least 200,000 by 2009, as it tries to reduce dependence on overseas labour and free up jobs for locals, a local newspaper said on Sunday. "We are in the stage of calling together large companies, associations that represent industry and outsourcing companies for talks to reduce the number," Raja Azahar Raja Abdul Manap, the top civil servant in Malaysia's home ministry, told the *Star*. —MNA/Reuters

Official says China signs new FTA agreement

BEIJING, 21 Jan—China has signed a new free trade area (FTA) agreement, sources with the Ministry of Commerce disclosed here at a national commerce working conference on Saturday.

Commerce Minister Chen Deming said that China has so far signed and implemented agreements on establishment of six FTAs.

Sources with the ministry told *Xinhua* that China did sign a new FTA agreement but decline to elaborate.

Previously, China has established five FTAs with Chinese Hong Kong, Chinese Macao, Chile, Pakistan and the Association of South-east Asian Nations (ASEAN). —MNA/Xinhua

Gambian leader says uranium reserves discovered

BANJUL, 20 Jan—The tiny West African country of Gambia has discovered commercially-exploitable deposits of uranium and other rare minerals, President Yahya Jammeh said on Saturday.

Jammeh, who seized power in a military coup in 1994, said in an address on state television to celebrate the Muslim New Year that his government had also detected titanium, silicon and iron reserves.

"But the biggest discovery is the discovery of uranium in Gambia," he said. "These minerals I have talked about, we are 100 per cent certain that they are in this country and can be exploited." —MNA/Reuters

Exit poll shows PPP's fresh victory in Thai by-elections

BANGKOK, 21 Jan — The People Power Party (PPP) looked set to win most of the 17 Parliament seats in by-elections held in six Thai provinces on Sunday, according to an exit poll conducted by ABAC University.

While official results were to be announced later, the famous ABAC survey indicated the PPP will regain all the 12 seats which were won by the party and later

disqualified by the Election Commission (EC). Moreover, the party was likely to gain two or three additional seats.

After handing out yellow and red cards to winning candidates in the 23 December general election for alleged electoral wrongdoing, the EC organized by-elections for Sunday in the provinces of Nakhon Ratchasima, Sakon Nakhon, Udon Thani, Lampang, Phrae and

Nakhon Nayok.

A total of 16 winning candidates in the six provinces received yellow cards, which allowed them to re-contest in the by-elections. Twelve of them were from PPP, two from the Democrat Party and two from the Puea Pandin Party. Another PPP contender was given a red card, which disqualified him from re-running in the contest.

UN strongly condemns terrorist attack in Lebanon

UNITED NATIONS, 20 Jan — The UN Security Council strongly condemned on Friday Tuesday's terrorist attack in Beirut, which killed at least three persons, wounded several others and struck a diplomatic vehicle from the American Embassy.

"The members of the Security Council expressed their deepest sympathy and condolences to the families of the victims and to the people and government of Lebanon," the Council said in a Press statement read out by Council president Giadalla Ettlhi of Libya.

The Council "reaffirmed that terrorism in all its forms and manifestations

constitutes one of the most serious threats to international peace and security, and that any acts of terrorism are criminal and unjustifiable, wherever, whenever and by whomsoever committed," the statement said.

The Council expressed support for Lebanese efforts to bring those responsible for the attack to justice and urged member states to extend their cooperation with the Lebanese authorities in this regard.

Hillary declared winner of Democratic Nevada caucuses

WASHINGTON, 21 Jan — US Democratic presidential hopeful Hillary Clinton was declared by major US news wires and TV networks as the winner of Democratic Nevada caucuses Saturday.

With 70 per cent of precincts reporting, Hillary has 51 per cent of the vote, compared to 45 per cent for Barack Obama, her archrival.

John Edwards came in with a remote third place, grabbing only 4 per cent of the votes.

Nevada is the first test of the Democratic candidates' support among Hispanics.

Democrats moved Nevada's primary up, in part, to showcase the Hispanic vote, and all the major Democratic candidates are vying to capture it.

EU aid commissioner arrives in Kenya

NAIROBI, 20 Jan — European Union Development Commissioner Louis Michel arrived in Kenya Saturday to assess post-election situation after last month's disputed presidential election.

EU official in Nairobi said Michel who arrived in Nairobi is holding separate meetings with President Mwai Kibaki whose re-election sparked violent protest across the country and opposition leader Raila Odinga who says he was rigged of victory.

Michel has held talks with Kenya's Vice-President Kalonzo Musyoka where he expressed concern that the post election violence had led to loss of life and wanton destruction of property, and called on the parties involved in the conflict to urgently dialogue and negotiate a way forward. During the

meeting, the EU pledged to donate 5.5 million euros to assist in the humanitarian relief effort following the post election violence.

Michel said EU regards Kenya as a model of democracy in Africa and a key player in the region. Musyoka thanked EU for the donation and said the money will assist in providing shelter and food besides other basic necessities for the displaced Kenyans.—MNA/Xinhua

Four killed in gunfire attacks in north of Baghdad

TIKRIT (Iraq), 21 Jan — Four people were killed, including a former senior member of Saddam's Baath Party, in two attacks in the city of Samarra in Salahudin Province, a provincial police source said on Sunday.

"Unknown gunmen in a car opened fire on Rasheed Nsaeyf Jasim, a former local senior Baathist, killing him near his house in northern the city," the source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident,

clashes erupted in the centre of the city when gunmen attacked a group of local Awakening councils fighters near a football stadium, the source said.

The clashes resulted in the killing of three attackers and the capturing of a fourth, he said.

stores, brokerage houses, a highway bus terminal and restaurants. Like the system of tax-free markets, we have laid down first come, first served system for vendors to take the temporary shops. So, whoever comes first can take the shops for one-day sales. One-day's rental rate is 100 kyats a temporary shop. The market has a highway bus terminal, and goods from various regions are transported to this market. So, the commodity flow is swift. There are also car servicing centres and car spare parts shops for servicing the buses. Another salient point is that there is a night bazaar that opens from 3 pm to 10 pm daily. So, when office hours is over, government staff can easily get

goods and foodstuff they want there. Many of the staff buy goods before going home in the evening. Unlike in other markets, high mark lamps are lit in this market. People can apply for shops of Myoma Market to sell goods if they want to. We give permits to those who really want to get shops for trade. The market hours is from 7 am to 7 pm. We set up two shifts of sanitation workers to keep the market clean. In addition, we fine those who throw away rubbish and spit betel spittle indiscriminately, and those who violate disciplines".

U Zaw Naing Oo, in-charge of Cherry Oo Watch Sales Centre, said, "We sell our goods at the same prices and quality as that

marriage season now, so the store is busier than usual. I had to pay only 10,000 kyats to Nay Pyi Taw Development Affairs Committee for the shop. I get the goods I want from Mandalay. 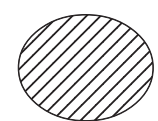

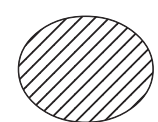

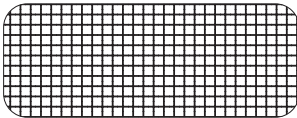

**Chinese police detain 31
stowaways in N-E China**

DAMASCUS, 21 Jan— Syrian President Bashar al-Assad held talks with visiting Arab League Secretary General Amr Moussa on Saturday on the political crisis in neighbouring Lebanon and the "dangerous developments" in the occupied Palestinian territories.

Moussa reviewed the political developments in Lebanon and the consultations he made to solve the pending issues among the Lebanese parties in the framework of an integrated Arab plan endorsed in Cairo on 6 January, the official *SANA* news agency reported.

The two sides underscored the importance of achieving consensus among the Lebanese people to ensure unity, security, and stability in Lebanon, the report said.

They also discussed the current arrangements for holding the forthcoming Arab summit in Damascus in March, it added.

The necessary steps to be taken on the Arab and international levels to force Israel to halt its aggression on the Palestinian people were also stressed in the meeting.

An official accompanying Moussa told reporters that Moussa briefed Assad during the meeting the outcomes of his talks with the different Lebanese political leaders during his trip to Beirut.

Moussa also held meetings with Vice-President Farouk al-Shara and Foreign Minister Walid al-Muallem, *SANA* said. — *MNA/Xinhua*

ECOWAS leaders plan Sahara security conference

OUAGADOUGOU, 20 Jan — West African heads of state agreed on Friday to convene a regional summit to discuss instability in the Sahel, particularly the Tuareg uprisings in northern Mali and Niger.

Weeks after the killing of four French tourists in Mauritania by al-Qaeda, the 15 nations of the

Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) agreed to hold the conference in the Malian capital Bamako in the first quarter of 2008.

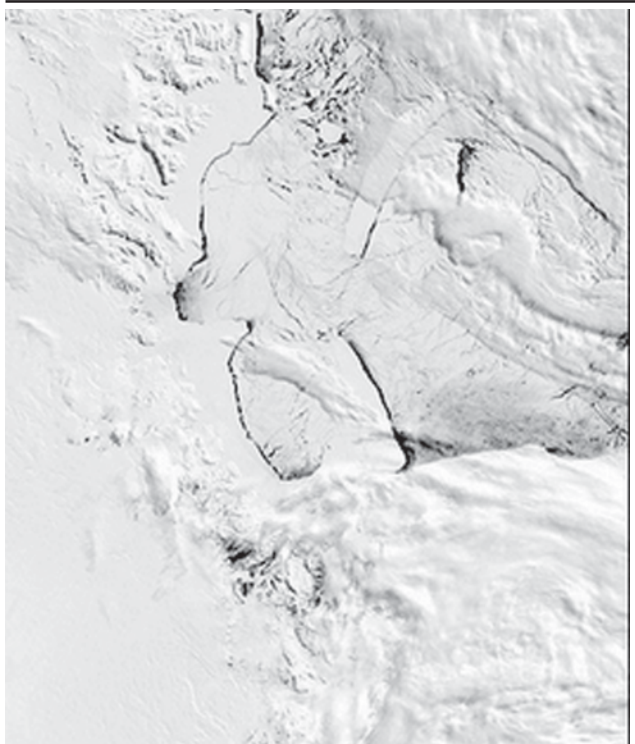
The meeting will aim to “reduce the tensions in this part of the region and allow a debate on security issues, the circulation of light arms, drug trafficking and the

development needs of the population,” said a final statement on Friday at the ECOWAS summit in the Burkina Faso capital Ouagadougou. Burkina Faso’s President Blaise Compaore applauded efforts by his counterpart in Niger Mamadou Tandja and Malian leader Amadou Toumani Toure to resist a rebellion led by nomadic Tuareg peoples in the Sahara and the arid Sahel belt to the south.

Bird flu spreads to new districts in E-India

KOLKATA(India), 20 Jan — Bird flu spread to two new districts in an eastern Indian state, officials confirmed on Saturday, as veterinary staff struggled to cull thousands of birds in the face of resistance from farmers.

The H5N1 virus was found in dead birds in Burdwan and Nadia, taking to five the number of infected districts in West Bengal state.

The virus was also spreading to new areas within already infected districts.

India, which is witnessing its fourth bird flu outbreak in poultry since 2006, has not reported any human infection.

Officials said they were immediately extending culling operations to the newly affected areas. West Bengal began culling more than 400,000 chickens and ducks in three districts this week.

Cambodian police block Mia Farrow’s Darfur rally

PHNOM PENH, 21 Jan — Baton-wielding police barred Hollywood actress Mia Farrow from holding a rally in Cambodia’s “Killing Fields” on Sunday as part of a campaign to end atrocities in Sudan’s Darfur.

Some 100 military police blocked Farrow, who fronts the Dream for Darfur pressure group, and her fellow activists from entering the compound at Tuol Sleng, the Phnom Penh high school that became Pol Pot’s main torture centre. “Darfur has nothing to do with Cambodia. Go protest in Darfur,” Phnom Penh police chief Touch Naruth told reporters after the hour-long stand-off ended without incident.

The group, which had planned to lay flowers and light a symbolic Olympic torch in the compound, has held similar events in Chad, Rwanda, Armenia, Germany and Bosnia as part of a campaign to persuade China to push Khartoum into ending the violence in Darfur. — MNA/Reuters

Activists admit throwing stink bombs at Japanese whalers

CANBERRA, 20 Jan— The anti-whaling activists admitted that they had thrown about 12 stink bombs onto a Japanese whaling ship after two of its crew were released.

Two members of the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society, who were being detained on the whaling boat *Yushin Maru No 2*, were handed to an Australian Customs’ vessel on Friday and then returned to their ship, *The Steve Irwin*.

The Japanese Whaling Association (JWA) accused earlier in a statement that the activists had thrown acid onto the sister vessel of the *Yushin Maru No 2* - the *Yushin Maru No 3* - overnight.

Captain of the *Steve*

Irwin Paul Watson denied any attack on the *Yushin Maru No 3*, saying he had not even seen such a boat, according to a report by the *Australian Associated Press*.

But he confirmed the group launched a “retali-

atory strike” of butyric acid “stink bombs” at the *Yushin Maru No 2*, about one hour after activists Benjamin Potts and Giles Lane were transferred to the Australian Customs boat.

Snowfall, rains strand trucks to Three Gorges Dam area

YICHANG (Hubei), 20 Jan — More than 1,000 trucks were stranded on Saturday at an overburdened ferry en route to the Three Gorges Dam area in central China’s Hubei Province when continuous snowfall and

rains have forced several other roads to close.

The trucks queued up at the ferry waiting to board when the dock only had a daily ferry capacity of 700 vehicles.

The trucks were heavily loaded with variety of goods, including glass, equipment, cables and fresh foods.

“I intended to transport some facilities from east

China’s Jiangxi Province to the central Chongqing Municipality and I have waited for three days here due to the heavy snow,” a driver in the queue said.

The snow was said to be the heaviest in the past 30 years in Yichang city, where the dam is located.

It has forced several highways to close, according to local traffic authorities.

LONDON, 21 Jan — Everton moved into fourth place in the Premier League on Sunday with a scrappy 2-1 victory at lowly Wigan Athletic.

First-half goals from Andy Johnson and Joleon Lescott gave Everton a comfortable interval lead before an own goal from defender Phil Jagielka gave Wigan a lifeline in the second half.

Manchester City climbed the table to fifth although they were below-par in a 1-1 draw with West Ham United that maintained their unbeaten league record at home this season.

Carlton Cole's acrobatic overhead kick gave West Ham an early lead but Darius Vassell equalized before halftime.

Everton moved to 42 points, three above city rivals Liverpool who drop to sixth albeit having played two games fewer and face Aston Villa on Monday. City have 40 points.

Memories of 2005 when David Moyes guided Everton to a fourth-place finish are beginning to stir as his side again threaten the established big guns in the Premier League.—MNA/Reuters

Rachid Ofrany opened the scoring for VVV in the second minute with a superb lob but 10 minutes later Balazs Dzsudzsak equalized at close range from Jefferson Farfan's pass. VVV, who have also drawn at home against Ajax and Feyenoord, were reduced to 10 men after 32 minutes following a second booking for full back Peter Reekers.

kept them seven points clear of Barcelona who claimed a flattering 1-0 win over a well organized Racing Santander at the Nou Camp. Thierry Henry scored the winner with an opportunist header in the first half.—MNA/Reuters

MILAN, 21 Jan — Serie A leaders Inter Milan came from behind to beat Parma 3-2 at home on Sunday after Zlatan Ibrahimovic's controversial late double in foggy conditions. Inter, who maintain their seven-point advantage at the halfway stage of the season, were 2-1 down with two minutes to go when Parma defender Fernando Couto was adjudged to have handled an Ibrahimovic shot off the line.

Replays were inconclusive and despite Parma protests that he had used his head, Couto was sent off and Ibrahimovic converted the penalty before chesting down and firing in a stoppage-time winner with Parma's defence weakened. "We didn't play very well. A great player has won it for us at the end," Inter coach Roberto Mancini, celebrating his 200th game in charge, told Sky Sport.—MNA/Reuters

Lyon crash 3-0 at struggling Lens

PARIS, 21 Jan — Olympique Lyon suffered a fresh setback when they crashed 3-0 at struggling Racing Lens on Sunday four days after being ousted from the French League Cup by Le Mans.

The result cut to three points the French champions' lead over Girondins Bordeaux, who claimed second place in Ligue 1 with a 2-1 win at Le Mans on Saturday despite playing with 10 men for the entire second half.

Lens, who had only five wins in 19 Ligue 1 games this season, opened the scoring in the 55th minute through Toifilou Maoulida.

Milan, in ninth, have their eyes on fourth place after enduring a difficult first half of the campaign where they failed to win at home in the league until last weekend's 5-2 victory against Napoli.

Carlo Ancelotti again fielded a Brazilian front three at Udinese with Ronaldo hitting the post in the first half and teenager Pato combining well with Kaka to slip in Italy's Gilardino for the winner.

Russia rejects Kosovo's unilateral independence

Moscow, 21 Jan — Russia's position on Kosovo's status remains unchanged, and Moscow will not recognize its unilateral independence, Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Kislyak said on Saturday.

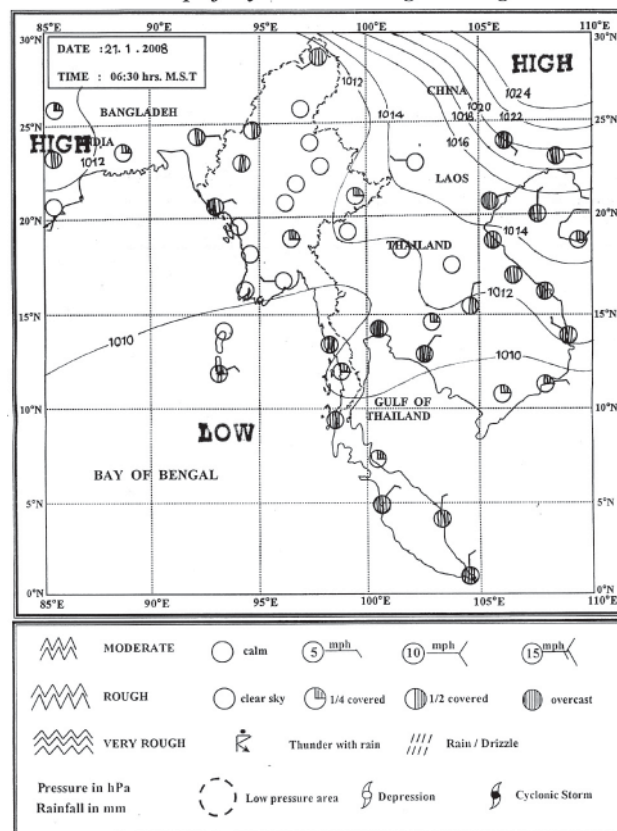
"We will consider illegitimate the unilateral declaration of Kosovo's independence and the

granting of independent state status to it," Kislyak was quoted by the *Interfax* news agency as saying at a national security conference in Moscow.

Russia should also enhance its involvement in peacekeeping operations, he said. "We have about 290 peacekeepers now, which makes (Russia) the 45th in this respect among the 119 UN members taking part in peacekeeping operations," he said.

The UN Security Council held consultations last month on the future status of the Serbian province of Kosovo. But no conclusions were reached due to major differences among the parties. —MNA/Xinhua

Rocket attack on Ashura ceremony kills seven in N Iraq

MOSUL (Iraq), 21 Jan — A rocket hit a Shiite religious ceremony in a town in the northern Iraqi province of Nineveh on Saturday, killing seven people and wounding 17 others, a senior local police officer said.

"A *Katyusha* rocket struck a rally of Shiite pilgrims commemorating the Ashura ceremony in the afternoon in the town of Tal Afar, 420 kilometres northwest of Baghdad, killing seven people and wounding 17 others," Brigadier Najim Abdullah, who is also the mayor of the town, told *Xinhua* by telephone.

Hundreds of thousands of Iraqi Shiite Muslims rallied in the

mainly Shiite cities across Iraq, particularly in the holy city of Karbala, some 110 kilometres south of Baghdad, to commemorate the Shiite religious festival.

The Ashura occasion, on Friday, marks the death of Imam al-Hussein, Prophet Muhammad's grandson and the third holiest Imam of the 12 Imams most revered by Shiite Muslims, who was killed in a battle named Taf in Karbala in the seventh

Century.

In a separate incident on the day, five mortar rounds landed on an Iraqi Army base in the Mosul Hotel in western Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad, a provincial police source told *Xinhua*.

The attack resulted in wounding of four Iraqi soldiers and damaging parts of the hotel's building, the source said on condition of anonymity.
