### New dams for extended cultivation of summer paddy and other crops

The government is building irrigation facilities wherever necessary to ensure water supply for agricultural purpose.

Dams and reservoirs were mainly built in such arid zones as Sagaing, Magway and Mandalay Divisions along with the implementation of underground water tapping projects, embankments and canals. Therefore, efforts are to be made for extended cultivation of paddy, cotton, sugarcane, pulses and beans and edible oil crops.

**Taukpyo Dam built on Taukpyo Creek in Nay Pyi Taw Pinyinana Township was opened on 27 April. The dam is the 210th of its kind in the nation and the 27th one in the area of Nay Pyi Taw.**

The irrigation facility is of earthen type with the water storage capacity of 2,500 acre feet. As it will benefit altogether 300 acres of farmland, local farmers in the region will be able to engage in extended cultivation of summer paddy and other crops.

As the government built a cluster of dams and reservoirs as well as sluice gates and canals throughout the nation the irrigated sown acreage has increased, thereby contributing to increased production of crops. As a result, the living standard of farmers has improved as their income increased.

At present, there are over 28 million net sown acreage in the nation. Of them, over 5 million are irrigated land. Making better use of irrigation water, it is sure that farmers and local people will be able to engage in extended cultivation of paddy and other crops while striving for perpetual existence of dams and reservoirs and greening of the catchment areas.

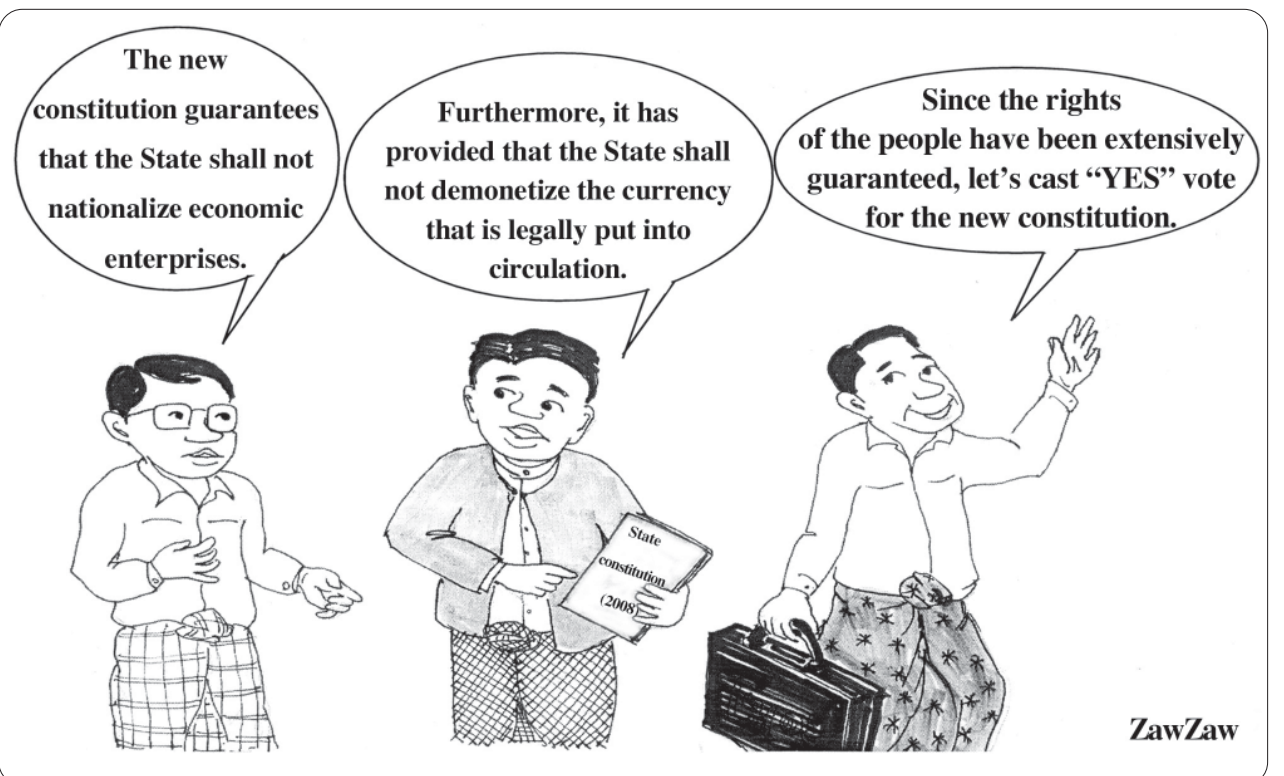
### Billboards erected in Toungoo to hail Referendum

## China, Pakistan discuss cooperation expansion

ISLAMABAD, 28 April—The visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Yang Jiechi and his Pakistani counterpart held a meeting here on Friday and discussed possibilities to expand cooperation between the two countries.

At a news briefing held after their meeting in the foreign office, Pakistani Foreign Minister Makhdoom Shah Mahmood Qureshi said the two sides discussed a host of issues

including possibilities to expand the bilateral cooperation in various fields.

Qureshi said that the relations between Pakistan and China were time-tested and had many sound foundations.

Yang said that China would provide Pakistan 70 million RMB (around one million US dollars) as technical and economic assistance and 500,000 RMB (around 71,429 US dollars) for equipment for the Foreign Office of Pakistan. Yang said that China and Pakistan enjoyed all-weather and time-tested relations and pledged to push the bilateral relations forward.

Terming Pakistani President Pervez Musharraf's recent visit to China a success, Yang said the two countries agreed to increase their level of contacts and exchange of visits. —MNA/Xinhua

## Afghan ceremony gunfire death toll rises to four

KABUL, 28 April—The death toll in the gunfire and explosions which rocked a celebration gathering in Kabul marking the 16th anniversary of Afghan nation Sunday morning rose to four, officials and TV reports said.

Besides a tribal group chief and a 10-year-old boy, who were killed as stated in an earlier presidential office statement, one of the two injured parliamentarians and one soldier were confirmed dead, according to local TV reports and a Defence Ministry spokesman.

Militants fired gunshots and rockets on a high-profile function featuring a parade, which was attended by Afghan President Hamid Karzai and several hundred officials, foreign

diplomats and local notables.

Explosion and gunfire erupted suddenly at around 9:45 am local time just as all the attendants were standing, listening to the national anthem during which there were celebration cannon

firing.

Karzai, who had sit in the middle on the stage opposite the buildings where the attacking shots came from and was thought to be the target, left the scene safe under protection of guards.

## Moscow criticizes suspension of food supplies to Gaza

Moscow, 28 April—The Russian Foreign Ministry criticized the suspension of food supplies to Palestinian refugees on Friday, saying it may lead to famine and more tension. "The termination of supplies is

fraught with the threat of hunger and a sharp rise in internal tension. Moscow believes that such actions, which may be regarded as collective punishment of the civilian population, must be avoided," Boris

Malakhov, deputy spokesman for the ministry, told the Press.

"We are seriously concerned over the humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip," Malakhov said, adding that the food supplies are a matter of life or death for most people in the Gaza Strip.

The United Nations Works and Relief Agency stopped deliveries to 650,000 Palestinian refugees Thursday due to fuel shortages after Israel imposed an embargo on the Palestinian enclave. The mission needs 7,000 litres of fuel per day to carry out its operations.

## Dozens missing after apartment fire in US

WASHINGTON, 28 April—Dozens of people are reported to be missing following a large fire which devastated an apartment complex in the US state of Connecticut early Saturday morning.

As yet there are no reports of deaths or injuries. Fire Chief Ken Scandariato of Norwich, where the 12-building apartment complex is located, said the fire alarm was registered at 1:30 am. So far 105 of the

estimated 150 residents have been relocated.

As for the dozens people unaccounted for, some might have turned to friends or relatives, but the possibility that some tenants may not have escaped could not be ruled out, he added.—MNA/Xinhua

## NATO soldier killed, four wounded in S Afghanistan

KABUL, 28 April—One soldier serving the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) was killed and four soldiers were wounded in an engagement with in-

surgents during a patrol in southern Afghanistan Sunday, an ISAF statement issued here Monday said.

Without elaborating, it said the wounded soldiers were transported to an ISAF hospital to receive treatment. The ISAF did not release the casualty's nationality, quoting a policy. "Next of kin have been notified," it added.

A total of 47,000 troops contributed by 40 nations are deployed in Afghanistan to help with stabilization and reconstruction under the flag of NATO-led ISAF with an UN mandate.—Internet

**Britain's Labour traces behind Conservatives in new poll**

LONDON, 28 April — Britain's ruling Labour Party traced behind the Conservatives by 10 per cent in a new poll released on Sunday.

Published on the eve of local elections in England and Wales, the ICM survey put the Tories at 39 per cent, Labour at 29 per cent and the Liberal Democratic

at 20 per cent after polling over 1,000 adults by telephone, The *Sunday Telegraph* reported.

The survey showed that for the first time in a generation voters wish the Conservatives to win the next election. Some 44 per cent of respondents think the Tories will win more seats in the Parliament,

compared with 35 per cent who favour the Labour.

Analysts said if the poll is repeated at a general election, the Labour Party would be in a minority at the Commons.

A total of 63 per cent of those polled think Labour has done too little to reduce the gap between the rich and poor, while 23 per cent feel the government has got it "about right" and 8 per cent say too much has been done.

It is estimated that the local elections on Thursday could see Labour lose as many as 200 council seats across the country, as well as control of London, if Boris Johnson, the Tory candidate for the Mayor of London, beats the incumbent Ken Livingstone.—Xinhua

**UK's private school fees rise to double inflation rate**

LONDON, 28 April — Private school fees in Britain will rise by over 5 per cent, or more than double the rate of inflation, this fall, *The Sunday Telegraph* reported.

A survey of 50 schools by *Sunday Telegraph* indicates that the average rise in private school fees will be 5.6 per cent, while fees at one-fourth of these schools will rise by at least 7.5 per cent.

Many parents will have to pay an extra 1,000 pounds (1,986 US dollars) for each child's education this year, according to the survey.

Parents with children at Garden House, a junior school in west London, will have to pay 15,552 pounds (30,792 dollars), or 1,150 pounds (2,277 dollars) more than in September 2007 for a school year.

The number of families receiving assistance toward the cost of fees was a record high in 2007 and is expected to rise again this year, as the fee hike comes along with rising household bills, fuel prices and mortgage costs in the wake of credit crunch, said the report.

The Headmasters and Headmistresses Conference, which represents leading schools, cited fee rises as driven by unavoidable costs such as teachers' salaries and pensions.—Xinhua

**Hamas urges Abbas to declare peace talks failure**

GAZA, 27 April — Islamic Hamas movement on Saturday called on Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas to announce the failure of the Middle East peace process and to start a national dialogue instead. "Hamas movement calls on the (Palestinian National) Authority

president to officially announce the failure of the negotiations and to return to negotiate with the Palestinian powers," said Hamas' spokesman Sami Abu Zuhri.

Hamas' call was made after Abbas ended talks with US President George W Bush on Friday. The

talks did not achieve any progress in pushing peace talks with Israel.

"This failure proves that all promises by Bush, about creating a Palestinian statehood before he steps down, were only lies and illusions," Abu Zuhri said.

**Two tons of cocaine seized in Colombia**

BOGOTA, 28 April — Two tons of cocaine were seized Friday at the Buenaventura port in Colombia, local police said.

"Many people in Buenaventura tried to load some containers onto a boat even though the pier

was not operating," the police told Caracol Radio.

After investigation, they found 80 packages of drugs being loaded onto a Chilean boat to head for Guatemala, they added. Drug traffickers in Colombia usually transfer their drugs to the United States and Europe by sea and by air in Central America.

**Flood fears lead to evacuation in E Canada**

OTTAWA, 28 April — Some 3,600 residents in Canada's eastern Ontario Province are being evacuated due to flooding threats from a nearby river, officials said Friday.

Charter planes are used to transfer the residents at two aboriginal communities in northern Ontario as iceflows flowed down the Albany River. There is fear that the melting ice could breach the dykes protecting the communities, causing flooding, which almost happens every year.

About 600 people are expected to be evacuated over the next 24 hours to different places across Northern Ontario, the Red Cross's manager of disaster management for northern Ontario Annie Burke said in a news release. —Xinhua

**Small plane crashes in Jakarta, injures pilot**

JAKARTA, 27 April — A small plane crashed near the Taman Mini resort park in Jakarta on Saturday, but the pilot reportedly survived the accident with minor injuries.

"The (pilot) condition

is not too bad.

He has been sent to the hospital," Jakarta traffic police officer Kasno was quoted by leading news website Detikcom as saying.

The accident did not cause major damage to the

site as it crashed into an open field near the resort park.

The plane is registered with the Indonesian Aero Sport Federation (FASI).

It remains unclear the likely reason behind the accident.—Xinhua

**Lebanese speaker sets new date for election**

BEIRUT, 27 April — Lebanese Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri on Saturday set 13 May as a new schedule date for electing a new president, local ANB reported.

"Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri decided to set Tuesday, 13 May, a new

date for a session to elect the president of Lebanon..." a statement from the Parliament was quoted as saying.

Berri, on Tuesday, postponed a parliamentary session to elect Lebanon's president, without setting the exact date of the next

session.

"I will wait the results of the calls for national dialogue to set another date," Berri said in a statement at Parliament headquarters in Downtown Beirut. It is the 18th postponement since 25 September.—Xinhua

## German Fin Min criticizes BoE over Northern Rock

BERLIN, 27 April — The Bank of England made a mistake last year in not pumping enough extra funding into money markets at the height of the mortgage crisis, German Finance Minister Peer Steinbrueck said on Friday.

In an apparent reference to a run by depositors on British mortgage lender Northern Rock last year,

Steinbrueck praised the US and euro zone Central Banks' approach to helping commercial banks through the credit squeeze. "The policy of the Fed and the ECB to supply the market with liquidity was right. A bank that didn't do this in Great Britain led to people standing in long queues outside (their bank)," he told the Bundestag Lower

House of Parliament.

"Just imagine if we'd had these kind of scenes in Germany that harked back to the 1920s," Steinbrueck added. Germany was rocked by severe hyperinflation in 1922-1923. Open criticism of foreign central banks by senior government officials has been rare during the financial crisis.

## Thousands protest against Mexico oil privatization plan

MEXICO CITY, 28 April — Thousands of demonstrators marched along Mexico City's streets Sunday to protest against the government's plan to privatize the nation's oil industry.

The protest was led by

former Mexico City mayor and presidential candidate Andres Lopez Obrador. More than 30,000 people took part in the rally, local police said.

Addressing demonstrators in Zacalo square, the biggest public square in

central Mexico City, Obrador said President Felipe Calderon's plan "violated the spirit and letter" of the Constitution.

President Calderon proposed on 8 April to the Mexican Senate an energy reform plan, including opening Mexico's state-run oil company Pemex to domestic and foreign investment.—MNA/Xinhua

## Filipino nurses seeking jobs in US drops in Q1

MANILA, 28 April — The number of Filipino nurses who sought jobs in the United States by taking a US licensure exam dropped by 7 per cent in the first quarter of this year, reported local newspaper *Philippine Daily Inquirer* website Saturday.

The number of Filipino nurses who took the US National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) went down from 5,076 registered in the first quarter of 2007 to 4,686 during the same period this year, said the report quoting official sources.

A record number of 21,499 Filipinos took the NCLEX, excluding repeaters, in the whole year of 2007, 40 per cent higher than 2006, said the report.

## Oil hits record on UK pipeline shutdown, Nigerian violence

BEIJING, 28 April—Crude oil hit a record high of 119.93 US dollars a barrel on Monday after BP Plc shut a North Sea pipeline and as fresh violence in Nigeria reignited supply fears.

US light crude for June delivery rose 81 cents to 119.33 dollars, after striking a lifetime high of 119.93 dollars a barrel at the start of Globex electronic trade.

London Brent crude rose 66 cents to 117 dollars. Hundreds of workers at Scotland's only oil refinery began a 48-hour strike on Sunday, forcing BP to shut a pipeline system that delivers almost a third of Britain's North Sea oil.

BP said it had completed the closure of the Forties Pipeline System when 1,200 workers at the Grangemouth refinery in central Scotland walked off the job over pension issues.

The pipeline brings in 700,000 barrels of oil a day from the North Sea to BP's Kinneil plant, which

is powered from the Grangemouth site.

BP said that assuming it got power back as soon as the strike ended and Fortis fields resumed production rapidly, the pipeline could be back in operation within 24 hours but might take a few more days to get back to full flow.—Internet

## Indonesia signs \$889m power contracts with Chinese firms

JAKARTA, 27 April — Indonesia's state-run power firm PLN has signed two engineering procurement contracts worth 888.4 million US dollars with Chinese companies for the constructions of coal-fired power plants, local Press said on Saturday.

The first contract worth 642 million dollars was signed Friday for the 700-megawatt Tanjugn Awar-Awar plant in East Java with a consortium of China National Machinery Equipment Corp (Sinomac), China National Electric Equipment (CNEEC) and local firm PT Penta Adi Samudra.

## Nepal, Bahrain to ink labour pact

KATHMANDU, 28 April — Nepal and Bahrain are set to ink a bilateral labour pact to pave a way for secured employment opportunities and provide legal recognition to Nepali migrant workers in this Gulf state on Tuesday.

According to The *Himalayan Times* daily on Monday, Bahrain's Labour Minister Majeed Bin Muhsin Al Alawi is arriving Kathmandu Monday on a three-day long official visit leading a nine-member delegation.

Al Alawi is scheduled to sign a memorandum of understanding with his Nepali counterpart Ramesh Lekhak, said Uddav Baskota, spokesperson at the Ministry of Labour and Transport Management.

## Let's continue to shoulder national duty

*Kyaw Min Aye*

Every sovereign country has a constitution, the basic law of the laws in the country.

Legislative, executive and judicial functions are to be carried out in accordance with the principles stated in the constitution.

The existing laws are in force so long as they are not contrary to the State constitution. The Pyidaungsu Hluttaw that comes into existence according to the constitution has the power to nullify or amend the existing laws.

The existing rules, regulations, bye-law, notification, order, directives and procedures are in force as long as they are not contrary to the constitution. The Pyidaungsu government that comes into existence according to the constitution has the power to annul or amend the existing laws.

If a provision stipulated in a law enacted by a legislative body or an existing law is contrary to the provisions of the State constitution, procedures are to be carried out in line with the provisions of the State constitution.

Above-mentioned points indicate that no man is above the law. Everyone does not want a situation in which someone is above the law. Everyone wants to enjoy equal rights in terms of law, and to get the protection of the law equally.

No person, party or organization can guarantee that no one is above the law.

The State constitution is the only one that can guarantee in this regard. Studying these points, a person can visualize the evil consequences of lack of a constitution and benefits of the existence of a constitution. Therefore, I would say a constitution is necessary. It is essential.

With the approval of the constitution, it can be guaranteed that the State is formed with the Union system. And the nation will be able to exercise genuine discipline-flourishing multi-party democracy system and market economy, and continue to practise the independent and active foreign policy.

After the constitution is approved, every citizen

will have the right to vote and to stand for election in accordance with the law. That is to say if interested, every citizen will have the rights to do politics legally, establish a political party in accordance with the law, stand for election and organize freely.

The constitution bestows rights to promulgate necessary laws to protect the rights of peasants and workers. Besides, necessary laws will be promulgated to ensure job security of State service personnel, food safety, the rights on maternity of female staff, welfare of retired service personnel.

The constitution guarantees that private economic enterprises will not be nationalized, the currency in circulation will not be demonetized. Measures will be taken to improve the living conditions of the people and ensure development of general investments, reduce unemployment rate as much as possible, and provide necessary assistance such as technology, investment, machines and raw materials for industrial development.

These points are some of the political, economic, education, health and social benefits that can be available after the approval of the State constitution. The more a person studies the draft constitution, the more he will notice the benefits.

If a citizen considers that he does not have access to any of the fundamental rights enumerated in the Chapter (8) 'Citizenship, Fundamental Rights and Duties of Citizens' due to various reasons, he has the right to apply to the Union Supreme Court in accordance with the disciplines for the right. Every citizen is bestowed on the right to apply.

Myanmar is a land where more than 100 national races make their home together. The people have lived in the nation for more than 1000 years without designating any boundaries. The constitution grants every citizen (national race) permission to settle in any of the regions in the nation in line with the law.

For every ethnic minority living in the Region and State there is no need to worry about that. Myanmar people by nature are strongly equipped with family spirit and Union Spirit. Myanmar national people are

born democratic ones without discrimination on the basis of race, gender and class.

So, various national races live together with local people in any parts of the nation. National races have maintained friendship since time immemorial.

According to the constitution, the existing seven divisions are designated as seven regions and the existing seven states, as seven states. And their names are retained as they are at present. In addition, self-administered zones are designated in accordance with the three norms for Naga, Danu, Pa-O, Palaung and Kokang national races, and one self-administered division, for Wa national race. The designation of one self-administered division and five self-administered zones will come in force only after the approval of the constitution.

There is a principle for every national race that lives in a Region or State and that has not got a Region/State, self-administered division/zone. If such a national race has a population that constitutes 0.1 per cent of the population of the State, it can elect a representative from among its population to the Region/State hluttaw concerned. The representative will have the right to make law in the legislative body (Region/State hluttaw) and will become the minister for national race affairs in the administrative body (Region/State government).

All these rights will be available only after the State constitution is approved. So, apparently, the drive for approval of the constitution is a national duty of today's national people. I think every citizen who wants to serve the national interest and shapes their prosperous future realizes the benefit of casting 'Yes' vote for approval of the constitution.

Here, I would like to present a tale. Long ago, an honest man was on his way home, shouldering a goat he had been presented. Three unscrupulous persons cast covetous eyes on the goat. Taking position at three different places on the route, one of them asked why the man was shouldering a dog. The next one said that he wondered why the man was carrying a dead calf. And the last one asked why the man was shouldering a donkey. Considering that it might be a devil, the man threw it down the ground and ran away. Then, the three caught the goat and took it. I read the tale in an article.

What the national races are shouldering is not like the goat in the tale. They are shouldering a national duty for the approval of the constitution that represents the sovereignty. Therefore, I would like to urge the people to continue to shoulder the national duty.

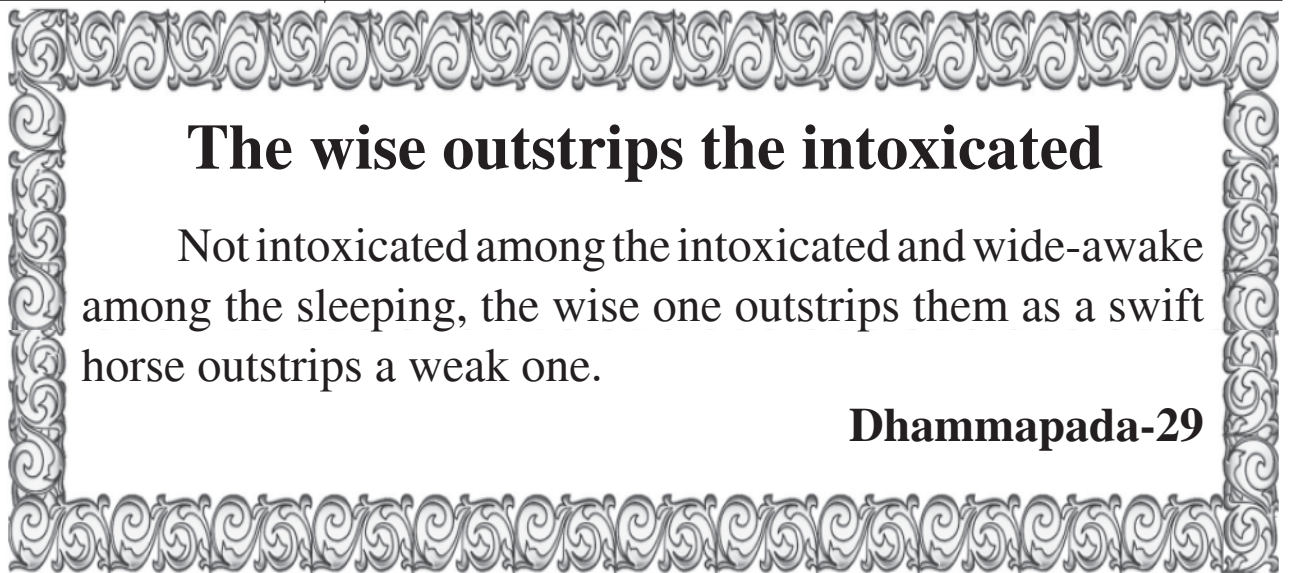

China copper trader jailed for illegal deals

BEIJING, 27 April—Liu Qibing, a copper trader who took a massive loss-making short position for China's State Reserves Bureau, was sentenced last month to seven years in prison, Caijing magazine reported on Friday.

Liu disappeared in 2005, as a rally in copper futures on the London Metal Exchange jeopardized a short position he had taken out earlier in the year.

"Liu still forged fake documents to manoeuvre state copper funds and bet, wrongly, that the copper price would fall. His illegal trading lasted six years, while the supervisor was long aware but kept the lid on it," Caijing said.—MNA/Reuters

China seizes \$750m of pirated software

BEIJING, 27 April— Chinese police have seized 750 million US dollars worth of pirated computer software and broken up a piracy ring in southern China, state media said on Friday as Beijing vows to crack down on a problem which has soured trade ties. Police swooped on the gang last summer and arrested 10 people in the boomtown of Shenzhen, across the border from Hong Kong, the official Xinhua news agency said. Chinese police acted after the US Federal

Bureau of Investigation told China about the gang, Xinhua said. "Around 70 per cent of the pirated software was sold in the United States, according to the FBI intelligence," the prosecutor said. "The FBI provided names and addresses of some suspects to the Chinese police." According to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the trade in pirated consumer goods has reached 200 billion US dollars a year, equivalent

to 2 per cent of world trade, with many fakes coming from China. Washington and Brussels have expressed their displeasure with Beijing numerous times over the problem, and it has proven a major irritant in trade and political ties. EU officials led by European Commission President Jose Manuel Barroso have been in town this week. China says it is trying hard to tackle piracy, but that as it is a developing country it may take many years to root out the problem.—MNA/Reuters

Sri Lankan Air Force raids rebel targets

COLOMBO, 28 April— The Air Force in Sri Lanka bombed the Tamil Tigers' artillery positions in the northeastern area of Welioya on Saturday, said the military.

Military spokesman Udaya Nanayakkara said Air Force fighter jets made precision air raids at identified LTTE (Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam) artillery positions in Welioya, about 280 kilometres northeast of the capital Colombo around 5 pm local time (1130 GMT). The LTTE said earlier the rebels confronted Army units who launched a large-scale offensive push in the area on Saturday.

The air raids came three days after a fierce battle in the northern Jaffna peninsula, with hundreds of combatants being killed or injured. Having taken over control of the Eastern Province last July, Sri Lanka's security forces are currently battling LTTE rebels in the north with an aim to crush them before the end of 2008. The LTTE has been fighting the troops since the mid-1980s to carve out a separate homeland for the Tamil minority in the north and east, resulting in the death of more than 70,000 people.—MNA/Xinhua

## Universal coverage to end malaria deaths by 2010

UNITED NATIONS, 27 April — UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon marked World Malaria Day on Friday with a call for realizing universal coverage to end malaria deaths by 2010.

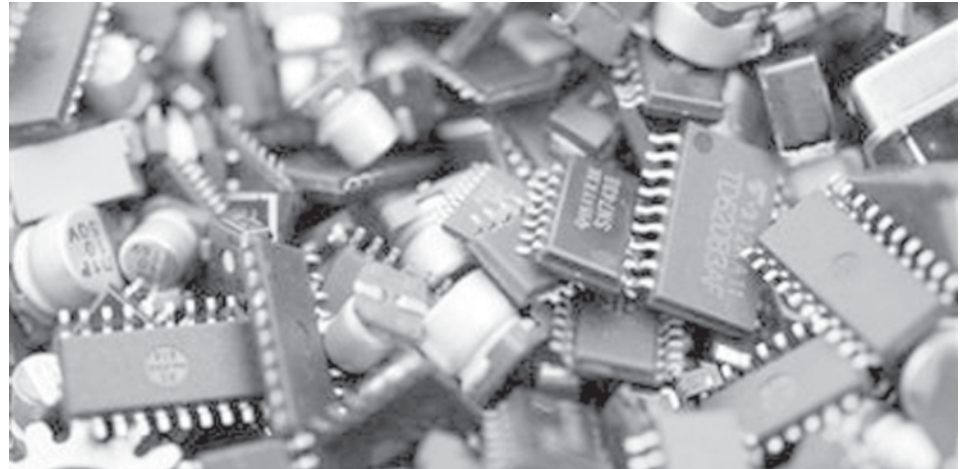
In a video message to mark World Malaria Day, Ban noted the “dramatic strides” made by several African countries in controlling malaria in

recent years.

“But the most affected nations remain off track to reach the goal of halting and reversing the incidence of the disease,” he said. “As we pass the mid-point in the race towards the Millennium Development Goals, we desperately need to step up our efforts to roll back malaria.” To this end, the secretary-general

announced a “bold but achievable vision,” which is to put a stop to malaria deaths by ensuring universal coverage by the end of 2010.

“This initiative will offer indoor residual spraying, and bed nets treated with long-lasting insecticide, to all people at risk, especially women and children in Africa,” he said. —MNA/Xinhua

## China's mobile phone users hit 574m by March

BEIJING, 27 April — The mobile phone subscribers in China has risen to more than 574 million by March, as more fixed-line users switched to mobile services on lower rates, according to the Ministry of Industry and Information.

The number was 27.3 million more than at the end of last year, the ministry said.

The nation's fixed-line operators lost 4.4 million subscribers in the first quarter, reducing the total fixed-line users to 361 million by the end of last month.

China's mobile phones users sent 174.9

billion text messages in the first quarter, up 28.8 per cent from the same period last year.

The telecom industry

reported revenue of 194.1 billion yuan (27.7 billion US dollars), 10.8 per cent higher than a year ago.

## California to use DNA crime-fighting technique

LOS ANGELES, 28 April — California will become the first state in the United States to use DNA to try to identify elusive criminals

through their relatives, the *Los Angeles Times* reported on Saturday.

The policy is aimed at identifying a suspect through DNA collected at a crime scene by looking for potential relatives in the state's genetic database of about a million felons, according to the paper. Once a relative is identified, police can use that person as a lead to trace the suspect, the report said. The new approach was justified by violent crime plaguing the state, the report quoted state Attorney General Jerry Brown as saying.

He emphasized that it would be used only when

all other leads had been exhausted. “We have 2,000 murders a year in California—that is 10,000 since the Iraq war started — and that is a lot of killing,” Brown said.

“When you see it and see the victims and have to go to funerals, it is pretty serious stuff.”

The new plan makes California a leader in such searches, which several states permit but do not vigorously pursue.

Colorado has recently begun to examine its database for relatives of unknown criminals as part of a research project, according to the report.

## HK to cut tax for environment-friendly facilities

HONG KONG, 28 April — Hong Kong will soon introduce one-off and accelerated tax cuts for environment-friendly machinery and installations, the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) government said on Saturday. “A 100-per cent deduction under profits tax will be provided in the year of purchase for the capital expenditure incurred on the provision of eligible machinery,” a government spokesman said, referring to the tax cuts proposal.

The amendments will be made to the tax law upon the passing of a Revenue Bill by the Legislative Council, the HKSAR government said in a statement.

Environmental protection machinery includes low noise construction machinery or plant registered under the Quality Powered Mechanical Equipment system, certain waste treatment, wastewater treatment and air pollution control machinery or plant. “A deduction under profits tax for 20 per cent of the capital expenditure incurred on the construction of eligible installations will be provided in each of the five years starting from the year of acquisition,” the spokesman said. —MNA/Xinhua

## EU launches second satellite for Galileo project

MOSCOW, 28 April — The European Union on early Sunday launched the second experimental satellite for the bloc's Galileo navigation system from Kazakhstan's Baikonur cosmodrome in an effort to compete with the US GPS system.

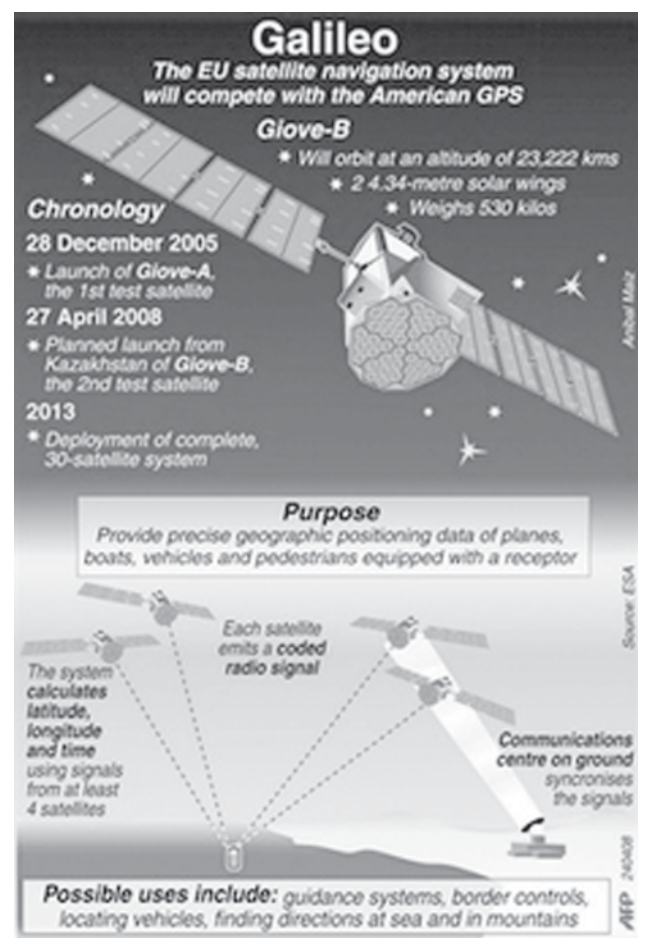
The satellite was lifted into space by a Russian Soyuz rocket at 4:16 am local time (2216 GMT Saturday), said the Russian Federal Space Agency (Roskosmos).

If everything goes well, the *Giove-B* satellite, an over 500-kilo cube built by the Astrium and Thales AleniaSpace, will be placed into its designed orbit in less than four hours.

The *Giove-B* will test technologies to be used in the Galileo system, which the EU said is superior to the existing GPS system in coverage sphere. It can also provide navigation service for motorists, sailors, pilots and emergency rescue staff, according to the EU.

## Cisse revives Marseille's Champions League hopes

MONACO, 28 April — Djibril Cisse netted with nine minutes remaining to give Olympique Marseille a 3-2 Ligue 1 win at Monaco on Sunday that revived his side's hopes of clinching a Champions League place.

The France striker collected a Mamadou Niang pass in the area to beat Monaco keeper Flavio Roma from close range.

Marseille are now third in the standings on 58 points with three matches left after Nancy (57) drew 1-1 at Valenciennes earlier on Sunday.

Eric Gerets's side went ahead on 28 minutes through playmaker Samir Nasri only for Ignacio Gonzalez to level the tie 10 minutes into the second half.

Nigeria defender Taye Taiwo put the visitors back in command six minutes

later but Jerko Leko equalized again for Monaco in the 63rd minute.

Marseille's attempts to grab all three points were not rewarded until the 83rd minute and Cisse's 14th goal of the season.

## Bayern closing in on Bundesliga title

BERLIN, 28 April — Bayern Munich beat VfB Stuttgart 4-1 on Sunday to move 12 points clear in the Bundesliga with only one point required from their last four games to seal a 21st German title.

Luca Toni scored his 36th goal in 42 matches in the eighth minute. Antonio da Silva equalized nine minutes later before Mark van Bommel fired in a superb low shot that curled around the wall off an

indirect free kick in the 55th minute.

Bayern coach Ottmar Hitzfeld had rested Franck Ribery along with four other first team players ahead of a semi-final second leg UEFA Cup match on Thursday at Zenit St Petersburg. However, he decided to send Ribery on in the 57th minute and the France playmaker scored twice within two minutes.

Ribery blasted a spectacular long-range shot into the top right corner beyond the fingertips of keeper Raphael Schaefer in the 75th minute and then beat two Stuttgart defenders before firing

in a crisp shot with his weaker left foot.

"He comes off the bench and shows his class right away," said Hitzfeld, who also sent in Ze Roberto for the final 23 minutes to tune up for St. Petersburg. "Two ball artists go in and Ribery scores two dream goals."

Hitzfeld made it clear that reaching the UEFA Cup final was the top priority on Sunday with the Bundesliga all but wrapped up. "I'm glad I rested Ribery. He was hugely motivated when he came in off the bench," he said.

## Real edge closer to title after 3-0 win

MADRID, 28 April — Real Madrid crushed Athletic Bilbao 3-0 at the Bernabeu on Sunday to edge closer to the Spanish title but Villarreal's 1-0 victory at Real Betis put their celebrations on hold for at least another week. Real's victory means that with four games left to play they remain 10 points clear of Villarreal at the top of the table on 75 points and will claim their 31st league title if they win next week's match at Osasuna.

Third-placed Barcelona, who are four points behind Villarreal after their 2-0 loss at Deportivo Coruna on Saturday, can now only hope to dispute second place with Villarreal.

Argentine striker Javier Saviola paved the way for Real's victory when he took advantage of a rare appearance in the starting line-up to poke home after Bilbao keeper Armando had spilled a shot from Robinho in the 13th minute.

Keeper Iker Casillas halted a Bilbao comeback when he produced a great one-handed stop to save a Joseba Garmendia penalty given after Real defender Gabriel Heinze had bundled into Fernando Llorente in the area late in the first half.

Real dominated after the break and gained a deserved second when Arjen Robben steered home from close range after a superb pass from Gonzalo Higuain and the Argentine wrapped up the win with a classy curling strike of his own two minutes later.

Villarreal clinched their win over a revived Real Betis side thanks to a breathtaking goal from midfielder Marcos Senna.

The Spain international fired the ball into the top corner from a metre inside the Betis half after spotting keeper Casto off his line in the 16th minute. Atletico Madrid remain in fourth spot, six points behind Barca, after drawing 1-1 at Getafe, while Racing Santander lost ground in the hunt for the final Champions League place after slumping to a 3-1 defeat at Real Mallorca.

## Ranieri hails Juve after Champions League spot sealed

MILAN, 28 April — Juventus coach Claudio Ranieri thanked his side for giving him their full backing after Sunday's 5-2 home win over Lazio sealed a Champions League qualifying place.

Third-placed Juve have achieved the feat in their first season back in the top flight following their relegation to Serie B for match-fixing and immediate promotion back.

Former Chelsea and Parma coach Ranieri, who took over in June after the departure of Didier Deschamps, said the players deserved their success after all the club had been through.

"A great thank you goes to the lads because it has not been easy to end up where we are. Compliments to everyone. It was not easy to be third three games from the end of the season. They have had a fantastic season," he told Sky television.

"The lads were great to follow me straight away. It was not easy for me to

arrive at Juve, build a team and immediately win. Could we have done more? It is fine like this. I feel I have a team that has great personality, they know what they want and are able to achieve it."

Juve are five points behind second-placed AS Roma and still have a chance of overhauling them and securing a berth in the full Champions League without needing to play a qualifier.—MNA/Reuters

## Kaka predicts he will reach his peak in 2010

RIO DE JANEIRO, 28 April — World Player of the Year Kaka predicted on Sunday that he would reach his peak in time for the 2010 World Cup.

In an interview with the Brazilian sports daily Lance, the AC Milan and Brazil player reaffirmed his wish to play at the Olympic Games in August but admitted the matter was out of his hands.

"I think the best is yet to come," said Kaka, who has suffered a dip in form this year.

"The year 2007 was marvellous but I still think I can improve technically and physically.

"I want to reach a very high level (for the 2010 World Cup). I will be 28, at my peak. It could be a great World Cup for Brazil, a new cycle and new players."

Kaka has had some fitness problems recently, which he blamed on too much football. "The biggest problem with injuries, today, is the quantity of games," he said. "There comes a time when your body can't take any more."

The 26-year-old said he wanted to help Brazil win their first Olympic Gold medal in Beijing. The Olympic soccer tournament is for under-23 teams but

three over-age players are allowed.

"Nobody has won the Olympic gold (for Brazil) yet, that's the big motivation," he said. "But, how I get to the Olympics is something which does not depend on me." He was unsure if he would still be playing international football when Brazil host the World Cup in 2014.

"I don't know if I will be there," he said.

"It depends on how I am physically, if I am still in condition to play football at a high level, with the right motivation to play a World Cup.

The two-seater *Thorp T-18* light aircraft, believed to be a civilian plane, crashed between a hangar and an administration block.

The ambulance service said the plane's two occupants died at the scene after ploughing into the ground.

**British innocent schoolboy machine-gunned in bed**

LONDON, 28 April — An innocent 15-year-old schoolboy was sprayed with bullets from a machine gun as he lay in his own bed after becoming the victim of mistaken identity during a gang war, a London court heard on Friday.

Michael Dosunmu was hit by four bullets, one fatally wounding him in the heart, fired by two gunmen who had burst into his home in south London looking for his brother.

Prosecutor Jonathan Laidlaw told the Old Bailey that it was shortly before 1 am on 6 February last year that the men had forced their way into Dosunmu's house in Peckham.

“They went straight to the first floor and entered one of the three bedrooms,” he said. — *MNA/Reuters*

**60 dead, 400 injured in east China train collision**

JINAN, 28 April— The early Monday train collision in east China's Shandong Province has caused 60 deaths and 400

injuries so far, railway authorities confirmed.

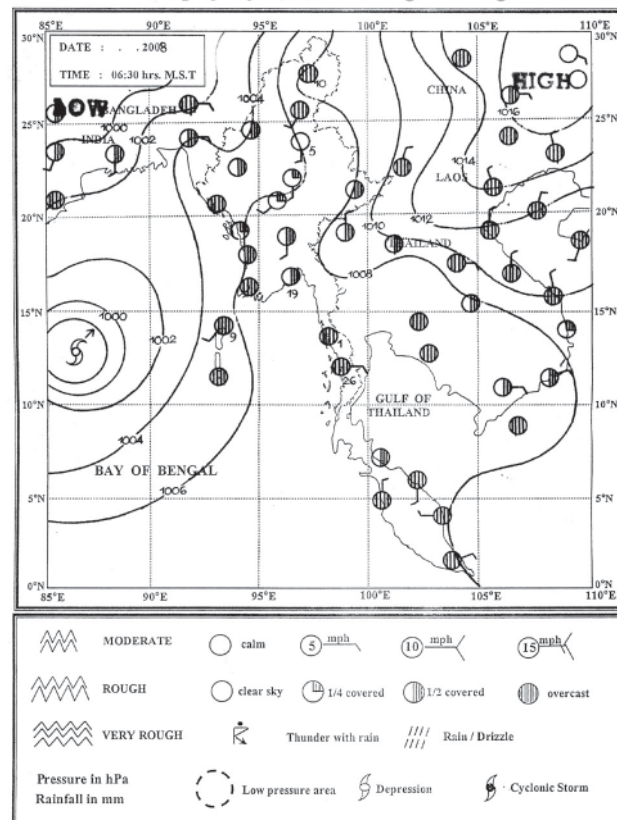
The Jinan Railway Bureau based in Shandong said 70 of the injured people were in critical condition.

The victims were from two passenger trains, one of which was en route from Beijing to Qingdao, a famous summer resort in Shandong and venue of the Olympic sailing competition, and the other, from Shandong's Yantai to Xuzhou in eastern Jiangsu Province.

The train from Beijing, coded T195, derailed in the city of Zibo in Shandong Province at 4:43 am. About 10 carriages toppled into a ditch.

The derailed train hit train 5034 and caused the latter to veer off its tracks, too. — *MNA/Xinhua*
