Prime Minister inspects development tasks in Myitkyina, Putao

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Jan—Chairman of the Work Committee for Development of Border Areas and National Races Prime Minister General Thein Sein, accompanied by member of the State Peace and Development Council Lt-Gen Ye Myint, Chairman of Kachin State PDC Commander of Northern Command Maj-Gen Ohn Myint, Chairman of Sagaing Division PDC Commander of North-West Command Brig-Gen Myint Soe, ministers, deputy ministers and departmental heads, arrived at Myitkyina Airport at 8.30 am on 21

January. At the lounge of the airport, Minister for Transport Maj-Gen Thein Swe reported on the background history of the airport and the runway extension project.

Director-General of Department of Civil Aviation U Tun Hlaing and Kachin State Senior Engineer U Khin Maung Kyaw reported on progress in extension of the runway and future construction work.

The Prime Minister fulfilled the requirement and stressed the need for timely completion of the project tasks meeting the set standard. The original runway measuring 6000

ft by 100 ft is being extended to the one measuring 7000 ft by 100 ft.

Next, the Prime Minister and party went to Bala Min Htin Bridge by car. He inspected the bridge and called on the officials to systematically carry out maintenance tasks and durability of the bridge. The Prime Minister and party then viewed the development of Myitkyina by car.

Afterwards, they proceeded to Putao by air. At the lounge of Putao Airport, the Prime Minister heard a report by Minister Maj-Gen Thein Swe on upgrading of the airport. Director-General U Tun

Hlaing presented a report on extension of the runway.

In response to the reports, the Prime Minister said that Putao has natural scenic beauties attracting tourists. Making use of the region, measures can be taken for development of eco-tourism. If so, the region will become strategically important for

the economic growth as well as for regional development. So, all necessary requirement including transport and power supply are to be fulfilled.

Later, a meeting on supply of hydropower took place at 2.30 pm at Khakaborazi Yeiktha. Director-General U Aung Koe Shwe of Hydropower Projects Implementation

Department of the Ministry of Electric Power No 1 reported on generation of 200 kilowatts by Namhtut Hydropower Station in Putao and generation of 400 kilowatts on completion of a diversion dam with the water resources of Namkamti creek, three miles from west of Putao.

Bush admin issued false statements for Iraq war

WASHINGTON, 24 Jan—US President George W Bush and top administration officials made hundreds of false statements about security threat from Iraq to gain public support for the war on Iraq, a study by two nonprofit journalism organizations said on Tuesday.

The study was conducted by the Centre for Public Integrity and the Fund for Independence in Journalism.

The false statements

were “part of an orchestrated campaign that effectively galvanized public opinion and, in the process, led the nation to war under decidedly false pretenses”, the study found.

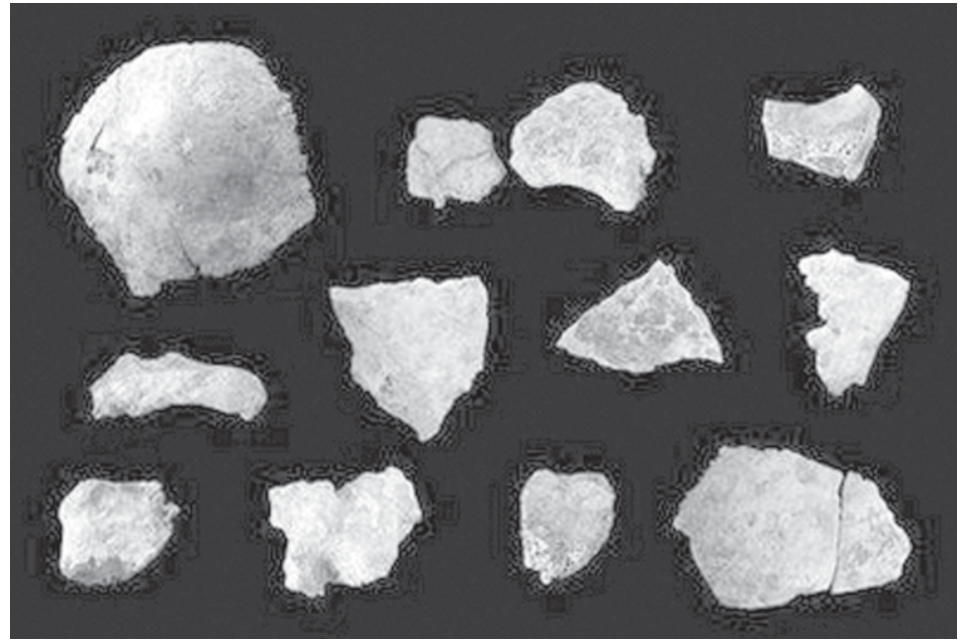
In the two years after the 11 September terrorist attacks, Bush and administration officials stated on 532 occasions at least that Iraq possessed weapons of mass destruction or was trying to obtain them or had links to al-Qaeda.

The statements were made in speeches,

briefings, interviews and other venues.

Bush made 259 false statements, followed by former Secretary of State Collin Powell with 244. On the list were also Vice-President Dick Cheney, national security adviser Condoleezza Rice, former defence secretary Donald H Rumsfeld, former deputy defence secretary Paul Wolfowitz and former White House Press secretaries Ari Fleischer and Scott McClellan.

US suffers first death in new armoured truck

BAGHDAD, 24 Jan—The US military has suffered a first fatality in one of a new fleet of heavily armoured vehicles designed to protect soldiers from roadside bombs, the military said on Tuesday.

One soldier died and three were wounded when a bomb went off next to the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) armoured truck near Arab Jabour on Baghdad’s southern outskirts on Saturday.

Thaksin’s wife fights corruption charges at court

BANGKOK, 24 Jan—Pojaman Shinawatra, wife of Thailand’s ousted premier Thaksin Shinawatra, defended herself at the Supreme Court in Bangkok Wednesday morning against corruption charges over a controversial land deal,

denying any illegal conduct in the case.

Pojaman said nothing was done inappropriately or unlawfully during the land deal as she appeared to face corruption charges in Bangkok Wednesday morning.

Iran says any new sanctions will not affect atom work

TEHERAN, 24 Jan—Iran said on Tuesday any new international sanctions against it would not succeed in forcing the country to halt its nuclear programme, which the West suspects is aimed at making bombs.

“The Iranian nation moves in the framework of its legitimate and legal rights ... and a possible ratification of a new (UN sanctions) resolution will not have an impact on our nation’s behaviour,” government spokesman Gholamhossein Elham told a news conference.

He spoke ahead of a meeting in Berlin on Tuesday of foreign ministers from major powers to discuss a possible third UN Security Council resolution against Iran for its refusal to halt enrichment, which can have both civilian and military uses.—MNA/Reuters

Syria imposes food blockade on Lebanon

BEIRUT, 24 Jan—Syria has imposed a blockade of food supplies on Lebanon, local newspaper *An Nahar* reported Tuesday.

The report, citing information received by Lebanese authorities, said Syrian Customs authorities informed all border checkpoints of their decision to prevent trucks and vehicles carrying food supplies from crossing into Lebanon as of 6 pm (1600 GMT) Monday.

An Nahar said Lebanese authorities had no “explanation to Damascus’ surprise decision”, but hinted that the siege might coincide with Monday nights’ protests in Beirut.—MNA/Xinhua

Kenyan runner killed in post-election violence

NAIROBI, 24 Jan—Kenyan marathon runner Wesley Ngetich has been shot and killed by a poisoned arrow, the second international athlete to die in post-election violence in the east African country.

“We have received word from Ngetich’s manager and we deeply regret negthich’s demise,” Athletics Kenya’s secretary, David Okeyo, told *Reuters* on Tuesday.

His American manager Hussein Makke, was quoted in US newspapers saying the athlete was a victim of a poisoned arrow attack during fighting in his home town of Trans Mara, at the edge of world famous Maasai Mara Game Reserve on Monday.—MNA/Reuters

Obama hurls new anti-Clinton broadsides

CAROLINA, 24 Jan—White House hopeful Barack Obama came out firing against his tag-team Clinton opponents on Wednesday as he battled to regain the initiative in the bad-tempered Democratic race.

Heading into South Carolina’s Democratic primary on Saturday, the Illinois senator all but accused Bill Clinton of lying as he countered the former president’s outspoken campaigning on behalf of his wife Hillary.

“The only thing I want to make sure of is that

when he goes after me, that he goes after me on the basis of facts and policy differences, and, you know, stuff isn’t just made up,” Obama said on ABC’s “Good Morning

America” programme.

In another appearance on NBC’s “Today Show,” the first Africa-American with a viable shot at the White House denied that Bill Clinton was getting

to him psychologically.

“It’s just that, I think, in the Clinton campaign, they have had former president Clinton delivering a bunch of inaccurate statements about my record. So, naturally, I’ve got to make sure that those are corrected,” he said.

Bad blood between the two campaigns spilled out into the open on Monday at a Democratic debate, when Obama and the former first lady accused each other of dishonesty, policy U-turns and campaign trickery.

Darfur rebels down government plane

KHARTOUM, 23 Jan—Darfur rebels said on Monday they had shot down a government plane bombing their areas in West Darfur, but Sudan's Army denied the claim, the first from the Justice and Equality Movement (JEM) this year.

JEM has emerged as the most powerful threat

to the government after almost five years of fighting which experts estimate has killed 200,000 people, but its latest claim could not be independently verified.

"It bombed our areas in Jabel Moun and our defence forces shot it down, it was a MiG-29," JEM commander Abdel

Aiz el-Nur Ashr told *Reuters* from the West Darfur region.

He said the aircraft crashed in a mountainous area in North Darfur between the towns of el-Fasher and Kebkabiya.

An Army spokesman said the news was "utterly untrue".

Pakistan's Khan says Backing Musharraf hurts US

WASHINGTON, 24 Jan — Continued US backing of President Pervez Musharraf risks alienating Pakistanis and increasing extremism in the nuclear-armed Islamic country, cricketer-turned-politician Imran Khan said on Tuesday.

Khan said he came to the United States "to try and convince the politicians in Washington that the policy they have adopted is a disaster for Pakistan and it is a disaster for America".

His main message to

senior US lawmakers including Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid was that Washington must apply more pressure to make Musharraf

reinstate the senior Pakistani justices who were sacked under emergency rule late last year.

Bomber kills one, wounds 21 at Iraq school

BAGHDAD, 24 Jan — A suicide bomber killed one student and wounded a number of others when he detonated a trolley laden with explosives in a schoolyard north of Baghdad on Tuesday, Iraqi police said.

They said 21 people were wounded, a mix of students and teachers who were arriving for classes at the boys secondary school in Baquba, the capital of volatile Diyala Province.

The bomber hid the explosives in a trolley that he had pushed into the school, police said. Most of the boys at the school are teenagers.

Diyala is one of several northern provinces where US and Iraqi forces have been carrying out a series of offensives against al-Qaeda in Iraq. The Sunni Islamist group is blamed for most suicide bombings in Iraq.

Blast injures two copper miners in Zambia

LUSAKA, 24 Jan — A blast at the Mufulira copper mine in Zambia left two mineworkers unconscious and with serious burns, a government official said on Tuesday.

Mopani Copper Mines (MCM), a unit of Swiss firm Glencore International AG and Canada's First Quantum Minerals, remained open and operational after the incident.

MCM operates the Mufulira and Nkana mines and the Mufulira Smelter.

"Two miners were badly injured and their chances of survival are very slim because their bodies were burned like charcoal," Dayford Muulwa, the district commissioner for Mufulira, told *Reuters* by telephone.

The two miners were in intensive care at the local hospital.

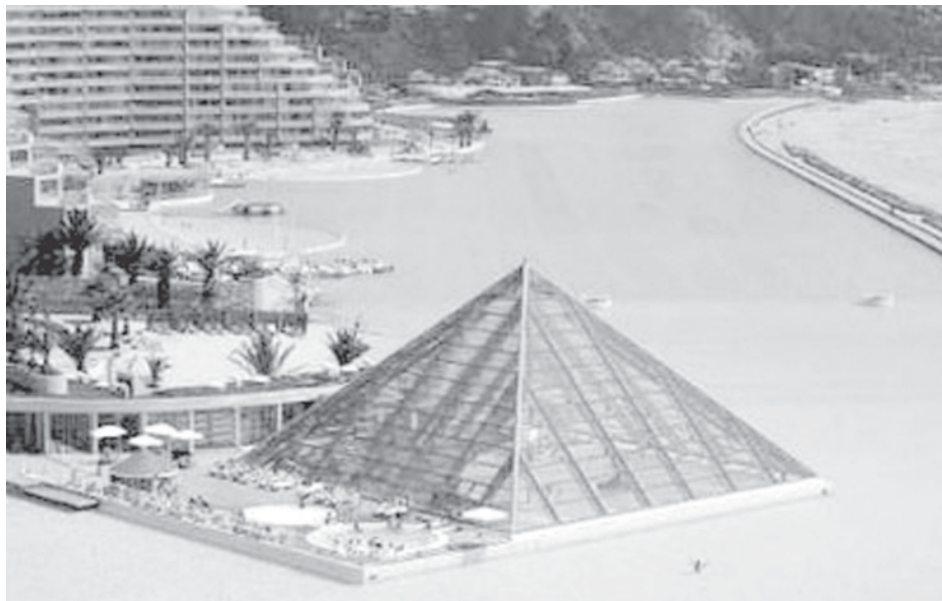
Militants kill five Pakistani troops in attack

ISLAMABAD, 24 Jan — Militants attacked a Pakistani security force fort in the South Waziristan region on the Afghan border on Tuesday killing five soldiers and wounding seven, the military said.

The militants attacked the Ladha fort and an observation post an hour after midnight on Monday.

"Security forces retaliated with fire causing heavy casualties... the attack was beaten back," the military said in a statement. The exact number of militants killed could not be ascertained, it said. Violence has intensified in recent days in South Waziristan, where an al-Qaeda-linked militant leader blamed by Pakistani authorities and the United States for the 27 December assassination of opposition leader Benazir Bhutto is based.

Emergency workers rescue 131 from snowstorm in Tibet

LHASA, 24 Jan — The number of people rescued from snowbound highways in a region of Tibet since last Thursday had risen to 131 by Monday afternoon.

However, the government of Ngari Prefecture fears others are still stranded by a snowstorm that began sweeping through the area for four days.

One motorist, who

had been stranded with 15 other people in three vehicles for two days on a highway near the Sino-Nepal border, told *Xinhua* by cellphone, "rescuers have just arrived, and we are in good shape".

Ngari, a remote region in the west of Tibet Autonomous Region, has reported many sections of highways blocked by thick snow.

Local officials say

many areas beyond mobile phone services are still cut off and they have no way of knowing how many other people are trapped.

As heavy snow continued to fall over large parts of China on Monday, widespread traffic disruptions were reported and at least four deaths caused by structures collapsing under the weight of snow.

Russia asks Libya to free oil company executive

MOSCOW, 24 Jan — Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov on Wednesday asked Libya to release the head of oil giant Lukoil's overseas office in Libya who was detained in late 2007 and reportedly involved in commercial spy case.

"I have sent yet another appeal to my Libyan counterpart. We believe that

Libyan authorities could release Alexander Tsygankov on Russian Embassy guarantees," Lavrov told a news conference on Wednesday.

Tsygankov was arrested in Tripoli, capital of Libya, on 25 November and no official charges had been brought against him so far, RIA news agency reported.

Philippines says China trade will cushion US slowdown

MANILA, 23 Jan— The Philippines expects its growing trade with China to cushion the impact of an economic slowdown in the United States, the chief spokesman of President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo said on Tuesday.

“The United States remains a very close ally,” Presidential Spokesman Ignacio Bunye told reporters. “It’s economy is one of the biggest and if there’s a slowdown there’s an effect on other countries. Before, we

were solely dependent on the West, but there are other markets.”

Describing Manila’s trade with Beijing as growing “by leaps and bounds”, Bunye said: “This will somehow cushion whatever negative impact the slowdown in the US economy would have on the Philippines.”

The United States remains the Philippines’ biggest trading partner with total trade at about 1.5 billion US dollars in October, the latest month

for which data is available. China was in third place after Japan with trade of about 977 million US dollars.

In October 2006, the United States had about 1.56 billion US dollars in two-way trade with the Philippines while China had 809 million US dollars. Philippine imports from the United States are mainly electrical and transport equipment, while it exports mostly electronics and garments.

Nepali low-cost carrier launches int’l line

KATHMANDU, 24 Jan— Yeti Airlines International, a joint venture between Yeti Airlines and UAE-based Air Arabia, Tuesday began international flights, with its inaugural flight taking off to Kuala Lumpur, local newspaper *The Kathmandu Post* reported on Wednesday.

The airline, which is also known as Fly-Yeti.com, is scheduled to operate three flights a week to Malaysian capital

Kuala Lumpur, Malaysian capital, and thrice-weekly flights to Sharjah, United Arab Emirates (UAE), using a *Boeing 737-800* aircraft. It is the first Nepali low-cost carrier and the first to have foreign investment.

Minister for Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation Prithivi Subba Gurung said its operation will help to provide easy connections to Nepali working abroad and several more tourists to

visit Nepal. Lila Mani Poudel, secretary at the Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation, asked the airline to work with Nepal Tourism Board to promote Nepal’s image in the international market.

Ang Tshering Sherpa, chairman of the airline, said that the airline was planning to bring in another aircraft, an *Airbus-320*, in mid-February and another *Boeing 737-800* aircraft in mid-March.

Abu Dhabi says to invest \$15b in green energy

ABU DHABI, 23 Jan— Gulf Arab oil exporter Abu Dhabi plans to spend 15 billion US dollars in the first phase of an initiative to develop green energy and build the world’s largest hydrogen power plant, it said on Monday.

The investment would be part of the Masdar initiative, set up to develop sustainable and clean energy, Abu Dhabi’s Crown Prince Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed al-Nahayan told the World Future Energy Summit in the emirate. He gave no time frame.

Abu Dhabi, capital of the seven-member United Arab Emirates federation, will build the world’s largest hydrogen power plant with 500 megawatts of capacity, said Sultan al-Jaber, chief executive of Masdar, the Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company.

A Masdar official said British Petroleum and Rio Tinto would have a role in the power plant, but did not give details of their involvement.

Belarus leader Lukashenko dismisses business rally

MINSK, 24 Jan— The President of Belarus on Tuesday dismissed complaints by entrepreneurs about new rules governing business and said protests were being stage-managed by the opposition.

A court in the ex-Soviet state jailed and fined 12 of about 2,000 activists who joined an unauthorised rally on Monday that was broken up by police.

The opposition movement Vyasna said the participants were handed 15 day sentences for public order offences and fined up to 700 US dollars.

Small entrepreneurs

say new 2008 regulations deny them the right to hire workers outside their immediate families or oblige them to re-register and be subject to higher taxes.

But President Alexander Lukashenko, accused in the West of crushing fundamental rights, said businessmen were being manipulated by Belarus’ liberal and nationalist opposition.

“Money and business do not like people going into the street. It is clearly those people who want destabilization,” Lukashenko, referring to the opposition, was quoted as saying by *BELTA* news agency.— MNA/Reuters

Australian police seize 250,000 piracy DVDs

CANBERRA, 24 Jan— The police in Australia’s Victorian state on Tuesday busted what is believed to be the biggest-ever movie piracy operation in the country.

A home at Sunshine North, in Melbourne’s west, was raided and over 250,000 pirated DVDs and 100 DVD burners seized.

The haul included movies which have only just been released in cinemas and a 49-year-old man is helping police with their inquiries, according to a report of the Australian Broadcasting Corporation.

US drugs industry not reliable to prevent influenza

WASHINGTON, 24 Jan— Vaccines and drugs will not be enough to slow or prevent a pandemic of influenza, according to a US Government report released on Tuesday.

The report from the US Government Accountability Office confirms what most experts have been stressing for years — that the pharmaceutical industry cannot be relied on alone to protect the world from bird flu.

The GAO, the investigational arm of Congress, reached its own conclusion independently.

“The use of antivirals and vaccines to forestall the onset of a pandemic would likely be constrained by their uncertain effectiveness

and limited availability,” the GAO report reads.

Health experts almost universally agree that a global epidemic — a pandemic — of influenza is inevitable and even overdue. Flu is always circulating but, every few decades, a completely new strain emerges and makes millions sicker than usual.

One prime suspect is the H5N1 strain of avian influenza. It is entrenched in poultry across much of Asia, the Middle East and Africa, pops up regularly in Europe and has forced the slaughter of hundreds of millions of birds. It also occasionally infects people, killing 219 of the 351 people infected in 14 countries since 2003.

S Korea launches 30-mw solar power plant

SEOUL, 24 Jan—South Korea has launched the country's largest and most advanced solar power plant that can generate 30 megawatts of electricity amid increasing worries over climate change and high oil prices, the *Korea Herald* reported on Wednesday.

According to the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Energy, it completed a plant in Daegu which has the capacity to generate 30 megawatts of electricity with solar cells on Tuesday.

The ministry said it believes the new solar power plant will help elevate the standards of the country's solar energy industry, and signals the growing interest of local companies in producing key components for the market.

South Korea first stepped into the industry in 2003, and began domestic production of polysilicon in 2007. The ministry estimated that the new plant will generate 60 billion won (63 million US dollars) in sales this year, and have the power to supply energy to 12,000 homes. The investment in the plant is worth about 40 billion won (42 million US dollars).

Heavy rains kill 17 canoeing on Zambia lake

LUSAKA, 23 Jan—Seventeen people drowned in a man-made lake in Zambia when their canoe capsized due to heavy rains, officials said on Monday, adding that flooding in the country was expected to get worse.

Ackimson Banda, junior minister for Zambia's Central Province, said 13 of the victims were members of one family who were canoeing to a village to attend a funeral on Friday night.

"Seventeen people were confirmed dead after a canoe capsized on the man-made lake (Lusiwasi) where water has risen abnormally because of the heavy rains," Banda told *Reuters*.

Zambia, Mozambique, Zimbabwe and Malawi have been lashed by heavy rains for several weeks. Swollen rivers have burst their banks, killing dozens and forcing thousands of villagers to flee flooded homes.

Jacob Nkomoki the deputy director of Zambia's Meteorological Department said more flooding was expected from heavier rains forecast in traditionally higher rain belts in the country's northern region.

Britain's Defence Ministry details security breach

LONDON, 23 Jan—Britain's Defence Minister on Monday said he "regretted" the loss of a ministry laptop containing personal data on 600,000 military staff or potential recruits, the latest in a series of security breaches.

The theft of the computer from a car, has raised fears lives could be at risk if the unencrypted information falls into the wrong hands, but Des Browne said there was no evidence so far that that was the case.

The minister told Parliament the loss of the computer, which con-

tained passport and national insurance numbers, was the result of a "procedural" error by a member of staff, but also admitted it was the third laptop to go missing since 2005. "I take this extremely seriously," he said. "As with all parts of government, those who are dealing with the armed forces have a right to expect that their data will be properly protected. I very much regret that this has not happened."

The breach is the latest in a slew of slip-ups by government departments. In November, details on 25 million people were

lost by the Revenue and Customs department, and a week later information on three million learner drivers went missing.

The loss of the defence department computer could make government's plans for new legislation, including the introduction of detailed identity cards for all citizens, more difficult to pass.

Fire hits US residence building, 18 families evacuated

WASHINGTON, 23 Jan—A residential building in New Jersey caught fire Monday leaving at least 18

families displaced, according to a TV report. It is not yet known whether there have been any casualties. The fire devoured the building in Newark, burning through its multi-level structure before spreading to neighbouring buildings, WABC TV reported.

Most of the 18 families managed to escape under their own initiative, but it was still too early to tell whether any casualties had resulted from the fire which started in the afternoon, it said. A total of 72 fire-fighters attended the blaze, but it was so hot that they were unable to get inside the building. Adding to their difficulties, their water equipment had frozen in the cold weather.—MNA/Xinhua

Saudi Arabia eases rules for women in hotels

RIYADH, 23 Jan—Saudi authorities, breaking with religious codes that require women to be accompanied by a male guardian, have decided to allow women to stay in hotels on their own, a newspaper reported on Monday.

A royal decree allowed the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to lay down new regulations simply requiring women to show personal identification including a photograph, which hotel managers must register with local police, al-Watan said.

Tribal custom and hardline religious strictures limit women's movement in the conservative Islamic state, the only country in the world where women are forbidden from driving. Saudi women can face harassment from the religious police if they are not accompanied in public areas by a male relative who acts as her "guardian". The rules are less strictly enforced for foreigners and in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia's most liberal city.

The paper said the rules, set out in last month's decree, were worked out in coordination with the Ministry of the Interior and the religious police organization, two bodies who rights activists say stand in the way of improved women's rights in Saudi Arabia.

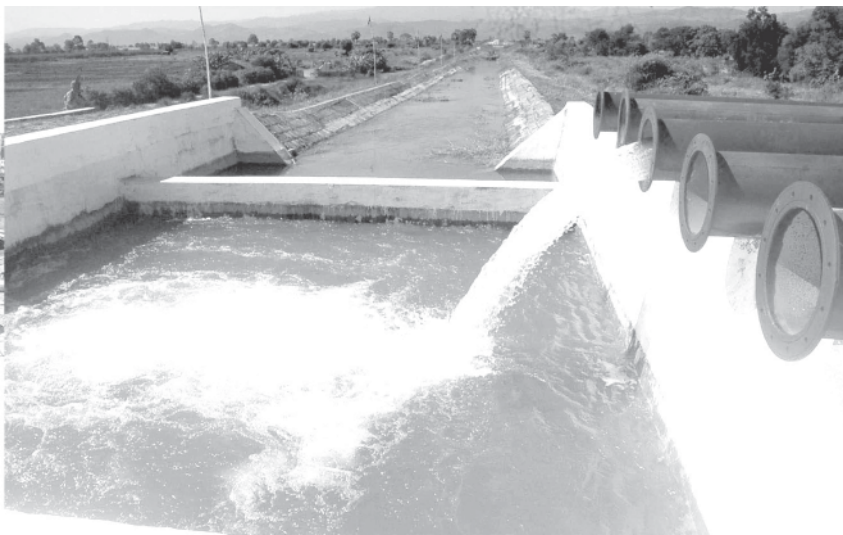

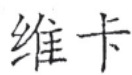

British Man held over "frenzied" attack on girl

LONDON, 24 Jan— Police said on Wednesday they had arrested a 21-year-old man in connection with the frenzied knife attack on a teenage girl in a Lancashire park.

Jessica Knight, 14, is critical in hospital after suffering multiple stab wounds in the incident which took place at around 5 p.m. on

Monday in Astley Park, Chorley, south of Preston. "This is a particularly nasty assault on a defenceless young girl," said Detective Superintendent Steve Brunskill.

"At this early stage of the investigation we are unsure of the motive and would urge people in the area to take precautions for their own

safety until this dangerous offender, or offenders, are caught."

Police said they were now questioning a local 21-year-old man on suspicion of attempted murder. Knight was thought to have gone to the park, a popular hangout for young people, after visiting shops in Astley village.

Indonesian man infected by bird flu, putting cases to 120

JAKARTA, 24 Jan— A 30-year-old Indonesian man from the outskirts of Jakarta was infected by avian influenza, bringing the total cases to 120 with 97 fatal in the hardest-hit country, Indonesian Health Ministry said Tuesday.

The man from Tangerang Town had been treated in a bird flu designed hospital of Persahabatan in east Jakarta since 18 January, an official of anti-bird flu centre of the ministry Joko Suyono said.

"Two of his laboratories tests show positive today," Suyono told *Xinhua*. The man did not have historical contact with fowl like many other victims of the disease, said the official.

DPRK chief demands to develop software tech faster

PYONGYANG, 23 Jan—Kim Jong-il, top leader of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) has called for efforts to speed up the development of computer software technology, the official leading newspaper *Rodong Sinmun* reported on Tuesday.

"It is of weighty importance to develop the programming technology as required by the age of science and technology and the age of computer," Kim said when visiting the 18th national programme contest and exhibition of the DPRK.

The DPRK should speed up the development of software technology under a long-term plan and more thoroughly establish the system for training software technologists and reinforcing the material means, Kim said. The educational institutions should offer effective computer education to students from their early years, he added.

The newspaper reported that Kim looked round exhibits for a long while to acquaint himself in detail with the performance of programmes and their development. — *MNA/Xinhua*

Bolivia seizes 50 tons of drugs

LIMA, 24 Jan—Over 50 tons of drugs have been seized since the beginning of 2008 in Bolivia, anti-narcotics police said Tuesday.

The drugs, including 800 kilos of cocaine and 51 tons of marijuana, were confiscated in over 500 anti-drug operations, police said in a statement.

Officers also demolished two drug processing plants and captured a large amount of coca leaves, from which cocaine is extracted, and other chemicals used in drug production.

Most hauls were made in border areas linking Bolivia with Chile, Peru and Brazil.

Bolivia sits in a transit route, on which drugs, destined for the US and European markets, are smuggled from Peru to Brazil and Chile. In 2007, Bolivian police seized over 430 tons of drugs and arrested 4,178 suspected drug dealers. — *MNA/Xinhua*

Egypt detains 30 Brotherhood men over Gaza protests

CAIRO, 24 Jan — Egyptian security men detained at least 30 members of the Muslim Brotherhood in dawn raids on Wednesday, accusing them of illegally organizing protests against the Israeli blockade of Gaza, security sources said.

The arrests were the latest escalation in a crackdown on Egypt's most powerful opposition group and followed the detention of 37 Brotherhood members over the past two days in the northern port city of Alexandria.

Security men rounded up the men in raids on their homes in northern Egypt. Those held include the secretary general of the Cairo doctors' syndicate, Saad Zaghloul, security sources said.

A Brotherhood spokesman confirmed that dozens of members had been arrested, and said the arrests took place in Giza, north of Cairo, and in Gharbia and Kafr al-Sheikh in the Nile Delta. All are areas where the Brotherhood has a strong popular base.

British voting system open to fraud

PARIS, 24 Jan — Britain's voting system is open to fraud and makes it "childishly simple" to register bogus voters, Europe's main human rights body said on Tuesday.

Britain introduced new laws in 2006 to combat postal vote fraud after a probe found local members of then-prime minister Tony Blair's Labour Party had conducted massive vote-rigging in a local election in Birmingham, Britain's second biggest city. —MNA/Reuters

Study says sociable people get fat, worriers thin

TOKYO, 23 Jan — Outgoing people tend to be overweight, while anxious types are more likely to be thin, according to Japanese researchers who examined the links between personality and body mass.

More than 30,000 people in northeastern Japan aged between 40 and 64 were quizzed about their height and weight, and given a personality test, according to a study published in the *Journal of Psychosomatic Research* this month.

The results showed that

outgoing people were far more likely than other people to have a body mass index (BMI) of more than 25, a widely used definition of overweight, said Masako Kakizaki of Tohoku University, who led the analysis.

After controlling for other factors, such as smoking, men in the most extrovert category were 1.73 times more likely to be obese than their most introvert counterparts.

Extrovert women were 1.53 times as likely to be obese. People ranked as having the most anxious personalities were twice as likely as the least anxious to be underweight, or have a BMI of less than 18.5, the study found.

"These results may provide clues to devising more effective measures for preventing overweight, obesity or underweight," the researchers said in their paper. —MNA/Reuters

Blasts and bullets kill 16 in Iraq

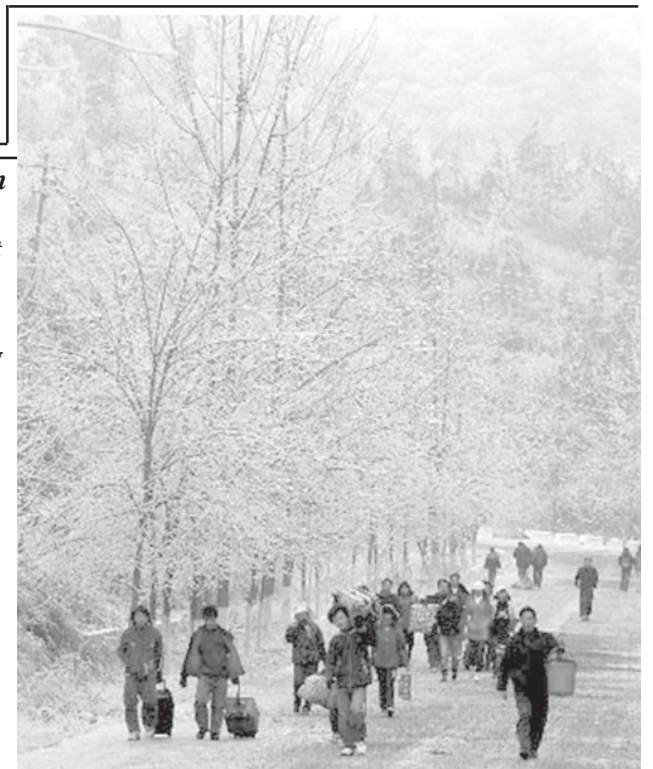
MOSUL, 24 Jan — Blasts and bullets killed at least 16 people in Iraq on Wednesday, among them seven who died when munitions blew up and three Iraqi soldiers shot dead in a Baghdad street, officials said.

Almost 90 people were wounded in the violence, which also included a car bomb in a usually peaceful town near the oil city of Kirkuk, security officials said. Police Brigadier General Abdul al-Juburi said a powerful blast ripped

through an empty three-storey apartment block in Mosul, Iraq's main northern city, bringing the building down and shattering adjoining houses. "We have at least seven people killed and 70 wounded," Juburi said, adding that the blast was caused when munitions blew up. "The Iraqi Army received reports that a cache of weapons and munitions had been discovered in an empty building in west Mosul. The Army arrived near the area and was waiting for the disposal experts to arrive when the explosion occurred," Juburi told AFP. —Internet

Norway says embassy in Kabul threatened

OSLO, 24 Jan — Norway's Embassy and other buildings in the Afghan capital Kabul have been threatened with attack, Norwegian officials said on Tuesday. Word of the threat came just over a week after a four-man suicide squad breached security at Kabul's luxury Serena Hotel, killing eight people, including a Norwegian journalist.

Vietnam to have 7th mobile operator this month

HANOI, 23 Jan — Vietnam's Ministry of Information and Communications plans to license the country's seventh mobile phone service provider named G-Tel, an enterprise under the Vietnamese Ministry of Public Security, this month, local newspaper *Youth* reported on Tuesday.

G-Tel will join hands with VimpelCom, a Russian mobile phone service provider, in establishing its mobile phone network in Vietnam.

Two years ago, Vietnam ceased granting new licences for mobile phone service providers, so the six licensed operators could keep their businesses running effectively. Now, three Vietnamese GSM operators Viettel, MobiFone and VinaPhone, and CDMA operator EVN Telecom are vying for Vietnam's first licence to offer mobile services using third-generation (3G) technology. Vietnam signed up 18.5 million mobile and fixed phone subscribers in 2007, nearly equating to the combined number of subscribers registered from 2004 to 2006, the ministry's Telecommunications Department told *Xinhua* recently. —MNA/Reuters

All 19 on board Polish aircraft die in crash

WARSAW, 24 Jan — All 19 people on board a Polish military transport aircraft died when it crashed late Wednesday near the Miroslawiec airport in northwest Poland, an airport spokesman said Thursday.

"Nobody survived the accident," Bogdan Ziolkowski told reporters.

The Spanish-built CASA C-295M transporter was approaching the West Pomeranian town of Miroslawiec when it went down in woods close to a Polish Air Force base runway, before setting on fire, Polish news agency PAP reported, quoting local fire services.

Prime Minister Donald Tusk and Defence Minister Bogdan Klich

visited the crash site during the night. President Lech Kaczynski, on a visit to Croatia, announced that he would return to Poland Thursday.

According to the Polish military, there were 15 passengers and four crew on board. Poland's TVN24 all-news television channel said the

plane was carrying officials taking part in an aviation safety conference.

The C-295M is a medium-range, twin-turboprop aircraft developed by the Madrid-based manufacturer, Construcciones Aeronauticas SA (Casa).

Rangers crush East Stirling 6-0 in Scottish Cup

GLASGOW, 24 Jan — Kris Boyd's hat-trick helped Rangers romp to a 6-0 win over Fourth Division East Stirling in Wednesday's Scottish FA Cup fourth round clash. The Scottish Premier League leaders, who will next visit Hibernian in the fifth round on February 3, effectively had the tie wrapped up with three goals inside five first half minutes.

Striker Lee McCulloch began the rout after 24 minutes when he was found on the right by Charlie Adam, cut inside a defender and slotted past goalkeeper Michael Brown from eight metres. Rangers defender Alan Hutton then ended a surging run by taking a back-heeled return pass from Alan Gow before striking a shot across Brown into the net after 27 minutes.

Boyd grabbed his first goal two minutes later with a clipped six-metre shot from Gow's cut-back and made it 4-0 just before halftime with a low shot that deflected off a defender. McCulloch blasted home a superb fifth goal five minutes into the second period from 25 metres and Boyd completed his hat-trick after 61 minutes from the penalty spot. "I'm quite glad it's over because it could have got out of hand," East Stirling manager Gordon Wyld told the BBC. — MNA/Reuters

ROME, 24 Jan — Atalanta came from behind to beat AC Milan 2-1 in Bergamo on Wednesday and move up to sixth place in Serie A.

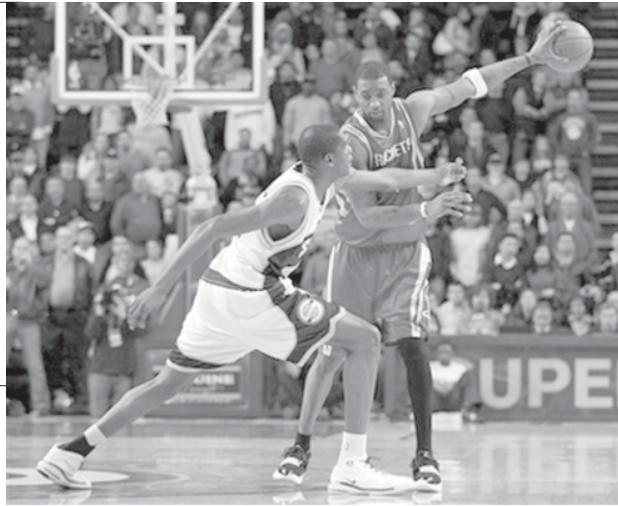

MADRID, 24 Jan — Last season's King's Cup runners-up Getafe and six times winners Valencia have the upper hand in their quarterfinals after 1-0 home wins in their first-leg matches on Wednesday. Chelsea to face Spurs in League Cup final

LONDON, 24 Jan — Holders Chelsea will meet London rivals Tottenham Hotspur in next month's League Cup final at Wembley Stadium after beating Everton 1-0 in the second leg of their semifinal at Goodison Park on Wednesday.

Chelsea, holding a 2-1 first-leg lead, wrapped up an evenly balanced tie after 69 minutes when Joe Cole scored with a brilliant strike after a long raking pass from Florent

Malouda. Forward Cole controlled the ball superbly with his first touch before firing past goalkeeper Tim Howard from 12 metres.

Earlier Nicolas Anelka hit the Everton crossbar while Joleon Lescott went close for the home side after only 10 minutes but saw a fine header scrambled away by Chelsea keeper Petr Cech.

Cech had double reason to celebrate at the end after becoming a father

for the first time earlier in the day. He also had an outstanding game and kept Everton out with a series of fine saves from, among others, Phil Neville and Phil Jagielka as Everton, battling to reach the final for the first time since 1984, pressurized the visitors defence.

But with Ricardo Carvalho also playing superbly at the back, Chelsea held firm and gradually took control of the game. — MNA/Reuters

Late double gives Juve Cup draw with 10-man Inter Milan

ROME, 24 Jan — Late goals from Alessandro Del Piero and Jean Alain Boumsong earned Juventus a 2-2 draw at 10-

man Inter Milan on Wednesday in the first leg of their Italian Cup quarterfinal. Argentine striker Julio

Cruz headed the Serie A leaders in front nine minutes after the break and turned in a cross from Brazilian winger Cesar in the 74th to double the lead.

Del Piero pulled one back for Juve in the 79th and French defender Boumsong, who is expected to leave Turin in the transfer window, levelled the score with a header five minutes from time. Cruz almost snatched a win for Inter when he hit the post in the closing stages.—MNA/Reuters

S Africa snatch late draw against Angola

TAMALE, 24 Jan — Substitute Elrio van Heerden scored from long range with two minutes left to give South Africa a 1-1 draw against Angola in the African Nations Cup on Wednesday.

Beijing proposes smoking ban for hotels

BEIJING, 24 Jan — Beijing is to ban smoking in 70 per cent of the city's hotel rooms as it strives to clean up its air before this August's Olympic Games.

A draft law on the official website of Beijing Legislative Affairs Office (www.bjfbz.gov.cn) bans smoking inside all hotels except for in "well-ventilated and clearly indicated smoking rooms".

China has an estimated 350 million smokers and the smell of tobacco is difficult to escape in the country's capital with existing bans frequently flouted.

The new Beijing regulation, which is open to public consultation but will be enacted on 31 May, will later be expanded to

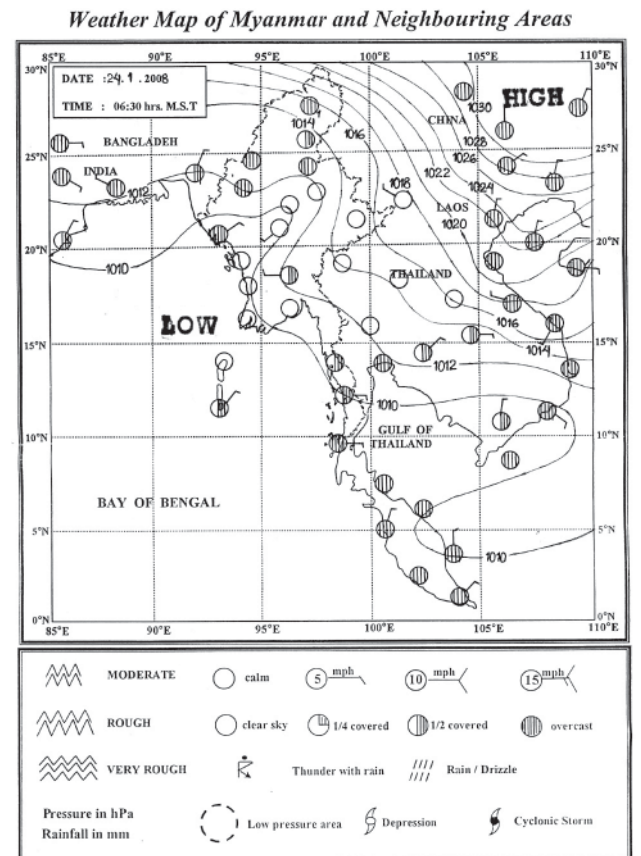
cover fitness centres, cultural heritage sites and offices.

Fines for violations will be only 50 yuan (6.91 US dollars), however, compared to the 100 to 200 yuan (14-28-US-dollar) fines taxi drivers face if they smoke in their cabs under a law brought in last October.

Hospitals and universities will be allowed outdoor smoking areas but they must be away from places that people have no choice but to pass through, the draft said.

Smoking is already banned in schools, libraries, cinemas, theatres, museums, galleries, stores, banks and post offices and on public transport.

Bird flu hits Vietnam poultry, may have killed man

HANOI, 24 Jan — Bird flu may have killed a 32-year-old Vietnamese man in a northern province where the virus has been found in poultry, state-run media and a government report said on Tuesday.


The man died at a Hanoi hospital of pneumonia earlier

this month, two days after he had been taken in from Tuyen Quang Province, the hospital's deputy director Nguyen Hong Ha was quoted by the online VTC News newspaper (www.vtc.vn) as saying.

The man fell ill on January 16 after eating

chicken which had died of unknown cause. Dead chicken and white-winged ducks were also found near his house, the newspaper quoted a relative as saying.

Vietnamese doctors were testing to see if the man had been infected by the H5N1 virus.—MNA/Reuters

Prime Minister General Thein Sein meets local people in Kachin State

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Jan — Chairman of the Work Committee for Development of Border Areas and National Races Prime Minister General Thein Sein met with departmental officials, members of social organizations and townsenders in Putao, Kachin State, on 22 January.

Also present on the occasion were Lt-Gen Ye Myint, Chairman of Kachin State Peace and Development Council Commander of Northern Command Maj-Gen Ohn Myint, Chairman of Sagaing Division Peace and Development Council Commander of North-West Command Brig-Gen Myint Soe, ministers, deputy ministers and de-

partmental heads.

At the meeting, Chairman of Putao District Peace and Development Council U Mya Aye reported on cultivation of rain-fed paddy and irrigated paddy fields in the district, cultivation of nine major crops except cotton, reclamation, sufficiency of rice and edible oil, transportation, education and health sectors in the district.

Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister said Putao District is

located in the northernmost part of the country and shares borders with two neighbouring nations with heavy populations. Therefore, it plays an important part in strengthening relations including political, economic and social affairs between Myanmar and the two neighbours.

Putao District is rich in natural resources and rivers and creeks which can produce hydro power flow in the district. Moreover, snow-capped

mountains and forests in the division can develop the eco-tourism in the region. Therefore, Putao District can bring benefits to Kachin State as well as to the country.

The climate of all areas including Kachin State is favourable for agriculture. Myanmar can produce rice, fish and meat and is also rich in natural resources.

Therefore, people do not need to worry about three basic needs. However, people are needed to make

more efforts for improvement of their living standard making the best use of natural advantages.

The Government has made efforts for equitable development of all regions in the country.

As Putao District is mountainous, it is diffi-

cult to construct and upgrade roads in the region. However, the government is making efforts to construct roads and bridges.
