## US congressman opposes House resolution on China

WASHINGTON, 4 Aug—US Republican congressman Ron Paul of Texas described the recent resolution by the House of Representatives on China's human rights situation as "ill-conceived" and "hypocritical" and he urged the US legislature to deal with human rights abuses in US or those created abroad by US foreign policies.

"I rise in opposition to this resolution, which is yet

another meaningless but provocative condemnation of China. It is this kind of jingoism that has led to such a low opinion of the United States abroad," Paul, who had run for US president as a Republican candidate earlier, said in a statement posted on the official website of the House.

"We are not debating a bill to close Guantanamo, where abuses have been documented. We are not debating a bill to withdraw

from Iraq, where scores of innocents have been killed, injured, and abused due to our unprovoked attack on that country. We are not debating a bill to reverse the odious FISA bill passed recently which will result in extreme abuses of Americans by gutting the Fourth Amendment," he said in the statement made before the House voted to adopt the anti-China resolution on 30 July.

## Incident involving radioactive material at IAEA Safeguards Laboratory

VIENNA, 4 Aug—Pressure buildup in a small sealed sample bottle in a storage safe resulted in plutonium contamination

of a storage room at about 02:30 Sunday at the IAEA's Safeguards Analytical Laboratory in Seibersdorf, but no radioactivity released to environment.

All indications are that there was no release of radioactivity to the environment. Further monitoring around the laboratory will be undertaken. No one was

working in the laboratory at the time, according to the IAEA Press releases on Sunday.

The Laboratory's safety system detected plutonium contamination in the storage room where the safe was located and in two other rooms - subsequently confirmed by a team of IAEA radiation protection experts.—Internet

## US military death toll rises to 4,129

WASHINGTON, 4 Aug—As of Sunday, 3 Aug, 2008, at least 4,129 members of the US military have died in the Iraq war since it began in March 2003, according to an *Associated Press* count.

The figure includes eight military civilians killed in action. At least 3,362 died as a result of hostile action, according to the military's numbers.

The AP count is the same as the Defence Department's tally, last updated Friday at 10 am EDT.

The British military has reported 176 deaths; Italy, 33; Ukraine, 18; Poland, 21; Bulgaria, 13; Spain, 11; Denmark, seven; El Salvador, five; Slovakia, four; Latvia and Georgia, three each; Estonia, Netherlands, Thailand, Romania, two each; and Australia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, South Korea, one death each.—Internet

## Ten people killed in fire in Bangladesh's capital

DHAKA, 4 Aug—Ten people were killed and 15 others were injured in a fire accident in Bangladesh's capital Dhaka early Monday morning, fire brigade said.

A fire official on duty said the fire started from a chemical shop which is in the ground floor of a 7-story building after Sunday midnight.

It took one and half hours for the fire brigade to extinguish the fire.

The official said the fire went up to the fourth floor of the building and many residents who live in the building rushed out of their homes and caused stampede.

"Some people were injured during the stampede," he said.

The reason of the fire is not known yet. An investigation is underway.—Internet

## Police station raided in west China's Xinjiang, terrorist plot suspected

URUMQI, 4 Aug—Terrorist plot was suspected in the violent attack targeting border police in China's westernmost city of Kashi, which left at least 16 policemen killed and 16 others injured Monday.

The attack occurred in the front of the Yiquan Hotel, which is nearly 200 metres away from the Kashi border armed police division, *Xinhua* correspondent reported from Kashi.

The reporter said the police investigation found that two attackers drove a tip lorry to hit a team of policemen who were jogging to pass the hotel in a regular morning exercise at about 8:00 am.

The suspects then got off the lorry to throw explosive and hack the policemen with knives, after the vehicle veered to knock on a roadside wire pole, said the Kashi police.

No civilians were hurt in the attack so far. The police said the two attackers had been arrested, and one got a leg injury in the raid.—Xinhua

## Faulty landing gear forces UA flight back to Beijing airport shortly after take-off

BEIJING, 4 Aug—The UA888 flight of the United Airlines (UA) returned to Beijing Capital Airport after hovering about two hours in the sky, due to landing gear problem. No casualties were reported.

The flight took off at 12 am and landed again on the airport at 14:10 pm. The cabin crew found the problem about one hour after the take-off and soon informed the 281 passengers on board.

The UA arranged another aircraft to fly to San Francisco at 5:20 pm after loading all passengers and baggage. United Airlines (UA) of the United States launched the daily direct flight between Beijing to San Francisco in 2004.—Internet

# China's futures trading volume up 76% in July

BEIJING, 4 Aug— China's futures market witnessed a rapid growth in trade volume in July, led by an active trade in farm products such as sugar, soybeans, and aluminum.

Trade volume hit 6.45 trillion yuan (948 billion US dollars), representing

an increase of 76 percent over the same period last year, according to figures released Sunday by the China Futures Association.

Futures markets nationwide realized 112 million contracts in July, up 98 percent.

In the January-July

period, the trade volume of China's futures markets grew 128 percent year on year to 41.5 trillion yuan, involving 690 million contracts.

Market analysts attributed the increase mainly to the sharply fluctuating farm product prices across the global since late 2007, as well as to an improving domestic market environment.

### Beijing boat, marina show to open in Nov

BEIJING, 4 Aug — The Beijing International Boat and Marina Development Show will kick off on 20 November, amid the country's efforts to promote the cruise sports in northern Chinese cities.

The show, to be jointly held by the General Administration of Sports of China (GASC), China Cruises and Yacht Industry Association (CCYIA) and the IIR (Institute for International Research) Exhibitions Ltd, is scheduled to last three days.

"Water sports such as sailing and wind surfing develop slowly in China's northern cities, and the exhibition is a good platform to popularize relevant knowledge among citizens, said Li Quanhai, a senior official with the GASC.

Boating industry in China lags far behind than some countries in Europe and America. The upcoming Beijing show will certainly provide boat producers in both domestic and overseas markets with great opportunities to expand their businesses, said Zheng Weihang, secretary of CCYIA.

BEIJING, 4 Aug— The police officers looked as elegant as a wedge of swans in flight as they synchronized to wove around traffic cones on their Honda motorbikes yesterday, preparing to be the official motorcade of the Games.

"Although we all knew a bit about motorbikes, we were far from being able to show off these kinds of special skills," said Duan Tao, 25, speaking from under a brilliant white helmet. She had matching gloves and Matrix-like sunshades to match it.

### Closure of Argentina-Chile pass strands 2,000 trucks

BUENOS AIRES, 4 Aug — Some 2,000 trucks on Sunday were stranded due to the closure of the Cristo Redentor tunnel, the main pass between Argentina and Chile in the Andes mountain range, authorities said.

The National Direction of Way from Argentina said Sunday that the bordering tunnel was closed due to a strong seasonal snow and wind, and it will not open because of the accumulation of snow on the Chilean side.

### Moderate quake hits eastern Indonesia

JAKARTA, 4 Aug — An earthquake measuring 5.5 Richter scale rocked eastern parts of Indonesia on Monday, with no initial report of damage or casualties, Indonesia's meteorology agency said here.

The quake struck at 10:26 am Jakarta time (0326 GMT) with epicentre at 39 kilometres northwest of Ruteng town of East Nusa Tenggara Province and at 110 kilometres in depth, an official of the agency said.

Indonesia sits on a vulnerable quake-hit zone so called "the Pacific Ring of Fire," where two continental plates meet, causing frequent seismic and volcanic movements.

### Five killed in plane crash in W Canada

OTTAWA, 4 Aug — Five people were killed Sunday after a small plane crashed in western Canada's British Columbia Province, officials said.

Two men survived the

crash aboard the twin engine aircraft, which happened along the northern shoreline of Vancouver Island.

They were rescued hours after search teams received text messages

one of the survivors sent to a friend with the whereabouts of the crash site.

One was in good condition while the other was injured, according to Lt-Commander Gerry Pash of the Victoria Joint Rescue Coordination Centre.

The plane, which belongs to Pacific Coastal Airlines, left Port Hardy on route to Chamiss Bay Sunday morning just after 7 am local time (1400 GMT) and was reported missing three hours later.

The cause of the crash is still under investigation, officials said.

## Tropical Storm Edouard moves toward Texas

NEW ORLEANS, 4 Aug—Tropical Storm Edouard churned west in the Gulf of Mexico on Sunday night and was expected to strengthen to a near-hurricane before making landfall somewhere in Texas on Tuesday.

The National Hurricane Centre issued a hurricane watch for the coasts of

western Louisiana and eastern Texas late Sunday, meaning hurricane conditions were possible the next 24 hours from Intracoastal City to Port O'Connor, Texas.

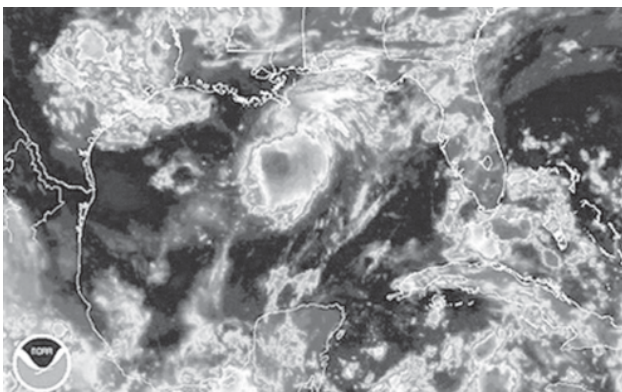
Edouard, packing 50-mph maximum sustained winds, is the fifth tropical storm of the 2008 hurricane season. At 10

pm CDT, its centre was located about 80 miles east-southeast off the mouth of the Mississippi River and about 390 miles east of Galveston, Texas.

It was moving west at 5 mph and was expected to strengthen before making landfall Tuesday morning in Texas. Forecasters said the warm waters of the Gulf provided the right conditions for the storm to intensify and approach hurricane strength with winds of 75 mph or more.

Southeastern Texans prepared for Edouard's impact while the victims farther down the Texas coast continued cleaning up the damage from Hurricane Dolly, which hit last month.

## Children die in diarrhea outbreak in western Nepal

KATHMANDU, 4 Aug—As many as nine children died and dozens of others fell sick due to an outbreak of diarrhea that spread at Syada village in Humala district in mid-western Nepal recently, The Kathmandu Post reported on Monday.

According to the daily,

the outbreak has not yet been controlled due to unavailability of medicine in the village.

"Nearly 100 minors are now suffering from diarrhea in Syada, Sata and Yangu VDCs (village development committees)," VDC secretary Gajabir Rokaya claimed.

"The outbreak could turn into an epidemic since there is no medicine at the local health office," said Rokaya.

Dr Srabesh Sharma at District Hospital, however, said he had no knowledge of the outbreak.

## Immunotherapy boosts treatment of kids' high-risk sarcomas

WASHINGTON, 4 Aug—Immunotherapy shows promise in treating children with high-risk sarcomas, according to a US National Institute of Health pilot study.

The study involved a new dendritic vaccine as well as a standard flu vaccine to potentially strengthen the immune system following chemotherapy.

While the dendritic vaccine didn't

perform as well as hoped, children did respond well to the standard flu vaccine. This suggests that boosting immune function in children with sarcoma may be an effective approach. The dendritic vaccine included peptides derived from each patient's individual cancer in a way designed to alert the system to the unique genetic alteration on the cancer cells.

## Parents forget child at airport

TEL AVIV, 4 Aug—Staff at Ben Gurion Airport in Israel have found a three-year-old girl alone in a duty-free shop after her parents accidentally took a plane without her.

The parents boarded the flight to Paris with four of their five children.

The parents did not realise their mistake until the captain of the plane informed them after take-off, according to police.

The girl was put on the next flight to Paris. The parents will be questioned when they return to Israel.

"It is usual that travellers in a rush forget their luggage but not a child. This never happens," a police official said.

## SpaceX launch fails a third time



The first launch in March 2006 ended with a fuel line leak and a fire.—INTERNET

HOUSTON (Texas), 4 Aug—A private rocket carrying three satellites, including a NASA space sail, has failed to reach orbit.

It is the third unsuccessful launch attempt for the Falcon 1 rocket, built by private space firm SpaceX.

Two rocket stages failed to separate two minutes, 20 seconds into launch

from Kwajalein Atoll in the Pacific Ocean.

Engineers are still investigating the cause of the rocket's failure.

"It was obviously a big disappointment not to reach orbit on this Flight 3 of the Falcon 1," said Elon Musk, chief executive of SpaceX, in a short statement read to reporters.

Mr Musk invested millions of dollars gleaned from the sale of his two internet financial services firms into SpaceX to develop low-cost space transportation.

The Falcon 1 rocket was carrying Trailblazer, a small satellite built by the Pentagon, as well as a mini-laboratory called PreSat and a 10 sq m "solar sail"—both of which were built by NASA.

On Saturday, SpaceX also fired its Falcon 9 rocket, designed to ferry cargo and astronauts to the International Space Station (ISS).

NASA hopes the Falcon 9 can help fill the mission gap that will exist while it develops a successor to the shuttle.—Internet

## Fatah fugitives being sent to West Bank

JERUSALEM, 4 Aug—Israel says it will transfer to the West Bank some 150 Fatah members who fled Gaza after being told those who had returned to the Hamas-ruled territory were in mortal danger.

Israeli Defence Minister Ehud Barak held talks with Palestinian officials "in order to convince them to allow the refugees entry" to the West Bank town of Ramallah, his ministry said.

The decision reverses a previous request by Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas that the 180 or so members of his

party that had fled Gaza into Israel on Saturday following a day of deadly clashes with Hamas would

be returned to Gaza and not transferred to the West Bank, the statement said.—Internet

## Two French nationals kidnapped in Nigeria

PARIS, 4 Aug—French Foreign Ministry confirmed on Sunday that two French working in Nigeria were abducted Saturday night in south Nigeria.

A statement issued by the ministry "confirmed the abduction of two French nationals working in Nigeria, near the oil city Port-Harcourt in the south of Nigeria."

Earlier in the day, Nigerian police also made the announcement.

The French foreign ministry called on the Nigerian authorities to work for their liberation as soon as possible.

## South Asia leaders urge joint terrorism fight

COLOMBO, 4 Aug — The leaders of South Asia called for fighting terrorism together as a regional summit overshadowed by worsening ties between India and Pakistan, its biggest members, opened on Saturday.

The leaders of the eight-nation South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) plan to sign four agree-

ments, including one on legal cooperation to combat terrorism at the summit in the Sri Lankan capital. The two-day summit will also frame a declaration on food security for a region which is home to a fifth of humanity and remains one of the poorest in the world.

But concern about terrorism dominated the summit after speaker

underscored the need to fight terrorism unitedly, alongside securing food and energy security.

“The challenges of terrorism must be overcome in order for us to realize the potential of greater regional integration... greater economic integration,” Afghan President Hamid Karzai said.

### Lebanese Cabinet policy statement adopts “resistance”

BEIRUT, 4 Aug — The ministerial committee assigned to draft the policy statement of the Lebanese Cabinet agreed after two weeks and 13 intensive meetings to include a clause on the right of the “resistance” to liberate its land, local daily *Star* reported on Saturday.

The Cabinet is to tackle the policy statement draft next week for ratification. Information Minister Tareq Mitri said the statement included “the right of Lebanon, its people, Army and resistance to liberate or reclaim its land”. Pro-government majority leaders have been refusing to mention the resistance because it would mean accepting Hizbollah’s weapons as legal.

Pro-government State Minister Nassib Lahoud expressed reservations over the clause related to the resistance on Friday.—Xinhua

### Afghanistan agrees to resume talks with Pakistan

KABUL, 4 Aug—Afghanistan accepted Pakistan’s offer on Sunday to resume talks which the Kabul Government had boycotted after accusing its neighbour of being behind a series of attacks.

Afghan President

Hamid Karzai and Pakistani Prime Minister Yousaf Raza Gilani talked on the sidelines of regional summit in Colombo on Sunday, their first meeting since 15 July.

“At the suggestion of Pakistan, the Afghan side agreed to re-engage on all

bilateral and multilateral forums,” a presidential palace statement said.

They agreed the two governments needed to develop a common strategy to overcome the threat of terrorism and extremism.

### Police seize 6,000 improvised explosive devices in Peru

MEXICO CITY, 4 Aug — Peruvian police seized some 6,000 improvised explosive devices in a truck in downtown Lima on Friday, news reaching here from Lima said.

Initial investigations showed that terrorists may have planned to use the explosives to launch bomb attacks in crowded areas of Peru’s capital city, or in some key mining sites in the country, police said.

### Bangladesh to start FTA talks with neighbours

DHAKA, 4 Aug—The Bangladeshi Government Sunday decided to start bilateral free trade agreement (FTA) negotiations with India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, a senior official said.

The decision was made at a high-powered

inter-ministerial meeting here, an official of the Commerce Ministry told reporters after the meeting.

Bangladesh’s missions in the three neighbouring countries would start the negotiation process while a core

committee in Dhaka will prepare the terms of reference for each of the three countries before the final talks start.

The decision came as the South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) has not been implemented yet while the neighbour countries moved to sign bilateral trade deals with each other to boost trade.

India signed a bilateral trade deal with Sri Lanka in 2001, leading to five fold increase in trade between the two countries.

### Security service officer shot in South Russia

NAZRAN, (Russia)—4 Aug—A security services officer was shot and wounded and a second man killed at the scene of the latest attack on law enforcement in Russia’s southern Ingushetia region on Saturday. *RIA Novosti* reported.

Earlier this week, at

least two people were killed and five wounded in the Ingush capital Nazran when a car exploded outside a police station.

*RIA* quoted a local Interior Ministry source as saying the officer was shot on Saturday when his car came under automatic rifle fire from a passing

car.

Later, investigators shot and killed a man at the scenes who ignored their warning to remain in his car.

Earlier *RIA* and other news agencies reported a security services officer had been killed in the attack.—MNA/Reuters

### EU, Australia investigate FARC’s int’l network

BOGOTA, 4 Aug—The authorities of Australia and Europe have launched investigations into international links with the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC), Colombia’s *El Tiempo* daily reported on Sunday.

The report said four Spaniards, two Italians, an Australian and a Dane were under investigation for their alleged links with the FARC.

The Dane was said to be involved in the founding of a media institution used by the FARC, and one of the Spanish suspects was believed to be head of the FARC’s Spanish branch, according to the report.

# Note prevailing conditions and mend ways simultaneously

When I was at basic education primary school, I learnt directions. Once upon a time, a rich man's son faced a gradual loss of all of his assets worth 800 million in currency units because his intellectual power was too poor to learn the directions. We learnt how to note the directions: stand with your hands stretching straight on the sides facing the direction where the sun rises, the direction where the sun rises is east, the direction where the sun sets is west, the direction on the left side is north, and the direction on the right side is south. To put it another way, I put it into my memory. In the brief Myanmar dictionary, memory is defined putting things, places and experiences, etc. into one's mind; something that remains in one's mind.

In that case, a thought occurred to me that people supposedly have to note that the direction where the sun rises is west and the direction where the sun sets is east. If so, it will not be difficult for children who are going to pursue primary education to note it. However, it will be difficult for those who have learnt that the direction where the sun rises is east to note it. The problem will be worked out when the children who learn that the direction where the sun rises is west grow up. There will be a disagreement between the generations that learnt that the direction where the sun rises is east and the generations that have learnt that the direction where the sun rises is west till that time. It is a notable point that memory of something can be changed at a time in future.

And supposedly it is required to make an ugly man a handsome one. We have to create him handsome, make his complexion fair, and give him fine clothes and fine things to wear to have a good looking. If so, he will be recognized as one with a good looking. In this regard, what is more important than good appearance is moral conduct. However, if he cannot be a handsome man with good moral conduct until he mends his ways. Only when he mends his ways will it be possible for him to be a handsome one with good moral conduct.

The brief Myanmar dictionary defines the word "habit" something that one does regularly or usually, moral conduct, virtue. Therefore, it is very difficult for one to drop a bad habit. A bad habit by nature does not dwindle away itself. We can cultivate a good habit by doing it regularly and often. So, one who wants to cultivate a good habit must consider it to be a good habit and have to try his best to achieve it.

In Myanmar, today's generations are pursuing the goal of a democratic nation. I spent 55 per cent of my lifetime in the time of the Myanmar Socialist Programme Party and 45 per cent of my lifetime in the transitional period. When I was young, I was also committed to help set up a society of Socialism, and I worked a lot to help fulfil the requirements to meet the goal. Nonetheless, Socialist policy no longer won the support of the people. Myanmar has been taking steps for 20 years to transform from Socialism into democracy. So, I do not think it is difficult for the

generations at present to commit these terms into memories. And younger generations will soon get used to these terms.

The situations call for a new system and good moral conduct that are in conformity with the terms. Actually, State constitution, which is in harmony with the new systems, has been drawn and adopted with the approval of the great majority of the people. Now, some necessary amendments are being made to the laws, regulations and procedures in order that they will match the State constitution. Multi-party democracy general elections will be held in few years. We people will be the citizens of a democratic country when all those proceedings come to fruition. I do not think it is wise the people consider themselves to be the citizens of a democratic nation just because the nation is under the name of democratic one with democratic laws, regulations and procedures. What we people should do now is to try to be accustomed to democratic practices.

Here, we should have a clear outlook on the new era that will fall soon in accordance with the laws and regulations that are in conformity with the new system. Due to the new system, there will be a lot of changes in the political, economic and social sectors. And we have to take necessary measures in advance for possible future changes. In the multi-party democracy period, a citizen can enjoy the rights to elect the person and the party he favours into a government. On the other hand, the people may be at the mercy of a government they have elected. It is time we people quit the bad habits of putting all the blame on the government for a problem, placing too much reliance on the government, and the government alone is responsible for national affairs.

We should stay away from bad habits such as the practice of the Opposition to criticize whatever the government does in the political affairs, improper economic practice with which rapacious persons take full advantage of crises even in times of natural disasters, and thinking highly of alien culture ranging from costumes to lifestyle.

In fact, memory can be changed gradually in a certain period, whereas bad habits can be nipped only if we try our utmost and exercise good ones. Otherwise, there will be a situation in which one notes that the direction where the sun rises is west, instead of east. However, the sun rises in the same direction as usual.

## Bizarre tornado in northern France kills three

HAUTMONT, 4 Aug—A freak tornado ripped through northern France overnight, killing three people and injuring nine as it gutted houses and hurled cars through the air, officials said on Monday.

Packing violent winds and lashing rain, the flash storm tore across a 10-kilometre (six-mile) swathe late Sunday night, destroying some 40 homes in the space of minutes in Hautmont, the worst-hit of the four towns on its path.

A woman in her seventies was killed when her house caved in, medics said, while rescue workers Monday pulled the bodies of the deputy mayor of Hautmont and his wife from the rubble of their home.

Torn metal sheets, ripped electric cabling, roof tiles, gravel and bricks littered the town's two worst-hit streets Monday morning, as 200 rescue workers with sniffer dogs combed the debris for

possible victims.

Local rail traffic was also cut after the storm, which struck at around 11:00 pm (2100 GMT) Sunday, brought down local power lines, according to French rail operator SNCF.—*Internet*

## S Korea seeks closer coop with Israeli defence industry

## Alpine tourists attacked by Pyrenean dogs brought in to save the sheep

PARIS, 4 Aug — Jean-Luc Renaud was on a mountain-walking holiday when he saw a bloodstained Belgian tourist staggering towards him. "His shorts were torn and he had been bitten badly in both buttocks," Mr Renaud told. "He was in a state of complete shock." The Belgian had fallen victim to a notoriously ferocious breed of mountain dog brought into the French Alps to defend sheep from wolves.

The attacks are driving holidaymakers away and are splitting the community against a backdrop of controversy over the reintroduction of the wolf in France. To add to the row, shepherds have been taken to court by wounded holidaymakers and 17 dogs have been poisoned in the Maurienne region of the Alps.

At the centre of the debate is Le Chien de Montagne des Pyrénées (Pyrenean mountain dog)—known commonly as the patou. White and fluffy, the breed looks like a cuddly family pet; it is anything but. Fearless, ferocious, weighing up to 60kg (132lb) and nicknamed the Prince of Shadows, it will fight to the death against wolves and bears to save a flock.

## Breast cancer diagnosis ... and the outcome

LOS ANGELES, 4 Aug — The specter of a breast cancer diagnosis haunts women worldwide, synonymous for some as a point of no return. And yet actress Christina Applegate, recently diagnosed, is expected to make a full recovery after treatment. Many do.

Although breast cancer remains the second-leading cause of cancer death in women (far behind lung cancer), Applegate's disease was caught in the early stages, which makes an enormous difference in treatment — and prognosis.

Breastcancer.org offers a list of the stages of breast cancer, from 0 to 4, with 0 describing noninvasive cancer and 4 describing invasive cancer in which the tumor has spread beyond the breast, underarm and internal mammary lymph nodes.

The National Cancer Institute offers an online booklet "What You Need to Know About Breast Cancer." And the American Cancer Society offers a statistical look at the disease, with estimates of new breast cancer cases and deaths, plus factors that can affect survival.—*Internet*

## US has 'under-estimated spread of HIV by 40 per cent'

LOS ANGELES, 4 Aug — The United States has been under-estimating the spread of HIV by more than

40 per cent per year for the past decade, according to newly-published research indicating that the domestic AIDS epidemic may be far more widespread than previously thought.

A new testing technique has revealed that roughly 56,300 Americans were infected by the virus in 2006, the last year for which data is available. That's a significant increase from the 40,000 cited as standard by

politicians and medical experts for the past fifteen years.

The results of a study by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Government body in charge of tracking AIDS in the US, suggest that more than 1,325,000 more people may now be living with HIV in America. Previous estimates had always put the figure closer to one million.—*Internet*

## Solana, Iran nuclear negotiator to talk soon

BRUSSELS, 4 Aug—Iran's top nuclear negotiator, Saeed Jalili, and EU foreign policy chief Javier Solana are expected to discuss the major powers' offer on Teheran's nuclear programme by phone soon, Solana's spokeswoman said on Sunday.

"We expect a contact between Mr. Solana and Mr. Jalili soon by phone," the spokeswoman said, a day after the informal deadline set by the powers for an answer from Iran. She gave no further details. Western officials gave Teheran two weeks from 19 July to respond to their offer not to impose more UN sanctions on Iran if it froze any expansion of its nuclear work. Iran said on Saturday it would not back down in its nuclear row with the powers.

"In whichever negotiation we take part ... it is unequivocally with the view to the realization of Iran's nuclear right and the Iranian nation would not retreat one iota from its rights," President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad said in a statement.

The six powers — the United States, Russia, China, France, Britain and Germany — have appointed Solana to lead the nuclear talks with Iran. The West accuses Iran of seeking to develop nuclear weapons under cover of a civilian power programme.

**Taliban ambush leaves four police dead, seven others wounded in central Afghanistan**

K ABUL, 4 Aug—Taliban militants ambushed two police vehicles in central Afghan province of Ghazni, killing four policemen including one commander and wounding seven others, an official said on Monday.

Muhamad Zaman, the chief of intelligence agency of Ghazni province, told media the attack occurred on Sunday evening in ZanaKhan district.

Meanwhile, Zabihullah Mujahed, the purported Taliban spokesman claimed responsibility for the attack, saying that around 10 police were killed and there were no casualties on the Taliban side.

In clashes elsewhere in Afghanistan, the US-led Coalition killed and detained several militants during two separate operations against the anti-government militants on Sunday, said a Coalition statement.

BAGHDAD, 4 Aug— The US military Sunday announced the death of one of its soldiers in a non-combat related incident in Iraq.

**Israeli Army detains 11 Palestinians in Nablus**

RAMALLAH, 4 Aug—The Israeli Army nabbed 11 Palestinians from their homes in the northern West Bank city of Nablus early on Monday morning, Palestinian security sources said.

The sources and residents in the city said around 20 Israeli Army jeeps full of soldiers raided the city from different directions amid intensive gunfire. No injuries were reported.

They said the Israeli forces redeployed in

several parts of the city before storming residential houses and detained the 11 people, who Israel said are wanted by Israeli security forces.

Hamas movement in the West Bank said in a statement that the Israeli Army released Omer Abdul Razeq, former minister of finance in the Hamas unity government formed after it won the January 2006 legislative

elections.

Meanwhile, Israeli naval gunships opened intensive gunfire at the boats of Palestinian fishermen in the sea off the southern Gaza Strip town of Khan Younis, inflicting no injuries so far.

Residents of Khan Younis said the gunfire lasted for more than an hour causing fear among the population living in the western part of the city.

ISLAMABAD, 4 Aug— At least 14 people have been killed in flooding and rains in northwestern Pakistan, local TV reported on Monday.

The provincial government of North West Frontier Province has called for Army's help after severe flooding and rains is sweeping throughout the province, Geo TV channel said. Situation is worsening in different areas of Pakistan's Peshawar District as flood waters had entered into houses and forced people to stay at home. The Peshawar District Government has called Army and helicopter to help cope with the situation.

**Zambia's foreign portfolio investment hits \$150 mln**

LUSAKA, 4 Aug—Foreign portfolio investment in Zambia's government securities have grown to 528 billion Kwacha (150.86 million US dollars) from

virtually zero in 2005, the Bank of Zambia (BoZ) has said.

The central bank notes that improved investment environment in the economy had resulted in increased inflows of foreign direct and portfolio investments.

The investments increase in sectors such as agriculture, mining, manufacturing, tourism, construction, transport and communications, according to the BoZ.

It also said that non-traditional export had more than tripled to 920.7 million dollars in 2007 from 255.7 million dollars in 2000.

Zambia's gross foreign reserves stays around 1.4 billion dollars, latest BoZ data shows. —*Internet*

**World's smallest known snake found on Barbados**

BEIJING, 4 Aug—An American evolutionary biologist has discovered the world's smallest known snake—small enough to curl up on a US quarter—on the island of Barbados.

Blair Hedges of Penn State discovered the snake, which just under four inches (10 cm) in length as an adult, in a fragment of forest on the eastern side of Barbados. Genetic material from the snake, along with physical characteristics such as its unique colour patterns and scales, provided evidencethe snake was indeed a new species of threadsnake, now dubbed *Leptotyphlops carlae*.

"Snakes may be prevented by natural selection from becoming too small because, below a certain size, there may be nothing for their young to eat," Hedges said.

The Barbados snake, like its relatives, likely feeds primarily on the larvae of ants and termites.—*Internet*

## Obama calls for full voting rights for Florida, Michigan delegates

WASHINGTON, 4 Aug. — US presumptive Democratic presidential candidate Barack Obama called on Sunday for full voting rights for delegates from Florida and Michigan states at the party's national convention.

"I believe party unity calls for the delegates from Florida and Michigan to be able to participate fully alongside the delegates from the other states and territories," said the Illinois Senator in a letter to the Democratic credentials committee.

The two states were stripped of all delegates to the Democratic national convention from 25 Aug

to 28, where the presidential candidate will be officially elected and announced, because the state parties violated the rules by moving forward with their primary dates ahead the Super Tuesday on 5 Feb.

After a long-term negotiations, the Democratic National Committee (DNC)'s rules and bylaws committee decided on 31 May to reinstate all of Florida and Michigan's delegates to its party's presidential nomination convention in August. However, each delegate from the two states will only have half a vote at the convention.

## Venezuela receives Russia-made planes

## Roadside bomb kills two people in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 4 Aug. — A roadside bomb explosion struck an Iraqi Army patrol in eastern Baghdad on Monday, killing two people and wounding 22 others, an Interior Ministry source said.

The bomb explosion hit the military patrol in Palestine Street near Mustansriyah University, killing a soldier and a civilian, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity. Nine soldiers

and 13 civilians were wounded by the blast which damaged a military vehicle and several nearby civilian cars, the source said. In a separate incident, another roadside bomb struck a police patrol in Baghdad's southern district of Doura, damaging a police vehicle and wounding two policemen aboard, the source added.

On Sunday night, a roadside bomb detonated at about 9:00 pm (2100

GMT) near a police patrol vehicle in the town of Mahaweel, some 70 km south of Baghdad, wounding four policemen and three civilian bystanders, he said, citing local police. Monday's attacks came a day after a car bomb explosion struck a passport office in the Sunni neighbourhood of Adhamiyah in northern Baghdad, killing 12 people and wounding 22 others.

## Global AIDS conference opens in Mexico City

MEXICO CITY, 4 Aug.—About 25,000 scientists, policymakers and physicians met here on Sunday for the 17th International AIDS Conference in search of better ways to curb the spread of the epidemic.

It is the first time the biennial conference is held in Latin America. The gathering, with Universal Action Now as its theme, runs through Friday.

Some 2.1 million people died of AIDS last year and about 33 million people worldwide have the HIV

infection, according to the UN.

In Latin America, at least 500,000 people aged between 15 and 24 are HIV carriers, a 5-percent increase over 2006 figures, the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) says.

Among the 33 million people in the world living with HIV/AIDS, 5.5 percent are teenagers and young adults, and about one third of them are Latin American, according to the UNFPA.

## Mexico reshuffling top cops in drug war

MEXICO CITY, 4 Aug.—Mexican President Felipe Calderon is shaking up the top level of the attorney general's office as he struggles to combat powerful drug gangs that have killed 1,900 people this year, a government official said on Sunday.

One of Mexico's top crime fighters, Deputy Attorney General Jose Luis Santiago Vasconcelos, and five other top security

officials are resigning, the official told *Reuters* on condition of anonymity. He declined to say if they were asked to quit.

Santiago Vasconcelos, a veteran police chief who worked at the attorney general's office for 20 years, was a driving force behind the battle against drug cartels. He was in charge of extraditions of drug lords to the United States.

Calderon made drug fighting a cornerstone of his administration as he took office in December 2006, but despite his Army-backed crusade against traffickers, the cartels remain strong and violence is on the rise. In recent months, police chiefs have been ambushed and killed in brutal attacks while children and families are increasingly becoming victims.—MNA/Reuters

## Real won't give up on signing Ronaldo

BEIJING, 4 Aug — Real Madrid coach Bernd Schuster believes the Spanish champion can still win its battle to sign Manchester United winger Cristiano Ronaldo.

## Bruce warns Tigers Latics chief losing patience over King deal

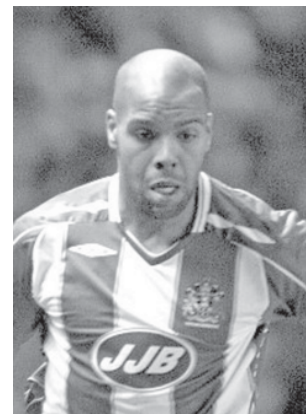
LONDON, 4 Aug — Wigan boss Steve Bruce has warned Hull he is ready to pull the plug on their bid to sign Marlon King.

# Al-Qaeda confirms death of top bomb maker Masri

DUBAI, 4 Aug — Al-Qaeda confirmed on Sunday that Abu Khabab al-Masri, a chemical and biological weapons expert, was killed with three other militants in a suspected US air strike in Pakistan's border region last week.

Masri, who carried a five-million-US-dollar US bounty on his head, had been earlier identified as the likely target of the attack on a house in a Pakistani tribal area bordering Afghanistan, according to Pakistani officials.

An al-Qaeda statement posted on Islamist websites said Masri, referred to as the "expert", had left behind him a generation of students who would avenge his killing. The statement, signed by al-Qaeda's leader in Afghanistan, Mustafa Abu al-Yazid, named three other militants killed alongside Masri on 28 July. It said some of their children also died.

On Saturday, a Pakistani Taleban spokesman denied a US media report that al-Qaeda number two, Ayman al-Zawahri, had been killed in what was believed to be the same US missile strike that killed Masri.

Masri, a 55-year-old Egyptian chemist, was regarded as one of the group's top bomb makers.

## Terror suspect escapes police raid in Kenya

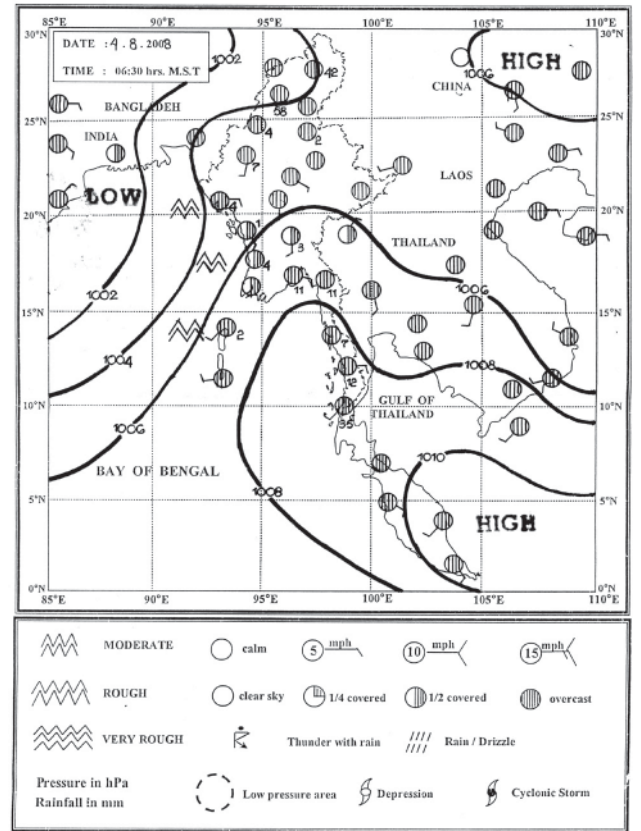
NAIROBI, 4 Aug — One of the most wanted Al-Qaeda terror suspect Fazul Abdullah Mohammed escaped police dragnet in the Kenyan coastal town of Malindi just minutes before the authorities entered the house.

Police spokesman

confirmed on Sunday that the country's security forces have launched a massive manhunt for 32-year-old Mohammed who on Saturday night escaped a police dragnet in Malindi. A senior detective said Mohammed managed to escape but two people who are believed to be his aides have been arrested and are being questioned.

"The two have been arrested and transferred to Mombasa for interrogation. A major police operation has been launched to arrest the culprits," the detective who did not want to be named told *Xinhua* by telephone from Mombasa. The United States has offered a five-million-US-dollar reward for information leading to the arrest of the Comorian, who speaks five languages and is said to be a master of concealing outfit. —MNA/Xinhua
