Thousands in UK anti-war protest march

LONDON, 16 March — Thousands of anti-war protesters joined marches in Britain on Saturday to mark the fifth anniversary of the start of the war in Iraq. They took to the streets in London and the Scottish city of Glasgow demanding that British troops pull out of Iraq and Afghanistan.

A spokesman for the Stop The War coalition, which organized the marches, said that five years after the invasion of Iraq, the world had become “a much more dangerous place”.

“Estimates suggest as many as one million people have died violent deaths as a result of the occupation

of Iraq,” spokesman Paul Collins said.

He said Prime Minister Gordon Brown was sending more troops to Afghanistan and claimed “this hidden war is fast becoming a disaster mirroring Iraq”.

But the Foreign Office disputed Stop the War’s conclusions. “In Iraq, there is clear evidence we are making steady progress, particularly in terms of security,” a spokesman told Reuters. — MNA/Reuters

Three killed in S Philippines blast

MANILA, 16 March — A grenade explosion killed three people and wounded 19 others in the southern Philippines, media reports said on Saturday.

The accident occurred in the country’s province of Davao del Sur, where a disco session was ongoing at 10 pm Friday local time (1400 GMT), Philippine TV network GMA News reported.

Initial investigation

showed that civilian volunteer organization member Reto Pelonio, reportedly drunk at the time, dropped the grenades while dancing.

Police said it was likely Pelonio had the grenades in his pockets because there was no crater formed by the explosion.

Clinton, Obama clash despite plan to talk issues

WASHINGTON, 16 March — Democratic US presidential candidates Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama clashed on Saturday over his ties to an indicted Chicago businessman and her tax records, despite their agreement two days earlier on the need to focus on issues. Clinton’s campaign questioned Obama’s judgment in his dealings with campaign supporter and businessman Antoin “Tony” Rezko.

Obama’s campaign fired back, calling it “the height of hypocrisy for Senator Clinton to demand the release of documents already on our campaign web site” while she has refused to release her full tax returns during her time in the Senate. The stepped-up attacks came ahead of the crucial 22 April Pennsylvania primary. —MNA/Reuters

Sri Lanka accuses US throws lifeline to Tamil Tigers

COLOMBO, 15 March — Sri Lanka’s Government has accused the United States of throwing a lifeline to the widely banned Tamil Tiger rebels.

“The report presents a distorted view of the actual situation in Sri Lanka during the year 2007 and is unfortunately a litany of unsubstantiated allegations, innuendo and vituperative exaggerations,” the Foreign Ministry said in a statement issued late on Friday.

“It is indeed a matter of concern that the report, based on hearsay ... has resulted in throwing a lifeline to the LTTE (Tigers) at a time when it is struggling to maintain its position both militarily on the ground and internationally.”

EU says saving planet must not cost the earth

BRUSSELS, 16 March — European Union leaders pledged on Friday to agree laws within 12 months to implement their ambitious goals for combating climate change but promised to soften the blow for heavy industries.

A final statement at a two-day summit set a tight timetable for adopting mechanisms to curb greenhouse gas emissions and promote green energy sources but stressed they must be affordable at a time of economic downturn and market turmoil.

Concerns about slowing growth and financial instability prompted the 27 leaders to add the tell-tale phrase “so as to avoid excessive costs for member states” to the statement. — MNA/Reuters

Egypt says US criticism of rights record “biased”

CAIRO, 16 March — Egypt struck back at a US Government report criticizing its human rights record on Friday, saying the report was biased and neglectful of the social situation in the most populous Arab country.

Egypt, a US ally, also said a White House statement expressing concern at a “campaign of arrests” of opposition members reflected a “lack of understanding” of

Egypt.

In an annual report released this week, the US State Department said Egypt, a major recipient of US aid, sought to “thwart” opposition activities, journalists and civil society groups.

Egyptian authorities continued to hold former presidential candidate Ayman Nour as a “political prisoner,” detained Internet bloggers and charged independent journalists with libel and

other crimes, including defaming President Hosni Mubarak, the report said.

“The report was unfortunately a mix of non-objectivity and non-science in presenting the biased views of some non-governmental organizations,” Egypt’s Foreign Ministry said. “It neglects the social components surrounding the human rights development process.”

Clinton defends role in N Ireland peace process

PITTSBURGH, 16 March — Democratic US presidential hopeful Hillary Clinton defended her role in the Northern Ireland peace process on Saturday and accused rival Barack Obama of “nitpicking” her record on the issue. Clinton, a Senator from New York, and Obama, a Senator from Illinois, have made experience and judgment key arguments in their respective quests to become the Democratic

Party’s White House nominee.

Clinton has cited repeatedly her involvement in the peace process as First Lady during former President Bill Clinton’s Administration as an example of her foreign policy credentials. Obama advisers have said her role was minimal at best.

“I helped with the peace process in Northern Ireland,” Clinton told reporters on her campaign plane on Saturday. “That’s

been validated in many different settings by many different people who were part of the process.”

Her husband helped broker the 1998 Good Friday peace accord that paved the way for a power-sharing government in Belfast and a greater role for Dublin.

She said she continues to be engaged with leaders from Northern Ireland and questioned whether Obama could say the same. — MNA/Reuters

Minister denies Germans complicit in US rendition

BERLIN, 15 March — Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier denied on Thursday Berlin had advance knowledge of a 2001 US operation to seize a German citizen in Morocco and transfer him to Syria where he was allegedly tortured.

Steinmeier was testifying before a special parliamentary committee set up to investigate German cooperation with the US “war on terror”, particularly its knowledge of secret CIA transfers of terror suspects known as “renditions”.

Thursday’s hearing focused on the case of Mohammad al-Zammar, a Syrian born man with German citizenship who had links to the Hamburg al-Qaeda cell that led the September 11, 2001, attacks on the United States. — MNA/Reuters

Police arrest dozens after clashes in Iraqi city

KUT (Iraq), 16 March — Iraqi police arrested dozens of members of Shiite cleric Moqtada al-Sadr’s Mehdi Army militia on Saturday, hours after two policemen were killed in gunbattles in the southern city of Kut, police said. Clashes this week between Iraqi security forces and the militia in Kut, 170 kilometres (105 miles) southeast of Baghdad, have raised fears a ceasefire called by Sadr may unravel, although the violence has so far been confined to Kut. It is the first major violation of the seven-month-old truce, which has been credited by the US military with helping to reduce violence between majority Shiite and Sunni Muslims that has killed tens of thousands of Iraqis.— MNA/Reuters

Chad, UNICEF repatriate kidnapped children to families

N’DJAMENA, 16 March — Chadian authorities and the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) Friday officially launched the process of restituting the 103 children at the centre of child trafficking scandal back to their families, according to official sources.

After a ceremony at an orphanage in Abeche, eastern Chad, where the children have been staying since the arrest of six

members of a French aid Zoe’s Ark on October 25, 83 of the children boarded two buses bound for Andre, about 150 kilometres further east, where they were eagerly awaited by their families. The remaining children are expected to be sent to Tinah-Chad and Biltine, 250 kilometres north-east and 75 kilometres north of Abeche respectively in coming days. Five children originally from Sudan, who are yet to be identified have

been assigned to the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) temporarily.

“My organization is committed to support these children even after they are taken back to by respective families,” UNICEF country representative for Chad Mariam Ndiaye said while launching the operation, calling on other partners to “support” the initiative.

4 dead, many injured in NY crane collapse

NEW YORK, 16 March — A construction crane snapped Saturday from a 25-storey building in Manhattan, killing at least four people and injuring many others, New York City authorities said.

All four known deaths were of construction workers at the site and some of the injured are in serious or critical condition, Mayor

Michael Bloomberg told a Press conference. The crane snapped into two parts, damaging three nearby buildings and completely destroyed a fourth, Bloomberg said.

The building that was destroyed was a five-storey brownstone with a popular bar in the first floor which, fortunately, was not open at the time.

Over 300 firefighters, 150 police officers and many other emergency workers are working at the site. Police dogs and listening devices were deployed to looking for victims trapped in the rubble. Several blocks in the vicinity of crane collapse remain cordoned off to traffic. Several buildings nearby are being vacated and occupants are told to go to a shelter set up in a school.—MNA/Xinhua

China posts double-digit growth in LPG import in 2007

BEIJING, 15 March — China imported 6.98 million tons of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) at a cost of 3.09 billion US dollars in 2007, a year-on-year growth of 15.2 percent and 2 percent, respectively.

Of the total, liquefied natural gas accounted for

41.7 per cent, or 2.91 million tons, up 320 per cent, sources with the General Administration of Customs said on Saturday.

Foreign-funded companies made up 83.4 per cent, or 5.82 million tons, of China's total LPG

imports, up 37.5 per cent.

Last year saw China buy 3.38 million tons of LPG, or 48.5 per cent of the total, from Australia, up 100 per cent, and 2.83 million tons, or 20.6 per cent of the total, from the Middle East, down 23.5 per cent. —MNA/Xinhua

Philippine Airlines makes first flight to west China

CHONGQING, 16 March — Philippine Airlines (PAL) completed its maiden voyage into western China on Friday with a flight from Manila to Chongqing Municipality.

The country's flagship carrier has begun to offer twice-weekly flights to the

southwestern city via an Airbus A320 on Tuesday and Friday.

A round-trip ticket for the 3.5-hour flight is around 1,400 yuan (197 US dollars), a PAL official said.

Previously, passengers had to transfer at Hong Kong if they were

travelling to the city from the Philippine capital.

Starting on Tuesday, the carrier will also begin offering flights to neighbouring Chengdu with a similar frequency. On 1 May, it will launch five weekly flights to the Macao Special Administrative Region.

ADB funds Asia's sea, rainforest preservation project

MANILA, 16 March — The Asia Development Bank on Friday said it will fund a regional project to protect the shrinking seas and rainforests in Southeast Asia.

The region is home to the Coral Triangle, which has the highest marine biodiversity in the world, as well as the Heart of Borneo, rainforests covering 22 million hectares that are some of the last refuges for orangutans, Asian elephants, and Sumatran rhinos, the regional lender said.

Each year logging, mining and farming destroy millions of hectares of forests. Global warming also had its shares of damage, the ADB said.

The ADB grant, amounting to 1.5 million US dollars, will provide funding for the World Wildlife Fund for Nature to undertake an environmental and socio-economic profile of the region, GIS (geographic information system) mapping and stakeholder consultations in the region.

The grant will also allow the countries to assess policies and institutional capabilities in managing natural resources, address cross-border environmental issues and implement policies through the setting of minimum standards, monitoring and self regulation.

Trade volumes between Cambodia, Thailand up 10% in 2007

PHNOM PENH, 16 March — The trade volumes between Cambodia and Thailand showed an increase of 10.56 per cent in 2007, with total trade figures reaching 1.404 billion US dollars, Cambodian Commerce Minister Cham Prasidh said here on Friday.

The amount of 49 million US dollars represented the cost of goods exported from Cambodia to Thailand, Cham Prasidh said at the opening ceremony of Thailand Exhibition 2008, which is being held in Phnom Penh from 14 to 18 March. With the steady increase of trade volumes,

UAE tries Jordanian for trade in nuclear component

DUBAI, 15 March — A Jordanian man on trial in the United Arab Emirates for trading in a metal used in nuclear reactors told the court on Thursday that he did not realise he was breaking the law.

The suspect, who is

48, remains in custody and the magistrate scheduled the next hearing in the case for 25 March.

The Gulf Arab trade hub foiled an attempt to import for re-export 240 kilos (529 pounds) of zirconium as part of its

efforts to keep the region clear of weapons of mass destruction, the official WAM news agency said on Wednesday.

It did not say where the shipment was destined for but Dubai is situated across a short stretch of water from Iran, which is locked in a standoff with the West over its nuclear programme.

The United States accuses Iran of planning to build bombs but Teheran says its nuclear programme is aimed at generating electricity.

Nestle wins trademark suit over Dumex in Chinese court

BEIJING, 15 March — Nestle has won a trademark infringement suit in a Beijing court against its powdered milk competitor Royal Numico Dumex and received 200,000 yuan

(28,129 US dollars) in compensation.

Dutch firm Royal Numico Dumex was also ordered to stop using the trademark of a shield device on its powdered milk products and stop selling infringing products in the Xizhimen branch of the Itoiyokado Mall, according to a Beijing Municipal No 1 Intermediate People's Court ruling on Wednesday afternoon.

Swiss-based Nestle sued Royal Numico Dumex in September 2007 for trademark infringement and requested the defendant to immediately stop selling the infringing products and compensate Nestle 500,000 yuan.

Nestle alleged that it had already globally registered the figurative trademark of a shield device and the other trademark "Golden shield trademark in Chinese character" of Nestle had also been applied for registration with the Chinese trademark authority and this trademark had been widely used on its milk powder product.

Nestle found that, without its authorization, the defendant used a device which was similar to its registered figurative mark on the packages of a series of Royal Numico Dumex milk powder.

Health authorities say no novel flu virus in HK

HONG KONG, 16 March — Hong Kong health authorities said on Friday that gene sequencing on flu viruses from two children who died amid a recent outbreak showed no novel flu virus.

The Centre for Health Protection of the Department of Health of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government said in a statement that the flu viruses from the two victims match the genetic makeup of viruses that are already circulating.

The two children who died were a seven-year-old boy and a three-year-old girl. "Gene sequencing results available today confirmed that the H1N1 virus found in this boy has the same genetic makeup as the circulating H1N1 (Brisbane) strain in Hong Kong," said the spokesman of the centre.

China names premier, top judge, prosecutor

BEIJING, 16 March — China's Parliament re-elected Wen Jiabao as Premier on Sunday, but a next-generation leader was passed over for promotion to a top military job. The National People's Congress gave Wen, ranked third in the Communist Party hierarchy, a second five-year mandate with 2,926 votes for, 21 against and 12 abstentions.

People's Liberation Army Generals Xu Caihou and Guo Boxiong were elected vice-chairman of the decision-making Central Military Commission.

A Hong Kong

newspaper had said next-generation leader Xi Jinping would become the third vice-chairman of the military commission, but he was not on the ballot on Sunday.

If Xi, who was elected vice-president on Saturday, had been given the military portfolio, it would have cemented his role as heir apparent to President Hu Jintao, who doubles as Communist Party and military chief.

Parliament also endorsed the nominations of Wang Shengjun as the country's top judge and Cao Jianming as the top prosecutor.

Vietnam to host int'l network, data security conf

HANOI, 15 March — Vietnam will organize an international conference and showcase christened Security World 2008, the biggest of its kind, with the participation of 30 prestigious speakers and over 20 well-known information technology companies from 19-20 March, organizers said Friday.

During the event themed "Strengthening Security Awareness and Deployment" and held by

the General Department of Technology under the Vietnamese Ministry of Public Security and the International Data Group, the speakers from Vietnamese ministries and organizations, and such foreign firms as Cisco Systems and Symantec will touch current status and trends of, and solutions to network and data security in the Asia-Pacific region in general and Vietnam in particular.

Delegates to the two-

day event in Hanoi will focus their discussions on implementation of data security systems in stock and e-commerce transactions, solutions to prevent and deal with hackers' attacks targeted at mobile phones and computers, and experiences in carrying out surveillance activities based on the employment of advanced cameras and alarm equipment in enterprises and urban areas.—Xinhua

Engine fault grounds over 300 aircraft in New Zealand

WELLINGTON, 16 March — More than 300 small planes and helicopters were grounded on Friday due to fears they may have a faulty part that can cause loss of power and engine failure, Radio New Zealand reported on Saturday.

The problem was discovered in the United States, where 18 incidents were recorded of gasket failure inside the fuel injection system of some aircraft engines.

The New Zealand Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) issued an emergency directive to 225 operators and owners of single and twin-engined, piston-engined aircraft about a possible fuel injector fault.

The authority says 326 aircraft could be affected.

The CAA Spokesperson Bill Sommer said aircraft affected by the

directive cannot be flown until a plug in the fuel injector is checked and, if necessary, replaced.

Death toll in Baghdad car bombing rises to 10

BAGHDAD, 15 March — The death toll from a car bomb attack in central Baghdad on Thursday rose to 10, with 50 others wounded, an Interior Ministry source said on Friday.

"The final toll from the Bab al-Sharji area car bombing rose to 10 killed and 50 others injured," the source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

The attack took place at about 2:00 p.m. (1100 GMT) when a booby-trapped car parking near the commercial building of al-Khaiyam in the crowded area of Bab al-Sharji detonated, the source said.

Earlier, the source put the toll at seven civilians killed and 20 others wounded. Violence and bloodshed in Iraq have increased recently, despite the US military's announcement of a 60-per-cent drop in attacks since last June. — Xinhua

If in no mood to help, do not disturb

Current comments provoked me to write this article. **The government issued Announcement 1/2008 and Announcement 2/2008, regarding the forthcoming referendum to be held in May 2008 to approve the draft of the State Constitution and the multi-party democracy general elections to be held in 2010.**

The entire people were pleased with and wholeheartedly welcomed the announcements. Every citizen is convinced that a constitution is a must because it serves as the lifeblood of a nation. However, a particular party and person that are desperate to monopolize the process of drawing a constitution are not happy with and are criticizing the announcements.

NLD central executive committee members are now uneasy with the knowledge that the government's Announcement No 1/2008 and Announcement No 2/2008 imply that the constitution they have written unilaterally has gone down the drain. They are so agitated for the announcements that they are opposing them by issuing various forms of objection flyers and by conducting prearranged interviews with some foreign radio stations such as BBC and VOA.

Before the announcements came out, they made comments that it took 14 years for the government to complete the National Convention, and they wondered how long it would take for the government to complete the drafting of the State Constitution. The army, they said, was deliberately prolonging the processes because it was unwilling to hand over power. When elections would be held was difficult to guess, and the process lacked a time frame, they added. However, nowadays, they said that the completion of the drafting of the State Constitution in a short time lacked honesty; that the Pyithu Hluttaw would be formed with the representatives elected at the constituencies according to Law No 14/89 or Pyithu Hluttaw Election Law; and they did not accept or recognize the processes to hold elections according to the constitution the government had drafted, and the processes would not be legitimate.

NLD is in the habit of easily forgetting what it has said and done. The government issued Announcement No 1/90 offering to write a constitution in order to form a hluttaw in accordance with the Pyithu Hluttaw Election Law.

The Multi-party Democracy General Election Commission scrutinized the representatives-elect and announced its approval. Then, the government made an offer through Announcement No 1/90 to write a constitution with representatives of legal political

parties, representatives of national races and representatives of the people from all walks of life including representatives-elect to form Pyithu Hluttaw in line with the constitution.

NLD won the votes of 31 per cent of the number of eligible voters. But, it said as if it won the votes of the great majority of the entire people. In addition, it asked when power would be handed over and a hluttaw would be convened. On 28 and 29 July 1990, NLD held a meeting in Gandhi Hall and issued Gandhi Announcement. Through the announcement, NLD called for holding Pyithu Hluttaw by September 1990, and handing over power with the constitution drawn by itself. Late NLD Central Executive Committee Member U Kyi Maung declined the government's offer through Announcement No 1/90 to cooperate with the government and to make collaborative efforts in building a new democratic nation.

During the period to coordinate plan to lay down fundamental principles and detailed basic principles, NLD attended the National Convention being held by the government with representatives from various parties, national races, and all strata of life, and representatives-elect to draw an enduring State Constitution. Nevertheless, NLD made unreasonable accusations of the discussions including the ratios of NC delegates and proceedings and gave unreasonable excuses that did not concern the National Convention and walked out of the National Convention on 28 November 1995.

Fulfilling the demands of NLD as far as it could and expressing its magnanimity and great patience, the government invited NLD to the National Convention that resumed on 17 May 2004. NLD replied that it would attend it, and when it was close to the National Convention, NLD announced that it would not attend it, giving excuses that the government could not fulfil its demands that were not in conformity with the prevailing situations.

The government held the National Convention together with representatives-elect, representatives of various parties, national races, and the people from all walks of life to draw a constitution to be able to convene a Pyithu Hluttaw session in accordance with Pyithu Hluttaw Election Law. NLD failed to attend the National Convention of its own volition and made its choice. However, it is now levelling accusations against the government that the processes do not meet the Election Law and that are against Announcement No 1/90.

Frankly speaking, if NLD had assumed itself to be a standard political party, it would have realized that it had to cooperate with the ruling government to draw a

constitution because a hluttaw could not be convened if the nation lacked a constitution.

Instead, NLD chose the way of confrontation with the government. **It is resorting to various means in complicity with the colonialist bloc to put pressure politically on and impose economic sanctions against the nation. At the same time, it provoked riots, after forming so-called hluttaw representative committee. It tried to destabilize the nation.** In consequence, its members resigned from it in groups, and so did representatives-elect. Its political organizing work went down to the bottom. Initially, the number of NLD representatives-elect was 392, and so far, the number has decreased to 80 due to the fact that some committed crimes, some violated the existing law, and some have fled the nation and are living abroad as expatriates or absconders. Some have become independent representatives-elect, some have died, and some resigned from the party as members and representatives-elect. Now, the number of NLD representatives-elect is only 80.

According to the international hluttaws, a hluttaw can be called at least one-third of the total number of hluttaw representatives so requisition. The total number of remnant NLD representatives-elect, the representatives-elect of other parties and independent representatives-elect is less than one-third of the total number of hluttaw representatives.

I wonder if NLD thinks it still wins the support of those who voted for it in the 1990 elections. If NLD assumes that winning once in the election will help win the support of the public always, I would say it is crazy about something.

NLD has constantly demanded the approval of the 1990 election results. However, it did not cooperate with any forces when the government invited it to draw a constitution to approve the 1990 election results to convene a Pyithu Hluttaw session. It persisted in making a demand for handing over power through the constitution it had drawn alone. It is claiming democracy, but practising one-party dictatorship. Any citizen will not accept that a single party monopolizes the process of drawing a constitution that should be done through coordination by many representatives. If NLD had attended the National Convention and worked together with other representatives in drawing the constitution, the National Convention would have been completed earlier, State Constitution would have been approved and the Pyithu Hluttaw would have been about two terms.

Now, the government and the people are working together with might and main to hold elections in accordance with the forthcoming State Constitution after approving the constitution through a referendum. I do not think it is wise that NLD is criticizing that holding new elections is not legitimate and persists in making demands that are no longer in line with the present time and present way of life of the people. So, I would like to say that if NLD is in no mood to extend a helping hand, it does not matter, but it is requested not to disturb the processes.

Overweight women have worse breast cancer

WASHINGTON, 16 March — Breast cancer patients who are overweight have more aggressive disease and are likely to die sooner, US researchers reported on Friday.

A dangerous type of breast cancer, known as inflammatory breast cancer, was seen in 45 per cent of obese patients, compared with 30 per cent of overweight patients and 15 per cent of patients of healthy weight.

“The more obese a patient is, the more aggressive the disease,” said Dr Massimo Cristofanilli of the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Centre, who led the study.

“We are learning that the fat tissue may increase inflammation that leads to more aggressive disease.”

Writing in the journal *Clinical Cancer Research*, Cristofanilli and Colleagues said they studied 606 women with breast cancer that had spread within the breast.

They classified them according to body mass index or BMI, a globally accepted measure of obesity. People with BMIs of below 25 are considered normal, while 25-29 marks overweight and 30 or above is clinically obese.

After five years, 56.8 per cent of obese women and 56.3 per cent of overweight women were still alive. But 67.4 per cent of the normal weight women had survived.

More than 56 per cent of women of normal weight survived 10 years, compared to 42.7 per cent of obese women and 41.8 per cent of overweight women.—MNA/Reuters

Indonesia raises fuel prices for industrial uses

JAKARTA, 16 March — Indonesia’s state-run oil and gas firm Pertamina announced on Saturday it has increased fuel prices by between 1.1 per cent and 4.6 per cent for corporate customers effective from the same day.

Under the new pricelist, low-grade gasoline for industrial uses sells at between 7,000 rupiah and 7,385 rupiah (between about 77 US cents and 81 US cents) per litre, depending on the distribution areas in the huge archipelago.

Diesel fuel is priced up to 8,192 rupiah (90 cents) per litre and kerosene 8,111 rupiah (89 cents) per litre, the company said in a statement.

SAN FRANCISCO, 16 March — Meg Whitman, eBay Inc.’s outgoing chief executive officer, will co-chair the national presidential campaign of US Senator John McCain, the presumptive Republican nominee.

The organization said on Friday Whitman, 51, would play a lead role in the campaign’s financing and policy development.

Since Whitman joined

eBay in 1998, the 30-employee start-up has been transformed into a Fortune 500 company with nearly eight billion US dollars in revenue.

This success made Whitman one of the most powerful women in business and earned her a ranking among *Time* Magazine’s list of the world’s most influential people.

Rain, floods kill 73 in Bolivia since November

LIMA, 16 March — Heavy rain and floods have killed 73 people, made five missing and affected 95,000 families in Bolivia since November, Bolivia’s Civil Defence Department said on Friday.

Bad weather caused by

“La Nina”, or the extensive cooling of the central and eastern Pacific, has mainly caused damages in Chuquisaca Province in southern Bolivia, according to reports from La Paz, Bolivia’s administrative capital.

A total of 22 deaths occurred in Chuquisaca, followed by Santa Cruz, Cochabamba and La Paz with 14 deaths each.

January was the most fatal month, and the international community has sent emergency aid to Bolivia.

Germany, Spain, Argentina, Brazil, Japan, Chile, the United States and some other countries as well as organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank have provided aid for Bolivia.

Bolivia’s National Weather Service reports “La Nina” phenomenon has started to decrease and will disappear in April.

50 feared dead in Albanian Army depot explosion

TIRANA, 17 March — At least 50 people working at the site of an Army depot have been feared dead in an explosion which occurred Saturday near the Albanian capital Tirana, it was reported.

The depot is located near Vora, about 15 kilometres west of Tirana. The explosion can be heard in Tirana and Durres, the biggest port city of Albania.

A witness told a local TV that there were at least 50 people working at the site, dismantling weapons, and they were feared killed in the explosion.

Albanian Prime Minister Sali Berisha said they still have not got the full information about the situation, and

the country’s President Bamir Topi said that the exact casualties cannot be established yet.

Albania has destroyed some 46,000 tons of ammunition it has inherited from the past, and is continuing to scrap excess weaponry, hoping this might help the country get the ticket to a NATO membership at the alliance’s April 2-4 summit in Bucharest, Romania.

Albania was the first country to destroy 16,000 tons of chemical agents in July last year through the Nunn-Lugar programme, which was launched by two US Senators for the elimination of chemical weapons and other substances.—MNA/Xinhua

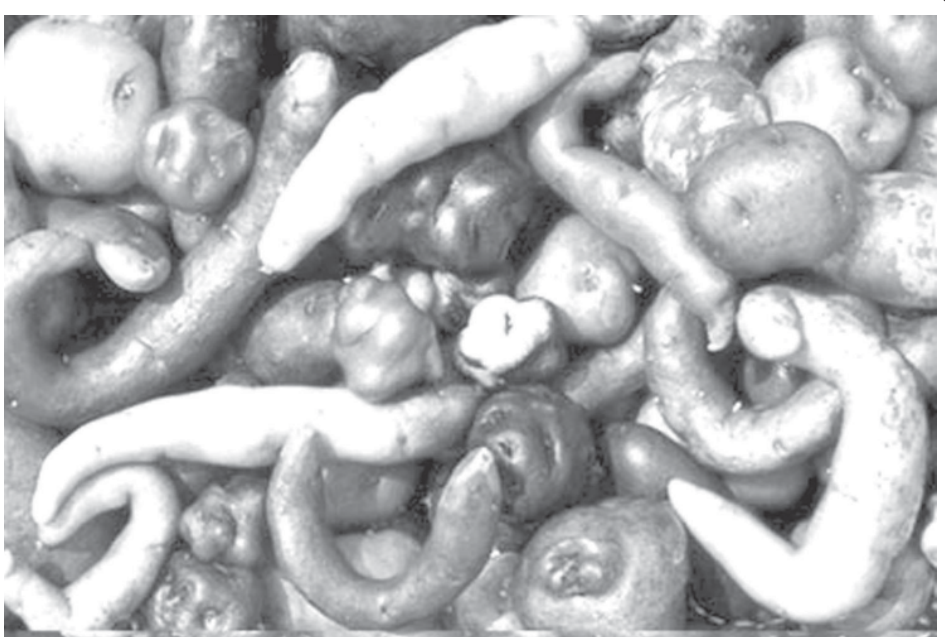

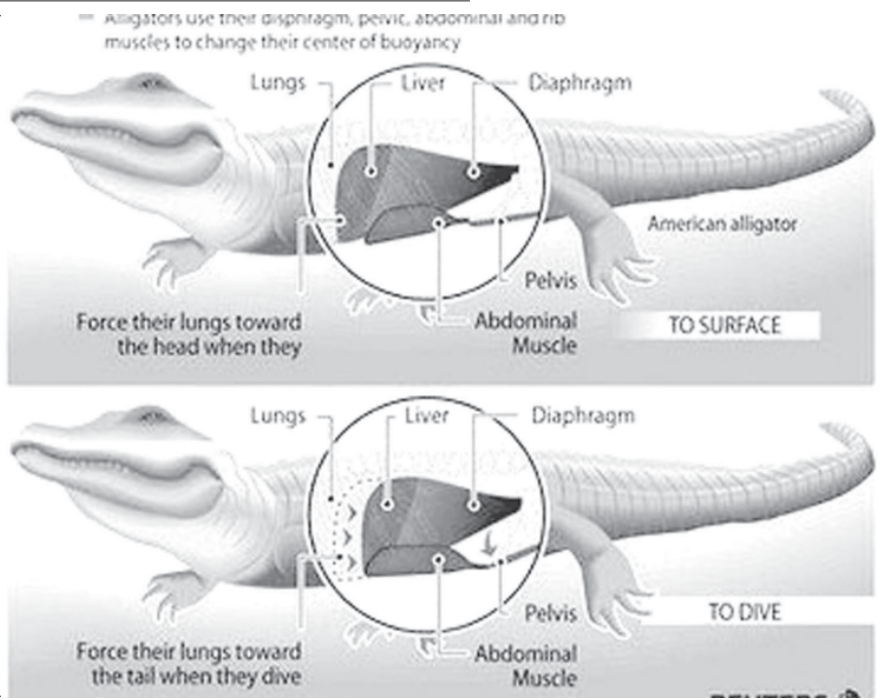

ISLAMBAD, 16 March — A foreign woman was killed and US Embassy staff were wounded in a bomb attack on a restaurant in the Pakistani capital of Islamabad on Saturday night, police said.

Police Deputy Inspector General Shahid Nadeem Baloch said the victim was a Turkish woman who worked for a relief agency. Baloch said 11 people were wounded, eight of them foreigners.

Doctors at the hospital where the dead woman was taken gave conflicting accounts, identifying her as an American nurse working at the US Embassy.

“US Embassy staff were among those wounded,” US Embassy spokeswoman Kay

Mayfield said, but she could not confirm any death.

Pakistan has been battling Islamist militancy since joining the US-led campaign against terrorism after the September 11 attacks on the United States.

More than 500 people have been killed this year in militant-related violence, including a wave of suicide bombings.

Bombers have targeted US diplomats several times in the past. A suicide bomber killed a security guard outside Islamabad’s Marriott hotel last year, but attacks on soft targets like restaurants frequented by foreigners would mark a change in militant tactics.

Sinopec denies report of projected Q1, Q2 losses

BEIJING, 15 March — China Petroleum and Chemical Corporation (Sinopec) has denied a report that it would probably suffer losses in the first two quarters due to high crude prices, the *China Securities Journal* reported on Friday.

“Such reports are groundless and untrue,” an unnamed company official was quoted as saying in reference to an article in Thursday’s *21st Century Business Herald*.

Refining business undoubtedly lost money, but that was not the case for the whole company,

he said. “Sinopec’s oil and gas exploitation, gas stations and chemical segments are very profitable.”

It was also untrue that Sinopec booked a January profit of only one billion yuan (140.8 million US dollars), about a sixth or a seventh of the level in the same month of the past two years, he said. But he recognized that profits in the first quarter declined compared with the year-earlier period. Sinopec is scheduled to release its first quarter financial results in late April.

“The company’s refining profitability depends on the market condition and the national policy,” he said. “The current 110 US dollars per barrel on the international market is an appalling price.”

Afghan mobile phones cut after Taliban attacks

KANDAHAR, 16 March — Mobile phone operators have shut down their networks at night in parts of Afghanistan after attacks by Taliban militants who say troops use the signals to track them down, residents and a phone company official said on Saturday.

Residents in parts of southern Afghanistan reported their mobile telephones no longer worked at night and an official from one of the companies confirmed its network had been shut

down from dusk till dawn in some areas of the country.

The Taliban last month ordered mobile phone operators to switch off their networks from 5 p.m. till 7 a.m. and have attacked and destroyed around 10 mobile phone towers since then to drive home their threat.

The latest attack on a mobile phone tower came just before dawn on Saturday in the southern province of Kandahar, a mobile telephone company official said.

Five bodies found in Peru helicopter crash

LIMA, 15 March — Rescue teams found on Thursday five of the 10 bodies of the helicopter that crashed on Tuesday in northwestern Peru.

The preliminary reports said the rescue teams discovered five yet unidentified bodies at Chiriato hill in Santa Cruz Province, some 800 kilometres northwest of Peru’s capital Lima.

The Bell 412B helicopter, belonging to the Helinka-Evergreen company, lost contact with the ground at 11 am local time (1600 GMT) Tuesday while offering transportation services for the Rio Tinto mining company. The wreckage of the helicopter, which disappeared while flying over a mountainous area difficult to get access with heavy rainfalls and fog, was found in a precipice Wednesday.

The 10 people aboard included two pilots and eight passengers being transferred by the helicopter rented by a mining exploration firm.

Japan starts environment assessment on US Marines’ site

TOKYO, 16 March — Japan’s Defence Ministry on Saturday launched comprehensive environmental assessment on a US Marine Corps’ relocation site, said reports from the southern Japanese port city of Naha, capital of Okinawa Island.

The assessment work, which includes the evaluation of weather conditions, the impact on the ecological environment and noise levels from the aircraft, is conducted by the Okinawa Defence Bureau of the ministry at the US Marines’ Camp Schwab in Nago, Okinawa Prefecture, a planned relocation site for the Marine’s Futenma Air Station

in Ginowan.

Under an implementation agreement reached by Japan and the United States in May 2006, the Japanese Government agreed to build a new airfield at Camp Schwab in Nago by 2014 to relocate the Futenma Air Station from the densely-populated area of Ginowan.

The local governments, however, have repeated asked the defence authorities to consider the impact of aircraft noise on the neighbouring residential areas and the potential negative effect on local biological environment.

Software “hiccup” undermines trip past Saturn moon

WASHINGTON, 15 March — A software malfunction prevented a key piece of equipment on the *Cassini* spacecraft from recording data as it flew through the plume from a geyser shooting off a moon of Saturn, NASA said late on Thursday.

NASA called the problem “an unexplained software hiccup” that came at a very bad time, preventing *Cassini*’s Cosmic Dust Analyzer instrument from collecting data for about two hours as it flew over the surface of the moon Enceladus on

Wednesday.

A key objective of the fly-by was to determine the density, size, composition and speed of particles erupting into space from the moon’s south pole in a dramatic plume.

Bob Mitchell, Cassini programme manager, said the problem meant that the instrument did not collect data as the craft flew

through the plume — a process lasting under a minute.

“When it went through the plume, it was not working properly,” Mitchell said in a telephone interview, expressing disappointment. “We had tested that software very carefully. We don’t know why it didn’t work properly.”—MNA/Reuters

Feelin’ groovy even a 10-minute workout can help

CHICAGO, 15 March— Exercising as little as 10 to 30 minutes a day can make overweight or obese older women get more done and feel better about their lives, US researchers said on Thursday.

They said even women who only exercised 10 minutes a day saw significant improvements in quality of life — they had more energy, less anxiety and were simply

happier. The study is among the first to examine how exercise can improve the quality of life of postmenopausal women who were extremely out of shape but otherwise healthy, said Dr Timothy Church of the Pennington Biomedical Research Centre in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

“This is by far the largest exercise trial which has ever looked at

Two dead as fresh storms spawn tornado near Atlanta

ATLANTA, 16 March — A tornado in northwest Georgia killed two people and left others seriously injured on Saturday, one day after a twister battered Atlanta’s downtown, officials said.

One person died in Polk county and a second died in Floyd county, said Buzz Weiss of the Georgia

Emergency Management Agency. Both counties are on Georgia’s border with Alabama.

The National Weather Service issued a string of tornado warnings moving east across north Georgia throughout the day. It said there was a risk of “isolated tornadoes” across central

Georgia and South Carolina, where local media said storms left thousands without power.

Workers were clearing debris in the heart of Atlanta following Friday night’s storm, which damaged landmark buildings, overturned cars and injured dozens of people. — MNA/Reuters

Scientists discover gene that controls tomato shape

WASHINGTON, 16 March — US scientists have identified a gene that controls the shape of tomatoes, a discovery that could help unravel the mystery behind the huge morphological differences among edible fruits and vegetables.

The discovery was reported, as the cover article, in the March 14 issue of the journal *Science*.

The gene, dubbed SUN, is only the second ever found to play a significant role in the elongated shape of various tomato varieties, said

Esther van der Knaap, lead researcher in the study at Ohio State University.

As one of the most diverse vegetable crops in terms of shape and size variations, tomatoes have evolved from a very small, round wild ancestor into the wide array of cultivated varieties — some large and segmented, some pear-shaped, some oval, some resembling chili peppers — available through most seed catalogs and for sale in supermarkets. — MNA/Xinhua

Japan’s space state lab section opens for business

HOUSTON, 15 March — A key component of a huge new orbital research laboratory was installed by spacewalking astronauts on Friday, launching construction of Japan’s signature contribution to the *International Space Station*.

Wearing protective masks and goggles,

station commander Peggy Whitson, Japanese astronaut Takao Doi and lead shuttle spacewalker Richard Linnehan floated into an equipment-jammed storage closet that will be hooked up in May with Japan’s main laboratory, named Kibo, or “hope”.

“This is a small step

for one Japanese astronaut, but a giant entrance for Japan to a greater and newer space programme. Congratulations,” Doi radioed to the Japan’s new space control centre outside Tokyo.

“We love our new room already,” added Whitson. “It looks great.”— MNA/Reuters

Cristiano Ronaldo was United's hero at Pride Park, scoring with just 14 minutes to go as Derby, bottom of the table with only one league win all season and beaten 6-1 at Chelsea on Wednesday, offered far tougher resistance than United expected.

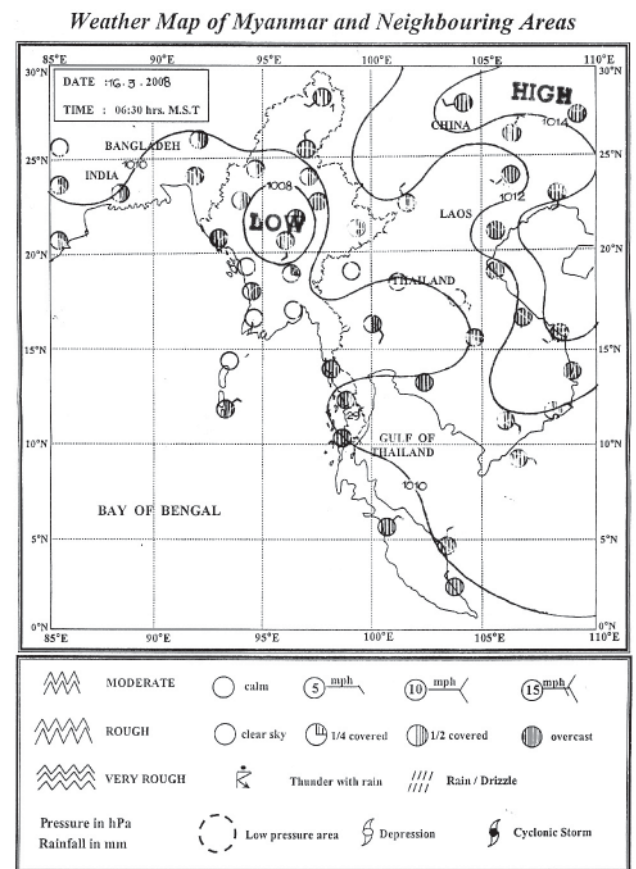
Jankovic overcame the gusting winds at the Indian Well Tennis Garden
