## Sudan rejects US human rights criticism

KHARTOUM, 15 March — Sudan rejected US criticism of its human rights record on Thursday, saying George W Bush's Administration was the biggest rights abuser in the world and had ignored big improvements made by Khartoum.

The US State Department said Sudan's record remained "horrific" with "continued reports of extrajudicial killings, torture, beatings, and rape by government security forces and their proxy militia in Darfur" in a report published on Tuesday. But Sudan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs accused Washington of ignoring significant improvements in the human rights situation.

The "Sudan Government has never hesitated in adopting legal procedure against the persons who committed human rights violations in Darfur," said the statement, released on the state *Suna* news agency on Thursday.

International experts estimate 200,000 people have died and 2.5 million been forced to flee homes in Sudan's western Darfur region since conflict erupted there in 2003. Khartoum puts the death toll at 9,000.— *MNA/Reuters*

### Chad says Sudan sent rebels across its border

DAKAR, 15 March — Chad on Thursday accused Sudan of sending "heavily armed columns" of anti-government rebels into its territory in the midst of international efforts to secure a peace accord between the two neighbours.

"The Chadian Government informs national and international opinion that Sudan on Wednesday March 12, 2008 launched several heavily armed columns against Chad," an official statement released in N'Djamena said.

Calling the attacking forces "mercenaries", the usual term it uses for Chadian rebels, the Chadian Government said the incursion took place at Moudeina on its eastern frontier with Sudan's Darfur. There was no immediate independent confirmation.

Chad, which often accuses Khartoum of backing Chadian rebels fighting to topple President Idriss Deby, made the latest accusation as the leaders of both states were preparing to meet in the Senegalese capital Dakar in the latest peace initiative.— *MNA/Reuters*

### Chavez goads US over terrorism blacklist, sanctions

CARACAS, 15 March — Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez dared the United States on Friday to impose sanctions on his OPEC nation as a terrorism sponsor after US officials said they were investigating his support for Colombian rebels.

The probe could prompt the Bush Administration to put the self-styled socialist revolutionary on the list and impose sanctions on the major oil supplier to the United States. "They threatened to put us on the list of terrorists that they've got there. Great, let them make their list and shove it in their ... pocket," Chavez said with a pause for comic effect.

The United States, which clashes with Chavez over everything from oil prices to arms sales, has pledged to investigate Colombian allegations this month that a rebel's computer files show Chavez offered the FARC 300 million US dollars.

The leftist, anti-US Chavez expresses sympathy for Marxist FARC rebels and has called for the United States and the European Union to stop labelling the group as terrorists, causing friction with neighboring Colombia, a US ally. — *MNA/Reuters*

### Ecuadorean President says US should stop accusations

QUITO, 15 March — Ecuadorean President Rafael Correa Friday told his US counterpart George W Bush to "shut up", in response to US criticism that Ecuador harbours rebels of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC). In a declaration published by the presidency, Correa also challenged Bush to send troops to the Colombian-Ecuadorean border.

"Bring your soldiers Bush, let your soldiers die at the southern border with Colombia. Let's see if US citizens will accept such an outrage. Otherwise, shut up and try to understand what's happening in Latin America," Correa added.

Correa made the remarks following implied criticism of Ecuador by US Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, who said Thursday during a visit to Brazil that "responsible states" should not let their territory be used by "terrorists".

### Republican fundraisers' ex-auditor under scrutiny

WASHINGTON, 15 March — The fundraising arm for Republican members of the US House of Representatives said on Thursday its former treasurer is under investigation for the unauthorized transfers of "several hundred thousand dollars" of its funds to outside committees.

The National Republican Congressional Committee said that after

it learned bogus financial statements had been submitted to its bank dating back to 2002, it contacted the FBI, which began a criminal investigation.

Christopher Ward, a consultant to the committee and its former treasurer, was dismissed in January. He had worked for the committee since 1995.

Citing an unnamed law enforcement official, *The Washington Post* first

reported that the FBI was investigating what appears to be a "significant amount of money" missing from the committee. The committee's chairman, Representative Tom Cole of Oklahoma, said in a statement, "The evidence we have today indicates we have been deceived and betrayed for a number of years by a highly respected and trusted individual."

# Hu, Putin hail strategic partnership development

BEIJING, 14 March — Chinese President Hu Jintao and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin hailed the development of the strategic partnership between the two countries in a telephone conversation, the Chinese Foreign Ministry said on Thursday.

Hu spoke highly of Putin's outstanding contributions to the China-Russia strategic partnership in the phone talks Wednesday, the ministry said in a statement. The two countries have signed the Sino-Russian Good-Neighbour-

ly Treaty of Friendship and Cooperation and achieved a thorough settlement of the border issue, the Chinese President said.

Both countries successfully staged the "Year of Russia" in China and the "Year of China" in Russia during the past two years, after the signing of a joint statement on world order in the 21st Century in July 2005, he added.

Hu expressed confidence in seeing more fruits of friendship and further development of the Russia-China strategic partnership

based on common efforts.

Putin highly evaluated his close and fruitful cooperation with Hu, reaffirming that Russia and China are strategic partners and that his country attaches great importance to bilateral ties with China.

More than 600 events were staged within the framework of the national theme years, he said, adding Russia and China have witnessed steady expansion of bilateral trade and good cooperation in world affairs.

### China's CPPCC concludes annual session

BEIJING, 15 March — The First Session of the 11th National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC) concluded on Friday, adopting resolutions and stressing the leadership of the Communist Party of China (CPC) over the CPPCC.

### Cambodia, Singapore sign MoU to fight transnational crimes

PHNOM PENH, 14 March — Cambodian and Singaporean Government officials here on Thursday signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to carry out more cooperation against transnational crimes.

"The Ministry of Home Affairs of Singapore (MHA) and its counterpart Ministry of Interior of the Kingdom of Cambodia have agreed to enhance bilateral cooperation with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on developing cooperation to combat transnational crimes," said a Press release from the Singaporean Embassy.

The MOU with the Kingdom of Cambodia was signed by a senior Singaporean delegation and Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sar Kheng in Phnom Penh on Thursday, it said.

"The MOU provides a formal framework to facilitate better understanding of challenges in the areas of combating transnational crimes, and the conclusion of the MOU signals closer

cooperation in the exchange of expertise and information between Singapore and the Kingdom of Cambodia," it said.

### India to continue one-China policy

NEW DELHI, 14 March — India will continue to abide by the one-China policy and oppose any activity that is against the one-China principal, said Navtej Sarna, spokesman of Indian Ministry of External Affairs on Thursday. In an exclusive interview with Xinhua on Taiwan issue, Sarna said the government of India has followed the one-China policy and does not have diplomatic or official relations with Taiwan. The India's policy is consistent and has been conveyed to the government of the People's Republic of China on several occasions.

Most recently, he said, during the Prime Minister of India's visit to China in January 2008, in a joint statement, the Indian side recalls that India was among the first countries to recognize that there is one China, and that its one-China policy has remained unchanged.—Xinhua





## Merkel vows to protect auto sector jobs

BRUSSELS, 15 March — German Chancellor Angela Merkel vowed to protect jobs in her country's car industry on Thursday, ahead of an EU summit where leaders will seek to set out a timetable for action on curbing emissions. "I will be standing up particularly for jobs in Germany's car sector," Merkel said before

the talks in Brussels, saying that countries which manufacture large cars should not be treated worse than those which produce smaller ones.

"That is why we want a fair set of rules here," she told reporters, adding that efforts to protect the environment must be tied in with maintaining a competitive industrial

base. EU states agreed in principle last year to cut emissions by at least one-fifth by 2020 from 1990 levels, to use 20 per cent of renewable energy sources in power production and 10 per cent of biofuels from crops in transport by the same date.

The EU wants to work out the details on how to achieve those targets by this time next year so as to be ready for global talks on new emissions rules to replace the Kyoto Protocol. —MNA/Reuters

## China overtakes US as top Web market

SHANGHAI, 15 March — China has surpassed the United States to become the world's largest Internet market by number of users, a research firm said on Thursday. The estimate by Beijing-based BDA was based on data from China Internet Network Information Centre which indicated that the country's Internet users totalled 210 million at end-2007.

Nielsen/NetRatings put the United States Web population at 216 million for the same period, BDA said. "Based on these sources and the assumption that these markets have continued to grow in 2008 to date at the same rates that they grew in 2007, we can conclude that China has by now comfortably surpassed the United States as the world's largest Internet population," analyst Bin Liu said in a statement.

BDA added that it expected e-commerce to become the next boom sector in China, as businesses take advantage of the mass market of consumers already online. —MNA/Reuters

## Vietnam produces energy-saving mobile microprocessor

HANOI, 14 March — The Vietnamese company VSMC has succeeded in manufacturing Vietnam's first energy-saving microprocessor which helps mobile electronics devices slash their energy consumption by 40 per cent, local newspaper *Young People* reported Thursday.

The microprocessor coded VS8801A can be used in smart phones, digital cameras, PDAs, Pocket PCs, and iPods. Vo Huu Hai, director of the company in southern Ho Chi Minh City, said his firm and Taiwanese microprocessor maker TSMC have reached a deal on VS8801A production. —MNA/Xinhua

## China's fixed asset investment up 24.3%

BEIJING, 15 March — China's fixed asset investment totalled 812.1 billion yuan (about 114.4 billion US dollars) in the first two months, up 24.3 per cent year on year, the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) said on Friday.

The figure represented a slight acceleration, by 0.9 percentage points than that for 2007's same period.

Investment in the booming real estate sector grew 32.9 per cent to 237.4 billion yuan, according to the NBS. Investment in projects authorized by the central government rose by 14.9 per cent and in local government-approved projects by 25.3 per cent compared with the same period of last year. —MNA/Xinhua

## Russia, Ukraine agree to remove gas middlemen

MOSCOW, 14 March — Russia and Ukraine will remove all middlemen in their gas trade, Russia's gas export monopoly said on Thursday, ending years of opaque schemes which caused tensions between the two neighbours and alarmed investors.

"There is no need for them now after we agreed to supply some volumes to Ukraine's industrial consumers directly and given the upcoming rise in the Central Asian gas price," Gazprom's spokesman Sergei Kupriyanov told *Reuters*.

The move is likely to be hailed by Ukraine's Prime Minister Yulia Tymoshenko, who has demanded Moscow axe all intermediaries saying their role was unclear and led only to gas price increases for Ukraine.

Her tough stance and Ukraine's debt for previous supplies of gas were the main reasons behind a new round of tensions between Moscow and Kiev, which prompted Gazprom to briefly halve supplies to Ukraine earlier this month. —MNA/Reuters

## Britain, China explore potentials in creative industries

LONDON, 14 March — The Centre for Creative Business in London hosted on Thursday Creative Exchange with China, exploring the possibilities of business ventures between the two countries in the creative industry. The conference, which is aimed to help creative businesses from both China and Britain to get to know each other before exploring the business potentials of the rising industry, has attracted some 200 creative entrepreneurs, creative business managers and executives, policy makers, practitioners academics and researchers.

In his keynote speech delivered at the conference, Michael Bichard, rector of the University of the Arts London, said within the next two years, Britain's creative industries sector is expected to overtake the financial sector as the country's most significant economy. At the same time, China will move ahead of Germany as the world's third largest economy.

## Cambodia to reduce foreign debt to \$2b after election

PHNOM PENH, 14 March — In the face of recent US appeals for Cambodia to pay back its foreign debt, Cambodia has announced plans to make substantial repayments

after the 2008 election, local media reported on Thursday.

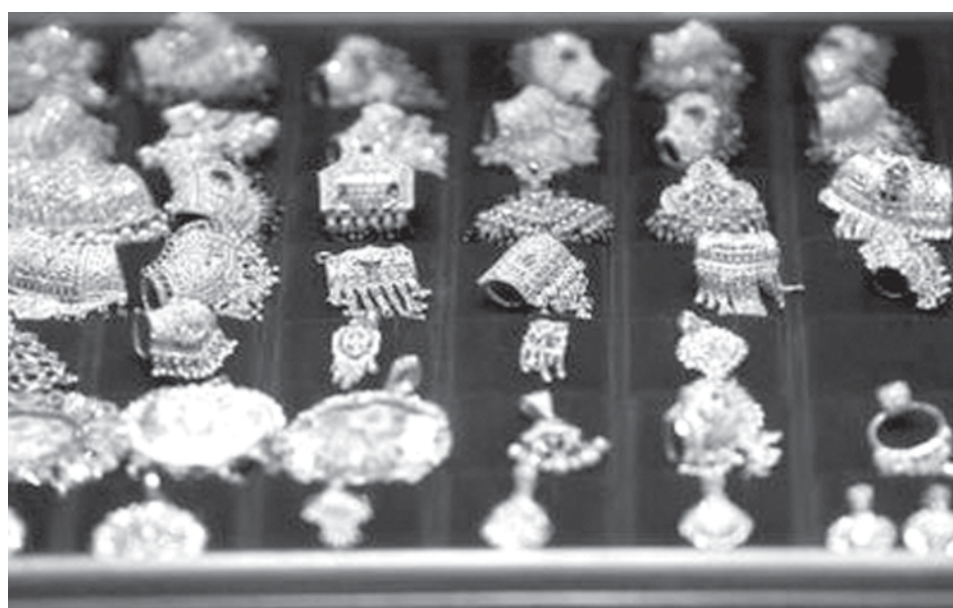
"We hope that foreign debt will be reduced to two billion US dollars," Hang Chuon Naron,

secretary general of the Economy and Finance Ministry, was quoted by the *Mekong Times* newspaper as saying.

The Cambodian Government will hold negotiations with loan providers both to reduce debts and set aside a portion of the state budget to repay them, Hang Chuon Naron said. "We will need 20 million to 50 million US dollars each year to repay the US and Russia," he added.

Cambodia currently owes over three billion US dollars to foreign countries, according to Finance Ministry figures from 2006, the newspaper said.

# US gets guilty plea on illegal exports to India

WASHINGTON, 15 March — The owner of an electronics company pleaded guilty on Thursday to conspiracy to illegally export sensitive computer components, including missile technology, to India, the US Justice Department said.

Parthasarathy Sudarshan, 47, admitted he took part in a scheme to provide the parts to government

entities in India that develop missiles, space launch vehicles and fighter jets, department officials said.

According to court documents, Sudarshan did business as Cirrus Electronics and said he was the chief executive officer, managing director, president and group head. It has offices in Simpsonville, South Carolina; Singapore; and

Bangalore, India.

He had many years of experience as an electrical engineer in the research and development section of India's state-run defence industry, before he emigrated to Singapore and started Cirrus in 1997, the officials said. Among the recipients of the US technology were the Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre and Bharat Dynamics—key state agencies in India's space and defence sectors.

## US falsely implicates Guantanamo prisoner

GUANTANAMO BAY US NAVAL BASE (Cuba), 14 March — A US military report on a battle in which a US soldier died in Afghanistan was altered after the fact to falsely blame a young Canadian prisoner, his lawyer said on Thursday.

The report initially said the assailant who threw the fatal grenade had himself been killed in the battle near the Afghan city of Khost on 27 July, 2002, the lawyer, Navy Lieutenant Commander William Kuebler, told reporters at the Guantanamo naval base.

The officer who wrote that report on 28 July, 2002, revised it about two months later to say the grenade thrower survived, implicating Canadian prisoner Omar Khadr, said Kuebler. He asked a judge in the Guantanamo war court to allow him to interview that officer about the contradictory accounts. — MNA/Reuters

## Japan domestic violence cases jump, women end silence

TOKYO, 15 March — Japanese police said on Thursday the number of domestic violence cases jumped 15 percent last year to 21,000 cases as more women

broke their silence about assaults in the home.

"An increasing number of cases concern women who had previously suffered in silence but have decided

to come out to seek advice or support from police," *Kyodo News* agency quoted an agency official as saying. A growing public outcry about violence behind closed doors prompted Japan to enact its first law on domestic violence in 2001. This was expanded in 2004 to cover former spouses and children. Courts can order perpetrators to leave their homes for two months and force them to stay away from their children, spouse or former spouse.

## Kenyan forces arrest 69 militiamen in offensive

ELDORET (Kenya), 14 March — Kenyan security forces have arrested 69 members of a shadowy militia blamed for a spate of bloody clashes over land in Kenya's Mount Elgon region, a local official said on Wednesday.

violence preceded a wave of ethnic killings around Kenya after President Mwai Kibaki's disputed re-election in December, but it shares some of the same root causes mainly resentment over land distribution and tribal tensions. "We have arrested 69 members of the Sabaot Land Defence Force, the operation will continue until the militias are wiped out," provincial commissioner Abdul Mwasera told *Reuters*.

At least 300 people have fled their homes and are seeking refuge at a nearby shopping centre in Cheptais Town. Some have crossed the border to nearby Uganda, witnesses say.

## Suicide car bomb kills eight Afghans near Kabul airport

KABUL, 14 March — A suicide car bomber killed eight Afghan civilians in an attack on US troops near the airport in Afghanistan's capital on Thursday, a NATO spokesman said.

Taliban Islamist militants have threatened to step up suicide attacks on the capital Kabul this year in a campaign to wear down the will of NATO countries to carry on the fight in Afghanistan and force a withdrawal of foreign troops.

Thirty-five civilians were also wounded in Thursday's attack, but the four US soldiers inside the two vehicles targeted suffered only minor cuts and bruises. — MNA/Reuters

## Pakistan says US-led Afghan force kills four villagers

ISLAMABAD, 14 March — Foreign forces in Afghanistan killed four Pakistani civilians, including two children, when they fired across the border, a Pakistani military spokesman said on Thursday.

Up to 2,000 villagers protested against the strike that happened on Tuesday

night in Pakistan's North Waziristan border region where militants opposed to both the Afghan and Pakistani governments are based.

"They fired five rounds which landed in our territory and in the process a house was destroyed resulting in the deaths of two women and

two children," said military spokesman Major General Athar Abbas. Pakistan had lodged a "very strong" protest with international forces in Afghanistan over the attack on the house, which was about two kilometres (1.25 miles) inside Pakistan, he said.

# Who does not favour election policy based on Bogyoke's patriotic spirit and preservation of own lineage, and why?

The 1947 constitution of the Union of Myanmar was drawn in haste in the pre-independence period. In 1947, Myanmar was still under the rule of British colonialists. The invaders had a conspiracy to leave hilly regions out of the independence plan as schedule areas and grant independence to only the plain areas even if they had no choice. **However, thanks to the foresight of leaders of Myanmar patriots, nationalistic spirit and national unity, Panglong Agreement could be endorsed on 12 February 1947.** So, the whole Union regained independence.

**At that time, some feudal sawbwas (chieftains) abetted by the colonialists tried to wreck the Panglong Conference to the liking of the aliens. After the nation achieved independence, the colonialists incited the armed insurrection of national races who were completely under the alien influence. Now, the colonialists' attempts to drive a wedge has come to the knowledge of the entire people, so national races have been able to achieve national reconsolidation.**

When the drawing of the 1947 constitution was in process, Nyaungshwe Sawbwa Sao Shwe Thaik and his fourth wife Maha Devi Sao Hein Kham insisted that they could not participate in the process if the right to secede from the Union was not among the principles. Bogyoke Aung San had to yield to their coercion because regaining of independence was essential. However, foreseeing possible evil consequences of the sections, he on 17 July 1947 instructed state affairs subcommittee for drawing the State constitution U Myint Thein to omit the section on secession from the Union at the meeting to be held on 20 July 1947. On 19 July 1947, Bogyoke Aung San and some of his colleagues were assassinated. At the meeting on 20 July 1947, U Myint Thein submitted a case to leave out the section on secession from the Union as instructed by Bogyoke. It was later disclosed that Sao Shwe Thaik and Sao Hein Kham turned down the proposal and approved the section. Referring to the section, some sawbwas launched secession movements in the 1950s. The movements became out of control in March 1962. Many parties such as AFPFL, Pa-Hta-Sa, Pa-Ma-Nya-Ta, and Ra-Ta-Nya protested the movements. The ruling government was not in a position to control the deteriorating situations. Therefore, on 2 March 1962, the Revolutionary Council had to prevent the nation from the federal movements and the joining of SEATO or the US military empire that could break up the nation into eight parts. In other words, the Revolutionary Council had to safeguard the Union and Myanmar's sovereignty (independence).

It was followed by national race armed insurgency resulting from narrow racism, a wedge driven by alien countries among national races, and doubts. It had to work a lot to tackle the problems. Now, although a handful of remnant armed groups have fallen into the colonialists' snare of not returning to the legal fold, all the national race armed groups have made peace to share the tasks for peace and development of the Union. Not long ago, however, a group of old sawbwas led by Sao Hkam Hpa who were in exile (in the US and Europe) announced the secession of Shan State from the Union and establishment of independent Shan State.

Now, national brethren are upholding the independence policy of Bogyoke, and policy of ensuring perpetual existence of the Union with anti-colonialist sentiment and Union Spirit. **They are working together exerting the strength of national unity and Union Spirit to achieve the goal of building a peaceful, modern and developed discipline-flourishing democratic nation. The State Constitution has been drafted that can guarantee perpetuation of the Union**

**and independence, and development of the nation, and can help the people practise discipline-flourishing democracy.**

**From 1948 when it regained independence to date, Myanmar has constantly exercised independent and active foreign policy, recognized the sovereignty of other countries with different religions, different political policies, different culture, different languages, and different economic policies, and upheld the Five Principles of Peaceful Coexistence. The country joined the UN in 1948, and since then, it has participated actively in the affairs of the global family, and regional organizations such as ASEAN and BIMSTEC.**

**It maintains the friendly relations with its neighbours and regional countries in accordance with the international conventions, UN Charter, and Bandung (Non-Aligned) policies. Myanmar is an exemplar in foreign relations.**

**Now, peace and stability has been restored throughout the nation, that the previous governments did not achieve despite their strenuous endeavours. Had the nation not faced disruption by the west bloc the remaining armed groups would have returned to the legal fold. I would say Myanmar's achievement in internal peace and national reconsolidation deserves recognition of the whole world.**

Internal national axe-handles are instigating the international community to impose economic sanctions against and not to provide assistance for Myanmar, dissuading foreign companies from making investment in the nation, demanding the foreign companies in the nation for withdrawal of their investments, dissuading foreign tourists from visiting the nation, and calling on the international community to take action against the nation. Some countries that get along with the colonialists supported the demands of the axe-handles. They were resorting to various means to harm State's stability, peace and development hand in glove with external elements with the thought that if so Myanmar people would have to face hardships. When the havoc was intolerable, the people would take to the streets to their liking. Then, they would come to power.

**Despite a variety of disruptions, the nation has enjoyed the taste of remarkable development due to the hard work exerted by national people with patriotic spirit and nationalistic fervour. The democratic process has made progress to a certain degree. Myanmar people are now enjoying the fruits of wholesome deeds they have done.**

Myanmar people by nature preserve their lineage. In Myanmar, one of the five duties of children is to preserve their family lineage. Bogyoke Aung San in one of his speeches said that preservation of own lineage was patriotic spirit. Myanmar people in culture uphold preservation of own lineage and equip themselves with patriotic spirit. Thanks to the long colonial rule, the people have come to love and preserve own lineage all the more.

**Every citizen knows that Myanmar people are only the ones who are eager to serve the interests of Myanmar. They appreciate the genuine goodwill and loving-kindness of friendly countries for Myanmar. However, they abhor the colonialists, who are casting covetous eyes on Myanmar's rich natural resources, and their associates. Bogyoke Aung San, who made sacrifices for the nation to regain independence, understood well the colonialists' stance. It was very visionary of Bogyoke Aung San to lay down a principle that could prevent the sovereignty of the entire people from falling in the hands of the ones who owe allegiance to a foreign government, or a subject of a foreign government or a citizen of a foreign country, the ones planted by external elements, and those who are**

**trying to expend the interests of the nation in their interests.**

Here, I would like to present a point that in the world, many persons are not happy with the adoration and preservation of own lineage. Once, former Secretary of State of the US Dr Henry Kissinger said that American citizens had to imbue themselves with nationalistic spirit; that they had to love the US where they were born and had grown up; that patriotism was a difficult issue; and asked what lineage they should love. The US is home to various races such as Negro, Hispanics, Cubans (expatriates), Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Indian, Vietnamese and various Arabian tribes. In such countries, mixed marriage is a tradition. However, Asians including Myanmar cherish and preserve own lineage.

Bogyoke Aung San lived in the exercise of preserving own lineage. So, he prescribed a principle that says any person owing allegiance to a foreign government, or a subject of a foreign government or a citizen of a foreign country shall not have the right to stand for election and the right to vote. Myanmar people have constantly put in the fore Bogyoke's concept in order that they can exercise Myanmar's sovereign powers and the nation will not fall in the hands of the people who are not nationals. Like the election laws practised in the AFPFL period and the Myanmar Socialist Programme Party period, the 1990 Election Law includes the principle laid down by Bogyoke Aung San. The principles adopted by the National Convention and the principles on the right to stand for election stated in the draft constitution also carry the principle of Bogyoke.

**If Myanmar people had not armed themselves with patriotism and patriotic spirit, the nation would have fallen under alien subjugation for long. A new nation must be built based on patriotic spirit. However, in the international relations, Myanmar will maintain friendly relations with other countries. Myanmar will continue to recognize the sovereignty of other countries and cooperate with other countries in global interests.** Taking lessons from the state of being fallen under alien subjugation and having internal affairs interfered by alien countries, Bogyoke Aung San laid down that principle to make sure that Myanmar's internal affairs will be free from alien interference, and the practice of Myanmar sovereign powers is in the hands of Myanmar people only.

**Western countries are making comments that the draft of the State constitution, which will be approved in a referendum to be held in coming May, deprives a particular person of the right to stand for election. No one can be privileged in the exercise of the principles based on the policy of preserving own lineage and on patriotic spirit.**

The government has let bygones be bygones regarding activities of certain groups to provoke riots and chaos in the 1988 unrest, and the attempts they made in collusion with alien elements to incite protests with the intention of disrupting Myanmar's progress. In response, NLD should not revive the incidents that took place in 1988 and 1990. It should not look forward to the entices of foreign countries because it cannot achieve its goal if it does not win the support of the people. I would like to suggest that the leader of the party eat what she has said, and withdraw her threat to block national development, and utter devastation. If NLD truly believes it can win public support, it should make preparations to stand for election in the multi-party general elections to be held in 2010. If NLD is addicted to the praises and instigation of VOA, BBC and RFA, it will lose all of its reputation in the political field.

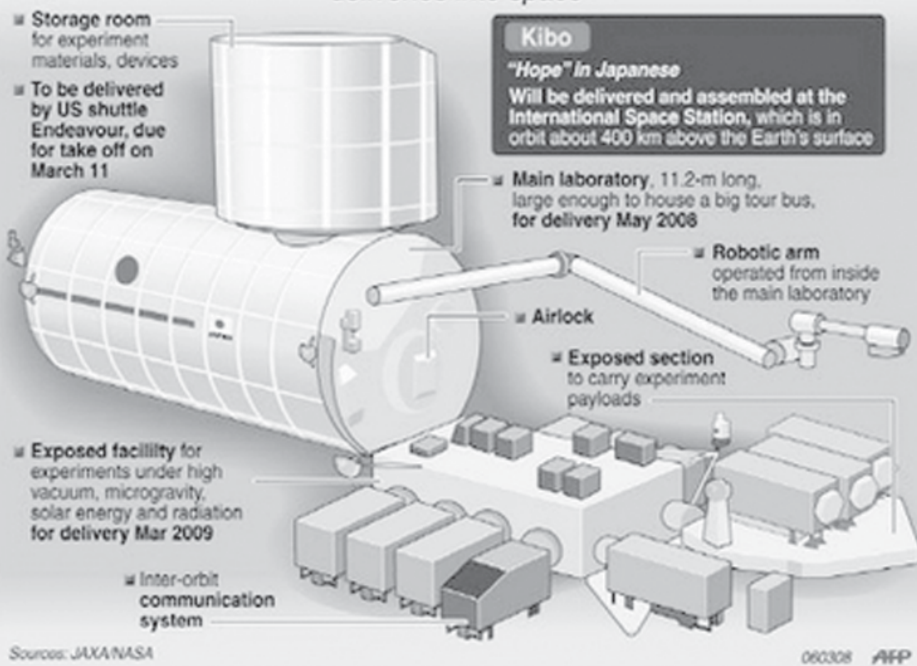

## Peru archaeologists find Inca temple in Andes

LIMA, 15 March — Researchers have found the ruins of an Inca temple built for religious ceremonies in the Andes Mountains, at a park in the archeologically rich region of southern Peru that includes Machu Picchu.

The temple measures 2,700 square feet (250 square metres), includes 11 rooms of various sizes and an area in the shape of a Chacana, an Incan religious symbol.

"This was an adoration centre," said Oscar Rodriguez, a researcher at the Sacsayhuaman archaeological park that, like the ancient Incan citadel of Machu Picchu, is a popular tourist destination.

Archaeologists said they will spend the next five years investigating evidence of other buildings near the temple, which was made of stones and adobe.

Scientists were lucky to have found the temple, part of which was destroyed nearly 100 years ago by dynamite blasts at a nearby rock quarry, Rodriguez said. Peru is rich in archaeological treasures. Until the arrival of the Spanish in the 1500s, the Incas ruled an empire for several centuries that stretched from Colombia and Ecuador in the north to what are now Peru and Chile in the south.—MNA/Reuters

**China, Japan to exchange food safety experts**

BEIJING, 14 March — China and Japan will exchange teams of food safety experts and investigators in a bid to clear up a disagreement over Chinese-made dumplings that left 10 people sick in Japan, a Chinese official said on Thursday.

No one has died from the poisoned food but the case has stirred intense media coverage in Japan and threatened to strain ties between the two countries ahead of a visit by Chinese President Hu Jintao to Japan in coming months.

Li Changjiang, head

of the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine, said China would send a team to Japan "in the near future". "Public Security authorities in China have also extended a similar invitation to their counterparts in Japan to discuss experiments and food safety testing methodologies," he said.

"With their joint efforts it won't be long before we reveal the final truth of the dumplings poison case," he said.

Both Beijing and Tokyo have blamed sabotage rather than production failings for causing the dumplings to be tainted, but they have been at odds over how. They have also both been at pains to emphasize the poisoning did not happen in their home countries.

**French woman faces murder trial over freezer babies**

PARIS, 14 March — A woman suspected of killing three of her children at birth and storing two of the bodies in a freezer will be tried for their murder, French judicial authorities said on Wednesday.

Veronique Courjault, who has been in custody since October 2006, is expected to go on trial later this year in the western city of Tours. At a hearing on Wednesday, the examining judge dropped charges against her husband Jean-Louis, who had been investigated for complicity in the murders, his lawyer said. Veronique Courjault, 39, is alleged to have given birth to two children while the family were living in Seoul, South Korea, and to have killed both infants, storing their bodies in a freezer in their apartment.

Police say she has admitted killing a third child in France. —MNA/Reuters

**Mt Everest skydives offered in Nepal**

KATHMANDU, 14 March — A British adventure firm is offering 25,000-US-dollar skydiving trips over Mt. Everest, in a new twist to extreme sports around the world's highest peak, *The Himalayan Times* reported on Thursday.

"It is the first time anybody has tried this in the Everest (Qomolangma) area," said Nigel Gifford, whose company is offering the one-minute freefall over Mt Everest.

According to the daily, the skydivers will jump out of their plane at around 8,848-metres, he said. He said his company, High and Wild, has already taken 22 reservations from experienced sky divers as well as novices who will tandem-dive on trips planned for September.

**China steps up air security after terrorist plot**

BEIJING, 14 March — Chinese airports and airlines will step up security and ban passengers carrying liquids on domestic

flights, the government said on Thursday, a week after it revealed an attempt to bring down a flight to Beijing.

Beijing is keen to reassure the world there is no problem with airline security in China ahead of the Summer Olympics in August.

Staff would open up and check more hand baggage than before, and "easy boarding" services, where passengers pay for

the privilege of speedier security checks and priority boarding, would be banned, the General Administration of Civil Aviation said.

The Chinese Government announced over the weekend that a passenger jet from the restive western region of Xinjiang made a forced landing after the discovery of what state media called a "planned terrorist attack". —MNA/Reuters

**US soldier killed by German police in standoff**

BERLIN, 15 March — A US soldier who threatened his ex-girlfriend with an assault rifle has been shot dead in a standoff with German police in the southern state of Bavaria.

The incident occurred Thursday night when the 30-year-old soldier, who was based in Schweinfurt, broke into his ex-girlfriend's apartment in

Koenigsberg and threatened her with an M4 rifle, German police said in a statement.

The woman managed to escape and alerted the police.

About an hour later, a police helicopter equipped with night vision cameras found the fleeing soldier in a nearby field.

According to the police account, the soldier was shot after he pointed his rifle at police commandos who came to arrest him.

German authorities and military police from the US Army base in Schweinfurt are jointly investigating the incident, the US military said.

**Man charged over Heathrow security alert**

LONDON, 15 March — A man who caused a major security alert at Heathrow Airport after getting onto a runway was charged on Friday with "aircraft endangerment", police said.

Ketheeswaran Uthayakumar, 27, of no fixed address, will face a further charge of illegally being airside when he appears at Uxbridge Magistrates Court, west London, on Saturday.

He was arrested near the northern runway of the world's busiest international airport on Thursday after scaling the perimeter fence.

Police said the incident was not related to

terrorism, but have declined to comment on possible motives.

Officers blew up the man's bag in a controlled explosion, but later said they found no bomb. Some flights were delayed.

It was the second major security breach at the airport in less than a month and came the day before the Queen opened the airport's new fifth terminal.

Last month, protesters opposing the Heathrow expansion plans breached the airport's security to unveil a banner on top of a parked passenger jet.

## China's sci-tech development plan in progress

BEIJING, 14 March — China's Minister of Science and Technology Wan Gang said here on Thursday that the medium- and long-term plan for scientific and technological development has been "progressing smoothly" since 2006.

A number of major projects, such as large

planes, nuclear power and water pollution treatment and control, major new medicines and next-generation mobile communication, have been launched and the others are expected to start later this year, Wan said at a Press conference on the sidelines of the annual sessions of the national

legislature and the top political advisory body.

He spoke highly of the amendment to the law for promoting scientific and technological advance, which was endorsed at the end of last year, and said it created a better environment for innovation.

## If pregnant women stop smoking, babies are happier

WASHINGTON, 14 March — Mothers who stop smoking while pregnant tend to have cheerier, more adaptable babies, British researchers reported on Wednesday.

Babies of women who continued to smoke while pregnant were notably grumpy, and the researchers believe that mothers who can muster the effort to kick the habit are also caring more for their babies in other ways.

Babies of non-smokers also more temperamental than babies born to quitters,

the researchers found—which they said suggested that mothers who suspend smoking are doing something special.

Tobacco can affect the growth of a fetus and has been shown to also affect children if they breathe in their mothers'

secondhand smoke.

But Dr Kate Pickett at Britain's University of York thinks her team is on to something more. They have been following 18,000 British babies born between 2000 and 2002, as well as their mothers, who are taking part in a larger study.

## Immune system may cause reaction to cancer drug

WASHINGTON, 15 March—People who live in parts of the US South may have pre-existing immunities that cause a severe allergic reaction to the widely used cancer drug Erbitux, US researchers reported on Thursday.

They found that patients who had the sometimes life-threatening reactions had a pre-existing immunity to a sugar compound found in the drug made by ImClone Systems Inc.

The discovery, reported in the *New*

*England Journal of Medicine*, might help explain why people living in certain regions of the United States are much more likely to have the reaction, the researchers said.

Potential patients should be tested before getting the drug, which had global sales of 1.1 billion US dollars in 2006 for use in treating colon, head and neck cancers, the researchers said.

Erbitux, known generically as cetuximab, is a monoclonal antibody, a genetically engineered

immune system compound designed to target cancer cells.

But some patients have a severe allergic reaction to the drug.

Dr Thomas Platts-Mills of the University of Virginia and colleagues looked at reports of these cases, which suggest that as many as 22 per cent of patients treated with Erbitux in Tennessee and North Carolina reported some kind of reaction including anaphylaxis, which can rapidly lead to difficulty breathing, shock or fainting.

The reported outbreaks comprise 27 primary schools and 16 kindergartens and childcare centres, five secondary schools and one correctional institution and one special school.

influenza-related complications in children (including severe pneumonia, myocarditis, shock, sepsis-like or encephalopathy), three reports were received so far with laboratory evidence of influenza.

They are one three-year-old boy (whose case was announced Wednesday) and two girls aged seven and eight respectively. Their current conditions are stable.

## Greek passenger ship runs aground, passengers safe

ATHENS, 14 March — Greek rescue crews transferred about 280 foreign tourists to safety after their cruise ship ran aground in the Aegean on Thursday, Greek officials said.

The small cruise ship carrying mostly US, Russian and Japanese tourists, ran aground north of the Saronic Gulf island of Poros about 50 kilometres (30 miles) south of Athens, but there were no injuries.

"The evacuation is

finished and we are making the final checks to make sure everyone is safe," said a Merchant Marine Ministry official who requested anonymity.

The Coast Guard said two ships, a C130 transport plane and numerous fishing boats assisted the evacuation, while four Coast Guard vessels and a helicopter were standing by. Passengers were taken to Poros.

## Blatter confident of solution to Spanish row

ZURICH, 15 March — FIFA president Sepp Blatter said on Friday he was confident a solution could be found to end the row over the Spanish Government's alleged interference in the running of its football association.

Last month he said Spain could face international suspension if their government continued to insist on early elections within the football association.

## FIFA executive backs quota for foreign players

ZURICH, 15 March — FIFA will press ahead with controversial proposals to limit the number of foreign players available to clubs, president Sepp Blatter said on Friday. Under the so-called "6 plus 5" system, Blatter wants club sides to field a minimum of six players eligible to represent the team's home international side.

Blatter, who has the full support of his executive committee for the proposals, said the idea would strengthen the identity of clubs and promote investment in developing young players.

There are doubts, however, over whether the proposals contravene European laws forbidding restraint of trade on the grounds of nationality.

"The executive committee has unanimously stated that 6 plus 5 is

indeed a positive solution but, of course, we do not want to clash directly with existing laws," Blatter told a news conference at FIFA's Zurich headquarters.

He believes an exception could be made for sport in line with an agreement in the European Union's new reform treaty.

## Schalke fight back to beat lowly Duisburg 2-1

BERLIN, 15 March — Schalke 04 recovered from a goal down to beat lowly MSV Duisburg 2-1 in the Bundesliga on Friday after facing a chorus of boos at halftime.

Germany defender Heiko Westermann got the winner in the 74th minute, firing home from the right with an acrobatic strike after Gerard Asamoah's header came back off the bar.

Germany striker Kevin Kuranyi equalized for Schalke on the hour after getting his knee on a low cross from Ivan Rakitic.

Duisburg had taken the lead against the Champions League quarterfinalists — who were drawn on Friday against Barcelona — in the 21st minute to stun a sell-out crowd of 61,482.

Bulgaria striker Blagoy Georgiev intercepted the ball in midfield and made a superb solo run down the left before beating goalkeeper Manuel Neuer with a fine shot inside the far post.

"We had a hard time finding the openings," said Schalke coach Mirko Slomka after Duisburg played with 10 men behind the ball for much of the game.

## Liverpool to face Arsenal in Champions League

LONDON, 15 March — Arsenal and Liverpool will face each other for the first time in European competition after being drawn together in the quarterfinals of the Champions League on Friday.

With four English clubs in the last eight, the most ever from one country, it was almost inevitable that two would meet as the names were drawn at UEFA headquarters in Nyon, Switzerland.

Manchester United face Roma in a repeat of their clash at this stage last year while Chelsea's quest to win Europe's premier club competition for the first time will be tested by a tie with Turkish last-eight debutants Fenerbahce.

Barcelona will have home advantage in the second leg after being drawn to play Germany's Schalke.

With the semifinal draw also being made, the eight remaining clubs now know their prospective paths to the final to be played in Moscow.

## Barca's Eto'o wanted Chelsea or United, not Schalke

MADRID, 15 March — Barcelona striker Samuel Eto'o would have preferred facing Chelsea or Manchester United rather than Schalke 04 in the Champions League quarterfinals.

Spanish media were unanimous Barca had a favourable draw by avoiding the four British teams and getting the unfancied Bundesliga side making their first appearance in the last eight.

To support his argument, though, Eto'o referred to last year's King's Cup tie against semifinal debutants Getafe when Barcelona let a 5-2 first-leg lead slip as they went out of the competition after embarrassing 4-0 defeat in the return. —MNA/Reuters

## Liverpool's Agger ruled out for rest of season

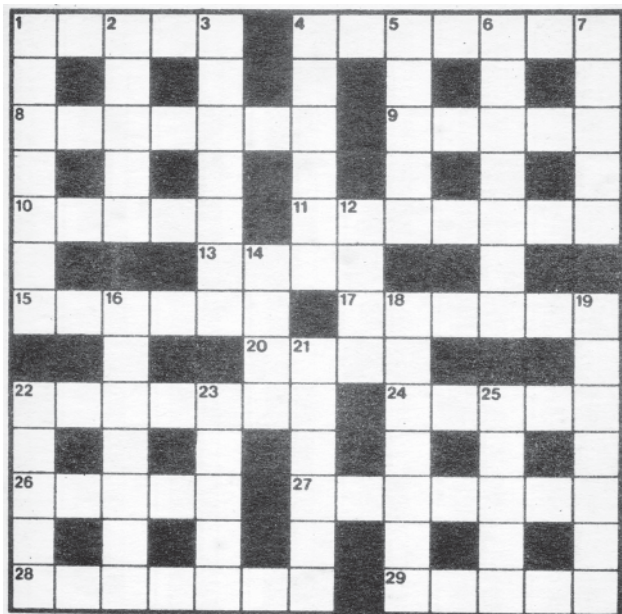
LONDON, 15 March — Liverpool central defender Daniel Agger will miss the rest of the season with a foot injury, the Premier League club said on Friday.

## Bus accident kills 23 students in Syria

DAMASCUS, 15 March — Twenty-three high school students were killed on Friday when a bus carrying them on a recreation trip overturned and hit a house in a coastal region of Syria, officials said.

The owner of the house in the province of Tartous was also killed. A total of 31 people, mostly students, were injured, nine of them in critical condition, the officials said.

The bus was going too fast, approached a curve and could not maintain control, one of the officials told Reuters.

Syrian roads, especially ones linking provinces, are notorious for being dangerous. The roads rarely carry markings, no speed limits are enforced, and small buses with tiny engines and no crash protection are allowed on highways.

## US serviceman fined over trespassing in Okinawa

TOKYO, 15 March — A US Air Force serviceman in Southern Japan's Okinawa Prefecture was fined 100,000 yen (about 1,000 US dollars) Friday over trespassing into a private office earlier this month.

Wesley Taft, an Airman Second Class of Kadena Air Base, was convicted of trespassing into a construction association's office in Okinawa city on March 2 after breaking the building's appearance glass with a 1.8-metre-long iron stick in early morning.

He was drunken when being arrested and admitted what he was accused of.

The case happened after the Japan-based US forces imposed since February 20 a curfew on all of its servicemen and nonmilitary personnel as a measure to tighten discipline in wake of a series of crimes involving US troops, including the rape of a minor girl by a US Marine.

Taft said he sneaked out of his base over fence during the curfew.

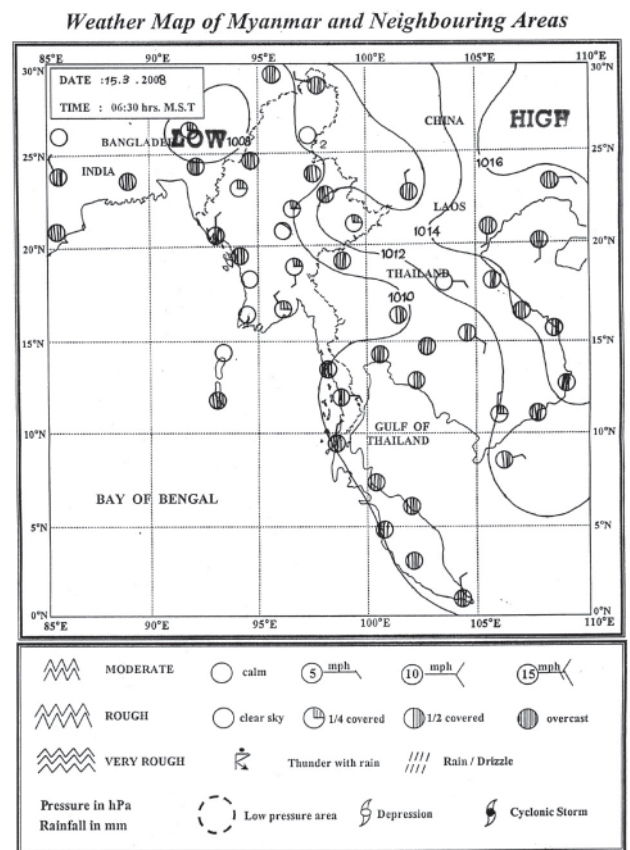

## Strong earthquake jolts Bonin Islands, Japan

HONG KONG, 15 March — An earthquake measuring 6.2 on the Richter Scale hit seas near Bonin Islands, Japan at 6:38 am (1038 GMT) on Saturday, according to a bulletin released by the Hong Kong Observatory.

The epicentre was initially determined to be 26.9 degrees north Latitude and 142.6 degrees east longitude, about 1,010 kilometres south-southwest of Tokyo.
