Japanese PM Yasuo Fukuda resigns

Токуо, 1 Sept—The Japanese prime minister, Yasuo Fukuda, today resigned from the post after less than a year amid deadlock in his coalition government.

The increasingly unpopular 72-year-old has been struggling to cope with a divided parliament in which opposition parties control the upper house and can delay legislation.

Speculation Fukuda would have to go has been simmering for some months as his popularity slumped in the face of rising fuel and food prices.

Last week, his government unveiled plans for tax cuts and a major injection of government spending to cushion the blow of inflation, but the latest opinion polls showed support for him and his government continuing to fall.

Fukuda's resignation will not necessarily trigger a general election.

His party, the Liberal Democratic party, must pick a new leader and win confidence parliament's lower house in order to continue leading Japan's coalition government.

Fukuda's decision adds to a period of political instability for Japan. He took over following the sudden resignation of his predecessor, Shinzo Abe, who lasted only 12 months.

Georgia admits dropping cluster bombs

New York, 1 Sept— Georgia has admitted dropping cluster bombs during its attempt to regain control of its breakaway province of South Ossetia, a human rights group said today.

Human Rights Watch said it had received a letter from the Georgian defence ministry acknowledging the use of M85 cluster bombs near the Roki tunnel that connects South Ossetia with Russia.

Georgia launched its ill-fated campaign to retake South Ossetia last month, prompting Russia to invade Georgia and occupy Georgian territory.

The South Ossetia conflict was the first time cluster bombs were deployed since the Lebanon war in 2006, when M85s were used extensively by Israel against Hizbullah.

Cluster munitions, which contain dozens or hundreds of smaller submunitions or bomblets, have been condemned because of their capacity

to kill and maim civilians. Many do not immediately explode, causing civilian casualties for months or years to come.

The convention on cluster munitions agreed in May comprehensively bans the use, production, trade and stockpiling of the weapon. It will be open for signature in Oslo on December 3.

10 killed in shelling in Pakistan's tribal area

ISLAMABA, 1Sept. -At least 10 people were killed as a shell hit their house in Pakistan's tribal area on Monday, the News Network International (NNI) news agency reported.

The 10 people, mostly women and children belonging to the same family were killed when a shell fired by security forces against the militants landed at their house at the town of Enayat Qila in Bajaur tribal region, according to NNI.

Interior Advisor to Prime Minister Rehman Malik last week said security forces would halt operation against militants with respect to the Islamic holy month of Ramadan, which will begin on Tuesday.

Death toll rises to 40 in SW China earthquake

Huili, Sichuan, 1 Sept Two more deaths were reported Monday afternoon in Huili County, bringing the death toll from the 6.1-magnitude quake that struck southwest China's Sichuanand Yunnan provinces on Saturday to 40, according to local authorities.

The county in Sichuan reported 25 deaths as 8 a.m. Monday. The Ministry of Civil Affairs announced on Monday night that the quake had injured 675 people as of 4 p.m. Monday in the two provinces.

More than 392,000 houses collapsed or were destroyed and about 181,000 people were evacuated. A total of 941,000 people were affected, said the ministry.

The quake jolted Huili and Panzhihua, both in Sichuan, and autonomous prefectures of Chuxiong, Dali, Lijiang and Zhaotong cities, all in Yunnan Province. Kunming, the capital of Yunnan, was also hit.Most of the fatalities were in Huili, Chuxiong and Panzhihua, which sit on the southern end of the fault line involved in the massive May 12 quake that left more than 69,000 people dead and nearly 18,000 missing.

More than 15,120 tents, 20,000 quilts and 15 million yuan (about 2.2 million US dollars) in aid have been allocated to the quake areas in Sichuan. The Yunnan provincial government will allocate 30 million yuan for quake relief apart from tents and quilts, according to the

Blast in Philippine bus terminal kills 6

Manila, 1 Sept — A powerful blast ripped through a bus at a terminal in the troubled southern Philippines on Monday, killing six people and injuring 27 others, army and police said.

Cesario Darantinan, police chief in Davao del Sur province Mindanao, said the bus was waiting passengers at a terminal in the town of Digos when an explosive device went off inside the vehicle.

"It could have been a crude bomb that was set offremotely," Darantinan said. "The explosion was so powerful that the bus was almost broken into



Kaubl, 1 Sept— Foreign and Afghan forces killed five children in two separate incidents Monday, further inflaming tensions in the country over the killings of civilians by troops from the US and other countries.

NATO said it accidentally killed three children in an artillery strike eastern in Afghanistan. It said NATO forces fired the rounds after insurgents attacked its patrol in Gayan district of Paktika province and one of the rounds hit a house, killing three children and injuring seven civilians.

In a separate incident, foreign and Afghan forces killed a man and his two children and during a raid near Kabul, police and witnesses said. Angry men gathered at the victims' house in the Utkheil area east of the capital, where the three bodies were displayed inside a mud-walled compound. The man's wife was wounded in the operation, said Yahya Khan, a cousin.

The latest deaths deepened strains between the Afghan government under pressure from an increasingly irate public and foreign forces in the

country who are accused of killing dozens of civilians only in the past few weeks.

Venezuela rejects visit of **US** anti-drug chief

C ARACAS, 1 Sept—The Venezuelan Foreign Ministry has rejected a visit by John P. Walters, director of the US National Drug Control Policy office, calling the proposed trip useless and ill-timed.

A ministry statement issued Sunday said the American anti-drug chief

"would better use his time to control the flourishing drug trafficking and abuse in his own country."


Venezuelans are displeased with the visit, it added. The fight against drugs has actually seen "significant progress in Venezuela in the last few years, especially since the

Bolivarian government ended the cooperation programs with the US Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)," the statement said.

Venezuela ended cooperation with the DEA in 2006, accusing it of espionage. The government of President Hugo Chavez reaffirmed Sunday that the DEA operated in an illegal way on Venezuelan territory, and openly conspired against the South American country's democratic and constitutional order.

The US government has been able to send thousands of soldiers to Iraq and to persecute Latin American countries, yet it was inefficient in the fight against drugs, the ministry statement said.

The two leaders met in the early afternoon in Jerusalem for the second time since probes-plagued Olmert announced on 30 July that he would not contend in the upcoming primary of his ruling Kadima party and would resign upon the election of his successor.

During the meeting, the pair pledged to continue the negotiations for a peace pact by the end of this year, as they promised at a US-hosted peace conference at Annapolis last November when they resumed the long-stalled peace talks, according to the report.—*Internet*

Wellington, 1 Sept— An earthquake measuring 5.8 on the Richter scale struck New Zealand's North Island on Monday, the GNS Science said.

The quake, which occurred at 1:21 pm local time (1:21 GMT Monday), was centered 10 km southeast of the central North Island town of Turangi and 260 km north of Wellington at a depth of 80 km. No casualties or damage were reported.

Anti-war protesters set to stage massive rally at opening day of **Republic convention**

ST PAUL, The United States, 1 Sept—Anti-war protesters said Sunday that they will still stage a massive rally as the Republican National Convention (RNC) kicks off here on 1 Sept.

The convention's scaled-back activities and a series of law enforcement raids will not force them to change the rally plan, Jess Sundin, a spokeswoman for the Coalition to March on the RNC and Stop the War, told reporters. "Plans for tomorrow's massive antiwar march are well in hand," he said, "People will not let the RNC gather in St Paul without aloud and clear response from us." The coalition's protest will begin at 11 am (1600 GMT) with a rally at the Minnesota State Capitol building and continue with a march past the Republican convention headquarters at the Xcel Energy Center in St Paul.

Or ganizers have said they expect as many as 50,000 people to participate. The event comes a day after convention organizers announced that they will scale back Monday's activities because of the expected landfall of Hurricane Gustav on the Gulf Coast.

China to produce world's fastest bullet train

Beijing, 1 Sept — China will produce the world's fastest bullet train for the Beijing-Shanghai high-speed railway, a senior railway official has said.

Zhang Shuguang, deputy chief engineer with the Ministry of Railways, said the domestically developed train will run at 380 kph, the highest speed for any railway in the world.

And if the project materializes, the travel time

between the two metropolises will be cut from five to around four hours, enhancing the rail network's competitive edge against airlines, he said.

Previously, China planned to run trains at 350 kph on the 1,318-km Beijing-Shanghai line, the same speed as on the Beijing-Tianjin intercity passenger railway that opened a month ago.


And the travel time is estimated at five hours, about half of the current time. Manufacturing 380kph trains in China is already possible in terms of technology, he said.

China has established a comprehensive system for bullet train manufacturing, including basic theory, design, manufacture, maintenance and appraisal, he said. —Xinhua

Indonesian energy firm eyes \$800 mln power projects

JAKARTA, 1 Sept- Indonesian state-owned energy company Adhi Karya sought a possibility to develop four steam power plants projects worth 800 million US dollars, a paper said here Monday.

Director for finance of the company Indradjaja Manopol was quoted by Bisnis daily as saying that the funds to finance the projects would be from rights issue of the shares of the company.

"Now, we are conducting negotiation to get the projects," he said.

The director expected that the negotiation would be completed before the year end.

Indonesian State-Owned Enterprises Minister Sofyan Djalil said that the government was ready to purchase the shares released by firms as soon as at the end of this year.

The broader Topix index of all First Section issues on the Tokyo Stock Exchange was down 24.07 points, or 1.92 percent, to 1,230.64. On the First Section, declining issues out-numbered advancing ones 1,485 to 194, with 41 others remaining unchanged.

Trading volume on the main section came to 1,342.13 million shares, down from Friday's 1,779.25 million.

Value leader Mizuho Financial Group plunged 9,000 yen, or nearly 2 percent, to 461,000 yen.

Volume leader GS Yuasa, a manufacturer of batteries, climbed 18yen, or over 3 percent, to 580 yen. The TSE's Second Section index was down 9.04 points, or 0.35 percent, to 2,555.02 on a volume of 27.97 million shares.

Education as Social Elevator

As EDUCATION is regarded as social elevator, literacy, the main foundation of education becomes a global challenge to overcome for all countries in the world. Due to the tremendous and continuous efforts the statistics show improvement during last decades, but the challenge remains a threat to some countries where the situation does not favour. There are estimated 774 million illiterate adults and two thirds of whom are women and most of them are from low-income, often heavily indebted countries with widespread household poverty. The lowest literacy rates are found in Africa, South and West Asia and the Arab States.

The definitions of literacy

The definitions of literacy vary from countries to countries based on their own context such as basic literacy, post-literacy, functional literacy, and skills-based literacy and so on. In some countries, even the term computer literacy is used to scale up the potential of the citizens for the social and economic development. But basic literacy is by no means the minimum prerequisite for life long learning society to face the challenges of the 21st century. With the change of concept, one futurist refers to literacy as 'the illiterates of the 21st century won't be those who can't read and write but those who can't learn, unlearn and relearn'.

Education for All plan and literacy

After the declaration of EDUCATION for ALL in1990 in Jomtien, the nations with close cooperation and support of UN agencies and organizations initiated their own plans to combat illiteracy. This movement was being reinforced by another global commitment of Education for All plan to be continued from 2000 to 2015 after the Global Education Forum held in Dakar, Senegal.

Education for All (EFA) plan in all countries encompasses Literacy and Continuing Education as one of the six goals to be implemented for all countries. The fourth EFA goal is "achieving a 50 per cent improvement in levels of adult literacy by 2015, especially for women, and equitable access to basic and continuing education for all adults." This also means that there will be a lot of illiterates after the year 2015 creating an unaccomplished task for all countries. The challenge will continue for centuries.

Reaching the Unreached

The most difficult task for all countries is to facilitate the remaining adult illiterates to become literates. For this, UNESCO is trying to encourage all countries to prepare EFA Mid-Decade Assessment Report in 2007-08 focusing on the unreached and underserved groups. In this regards, the theme "Reaching the Unreached" is adopted as the theme for all countries to identify the groups whom to be given top priorities for the implementation of EFA. Now UNESCO, SEAMEO and ASEAN has jointly initiated a common task to address the unreached and underserved groups in South East Asian countries and to facilitate these countries for the realizing of EFA 2015 goals

International Literacy Day

September 8 was proclaimed International Literacy Day by UNESCO on November 17, 1965. It was first celebrated on 1966. The aim is to highlight the importance of literacy to individuals, communities and societies. The theme International Literacy Day changes from year to year and the theme for 2008 is "Literacy and Health," placing special focus on the vital relationship between literacy and health. In particular, International Literacy Day 2008 has a strong emphasis on Literacy and Epidemics with a focus on

communicable diseases such as HIV, Tuberculosis and Malaria, some of the world's most important public health concerns. This reminds us that only basic skills of reading, writing and numeracy are not enough for the improvement of not only the individual but also the family and the community wellbeing. Literacy is an empowering process and essential to development. Right health care practices can help develop the healthy world.

UNESCO Literacy Prizes

UNESCO is evaluating literacy programmes and projects around the world and literacy organizations are awarded for their excellent performance in literacy programmes yearly. For the year 2008 UNESCO Literacy Prizes are awarded to literacy projects as follows:

- * UNESCO International Reading Association Literacy Prize is awarded to the Curitiba City Council in Brazil
- * The UNESCO King Sejong Literacy Prize goes to the People's Action Forum from Zambia
- * UNESCO Confucious Prizes for Literacy to Operation Upgrade of South Africa and the Adult and Non-formal Education in Ethiopia.

UN Initiatives

As mentioned above, EFA, a global initiative was first introduced in 1990 jointly sponsored by UNDP, UNESCO, UNICEF and the World Bank. International agencies together with all the governments give the highest priority in combating the illiteracy and widening the scope depth and breadth. Thus, **Literacy for All** is a common agreement of all countries as a minimum prerequisite for Education for All and all countries have been taking more serious effort to eradicate illiteracy. To energize the task towards the reaching of the goal of

50 percent improvement in adult literacy rates by 2015, United Nations Literacy Decade was designated starting from 2003 to 2012. This year marks the midway of this initiative. The United Nations Organization initiates regular monitoring mechanism to achieve the eight UN Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) ranging from halving poverty to halting the spread of HIV/AIDS and providing universal primary education — all by the target date of 2015.

Literacy in Myanmar

One of the six Myanmar EFA goals is "achieving significant improvement in the levels of functional literacy and continuing education for all by 2015". Literacy is given high priority in Myanmar and programmes have been adopted in line with longterm basic education development plan, EFA programmes and also with the UN Millennium Goal. Efforts are made for ensuring literacy for all citizens. Emphasis has also been given to the remote and border areas where most of the ethnic groups lagged behind for many years regarding access to education and development of reading and writing skills. As a result the adult literacy rate of the country in 2008 has been increased to 94.83% due to the concerted effort of the Ministry of Education and other line ministries, International Agencies, INGOs, GOs, regional and local authorities and the communities. Special arrangements are being made for the states and divisions to increase literacy rates. Special 3Rs programme in border areas initiated in Myanmar in 1996 is regarded as one of the best practices in Asia and the Pacific Regions. Initiation of Community Learning Centres (CLC) helps the newly literate learners to gain a good foundation for basic literacy. CLSs are now being introduced under the supervision of the Department of Myanmar Education Research Bureau (DMERB).

A CLC can be regarded as an information centre, a vocational training centre, a discussion club, a reading centre, a library, a cultural centre and an entertainment centre. Continuing education programmes are being conducted to upgrade literacy skills, generate more family income and to improve quality of life of the literate people. Self-reliance village libraries initiated by the Ministry of Information are of great support for neo-literates for the attainment of literacy and other literate persons for the enrichment of their knowledge and information aiming for rural development. To help support the literacy related activities, the Myanmar Literacy Resource Centre (MLRC) was established in March 2000. One of the functions of MLRC is the training of NFE personnel at various levels by conducting training workshops.

The Way Forward

With the complexity of the changing world, Continuing Education (CE) Programmes comprising post-literacy, functional literacy, income generating programmes, quality of life improvement programmes and equivalency programmes need to be reinforced and strengthened mobilizing resources for the socioeconomic development of the individuals, communities and societies at large. The organizers need to utilize the existing facilities such as village self-helped libraries, and Community Learning Centres (CLCs).

Since illiteracy is still a challenge, tremendous efforts have to be made in the interest of the country at all levels: regional, national, and local. For the reduction of illiteracy rate the following approaches should be adopted:

- * expand quality basic education for all girls and boys
- * scale up youth and adult literacy programmes
- * develop rich literate environments

New Orleans evacuates for "Big ugly storm"

New Orleans, 1 Sept—Tens of thousands of people in New Orleans and the US Gulf Coast fled their homes on Sunday as Hurricane Gustav moved within 24 hours of striking land, possibly with a weaker punch than 2005's Hurricane Katrina.

The oil industry from Texas to New Orleans was taking no chances either, shutting down nearly all offshore platforms and many refineries as Gustav threatened the region that pumps a quarter of the US oil supply.

Long lines of cars and buses streamed out of New Orleans after Mayor Ray Nagin ordered mandatory evacuation of the city of 239,000 and told residents, "This is still a big ugly storm, still storng and I encourage everyone leave."

Forecasters projected Gustav would land west of New Orleans around midday on Monday, and the Lousiana coast could see strong winds and rain Sunday evening. But it was no longer expected to be a Category 4 hurricane of the five-step Saffir-Simpson scale.

Biofertilizers help boost production of crops in seawater-flooded farmlands

Due to the entry of seawater together with tidal waves, the soil of an affected area loses not only fertility but also nutrients and humus. Moreover, that kills microscopic living things that encourage soil.

He said, "Organic and biofertilizers are only things that can regenerate the fertility of paddy fields because fertilizers contain humus. If we put fertilizers on a land, the land will regain various types of fertility it has lost. In addition, fertilizers can improve the propagation process of microscopic living things in a field."

In Myanmar, the delta, and coastal regions

in Yangon and Taninthayi divisions and Rakhine State can be flooded by seawater. Salt solution rate can be measured with the use of an EC metre. Paddy grows well in a field with salt content of two millimoores. If a paddy field has salt content of 4.8 millimores, the paddy yield can fall by 50 per cent. In Myanmar, salt solution reaches its peak at the rate of about 10 millimores from March to

"Paddy cultivation methods are of two kinds: nursery method, and sowing method. A field put under paddy with nursery method is more affected by salt solution than a field with sowing method. A paddy plant is affected by salt solution most when it is in leaf. If a paddy field has adverse effect of high salt solution rate, it will produce a large amount of under developed grain." Said Dr Win Htin.

Paddy agriculturalist U Zaw Than of the Myanma Agriculture Service said, "We should choose bio-supreme fertilizer to regenerate farmlands and paddy fields that have been flooded by seawater because the microscopic living things in bio-supreme fertilizers shape the sodium in the water into small crystals. Bio-supreme fertilizers can

prevent paddy plants from having their tubes to gain nutrients blocked by salt crystals, sodium poisoning, thirsty, and lack of potassium and magnesium."

Super-K fertilizer should be put at least once every 15 days on the seawater-flooded paddy fields in order that paddy plants will regain their strength.

He said, "On average, we should use two to four bags of bio-supreme fertilizers for an acre of paddy field. If we want to regenerate a field before growing paddy and when paddy plants propagate and they are affected by fungus, we should put two bags on an acre of paddy. If we use pale fertilizer and bio-supreme fertilizer in combination, the potency of pale fertilizer can be increased about three times. The benefit reaches its peak if we combine two bags of biosupreme fertilizer and eight small baskets of *pale* fertilizer.

Soil expert U Aye Tun of the Myanma Agriculture Service said, "We should get real raw materials to produce biofertilizers. Such

fertilizers needed to have high temperature to kill germs. It is needed to control the quality of the products. The ratio of carbon and nitrogen should not be more than 20-30 to 1. Otherwise, the microscopic living things cannot grow.

"And we should use correct production method in order that we can get quality fertilizer. Moreover, we should have a laboratory for quality

control."

Farmer Daw Myint Myint Maw of Hse Village in Thongwa Township, Yangon Division, who uses biofertilizers said, "Here, Hsin-thwe-lat and Yakyaw strains of paddy are mostly used in the seawater-flooded fields.

The average paddy yield of a field is about 60 baskets an acre. I used two bags of bio-supreme fertilizer and four small baskets of pale fertilizer in combination, and the paddy yield increased to more than 70 baskets. In the past, paddy did not

grow well if they were grown as mixed crop with beans and pulses. Now, we find monsoon paddy fields successful when we use bio-supreme fertilizer."

Using bio-supreme fertilizer not only in seawater flooded fields but also in other farmlands, farmers can boost production of crops. So, farmers should maintain their fields and use fertilizers systematically.

CARACAS, 1 Sept-Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez on Sunday warned the US ambassador to his country not to interfere in its domestic affairs or he would be expelled.

Chavez said his government will not accept any interference or disrespect, referring to recent criticism from Ambassador Patrick Duddy on the rise of drug-trafficking in Venezuela.

During his Sunday TV and radio program "Hello, President," Chavez said the United States was the biggest producer of marijuana in the world and its plantations are located in the state of Virginia.

The US' drug shipments leave from Colombia, where the United States has military bases, he said.

He accused the US Drug Enforcement Agency of collaborating with drug dealers, adding that Venezuelan Vice President Ramon Carrizales will hold a press conference on the issue Monday. —Internet

New 600 km road to link four Cambodian provinces along Thai border

PHNOM PENH, 1 Sept— Cambodian military officials hoped a new road will bolster local populations and improve security in four provinces along the Cambodian-Thai border, local media reported Monday.

The more than 600 km road will link Banteay Meanchey, Oddar Meanchey, Preah Vihear and Stung Treng provin-ces, the Phnom Penh Post said.

"We will build the road through the four provinces as soon as the rainy season passes," Kvan Siem, head of general command headquarters for military engineers,

was quoted as saying.

"I received orders from Prime Minister Hun Sen to build the road to help people settle their homes along the border and farm their lands," Kvan Siem said, adding that he completed a study of the projected gravel road earlier in August.

The proposed road will run between one and four kilometres from the Thai border, with a second road planned closer to the border once Thailand and Cambodia complete negotiations over new border demarcations.

Flood situation worsens in Bangladesh

DHAKA, 1 Sept — The overall flood situation in Bangladesh has deteriorated suddenly recently and experts say the situation could worsen in the next couple of days.

Fresh areas in northern and central parts of the country were inundated Sunday marooning tens of thousands of people, leading newspaper The Daily Star reported Monday.

Water levels of all major rivers are expected to continue to rise in the next three days by six inches a day. This would inundate many areas of 20 northern and central districts out of total 64 districts in the country, officials said at a press conference here on Sunday.

"The next 48 hours is very crucial. If the situation does not improve within this time, the flooding may linger like in 1988 and 1998," said engineer Saiful Islam, director of Flood Forecasting and Warning Center (FFWC). —Internet

Ban calls for next US president to show greater leadership

GENEVA, 1 Sept— The next US president should show greater leadership in tackling the global climate change challenge, UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said here on Sunday.

"Now with the expected change of the administration of the United States, of course I would expect that the future president, whoever may be, will have to exercise greater leadership," Ban told journalists after attending a ceremony marking the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC).

Ten killed in cattle raid in northern Kenya

NAIROBI, 1 Sept — At least 10 people were killed and several others wounded in Kenya's northern district of Turkana by suspected cattle rustlers from Toposa, southern Sudan on Saturday.

According to local administrators, the raiders armed with AK-47 rifles have struck Mogila area in Lokichogio division and stole 732 animals.

Turkana North District Commissioner Jack Obuo confirmed the deaths and said will ascertain the extent of the raids.

"I am on the ground with other security of ficers to ascertain what is going on but the minister will issue a statement about the recent raids," Obuo said on Sun-

Tension is high in the area on Sunday as contingents of heavily armed police officers pursued the raid-

"It appeared they crossed over to Ethiopia but we are still pursuing them," a senior police officer said.

Eight of those killed were area residents who were shot by cattle rustlers at about midday on Saturday while the other two were raiders who were shot and seriously wounded during the confrontation.—Internet

UK mulls new concept for 2012 Olympic ceremonies

London, 1 Sept—The opening and closing ceremonies of the 2012 Olympic Games should involve all of London, not just the main stadium in Stratford in the east of the capital, Olympics Minister Tessa Jowell said on Saturday.

Olympic Games are traditionally opened and closed at a single venue as happened earlier this month in Beijing, where China won plaudits for its extravagant ceremonies in the futuristic Bird's Nest stadium. "We don't want to try to emulate Beijing," Jowell told the *Independent* newspaper in an interview. "What we want is new ways of thinking about the opening ceremony. "We want the whole of London to be involved, with different parts of London taking part in the ceremony. The London Games must be deeply democratic, with the city's citizens feeling they're intimately involved."

Jowell is also assessing a ticketing system similar to the one used by the organizers of the Wimbledon tennis grand slam, where unused tickets are re-issued to minimize the number of empty seats. "I want to minimize the number of empty seats in stadiums, which frustrate the public and keep them at a distance for no reason," Jowell said.—MNA/Reuters

With the reopening, some 500 people have crossed into Egypt and 700 have returned home to Gaza, the Egyptian sources said.

Palestinian officials said more than 1,000 Egyptians and Gazans with foreign residency permits had crossed into Egypt.

Hamas wants Egypt to open Rafah permanently to ease the Israel-led blockade on Gaza, but under a US-brokered accord it cannot do so without the consent of President Mahmoud Abbas, whose Fatah movement is Hamas's rival.

"The opening of Rafah for a few days will alleviate the suffering of our people," said Hamas spokesman Sami Abu Zuhri.—MNA/Reuters

Bulgaria sends 43 tons of humanitarian aid to Georgia

Sofia, 1 Sept—Bulgaria has shipped 43 tons of humanitarian aid for the Georgian people who have suffered loss and damage due to the military actions in the region, local Sofia news agency reported Saturday citing the Bulgarian Government Press centre.

The aid was decided by the Government last Monday. It consists mostly of medicaments and is valued at nearly 254,000 leva (about 191,000 US dollars).

The sending of more Bulgarian aid, in the form of financial assistance for the South Ossetia refugees is also forthcoming. The humanitarian aid provided by the Bulgarian Government is a timely expression of solidarity with the affected population of Georgia, including people who are in the territory of the Russian Federation, the Government said last Monday in a Press release.—MNA/Xinhua

High waters, heavy rain hamper Indian flood relief

PATNA (India), 1Sept— Indian authorities, hampered by heavy rain and damaged roads, were struggling on Saturday to get aid to millions of displaced villagers in the eastern state of Bihar, hit by the worst flooding in 50 years.

The Kosi River burst a dam in neighbouring Nepal earlier this month, deluging Bihar and drowning village after village in its path as authorities failed to evacuate millions in time. About 85 people have been killed and more than two million displaced by floodwaters that have smashed houses and destroyed 100,000 hectares (247,000 acres) of farmland. "Rains are killing our rescue and relief efforts," Bihar Disaster Management Department Minister Nitish Mishra told Reuters.

"Our helicopters were barely able to fly for most of the day yesterday as it continued raining heavily till 4 p.m.," he said. On Friday, an overcrowded Army boat carrying dozens of flood victims overturned in the swollen river, drowning at least 20 people and leaving 10 unaccounted for. Some 350,000 people have been evacuated over the past 10 days and thousands are marooned, said Pratyay Amrit, a Bihar disaster management official. —MNA/Reuters

Police break up **Bangladesh** protesters, 50 hurt

Dнака, 1 Sept—At least 50 people were injured when Bangladesh police fired teargas and used batons to disperse textile workers protesting against the sacking of fellowworkers on Saturday, police and witnesses said. Five policemen were also among the injured, hit by missiles thrown by workers who also ransacked a garment factory and damaged several vehicles on a road in Gazipur, 40 kilometres (25 miles) north of Dhaka. Eighteen workers at a local garment factory were sacked on Friday for violating factory rules and colleagues walked out to demand their reinstatement.—MNA/Reuters

McCain criticizes Bush on torture of prisoners

ST LOUTS, 1 Sept— Republican presidential candidate John McCain, a former prisoner of war in Vietnam, on Sunday issued some of his harshest criticism to date of the use of torture against terrorism suspects during President George W Bush's Administration. In an interview on Fox News, the Arizona Senator laid out his differences with Bush on a number of issues, citing torture as a key sticking point between him and the current president.

"I obviously don't want to torture any prisoners. There is a long list of areas that we were in disagreement on," McCain said of Bush. Fox interviewer Chris Wallace asked McCain if he was suggesting that Bush did want to torture prisoners.

"Well, waterboarding to me is torture, OK?" McCain responded. "And waterboarding was advocated by the administration, and according to a published report, was used." Bush has said the United States does not practice torture. But the Central Intelligence Agency has admitted using waterboarding, a form of simulated drowning, and a recent Justice Department probe cited cases of sleep disruption, "short shackl-ing" and other physical techniques against terrorism suspects captured after the 11 September attacks.

McCain suffered torture at the hands of his captors during more than five years in a Vietnam prison camp.

Taking stairs instead of lift could save life

Geneva, 1 Sept — Banning the use of lifts and escalators led to better fitness, less body fat, trimmer waistlines and a drop in blood pressure, a study of 69 people found.

This translates to a 15% cut in the risk of dying prematurely from any cause, calculate the University of Geneva team.

The results were revealed at a meeting of the European Society of Cardiology.

Before the study, the 69 participants had what the researchers described as a sedentary lifestyle, meaning they did less than two hours of exercise or sport each week and climbed fewer than 10

flights of stairs each day. Over the 12 weeks of

the study, the volunteers, who were hospital employees at the university, were asked to use the stairs exclusively at work instead of taking the lift.

On average, the number of flights of stairs - classed as climbing up or down one storey - rose from five per day to 23.

After the three months of the trial, tests showed they had better lung capacity, blood pressure cholesterol and measurements.

Their weight, body fat and waist measurements also dropped, and their capacity for doing aerobic exercise improved.

Taken together, this equates to a 15% reduction in the chances of dying young, say investigators.

Lead researcher Dr Philippe Meyer, said: "This suggests that stair climbing can have major public health implications."

He said the findings now needed to be confirmed with larger studies.

Professor Adam Timmis, consultant cardiologist at Bart's and The London NHS Trust, said: "It's a small study but valuable because it provides a practical way for busy working people to increase their exercise capacity.— Internet

The talks came only one day before EU leaders meet for an emergency summit to discuss the Caucasus crisis.


Mexican President fractures shoulder in bike fall Mexico City, 1 Sept

Commerce, Home Affairs winners in Nay Pyi Taw Inter-Ministry Football Tournament



Yangon, 1 Sept—Minister for Forestry Brig-Gen Thein Aung went to Kokway Timber Extraction Camp in Taunggyi on 29 August and urged officials concerned to make efforts for afforestation and meeting the objectives of the Forest Department.

At the meeting, Deputy General Manager of Shan State (South) Timber Extraction U Sein Win reported to the minister on tasks for extraction of timber from Shan State (South) and Director of Forest Department U Kyaw Soe Khaing on forest plantation and conservation of reserve forests and seizure of timber smuggling.

Member of the Central Executive Committee of Union Solidarity and Development Association Minister Brig-Gen Thein Aung and Chairman of Kayah State Peace and Development Council Brig-Gen Win Myint attended a ceremony to conclude transplanting paddy seedlings at Htayngarhlyar Village in Loikaw Township on 30 August.
