US soldiers shoot, wound woman in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 4 Jan — American soldiers shot and wounded a woman — identified by an Iraqi television station as one of its producers — after she failed to heed warnings to stop near a Baghdad checkpoint recently targeted by suicide and car bombs, Iraqi and US military officials said on Saturday.

The US military said in a statement that the woman was “acting erratic” and didn’t respond to warnings from Iraqi and American

troops near the checkpoint in the central neighborhood of Jadiriya on Thursday.

“Concerned by the danger she might present to the security forces and civilians, given her repeated failure to respond to warnings, soldiers fired two rounds, wounding the woman,” the US military said. It did not provide further details of her behavior.

The Biladi TV station, which is owned by former Prime Minister Ibrahim al-Jaafari, identified the

woman as 25-year-old producer Hadeel Emad.

Station spokesman Muhsin Kadhum told The Associated Press that Emad had just left the station and was crossing the street to get a taxi when she was shot. “She has hearing problems, and she didn’t hear the warnings,” Kadhum said. “She was wearing a long coat and carried nothing in her hands.” Emad was in critical condition in a Baghdad hospital, Kadhum said.—*Internet*

Pakistan arrests senior Taliban figure

PESHAWAR, 4 Jan— Pakistan has arrested a former Taliban spokesman who was released by Afghanistan in 2007 in exchange for a kidnapped Italian journalist, intelligence officials said on Saturday — a high-profile catch at a time when many in the West are concerned tension with India could distract Pakistan from fighting militants on the Afghan border.

Taliban leader Mullah Omar sent his former spokesman, Ustad Mohammed Yasir, to Pakistan last year to mediate between two Taliban groups in the Mohmand tribal area on the Afghan border, an intelligence official said.

Many Taliban and al-Qaeda militants fled to Pakistan in 2001 after the US-led invasion of Afghanistan to oust the Taliban regime. The US has pushed Pakistan to crack down on the militants, who have regrouped in the country’s northwest and have been launching attacks against Western forces across the border in Afghanistan.

The Pakistani military has launched several operations along the Afghan border, including one earlier this week to secure the main supply route for US and NATO troops in Afghanistan. But many in the West have questioned Islamabad’s willingness to target the Taliban because Pakistan backed the hardline regime before its ouster. Pakistan’s recent decision to redeploy troops away from the Afghan border toward India following tension over the deadly Mumbai attacks has heightened concerns that the fight against militants could languish. India has blamed Pakistani militants for the November attacks in India’s commercial capital that killed more than 160 people.

6.2 quake shakes northeast Afghanistan, Pakistan

KABUL, 4 Jan—Officials say a strong earthquake has hit northeastern Afghanistan, a quake that rattled the capital Kabul for about a minute.

The US Geological Survey says Sunday’s quake had a preliminary magnitude of 6.2 and was located in the northeastern province of Badakhshan in the Hindu Kush mountains. The area is often hit by earthquakes but is sparsely populated.

A Badakhshan police official, Fazel Ahmad Naderi, says the quake was strong but noted that his cell phone still worked, meaning that towers had not been toppled. The quake hit about 12:50 am local time and Naderi says he won’t know about damage until daylight. The quake rattled buildings in Kabul, about 160 miles southwest of the epicenter.—*Internet*

Poland may send more troops to Afghanistan

WARSAW, 4 Jan—Poland may send 400-600 additional troops to Afghanistan, raising its total number to 2,000-2,200, Defence Minister Bogdan Klich was quoted as saying on Saturday.

Klich told the Dziennik daily the government would review the Afghan mission’s effectiveness in January and depending on the result may opt for increasing the number of troops. “After the review the government will decide whether to continue our presence with the current strength, or as experts say, whether to raise it by 400-600 soldiers,” Klich said.

In October, Poland took command of security in the Afghan province of Ghazni, a volatile area two hours’ drive southwest of Kabul, freeing up US forces.

Govt trying for release of kidnapped Indian in Afghanistan

NEW DELHI, 4 Jan— The Centre has been doing its best for the safe release of an Indian worker who was abducted by militants at Herath Province in Afghanistan two months ago, the government said on Saturday.

“Details will not be revealed as it is a kidnap case. The Embassy is at the job. They are trying through the Government,” overseas Indian affairs minister Vyalar Ravi said commenting on the abduction of Simon Paramanandam, who hails from Kalakurichi Village of Villupuram district in Tamil Nadu.

Paramanandam, who was working with an Italian food store supplying food to its soldiers in Afghanistan, was kidnapped by a militant group on 13 October last year.—*Internet*

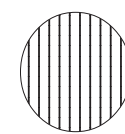

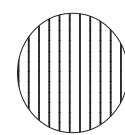

Australia aviation regulator probes military link to emergencies

SYDNEY, 4 Jan — Australia's air safety regulator will examine whether interference from military radio signals prompted a second aircraft emergency over the country's northwest.

A Singapore-bound Qantas jet carrying 277 passengers was forced to turn back to the west-coast city of Perth early on

27 December 2008, after the aircraft's auto pilot disconnected.

The plane was about 260 nautical miles (416 kilometres) north-west of Perth when the malfunction occurred, disrupting the supply of key information to flight control computers.

The Air Transport Safety Bureau announced

late Friday that it would combine the investigation into the incident with a probe into a similar emergency in October.

"As it appears to be a similar event to a previous event involving an A 330 aircraft on 7 Oct 2008 it will be included as part of the earlier investigation," the bureau said.

French warship thwarts Somali pirate attack

PARIS, 4 Jan — A French warship has thwarted an attack by Somali pirates on a cargo ship in the dangerous Gulf of Aden on a day when several cargo ships were attacked, the French president's office said.

The warship was patrolling the area on Thursday as part of a multinational operation to protect commercial vessels passing through one of the world's most important sea routes.

The crew of the French "PM L'Her" dispatch boat intercepted two speedboats carrying eight Somali pirates as they were preparing to board a Panamanian cargo ship, said a statement that President Nicolas Sarkozy's office released late Thursday. The French Navy will hand over the men to Somali authorities.

The French crew seized weapons and munitions from the speedboats, the statement said.

Also on Thursday, Somali pirates seized an Egyptian cargo ship and its 28 crew members, but a Malaysian military helicopter saved an Indian tanker from being hijacked.

More than a dozen warships are now patrolling the vast waterway between the shores of Yemen and Somalia. Countries as diverse as Britain, India, Iran, the United States, China, France and Germany have naval forces in the waters.

According to the International Maritime Bureau, pirates attacked 111 times in the Gulf of Aden in 2008, successfully hijacking 42 ships.—Internet

Chile identifies 133 endangered species

SANTIAGO, 4 Jan—Chile has identified 58 fauna and 75 flora species on the verge of extinction, the National Commission of Environment (Conama) said Friday.

"In this process (of the identification), there are two standouts—the southern right whale and humpback whale, classified as endangered and vulnerable respectively, as well as a high percentage of species from Juan Fernandez Archipelago," Chilean Environment Minister Anlia Uriarte said.

Only about 100 southern right whales are currently living in the South Pacific, said Uriarte, who also heads the ministerial commission.

The humpback whale is classified as "vulnerable" as it has begun a slow but progressive process of recovering, she added.

Meanwhile, Alvaro Sapag, executive director of Conama, said the identification process "allows us to have precise and relevant information on the species that live in our territory".—MNA/Xinhua

Manned flight to Mars one step closer?

An experiment based on a manned flight to Mars is planned to be launched in March 2009. Ten candidates have been selected for participation in the 105-day-long experiment.

Among the ten selected candidates are six Russians, and four representatives of the European Union.

Candidates were selected according to questioning and complex medical examination in the Central Clinical Hospital of the Russian Academy of Sciences and in the European Astronaut Centre in Cologne, Germany.

The final crew will include four volunteers from Russia and two from the European Space Agency. Those volunteers who will not be part of the crew will help carry out the experiment.



The primary goals of experiment are the physiological and psychological adaptation of the crewmen to the conditions of closed and isolated space and studying the interaction of the crew with the personnel of the experiment's control centre under hanging conditions of communication.

Crocodile discovered in London bath

A crocodile has been discovered living in a bath in London.

When he entered, he found the creature lying in the tub. "What I didn't expect was to be eyeballed by a two-foot-long crocodile, happily lounging in the bath," he said.

The official called a team of animal control experts to take away the reptile, which the flat's occupant claimed he was looking after for a friend.

Police use tobacco spit to nab burglary suspect

A trail of tobacco spit has led investigators to a suspect in at least five burglaries across eastern Oklahoma, police said.

Randy Lee Shoopman Jr, 33, was charged with 11 counts of second-degree burglary after a sample of his DNA matched that taken from expectorant left behind at the scene of several burglaries in Oklahoma, said officer Brad

Robertson, a spokesman for the Tahlequah police department.

Shoopman was taken into custody in Merced, Calif, on an unrelated stolen property charge, Robertson said.

Investigators also said Shoopman may be involved in break-ins at businesses across eastern Oklahoma and in Missouri.

Stilwell police detective Chad Smith said he was investigating the burglary of an insurance company in September when he noticed a tobacco stain on papers in the ransacked office.

Utah store has bone to pick with shoplifting dog

A thief remains at large after pulling off a daring heist — in the pet food aisle.

Surveillance video at a supermarket in this Salt Lake City suburb caught a dog shoplifting, KSL-TV reported on Wednesday.

The video showed the dog walking in the front door of Smith's Food & Drug in Murray, and heading straight to Aisle 16, the pet food aisle, where it grabbed a bone worth \$2.79.

The thief wasn't even perturbed by a face-to-face confrontation with store manager Roger Adamson.

"I looked at him. I said 'Drop it!'" Adamson said. "He looked at me, and I looked at him, and he ran for the door and away he went, right out the front door."

Plants, flowers speed surgical recovery

MANHATTAN, 4 Jan — US researchers have confirmed the beneficial effects of plants and flowers for patients recovering from abdominal surgery. Researchers Seong-Hyun Park and Richard H Mattson of Kansas State University say there is strong evidence that contact with plants is directly beneficial to a hospital patient's health.

The researchers studied 90 patients recovering from appendectomy. Patients were randomly assigned to hospital rooms with or without plants during their post-operative recovery periods and data were collected on the length of hospitalization, administration of drugs for post-operative pain control, vital signs, ratings of pain intensity, distress, fatigue, anxiety and room satisfaction.

The study, published in the journal HortTechnology, found patients with plants in their rooms had significantly fewer intakes of pain medication; more positive physiological responses — lower blood pressure and heart rate; less pain, anxiety and fatigue; and higher satisfaction with their recovery rooms compared to the control group.

The study suggests that potted plants offer the most benefit, as opposed to cut flowers, because of their longevity. Nursing staff reported that as patients recovered, they began to show interaction with the plants, including watering, pruning, and moving them for a better view or light. Indoor plants make air healthier and provide an optimum indoor environment by increasing humidity and reducing the quantity of mold spores and airborne germs, the researchers added. —Internet

Man discovers neighbour is his long lost sister

MANCHESTER, 4 Jan — A brother and sister in England spent 40 years trying to find each other then discovered they lived only 300 yards apart. Ken Whitty, 64, walked past 62-year-old Yvonne's house countless times and even saw her in the garden, but did not recognize her.

They were reunited only after Whitty wrote to his local paper appealing for help in his search. Soon after his letter was published, he got a phone call saying: "Hello, this is Yvonne." The pair spent their early years in Ordsall, Greater Manchester.

They were still kids when their parents died and were cared for by a family friend.

They lost touch after leaving home and starting their own families. Later, they tried to trace each other then Whitty, wrote to the paper last month.

When Yvonne called, it turned out she was living 300 yards from him in Reddish, Greater Manchester. Ken, who moved to Reddish in 2002, said: "I couldn't believe it. I shot round to see her. "Yvonne said: "It's so nice to see Ken again. It's overwhelming."

WINCHESTER, 4 Jan — A 40-year-old British mother-of-two says she was forced go home and get her passport after being told she was too young to buy alcohol at a store. Karen Hamilton of Hampshire county said during a recent beer run at a Tesco retail store, she was told she could not buy alcohol without proper documentation of her age, the Daily Mail reported Saturday.

Hamilton, who was not carrying any identification with a photograph at the time, said she became annoyed at the clerk's unwillingness to accept her

age claims. "The woman at the check-out must have been about my age but she insisted on asking for ID — I thought she was joking," she said.

"It became very irritating because I couldn't convince her otherwise — other women in the queue even tried to argue for my case by saying they thought I looked over 18." The Mail said Tesco has since apologized for the incident and suggested Hamilton should feel complimented for being seen as younger than 18, the legal alcohol purchasing age in Britain.

Bavarian beaver at home in Britain

EXETER, 4 Jan — A Bavarian beaver is making itself at home in England's Devon county after escaping from an area farm, its owner says.

Conservationist Derek Gow said the escaped 88-pound beaver apparently does not know it has moved across several international borders and is preparing for a typical German winter, The Times of London reported Saturday. "It's laying up a store of feed because it doesn't know it isn't in Germany," Gow said of the animal, which was one of three that escaped four weeks ago from his farm.

Drug traffickers hanged in prison

TEHERAN, 4 Jan — Iran has hanged two men in prison in the south-eastern city of Zahedan after they were convicted of drug trafficking, the state broadcaster reported.

The report said the unnamed men were found guilty of smuggling 300kg of drugs. The hangings are the first to be reported in 2009. Iran executed at least 246 people last year. Capital offences in the Islamic republic include murder, rape, armed robbery, drug trafficking and adultery.

UN Security Council fails to reach agreement on Gaza

UNITED NATIONS, 4 Jan—The UN Security Council failed to reach any formal agreement after discussions on Israeli military operations in the Gaza Strip, the president of the council said on Saturday.

“There was no formal agreement among the members of the Security Council,” said Jean-Maurice Ripert, France’s UN ambassador and the current council president.

Ripert spoke to reporters after the 15-member council held a closed-door emergency meeting after Israeli troops entered Gaza. However, Ripert said he noted “strong convergences” among council members to have a state-

ment adopted by the council to call for “an immediate, permanent and fully respected cease-fire in Gaza and southern Israel.”

During the closed-door consultations, some council members voiced concern at the escalation of violence and the humanitarian situation in Gaza. They called for efforts to ensure free access to the area so that humanitarian supplies could be shipped to people in need.

“There are also strong convergences among the council members to call on all parties to resume peace talks,” Ripert said.

JERUSALEM, 4 Jan—The aim of ongoing Gaza ground incursion is to stop the hostile aggression of the enemy, Israeli Defence Minister Ehud Barak said Saturday evening.

“We don’t want war, but we won’t abandon citizens victimized by Hamas,” Barak was quoted by local daily Ha’aretz as saying shortly after the ground incursion began.

“We will provide Israeli citizens with peace and quiet,” he stressed.

“I know well the dangers and the price of military operation,” said the defence minister, noting that “I don’t want to fool anyone, Gaza operation won’t be short and easy.”—Xinhua

Korean Air’s inauguration of service in China. To achieve sustainable growth in China is an important development target of the carrier’s global strategy. The aviation negotiation between China and the Republic of Korea will kick off in January 2009. Korean Air expects China

to open more cities in the west. Korean Air owns 126 aircraft, among the top 20 biggest airlines in the world. China has become the most important overseas market for the carrier.—Xinhua

Four people die, buildings damaged in Indonesia’s earthquakes

JAKARTA, 4 Jan—Four people were dead and two hotels collapsed when the earthquakes hit eastern Indonesia’s West Papua Province on Sunday morning, said Satrio Nurhat, an official from the Indonesian National Disaster Management Centre.

Nurhat said that some local residential buildings and two banks were also damaged in the quakes, adding casualties and material damage were still increasing. A 7.2-magnitude earthquake jolted eastern Indonesia’s West Papua Province at 4:43 am local time on Sunday (1943 GMT Saturday), followed by aftershocks measuring 5.1, 6.1, 5.1 and 7.6 degrees on the Richter scale, respectively.

The strongest 7.6-magnitude aftershock struck at 7:33 am local time (2233 GMT on Saturday), with its epicenter at 0.88 degrees southern latitude, 133.38 degrees eastern longitude, and a depth of 10 km below the sea level.—Xinhua

Cambodian minister says foreign tourist arrivals in 2008 less than expected

PHNOM PENH, 4 Jan— Cambodia received less foreign tourists in 2008 than expected due to the global financial crisis and the instability in neighboring Thailand, national media said on Sunday.

The total number of foreign tourist arrivals in the kingdom in 2008 stood at 2.15 million or so, a 6 percent rise over 2007, but much less than the expected 15 percent to 20 percent, Chinese-lan-

guage newspaper the Commercial News quoted Tourism Minister Thon Khong as saying.

Around 33 percent of them came to Cambodia through Thailand and 29 percent through another neighboring country Vietnam, the minister said.

In 2008, top 5 providers of foreign tourists for Cambodia were South Korea, Vietnam, Japan, the United States and China, he added.—Xinhua

Two security men killed in landmine explosion in SW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 4 Jan— Two paramilitary soldiers were killed and four others injured in a landmine explosion in southwestern Pakistan on Saturday, private TV channel DAWN NEWS reported.

The soldiers were patrolling a gas field in the town of Dera Bugti in Balochistan Province when a landmine was detonated by their vehicle, said the report.

As a result, two soldiers were killed and four others injured.

A spokesman for a militant group called Baloch Republican Army, Sarbaz Khan, later claimed responsibility of the attack.

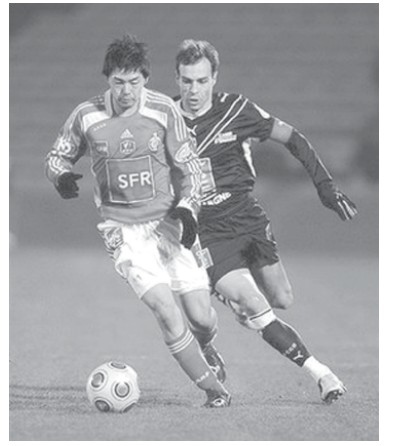
The world No 3 broke through for his first Grand Slam win at last year's Australian Open when he beat Frenchman Jo-Wilfried Tsonga in the final.

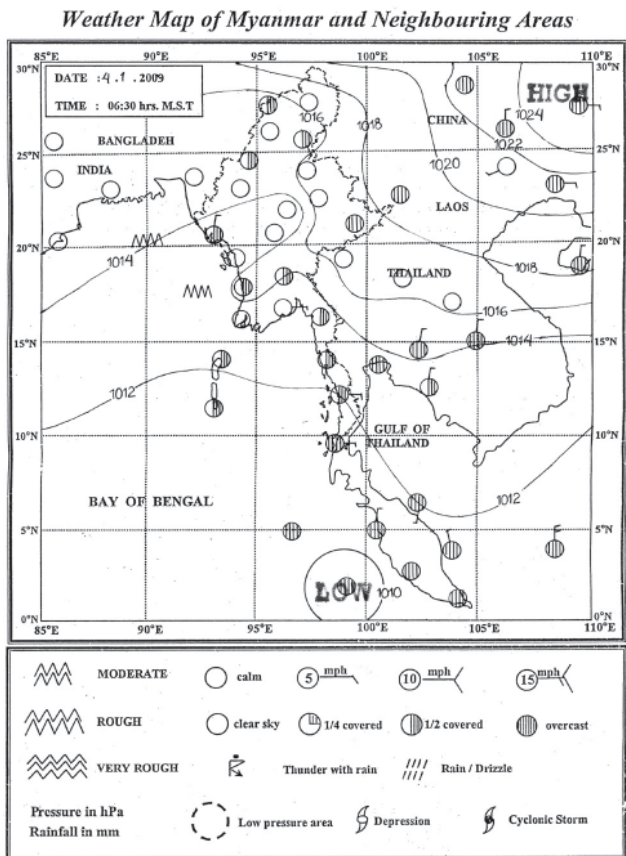
symbol of blessings, is emblazoned on the oxen’s body, brings well wishes of hope and happiness in the New Year.

Grape seed extract kills leukemia cells

LEXINGTON, 4 Jan—An extract from grape seeds forces laboratory leukemia cells to commit cell suicide, University of Kentucky researchers said. The study, published in *Clinical Cancer Research*, found that within 24 hours, 76 percent of leukemia cells had died after being exposed to the extract. While grape seed extract has shown activity in a number of laboratory cancer cell lines—including skin, breast, colon, lung, stomach and prostate cancers—no one had tested the extract in hematological cancers, said lead author Xianglin Shi. The researchers found that the extract activates JNK, a protein that regulates the apoptotic—cell death—pathway. “What everyone seeks is an agent that has an effect on cancer cells but leaves normal cells alone, and this shows that grape seed extract fits into this category,” Shi said in a statement. The research is not far enough along to suggest that people should eat grapes, grape seeds or grape skin in excess to stave off cancer, Shi said. “This is very promising research, but it is too early to say this is chemoprotective,” Shi said in a statement.—*Internet*

Nano device ‘times drug release’

LONDON, 4 Jan—US researchers say they have harnessed the power of gold nanoparticles to devise a better way of delivering

drugs to treat diseases such as cancer. The fledgling system could release a number of drugs in a specific part of the body at desired intervals, the MIT team wrote in the journal *ACS Nano*.

The device makes use of the fact that different particles melt when exposed to different levels of infrared light.

Different drugs on the particles could thus be released in a controlled way. One of the advantages of being able to

deliver drugs directly to a specific site within the body is that you can use relatively toxic drugs without fear of causing widespread damage to other, healthy tissue.

A number of trials are using nanoparticles, sometimes as small as one nanometre—or a billionth of a metre—to take drugs directly to the site of a tumour and avoid many of the side-effects associated with traditional chemotherapy.
