Republican McCain tacks away from Bush

ALEXANDRIA, 2 April—Virginia : John McCain on Tuesday struck away from the political legacy of President George W Bush, as he sought to plot an obstacle-strewn course back to the White House for Republicans.

The party's presidential candidate also mused on the lessons of his rebellious youth, as he sought to frame his life story as a history of self sacrifice and military service, the culmination of which would be the presidency.

"The point is, I'm not

running on the Bush presidency, I'm running on my own service to the country, my own record in the House of Representatives and the United States Senate and my vision for the future," McCain told ABC television.

"Now we'll have lots of time to portray that, and I'm doing that now."

McCain, 71, has been a fierce supporter of the Iraq war, though challenged the Bush administration's past management of the conflict, and admits his fortunes could be tied to

the way the war develops over the next nine months.

In an appearance at his old boarding school outside Washington, McCain also implicitly criticized Bush for not using the 11 September attacks in 2001 to call Americans to unite in a common national purpose.—Internet

Russia rejects US idea on modifying arms control treaty

Moscow, 2 April—Russia differs with the United States on the extension of a strategic arms control treaty and the two sides are expected to draft a new document in 2009, Russian news agencies reported on Monday.

"Washington believes that we need to move forward by developing and perfecting the Moscow treaty on strategic offensive reductions (SORT). Moscow disagrees with that and suggests using START-1 (Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty) as a basis by sticking to its strategic offensive arms control measures," Interfax cited an anonymous military

source as saying.

Moscow and Washington, however, have agreed to draft a new document by the end of 2009, the high-ranking official was quoted as saying when commenting on a bilateral talks held in Washington last week on the control of strategic offensive arms.

Russia-US relations were soured by arrays of disputes, including differences on a US plan to deploy missile shield components in Central Europe, as well as on the extension of the START-1 which expires in 2012.

France will not back Ukraine, Georgia NATO bids

PARIS, 2 April—France will not support bids by the former Soviet republics of Georgia and Ukraine to become members of NATO, putting it at odds with the United States, French Prime Minister Francois Fillon

said on Tuesday.

"France will not give its green light to the entry of Ukraine and Georgia," Fillon told France Inter radio. "France has an opinion which is different from that of the United States on this question."

NATO leaders hold a summit later this week in Romania where Georgia and Ukraine hope to obtain a Membership Action Plan (MAP) —a road map to eventual entry already secured by Croatia, Macedonia and Albania.

US President George W Bush arrived in Ukraine late on Monday ahead of the summit, and officials accompanying him remained optimistic that the alliance could extend the plan to both countries at the summit.

"We think it's very, very, very important (for) Georgia and Ukraine, that we welcome their aspirations to be part of NATO, that we have an active engagement in helping them move in that direction," National Security Council adviser Stephen Hadley told reporters aboard Air Force One.

Pakistan's Federal Cabinet holds first meeting

ISLAMABAD, 2 April—The Federal Cabinet of Pakistan held its first meeting after the first 24 ministers were sworn in by President Pervez Musharraf on Monday.

The meeting was chaired by Prime Minister Syed Yousuf Raza Gillani at the PM House in the capital, the *News Network International* news agency reported.

Gillani directed all the ministers to evaluate the projects of their respective ministries and prepare short-term and long-term plans in accordance with the manifestos of the coalition government. He also advised the members of the Cabinet to adopt a proactive approach and keep people abreast with the progress on various

programmes through media and parliamentary committees.

Briefing reporters after the meeting, Minister for Information and Broadcasting Sherry Rehman said the Federal Cabinet discussed measures to ensure adequate supply of atta, reduce power shortage and implement minimum wage for workers of 6,000 rupees (around 96 US dollars) per month by immediately amending labour laws.

Danish soldier killed in Afghanistan, two wounded

COPENHAGEN, 2 April—A Danish soldier was killed in Helmand Province in southern Afghanistan on Monday and two were wounded in a battle against Taliban insurgents, Danish Army

Central Command said.

The Army said the soldiers battled the Taliban alongside British troops in an offensive supported by tanks, artillery and helicopters.

Denmark has about 550

combat troops in Afghanistan. Three soldiers were killed this month and ten have died in combat so far, while three others were killed in 2002 while trying to dismantle a mine.

Two US soldiers killed by attacks in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 2 April — Two American soldiers were killed in insurgent attacks in Iraq, the US military said on Tuesday.

A soldier assigned to Multi-National Division-Baghdad was killed on Monday when a roadside bomb explosion hit his vehicle at about 4:00

p.m.(1300 GMT), in northeast of Baghdad, a US military statement said.

Another soldier assigned to Multi-National Division-Centre was announced dead on Saturday in Germany after being wounded by a roadside bomb explosion on 23 March in south of Baghdad, another statement said.

The latest deaths bring the number of US soldiers killed in Iraq to more than 4,010 since the Iraq war broke out in 2003, according to media count based on Pentagon figures. — MNA/Xinhua

Gas explosion injures seven in Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 2 April — At least seven people suffered major burns on Monday, including three children, when a cooking gas tank exploded at a taco stand in Monterrey, the capital of the northern Mexican state of Nuevo Leon, police told media on Monday.

The incident occurred earlier on Monday when three children who were playing close to the stand

pulled over the tank, causing a flame to leap out and trigger a more serious explosions which shattered windows in a dozen buildings.

Police named Sanjuan Rios Palomo 56 the stand's owner, and three children who are all four of the five years old as the worst injured.

Ecuador sues Colombia over anti-drug spraying

QUITO, 1 April — Ecuador said on Monday it had sued Colombia in international court over drug crop fumigation along its frontier in reaction to a Colombian raid that killed a rebel leader across the border earlier this month.

The 1 March bomb attack on a Colombian rebel camp inside Ecuador has

frayed ties between both countries, and briefly raised the threat of war after Ecuador and Venezuela moved troops to their borders with Colombia.

Ecuadorean President Rafael Correa had warned he would take action against Colombia on Monday and tensions between the Andean

neighbours remained high after Quito accused Bogota of waging a smear campaign to tie Correa to the leftist rebels.

"Ecuador asks the court to declare Colombia's air fumigation a violation of Ecuador's sovereignty," Foreign Minister Maria Salvador told reporters in Quito.

US, ROK conduct over 200 cases of aerial spying in March

PYONGYANG, 1 April — The Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) on Monday accused the United States and South Korea of committing more than 200 cases of aerial espionage against it in March, the official *Korean Central News Agency* (KCNA) reported.

The US forces perpetrated more than 110 cases of aerial espionage against the DPRK, and the South Korean forces at least 90 cases, said the report, quoting a military source.

Civilian killed by US ship gunfire near Suez condemned

CAIRO, 2 April — Egypt's Shura Council (Upper House of the Parliament) Monday denounced the killing of an Egyptian civilian by shots from a US Navy chartered ship last week at Suez Port.

The incident was rejected and deplored at all levels, the official *MENA* news agency quoted Shura Council Speaker Safwat el-Sherif as saying.

The government should have banned the

US ship from sailing through the Suez Canal and interrogated the perpetrators, Shura Council members said.

The lawmakers expected the government would do everything possible to protect Egyptian sovereignty and the rights of Egyptian people.

"Egyptian sovereignty over the Suez Canal is a red line that cannot be crossed," said Mohammed

Bassyouni, head of the Shura Council Arab and Foreign Affairs and National Security Committee.

"We are still waiting for the outcome of Egyptian and US investigations into the Suez shooting incident before an official Egyptian stance is announced," said Bassyouni.

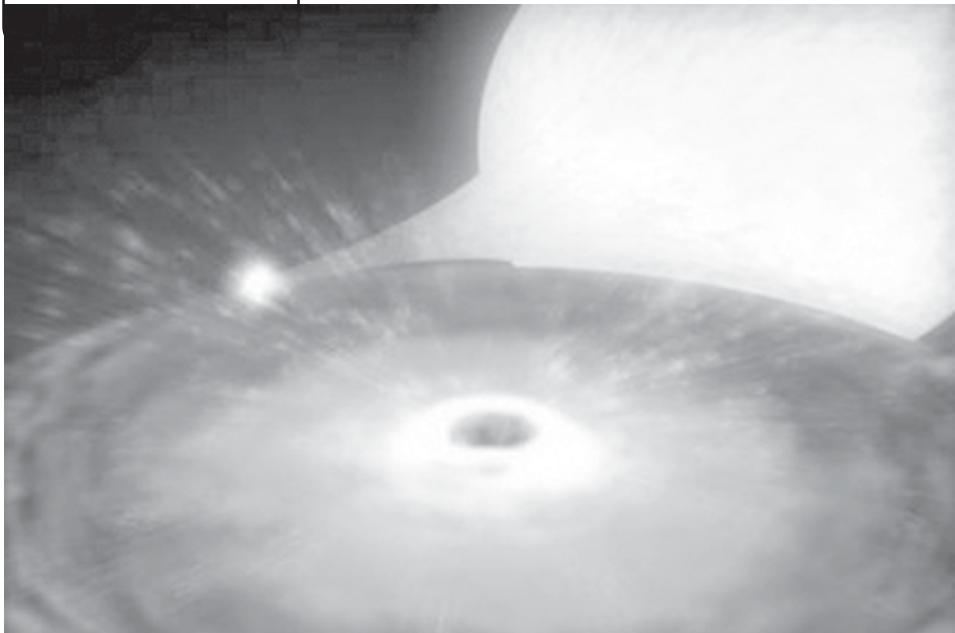

Cubans allowed to stay at tourist hotels

HAVANA, 1 April — Cuba has lifted a ban on its nationals staying at hotels formerly reserved exclusively for foreigners, hotel employees said on Monday. It was the latest step to liberalize the Communist-run state under new President Raul Castro, who has ended bans on Cubans buying computers, DVD players and cellular telephones.

"Anyone can stay at hotels as of midnight last night, as long as they have ID and the money to pay for a room," said the night porter at the Chateau Miramar hotel in western Havana.

Employees at several five-star hotels managed by Spanish chain Sol Melia confirmed this. Cubans can also rent cars and use other tourist facilities

previously limited to foreigners, industry sources said.

The ban on staying in hotels at tropical beach resorts was a source of frustration for Cubans since their country opened up to tourism in the early 1990s and gave rise to criticism of Cuba for having an "economic apartheid" system.

GMS countries decide to strengthen tourism

VIENTIANE, 1 April — Leaders from the six Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) nations agreed here Monday to make progress on tourism and human resource development in the region.

In the Joint Summit Declaration signed at the third GMS summit held in the capital city of Laos, leaders of the member nations of GMS say the

GMS member countries will strengthen the sustainable management of natural and cultural tourism sites, promote the joint marketing of tourism in the subregion, and strengthen the Mekong Tourism Coordinating Office.

According to the joint declaration, the six countries of GMS, which include Cambodia, China, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam, will imple-

ment the new strategic framework and action plan for cooperation in education, health, labour, and other social development areas.

They will also support the mandate and mission of the Mekong Institute, and enhance the prevention and control of communicable diseases in border areas, according to the declaration.

Climate for Africa growth more conducive

ADDIS ABABA, 1 April — China and India's explosion of trade with Africa and greater investment and tolerance by traditional partners have boosted the continent's development climate, Ethiopia's Prime Minister said on Monday.

"The external environment has been more conducive for African development. We have more latitude to be authors of our own destiny," Prime Minister Meles Zenawi told a meeting of finance and economy ministers in the Ethiopian capital.

China's trade with Africa grew to 40 billion US dollars in 2005 compared with 364 million US dollars in 1978, while India's rose to 11 billion US dollars in the same period, according to UN and African Union figures.

Analysts say that the influx of money, combined with the no-strings-attached trade and aid policies of both nations, has helped make Western donors who traditionally dictated the terms in Africa ease restrictions on its funding.

EU has failed to justify beef hormone ban

GENEVA, 1 April — The European Union has failed to justify its ban on imports of hormone-treated beef, the World Trade Organization said in a ruling published on Monday.

But in a mixed verdict the WTO panel also found the United States and Canada had broken trade rules when they extended sanctions on EU exports in response to the EU's revised ban.

The European Union, Canada and the United States all claimed victory in the latest twist of the 12-year-old dispute. US beef exports will not resume immediately and both sides are likely to appeal.

Brussels called on the United States and Canada to lift the trade sanctions, while Washington and Ottawa urged Brussels to let in hormone-treated beef.

But trade experts said the United States and Canada had come out the real winners. "There's a little bit in this decision for both parties, but primarily it's a US victory," said Brendan McGivern, a partner at the law firm White & Case. —MNA/Reuters

Philippine economy to maintain high growth in 2008

MANILA, 1 April — The Philippine economy is expected to grow 5.9 per cent in 2008, maintaining the momentum after achieving its fastest growth pace in three decades last year, the World Bank says.

Vera Songwe, the World Bank economist based in the Philippines, told a Press conference on Tuesday that the high expectation of growth is sustained by expected fiscal reforms and institutional changes in the government. The World Bank's forecast, though lower than a previous government expectation of 6.3-7 per cent, places the Philippines among the fastest growing economies in the Southeastern Asia region, local TV network GMA News said. —MNA/Xinhua

PM says Vietnam puts top priority on curbing inflation

HANOI, 1 April — The Vietnamese Government's current key tasks are curbing inflation, maintaining macroeconomic development, and ensuring social welfare and sustainable growth, of which inflation reduction is its top priority, said Prime Minister Nguyen Tan Dung.

To this end, the

government will ask localities and relevant agencies to tighten monetary policies, and cut down on expenses and public investments funded by the state budget, local newspaper *People* on Monday quoted an article written by the Prime Minister. —MNA/Xinhua

Iraq signs \$6b Boeing, Bombardier plane deal

BAGHDAD, 1 April — Iraq signed a 5.9-billion-US-dollar contract with US firm Boeing and Canada's Bombardier to purchase at least 50 airplanes, a government spokesman said on Monday.

The purchase, previously announced in February, is the country's first major aircraft order

since at least the 1980s.

Iraq is working to rebuild its fleet after most of it was destroyed during the 2003 US-led war.

It resumed international flights in 2004.

Under the contract, Iraq agreed to buy 40 Boeing 737 and 787 airplanes for its national carrier, with the option to purchase 15 more, the

government said. It also signed a 400-million-US-dollar contract with Bombardier to buy 10 jets.

Iraq's national carrier Iraqi Airways now flies only to neighbouring countries, but aviation officials say it hopes to expand its network from the Middle East into Europe and China.

Malawian President concludes first China tour

BEIJING, 1 April—Malawian President Bingu wa Mutharika left here Sunday night, concluding his first state visit to China. Mutharika had held talks with Chinese President Hu Jintao and met with Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao. The two heads of state reached extensive consensus on developing a healthy, steady, sincere and

friendly bilateral relationship, according to the Chinese Foreign Ministry. Mutharika also co-chaired the opening ceremony of the Malawian Embassy in Beijing with Chinese Foreign Minister Yang Jiechi. Besides Beijing, Mutharika also visited Chengdu, capital of southwest China's Sichuan Province, Shen-

zhen, a booming city of south China's Guangdong Province, and Shanghai, China's eco-nomic hub.

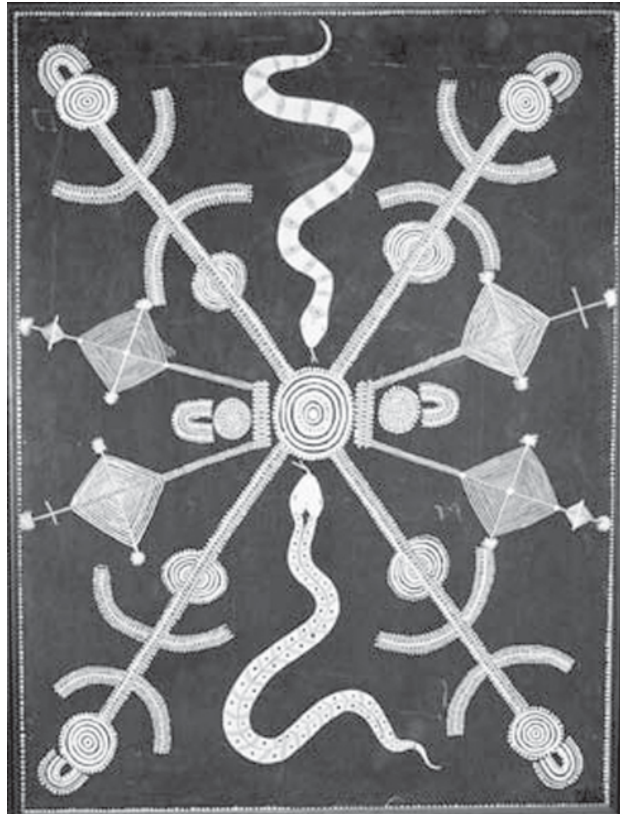
Mutharika started his visit to China on 24 March as guest of Hu Jintao. This is his first China tour.

Report says S Korea might face mortgage crisis

SEOUL, 1 April—South Korea might suffer a bursting property bubble in the manner of the US subprime mortgage crisis as mortgage-backed loans account for 47 per cent of total bank loans, local economists warned on Monday.

In a report published by the *Chosun Daily*, the Hyundai Research Institute said mortgage-backed loans account for 47 per cent of total bank loans, as loans to small and medium-sized companies in real estate development and construction have surged since 2001. In Japan, just before the housing bubble burst in the early 1990s, banks had only 26 per cent of mortgages.

The institute warned of a "hard landing" for the mortgage market, which would lead to an increase in credit delinquency and a fall in the value of collateral. The bursting bubble would ultimately result in the bankruptcy of financial institutions, the institute said.

Cambodia establishes diplomatic relationship with Qatar

PHNOM PENH, 2 April — Cambodia and Qatar on Tuesday signed an agreement to establish the diplomatic relationship, Cambodian Government spokesman Khieu Kanharith said.

The two countries agreed to select 1 April as the day to establish the diplomatic relationship, he told reporters at a Press conference following talks between Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen and visiting Qatar Premier.

"We also requested seven projects from Qatar and they agreed with all requests," he said.

The requests include helping to train oil and gas

experts for Cambodia, allowing Cambodian labour force to work in Qatar, bringing more investments, a direct flight from Doha of Qatar to Cambodia, strengthening gas and mines cooperation and buying rice products from Cambodia, Khieu Kanharith said. Both sides will create a law about investments promotion, he added.

Sheikh Hamad bin Jasssem bin Jabor Al Thani, the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Qatar, arrived in Phnom Penh on Tuesday to pay a two-day visit to Cambodia.

Iraqi Olympic Committee official dies of wounds

BAGHDAD, 1 April—The Iraqi Olympic Committee said Monday that its assistant secretary-general died of wounds sustained from gunmen attack last week.

"Dr Ra'ad Jaber died of wounds in a Baghdad hospital on Sunday after being attacked by gunmen in the Sa'doun Street in central Baghdad on Wednesday," Hussein al-Amidi, the acting secretary-general of the committee, told *Xinhua*.

Jaber was accompanied by members of the Iraqi basketball federation when the gunmen attacked them, Amidi said. Ra'ad Salman, an Iraqi basketball referee was killed instantly during the attack while Fikrat Toma, coach of national basketball team, escaped the attack with a gunshot wound in his thigh, he said.

The attack came as fierce clashes between Shiite Mahdi Army militiamen and the US-backed Iraqi security forces spiraled in several southern Iraqi cities in addition to Baghdad.

The clashes erupted on last Tuesday has caused hundreds of Iraqi casualties.—Xinhua

Phone scams rise in Singapore in first quarter of 2008

SINGAPORE, 1 April—Singapore's police said on Monday that they have received several reports of phone scams in the first

quarter of this year.

A notable new trick employed by these fraudsters is that the telephone number of a

police department or courts, even the emergency call 999, would appear in the caller ID of the victim's phones, the police said in a statement.

The fraudsters had posed as Supreme Court staff and police officers and informed their victims that they were involved in criminal cases or court hearings and directed them to transfer money into a bank account to clear their name.

Other scams use the "kidnap scam". The swindlers trick their victims into transferring money into a bank account by alleging that their family members had been kidnapped.—Xinhua

State Constitution (2008), the most appropriate one for Union of Myanmar

Myanmar people are now working together independently and harmoniously in their own interests. A citizen can realize the taste of sovereignty or independence to a greater degree if he compares the evil consequences of the colonial rule the colonialists exercised in the nation for more than 100 years with the fruitful results of peace and stability and development the people are enjoying at present.

The entire people of various national races are the ultimate owners of national sovereignty which is in force in the whole country. In the present period, the population of each nation is growing, and the people are no longer in a position to get together to make decisions by their own to deal with the public affairs. So, there has emerged a system in which people's representatives are elected and assigned duties to serve the public interests in compliance with the wishes of the people. This is to be termed "representative democracy".

Adoption of the principles of how the people's representatives will have to exercise the people's sovereign powers is called the drawing, prescribing and exercising the State constitution. At present time, every country chooses the pattern of the State structure, the system to exercise sovereign powers and promulgate the fundamental rights of the citizens according to its historical background, the desire of the people, prevailing conditions and future plans. Therefore, it is fair to say that every country practises the constitution that has been formulated and approved in accord with the wishes of the people.

Myanmar has a long history. It regained its sovereignty on 4 January 1948 after warding off the colonial rule. It drew the first-ever State constitution in 1947 and practised it. In 1974, it exercised the second State constitution or the State constitution of the Union of the Socialist Republic of Myanmar.

The State constitution (2008) is designed to be based on the prevailing situations and to shape a prosperous future of the nation, after taking lessons from the loopholes and defects of the first and second constitutions.

The fundamental principles and detailed basic principles for the 15 chapter headings adopted by the National Convention that was successfully over on 3 September 2007 have become the sections and sub-sections of the third and the best constitution. From 3 December 2007 to 19 February 2008, the 54-member Commission for Drafting the State Constitution completed the drafting the constitution on the basis of the principles the National Convention had adopted. In May 2008, all the eligible voters from the four corners of the nation will cast votes and approve the draft of the constitution.

Throughout the National Convention, the fundamental principles and detailed basic principles received media coverage and they were published into books for public knowledge. Therefore, they have come to the knowledge of the majority of the people. Here, I would like to present some salient points about the State constitution (2008).

Taking lessons from the defects of the parliamentary democracy system under which the three sovereign powers: (1) legislative power, (2)

executive power and (3) judicial power were vested exclusively upon a single person, the three sovereign powers will be entrusted to three bodies. The parliamentary democracy system is a system under which the leader of a party that has won the majority of the seats exercises the executive power, takes the position of the Head of State, makes laws at will because the majority of the MPs are its, and gives instructions, puts pressure, and interferes in the judicial affairs. In practice, a person alone is unable to exercise all the three sovereign powers, and he tends to make more and more mistakes. So, the countries with this system are often in a mess and often sees the government changes.

Unlike that, in the State constitution (2008), the legislative power is bestowed upon the representatives-elect of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw; the executive power, on the President the Electoral College has elected; and the judicial power, on the High Court of the Union. Then, the powers are shared with respective subordinate bodies, persons and levels in accordance with the law. There is a system of check and balance to sure that the three responsible bodies that take responsibility for and exercise the three sovereign powers are not given carte blanche to do what they like. In this regard, there is a notable point that in some countries with stable governments and long-lasting constitutions, the three sovereign powers are delegated to three bodies, rather than to a single person. The present constitution empowers the three powers to and holds the three bodies responsible. So, there will not be a dictator in the country.

If we study today's countries especially Union countries, we will see some powerful Union countries take measures for their perpetuation, while suppressing any movements of any parts trying to secede from them. Nevertheless, they are trying to break up developing countries and Union countries. Myanmar has been on the edge of collapse due to internal and external instigation more than one time. Thus, the State constitution (2008) carries a section "No part of the territory of the Union, namely regions, states and self-administered areas, etc. shall ever secede from the Union" to ensure perpetual existence of the Union.

Myanmar is a Union where multicultural national races make their homes together. A certain country is made up of 50 states, but all practically belong to the Whites. And they do not contain separate provinces of national races. Unlike them, in Myanmar, Kachin, Kayah, Kayin, Chin, Mon, Rakhine and Shan are the states of national races. And in a region, many different national races live together. Shan State, for instance, is home to many national races such as Shan, Pa-O, Danu, Palaung, Wa, Lahu, Akha, Lisu, Gong, Kachin, Bamar, Myaungsi, Taungthu and Taungyo. Similarly, in the divisions, Kayin, Mon, Shan, Rakhine, Chin and Kachin live together with Bamar.

At the National Convention, the delegates held discussions and coordinated to form self-administered areas for every national race that has a reasonable size of population living in a state. They are (1) Wa self-administered division, (2) Pa-O self-administered zone, (3) Palaung self-administered zone, (4), Danu self-administered zone, (5), Kokang self-administered zone, and (6), Naga self-administered zone.

In addition, this State constitution prescribes some principles that ensure that national races have the right to participate in the exercise of the legislative, executive and judicial powers. Pyidaungsu Hluttaw made up of Pyithu Hluttaw and Amyotha Hluttaw consisting of representatives-elect of national races is the body of high legislative power. Representatives-elect will have to represent the various national races concerned at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw, and participate in making laws. The forthcoming constitution prescribes state/region hluttaws that are unprecedented in Myanmar. The state/region hluttaws will have the right to exercise the legislative power. Even self-administered areas will be vested with the legislative power prescribed by the constitution.

The President is the Head of State and the administrative authority. Power will be shared to different levels such as Vice-Presidents, governing body (ministers), state/region chief ministers, self-administered area leading bodies, and those in-charge of districts, townships, wards and village-tracts.

National races numbering more than 100 can exercise legislative and executive powers by standing for election to state/region hluttaws and self-administered zones. Every national race whose population constitutes more than 0.1 per cent of the nation's population has the right to elect a representative from among its population to the region or state hluttaw concerned.

In this regard, there is no discrimination against or in favour of any particular national race. All citizens are of equal status before the law and can enjoy equally the fundamental rights of citizens. The 1947 constitution carried 23 sections on fundamental rights of citizens, the 1974 constitution, 26 articles, and the 2008 constitution, 50 sections. Every citizen irrespective of race has the right to express, profess the religions of their choice, do any business, the right of defence and the right of appeal to the Supreme Court of the Union.

And they have the right to impeach and remove people's representatives elected to practise sovereign powers such as legislative (MPs), executive (the President and governing bodies), judicial (judges including the Chief Justice), the attorney-general for the auditor-general for (a) treason, (b) violation of the provisions in the Constitution, (c) misconduct, (d) being disqualified for the Presidency or Vice-Presidency under the Constitution, and (e) incompetent discharge of duties assigned to him in accord with the law. And the voters can recall the representatives-elect they have elected.

There are several principles in the chapter "Provisions on State of Emergency" that in times of emergency such as insurgency or violence and alien intrusion, the President shall assign duties to the Commander-in-Chief of Defece Services and fix time frames in accordance with the law, and the administrative body (government) led by the President can continue to take State duties.

By studying some salient points I have presented, everyone will realize that the 2008 State constitution is the most suitable one for the people of the Union.

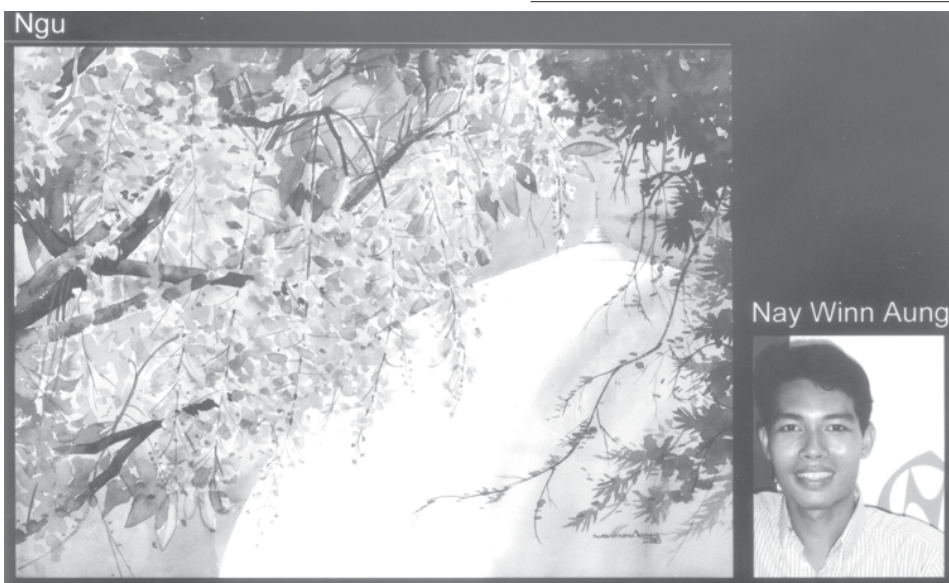
Flake Art Gallery to get the water colour painting back on track in Myanmar.

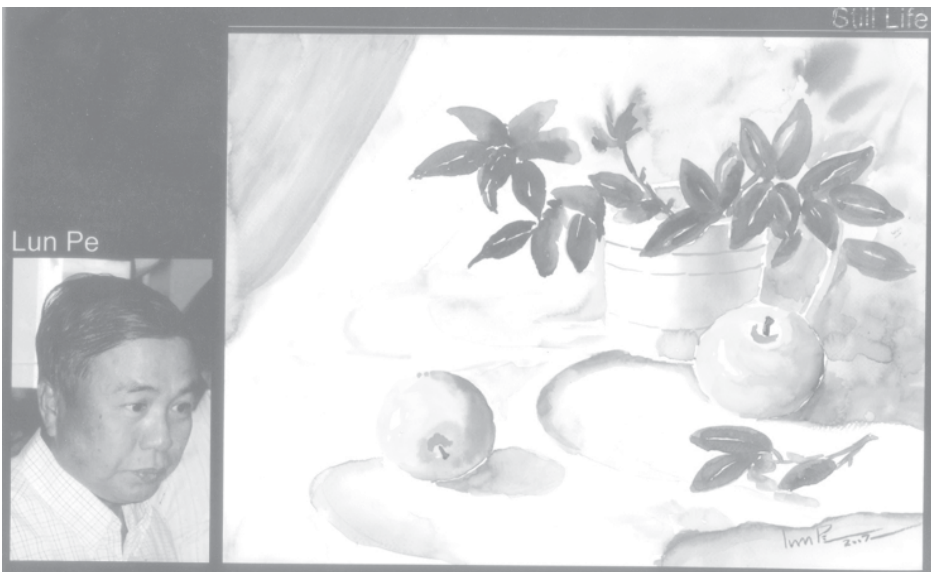

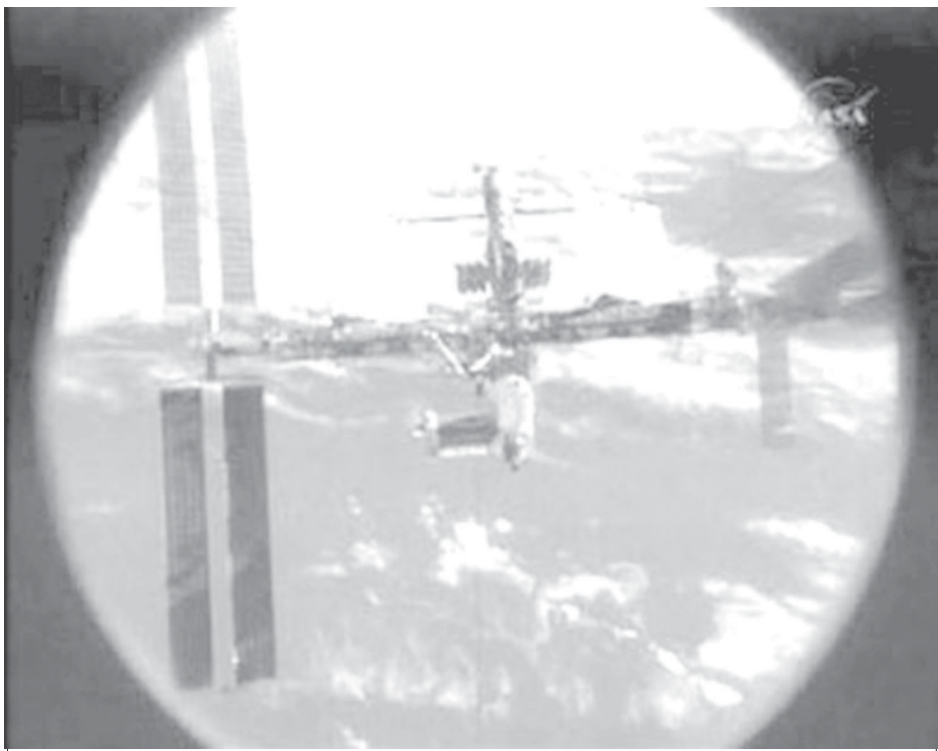

“No cell phones when you vote”, Italians told

Rome, 2 April — Italians were told on Tuesday that they will have to leave their beloved cell phones outside the ballot box when they vote in a national election this month.

A statement from the Interior Ministry said cell phones “or any other device that can take still pictures or video clips” will have to be checked outside the polling station during the April 13-14 election.

Mobile phones are ubiquitous in Italy. Last year Eurostat said that by 2005 there were more mobile phones than people Italy — 122 phones per 100 residents.

The ruling, the first of its kind, was apparently issued to head off corruption.

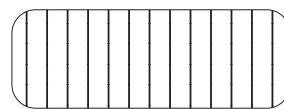

Twin quakes jolt N Philippines

MANILA, 1 April—Two earthquakes rocked the Philippines' northernmost province of Batanes on Tuesday morning, state seismologists said.

No earthquake-related damages have so far been reported, according to the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs).

The first quake was recorded at a magnitude of 5.1 at 9:31 am local

time (0131 GMT), Phivolcs said.

The quake's epicentre was traced 63 kilometres southeast of Basco, Batanes with a depth of 27 kilometres from the earth's surface. A second and slightly milder quake was felt more than 20 minutes later at 9:57 am local time (0157 GMT).

The epicentre of the 4.6-magnitude earthquake was traced 50 kilometres

southeast of Basco, Batanes.

The Phivolcs said it does not expect the twin quakes, both tectonic in origin, to wreak damage in the affected towns or produce any more after-shocks.

Meanwhile, the Hong Kong Observatory recorded the first disturbance at a slightly higher magnitude.

S Korean equipment to be used in space research

SEOUL, 1 April — South Korean scientific equipment was approved by Russian authorities to be used in a space research helped by Russia, the South Korean Government said Monday.

"The green light given by the rocket company and state-run laboratory will permit all 18 experiments to be conducted according to plan," said the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, adding that the Energia Rocket and Space Corporation and Institute for Biomedical Problems has certified test devices and biospecimens that will allow the astronauts to conduct tests in space. —MNA/Xinhua

Study: 7-8 hours of sleep best for keeping healthy weight

OTTAWA, 1 April — If you want to keep a healthy weight, sleep seven to eight hours a day and no more or less, scientists have discovered. A new study conducted by obesity researchers at Laval University in Quebec City suggests that seven to eight hours is just the right amount of sleep, with people who get too little and those who get too much actually putting on weight as a consequence.

The study showed that

people who slept five to six hours a night and people who averaged nine to 10 hours a night put on more weight when followed over a six-year period as compared to people who got the recommended seven to eight hours of shut-eye.

The researchers followed 276 adults aged 21 to 64 years, over half of whom were drawn from families where at least one parent and one offspring were obese by BMI measures. —MNA/Xinhua



Pig disease reoccurs in Vietnam

HANOI, 1 April — Central Ha Tinh Province has become the first Vietnamese locality being affected by Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome (PRRS)

over the past four months after the disease has recently hit 2,500 pigs in the province.

The disease has broken out in the two districts of Cam Xuyen and Thach Ha, and Ha Tinh City in the province, local newspaper *Youth* on Monday quoted the provincial veterinary bureau as reporting. Local veterinary agency has isolated and disinfected affected farms to prevent the disease from spreading.

PRRS was first recognized in the United States in the mid-1980s and is now present in most pig producing countries. The symptoms include reproductive failure, pneumonia and increased susceptibility to secondary bacterial infection.

Scientists discover 10 new planets outside solar system

WASHINGTON, 1 April — An international team of astronomers has found 10 new extra-solar planets, planets that orbit stars other than our sun, University of California, Santa Barbara, announced on Tuesday.

The new international collaboration is called "SuperWASP," for Wide Area Search for Planets. In the last six months the SuperWASP team has used two batteries of cameras, one in Spain's Canary Islands and one in South Africa, to discover the 10 new extra solar planets.

Two participating astronomers from the US are Rachel Street and Tim Lister, who are working at the Las Cumbres Observatory Global Telescope Network (LCOGTN), affiliated with UCSB.

"The flood of new discoveries from SuperWASP will revolutionize our understanding of how

planets form," said Lister in the statement released by UCSB. In order to discover these planets, astronomers look for "transits," moments when the planets pass in front of the star, like an eclipse, as

viewed from the Earth. This technique of locating the planets gives more information about the formation and evolution of the planets than the gravitational technique.

Philippines to ban commercial sales of kidneys to foreigners

MANILA, 1 April — The Philippine Government will ban commercial sales of kidneys of the Filipinos to foreigners under the guise of medical tourism, reported the official *Philippines News Agency* Monday. The Department of Health has asked hospitals to strictly follow the existing rules on kidney donation and transplantation that limit to 10 per cent the number of foreign transplant patients, while a new government order is yet to come into

force to ban such abuse of the poor Filipinos, said the *News Agency*.

Health Secretary Francisco Duque III said that the government will investigate and punish members of the medical community who promote commercial organ donation and violate the rules, according to the *News Agency*.

A new policy declares kidney transplantation is not part of medical tourism in the country. However, foreign patients are still

allowed to go to the Philippines to have their transplants here, it added.

"Organ transplant is not included and we do not advertise transplants in our medical tourism," Duque said. A previous government policy allowed foreign patients to come to the Philippines for kidney transplants, which has enabled hundreds of foreigners to get a kidney from Filipino donors for around 100,000 pesos (2,500 US dollars).

GELSENKIRCHEN (Germany), 2 April — Barcelona struck early through teenager Bojan Krkic and survived a series of late scares to claim a 1-0 win over Schalke 04 in their Champions League quarterfinal first leg on Tuesday.

Barcelona, bidding for a second Champions League title in three seasons, took the lead when Thierry Henry's cross from the left set up the 17-year-old Bojan to divert the ball into the roof of the net.

Fabian Ernst and Halil Altintop saw shots slip just wide with the keeper beaten midway through the second half and Soren Larsen put a free header past the post as the Germans hurled players forward.

Marcelo Bordon brought a fingertip save from Victor Valdes in the dying seconds and Barcelona held on to take a valuable lead into the second leg at the Nou Camp on 9 April.

The prize is a semifinal against Manchester United or AS Roma.—MNA/Reuters

Milan were dumped out of the Champions League by Arsenal last month and are sixth in Serie A, four points adrift of a European Cup spot for next season.

"Carletto is going very well," Berlusconi told Tuesday's Gazzetta dello Sport, referring to Ancelotti by his nickname. "You change in order to improve. For Milan who could I find better?" Ukraine striker Shevchenko had seven successful seasons at Milan before leaving for Chelsea in 2006 but he has struggled in English soccer.

Teammate Johan Micoud was given a two-match ban for "insulting comments" aimed at an assistant referee following the February 21 game, according to a statement on UEFA's website (www.uefa.com).

UEFA's disciplinary body also banned Bordeaux masseur Marc Venet from carrying out his functions for two European matches for tripping one of the assistant referees in the tunnel after the game.

Players from Gwangju Sangmu were sickened after eating a Korean dish of raw beef mixed with rice at a famous restaurant in their home city, an official from Korea's professional soccer league said by telephone on Tuesday.—MNA/Reuters

Nine-year-olds in US plotted to tie up, hurt teacher

ATLANTA, 2 April — Nine-year-olds at a school in the US state of Georgia brought a broken steak knife, handcuffs and electrical tape to school in a plot to injure their teacher, authorities said on Tuesday.

Teachers at Centre Elementary School in Waycross, Georgia, uncovered the plot on Friday when a pupil reported that a child in the third grade had brought a weapon into the school.

“The plan was to handcuff the teacher, put tape over her mouth and hit her over the head with the paperweight and possibly cut her,” said Lieutenant Duane Caswell of Waycross police, adding that some students said the knife was simply there to cut the tape.

Cambodian economy continues to grow rapidly

PHNOM PENH, 2 April — Cambodian economy continues to grow rapidly, while the GDP increased by almost 10 per cent in 2007, in line with the 2000-2006 average of 9.5 per cent, a Press release from the World Bank Resident Mission here said on Tuesday.

“Garment exports rose by almost eight per cent in 2007, while tourist arrivals jumped by nearly 20 per cent and construction activity doubled. With exports decelerating somewhat, GDP growth in 2007 was driven by consumption and investment,” said World Bank Country Economist Stephane Guibert.

“Economic prospects

for 2008 remain strong, although risks have increased substantially,” he added.

Indeed, he said, the slowdown of exports and the rapid growth of domestic demand have enlarged the trade deficit, and inflation also has picked up in recent months, adding to the government’s policy challenges.

Growth in developing East Asia will decline by around one to two percentage points to around 8.5 per cent in 2008 as a result of the unfolding financial turmoil in the United States and the resulting global slowdown, said the World Bank’s latest six-monthly review of the East Asia and Pacific region’s economies.—MNA/Xinhua

US truckers disrupt traffic to protest fuel prices

NEW YORK, 2 April — US truckers caused minor traffic snags in parts of the country on Tuesday to protest soaring costs for diesel, according to members of a major trucking association and law enforcement officials.

The mild disruptions from New Jersey to Chicago came in the midst of a week-long effort by independent truckers to get federal help easing the strain of high fuel prices through public protests or work stoppages.

“Our fuel costs have doubled over the past five years and the cost of doing business has doubled,” said one Florida-based driver. “Our industry is in ruins and the rest of the economy is going into a huge tailspin.”

On the New Jersey Turnpike, one of the most heavily traveled highways in the United States, hundreds of people took part in a protest at a service area and truckers reportedly were driving at slow speeds to back up traffic.

“There are some localized minor disruptions. We have taken enforcement actions which resulted in issuing summonses,” said Liertnant Gerald Lewis, a spokesman for the New Jersey State Police.

Six anti-Qaeda fighters killed in north of Baghdad

TIKRIT (Iraq), 2 April — Six fighters affiliated to anti-Qaeda Awakening Council groups were gunned down by unknown gunmen in Salahudin Province, a provincial police source said on Tuesday.

“Gunmen in a convoy of vehicles approached on Monday evening a checkpoint manned by local Awakening Council fighters in an area near the al-Tharthar Lake and opened fire, killing six fighters,” Colonel Hasan Ahmed from the provincial

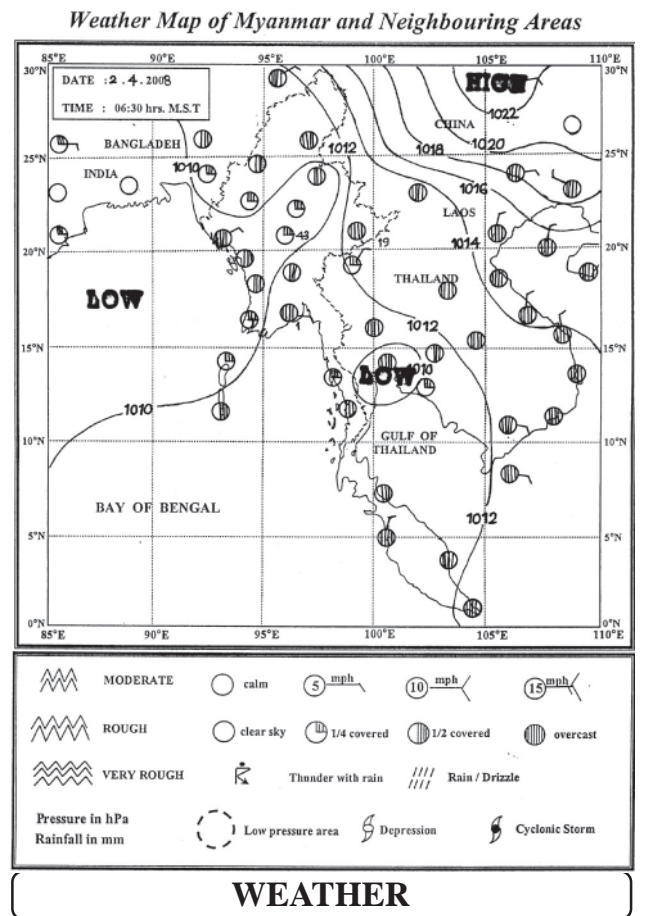
police command told Xinhua.

The gunmen were pretending as they were in a wedding procession in order to approach closer to the checkpoint, Ahmed said.

The area where the incident took place located

between Salahudin and Anbar provinces, which has long been a stronghold of the al-Qaeda in Iraq network despite many offensives launched by US and Iraqi security forces to clear the vast open area, he added.

The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Nay Pyi Taw (1.03) inches, Kyaukpadaung (2.34) inches, Kayan (1.89) inches, Namhsan (1.81) inches, Meikhtila (1.70) inches, Yamethin (1.62) inches Pyinmana (1.03) inches and Loikaw (0.95) inch.

Maximum temperature on 1-4-2008 was 87°F. Minimum temperature on 2-4-2008 was 72°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 2-4-2008 was 85%. Total sunshine hours on 1-4-2008 was (Nil).

Rainfall on 2-4-2008 was (0.08) inch at Mingaladon, (0.04) inch at Kaba-Aye and (0.28) inch at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2008 was (1.42) inches at Mingaladon, (1.54) inches at Kaba-Aye and (0.83) inch at Central Yangon.
