Obama's lead over Clinton widens again

WASHINGTON, 9 April—US Senator Barack Obama's lead over Senator Hillary Clinton in the race for the Democratic presidential nomination widened again, according to a new Gallup poll released Monday.

Obama led Clinton 52 per cent to 43 per cent and his lead has expanded to 9 percentage points from 3 percentage points in last

Gallup poll.

He has now led in 16 straight Gallup polls — by margins as much as 10 points and as little as one point. The latest results are based on surveys of 1,240 Democrats and voters who "lean" Democratic 4-6 April.

In another Gallup survey among 4,380 registered voters 2-6 April, Senator John

McCain, the Republican presumptive presidential nominee, remained tied with his two Democratic opponents.

McCain and Obama are deadlocked at 45 per cent each.

The hypothetical matchup of McCain vs. Clinton, are also unchanged, with McCain ahead 47 per cent to 45 per cent.

Mugabe urges safeguarding land from Whites

HARARE, 9 April—Zimbabwe President Robert Mugabe has said land must remain in the hands of indigenous people and urged Zimbabweans to safeguard it from the former colonizers, *The Herald* newspaper reported on Monday. His call comes in the wake of reports that some white former commercial farmers were trooping back

onto farms they once owned threatening to evict black beneficiaries, the newspaper said.

Mugabe made the plea at Nharira in Chikomba District, Mashonaland East Province, at the burial of the First Lady's uncle Junius Takaruza Marufu on Sunday.

Addressing mourners, Mugabe urged Zimbabweans to safeguard the

land, saying thousands of freedom fighters perished while others sustained permanent injuries during the liberation war fighting for the return of the land from Rhodesians.

Chief Enos Musarurwa, at the funeral, described land as a national heritage and urged Mugabe not to backtrack on the land reform programme.

"New York Times" reporter injured in Zimbabwe cell

HARARE, 9 April—A *New York Times* reporter has been badly injured while in detention in Zimbabwe and needed medical treatment, his lawyer said on Monday.

New York Times correspondent Barry Bearak and a British reporter were granted bail on Monday after being

charged with covering Zimbabwe's election without official accreditation.

"They were given bail of 300 million Zimbabwean dollars (7.50 US dollars) and the Briton was ordered to reside at the British Embassy and the American was ordered to stay at Dandaro Clinic

because he fell in the cells and sustained serious injuries, so he needs medical attention," lawyer Harrison Nkomo said. Police arrested the journalists at their hotel on Thursday night. Zimbabwean police were not immediately available for comment.

Australia faces youth homelessness crisis

CANBERRA, 9 April—Youth homelessness has doubled in the past 20 years and it will take at least 300 million Australian dollars (276 million US dollars) to fix the problem, The National Youth Commission's (NYC) Aus-

tralia's Homeless Youth report said Tuesday.

The report said the number of homeless teenagers aged 12 to 18 has doubled to 22,000 in the last two decades. In total at least 36,000 young people under 25 are

homeless on any given night. The problem is so severe that 50 per cent of young people seeking a bed in supported accommodation are turned away because services are full.

The commission held 21 separate hearings across the country and received 91 written submissions.

The report's release came almost 20 years after the last national inquiry into youth homelessness conducted by then Human Rights Commissioner Brian Burdekin in 1989, and the result showed the situation was getting worse.—MNA/Xinhua

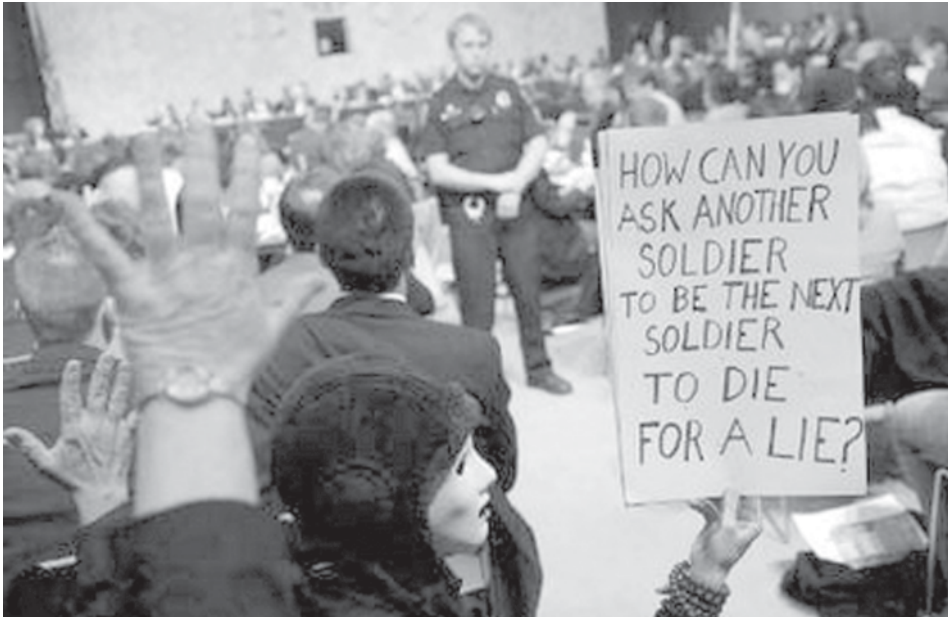
Two Polish soldiers wounded in Afghanistan

WARSAW, 9 April—Two Polish soldiers were injured on Monday when their Humvee vehicle hit a roadside bomb in the Ghazni Province of Afghanistan, Polish news agency *PAP* reported.

The life of wounded soldiers is not in danger, and their condition has been described as stable, *PAP* quoted spokesman for the Polish Armed Forces operational command Dariusz Kacperczak as saying.

The soldiers were transferred to a military hospital in Salerno, according to the spokesman. Poland's ISAF force currently numbers about 1,200 troops. Their number will go up to 1,600.—MNA/Xinhua

Iran says US requests new talks on Iraq security

TEHERAN, 8 April — Iran said on Monday it had received a request from the United States for a new round of talks on ways to improve security in Iraq and was considering it.

Easing a diplomatic freeze lasting almost three decades, Iranian and US officials met three times in Baghdad last year, but a planned fourth meeting has been repeatedly postponed.

The United States

accuses Iran of stoking violence in its neighbour by funding, training and equipping Iraqi militants. Iran denies this and blames the presence of US troops for the bloodshed.

“We have received a new request by American officials in a formal note for the holding of negotiations on the Iraqi developments and we are looking into the case,” Foreign Ministry spokesman Mohammad Ali Hosseini

told a news conference.

He said the US note had been delivered via the Swiss Embassy in Teheran, which handles US interests in the Islamic Republic.

The United States severed ties with Iran about a year after its 1979 Islamic Revolution.

US and Iraqi officials in Baghdad were not immediately available for comment.

EU to give Greece 90 mln euros for forest fires

BRUSSELS, 9 April — The European Union’s executive arm on Tuesday proposed giving nearly 90 million euros (142 million US dollars) in aid to help Greece cope with the damage from last year’s forest fires.

“I had the opportunity to see the horrific fire damage in Greece for myself, so I know the scale of the needs,” EU Regional Aid Commissioner Danuta Hübner said in a statement.

The fires caused major damage to basic infrastructure and the environment.

The aid still needs to be approved by EU governments and the European Parliament, but that is not expected to be a hurdle.—MNA/Reuters

Blast destroys house in Iraq’s Basra, eight killed

BASRA (Iraq), 8 April — An explosion destroyed a house in Iraq’s southern city of Basra overnight and Iraqi police said on Monday eight people had died.

Reuters television footage showed rescue workers pulling bodies from the rubble of a house that had been completely destroyed. Relatives wailed in grief and children picked through the rubble.

Neighbours said they believed the blast was caused by a US airstrike, but British forces, responsible for US and British military activity in the area, denied any role and said they had no explanation for the blast. “Coalition and Iraqi security forces were not involved in the incident,” they said in a statement.

Senior former Darfur rebel shot dead

KHARTOUM, 8 April — A senior former Darfur rebel was shot dead in his home in Darfur’s main town of el-Fasher, the movement’s head said on Sunday, declining to speculate who was behind the killing.

Suleiman Ishaq Korena, the secretary general of the north Darfur office of the Sudan Liberation Movement Peace faction, was killed late on Friday, SLM Peace Chairman Ibrahim Madibu told Reuters.

The SLM Peace faction is one of half a dozen splinter groups that signed onto a 2006 Darfur peace deal, gave up rebel activities and set up offices in Khartoum.—MNA/Reuters

Authorities impose one-day curfew on Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 9 April — Iraqi authorities have imposed a one-day curfew on Baghdad for Wednesday, an official in the Baghdad operations command for Iraqi security forces said.

The official said cars and motorcycles would be banned from the streets of the Iraqi capital between 5:00 am and midnight (0200-2100 GMT) on Wednesday.

Wednesday is the fifth anniversary of the fall of Baghdad to

US forces, and followers of Shiite cleric Moqtada al-Sadr had announced mass anti-American demonstrations. But Sadr called off the planned protest earlier on Tuesday for security reasons.

Sadr’s Mehdi Army militia has been clashing with US and Iraqi forces in Sadr City, a vast eastern Baghdad slum, for the past three days after fighting late last month in Baghdad and the Shiite south.

McCain says Democrats make “reckless” Iraq promises

KANSAS CITY (Missouri), 8 April — Republican presidential candidate John McCain charged his Democratic rivals on Monday with making “reckless” promises they cannot keep by pledging speedy US troop withdrawals from Iraq.

McCain kicked off a week in which the war returns to centre stage in Washington and on the US presidential campaign, with the top American commander in Iraq, General David Petraeus, to give congressional testimony on Tuesday.

“I do not believe that anyone should make promises as a candidate for president that they cannot keep if elected,” McCain said to applause in a speech to a Veterans of Foreign Wars convention.

Arizona Senator McCain and his Democratic rivals, Illinois Senator Barack Obama and New York Senator Hillary Clinton, are all scheduled to be on Capitol Hill for the Petraeus testimony, and they are far apart on a war that has cost more than 4,000 American lives.

Worldwide financial turbulence losses could reach \$945b

WASHINGTON, 9 April — Worldwide losses following the recent financial turbulence triggered by the collapse of the US subprime mortgage market could reach 945 billion US dollars, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said on Tuesday. “The global financial system has undoubtedly come under increasing strains since

October 2007, and risks to financial stability remain elevated,” the IMF warned in its latest Global Financial Stability Report (GFSR) on Tuesday.

“The crisis is spreading beyond the US subprime market — namely to the prime residential and commercial real estate markets, consumer credit, and the low to high grade corporate credit markets,”

said the report.

The US remains the epicentre of the losses, and financial institutions in other countries have also been affected, reflecting the same overly benign global financial conditions and weaknesses in risk management systems and prudential supervision to varying degrees in the financial system.

Vietnam to cut fishing boats in 2010

HANOI, 8 April— Vietnam has planned to reduce the number of fishing boats in its 28 coastal provinces to 50,000 in 2010 from current 95,600, in a move to guarantee its stable seafood development, local newspaper *Vietnam Investment Review*

reported Monday.

Under a 2010 seafood development master plan, the country is also expected to halve the number of people directly engaged in fishing activities to 500,000 in 2010.

Small boats that could not go offshore would be

removed, while large vessels would be improved and retained.

The number of boats to remain dock-site has yet to be determined.

Vietnam's inshore seafood sources are in danger of exhaustion, partly due to an increase of fishing boats to 95,600 currently from 88,000 in 2001.

However, fishing fleets have failed to be expanded in offshore areas.

the United States has complied with previous rulings in a dumping case, according to the agenda for the next meeting of the WTO Dispute Settlement Body on 18 April, issued on Tuesday.

Japan had previously sought authority to impose up to 250 million US dollars a year in extra tariffs on American goods to retaliate against the US method of setting duties on imports Washington says are dumped — unfairly sold more

cheaply than at home. The case turns on a method of calculating anti-dumping duties known as zeroing, which is used by Washington but rejected by the rest of the WTO's 151 members. Critics say zeroing results in duties higher than necessary.

The case was referred to WTO arbitration in January because Washington objected to the level of sanctions sought by Japan.

Greece, Cyprus to further strengthen economic ties

ATHENS, 9 April—Greece and Cyprus agreed to further strengthen their economic and trade ties, Greek Economy and Finance Minister George Alogoskoufis said here Monday.

“We have many common points, and both economies are founded on extroversion,” Alogoskoufis said after meeting with visiting Cyprus Finance Minister Charilaos Stavarakis.

Australia releases 35 offshore areas for oil exploration

CANBERRA, 8 April — The Australian Government has put 35 offshore areas for grabs for petroleum exploration, Resources Minister Martin Ferguson announced on Monday.

The released commonwealth areas are located across five basins off the Northern Territory, Western Australia, and the Territory of Ashmore and Cartier Islands coastlines.

“The Australian Government is committed to intensifying the mineral, oil and gas exploration effort and the development of new exploration

science and technology,” the minister said in a statement.

He said the announcement was a key part of the government's strategy to encourage investment in

petroleum exploration.

Bids for 17 of the new areas close on 9 October, 2008, with the remaining 18 areas closing on 9 April, 2009.

London to give Tower Bridge an \$8m paint job

LONDON, 8 April—Tower Bridge, the picturesque span over the River Thames in London, is to get a facelift, an eight-million-US-dollar project that will take four years to complete.

The 114-year-old bridge, whose middle section can be raised to let tall ships pass up and down the river, will be repainted its traditional blue and white, a task that will require 44,000 man hours and 22,000 litres of paint.—MNA/Reuters

Six nations to renew talks on Iran's nuclear issue

WASHINGTON, 8 April— Officials from the United States, Britain, China, France, Russia and Germany are due to meet later this month in a bid to renew their efforts to make Iran halt its sensitive nuclear work, the State Department said on

Monday.

"I can only narrow it down to mid-April. We're going to wait, we're going to let our hosts announce the meeting," State Department spokesman Sean McCormack said.

The spokesman did not

offer more details of the meeting, including who will host the talks.

Daniel Fried, acting undersecretary of state for political affairs, is to attend the scheduled talks, according to the spokesman.

China, New Zealand sign FTA pact

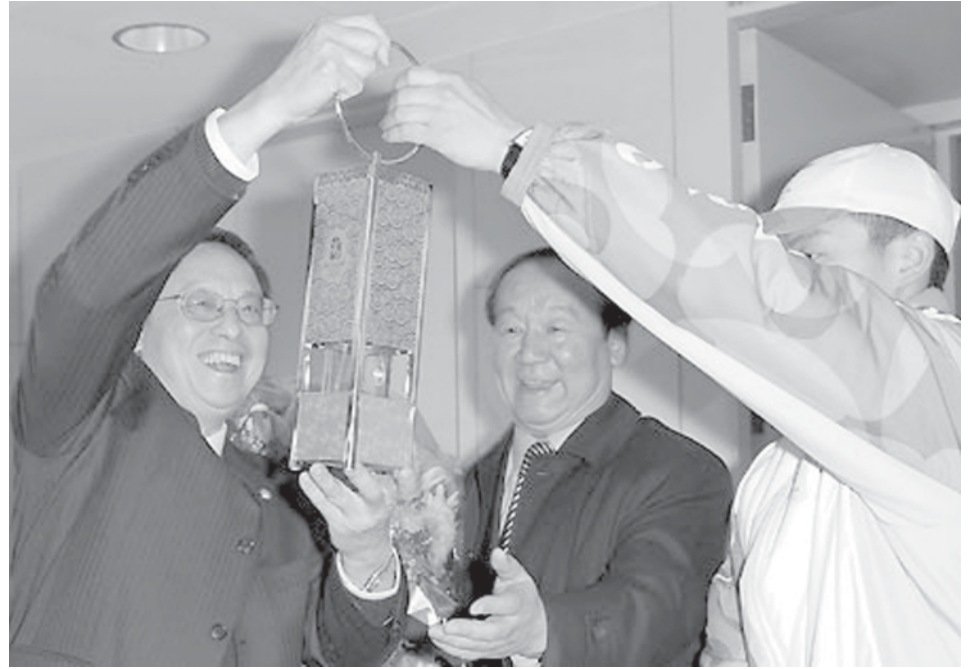
BEIJING, 8 April— China and New Zealand signed a free trade agreement, the first such pact between China and a developed country, on Monday. The deal was inked by Chinese Commerce Minister Chen Deming and New Zealand Trade Minister Phil Goff. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and his New Zealand counterpart

Helen Clark attended the signing ceremony after over-one-hour bilateral talks. The signing and implementation of the agreement will "further the friendly and cooperative relations between the two countries, promote each's economic growth, and bring practical benefits to the two peoples," Wen said at the beginning of the talks.

Wen described the day of the signing as "a day of historical significance" and said the move "met the goal" the two countries set during negotiations.

China and New Zealand formally launched the free trade negotiations in December 2004 and concluded the talks in December 2007 following 15 rounds of negotiations.

Mubarak meets Seniora on Lebanese political crisis

CAIRO, 8 April—Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak on Sunday held talks with visiting Lebanese Prime Minister Fouad Seniora on the latest developments in Lebanon, the official MENA news agency reported. Following talks with Mubarak, Seniora said it was natural to come to Egypt and consult with Mubarak when Lebanon is in a critical stage. Seniora said Lebanon believes in the

need to move forward with the presidential election process, voicing his hope to reach an agreement on a three-point Arab initiative to help resolve the Lebanese political crisis.

Lebanon is currently facing the most serious political deadlock since the end of the 1975-1990 civil war. For the first time in its history, the President's seat has been vacant since former Lebanese President Emile Lahoud stepped

down last November. A long-awaited parliamentary session to elect a new president to succeed Lahoud has been postponed for 17 times till 22 April.

Commenting on the absence of Lebanon from the just ended 20th Arab Summit in Damascus, Seniora said his country was sending a loud message to the Arab world to try to end differences and improve Lebanon's relations with Syria.—Xinhua

Iran would be destroyed if it attacks Israel

JERUSALEM, 9 April—Israeli Infrastructure Minister Benjamin Ben-Eliezer said Monday that any Iranian attack on Israel would lead to "the destruction of Iran".

The former defence minister made the remarks during a visit to the Infrastructure Ministry war room, which is being prepared as part of the ongoing five-day nation-wide civil defence drill.

"An Iranian attack will prompt a severe reaction from Israel, which will destroy the Iranian nation," he was quoted by local daily *The Jerusalem Post* as saying, adding Iran "is definitely aware of our strength".

Israeli-Iranian relations remain tense as the Jewish state has vowed to prevent Iran from having nuclear weapons while top officials of the Islamic state have repeatedly made remarks against Israel.

Cambodia weeds out marijuana plantation

PHNOM PENH, 9 April— The National Authority for Combating Drugs (NACD) of Cambodia has announced it has completely stubbed out marijuana plantations in the kingdom, local media reported on

Tuesday. "We have gained victory in rooting out marijuana, but what we are worrying about is the trafficking of synthesized drugs secretly produced in the country," NACD Secretary-General Lou

Ramin was quoted by the *Mekong Times* newspaper as saying.

"This is the first successful step in reducing drug trafficking in Cambodia, but we are not satisfied with the results as drug trafficking persists," he said.

In addition, Lou Ramin said that Cambodia's former reputation as a narcotics Mecca is beginning to change.

"We formerly suffered from accusations that our country is both a marijuana producer and a big marijuana exporter," he said, claiming that "marijuana is no longer available in Cambodia".

Vietnam to see strong growth in ‘IT’ industry by 2011

HANOI, 9 April — Vietnamese Government and corporate officials said Tuesday that the country would see strong growth in information technology (IT), telecommunications and electronics from now to 2011.

Both foreign-invested and domestic enterprises in Vietnam will turn out more items using

integrated technologies such as computers, mobile phones and cameras in the coming years, while the country’s digital content industry will thrive, Tran Duc Lai, Deputy Minister of Information and Communications, said at an international consumer electronics export and conference opening in Hanoi capital on Tuesday.

At the four-day event

organized by the International Data Group and Vietnam’s Hanoi Information and Communication Technology Association, Nguyen Lam, country director of International Data Company (IDC) in Vietnam, said that according to the company’s prediction, Vietnam’s IT market will experience annual average growth of 11.4 per cent in the 2007-2011 period, surging to 2.1 billion US dollars in 2011 from over 1.5 billion dollars in 2007.

Australian teen surfer dies in shark attack

CANBERRA, 9 April — An Australian teenager was killed in a shark attack on Tuesday while surfing in what lifeguards said were dangerous morning conditions, prompting authorities to close several beaches.

The 16-year-old boy was surfing with a friend at Ballina, on the north coast of New South Wales State, when the shark bit his upper leg and body. The other boy told police he saw a dark shape, then the water filled with blood.

“One of the boys indicated that he was in trouble to his mate. His mate went over to help and found that he had been attacked,” said Surf Life Saving NSW spokesman Craig Roberts.

“He was unconscious and the lifeguards and ambulance officers had some severe haemorrhage to deal with,” Roberts said. “Unfortunately the boy died due to his injuries.”

Local lifesaver Stephen Leahy said the attack occurred 50 metres (164 feet) from Lighthouse Beach around 8.30 a.m. (2230 GMT) and followed a day of heavy rain, which had reduced visibility.

UN convoy ambushed in northeastern Somalia

NAIROBI, 9 April — The UN refugee agency said Tuesday it is shocked by an ambush over the weekend of its convoy in northeastern Somali region of Puntland.

In a statement, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) said two staff members escaped unscathed after their vehicle was ambushed by a group of armed militiamen who blocked the way with a car in the town of Garowe, in the northeastern Somali region of Puntland.

“More than 20 bullets holes were counted in the UNHCR vehicle, which

was carrying an international staff member and the UNHCR local driver. Both remain deeply shocked,” the statement said.

The UNHCR said its driver managed to reverse his vehicle and drove away from the scene under heavy gunfire.

“The Special Police Unit (SPU) which was escorting the UNHCR vehicle later managed to arrest four suspects and recovered three AK-47 rifles. One SPU officer was shot in the leg and is presently under medical care,” the statement said.

Bulgarian Mafia author shot in head

SOFIA, 9 April — An author of books on the Bulgarian Mafia was shot in the head in Sofia on Monday, police said, the latest gangland attack in the Balkan country.

The shooting happened just hours after the head of an energy company that repairs Bulgaria’s only nuclear power plant and other big energy utilities, was shot dead in Sofia on Sunday.

The Socialist-led government is under growing pressure from the European Union and at home to stop procrastinating and get serious about fighting rampant crime and graft. There have been more than 150 gangland assassina-

tions since 2001. But despite its campaign against crime and graft, Bulgaria has failed to convict a single suspect, nor has it charged any senior officials with graft.

Bulgarian Georgi Stoev, 35, the author of a series of books on the emergence of Bulgaria’s underworld after Communism collapsed in 1989, was shot once in the head in front of a hotel in central Sofia, police said.

Doctors said he was in a critical condition.

On Sunday, police found Borislav Georgiev, the manager of Atomenergoremont, shot twice in the head in the entrance of his apartment block. The energy

company is majority owned by a businessman, who local media say has links to crime groups.

Activities of certain foreign embassies to interfere in Myanmar's internal affairs violate Vienna Convention and international laws

People who favour State stability desire the embassies stop such activities

NAY PYI TAW, 9 April—Certain foreign powers, with the intention of interfering in the internal affairs of Myanmar, are now resorting to a variety of means, while aiding and abetting some local political parties to destabilize the country.

According to the information, some diplomats of certain foreign embassies in Yangon regularly visit NLD (HQ), hold talks and give directives to harm the interests of the nation and the people. And they visited the office 19 times in March 2008, and 277 times from March 2007 to March 2008.

It is learnt that National Interest Group was formed on 29 March in Bangladesh with the aim of dealing with anti-government movements launched by foreign diplomats in the nation; and that the chairman of the Bangladeshi non-governmental political, social and

economic advisory board said at the press conference held on 29 March that the diplomats of some foreign powers were violating Article 41 on 1961 diplomatic relations of Vienna Convention and they should stop all those activities immediately. Article 41 of Vienna Convention says that foreign diplomats have a duty not to interfere in the internal affairs of the receiving State, and the premises of the mission must not be used in any manner incompatible with the functions of the mission as laid down in the present Convention.

It is learnt that in Myanmar, the people who favour stability of the State desire that the activities of certain foreign embassies to interfere in the internal affairs of the nation violate the Vienna Convention and international laws, so, the embassies should stop such activities.—MNA

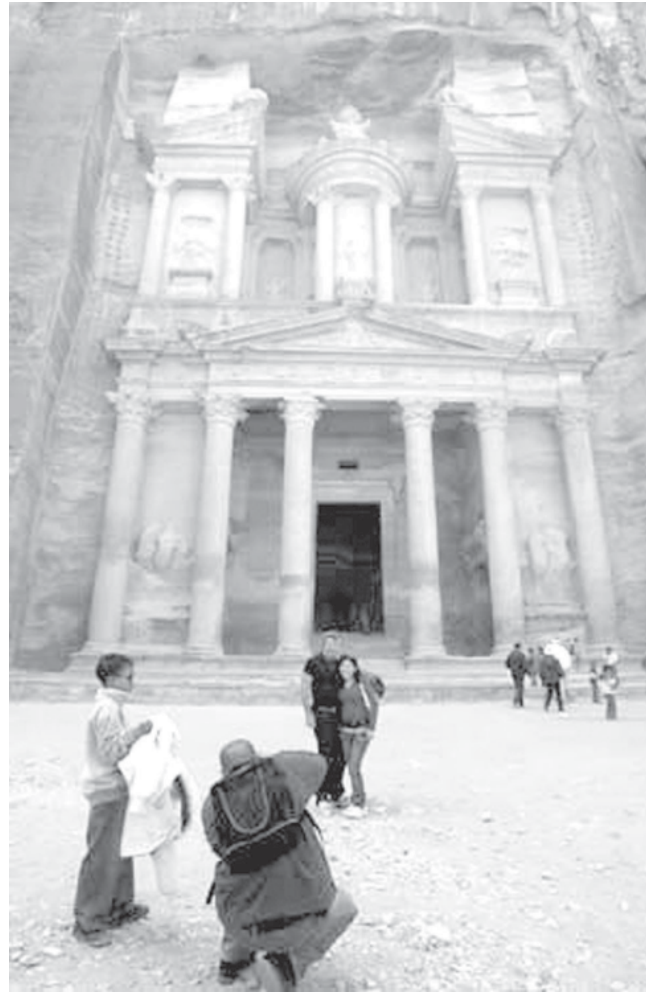

**Canada warns of health
problems due to climate change**

OTTAWA, 8 April — Canadian doctors on Monday urged the medical community to prepare for new health problems caused by climate change.

Climate change will lead to health problems unseen before, and Canadian doctors need to become experts in these new diseases, the Ontario College of Family Physicians said in a report.

Even a small rise in temperatures could have a "profound effect" on infants and children, the elderly and people with pre-existing diseases, the report said, adding that such problems as heat stroke and respiratory ailments are going to be common.

Malaria and dengue fever are now appearing in more areas in the world. Canadians visiting those areas are at risk of coming home sick, which requires Canadian doctors to get necessary skills in dealing with the disease.

College president, Dr Renee Arnold, also warned that the negative health effects of climate change will be irreversible "if we don't get our act together now and stop damaging our environment".

Diana unlawfully killed, inquest rules

LONDON, 8 April — Princess Diana and her lover Dodi al-Fayed were unlawfully killed by the grossly negligent driving of chauffeur Henri Paul and paparazzi photographers pursuing their limousine into a Paris road tunnel in 1997. The jury, which had spent almost six months listening to more than 250 witnesses from around the

world, reached their decision on Monday after deliberating for four days. The presiding judge, Lord Justice Scott Baker, had specifically instructed them to reject conspiracy theories that the accident was staged. The inquest, estimated to have cost up to 20 million US dollars, stretched around the globe with witnesses heard by

video link from France, the United States, Nigeria, Kenya and Australia.

Dodi's father, luxury storeowner Mohamed al-Fayed, charged that his son and Diana were killed by British security services on the orders of Prince Philip, Queen Elizabeth's husband and Diana's former father-in-law.

**Study says
treatment
reverses
blood
disorder in
mice**

CHICAGO, 8 April — An experimental treatment in mice showed promise in reversing a rare blood disease that can cause leukaemia, US researchers said on Monday, offering a glimpse of how the drug may work as it begins testing in humans.

In experiments at Harvard Medical School in Boston and the University of California, San Diego, researchers found the compound blocked a genetic mutation that causes three kinds of leukaemias.

The studies tested a compound supplied by privately held biotechnology company TargeGen in San Francisco, which has just begun early testing in humans.

It targets a genetic mutation in the JAK2 gene that causes most cases of the leukaemias polycythemia vera, essential thrombocytosis and primary myelofibrosis, which affect up to 100,000 people in the United States.

The mutation in the JAK2 gene causes an overproduction of blood cells. The TargeGen compound TG101348 is designed to block the JAK2 mutation that causes this.—MNA/Reuters

**Cement truck crashes into
China park, kills eight**

BEIJING, 9 April — A loaded cement truck lost control on a mountain road in central China, crashed through the gate of a park and ran down more than 20 people, killing eight, a newspaper said on Tuesday.

The accident happened on Saturday in Nanyang, Henan Province, during a long weekend after the country introduced its Tomb-Sweeping Day holiday on Friday. Many of the victims were students.

"Get out of the way!," the *Beijing News*, quoting witnesses, said the driver was shouting out the window when he realised his brakes had failed.

More than 20 people were knocked down and five cars were damaged. Ten people were injured.

Several college students, who were to have spent the weekend climbing, were among the dead, the newspaper said. —MNA/Reuters

Ronaldo eyes Flamengo stint before AC Milan return

MILAN, 9 April — Brazilian forward Ronaldo may use a stint at Flamengo to boost his fitness before returning to Italian side AC Milan.

The three-times World Player of the Year was linked to a permanent move to the Rio de Janeiro club he supported as a child before suffering a career-threatening knee injury in February.

“I have a beautiful relationship with my team (Milan), the doors will always be open for me there, but I have to be up to it,” Ronaldo told Tuesday’s *La Gazzetta dello Sport*. “The idea is to play in Brazil for a few months, maybe at Flamengo, and if everything goes well, reappear in red and black (of Milan).”

Milan have said they will support Ronaldo through the recovery process, which is expected to take at least seven more months. However, the Serie A side have yet to commit to a renewal of the player’s contract, which expires at the end of the season.

Ronaldo said he had a “huge desire” to return to soccer and that he could not imagine life without it.

“There is still a long way to go. Perhaps it’ll be four months before I can start running, but the recovery will be quicker than last time,” he added. —MNA/Reuters

Babel backs ref’s decision

LONDON, 9 April — Ryan Babel is convinced the referee made the right decision in awarding a penalty in Liverpool’s 4-2 win over Arsenal.

A pulsating second leg of the UEFA Champions League quarter-final had turned in Arsenal’s favour after Emmanuel

Adebayor had made it 2-2 on the night. But a minute later, Liverpool were given a spot-kick after Babel was brought down by Kolo Toure, with Steven Gerrard converting from 12 yards.

Toure and Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger were unhappy with the de-

cision, but Babel, who completed the scoring in injury-time, felt Swedish official Peter Frojdfeldt was correct.

“Yes, of course, I think so,” Babel told *Sky Sports News* when asked if he thought it was a penalty.

Pizarro denies indiscipline, criticizes Peru federation

LIMA, 9 April — Peru striker Claudio Pizarro, banned playing for his country for 18 months for alleged indiscipline, said Tuesday that he was innocent and accused the country’s federation of bad management.

“I want the truth to see the light of day and I want to prove that I’m innocent,” the Chelsea player told RPP radio.

“I want the public to realise that I haven’t committed any breach of discipline, above all, to be aware of the bad management of this football federation.”

Pizarro has been suspended along with fellow strikers Jefferson Farfan and Andres Mendoza and defender Santiago Acasiete following alleged incidents at the team hotel in November after World Cup qualifier against Brazil.

The bans were handed out last month but back-dated to November. The Peruvian federation has said that it’s case was based on evidence provided by a television station and hotel employees.

Similar strikes could also take place at other Portuguese clubs that are struggling to meet their financial obligations to players, the head of the Professional Soccer Player’s Union Joaquim Evangelista said.

“Boavista players unanimously decided to formalise a strike if the players do not receive their pay cheques by Friday,” he told reporters. —MNA/Reuters

Liverpool, Chelsea through to semifinals

LIVERPOOL (England), 9 April — Liverpool beat Arsenal 4-2 in a classic Champions League battle at Anfield on Tuesday to clinch their quarterfinal tie 5-3 on aggregate and reach the semifinals for the third time in four seasons.

Their opponents at the end of the month will again be Chelsea who they defeated at the same stage in 2005 and last season.

In a match that will rank as one of the best played in European competition, Liverpool came back from the dead after Arsenal appeared to have clinched the tie on away goals with only six minutes to play.

But Liverpool’s indefatigable belief in themselves on European nights at Anfield saw them turn the tie with Steven Gerrard smash-

ing home an 85th minute penalty and substitute Ryan Babel wrapping up a memorable win with a stoppage time goal.

Arsenal, who were superb for the opening half hour playing football worthy of European champions, took the lead through Abou Diaby after 13 minutes.

Liverpool fought back with a header from Sami Hyypia on the half hour and a stunning shot on the turn from Fernando Torres in the 69th minute to take a 2-1 lead on the night and 3-2 on aggregate.

A breakaway by substitute Theo Walcott which saw him skate past four Liverpool players six minutes from time set up Emmanuel Adebayor to make the score 2-2 — 3-3 on aggregate and Arsenal ahead on away goals. —MNA/Reuters

Adebayor: We can win title

LONDON, 9 April — Emmanuel Adebayor admits that he has already turned his focus to Sunday’s Premier League showdown with Manchester United.

The Arsenal striker was part of the Gunners side which crashed out of the UEFA Champions League against Liverpool on Tuesday night.

European glory had appeared to represent Arsenal’s best opportunity of picking up some silverware this season, but victory at Old Trafford this weekend could keep their push for domestic success on track.

Maximum points in Manchester would see the Gunners move to within three points of the Red Devils at the top of the table, and Adebayor is well aware that the weekend encounter has now become a must-win fixture for Arsene Wenger’s men. —INTERNET

Thunderstorm kills eight in central China

WUHAN, 9 April— Eight people died and at least 66 were injured by a thunderstorm that hit central China's Hubei Province on Tuesday. Strong wind, heavy rain and hail affected 350,000 people in 10 counties of Dangyang City from Monday night,

according to a source with the provincial government. About 70 per cent of Dangyang residents faced power failure after the grid was badly damaged. The extreme weather left eight dead in their collapsed homes, and forced the evacuation of 8,327.

The disaster caused 210 million yuan (25.9 million US dollars) in losses, with 10,850 houses and 22,666 hectares of crops damaged. It destroyed 41 transformers, 162 electrical wiring standards and broke 76 wires, among others. The local grid suffered 5.8 million yuan in losses. More than 100 emergency workers were summoned from other areas of Hubei to repair the Dangyang grid. Local residents were expected to have power as early as Wednesday evening.

The Conservative Party have risen two percentage points since a month ago to 39 percent while the Labour Party and Liberal Democrats has slipped down several points each, according to the poll.

The proportion regarding Labour Party as competent and capable has fallen to 37 per cent from 56 per cent since last September while the Conservative rating has risen to 45 per cent from 39 per cent.— MNA/Xinhua

Train derailment forces evacuation in Canada

OTTAWA, 9 April — Residents in a community in central Canada were forced to evacuate Monday following a crash involving three trains, some of which carrying dangerous goods, reports reaching here said.

No one was injured in the accident that happened near the farming community of Ralph, about 150 kilometres southeast of provincial capital Regina in the province of Saskatchewan.

British PM hits record low in leadership rating

LONDON, 9 April — British Prime Minister Gordon Brown's leadership rating has fallen to a record low, a poll carried out for *The Times* revealed on Tuesday.

The Prime Minister has presided over a sharp fall in confidence in the economy as he enters a crucial three weeks of campaigning for the London and local elections. The Populus poll

interviewed a random sample of 1,502 adults aged over 18 by telephone on 4-6 April. Interviews were conducted across the country and the results have been weighted to be representative of all adults.

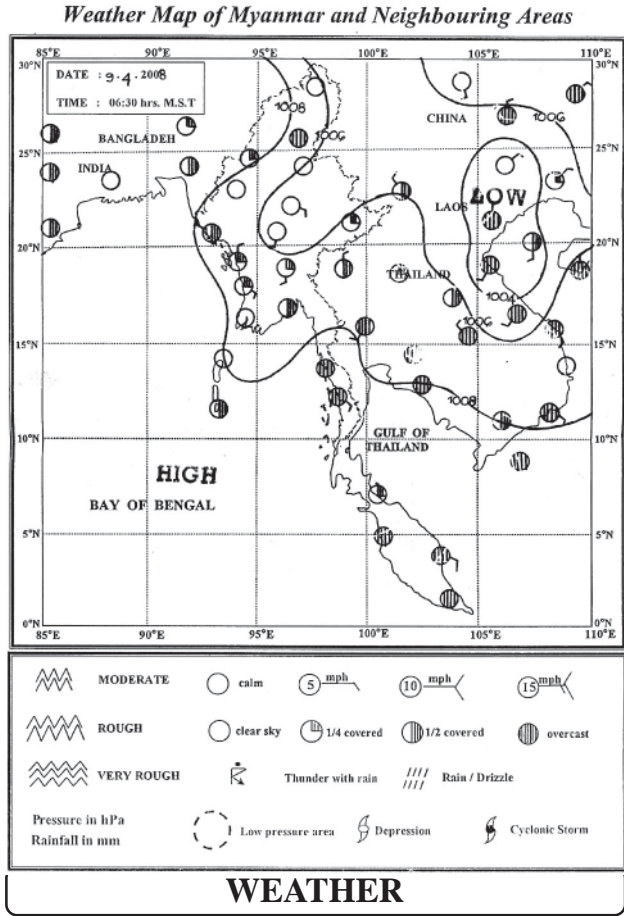
Floods leave 36 dead, 130,000 homeless in N-E Brazil

BRASILIA, 9 April — Floods triggered by downpours over the past weeks in northeastern Brazil have killed at least 36 people and forced about 130,000 to leave their homes, reports here said Monday.

The federal government will release 613 million reals (about 317 million US dollars) in emergency funding to relieve the victims, Minister of National Integration Geddel Vieira Lima told reporters Monday in Brasilia.

The federal government is considering extending agricultural insurance cover to protect farmers who have suffered losses, added the minister.

Seven states in northeastern Brazil have been severely hit by the floods. In the state of Paraiba, there have been 17 people reportedly dead and some 14,000 homeless. While in Piaui state, four people were killed and 57,000 have abandoned their homes.—MNA/Xinhua

Rainfall on 9-4-2008 was (Nil) at Mingaladon, Kaba-Aye and Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2008 was (1.69) inches at Mingaladon, (1.85) inches at Kaba-Aye and (0.83) inch at Central Yangon. Maximum wind speed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (6) mph from South at (14:30) hours MST on 8-4-2008.

Bay inference: Weather is generally fair in the East Central Bay and partly cloudy in the Andaman Sea and elsewhere in the Bay of Bengal.

Forecast valid until evening of 10-4-2008: Isolated rain or thundershowers are likely in Kachin, Mon States, Yangon and Taninthayi Divisions and weather will be partly cloudy in Chin, Rakhine, Shan, Kayin and Kayah States, upper Sagaing and Ayeyawady Divisions and generally fair in the remaining areas.
