Building irrigation facilities for boosting agricultural output

As Myanmar is an agro-based country, the main economic products come from agriculture. The government has laid down plans to build diversion weirs and dams in areas where there is scarcity of water and is implementing them for adequate supply of water in agriculture. It has built altogether 214 irrigation facilities throughout the country.

Kyauksauk Dam opened recently near Kyauksauk Village in Myaing Township, Pakokku District, Magway Division is the 55th project out of 71 being undertaken for irrigation and greening of Pakokku District.

In the past, only 98,000 acres of monsoon paddy and 11,000 acres of summer paddy were grown in Pakokku District. After completion of the dam, over 130,000 acres of monsoon paddy can be grown in the district for food sufficiency in the region.

The dam is located on Kyauksauk Creek about a mile west of Kyauksauk Village in Myaing Township. The catchment area is 1.5 square miles and annual inflow area is 350. The dam can store 519 acre feet of water at the highest level. Water storage capacity is 110 acre feet and surface area of water at full brim is 75 acre feet.

The government is building a number of dams for boosting agricultural production. By doing so, social economic life of the rural people will improve and production will also increase. Building of irrigation networks contributes towards serving national interests.

UN says mines, unexploded ordnance kills 17 in Chad

NAIROBI, 31 Aug — A total of 17 people have been killed and 78 others injured by mines and unexploded ordnance (UXO) this year in Chad, the United Nations has said.

A statement from the United Nations received here Sunday said mines and UXO are taking a heavy toll on Chadian civilians, particularly children who make up the majority of the victims of the deadly scourge in the African nation.

“This is one more

occurrence, in a fatal wave of UXO explosions affecting innocent civilians and especially children,” said Jean-Francois Basse, Child Protection Specialist with the UN Children’s Fund (UNICEF) in the Chadian capital, N’Djamena.

In the most recent incident on Thursday, one child was killed and five others injured when a UXO they were playing with exploded in the eastern Chadian village of Tine, on the border with Sudan’s war-torn Darfur

region. Two of the five wounded children had limbs amputated.

But during the journey, which lasted over seven hours due to the heavy rains, one of them died. On arrival at the hospital, two of the five surviving children had limbs amputated.

“This is a sadly frequent event in Chad”, said Christine Jamet, chief of Mission of Médecins Sans Frontières - Luxembourg (MSF-L) in Chad.

Hurricane Gustav ravages Cuba

HAVANA, 31 Aug — Tropical storm Gustav strengthened into a Category 4 hurricane as it churned into western Cuba Saturday and is now on its way to the oil-rich Gulf of Mexico and the US coast.

Gustav, with 240 kmph winds, poured heavy rains, knocked down power lines and uprooted plants as it swept across Cuba’s

western Pinar del Rio province, the country’s main tobacco-growing region.

Authorities have evacuated some 250,000 people in four western provinces. No lives have been lost due to the well-organized evacuation, Cuban officials said.

In the country’s Havana province, where

the capital is located, the storm emptied streets and severed power lines in many cities. Some 77,000 people have been evacuated across the province.

Forecasters predict the hurricane is likely to strengthen into a ferocious Category 5 as it tears into the Gulf of Mexico.

Two Chinese engineers missing in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 31 Aug — Two Chinese engineers had been missing since Friday in northwestern Pakistan and search and rescue work was under way, an official from the Chinese Embassy in Islamabad said on Sunday.

The two Chinese engineers from Zhongxing Telecommunication Equipment Company (ZTE) in Pakistan were found missing on Friday when they went to check the company’s equipment in Lower Dir district of North West Frontier Province.

The ZTE has lost contact with the engineers since Friday and there is no clue about their whereabouts.—Internet

Stranded Sri Lankan fishermen return home after two months

COLOMBO, 31 Aug — Five Sri Lankan fishermen who were stranded in the middle of the ocean for more than three weeks and ended up on an island off the coast of Thailand were flown back to Sri Lanka Saturday morning, a local newspaper reported on Sunday.

According to The Sunday Times, the fishermen set out from Dondra harbor in southern Sri Lanka on 26 June in their fishing boat “Samanala”. On the fourth day the engine failed, and the boat started to drift out to sea.

By the third week the men had run out of food and drinking water. They quenched their thirst by sucking on ice from the ice box in which the fish

was stocked. Twenty-nine days later they spotted an island and swam out to it.

“We walked for more than five miles (about eight km) before we met anyone,” Asanka Lakmal, one of the fishermen was

quoted as saying.

“We told the man our story and he took us to the police. We were then taken to the mainland. We arrived after a two-hour journey,” Lakmal said.

31 Taliban militants killed in S Afghanistan

KABUL, 31 Aug— Afghan National Security Forces (ANSF) in two-day’s clean-up operation targeting Taliban militants

activities in southern Afghan province of Helmand have killed at least 31 militants, said a police official on Sunday.

Mohammad Hussein Andiwal, the provincial police chief told Xinhua that ANSF clashed with Taliban militants in three separate districts, Gereshk, Nawad, and Nad Ali, in Helmand since Friday.

“At least 22 bodies of Taliban militants were still left in the fighting area,” Andiwal said.

“Fire fight has stopped

right now,” he added, “one police was also killed and four others were wounded in the clashes.”

Taliban insurgents who staged a violent comeback three years ago have intensified their activities targeting Afghan and international troops over the past weeks to mount pressure on the government despite around 70,000 foreign troops stationed in the war-torn country vowing to keep peace and help reconstruction here.

Moderate quake jolts E Philippines

MANILA, 31 Aug— A magnitude-5.1 quake was felt in the eastern Philippine areas of Bicol and Northern Samar Saturday evening, but no casualties were immediately recorded, local media reported Sunday.

The earthquake’s centre was estimated by Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) to have been at 36 kilometres northeast of Sorsogon province, local news network ABS-CBN News said.

It said the tremor which hit at 8:05 pm was tectonic in origin and had a depth of 11 kilometers.

It added that no aftershocks were expected from the quake.

Culture on show for Confucius in Shanghai

BEIJING, 31 Aug — Two culture exhibitions will be held at the newly renovated Shanghai Confucian Temple near Yuyuan Garden on 27 September to com-

memorate the birthday of Confucius.

Confucius, one of China's greatest thinkers and the founder of Confucian culture, was born 2,559 years ago.

"A feast of Confucian culture will be open to the public," said official Wang Aizhen.

The exhibitions will feature Chinese characters on horizontal inscribed boards written by "Zhuang Yuan" — people who were the number one scholars in the highest imperial examinations. Craftsmen carved words on the rectangular wooden boards before the boards were hung in the temple in ancient times. Various other calligraphy works will also be shown.

The temple was established in 1294 as an imperial construction to worship Confucius. The current site was chosen in 1855. —Xinhua

China's Arctic expedition team starts research in 87 degree north latitude

ABOARD XUELONG, 31 Aug — China's third Arctic expedition team started research operations in 87 degree north latitude, the northernmost part of the Arctica that the research team has ever arrived.

The scientific expedition team's

helicopter landed on a large piece of a floating ice after an 87-minute flight.

The scientists took pictures and videos from the helicopter for further research.

Zhang Haisheng, chief scientist of China's third Arctic expedition team,

said it was the first time that China has carried out research at such a high latitude, which showed China's improving ability in Arctic research.

The Arctic sea ice melting as a result of global warming helps the team successfully get deeper into this area and carry out a comprehensive study on the polar environment, he added. —Xinhua

DPRK says US, S Korea conduct over 180 cases of aerial spying against it in August

PYOGYANG, 31 Aug — The Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) has accused the the United States and South Korea of conducting more than 180 cases of aerial spying against it in August.

"The aerial espionage committed by them clearly indicate that the US and the South Korea remain unchanged in their aggressive ambition to stifle the DPRK by force of arms," the official KCNA news agency quoted a military source as saying Sunday.

4, 000 visitors flock to world's 3rd-tallest building on 1st public opening day

BEIJING, 31 Aug — A total of 4, 000 visitors, natives and foreigners, flocked to the Shanghai World Financial Center on its first opening day to have a sightseeing on Saturday, the Oriental Morning Post reported.

The Thursday-inaugurated Center stands aloof at 492 meters in the city's Pudong District, and is so far the biggest skyscraper in Chinese mainland and the third-tallest in the world after Burj Dubai and Taipei 101. The building had 101 floors above ground and three floors underground. The 94th to 100th floors were an observatory for sightseeing, according to its builder, the Shanghai Construction Group.

According to the Post report, the first 2, 008 visitors were given badge souvenirs. — Xinhua

Thousands evacuate New Orleans in advance of hurricane Gustav

WASHINGTON, 31 Aug — Thousands fled New Orleans, La., Saturday as Hurricane Gustav bore down on the US Gulf Coast.

Cars packed with children, suitcases and pet carriers jammed roadways leading north and west out of the city, US TV networks reported. By the end of the day, city officials hoped to evacuate at least 30,000 people who lack transportation or

are too sick or old to get out on their own.

Gustav, strengthening into a Category 5 storm, was south of Cuba Saturday. The latest forecasts called for the storm to make landfall just west of New Orleans as early as Monday, but forecasters cautioned that Gustav could strike anywhere along the Gulf coast from Texas to Florida early next week.

China's continuing telecom investment causes waste

BEIJING, 31 Aug — Continuing investment was a major problem in the nation's telecom sector as much waste had been caused by under-utilized cables and other infrastructure, China Times reported on Saturday.

The Beijing-based newspaper cited auditor-general Liu Jiayi reporting on Wednesday to the fourth session of the Standing Committee of the 11th National People's Congress, the country's top legislature.

He said the telecom sector had experienced huge growth in both network scale and capacity since the industry's reform and restructuring that started in 2002; repeated investment had dragged down performance. — Xinhua

Somali pirates seize another Malaysian ship

NAIROBI, 31 Aug — A regional maritime official said Saturday that Somali gunmen have hijacked another Malaysian ship off the coast of the Horn of African nation in the latest attacks on the world's most dangerous waters. Andrew Mwangura, the east African coordinator of Seafarers Assistance Program (SAP), told *Xinhua* that the Malaysian

vessel was seized on Friday night but could not confirm the name of the vessel and the nationalities of the crew members aboard. "The Somali gunmen seized another Malaysian cargo ship off the coast but I have not established how many crew members were aboard and their nationalities," Mwangura told *Xinhua* by telephone.

"The cargo ship was hijacked on Friday night. We still don't know the owners of the ship but we believe it's a Malaysian bulk carrier," he added by telephone from Kenya's coastal city of Mombasa. The global maritime body says at least 30 ships have been hijacked off the coast of the Horn of Africa nation so far this year.

Kadaffi, Berlusconi sign accord worth billions

BENGAZI (Libya), 31 Aug — Libya and Italy signed an accord on Saturday under which Italy will pay billions of dollars in compensation and investments for colonial misdeeds during its decades-long rule of the North African country.

"This accord opens the door to the future co-operation and partnership between Italy and Libya," Libyan leader Moammar Kadaffi said at the signing ceremony at a palace which was once the

headquarters of the Rome government's senior official during the 1911-1943 colonial rule.

Italian Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi said the accord ends "40 years of misunderstanding", adding that "it is a complete and moral acknowledgement of the damage inflicted on Libya by Italy during the colonial era".

Italy has had difficult relations with Kadaffi since he took power in 1969 but has backed Tripoli's recent drive to

mend fences with the West. The "friendship pact" removes a major hurdle to an improvement in ties.

Libya says Italian troops killed thousands of Libyans and drove thousands more from their villages and cities during the colonial era. "In this historic document, Italy apolo-gizes for its killing, destruction and re-repression against Libyans during the colonial rule," Kadaffi said.

Fireworks factory explosion in China kills 13

BEIJING, 31 Aug — An explosion at a fireworks factory in northern China's Inner Mongolia region has killed 13 people and injured six, according to state media.

The semi-official China News Service said that the explosion happened in Gu'aohan Banner on Saturday morning, but provided no other details other than

that a probe into the cause of the blast was underway.

Blasts at firework factories, many unlicensed and run with little regard for safety, are common in China, where fire-crackers are let off enthusiastically at weddings and especially at the start of the Lunar New Year, or Spring Festival.—Internet

Dutch say Pisa no longer Europe's most leaning tower

The Tower of Pisa is being challenged by a lesser-known 12th-century building in the northern Dutch town of Bedum as Europe's most steeply leaning tower. Retired geometrician Jacob van Dijk said measurements this week on Bedum's 36-metre church tower of Walfridus revealed it is now leaning more than its Italian rival, which lost part of its tilt following restoration works.

At a height of 55.86 metres, Pisa's tower leans about 4 metres, while Bedum's tower leans 2.61 metres on its height of 35.7 metres. If both towers were the same height, Bedum would have a greater tilt of 6 cm, Van Dijk argues.

Deadly Afghan spider hitches ride home with UK soldier, kills family dog

A British soldier's family have been scared out of their own home by a dangerous spider who bit their pet dog to death. The Griffiths are fighting the war at home against the giant arachnid, who was unwittingly transported back from Afghanistan in paratrooper Rodney's luggage.

They have already lost their beloved eight-year-old dog, Bella, to the camel spider. The family pet had to be put down after being bitten by the venomous attacker.

Lorraine Griffiths and her three children, aged 18, 16 and four, have been forced to leave their family home in Colchester, Essex. They are now refusing to return to the property until the killer spider is captured by the RSPCA.

Found in desert regions, camel spi-

ders can grow up to 6 inches and reach speeds of up to 10 mph, making them devils to catch.

Lorraine Griffiths believes the spider hitched a ride into the UK in the personal belongings of her husband.

Rodney, 32, came home from duty in Helmand in June.

He has since returned for a further tour of duty in Afghanistan.

Man says he found dead shark in lake Michigan

There's no telling what might turn up in Lake Michigan.

Rich Fasi of Traverse City says he found a dead 2-foot shark in the water while fishing on West Grand Traverse Bay on Wednesday.

The saltwater fish was a juvenile blacktip shark, said Mark Tonello, a fisheries biologist from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

Tonello said someone might have caught the shark off the Atlantic Coast and kept it on ice while bringing it to northern Michigan.

Another possibility is that the dead shark was dumped by someone who had kept it as a pet, Tonello said.

Baby boy born on airliner en route to Australia

An Indian woman gave birth to a healthy boy aboard a jet airliner while flying to Australia to reunite with her husband. Judith Hamel, one of four doctors who helped deliver the 6 pound baby aboard the Cathay Pacific flight from Hong Kong to the southern city of Adelaide, described the delivery as smooth.

"I think we all had fun once we knew it was all safe," Hamel told Australian Broadcasting Corp. radio Wednesday.

Kids playing on the deinosaurs, or "terrible crocodile," at the Urzeitpark in eastern Germany, would have made an appetizing lunch for this long-lost relative of the modern crocodile. The massive reptile lived during the Cretaceous period, about 145 million to 65 million years ago. We all have to honour people's desire

To the best of my knowledge, democracy is a system based on the people's desire. It is because in a country, the people represent the majority of the population. The force vested with the power of making a decision in a democratic way depicts the people. Therefore, it is required to respect the people's decisions and desire.

They just want to live a stable and peaceful life. Now, the people have enjoyed the fruit of stability and peace at the unprecedented level, and are pleased with that. In such a situation, any forms of attempts to disrupt already-achieved stability and peace and to destabilize the country are absolutely unacceptable

to them. That is the real desire of the people.

In relation to the second point, every citizen favours a situation in which their country and the people are enjoying development. Every citizen by nature wants greater development of their motherland than any other foreign country. Similarly, every citizen wants to witness and take pride that the people enjoy the taste of development and affluence more than any other people. If a nation is a developed one, each citizen of the nation will be able to enjoy better social-economic life. Therefore, it is apparent that all the people except anti-government axe-handles want to see development of their country. National development and the wealth of each citizen go together. Therefore, no doubt, this is the people's desire too.

In retrospect, after regaining independence, the nation passed two periods—the parliamentary democracy, and Myanma Socialist Programme Party. In the parliamentary democracy period, many parties split into factions, and internal multi-coloured armed groups rose against the nation, and political parties were in rivalry and independently. In consequence, the nation lacked stability and peace. Development tasks in the economic, social and education sectors could not be carried out effectively due to lack of stability and peace. The majority of the people were in dire poverty and in a state of panic due to internal armed insurgency. Thus, the people never again want to dream of such painful memories.

In the time of the Myanma Socialist Programme Party, political situations showed improvement to a certain degree. However, internal armed insurgency could not be wiped out yet. So, stability and peace could not be restored due to the armed strife, and the people were not in a position to expect national development. The people were impoverished and had to pass through real hard times. In fact, 40 years from 1948 to 1988 is long enough for the nation to enjoy stability and peace if the people work hard. However, there was no signs of national

development.

Every citizen will try to improve their living conditions in accordance with the market economy. There have been many opportunities, and no one has ill-intention to violate the law. They are keen on working hard freely under the protection of the law to achieve maximum success. The people are looking forward to sooner achievement of the democracy goal, while expressing their wholehearted support for the government's political work programmes. That is why the people today have remained indifferent and stood firmly on the side of national concerns however much anti-government are trying to arouse the emotional feelings of the people.

As far as I am concerned, the three sorts of people's desire reflect the real desire of the people. Now, the government is taking measures to fulfil the three desires of the people. What the government is doing is known to the people, so I do not want to present all facts. Overall, the people believe and support that the government is capable of restoring stability and peace, and ensuring development of the nation and the people, and transforming the nation into democracy, as aspired by the people. The people are working in concert under the leadership of the government to achieve the common goal. That is evidenced by the fact that in the previous referendum, the State constitution (draft) was adopted with the approval of 92.48 per cent of the voters.

While the seven-step Road Map is reaching its fifth step, the wishes and decision of the people are becoming more and more important. Anti-government groups on their part need to follow the people's decision regardless of whether they like it or not. Only then, will it be democratic. The public approval of the constitution in the fourth step means that all the people have supported the seven-step Road Map. In other words, the people have opened up the way to democracy for all. Here, 'for all' means the government, the people and Tatmadaw as well as the anti-government groups. Myanmar's new constitution is the concern of all the people including those supporting and those opposing.

Now it is opportune time for national forces that have to march towards the goal of democracy to build national reconsolidation or to reach the true path of national politics. So it is important for the anti-government elements to grab the good opportunity created by the people if they value the people's wishes.

Today, we no longer need to argue who is right and who is wrong. It is not the time either to make sure our party comes into power. It is no longer necessary to stick to the outdated 1990 election results. To have the last word, it is not the time to say that the democratically-approved constitution cannot be accepted and recognized by declining the people's wishes. It is only needed to know the time and circumstance.

If I say, both the government and the people aspire democracy. Likewise, the anti-government groups once repeatedly said that they

wanted democracy. So it can be said that we have the same want or the same goal. If so, why can't we march together to reach the same goal? Why not accept to march together? Unity is a success. The anti-government groups should notice this point.

Today, the State has been in a position to enjoy fruits of development. As I have said, with these fruitful results, it is necessary to redouble our efforts to keep abreast of others rising from the dire situation in which the country lacked development for 40 years due to the irresponsibility. Thinking highly of oneself or one's own party can lead to undermining the people's dream. No one will accept it. Anyhow, it is required to value the people's wishes.

It is known to all that nowadays, most nations are working very hard for their development. Really, they have developed. Many Asian tigers have emerged. So the time has come for us to endeavour for our future. Without arguing each other, we will have to work together so as to catch up with others. But if we waste our time arguing, opposing and instigating, I am worried that our country will have a dim future.

We should not forget the fact that Myanmar is on its way to the goal of democracy as wished by the entire people while building development infrastructures without harming peace and stability. The way in which the future of the State is decided by the people in the 2010 election is the most appropriate. If we do what we want regardless of what the people say, we will go round in circles. Employing wicked ways and unnecessarily arguing in

order to jeopardize peace and stability may lead the people to live in a state of chaos, instability and fear. It can also lead the people to live again in poverty. If so, we can say 'it serves you right'. The people in no way want to go into the previous situation.

If we follow the desire of the people, the road ahead can be reached through a bed of roses. I wonder that parties are formed; the existing parties get prepared to put things right; they canvass for votes by expressing their stance and policies; they run for the multi-party democracy general election to be held in 2010; if elected, Hluttaw representatives emerge; and depending on the public votes, own parties and organizations will be able to stand tall. In my opinion, it will be better if the above-mentioned things are done.

In brief, I have mentioned the true desires of the people. I have also said it is necessary to value the desire and decision of the people who have made true democratic practice. I have suggested that today's ideologies should be in accord with the people's desire. Anyway, in doing politics, everything will be alright if we give the first priority to the State and the people and the second priority to own party or group. As far as I am concerned, I don't want the people's hopes diminish. I want the people's dream to come true. It is because among the people are you and me as well as the anti-government groups. Serving others' interest will help us answer our own wishes.

It is absolutely right to value the people's true desire.

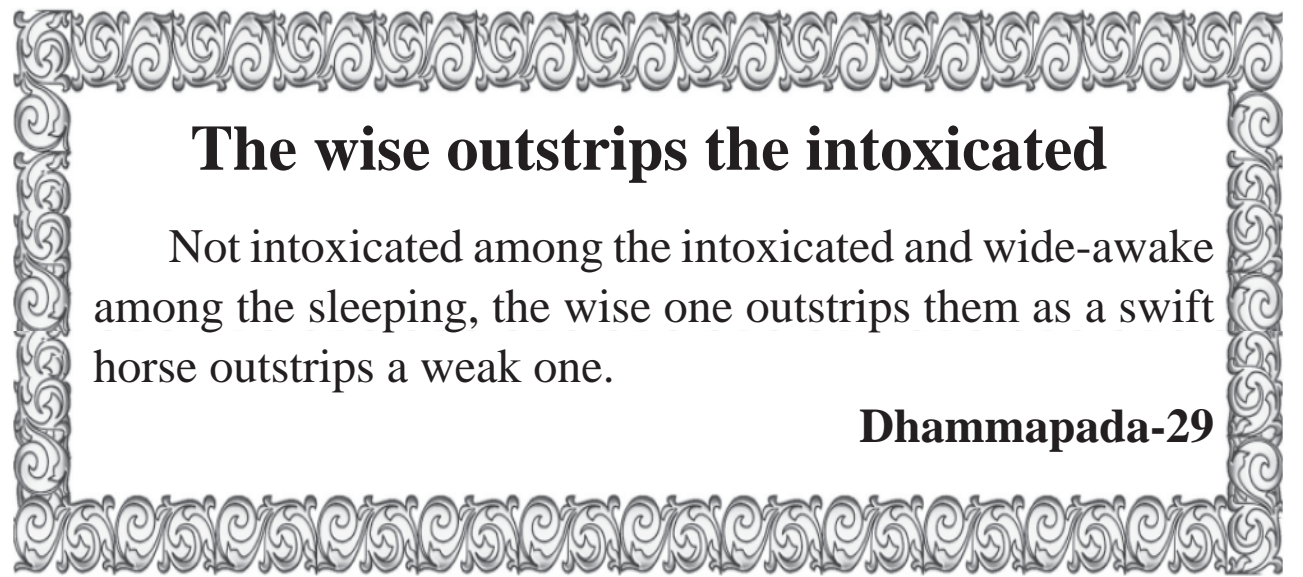

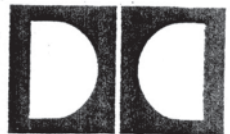

Study shows missile threat on Israeli bases not grave

JERUSALEM, 31 Aug — The ballistic missile threat to Israel Defence Force (IDF) bases in the central region and south is not as grave as thought, a recent

study conducted by the Army's Planning Division said.

According to the study, the bases would not need to be evacuated in the event of a war in the north, *The Jerusalem Post* reported on its website Friday.

The study was conducted by a team of officers and included an advanced analysis of the missiles in the arsenals of Israel's neighbours, particularly Syria and Hizbollah.

It was initiated following the Second Lebanon War, when 4,000

Hizbollah rockets struck northern Israel.

The study shows that although Syria and Hizbollah have thousands of short-range rockets and long-range ballistic missiles, their accuracy is limited.

The study further concluded that due to the inaccuracy of the Syrian and Hezbollah missiles, Ramat David Air Force Base situated near Nazareth need not evacuate and transfer the aircraft deployed there to alternative bases in the south as thought.

Mexican governor blames Gulf cartel for beheadings

CANCUN (Mexico), 31 Aug— The beheadings of twelve people in southern Mexico were probably the work of the powerful Gulf cartel based across the border from Texas, a state governor said on Friday.

Eleven beheaded bodies with signs of torture were dumped outside the city of Merida in the Yucatan Peninsula on Thursday.

A 12th beheaded body was found 50 miles (80 kilometres) away in a small town to the east of Merida, also showing signs of torture.

"This seems to be the work of the Gulf cartel," Yucatan Governor Ivonne Ortega told reporters, adding that she had received several threats from suspected drug gangs over the past three months.

Authorities say the cartel controls drug smuggling in seven states along the Gulf of Mexico from southern Mexico into Texas. —MNA/Xinhua

Bombs kill at least two Russian soldiers in Chechnya

Moscow, 31 Aug— At least two Russian soldiers have died in bombings in Chechnya, including a suicide attack on an Interior Ministry battalion base, Russian news agencies reported on Saturday.

One soldier died and 11 were wounded when two suicide bombers rammed a jeep packed with explosives through the fence of the base in Vedeno, south of the region's capital Grozny, a spokesman for the battalion was quoted as

saying by RIA. Another soldier died in a radio-controlled bomb attack in the village of Serzhen-Yurt, which lies between Vedeno and Grozny.

It was the second round of fatal attacks on Russian troops in the past week in Chechnya, a north Caucasus territory where Russia has fought two wars against separatist rebels since the breakup of the Soviet Union.

On Sunday, two senior Russian officers died after a gun and bomb attack on

their convoy.

Russian security officials have predicted a rise in rebel attacks in Chechnya after Russia's military incursion into neighboring Georgia, to crush Tbilisi's attempt to retake its breakaway province of South Ossetia.

Analysts say Moscow's decision to recognize rebel Georgian regions as independent states will encourage separatist sentiments in Chechnya and elsewhere in the Russian north Caucasus.—Internet

Russia to maintain diplomatic relations with Georgia

Moscow, 31 Aug — Moscow believes it is essential to maintain diplomatic relations with Georgia, the Russian Foreign Ministry said Friday.

"Georgia's Foreign Ministry informed us of its decision to lower diplomatic contacts and to cut the number of diplomats at its embassy in Moscow to five people," Andrei Nesterenko, a spokesman for the ministry, told a Press conference here.

"We regret such decisions, as we are confident that under the current circumstances it is essential to maintain working diplomatic contacts," he was quoted by the RIA Novosti news agency as saying.

Nesterenko also warned that NATO's actions toward a confrontation with Russia would result in irreversible consequences.

Weight loss may cut risk of colorectal growths

NEW YORK, 31 Aug — Obesity is associated with an increased risk of colorectal adenomas — growths or polyps that can become cancerous — but weight loss might reduce the risk, a study hints.

"Colorectal cancer is known to be associated with obesity," Dr. Yutaka Yamaji from University of Tokyo, Japan told Reuters Health. "Our data, together with previous reports,

shows pre-cancerous lesions are also associated with obesity."

Yamaji and colleagues investigated the relationship between obesity and the prevalence of colorectal polyps and studied the effect of weight loss on the development of these abnormal growths after one year. Almost 8000 "average-risk" subjects had an initial colonoscopy, and about 2500 of them had a

second examination a year later.

The prevalence of colorectal polyps at the initial colonoscopy increased proportionally with increasing body weight, the team found. Increasing body mass index, or BMI, was also associated with increasing numbers of colorectal polyps, but not with size or stage of the polyps.

Benefit of pelvic exercises on urine leaks wanes

NEW YORK, 31 Aug — In pregnant women, pelvic floor muscle training for bladder-control problems, though beneficial initially, is ineffective over the long term, research shows.

Stress-related urinary incontinence "is a risk factor for long-term leakage but not necessarily enough to require surgery," Dr Robert M Freeman from Derriford Hospital, Plymouth, UK told Reuters Health. Performing exercises before delivery designed to strengthen the pelvic floor muscles "does not seem to give good long-term results, and this is probably due to poor compliance", Freeman noted. The findings are based on 230 women who participated in two studies of the effectiveness of pelvic floor muscle training for preventing stress urinary incontinence after pregnancy. —MNA/Reuters

IAEA says nuclear leak did not reach environment

VIENNA, 31 Aug — A small amount of plutonium which leaked from an ageing International Atomic Energy Agency laboratory near Vienna did not reach the environment, according to an independent inquiry cited by the UN watchdog on Friday.

The 3 August incident at the Seibersdorf

analytical lab, which occurred overnight and caused no injury, raised a stir in Austria, which hosts the IAEA but rejects nuclear energy itself as fundamentally dangerous.

In a statement, the agency said test samples of soil, plants and water provided by outside Austrian experts found no release of radioactive

material into the environment from the incident.

A tiny amount of plutonium, a common nuclear bomb fuel, contained in an acid solution spilled from five small glass vials in a storage safe when one of them burst from a build-up of pressure, the statement said.

medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).

“The ministers agreed to improve enterprise environments as well as policies and regulations to promote the establishment, growth and develop-

ment of the micro, small- and medium-sized enterprises,” said Peruvian Production Minister Rafael Ray.

The APEC countries emphasized the importance of promoting the SMEs growth as part of their sustainable economic development, Rey said.—MNA/Xinhua

Strong earthquake in Tibet leaves no casualties

LHASA, 31 Aug — No casualties have been reported so far in the strong tremor measuring 6.8 on the Richter Scale that rocked Zhongba County, Xigaze Prefecture in Tibet on Monday, an inspection team leader Zhu Quan said on Saturday.

Zhu, the Tibet Seismological Bureau chief, said the team was continuing the assessment at the earthquake epicentre and found there is a big crack on the earth's crust.

“Some sections of the roads in the county are still blocked by mountain rocks that fell off in the earthquake, which impede the inspection team from entering six villages in the county,” Zhu told Xinhua over phone. Guo Chunming, an emergency disaster relief official with the team said that the strong jolt caused no big damages to the county, which is a sparsely-populated plateau pasturing place.

The newspaper quoted SriLankan Airline's CEO Manoj Gunawardena as saying that the appointment “is a significant event for the national carrier”.

Interestingly, Captain Anusha and her husband Captain Hemantha Siriratne also made history as the first husband-wife pilot duo in the country. Hemantha received his captain's appointment

earlier this year.

Captain Anusha is modest about her appointment and brushed off her achievement, which had been her childhood ambition.

“Women have lagged behind in the field of aviation in Sri Lanka, in comparison to the rest of the world. Even in neighbouring countries

such as India, women have been airline captains for many years now,” she was quoted as saying.

“It doesn't make a difference whether you are a man or a woman when flying. The circumstances don't change, the weather is the same, and the aircraft doesn't know the difference!” she said.

Storm “Gustav” shutting oil, gas output across Gulf

HOUSTON, 31 Aug— Oil and natural gas companies shut production across the Gulf of Mexico on Friday as they moved workers out of the

path of Tropical Storm Gustav ahead of what could be the worst hurricane to strike the nation's offshore oil patch since 2005.

Tropical Storm Gustav was expected to strengthen to a powerful Category 3 hurricane over the weekend before tearing into offshore production areas early next week.

With about a quarter of US oil output and 15 per cent of natural gas production in Gustav's path, US crude oil shot up 3 US dollars early Friday to above 118 per US dollars barrel as traders eyed possible supply disruption. As of Friday, 6.62 per cent of Gulf oil production and 1.84 per cent of natural gas production were shut in due to Gustav, the US Minerals Management Service said.

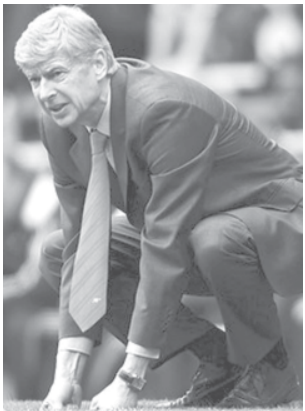
The Gunners were disappointing in defeat against Fulham last weekend but they returned to form as they put the FC Twente to the sword in the UEFA Champions League in midweek.

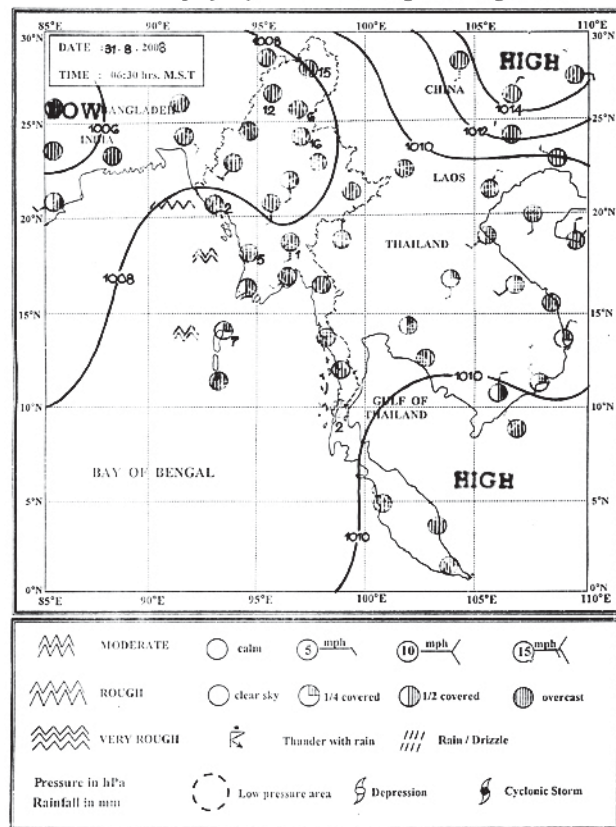
US military frees 11,000 detainees this year in Iraq

Iraq election law must pass mid-Sept for 2008 vote

BAGHDAD, 31 Aug — Iraq's Parliament must pass a contentious elections law by mid-September in order to allow anticipated provincial polls to be held this year, the Electoral Commission said on Saturday.

"If the law is passed

by September 9 or 10, we can hold the elections on December 22. If it's later than that, we will try for December 31," Commission head Faraj al-Haidari told Reuters. If the elections law has not been passed by then, the polls will slip into next year.

Further delays in the provincial vote, initially scheduled for October 1, are certain to frustrate Washington, which sees these elections as central to its efforts to help reconcile Iraq's rival factions and strengthen its fledgling democracy.
