## Car swindlers caught

NAY PYI TAW, 15 Sept — The police arrested culprits who pawned and sold cars after making fake documents in Yangon. They monthly hired the cars through brokers.

Beginning May 2008, the police stations in Yangon Division received first complaints in connection with swindling of cars. Myanmar Police Force exposed and arrested Chan Myat Ko (a) Lwin Ko, 26, and wife Ma Zin Thiri (a) Ma Wint Wint Thu, 33, at No. 359 on Yinmamyang Street, Ward 23, Thuwunna, Thingangyun Township and 13 people including those who made fake documents and brokers on 21 and 22 August.

The couple monthly hired 28 saloons such as Toyota Corolla, Corolla van, Toyota Limited, Sunny Super Saloon and

SE Limited through 11 agencies. They paid K 50,000 for the agencies' services. They also had to pay deposit money for a month and three-month's rent in two or three

faking three documents which they kept at the owners.

They realized a total of K 571 million from the sale of 28 vehicles. They spent K 7.5 million on

(a) Teza Kan Myint and Kyaw Wunna were arrested. According to the investigation, ten vehicles were confiscated.

Regarding the case, 35 more vehicles were

They took the fuel-purchase books, the owner books, wheel tax cards and Vehicle Inspection Certificates (VIC) and kept the premium book on injury insurance and documents on tax at the car owners. They sold the cars after

faking the documents, K 31.5 million on rent and K 13.1 million on service. They got a net profit of K 519 million.

In Pazundaung Township a car was pawned with the use of fake documents on 4 September. In connection with the case, Tin Aung

confiscated. Action will be taken against the four culprits and others who got involved in the case according to law and investigation is under way.

People are urged to be aware of such cases in order not to be swindled.

## At least 32 killed in new Iraq violence

BAGHDAD 15 Sept— Bombings in Baghdad and northeast of the capital killed at least 32 people Monday, Iraqi officials said, the latest in an apparent bid by insurgents to chip away at growing public confidence in recent security gains.

At least 20 were killed and 30 were wounded in a suicide bombing in an evening attack in Balad Ruz, 45 miles northeast of Baghdad, said Maj. Gen. Abdul-Karim al-Rubaie, the military commander of operations in Diyala province. Many of the dead were police.

A police officer said the attacker was a woman. The officer spoke on condition of anonymity because he is not authorized to speak to the media.

Another security official said the bomber

targeted the house of a former police commissioner who had been detained in Camp Bucca, a U.S.-run prison, for one year and was released Monday. At the time of the explosion, the detainee was hosting relatives and friends at a banquet. Earlier Monday, a double car bombing struck a busy commercial district in Baghdad, killing at least 12 people in one of the deadliest attacks in the capital in weeks.

## Bomb kills three guards in Afghan district

HERAT (Afghanistan), 15 Sept— A bombing Monday killed three bodyguards of a district chief, including his son, in an area of Afghanistan at the centre of claims that US air strikes killed dozens of civilians last month, the official said. Lal Mohammad

Omarzai said that the bomb was apparently hidden in a three-wheel motorcycle near the Shindand district centre and remotely detonated as his two-vehicle convoy passed. "Three of my bodyguards, one of them my son, were martyred and five others were

wounded," said Omarzai, who was not hurt in the attack. Shindand is the focus of one of the biggest claims of civilian casualties in air strikes since international troops arrived in Afghanistan to remove the extremist Taliban in late 2001.

## Pakistan troop fire turns back US helicopters

ISLAMABAD, 15 Sept— Firing by Pakistani troops forced US military helicopters to turn back to Afghanistan after they crossed into Pakistani territory early on Monday, Pakistani security officials said.

The incident took place near Angor Adda, a village in the tribal region of South Waziristan where

US commandos in helicopters raided a suspected al Qaeda and Taliban camp earlier this month.

"The US choppers came into Pakistan by just 100 to 150 meters at Angor Adda. Even then our troops did not spare them, opened fire on them and they turned away," said one security official.

Pakistani Army chief General Ashfaq Kayani said in a strongly worded statement last week that Pakistan would not allow foreign troops onto its soil and Pakistan's sovereignty and territorial integrity would be defended at all costs.

Another security official said on Monday that US armored vehicles were also seen moving on the Afghan side of the border, while US warplanes were seen overhead.—Internet

## Wall Street rocked by Lehman failure and Merrill sale

NEW YORK, 15 Sept Global financial markets were shaken to their core on Monday after US investment bank Lehman Brothers filed for bankruptcy protection and rival Merrill Lynch agreed to be taken over.

As a deepening crisis took new, bigger victims, The US Federal Reserve said for the first time it would accept stocks in exchange for cash loans and 10 of the world's top banks agreed to establish a \$70 billion emergency fund, with any one of them able to tap up to a third of that.

On a black Sunday for Wall Street, frantic

attempts to find a rescuer for Lehman (LEH.N) failed, and troubled insurer American International Group (AIG.N) asked the Fed for a lifeline, according to news reports.

But Bank of America (BAC.N) agreed to buy Merrill Lynch (MER.N) in an all-stock deal worth \$50 billion, seeking a bargain as the

world's largest retail brokerage sought refuge from fears it could be the next victim.

Asian and European stock markets tumbled as the worries about Lehman counter-party risk and further financial market turmoil sent investors scurrying for safe havens such as gold.

## THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL'S MESSAGE

### on the International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer (16 September 2008)

Market turmoil, economic downturns and talk of recession have historically spelt tough times for the environment. At such moments, safeguarding the planet has often been seen as a luxury, and as a burden on economic recovery and development. But the remarkable story of the ozone layer, whose preservation we celebrate today, shows such thinking for what it is: mere myth.

Decisive multilateral action on environmental threats and challenges can bring wide-ranging health, social and economic benefits. The Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer, which underpins our efforts to combat depletion of the earth's fragile protective shield, also contributes to combating climate change, since many of the chemicals controlled under the treaty have also emerged as ones that contribute to global warming. By phasing out chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs)—once common in products such as refrigerators—and now deciding to accelerate a freeze and phase-out of hydrochlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs), the treaty has provided two benefits at once. I hope Governments will look at such results and feel empowered to act across a wide range of environmental challenges, and not only in prosperous times. Such action should include exploring more fully the natural synergies that can occur among our various multilateral environmental agreements.

Next year in Copenhagen, Governments will gather for a crucial meeting on the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change. Our goal must be a decisive new agreement that sets the world on track to stabilize greenhouse gas concentrations in the atmosphere, and that provides the funding needed for vulnerable countries to adapt to the impact of climate change. Such an agreement would not only represent progress on one of the greatest challenges of our time, but is also likely to help tackle urban air pollution, deforestation, the loss of biodiversity and other dangers.

After decades of chemical attack, it may take another 50 years or so for the ozone layer to recover fully. As the Montreal Protocol has taught us, when we degrade our environment too far, nursing it back to health tends to be a long journey, not a quick fix. But the overarching lesson of the Protocol is that by acting on one challenge, we also act on many others. Continued progress, and the possibility of new breakthroughs from Copenhagen and other fora, would also make significant contributions to achieving the Millennium Development Goals. On this International Day, let us pledge to seize more such multi-faceted opportunities, and do our utmost to create tomorrow's "green economy" today.—UNIC

## US military deaths in Iraq war at 4,157

WASHINGTON, 15 Sept—As of Sunday, 14 Sept, 2008, at least 4,157 members of the US military have died in the Iraq war since it began in March 2003.

The figure includes eight military civilians killed in action. At least 3,377 died as a result of hostile action, according to the military's numbers. The British military has reported 176 deaths; Italy, 33; Ukraine, 18; Poland, 21; Bulgaria, 13; Spain, 11; Denmark, seven; El Salvador, five; Slovakia, four; Latvia and Georgia, three each; Estonia, Netherlands, Thailand, Romania, two each; and Australia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, South Korea, one death each.

## Australian men ill informed about prostate cancer

CANBERRA, 15 Sept—A new research report released on Sunday showed that Australian men in the age group most at risk of getting prostate cancer are ill informed about the disease.

More than 500 men aged between 40 and 80 were quizzed on their knowledge of prostate cancer as part of a University of Notre Dame Australia study, and four out of five did not know the function of the prostate.

Almost half did not

know the disease was the second most common form of cancer in men behind skin cancer, but 58 percent thought getting the disease would lead to a rapid death, said the study which was recently conducted in Western Australia.

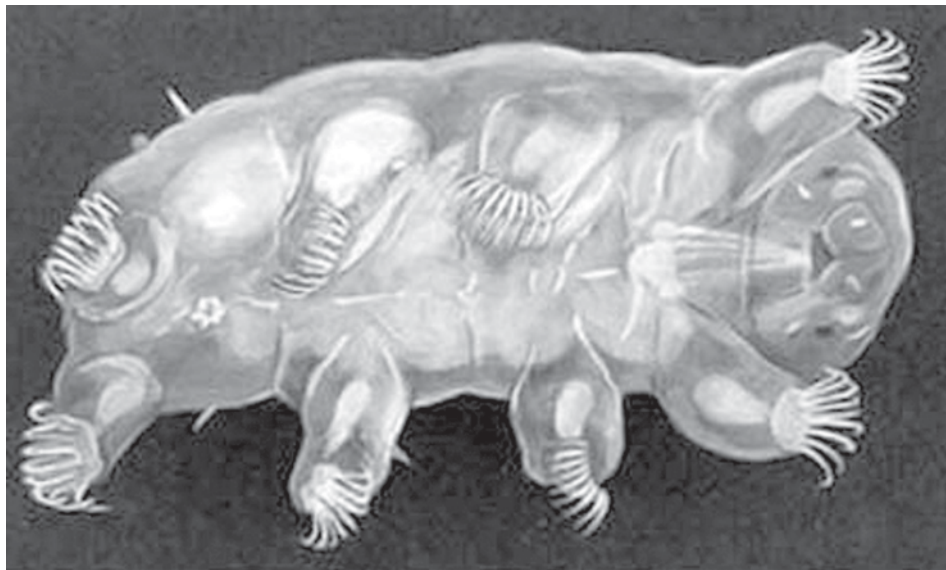
Almost 3,000 men die of prostate cancer each year in Australia and the incidence of the disease increases significantly for men aged over 60.

Researcher Alan

Wright said on Sunday the respondents' lack of knowledge about the disease could be due to men often not paying attention to their health.

One of the largest misconceptions about prostate cancer was a belief trouble urinating was one of the first symptoms of the disease, Wright said.

## Chinese President sends message of condolences over plane crash in Russia

BEIJING, 15 Sept — Chinese President Hu Jintao on Sunday sent a message of condolences to his Russian counterpart Dmitry Medvedev over the plane crash which killed more than 80 people on board.

On behalf of the Chinese government, the Chinese people and himself, Hu expressed sincere condolences and deep mourning over the deaths in the tragedy to the Russian president and the relatives of the bereaved.

A Russian Boeing-737 airliner went down at about 3 am (2300 GMT Saturday) Sunday in a patch of wasteland on the outskirts of the Russian city of Perm in the central Ural mountains, killing at least 81 passengers and six crew members.

## Tropical depression leaves more than 26,500 homeless in Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 15 Sept— Tropical Depression "Lowell" has left more than 26,500 people homeless in at least three states of Mexico, as rains caused the overflowing of streams and canals in the states of Michoacan, Sonora and Sinaloa, authorities said on Sunday.

In Huandacarero of the central western state of Michoacan, over 1,500 people were displaced after the stream flowing past city overflowed its banks on Saturday night, municipality authorities said.

At least five districts of the town were submerged in floodwaters more than one meter deep and some 50 houses were destroyed, forcing the evacuation of residents to relatives' houses and provisional shelters, mayor Jose Refugio Manriquez said.

In Sonora state, the number of homeless reached to 20,000 and Governor Eduardo Bours asked for support from the Natural Disasters Fund to repair damaged houses, highways and sidewalks.

The most affected cities of the state were Navojoa, Benito Juarez, Huatabampo and Etchojoa.

In Ahome of the northwest state of Sinaloa, some 5,000 people were evacuated from 19 villages in case several dams could burst.—Xinhua

## Singapore Airlines Cargo awarded \$349 mln maintenance agreement

SINGAPORE, 15 Sept — Singapore Airlines' cargo unit announced on Monday that it has signed a 10-year 500 million Singapore dollars (349 million US dollars) fleet management agreement with Pratt & Whitney Global Service Partners.

The maintenance and service agreement covers 13 Boeing 747 400F cargo aircraft powered by Pratt & Whitney engines and six spare engines, according to a statement by Singapore Airlines Cargo.

## 460,000 evacuated as Sinlaku approaches

### E China

FUZHOU, 15 Sept — About 460,000 people in east China's Zhejiang and Fujian Provinces have been evacuated as tropical storm Sinlaku, which was weakened from a typhoon on Monday morning, was approaching.

The Fujian provincial headquarters for flood control said on Monday morning that close to 230,000 people had been evacuated as of 9 pm on Sunday and the mass evacuation was still under way.

In Zhejiang, 230,000 residents have been evacuated and 30,000 fishing boats have been recalled to harbor.

Typhoon Sinlaku weakened into a tropical storm at 8 am Monday,

while its eye was reported to be about 203 km to the southeast of Wenzhou in southeastern Zhejiang and move northward at a speed of 5 km per hour, according to the local weather authorities.

Heavy rains were reported in eastern and

northern parts of Zhejiang and central and northern parts of Fujian on Monday morning.

Sinlaku, the 13th tropical storm so far this year in China, injured 13 people when it hit north-eastern Taiwan on Sunday.—Xinhua

## US stock futures drop as financial storm worsens

HONG KONG, 15 Sept—US equity market futures sank on Monday, pointing to a sharply lower New York open after buyout talks for Lehman Brothers faltered and a media re-

port said insurer AIG was seeking emergency funding.

S&P 500 futures fell 46.5 points, or 3.7 percent, while the Dow Jones Industrial Average futures

were off 360 points, or 3.14 percent.

One of the world's largest insurers, American International Group Inc, was asking the Federal Reserve for a bridge loan of \$40 billion to shore up its depleted capital position, the *New York Times* reported.

## Crude oil down nearly two dollars after Hurricane Ike

NEW YORK, 15 Sept—Crude oil prices dropped nearly two dollars Sunday in New York, dipping to 99.30 dollars, as traders were reassured over Hurricane Ike's relatively limited effect on oil production in the US Gulf Coast region.

At 12:15 local time (1615 GMT), a barrel of "light sweet crude" for delivery in October fell one dollar and 88 cents on the New York Mercantile Exchange, which was opened on Sunday due to the storm.

Ike hit the Texas coast before dawn on Saturday, triggering widespread flooding but no extensive damage to oil rigs and refineries in the Houston region, initial reports suggested.

The price of gasoline meanwhile rose 13.46 cents to 2.63 a gallon, with prices at pump stations about a dollar higher.

Oil refineries in the storm-hit Houston area could be down for eight to nine days due to Ike, which could create possible gas shortages in the region, according to US Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison of Texas.

To help meet the demand, President George W Bush announced Saturday that restrictions on imported gasoline had been suspended.—Internet

## Carbon traders compete in potentially lucrative market

BEIJING, 15 Sept — There's 30 billion US dollars floating in the air over China, but it won't be easy to grab it. It's China's carbon trading market.

The world market for trading greenhouse gas emissions doubled last year to about 70 billion dollars, according to World Bank figures. China accounts for 73 percent of the clean development mechanism (CDM) projects—a major carbon trading business.

Until just a few years ago, the idea of making money from emissions trading would have sounded like madness to most businesspeople in China. But the CDM is changing all that.

The deal between Myland Group, a chemical plant based in Jiangsu province, and the World Bank is one example. Every year during production, the plant emits HFC23, a strong, heat-trapping gas, equivalent to 8 million tons of CO<sub>2</sub>s. Before the manufacturer signed a contract with the World Bank to sell carbon credits, the chemicals group did not realize it was sitting on a goldmine. But the seven-year deal is expected to bring the group a windfall of more than 330 million euros at a price of 6 euros per ton of CO<sub>2</sub>s.

## Vietnam launches locally made ethanol-blended gasoline

HANOI, 15 Sept—Vietnam on Monday launched a locally made ethanol-blended gasoline with the view to "ensure national energy security and reduce the economy's dependence on oil products", said oil giant PetroVietnam.

Gasohol E5, which is five percent ethanol and 95 percent gasoline, was produced at an 80-million-dollar chemi-biological plant in northern Phu Tho province using ethanol alcohol imported from Brazil and homegrown sugarcane and cassava, the group said.

After pilot sales in Hanoi, PetroVietnam plans to send the new product to other major cities including Ho Chi Minh City and Can Tho in the south.

The state-run company, which is planning to build another plant with a capacity of 100,000 cubic metres in central Binh Dinh province, said Gasohol E5 would also help "the protection of the global environment".

Each year, communist Vietnam imports between 12 and 14 million tons of

various types of fuel for its 86 million people and demand is forecast to increase by between 10 and 15 percent a year, PetroVietnam said.

The country has vast offshore oil and gas reserves in the South China Sea but lacks a functioning refinery and has to import its refined petroleum products.—Internet

## Asian shares fall sharply on US concerns

SYDNEY, 15 Sept—Asian stock markets fell sharply on Monday on fresh fears over the state of the global financial system amidst concern over the fate of Wall Street giant Lehman Brothers, dealers said.

Australian shares were down 2.21 percent at noon, Singapore stocks dropped 2.26 percent in morning trading and in Taiwan shares fell 1.83 percent in early deals.

Several major markets in the region, including Tokyo, Hong Kong, Shanghai and Seoul were closed for public holidays.

## Reconstruction and rehabilitation tasks at full stretch (4)

The government is paying serious attention to long-term natural disaster preparedness measures, while carrying out reconstruction and rehabilitation tasks, because prevention is better than cure, and a natural disaster may occur at any time. So, it is required to take preparedness measures in order that the nation will not suffer a great loss when it comes under the strike of a possible future natural disaster.

Now, the government is taking preparedness measures to deal with possible future natural disasters. In compliance with the guidance of the Head of State, five roads are under construction in the coastal regions with the aim of contributing towards regional development and taking preparedness measures, as follows:--

- (1) Maubin-Yaylelay-Shwetaungmaw-Kyaikpi Mawlamyinegyun Road (43 miles and 7 furlongs)
- (2) Mawlamyinegyun-Hlaingphone-Thitpok-Kwinpauk-Pyinsalu Road (52 miles)
- (3) Labutta-Thingangyi-Pyinsalu Road (35.2 miles)
- (4) Bogale-Kyeinchaung-Kadon Kani Road (39 miles)
- (5) Labutta-Thongwa-Ottwin-Htaiksun Road (37 miles).

Now, efforts are being exerted to shape the projects into five earth facilities this rainy season. Plans are under way to upgrade Pathein-Mawtinsun Road and Pyapon-Kyonkadun-Ahmar Road.

The news about the project evoked my memories of a visit by car from Pyapon to Ahmar. It was at the start of a rainy season. I used to take a motorboat in rivers and creeks so many times. Therefore, I preferred to take a bus if the region was accessible by car. One day after I had finished work, I had to make a trip to Ahmar, and I decided to go there by car instead of by boat. My officemates in Pyapon arranged a Jeep drive for my convenience. At that time, the weather was fine. The road was fine up to a point beyond Kyonkadun. When the jeep reached at the start of the earth road, the sky became overcast and it rained heavily. I got completely wet in the rain. The earth road was usable until it rained. When it was raining, the earth road turned to a muddy one and the car could not move forward at all. To make matters worse, we were on a dyke at that time, and it was impossible for the car to make a U-turn.

So, the driver steered the car with great care. After sometime, he lost control of the car and it slewed sideways and went downhill the dyke. By good fortune, the car got on a hard space, instead of in a paddy field. Then, I did not know what I should do. At that time, four or five local people arrived and did us a favour. The place was a three or four-hour drive from Ahmar. Locals said that throughout the road ahead was muddy and we in no way could get to our destination that night, and it would be all right if the car got on the road to Kyonkadun. However, the problem was that we could not make a U-turn. The space was too narrow for the car to do a U-turn. They said "no sweat" and turned the car by hand. The space was wet and slippery, so the car did a U-turn through pushing and pulling by them. Then, I managed to go back to Pyapon.

With my true experience, I knew well how

poor the transport sector of the seaside regions was. **In the past, there was hardly a road section in the seaside regions, and the road sections were a little better than a bullock-cart track, not all-weather ones. Even Bogale-Pyapon Road was not much usable in the rainy season. However, my relatives in the coastal regions transported goods and passengers, using trailers-G, jeeps and old vehicles on such poor roads. When I caught in the rain in my trip, I was able to turn back, but if they were in my place, they would have to spend the night right at the place. It is heartening to note that the government is now constructing fine roads there.**

I have learnt that the roads are designed to form a square-shape network. Samalauk Village and Seintaung junction on Yangon-Pathein-Ngwehsaung Road section of the outward road of the network are designated as nodal points. And the road section between Samalauk and Ahmar through Maubin, Kyaiklat, Pyapon, Dedaye and Seikma will be upgraded to the front road of the network. Similarly, the road section between Seintaung and Mawtinsun will be upgraded to the westernmost road; and the road section between Mortinsun and Ahmar, the southernmost road of the network.

In constructing new roads and upgrading old ones, the foundations will be raised with the earth from both sides along the facilities so that they can be used temporary shelters in times of floods. Now, Maubin-Yayle-Shwetaungmaw-Kyaikpi-Mawlamyinegyun Road is being constructed and the project is making a good progress. And groundwork is being carried out to construct Labutta-Thingangyi-Pyinsalu Road and Bogale-Kyeinchaung-Kadonkani Road.

In the project, the road sections near the villages will be as high as 25 to 30 feet. It is because while the storm "Nargis" was raging, the tidal waves were as high as around 20 feet, and that was the root cause of high death toll and great loss of property. Moreover, small bridges along the roads will be bailey-type facilities as much as possible, and bent piles will be used instead of wooden ones.

The government is trying to build about 30-foot-high hillocks near the villages. In the process, earth will be taken to raise the roads and the places

where earth is taken will be lakes. So, there will be road-cum-shelters and lakes where local people can get fresh water.

**New schools, hospitals, monasteries, offices and departments will also be designed to be cyclone shelters. In that regard, some designs of cyclone shelters are from some neighbouring countries that have faced cyclones, and some designs are drawn and donated by national designers. Many internal and international well-wishers have donated cyclone shelters. If the contribution of the well-wishers is not enough, the State will render assistance to complete the project. Once the project is completed, my relatives will no longer need to worry about future natural disasters.**

A lesson has been learnt that the major problem in the aftermath of the storm "Nargis" was shortage of food supply. Therefore, a programme is included in the project to solve the problem of shortage of food supply in the face of a similar natural disaster. It is to store drinking water, rice, edible oil and salt enough for a week for local people. Arrangements have been made to build warehouses to store food supplies. In some regions, warehouses will be built separately, and in some regions, warehouses will be designed to serve as cyclone shelters.

Mangroves play an important role in taking disaster preparedness measures in the regions near the sea. In the past, my relatives cut down trees in the mangroves indiscriminately. The forest reserve is lush and green along the bank, but there are no large trees in the areas about 100 yards from the shore. Some reclaimed the lands in the mangroves to build prawn farms and salt farms, thus having adverse effects on the mangroves.

**In reality, mangroves are gifted to prevent seaside regions from being attacked by floods. The disaster Tsunami that took place in 2004 gave evidence of the importance of mangroves, but those forests were not protected and conserved effectively. Now, the government has launched programmes to regenerate those mangroves. Had local people exploited mangroves just prudently and conserved them, they would have avoided such a tragic incident.**

There were 34 embankments stretching 581.43 miles in total to prevent the agricultural farmlands and houses from floods of seawater. Now, embankments with the total length of 171 miles and 14 sluice gates are under emergency repair. As the first phase, work is under way with the use of 27 machines to get 240,000 hundred-cubit-foot units of earth to repair the broken embankments. And in the second phase, the embankments will be raised to higher levels to be used as shelters. That is a prudent work.

The storm "Nargis" cost a large-scale death and destruction, but now all sectors have almost returned to normal. The plan covers rescue work, emergency fulfillment of basic needs, restoration of livelihoods of local people, and rehabilitation work along with regional development and long-term natural disaster preparedness. The plan is being implemented with the contribution of the State, internal and international donors. The achievement is due to the fact that internal strength of the nation has been employed most effectively.

Studying the tasks to address the issues triggered by the storm, I have come to realize the farsightedness of the leaders of the State, and the importance of preparedness measures. It is known to all that the Ayeyawady delta is the granary of Myanmar, it is reliable for its rice in successive periods. The Head of State gave guidance on construction of dams and reservoirs in Sagaing Division in order that the region will become the granary of the Upper Myanmar. As a result, Sagaing

Division produces 1000 million baskets of paddy surplus a year. Likewise, plans are under way to help Magway Division become the edible oil pot, and Taninthayi Division, another edible oil pot. The government is giving encouragement to states and divisions to achieve at least rice sufficiency.

**Now, local people in the storm-hit areas are reaping the farsighted arrangements for enabling every region in the face of a natural disaster to get basic food supplies such as rice and edible oil from a region or another. If reserve rice and food supplies have not been stored, there would have been a larger number of aftershocks. All the storm survivors have been provided adequate amount food supply. And the whole nation has enjoyed food sufficiency.**

The flooded farmlands in the storm-hit areas have regenerated and put under crops in time. Thanks to the assistance of 8536 power-tillers, 2633 draught cattle, over 1.7 million baskets of paddy seeds, and fuel, over 90 per cent of the affected paddy fields have been put under paddy. That is the fruitful result of hard work of local farmers, supervision of the State, and contributions of local and foreign donors. The government has also made arrangements to mill the paddy. Mostly, townships in the coastal regions have 100-ton and 50-ton rice mills, and rural areas and hamlets, hullers. If hullers are used, the percentage of broken rice is high and rice is of low quality. So, the government is building modern rice mills in the rural areas. That is a change for the better.

The storm destroyed 23,458 acres of salt farms, 24,214 tons of crude salt and many salt enterprises in

Myaungmya, Labutta, Pyapon, and Ngapudaw townships. Salt farms will resume next month. So far, Khu-ai strain paddy has been grown in 10,553 acres of flooded salt farms. Related ministries will provide funds, tractors, water pumps, tarpaulin, plastic and fuel for timely restoration of salt farms. A target has been set to produce 300,000 tons of salt including land salt this year, which is good news for salt farmers.

Indeed, all the donations and relief supplies to the storm-affected areas are numerous. On behalf of my relatives in the seaside regions, I would like to express thanks to the State, internal companies, members of the Sangha, well-wishers and international donors for their generous donations.

**There are a large number of programmes to materialize to have the mission accomplished. The people will have to continue to provide relief supplies to the victims. The people know well that voluntary services alone are not enough to replace the broken bricks with stone ones. The whole plan can be realized only when good advice, funds, equipment and labour services are exerted in harmony. Therefore, I would say in that regard, members of the Sangha and the people are duty-bound to show greater loving-kindness, sympathy, compassion, patriotic spirit, nationalistic fervour and unity and do their bit in carrying out reconstruction and rehabilitation tasks.**

### British company GKN buys Airbus plant in Britain

LONDON, 15 Sept— An Airbus factory in south England is partly being sold to Britain's engineering company GKN for 136 million pounds (242.6 million US dollars), local media reported on Monday.

The factory at the Filton site, Gloucestershire, which makes wing components

for Airbus, was put up for sale by Airbus's parent, EADS, as part of its restructuring program.

British trade union Unite referred the deal as "fantastic news" for the country's manufacturing industry which would ensure the country's leading world-class position for designing, manufacturing and assembling wings for large aircraft.

Kevin Smith, the GKN chief executive, also described the acquisition as an "exciting step" for the company's aerospace business.

"The acquisition of the Filton wing components and assemblies manufacturing operation is a further exciting step in the development of GKN's aerospace business," said Smith.—Internet

### China to adopt new methods to value suspended stocks amid market slump

BEIJING, 15 Sept — China's fund management companies will adopt new methods such as incorporating industry index to value suspended stocks from Tuesday, China's securities regulators said on Monday.

The move was aimed to prevent abnormal high prices of suspended stocks which resumed trading amid a market slump.

Before the move took effect, the price of a stock that had just resumed trading was calculated by that on the last trading day before the suspension.

An official with China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC) said the fund management companies were asked to adopt proper methods of valuing suspended stocks to ensure the fairness and transparency of the valuation process.

While the recent market downturns would probably make them adopt industry index on both stock exchanges as they were more objective and transparent.

He said the new method could temporarily reduce the net asset value of some stock funds.

But it would standardize the valuation process and would not lessen the internal value of those suspended stocks.

The CSRC were studying the exiting regulations on stock suspension to prepare for further amendment on relevant stipulations, he added.

### UAE national airline signs codeshare agreement with Malaysia Airlines

ABU DHABI, 15 Sept— Etihad Airways, the national airline of the United Arab Emirates (UAE), announced Monday that it has signed a codeshare agreement with Malaysia Airlines in an effort to extend its destination network in Asia.

Under the agreement, Etihad will place its two-letter "EY" code on

Malaysia Airlines' flights between Kuala Lumpur, capital of Malaysia, and the country's popular islands of Kota Kinabalu, Penang, Kuching and Langkawi.

In addition, Malaysia Airlines will place its "MH" code on services operated by Etihad between the UAE's capital Abu Dhabi and Bahrain, Doha and Muscat in the Gulf region.

The new codeshare flights pave the way for closer co-operation between the two airlines on a range of other joint initiatives, including collaboration on frequent flyer programs, ground handling, customer support, cargo and airport lounge access, a statement by Etihad said.

dam was aimed at storing 70,000 acre-feet of water to irrigate 10,000 acres of farmlands in Myanaung Township and preventing the floods at farmlands on both banks of Ma Mya Creek.

Ma Mya Creek that originated at Rakhine mountain range flows into Ayeyawady River. Ma Mya Lay Creek, upstream of Ma Mya Creek, flows into Ma Mya Gyi Creek. As a result, a large volume of water flows

into Ma Mya Dam.

On our trip to Ma Mya Dam, we went along Patheingyi-Monywa road from Okshitpin junction. On reaching mile post 17/0, we proceeded one mile west of the road to the dam. At present, the right canal has been constructed and it supplies water to 5,000 acres of farmlands to grow summer paddy.

Ma Mya Dam was built near Hmyinwahtaung Village of Myanaung Township,

Ayeyawady Division, by damming Ma Mya Gyi Creek. In the watershed area of the dam, a total of 240,000 physic nut plants, 300 mango trees, 800 tamarind trees, 200 coconut palms and 400 cashew plants are grown, and flowery plants are thriving there.

Accompanied by Staff Officer U Khin Maung Than, I studied electricity supply to the villages by installing micro hydropower generators at the water outlets

along the right canal of the dam. China-made 2 KW, 3KW and 5KW generators were installing five water outlets together with turbine casing parts manufactured and installed by staff of Construction-9 of the Irrigation Department.

Moreover, engineers of the department calculated capacities of sizes of turbine casing, draft tubes, inflow of water and water level in installing the generators. Electricity is being supplied to Hmyinwahtaung and Ngabatkya villages.

The Construction-9 of the Irrigation Department is upholding the concepts that the dam contributes to greening its environs, cultivation of paddy and development of the country, and the government builds dams to develop villages and generate power by minimizing costs.

Ma Mya Dam has over two miles long embankment and over 600 feet high water control tower. Hence, the dam is pleasantly located in harmony with its water stor-

age area. Ma Mya Dam will irrigate paddy fields and other crops fields forever. For ensuring development of rural areas, electricity is being generated at the dam. As a result, the rural people enjoy fruits of water and power supply thanks to the government's efforts. Local farmers can now concentrate on the extended cultivation of crops for the State and the people.

## Bomber of video lounge in Kyaukkyi arrested

People to remain vigilant against and expose destructive elements trying to enter in disguise

NAY PYI TAW, 15 Sept — News reports were issued on 12 September that authorities concerned discovered an improvised explosive device with a timer

made of plastic hidden under the display of goods in a grocery in Theindan Ward, Kyaukkyi, Bago Division, at about 7.05 pm on 11 September. But they

managed to clear the bomb. At the time of clearing the bomb, two other bombs exploded in a video lounge in the same ward at 8.20 pm and 8.30 pm respectively

killing one man and one woman and wounding eight men and one woman.

The two dead were Mg Saw Bo Nay Tun (Kayin national, a student), 13, son of U Saw Ka Paw He and Ma Pan Nu Khaing, 20 (Bamar national), daughter of U Po Si. The nine wounded persons were Ma Lin Zarni Win (Bamar national, a student), 14, daughter of U Tin Win; Mg Saw Mu Ka Paw Htu (Kayin national, a student), 12, son of U Hti Paw Htu; Mg Saw John Hso Wah (Kayin national, a student), 13, son of U Than Khe; Mg Aung Naing Oo, 20 (Bamar national), son of U Soe Kyi; Mg Chit Yin Htoo (Bamar national), 20, son of U Soe Win; Mg Saw Da Si Htu (Kayin national), 19, son of U Saw Ei Kaw Si; Mg Saw Htu Lay Soe (Kayin national, a student), 7, son of U Saw Pala Htu; Mg Saw Bu Kay Htu (Kayin national), 17, son of U Saw Htu Paw; and Mg Saw Da Hse Hse, 20 (Kayin national), son of U Saw Maung Htu.

Knowing that the casualties in the incidents were only innocent civilians and that they are suffering from insecure life and economic loss, the people have come to abhor the terrorist insurgents. ## UN chief blasts 'cowardly' Afghan attacks

The attack in Kandahar province killed two Afghan doctors working for the World Health Organization as well as their driver. They were in “clearly marked UN vehicles ... carrying out a polio vaccination campaign,” he said.

SYDNEY, 15 Sept—Four people died in a helicopter crash Sunday in Western Australia's remote Kimberly region, police said.

A male helicopter pilot

Police said the accident happened 10 kilometres (6.2 miles) from the Bellburn air strip near Argyle, the site of a major diamond mine and a popular destination for international tourists.

Further details about the crash victims were not available. Police said air crash investigators were at the scene.—*Internet*

## Freeport blasts in Indonesia could be linked: police

TIMIKA (Indonesia), 15 Sept—An explosion near an airport belonging to US mining giant Freeport in Indonesia's eastern Papua province could be linked to an earlier mortar blast, police said Monday.

The Sunday night explosion was the second in three days on the property of the Freeport Indonesia copper and gold mine, which has long been a source of tension in the province.

There were no injuries in either case, police said.

In the latest incident, an explosive destroyed the door of a power plant about one kilometre (0.62 miles) from the airport in Timika town, which is near the mine, said national police spokesman Abubakar Nataprawira.

“Up to now, we don't know the type of explosives used,” he said in Jakarta.

The incident happened outside the mine itself and caused no disruption to operations, Freeport spokesman Mindo Pangaribuan said.

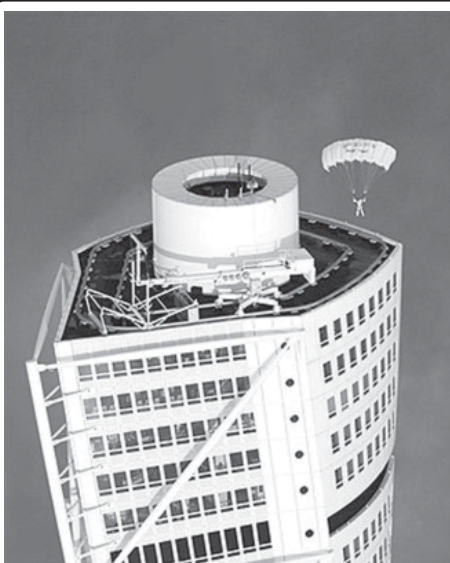

## Boy doles out hundreds of fake \$20 bills at school

Authorities say an 8-year-old boy was handing out hundreds of dollars in fake \$20 bills at an Ocala elementary school. School officials reported the boy to police on Tuesday.

The fake bills were discovered when a child tried to use one to pay for lunch. An administrator then tracked down several other students with fake bills. Those students all identified the boy.

The boy — who was not identified — was turned over to the Department of Children and Families after authorities learned his guardians had warrants for their arrest.

In all, the counterfeit money added up to 44 notes or \$880. Police say they don't know who produced the fake currency.

## Cats rescued after apparently starting house fire

Chattanooga firefighters rescued several cats during a house fire that investigators say was probably caused by the cats themselves.

Fire department spokesman Bruce Garner said firefighters responded to an alarm Thursday morning and found a fire in the kitchen. While no one was home, they found about 10 cats inside.

Some of the cats escaped the house on their own, but some showed signs of smoke inhalation. Firefighters used oxygen bottles and special masks to revive several of the cats. Garner said one cat was not expected to survive.

**Chilean police detain 19 demonstrators in protest**

SANTIAGO, 15 Sept — Chilean police detained 19 demonstrators in clashes during a march on Sunday.

GALEVESTON, 15 Sept— Officials in Galveston raised to five the number of people killed in the city by Hurricane Ike, as the

storm-battered US Gulf Coast continued to dry out and clean up.

The five reported deaths were in the weather-rav-

aged port city of Galveston, and officials said Sunday the toll was likely to rise as clean up and recovery continued. Simon Chabel of the Federal Emergency Management Agency told AFP that as of late Sunday, 3,743 people had been rescued throughout Texas after Ike, a Category Two storm, blew the roofs off of houses, felled trees, flooded roads, and downed and power lines when it made landfall here early Saturday.

Millions of people in the region remained without power, water or sanitation Sunday, prompting officials to advise residents sheltering outside the region to stay away until conditions in the storm-battered region improved.

"Galveston has been hit hard. We have no power. We have no gas. We have no communications. We're not sure when any of that will be up and running," Mayor Lyda Ann Thomas said.—Internet

**More than 20 die in Indonesian charity queue crush**

JAKARTA, 15 Sept— Twenty one people were killed and scores more hurt when a crowd stampeded in Indonesia after about 10,000 people queued for a charity hand-out to mark the Muslim fasting month, the state

news agency said on Monday.

The crush happened in the East Java town of Pasuruan when a crowd of poor people were waiting for a donation, known as zakat, of 30,000 rupiah (\$3.18) each from a wealthy family, Antara said. Some people collapsed due to a lack of oxygen in the crush, while others were trampled, the report said, adding the injured were being treated in a nearby hospital.

Zakat, or alms, is obligatory for wealthy Muslims and usually paid before the end of the fasting month of Ramadan. Many poor people in mostly Muslim Indonesia depend on these funds for several months.—Internet

**NTSB to seek cell phone records in LA train crash**

**Colombia police seize 150 guns, 700 kilos of drug**

WASHINGTON, 15 Sept — The US Coast Guard seized seven tons of cocaine with an estimated street value of \$8.4 million in what one officer called “the most dangerous operation of my career.”

A Coast Guard team

seized the drugs and arrested four suspected smugglers after boarding the stateless vessel in the eastern Pacific Ocean, about 350 miles west of Guatemala, on Saturday.

The vessel, a submarine-like ship

known as a self-propelled semi-submersible, moves beneath the surface of the water but cannot submerge completely like a true submarine.

The ship’s crew threw the engines abruptly into reverse when they saw the Coast Guard team boarding the vessel, in an effort to throw them into the water, the Coast Guard said in a news release.

When that failed, the alleged smugglers tried to sink their ship, but eventually complied with orders from the Coast Guard to close valves that were flooding the vessel, the agency said.

was the result of natural mating with a male giant panda the zoo brought in from China. The zoo had also conducted artificial insemination to improve Rauhin’s chances of breeding. Captive giant pandas are known for their low sex drive, which is exacerbating falling numbers as their natural habitat in southwestern China is encroached on by development.

## New breast cancer vaccine helps body fight tumors

WASHINGTON, 15 Sept — Researchers who designed one experimental breast cancer vaccine say they have fine-tuned the process and come up with another that they hope will be more effective.

Their new vaccine delivers a cancer-fighting gene into cells, which then produce immune system proteins as well as tumor-destroying cells. “In our own mind it is a very significant advance because we have put the gene into the cells in the body. The vaccine is produced by your own cells,” Wei-Zen Wei of Wayne State University in Detroit, who led the study, said in a telephone interview. “It is made right in your body.”

The vaccine eliminated tumors in mice from a type of cancer called HER2 positive cancer, they reported in the journal Cancer Research. HER2-positive cancers account for between 20 percent and 30 percent of breast cancers.—Internet

## Colon cancer Oncogene discovered

SUNDAY, 15 Sept — Researchers have identified a new genetic player in the development of colon cancer.

The findings implicate CDK8, a protein that regulates gene expression in the proliferation of colorectal cancer, the researchers found.

Should the results be validated, they could lead to new therapeutic approaches for colon cancer, as well as new screening and chemopreventative strategies, said Dr Durado Brooks, director of prostate and colorectal cancer at the American Cancer Society.

## One dead and 30 missing in Turkish ferry sinking

ISTANBUL, 15 Sept — A ferry carrying about 100 passengers sank near Turkey’s northwest port of Bandirma overnight, killing at least one person and leaving some 30 people missing, officials said on Monday. Broadcaster NTV said two people had been killed but the report could not be independently verified.

Local fishermen joined rescue operations when the roll-on roll-off ferry, loaded with 73 trucks and two cars, went down in the Sea of Marmara shortly after leaving Bandirma for Istanbul.

Officials said 68 people had been rescued, 31 of whom were injured, but that strong waves and winds were hindering the search.

PARIS, 15 Sept — Pirates fired rockets at a French tuna fishing boat in international waters in the Indian Ocean, 400 nautical miles (740 kilometres) off the Somali coast, the French Ministry for Agriculture and Fisheries said on Sunday. The boat suffered some damage but no one was hurt and it was able to get away after the attack, which occurred during the night, the ministry said in a statement. French and Spanish tropical tuna fishing boats present in the area have all gone back to port in the Seychelles because of the insecurity,

the ministry said. Minister Michel Barnier requested an urgent meeting with his defence and foreign affairs counterparts to examine what measures could be taken to help protect boats sailing in international waters in the Indian Ocean. Barnier called for solutions at European Union level during the French presidency of the bloc, which lasts until the end of this year, to protect a fleet of 55 European boats that fish in the area, according to the statement.

## Eight dead in Philippines as clashes erupt

MANILA, 15 Sept — Sporadic clashes erupted between the government troops and the Muslim rebels in southern Philippines over the weekend, leaving at least eight people killed, including a suspected rebel field commander, local news network INQUIRER.NET reported Sunday.

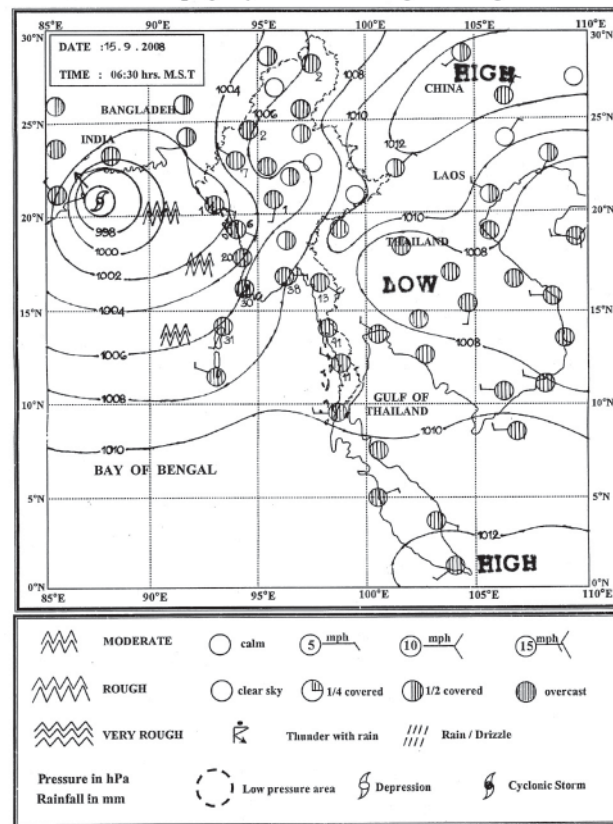
Major Peter Edwin Navarro, spokesperson of Armed Forces of the Philippines 601st Brigade, said the hostilities started Saturday noon in the marshy areas of Datu Piang town in Maguindanao Province. Seven suspected members

of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) and one government soldier were killed.

Navarro said the military encountered undetermined number of rebels believed to be under the most wanted MILF sub-commander Ameril Ombra Kato in Datu Piang town where the rebels were trapped.

Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr MST:

During the past 24 hours, rain or thundershowers have been isolated in Kachin, Kayah and Kayin States, lower Sagaing Division, scattered in Shan State and Mandalay Division, fairly widespread in Rakhine State, upper Sagaing and Taninthayi Divisions and widespread in the remaining States and Divisions. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Dawei (2.84) inches, Gwa (2.48) inches, Yangon (Central) (2.13) inches, Yangon (Kaba-Aye) (1.97) inches, Mindat (1.78) inches, Kayan (1.65) inches, Zaungtu (1.61) inches, and Magway (0.91) inch.

Maximum temperature on 14-9-2008 was 86°F. Minimum temperature on 15-9-2008 was 70°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 15-9-2008 was 100%. Total sunshine hours on 14-9-2008 was (1.6) hours (approx).

Rainfall on 15-9-2008 was (0.98) inch at Mingaladon, (1.97) inches at Kaba-Aye and (2.13) inches at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2008 was (89.64) inches at Mingaladon, (100.59) inches at Kaba-Aye and (117.68) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum wind speed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (10) mph from Southwest at (22:45) hours MST on 14-9-2008.

**Bay inference:** According to the observations at (12:30) hrs M.S.T today, yesterday's depression over the Northwest Bay has not developed further significantly and lay centered at about (160) mile South of Kolkatta (India). It is forecast to move Northwest slowly and cross the Orrissa Coast of India during the (12) hrs commencing this afternoon today, monsoonish condition prevail over Rakhine and weather is cloudy in North Bay and monsoon is moderate in the Andaman Sea and strong elsewhere in the Bay of Bengal.

**Forecast valid until evening of 16-9-2008:** Rain or thundershowers will be scattered in Chin, Kayah, Southern and Eastern Shan States, Sagaing, Mandalay and Magway Divisions, fairly widespread in Kachin and Northern Shan States and widespread in the remaining States and Divisions with likelihood of isolated heavy falls in Southern Rakhine and Mon States, Ayeyawady Division. Degree of certainty is (80%).

**State of the sea:** Squalls with rough sea are likely at times off and along Rakhine Coast. Surface wind speed in squalls may reach (40-45) mph. Sea will be moderate elsewhere in Myanmar waters.

**Outlook for subsequent two days:** Moderate monsoon. **Forecast for Nay Pyi Taw and neighbouring area for 16-9-2008:** One or two rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

**Forecast for Yangon and neighbouring area for 16-9-2008:** Some rain. Degree of certainty is (80%).

**Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring area for 16-9-2008:** Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).
