Koike eyes bid as Japan's first woman PM

TOKYO, 3 Sept—Yuriko Koike emerged Wednesday as a possible contender to be Japan's first female prime minister, with heavyweights in the ailing ruling party urging her to challenge conservative favourite Taro Aso.

Koike, 56, a former television anchorwoman

who has been a defence minister and environment minister, has stayed coy on whether she will contest a party vote on 22 September to replace outgoing Prime Minister Yasuo Fukuda.

Fukuda, who has faced months of low poll ratings, announced his resignation Monday, plunging Japan's long-dominant ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) into crisis mode.

Liberal Democratic Party General elections must be held by September 2009, but the government is in trouble against an emboldened opposition while the economy, the

world's second biggest, is teetering on the verge of recession.

"I want to consider what we need in general, rather than my own individual situation," Koike told reporters when asked if she would seek the top job. "I'm contacting various people since you can't play a baseball game all by yourself."

Hidenao Nakagawa, the former number two of the party and a backroom fixer, hinted at his support for Koike following their meeting Tuesday, saying: "We have to pick a candidate among reformists."—*Internet*

Police arrest 300 in anti-Republican rallies

ST PAUL, 3 Sept—Police used tear gas and chemical sprays to disperse hundreds of defiant protesters marching against President George W

Bush's policies outside the Republican convention site.

Several arrests were made, bringing to nearly 300 the number of people held in two days of

clashes outside the convention centre in St Paul, Minnesota, police said.

Some of the protesters reportedly tried to scale a security fence around the Excel Energy Centre, forcing police, wearing masks and other riot gear, to fire tear gas on the crowd.

Several demonstrators were seen in television footage hurling back tear gas canisters to scores of policemen guarding the centre, where Republican delegates are set to anoint Senator John McCain as the party's presidential hope.—*Internet*

'Civilians killed by US troops'

ISLAMABAD, 3 Sept — US soldiers were accused of killing up to 20 civilians—including women and children—in a pre-dawn raid inside Pakistan.

The commandos were alleged to have crossed the border from Afghanistan and launched an assault in a village in Pakistan's South Waziristan region.

A local governor, who is the chief administrator for the tribal belt, said three coalition helicopter gunships and commandos were involved in an "outrageous" attack.

"At least 20 innocent civilians of Pakistan, including women and children, were martyred," Owais Ahmed Ghani said in a statement. Pakistani officials said both the Army and the Foreign Ministry were investigating.

"There was darkness at the time when the Americans came and killed our innocent people," villager Habib Khan Wazir told the AP news agency.

"We would have not allowed them to go back alive if they had come to our village in daylight."—*Internet*

Haitians stranded on roofs in flooded city

SAINT-MARC, 3 Sept—Haitian families scrambled onto rooftops and screamed for help Tuesday in a city flooded by Tropical Storm Hanna, as UN peacekeepers and rescue convoys tried in vain to reach them.

By Tuesday night, Hanna claimed 21 lives in Haiti, including 12 dead in the state containing the cutoff city of Gonaives, said Marie Alta Jean-Baptiste of the country's civil protection office in Port-au-Prince, the capital.

Iris Norsil, 20, managed to flee Gonaives on Haiti's western shore and told *The Associated Press* that people there were isolated by muddy floodwaters as evening fell, seeking refuge on rooftops as wind gusts drove horizontal sheets of rain.—*Internet*

Six dead, two wounded in Wash state shooting spree

ALGER, 3 Sept—A terrifying shooting spree that stretched from a small northwest Washington town onto the state's busiest highway left six people dead and at least two more wounded on Tuesday.

The dead included a Skagit County sheriff's deputy and the wounded included a Washington State Patrol trooper who was shot while trying to catch the shooter on Interstate 5, the State Patrol said. A suspect in the shootings, a recently released convict with a history of mental illness, has surrendered.

China set to raise poverty line

BEIJING, 3 Sept—The government may raise the poverty line to enable more people to get State benefits to meet their needs, officials and experts said Tuesday.

The State Council, or the country's cabinet, will discuss such a proposal by the end of the year, Renmin University of China professor Wang Sangui said.

Lu Yan, spokeswoman for the council's Leading Group Office of Poverty Alleviation and Development, confirmed that the

authorities were considering the proposal but declined to give details. The cost of living in China is lower than in many other countries, hence the existing poverty threshold is an income of 1,067 yuan (152 US dollars) a year.

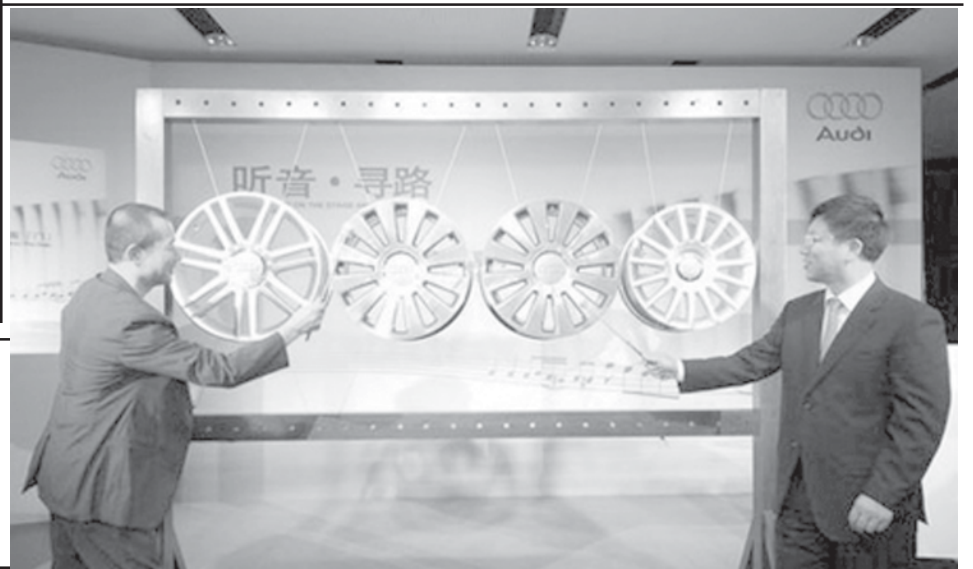
So if the proposed 1,300-yuan-a-year (186 dollars) income (equivalent to 1 dollar a day in other countries) becomes the new threshold, the number of Chinese living in poverty would almost double to 80 million.

About 43 million people

were living below the poverty line in the country's rural areas in 2007. Their number in urban areas was more than 22 million.

people were so friendly to guests from all around the world, I believe that China will do their best in the Paralympic games, too," said the chairman.

The Israeli delegation for Beijing Paralympics, which left for Beijing this week, comprises 42 athletes and 15 coaches. They will compete in swimming, shooting, table tennis, rowing, tennis, archery, basketball, equestrian, track and field, sailing and cycling.

Four years ago, Israeli players won four gold, four silver and five bronze medals at Athens Paralympic Games.

Bank of Korea says repeat of financial crisis unlikely

SEOUL, 3 Sept—Bank of Korea (BOK) Governor Lee Seong-tae said although the country's current economy is undergoing difficulty, South Korea is unlikely to go through another financial crisis, the Korea Herald reported Wednesday.

Lee said at a seminar hosted by the National Assembly's Economic Policy Forum that downward pressure on the value of the won is likely to continue but it is unlikely to lead to massive capital outflow.

"Because foreign debt and foreign exchange rates are linked, the downward pressure on the won will continue for some time to come," he said.

"However, because the current difficulties are the result of a slowdown in the global financial market, a withdrawal of funds just from Korea is unlikely to happen." Lee added.—Xinhua

Three killed in firefighting plane crash

LOS ANGELES, 3 Sept—A firefighting plane crashed in Reno in Northern California, killing all three crew members, authorities said on Tuesday.

The plane crashed on Monday after taking off from Reno-Stead Airport, said Ian Gregor, a spokesman for the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

The air tanker had been used to drop retardant on a wildfire in the Hope Valley south of Lake Tahoe in Northern California, according to the Reno Fire Department. The plane crashed after it took off to drop retardant on another fire in California later in the day, the department said.—Xinhua

US forces kill six Iraqi security personnel

BAGHDAD, 3 Sept—US troops killed six Iraqi security personnel on Wednesday, Iraqi police said, in what the US military said was a mistake.

Members of the Iraqi police and Army, and a neighbourhood patrol group, fired warning shots in the air when a US boat passed along the Tigris River near their checkpoint close to the town of Tarmiya just north of Baghdad, Iraqi police said.

"The Iraqis fired into the air, not knowing it was a US boat. The US soldiers returned fire and called in air support, and six Iraqis were killed and 10 others injured," said a police source, who declined to be identified.

The US military said there had been an

exchange of fire between US troops and Iraqi security forces and the Iraqis suffered casualties. The US military confirmed their aircraft had been involved, but gave no casualty figures.

Manufacturing shrinks in August, construction down

NEW YORK, 3 Sept— For the nation's lumber companies, automakers, home builders and other manufacturers, the final half of 2008 may be as sluggish as the first.

Slow consumer spending and high gas prices have stalled manufacturing, and even some bright spots are expected to dim.

Exports, which have propped up the sector, may slide as economies overseas slow.

Meanwhile, construction spending is at a seven-year low that has spread from housing to nonresidential projects.

The Institute for Sup-

ply Management said Tuesday its reading for the nation's manufacturers fell to 49.9 in August from 50 in July, matching economists' expectations, according to Thomson/IFR. A reading below 50 signals contraction, while a reading above 50 signals growth.

The index has hovered near the 50 "boom-bust" line all year and industry groups say they expect similarly weak growth for the remainder of the year.

"With the global economy slowing and the rebate boost fading, we look for a mild sagging trend to unfold in the sec-

ond half of the year," said Sherry Cooper, chief economist at BMO Capital Markets.

The second half of 2008 has started especially slowly for certain sectors.

US auto sales hit a 16-year low in July, and food manufacturers continue to struggle with inflation.

Hormel Foods last month lowered its fiscal-year outlook and Smithfield Foods Inc, the nation's largest pork producer, swung to a first-quarter loss of \$12.6 million, from a profit of \$54.6 million last year.

GM does not see US sales reviving this year

TALEGAON(India), 3 Sept—General Motors (GM.N) does not expect US sales to revive this year as the credit crunch pressures consumers, with a senior official saying the top priority was to turn around the North American business.

GM, which has lost \$51 billion over the past three years, will continue to invest in emerging markets such as India and China and was on track for full-year profit growth in Asia, officials said.

"The most important thing we can do is to turn around the North American business," Chief Operating Officer Fritz Henderson told reporters after inaugurating the leading US carmaker's second plant in India.

The factory in the western Maharashtra state has an annual capacity of 140,000 units.

"We do not have a huge amount of optimism for the rest of the year as the pressure on consumer

continues," Henderson said.

The troubled carmaker has been under increasing pressure to cut costs and raise capital because of the slump in US auto sales that pushed its first-half sales down 16 percent.

GM last week said it was offering early retirement incentives to about 28 percent of its US salaried work force as part of its effort to reduce payroll expenses and conserve cash.—Internet

Russia, Uzbekistan reach agreement on new natural gas pipeline

ALMATY, 3 Sept — Russia and Uzbekistan agreed Tuesday to build a new natural gas pipeline through Uzbekistan to export Turkmen and Uzbek natural gas, said news reaching here Tuesday from Tashkent, the Uzbek capital.

The two countries have agreed on joint construction of the pipeline to meet the challenge of increasing gas export from Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan, said visiting Russian Prime Minister Vladimir Putin after talks with Uzbek President Islam Karimov.

Relevant documents would hopefully be signed recently and the two countries also agreed on a European gas pricing formula for the purchase of Uzbek gas, Putin said.

Natural gas produced in the central Asia is cur-

rently sent to Russia via a pipeline built in the Soviet era, which has become incapable of handling the increasing demands for gas exporting in the region in recent years, Karimov said.

Oil falls in Asia on global demand concerns

SINGAPORE, 3 Sept—Oil prices dipped toward \$109 a barrel Wednesday as investors shifted attention to concern over slowing global demand for crude after Hurricane Gustav left oil installations in the Gulf of Mexico region largely undamaged.

Light, sweet crude for October delivery was down 33 cents to \$109.38 a barrel in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange midday in Singapore.—Internet

Morgan Stanley raising \$10 billion property fund, eyes China

SHANGHAI, 3 Sept—Morgan Stanley (MS.N) is raising \$10 billion for a global property fund and plans to put \$1.5 billion or more of that into China, shrugging off concern about a property market downturn, a banking source said on Wednesday.

The Morgan Stanley Real Estate Fund VII Global, the latest in a series of property investment funds, is expected to begin investing worldwide before the end of this year, said the source, who had direct knowledge of the fund.

It will invest at least 10 billion yuan (\$1.46 billion) in China over the next few years, taking a gradual approach while focusing on the largest cities such as Shanghai, where the price for a luxury downtown apart-

ment can exceed \$20 million, said the source.

The retail portion of the fund-raising has been completed with a minimum requirement of \$1 million for individual investors in Asia.

The institutional portion, which requires at least \$10 million for each institutional investor, will

be completed soon, the source added.

"It should not be too difficult for Morgan Stanley to raise funds from retail investors in Asia since, as you know, in China alone the number of millionaires has been growing very fast in recent years," the source said.—Internet

US government sues Boeing over price inflation

LOS ANGELES, 3 Sept — The US government sued Boeing Co on Tuesday, alleging the aerospace manufacturer illegally overcharged Air Force for building a B-1 bomber self-protection system.

The lawsuit, filed in US District Court in Los Angeles, alleges that during 1998 contract negotiations, Boeing exaggerated its contract price and submitted 140 illegally inflated invoices to Air Force, in violation of the federal False Claims Act, according to the US Attorney's Office.

Boeing failed to disclose that it would out-source the manufacture of most of the components that were to be used for the Towed Decoy System, the lawsuit claims.—Internet

American Air flight makes emergency landing

LOS ANGELES, 3 Sept — An American Airlines passenger jet forced back to Los Angeles International Airport by a blown tire landed safely about two hours later on Tuesday after flying over the Pacific Ocean to burn off excess fuel.

American Airlines Flight 1586, a Boeing 737 bound for Toronto with 135 people aboard, blew a left rear tire on its main landing gear, apparently on takeoff from LAX, at about 11 am local time (2 pm EDT), a Federal Aviation Administration spokesman said.

Live local television coverage showed the plane touching down on an LAX runway and coming to a safe stop shortly before 1 pm local time.

Somali pirates hijack French ship

NAIROBI, 3 Sept — Armed Somali pirates have hijacked a French ship in the pirate-infested world’s dangerous waters of Somalia, the ninth such attack this month, a regional maritime official confirmed on Wednesday.

Andrew Mwangura, the coordinator of the East Africa Seafarers Assistance Program (SAP) said the vessel is believed to have been carrying tourists along the coastal part of the Horn of Africa nation.

“We received reports early in the morning but we do not have more details about the crew mem-

bers, the name of the vessel and where it was sailing from and to,” Mwangura told Xinhua by telephone.

“Unconfirmed reports

say the French ship was carrying tourists but we don’t know whether it is a yacht or cruise ship,” Mwangura said.

Romania to take part in EXPO 2010 in Shanghai

S Korea’s IT export growth declines in August

SEOUL, 3 Sept— South Korea’s information technology (IT) exports growth fell sharply in August than the previous month, a report by the Ministry of Knowledge Economy showed Wednesday.

According to the report August’s exports grew a mere 0.02 percent to 11.53 billion US dol-

lars, declining from 10.1 percent gain in July.

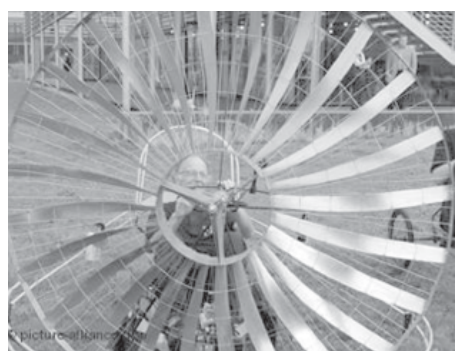
The figure is the lowest since September 2007 when IT exports fell 0.8 percent.

The slumping growth was mainly due to the sharp decline of overseas demand for semiconductors and television sets amid a global economic slowdown, the reports

showed. The report showed that sales of mobile handsets and flat-panels remained strong. Total exports of mobile equipment in August reached 2.81 billion US dollars, up 21.6 percent from a year ago, while panel exports also gain 16.5 percent posting 2.39 billion US dollars.

The final day of the annual dance attracted a record 70,000 girls, some of them as young as six years of age.

The girls — dressed in colourful Swazi regalia —

came from all corners of the mountain kingdom in a display of pride in their culture and virtue.

The ceremony has a more serious mission — to draw attention to AIDS and encourage abstinence among young women, in a small southern African nation ravaged by AIDS and poverty, according to the SAPA report.

Man gulps 11.5 pounds, wins Ohio Chili Contest

A man nicknamed “Humble Bob” stuffed himself with 11.5 pounds of a local specialty called chili-spaghetti in only about 10 minutes to claim victory in a holiday eating contest.

Bob Shoudt won \$2,500 at the inaugural Skyline Chili Spaghetti eat-off Monday at Kings Island amusement park. “Humble Bob” dashed to an early lead, sucking down more than two pounds in less than a minute.

Shoudt, of Philadelphia, is ranked No 5 by the International Federation of Competitive Eating. He did so well at vacuuming up the pasta mixture Monday that he narrowly beat the federation’s top-ranked competitive eater, Joey Chestnut. Chestnut won this year’s hot dog-eating contest at New York’s Coney Island with 59 dogs in 10 minutes.

Drinkers invite croc into Australia pub

Drinkers at an Outback watering hole found a crocodile at the door — and brought it inside for their session.

The saltwater croc in question was just 24 inches long and more a curiosity than a threat to drinkers at the Noonamah Tavern though the species can grow to more than 16 feet.

(15-1-1998), on which I was delegated as one of the representatives to attend the “Technical Working Group Meeting on COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS” in Chiang Rai, Thailand, along with the Superior Dr. Than Than Zin, Assistant Director, DBE, Myanmar. Without her sincere regard I would not be able to participate so smoothly and successfully. It was my very first experience.

The following is an excerpt of which appeared as our “Plan of Action” in the Final Report of TWG Meeting.

- **Project Title**

Developing Community Learning Centres in the Dry Zone.

- **Background**

The project intends to develop three CLCs in Tharzi Township of the Dry Zone. Tharzi Township has been selected for the following reasons:

1. It lies on the border of the dry zone and hilly regions,
2. It has moderate weather (not too hot, not too cold/dry),
3. It has easy access to implement activities of CLCs,
4. some NFE activities such as adult literacy programme has been introduced since 1997 and
5. It could be a model for both hilly regions and dry zone to expand the development of CLCs.

- **Objectives**

1. To establish model centre from CLCs in hilly region and dry zone.
2. To provide activities for the empowerment of people in Tharzi Township.

- **Beneficiaries**

All members of community including children, youth and adults.

- **Institution Working with the CLC**

Under the leadership of township level EFA committee CLCs will be working with:

1. Department of Basic Education (DBE) to support the basic education for children in the community.
2. Myanmar Education Research Bureau (MERB) to get support for adult literacy programmes.
3. Department of Agriculture, Commerce, Labour, Trade for vocational training programmes.
4. Local authorities, heads of villages/wards.
5. Local NGOs, private sectors (eg. Maternal and Child Welfare Association, Red-Cross Association, Union Solidarity and Development Association etc.)

- **Activities**

CLCs will provide NFE equivalency programmes for out-of-school children, adult literacy programmes for adult illiterates (semi-neo), different vocational training such as farming, food preservation, food processing, home industry, trading agricultural products in different seasons for unemployed youths.

Promoters of CLCs will be organized to get support and services from respective departments and organizations through township EFA committee.

- **Partnership Networking at Local Level**

Township level EFA committee consists of representatives from each department or organization as mentioned above. Through the EFA township committee meetings and workshops all members could coordinate and cooperate in implementing CLCs activities.

The EFA township committee has been already linked with district, state, division and national EFA committee.

- **Follow-up Activities and Possible Expansion**

When the CLCs have been established and are implementing the programmes, township EFA committee will supervise for sustainable development. Township committee will assess the weakness and strength of programme activities and make necessary changes in order to improve programmes. It will also report the state/division EFA committee and national committee for further

supports and advice for the process of expanding CLCs in the region.

- **Budget**

The expenses of CLCs would be supported by local government authority, contributions of NGOs, private enterprises, local community, international organizations and donor agencies.

So much so was the excerpt. From this very first experience I realize that ‘Experience or Knowledge in Youth is Wisdom in Age’. And we must keep learning and creating ideas i.e. keep the Time abreast with Life Long Learning (LLL). It is ‘The Greatest Beauty in the World’. Even little drop of water, little grain of sand, makes the mighty ‘Ocean’ and the pleasant ‘Land’.

It may be advisable that “Yesterday is for the Old, Tomorrow is for the Young, for Us is Today”. Never try to delay. ‘Delay means Defeat’. So, Let us try to maintain ‘Good Habit of learning and Imparting to Others’.

To observe such good habit wouldn’t it be necessary to “Go to the learners; live with them; Learn from them; Discuss with them; and Share with them” without any obligation.

“Honesty and Frankness make one vulnerable, but be honest and Frank anyway.” Be conscious “What we spent years Building may be destroyed overnight, but Build anyway.” “The gift to Truth excels all other gifts.”

Before conclusion, I wish to express the words of thanks to:-*Saya U Myat Naing*, the then ERO and the immediate Head of NFE section; *Sayagyi U Tin Nyo*, the Chairman of Myanmar Education Research Bureau; *Saya U Myint Han*, SERO; *Saya Dr. Mehm Hla Aung Gyi* (Ph.D), ERO, and *Saya U San Maung*, ERO of MERB for their confidence and trustworthiness in me, I esteem most, and their decision as the consequence to let me have the above mentioned expoure which I neither expect nor dream of.

Now, please let me conclude in this way... In our country, Myanmar, we have public shows called ‘Zat-Pwe’. When it started, two or more ministers (in Myanmar we called them ‘Wunmin’) appeared before the curtain. One starts asking: “Wunmin! What is the easiest thing in the world to do?”

The other replies: “Wunmin! To give advice”.

Then he asks another question: “What is the most difficult thing in the world to do?”

“Oh, Wunmin! The thing to be done”.

May I leave you with this abrupt conclusion which may be a little food for “headache” but not for “thought”.

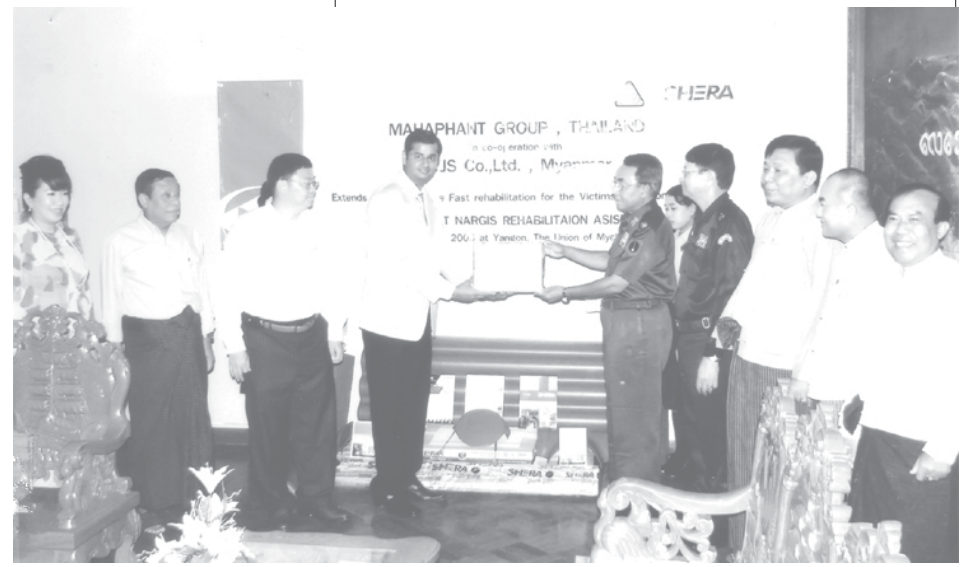

Rubber farming booming in Shan State (North)

Kyaw Kyaw (Bhamo)

The pilot establishment of rubber farms in Shan State (North) has showed successful. The project was launched with the aim of regional greening, sustainable economic growth of national race entrepreneurs, and creating job opportunities.

In an interview, Manager U Win Hlaing Oo of Myanmar Perennial Crops Enterprise (Northern Shan State Branch) said to Kyemon Daily that Shan State (North)

is located north of 17 degree north latitude and stands at an altitude between 1800 to 5000 feet. It has an annual average rainfall of 50 to 60 inches. On average, the number of rainy days in the region is about 90 to 100 in a year. So, the region has favourable location and climate to grow rubber on a commercial scale. Therefore, local authorities and rubber farmers were briefed on the findings of research done by the

special rubber farming zone reclaiming areas along Lashio-Mongyaw-Mongkyet Road from 2006-2007 to 2010. Myanmar Perennial Crops Enterprise designated the 700-acre plantation of Shan Yoma Peace Co in the zone as the model one. It will render assistance to help other plantations in the region meet the standard of the model plantation. It is now providing technical assistance to KDA Peace Group and Ngwe Hnin Hmon Co to implement

launched its rubber farming in 1996, and the acreage of rubber plantations increased to 18,983 in 2003. However, the number of the acreage fell to 4438 due to lack of agricultural experience and methods, insufficient use of quality strains, and cold waves that took place in 1993. So, the poor harvest made the rubber farmers disheartened.

Shan State (North)

agriculturalists along with a boom in the rubber trade in the international and local markets. The region restored its rubber farming in 2004. The acreage of local rubber farms has surged to over 40,000, as a result.

Due to regional development and vast knowledge, local national race entrepreneurs are engaged in rubber farming extensively. Now, plans are under way to establish a 10,000-acre

the 4000-acre rubber farm project for 2008-2009. It is pursuing the target of putting 4000 acres in Moneyin region, Namtu Township, under rubber, and will provide agricultural methods to national race farmers, groups and companies.

In the meantime, it is trying its best to meet the regional demand of rubber saplings in a year. It is making efforts to produce an adequate number of seedlings in

Muse District in a year, getting seeds of BPM-24 strain from Mudon and Thanbyuzayat. So far, it has nurtured more than 60,000 seedlings.

Now, Myanmar agriculturalists are reaping the rewards of their hard work and vast experience that some farmers from China purchased Myanmar rubber saplings. About 30,000 rubber saplings from Muse District fetched about K 30 million.

Being a large plateau,

Shan State (North) still has over 500,000 acres of virgin and vacant lands that can be put under rubber, with the potential for becoming the largest rubber producing state when the targeted acreage of rubber for the whole country is met. As the fruit of giving educative talks, local farmers who engage in the slash and burning farming have come to launch mixed-cropping pattern among the rubber trees. So, they will soon do well in their businesses

and will become successful rubber farmers. In addition, the boom in the nursery and trade of rubber seedlings and saplings created job opportunities for local people.

In conclusion, he expessed his opinion that Shan State would soon enjoy economic growth with a large number of commercial-scale lush and green rubber plantations.

Crude oil tumbles to 5-month low as Hurricane Gustav threat eases

NEW YORK, 3 Sept—Crude oil tumbled to a five-month low Tuesday as traders shifted their concern from Hurricane Gustav to dampening global demand.

Light, sweet crude for October delivery dropped 5.75 dollars to settle at 109.71 dollars a barrel on the New York Mercantile Exchange. Price plunged 10 dollars to hit 105.46 dollars a barrel in the early morning trading, the lowest point since 4 April.

As Hurricane Gustav appeared to leave the Gulf of Mexico and producers prepared to restart oil production, traders now focus more on the slowing global economic growth, speculating the world market demand for crude would continue to fall.

Economists: China's economy still in shape

BEIJING, 3 Sept—It's too soon for government measures to spur the economy, with momentum likely to remain strong despite the recent slowdown, economists said. The economy has grown at an average 10.8 percent over the past five years, making it the fastest growing economy in the world. But a tight monetary policy and the worse-than-expected global slowdown has put the brakes on growth after it peaked at 11.9 percent in the second quarter last year.

The country's GDP growth slowed to 10.8 percent in the second quarter, compared with 11.9 percent for 2007. Meanwhile, external demand, a key driver of China's economic expansion, is likely to dry up further in the months ahead. Some analysts have warned there is risk of

recession and called for more stimulus packages. "The economy is not really weak," Huang Yiping, an economist with Citigroup, wrote in a research note. "China needed economic stimulus policies during the Asian financial crisis, but it doesn't need them now."—*Internet*

Chilean copper mining giant seeks joint venture with Chinese company

SANTIAGO, 3 Sept—The Chilean state-owned copper firm Nacional del Cobre (Codelco) is seeking a joint venture with Chinese company MinMetals to explore minerals in African and Asian countries.

Local media quoted sources from Codelco as saying on Tuesday that the joint venture will be one of the major steps between the two companies to cement cooperation and seek mutual benefits. Coldec, the world's largest copper producer, produces one third of the mine output in Chile.—*Internet*

Study: stressed mothers may raise fat children

BEIJING, 3 Sept—Millions of poor children in the United States may be getting fat before age 10 because their mothers are stressed out and the youngsters seek escape in unhealthy comfort food, researchers said on Tuesday.

The stress is rooted in poverty and can be

brought on by money woes, work loads, insufficient health insurance and other factors, said Craig Gundersen of the University of Illinois, who led the study.

“People will eat in response to feeling stress,” he said in a telephone interview, and in this case children may be eating more in response to stress-related trouble at home.

The findings show there is a need for a firm social safety net for poor families with protections such as food stamps; better financial education to help people better manage money; and adequate

health insurance coverage, he said.

Gundersen and colleagues at Iowa State University and Michigan State University looked at data on 841 children in families living below the poverty line who were part of a government nutrition survey conducted from 1999 to 2002.

“We found that the cumulative stress experienced by the child’s mother is an important determinant of child overweight,” the research team reported in a study published in the September issue of *Pediatrics*.—*Internet*

“Early” blast-off tipped for spacewalk mission

BEIJING, 3 Sept—The planned launch date of *Shenzhou VII*, China’s third manned spacecraft, may be brought forward from next month to sometime this month, Hong Kong’s *Wen Wei Po* newspaper said.

A source reportedly told the paper the launch date will be between 17 Sept, the closing day of the Beijing Paralympics, and 1 Oct, China’s National Day. “Now it is fairly certain it will be before National Day, because the best launch window for *Shenzhou VII* will be before 1 Oct,” the newspaper quoted the source as saying.

But an officer with the General Armament Department of the People’s Liberation Army, which oversees the *Shenzhou* programme, told *China Daily* the report was “not

reliable”.

The spacecraft will lift off from the Jiuquan rocket launch site in northwestern Gansu province with three

astronauts. Two of them will enter the orbital module, with one expected to become the first Chinese spacewalker.—*Internet*

In Switzerland: diamond made of ashes of dead

BEIJING, 3 Sept—Diamonds really are forever. Algordanza, a small company based in the mountainous southeast of Switzerland, uses the

ashes of dead people to make diamonds as a permanent memento for their nearest and dearest.

And with prices starting at less than 5,000 euros

(7,488 US dollars), the jewels are not solely the preserve of the jetset.

“Some people find it helpful to go to the cemetery and grieve, and they leave their grief in the cemetery,” said Algordanza Chairman Veit Brimer. “There are some people who, for whatever reason, do not want to have this farewell.

“Astonishingly these are mainly Christian people. They say: ‘Why should I say goodbye? I’ll see my husband in 15 years in heaven anyway,’” Brimer said.—*Internet*

Brazil begins production in pre-salt layer oil field

RIO DE JANEIRO, 2 Sept—Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva Tuesday attended a ceremony marking the first oil production in the pre-salt layer field in southeast Brazil.

The production began with a Long-Duration Test (LDT) of about six months to one year to observe the operation in the Jubarte field off the coast of

southeastern Espirito Santo state.

Petrobras, the state oil firm, will spend about 50 million reais (31.25 million US dollars) to adjust the P-34 Platform, which is expected to extract 18,000 barrels of oil equivalent per day from the Jubarte pre-salt layer field.

The Jubarte field has a salt layer of only 200

metres and while the Tupi field, the largest ever oil field discovered recently, has a salt layer of over two km. Guilherme Estrella, Petrobras’s Exploitation and Production Director, said the company hoped to gain practical experience for exploitation at pre-salt layer oil fields through production at the P-34 Platform.

China’s coastal areas face further flooding

BEIJING, 3 Sept—Typhoons and heavy rainstorms are forecast to hit coastal areas over the next month, which could lead to further flooding of the Hanjiang and Jialing rivers, both tributaries of the Yangtze, the State Flood Control and Drought Relief Headquarters said yesterday.

Four to five rounds of typhoons may emerge in the West Pacific Ocean and South China Sea, with two likely to hit coastal cities, the *Xinhua News Agency* quoted the agency as saying. Meanwhile, the National Meteorological Centre said yesterday that heavy rains will hit the Huaihe, Yellow and

Yangtze rivers over the next three days, *Xinhua* reported.

Regional governments have been alerted to the danger and have been told to make sure local people stay well away from high-risk areas, the flood headquarters said.

Ships and fishing boats have been advised to stay in harbour, it said.

Since the start of this summer’s wet season, six rounds of typhoons have led to the flooding of several major waterways, including the Pearl and Nenjiang rivers and Taihu, Dongting and Poyang lakes, the flood agency said.

Between the start of June and the end of last month, floods nationwide killed 436 people, damaged more than 6.6 million hectares of cropland and demolished 370,000 houses, a *Xinhua* report claimed.

Smoking riskier to women’s hearts than men’s

MUNICH, 3 Sept—Women typically get heart disease much later than men, but not if they smoke, researchers said Tuesday. In fact, women who smoke have heart attacks more than a dozen years earlier than women who don’t smoke, Norwegian doctors reported in a study presented to the European Society of Cardio-

logy. For men, the gap is not so dramatic; male smokers have heart attacks about six years earlier than men who don’t smoke.

“This is not a minor difference,” said Dr Silvia Priori, a cardiologist at the Scientific Institute in Pavia, Italy. “Women need to realize they are losing much more than men when they smoke,” she said. Priori was not connected to the research.

An ailing Djokovic had to dig equally deep while playing through a sore right hip to defeat Spain's Tommy Robredo 4-6, 6-2, 6-3, 5-7, 6-3.

"Novak got a tough one too," Federer said. "You always wish for three sets but honestly those five-setters are fun."

Inter Milan's teenage star Balotelli can be great, says Lippi

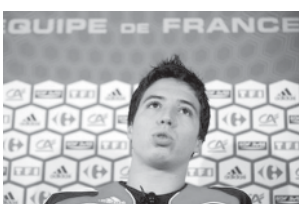

"He is ready to lead this nation," Bush said in excerpts of a speech to be broadcast from the White House to Republican delegates in St Paul, Minnesota.

Venezuela rivals US in Central America, Caribbean

CARACAS, 3 Sept— Venezuela's socialist President Hugo Chavez has won over some of the United States' closest allies in the Caribbean and Central America with oil credits and aid that match similar efforts by Washington.

Hundreds of millions of dollars in food aid and billions in low-interest loans to buy Venezuelan oil put Chavez neck-and-neck with the United States as a major financier in a region that US officials once called their backyard.

Chavez, who has clashed with the White House on everything from free trade to fighting drugs, is now a top benefactor even to Washington allies who welcome his aid offers to offset rising energy and food import bills.

With oil prices expected to stay high, analysts say Chavez's influence will grow in a

region that was once a Cold War battlefield and remains impoverished.

"The economic relationship with Venezuela now appears to be central to the region's short-and medium-term stability," said Anthony Bryan, a senior associate at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies think-tank in Washington.

Nigerian security forces arrest US filmmaker

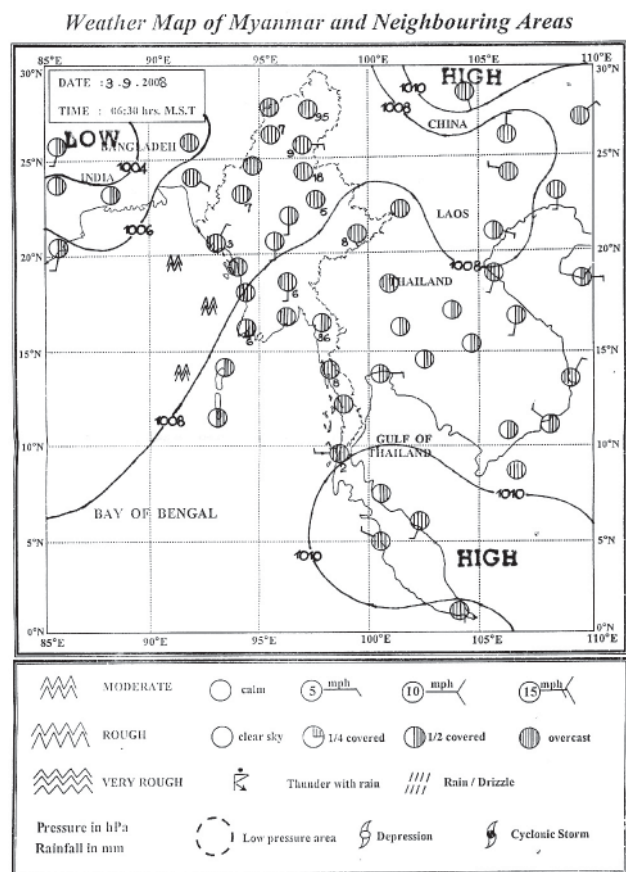
PORT HARCOURT (Nigeria), 3 Sept— Authorities in Nigeria have charged a US journalist working on a documentary in the oil-producing Niger Delta with spying after he was arrested for filming the Army, a media watchdog said on Tuesday.

SCIENCE DAILY, 3 Sept—Stanford computer scientists have developed an artificial intelligence system that enables robotic helicopters to teach themselves to fly difficult stunts

by watching other helicopters perform the same maneuvers.

The result is an autonomous helicopter that can perform a complete airshow of complex tricks

on its own.

The stunts are "by far the most difficult aerobatic maneuvers flown by any computer controlled helicopter," said Andrew Ng, the professor

directing the research of graduate students Pieter Abbeel, Adam Coates, Timothy Hunter and Morgan Quigley.

The dazzling airshow is an important demonstration of "apprenticeship learning," in which robots learn by observing an expert, rather than by having software engineers peck away at their keyboards in an attempt to write instructions from scratch.
