## Suicide attack kills four US soldiers in Mosul

BAGHDAD, 10 Feb—A suicide car bomber struck a US patrol in northern Iraq on Monday, killing four American soldiers and an Iraqi interpreter in the deadliest single attack against US forces in nine months.

The blast occurred as US vehicles were passing near an Iraqi police checkpoint in Mosul, Iraq's third largest city and the last major urban battleground in the war against al-Qaida and other

Sunni militants.

American casualties have fallen to some of their lowest levels of the war since thousands of Sunnis abandoned the insurgency and US and Iraqi forces routed Shiite militias in Baghdad and Basra last spring. Only five of the 16 US service members who died in Iraq last month were killed in action.

However, fighting continues in Mosul and elsewhere in northern Iraq — a conflict which US offi-

cialists say is driven in part by ethnic rivalries between Sunni Arabs and Kurds. Many Sunni extremists are believed to have fled north after being driven from longtime strongholds in Baghdad and central Iraq.

A US statement said three US soldiers were killed at the scene of Monday's attack. A fourth soldier and the interpreter died of wounds at a military hospital, the US said.—Internet

## Obama says no decision on changing Iraq, Afghanistan policies

WASHINGTON, 10 Feb—US President Barack Obama on Monday said there is no decision yet on how to change Iraq and Afghanistan policies.

He made the remarks at his first prime time White House press conference as president. "I do not have yet a timetable for how long that's going to take. What I know is I'm not going to make — I'm not going to allow Al-Qaeda or bin Laden to operate with impunity, planning attacks on the US homeland," he said, responding to a question on what's his timetable to withdraw troops from Afghanistan.

"With respect to Afghanistan, this is going to be a big challenge," Obama said. On Iraq, the president also stopped short of mentioning the timetable.

"We just saw an election in Iraq that went relatively peacefully and you get a sense that the political system is now functioning in a meaningful way." Internet

## US, allies, Kabul government losing ground

WASHINGTON, 10 Feb—Support for the Kabul government and the United States and European troops trying to bolster it against insurgents is plummeting among the Afghan people, a new poll reports.

The decline is striking particularly in the last year, the poll shows, even as the Obama administration and NATO allies weigh moves to strengthen forces in the struggle with Taliban and other radical groups.

President Barack Obama has assigned high priority to the conflict and the administration is weighing whether to send another 30,000 US troops there, almost doubling the 32,000 present.

His election, however, does not appear to hold much promise among the Afghan people: Two in 10 think he will make things better for the Afghan people and nearly as many think he will make things worse. The rest either expect no change or are waiting to see.

The poll, conducted by ABC News, the BBC and ARD German TV found, for instance, that the number of Afghans who say their country is headed in the right direction has dropped from 77 percent in 2005 to 40 percent now. That new and lower level is the first time less than half the Afghans polled were found to approve.

On top of that decline, while 83 percent of Afghans expressed a favorable opinion of the United States in 2005, just 47 percent feel that way now.

There was an 18 percent drop this year alone, according to polling results.

## US military deaths in Iraq war at 4,243

WASHINGTON, 10 Feb—As of Monday, 9 Feb, 2009, at least 4,243 members of the US military had died in the Iraq war since it began in March 2003.

The figure includes eight military civilians killed in action. At least 3,406 military personnel died as a result of hostile action, according to the military's numbers.

The British military has reported 178 deaths; Italy, 33; Ukraine, 18; Poland, 21; Bulgaria, 13; Spain, 11; Denmark, seven; El Salvador, five; Slovakia, four; Latvia and Georgia, three each; Estonia, Netherlands, Thailand and Romania, two each; and Australia, Hungary, Kazakhstan and South Korea, one death each.—Internet

## Car bomb explodes at trade fair centre in Spain

MADRID, 10 Feb—A car bomb believed planted by the armed Basque group ETA exploded at a business park on Madrid's outskirts Monday, but no one was injured, police said.

The bomb went off shortly after 9 am (0800GMT; 3 am EST) at the park in the Campo de Las Naciones trade fair centre about 90 minutes after the Spanish Red Cross received a warning call, a police spokesman said.

The explosion blew a meter-deep (3-foot) hole in the ground, destroyed some 30 cars and blew out windows at nearby offices, but no one was hurt, the spokesman said.

## Egypt invites rival Palestinian groups to meet

CAIRO, 10 Feb — In a sign of progress on a deal to end the Gaza crisis, Egypt has invited rival Palestinian factions to a reconciliation conference in Cairo this month, a Palestinian official said on Monday.

Egypt is trying to broker two key agreements in the sensitive region. One is a long-term truce between Israel and Gaza's militant Hamas leaders in place of a temporary cease-fire after Israel's devastating three-week offensive in Gaza last

month.

The other is an end to the bitter divide between Hamas and the Palestinian Authority, which worsened after the militant group expelled its rivals from Gaza more than a year and a half ago.

The Palestinian Authority controls the West Bank. The groups received invitations for the 22 Feb reconciliation

meeting, said Abdel Rahim Malouh, leader of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine.

In Paris, Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak expressed hope for "a return to calm" in Gaza by next week, after he and French President Nicolas Sarkozy discussed efforts for a one- or two-year truce in the Palestinian territory.—Internet

## British military plane crashes in Cyprus

NICOSIA, 10 Feb — A British military aircraft crashed on Monday at one of its two "sovereign bases" in southern Cyprus, but two pilots survived the accident.

"There has been an incident involving a military aircraft in RAF Akrotiri," confirmed British Bases Spokesman Stewart Bardsley, adding "there have been no fatalities as a result of the accident."

The pilot and co-pilot managed to eject from the jet and are currently being treated for "non life-threatening injuries," said the spokesman.

The aircraft was on a training exercise when it crashed on the runway of the British Base of Akrotiri on the south coast of Cyprus.—Internet

## Beijing blaze caused by "unlicensed" fireworks

BEIJING, 10 Feb—A fire that swept through part of Central China Television's hypermodern complex in Beijing was caused by powerful but unapproved fireworks,

state media said.

A fireman died after inhaling toxic gases when fighting the fire at the still unopened 30-storey building, Xinhua news agency said. Seven

people were injured, including six firefighters.

The blaze started on Monday evening and put out at 2 am on Tuesday.

Flames 20-30 feet high shot out of the building, just north of the spectacular, gravity-defying CCTV tower designed by Dutch architect Rem Koolhaas. The flames were reflected in the tower, which itself appeared to be untouched.

"CCTV hired staff from a fireworks company to ignite several hundred large festive firecrackers" in an open space outside the near-completed Mandarin Oriental Hotel, part of the CCTV tower complex, Xinhua said, quoting a fire brigade spokesman.

## US stock futures fall; uncertainty on "bad bank" plan

HONG KONG, 10 Feb — US stock futures fell on Tuesday on uncertainty about a White House financial rescue package after a CNBC report of an altered form of a "bad bank" plan to buy toxic assets from commercial banks.

Investors were waiting for a speech later by US Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner in which he is expected to unveil details about the plan.

CNBC initially reported the "bad bank" aspect was being dropped, but later updated its report to say a new form of the plan will essentially combine public and private resources to take bad assets off banks' books.—Internet

## Canada bankruptcies up over 12% in 2008

OTTAWA, 10 Feb — The number of individuals and businesses going bankrupt in Canada in 2008 totaled 96,774, up 12.3 percent from the 86,140 recorded in 2007, according to local media reports on Monday.

For the fourth quarter, bankruptcies totaled 26,436, up 9.3 percent from the previous quarter and 25.3 percent higher than the fourth quarter of 2007, federal monitoring agency the Office of the Superintendent of Bankruptcy reported on Monday.

However, the number of individuals and businesses going bust dropped in December compared with November.—Internet

## Oil below \$40 as investors eye US stimulus

SINGAPORE, 10 Feb—Oil prices languished below \$40 a barrel on Tuesday in Asia even as investors looked to a massive US stimulus package as a possible tonic for flagging crude demand.

Light, sweet crude for March delivery rose 35 cents to \$39.91 a barrel by midday in Singapore on the New York Mercantile Exchange.

The contract fell 61 cents overnight to settle at \$39.56.

The Senate passed an \$838 billion economic stimulus bill in a key test vote on Monday, setting up final approval on Tuesday.

The plan will then have to be reconciled with an \$819 billion package from the House of Representatives.

The measure nearing approval in the Senate calls for more tax cuts and less spending than the House bill.—Internet



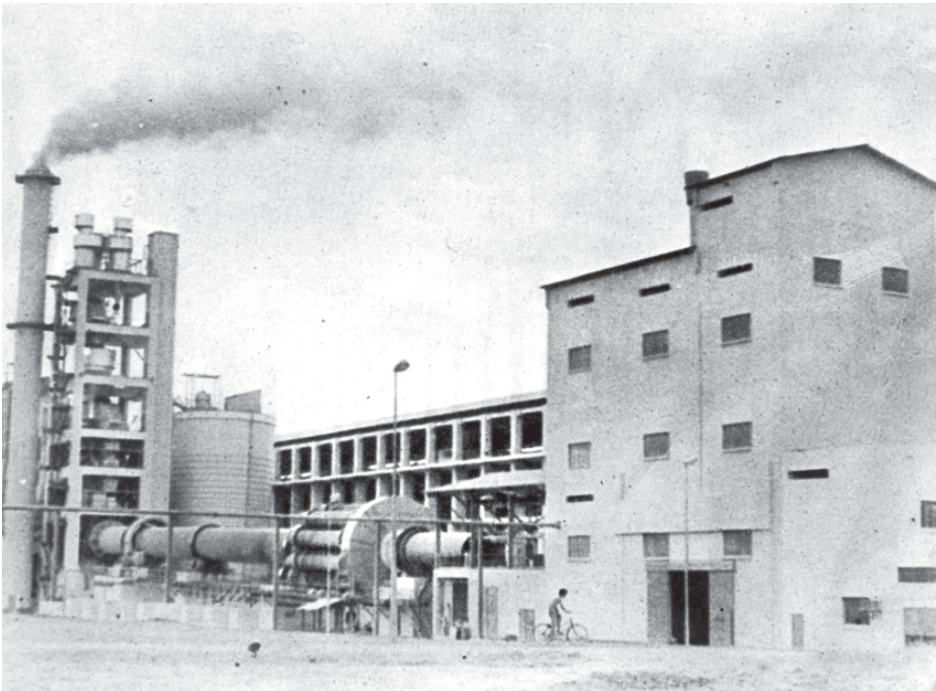

Hailing the 62<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary Union Day**Union and amicable relations***Yan Gyi Aung*

The global family consists of over 190 countries, 27 of which are unions. Five union countries: the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, United Arab Emirates and West India Archipelago collapsed and some of their parts seceded from them. Two union countries: Libya and Indonesia transformed themselves into unitary ones.

Of the union countries, some are constituted with states of equal status; the United States of America, Canada and Australia, for instance, were made up of colonies founded by European colonialists. Some used to be monarchies or empires that later became colonies; India, Malaysia and Nigeria, for instance, re-demarcated their states and reconstituted themselves into union nations after regaining independence. Some unitary countries such as Spain, Belgium and South Africa transformed themselves into union countries. Some countries such as Germany and United Arab Emirates formed themselves into union countries due to the fact that they were facing common enemies or they realized that they would be strong ones if they combined together.

Moreover, some union countries delineated their self-administered areas according to culture (for example languages, religious faith and ethnic group); some, according to geographical features; and some, according to both culture and geographical features.

Some union countries are very centralized, whereas some are not much centralized in sharing powers between the union government (central government) and state governments.

**Union countries are various and many according to their forms, constitutions, systems of sharing powers, and executive systems. Therefore, there is no specific principle to decide whether a union country is a real one or not. And each country has to write the constitution that is likely to be the most appropriate one for them, based on historical backgrounds, geographical features, cultures, traditions, social norms, economy, and political system concerned.**

Of the unitary and union countries, some are developed ones as well as political and economic powers, whereas some are poor ones, stemming from disunity of the people.

So, it can be deduced from the points that concept of the people is more dominant in terms of national unity, military power and development than geographical features and the structures of the nations. Even in a unitary country, the central government will get along with the self-administered areas if the people show mutual interest, understanding, trust and respect towards one another. And if in the same situation, the union government will get along with state governments; the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw (parliament), with state Hluttaws; and the Amyotha Hluttaw, with the Pyithu Hluttaw in dealing with each other and sharing powers in a union country.

Smooth relations of a nation's political forces rest mainly on their political maturity, priority to national interest rather than to self-interest and the interest of the party concerned, and to national politics rather than to power, money and political influence, and on mutual respect and interest and friendly relations between political forces. In other words, a nation can enjoy the taste of national unity, peace and stability, and development only if all the human societies including political communities build the relations

from peace due to the circle of prejudices and retaliation, oppression on the weak countries by stronger ones, and suicide bomb blasts.

Iraq under the political control of other country is still going through the hell of doomsday scenarios due to disunity of the people caused by religious and racial discrimination between Shiia Muslims and Sunny Muslims. Similarly, Afghanistan is still facing untold miseries due to alien intervention, following national disintegration caused by wars for territorial possession and power between Pushton people in the southern part and Uzbek, Takmin and Tajik ethnic groups. Long ago, the country used to earn a good reputation as Gandhara Province or the academic hub of the world, but now it is like an outlying country as a result of losing national unity.

Some other countries that have seceded from their unions such as Kosovo and Georgia are still witnessing battles. Still running high are a variety of problems and disputes between a region with its own ethnic groups, language and religious faith and another region with different ethnic groups, language and religious faith in non-union countries. Likewise in Southeast Asia, the Philippines is facing an issue on Moro ethnic group; Thailand, southern region issue; Indonesia, Maluku islets issue, and in southern Asia, Sri Lanka is facing rebellion of Tamil Tigers.

**All national races remained united in repulsing the alien invasion of the motherland in the successive periods. They immersed themselves in the drive for unifying the nation into the First, Second and Third Myanmar empires that attracted respects and admiration from neighbouring countries.**

based on loving-kindness among them.

Today, the world has seen rising instabilities, armed conflicts, suicide bomb attacks, and interior destructive acts due to prejudices against each other between countries, or human societies of a country, along with too much priority to self-interest, racial and religious and social discrimination, hegemony, discrimination by the majority against the minority, and jealousy and ill will harboured by weak forces towards stronger ones.

For instance, the recent incident that took place in Gaza region revealed that the Middle East at the center of three continents will have a prosperous future if investments and technology of Israel, oil deposits of Arabian countries and cheap labour of Palestine are combined. Nonetheless, the countries are still well far

**So, ensuring non-disintegration of the Union and national unity is of greater importance for the union countries that are constituted with states with different cultures.** So far, of the 34 union countries, seven countries or about 20 per cent could not stand as union countries long.

Being convinced of the union system's advantages of unity and harmonious combination of different cultures and traditions, many unitary countries have changed themselves into union ones. Some countries like the United Kingdom came to practise unitary executive system and the union power-sharing system in combination, according to their conditions. Some sovereign European countries came to realize the benefits of the union system, they had striven for

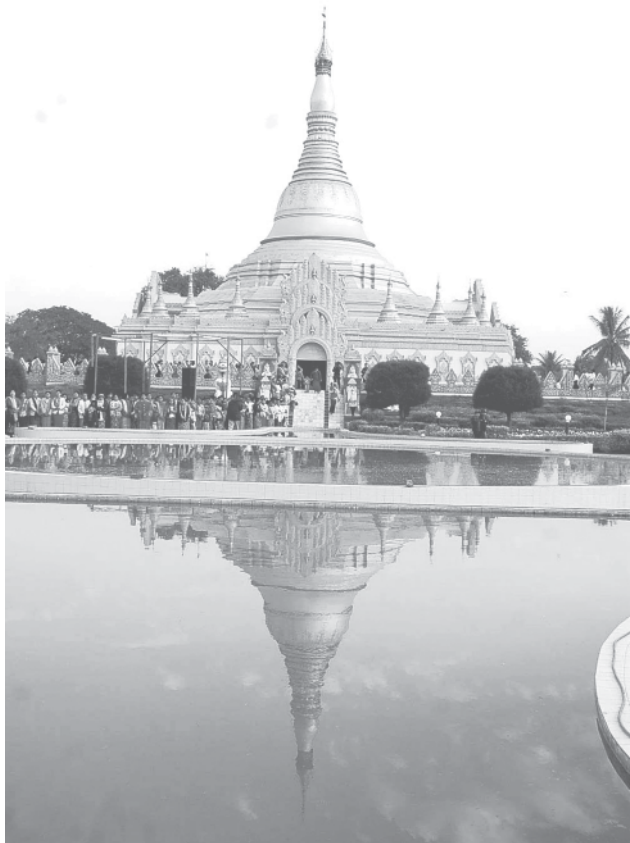

viewed the fossil of Ingyin Tree (*Pentacme suavis*) which is 160 ft long and 14 ft in circumference. The fossil of the hardwood tree was discovered in the Field No. 534 of Farmer U Myint San in June, 2005.

Afterwards, Vice-Senior General Maung Aye and party also viewed the other fossil of Ingyin Tree (*Pentacme suavis*) which is over 124 ft long and was discovered in the eastern field of Paittukan in June, 2007.

According to geologists, it is estimated that those fossils are about 1.2 million or 1.8 million years old.

Deer, monkeys, birds, crocodiles, rabbits, parrots and peacocks are kept for the public and shady trees are also planted in the garden. Afterwards, Vice-Senior General Maung Aye and party went to Thaphanseik Dam which was inaugurated in Kyunhla Township in 2001. At the briefing hall of the dam, Director of the Irrigation Department of the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation U Soe Nyunt reported to Vice-Senior General Maung Aye on facts about the dam.

During the tour, Vice-Senior General Maung Aye inspected the stor-

age of water and the intake and output channels of the dam.

Before Thaphan-seik Dam was constructed, Kaboe Dam irrigated about 280,000 acres of rice fields in every rainy season. On completion, Thaphanseik Dam has irrigated over 800,000 acres rice fields in the rainy and summer yearly via Kaboe and Kintat diversion dams.

Besides, the dam has supported water to the Hydropower plant constructed at the dam to generate electricity and the dam has become the multi-purpose one. After the inspection tour of the dam, Vice-Senior General Maung Aye and party went to Seikphumyaung

Village in Kanbalu Township where local villagers, members of social organizations and officials concerned welcome them. Vice-Senior General Maung Aye visited the clinic and library of the village and presented gifts to the aged and donated books and periodicals to the library.

Kayah State has already got a university for computer studies apart from the technological uni-

versity for human resource development. Now, Kayah State has been equipped with arts and science university, technological university and the university for computer studies that it has never got.

The Tatmadaw government is implementing plans for raising the nation's education standard and human resource development in its bid to generate a promising future of the nation. High education standard is essential for sustainable development of the human society, staying in touch with the changes, and long-term survival of the human society. Education is essential for expanding the horizons of the people, so lagging behind in education means all other sectors lag behind in development.

He cited the guidance of the Head of State, saying that education is the fundamental of develop-

Moreover, states and divisions are all making progress in parallel. Of the 14 states and divisions, Kayah State has smaller area and population than any other one, but its development is gaining momentum. Kayah State enjoyed annual average economic development by over 11.7 per cent in the third five-year plan (2001-2002 to 2005-2006), by nearly 10 per cent in the first year (2006-2007) and by about 11 per cent in the second year (2007-2008) of the second five-year plan. Due to the launch of cultivation of summer paddy, it increased total paddy sown acreage to over 100,000 in 2007-2008 from just over 60,000 in the past. In addition, it is growing edible oil crops extensively. As a result, supply of rice and edible oil has met the demand in Kayah State.

Nearly 60,000 local youths are pursuing education in 388 basic education schools in Kayah State. It has got 55 more basic education schools: seven high, six middle, and 42 primary schools.

As to the health sector, a 200-bed hospital, six 25-bed hospitals, eight station hospitals, 27 rural health care centres and a 16-bed traditional medicine hospital have been established to provide better health care to the people. Regarding the transport sector, Aungban-Loikaw Railroad was con-

structed in 1993, so Kayah State is now accessible not only by car and by air but also by train. Funds have been set up yearly to maintain such roads as Toungoo-Leiktho-Yado-Loikaw, Loikaw-Punchaung-Shardaw, Bawlakhe-Ywathit-Swutpaing, and Phasaung-Meisel, and construct bridges.

Smooth transport lies at the core of expediting regional development tasks, and smooth transport and trade calls for stability, peace and security of the whole state. Without the rule of law, stability and peace, it is impossible to make progress in improving the living standard of local people.

Despite unprecedented development, Kayah State is still facing armed insurrection of remnant insurgents, and that poses a barrier to regional development. Local people need to notice that point.

It is of great importance that local people can lead a peaceful life. The state has low population and its contribution to national economy is somewhat low, but the government has never showed disregard for it. It is required to restore stability and peace in the state in order that the government can work harder to enable it to keep abreast of other states and divisions in terms of development.

With this concept in view, the government has opened the peace door for

remnant national race armed groups to join hands with the people in the frame of the law for national reconsolidation, and stability, peace and development of the nation. Many evidences have revealed that mutual trust, understanding, forbearance, compassion and cooperation among national races serve as an engine for building the nation.

It is public knowledge that the government is working hard for equitable development of all parts of the nation, without any discrimination against or in favour of a particular one.

The Head of State in his guidance said that the people of the 14 states and divisions are all national brethren. So, the government is taking measures for physical and mental well-being of each citizen. **Chipmaker Spansion Japan files for bankruptcy protection**

Tokyo, 10 Feb— The Japanese subsidiary of flash memory chip maker Spansion Inc filed for bankruptcy protection on Tuesday with debts of more than 800 million dollars, the company said.

Spansion Japan lodged a request with the Tokyo District Court for protection from its creditors, a company spokesman said. It has liabilities of 74.1 billion yen (809.79 million dollars), he added.

The chip maker, which was jointly set up by Advanced Micro Devices (AMD) and Japan's Fujitsu, makes flash memory chips used mainly in digital electronics products such as mobile telephones.

"Flash memory chips are used in almost all electronics products," said the spokesman. "Since the financial crisis since last year, the entire production has declined."

It is the biggest bankruptcy in Japan's manufacturing sector so far this year, according to private credit research company Teikoku Databank.—Internet

**Orangutans in Indonesian suffering from illegal trade, rampant hunting**

JAKARTA, 10 Feb— More than 500 Kalimantan's orangutans (Pongo Pygmaeus) are trafficked illegally in the Indonesian market every year, while rampant hunt-

ing is predicted to threaten the extinct in the next 50 years, said an activist. "Those traded are their babies. Hunters kill the mothers in order to catch them," the national *Antara News*

Agency on Tuesday quoted Arbi Valentinus of the Orangutan Conservation Service Programme (OCSP) as saying.

He reiterated that orangutan's habitat in Kalimantan continued decreasing by about 3 square kilometer a year, making the animal one of the endangered species included in appendix I of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES), Law No 5 / 1990 on Bio-diversity and Ecosystem. According to the law, orangutan is in the list of protected species, and unlicensed domestication is a violation.

"There were only four great ape species in the world, three of which were found in Africa while the other one in Indonesia and Malaysia, namely orangutans," he said.

**Satellite problem disrupts TV programmes**

BEIJING, 10 Feb—Transmission of 150 satellite TV channels in China was interrupted Monday morning by satellite problems, the State Administration of Radio, Film and Television (SARFT) said.

A malfunction occurred in Zhongxing 6B satellite around 10:59 am and lasted 47 minutes, disrupting transmission of China Central Television (CCTV), China Education Television and 23 provincial satellite TVs, SARFT said. Channel by channel transmission resumed from 11:47 am to 01:11 pm.

As central radio and TV programmes were transmitted through the *Xinnuo 3* Satellite and the administration's special network, these programmes were not affected, it said. SARFT has apologized to viewers for the interruption.

The malfunctioning satellite has resumed normal operations, it said, adding the satellite's operator China DBSat was investigating the cause and taking measures to ensure transmissions. —Internet

**NYSE Euronext posts \$1.34 billion 4Q loss**

NEW YORK, 10 Feb— Trans-Atlantic stock exchange operator NYSE Euronext said Monday it recorded a \$1.34 billion loss during the fourth quarter as it was forced to take a charge related to its 2007 acquisition of European exchange Euronext.

NYSE Euronext lost \$1.34 billion, or \$5.06 per share, during the fourth quarter, after a profit of \$156 million, or 59 cents per share, during the same quarter a year earlier.

The exchange operator would have recorded a profit had it not been for

the \$1.59 billion write-down on goodwill left over from the 2007 combination. The write-down was due to collapsing equity markets during the final three months of 2008 as the global economic crisis grew. NYSE Euronext was formed in a \$9.96 billion deal that saw Euronext — which operates the Paris, Amsterdam, Brussels and Lisbon exchanges — combine with the US exchange in 2007.

Michael Geltzeiler, the company's chief financial officer, said the write-down brings the value of

the company in line with the lower earnings multiples that analysts and investors are assigning for stock exchange operators. The lower multiples come as equity markets have tumbled amid the ongoing economic turmoil.

NYSE Euronext reviews goodwill values every year during the fourth quarter and believes the write-down during the last quarter is sufficient to match the company's expected future cash flow, Geltzeiler said in an interview.

## Calif artist sues AP over image of Obama

NEW YORK, 10 Feb—An artist who created a famous image of Barack Obama before he became president sued The *Associated Press* on Monday, asking a judge to find that his use of an AP photo in creating the poster did not violate copyright law.

The lawsuit filed in US District Court in Manhattan said street artist Shepard Fairey did not violate the copyright of the April 2006 photograph because he dramatically changed the nature of the image.

The AP has said it is owed credit and compensation for the artist's rendition of the picture, taken by Mannie Garcia on assignment for the AP at the National Press Club in Washington.

Lawyers for Fairey acknowledged that the artist used the photograph. But they said he transformed the literal depiction into a "stunning, abstracted and idealized visual image that creates powerful new meaning and conveys a radically different message."—*Internet*

## Paris airports shut as high winds lash France

PARIS, 10 Feb—High winds lashed France on Tuesday, prompting authorities to shut Paris' two international airports for the first time in 34 years.

Winds gusting at up to 140 kilometers (87 miles) per hour were recorded on France's Atlantic coast, with forecasters saying they could reach up to 160 kilometres per hour. With gusts of up to 100 kilometres per hour expected to hit the Paris region, the authorities closed Paris' airports from 8:00 pm on Monday until 10:00 am (0900 GMT) on Tuesday.

All flights to and from the city's two main airports, Charles de Gaulle (Roissy) and Orly, have been cancelled within that time period and travellers were asked not to head to either of them.—*Internet*



## Blue Chip poll cuts forecast for second half 2009

WASHINGTON, 10 Feb—The recession-bound US economy is still expected to resume growing in the second half of this year, but at an even slower pace than previously thought as consumers spend cautiously, the Blue Chip survey of 52 economists said on Tuesday.

A poll on 4-5 February

for the monthly Blue Chip Economic Indicators February newsletter scaled back forecasts for second-half growth from those made in January but continued to predict the United States will come out of recession in 2009.

The Blue Chip economists now forecast a 0.8 percent gain in third-quarter US gross domestic product, down from the 1.2 percent gain they estimated in January. Fourth-quarter growth is seen at 2.0 percent rather than 2.2 percent.

The economy officially slipped into recession in December 2007. Many economists expect the combination of a sinking labor market, falling stock prices and a severe housing downturn will make it the most severe recession in decades.

"The year-over-year contraction in real GDP this year now is expected to equal the decline registered in 1982 that was the largest in the post-World War II era," the Blue Chip economists said.—*Internet*

## Nissan shares jump seven percent after restructuring steps

TOKYO, 10 Feb—Shares of Nissan Motor Co (7201.T) jumped 7 percent on Tuesday morning, making up for a sharp slide a day earlier before the company forecast its first loss in years and laid out countermeasures to reverse the bleeding.

Nissan, owned 44 percent by Renault SA (RENA.PA), said after the market closed on Monday

that it expected an operating loss of 180 billion yen (\$1.97 billion) in the year to 31 March and a net loss of 265 billion yen to pay for a series of steps to weather the worst downturn in the global car market in decades.

The stock ended the morning up 7.3 percent at 280 yen, bucking a fall in many other Japanese auto stocks.

Nissan shares lost nearly 6 percent on Monday.

Analysts mostly welcomed Nissan's moves, including its plan to knock vehicle inventory down by 20 percent by next month and reduce headcount by about 9 percent through the next business year to match tumbling global car sales.

## 56-year-old becomes 1st woman to swim Atlantic

Jennifer Figge pressed her toes into the Caribbean sand, exhilarated and exhausted as she touched land this week for the first time in almost a month.

Reaching a beach in Trinidad, she became the first woman on record to swim across the Atlantic Ocean — a dream she'd had since the early 1960s, when a stormy trans-Atlantic flight got her thinking she could don a life vest and swim the rest of the way if needed.

The 56-year-old left the Cape Verde Islands off Africa's western coast on 12 Jan, battling waves of up to 30 feet (9 metres) and strong winds.

A student has won a ten-year legal battle to return to lectures after he was banned from university because of his smelly feet. Teunis Tenbrook was reportedly thrown out of the Erasmus University in Rotterdam after staff and students complained that they could not concentrate because of the pungent odour.

A court has now ruled that smelly feet is no excuse to ban a student from a university, according to Ananova.

The judge said: "Our considered opinion is that the professors and other students will just have to hold their noses and bear it." Tenbrook had earlier told the court that his attempts to continue with his philosophy studies were stalled when he was also banned from the library.

## Woman claims McDonald's drink contained chemical

A Baltimore woman said when she ordered an iced tea at a local McDonald's restaurant last year, employees gave her a cup containing a cleaning chemical. Caryl Jones has filed a \$100,000 lawsuit in Baltimore City Circuit Court.

The lawsuit alleges negligence and breach of warranty. Jones' attorney, Patricia Steiger, said the cup contained a sanitizer used on kitchen equipment.

Steiger said Jones immediately spat out the liquid when it burned her mouth but was found by doctors to have suffered "a mild or moderate chemical reaction."

## Scolari sacking could prove costly for Chelsea

LONDON, 10 Feb—Chelsea's decision to sack Luiz Felipe Scolari as their manager could cost the Premier League side up to 15 million pounds (22 million dollars) in compensation. Scolari, who guided his native Brazil to World Cup glory, was booted out of Stamford Bridge here on Monday just eight months in to a three-year deal worth an estimated annual six million pounds.

Getting rid of Jose Mourinho as manager in 2007 and then firing his successor Avram Grant, a matter of months after the Israeli signed a new four-year deal, would not have come cheap, even to a club bankrolled by Russian billionaire Roman Abramovich.

The total cost of sacking these three managers could be as much as 40 million pounds, a sum which threatens to make a mockery of Chelsea chief executive Peter Kenyon's oft-repeated assertion that the London club will become "operationally independent" by 2010.

In the meantime Abramovich's money, never mind the current squad, should still make Chelsea an enticing prospect for their would-be managers.—INTERNET

## Nadal still convinced Federer top-shelf

ROTTERDAM, 10 Feb—A week after winning the Australian Open with a fifth consecutive victory over Roger Federer, number 1 Rafael Nadal hasn't budged from his belief that he's still just the world's second-best player. "I'm getting tired of this question," said the top seed on Monday as he opened with a loss in doubles alongside fellow Mallorcan Ignacio Coll-Ruidavets at the Rotterdam Open.

"When someone has 13 grand slams and 14 Masters titles, there is no discussion about who is the best," he said respectfully of number 2 Federer, who has not beaten him since the Shanghai Masters Cup in November, 2007. Nadal has plunged back into the ATP grind just eight days after his sixth major title, pausing for a meal with family and friends after arriving on his home island of Mallorca last Tuesday.—INTERNET

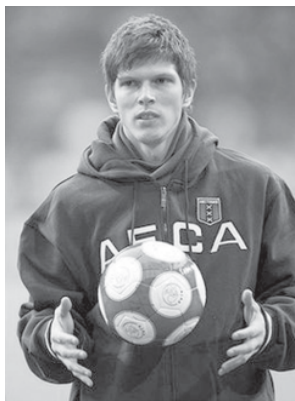

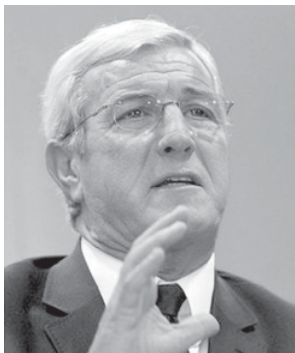

### China bans organ transplant operations for foreign tourists

BEIJING, 10 Feb—The Ministry of Health (MOH) said on Tuesday that China prohibits organ transplants for foreign visitors carrying a tourist visa and the ministry will deal harshly with domestic medical institutions involved in illegal organ transplants.

China opposes organ transplant for foreign tourists in accordance with international practice, said MOH spokesman Mao Qunan at a press conference.

Highlighting the lack of organ donors in the country, the official said that in China, organ transplants should be conducted for domestic patients who have an urgent need for the operation.

On 1 May, 2007, China issued the Provisions on Human Organ Transplant. So far, the ministry has granted over 160 medical institutions the license to conduct such operation. It has deprived some hospitals of the license.

The MOH has ordered domestic hospitals not to perform organ transplant for foreign tourists. Those who want to conduct such operations must acquire official approval from provincial health departments, and provincial health departments must report to the MOH before giving approval to the applications.

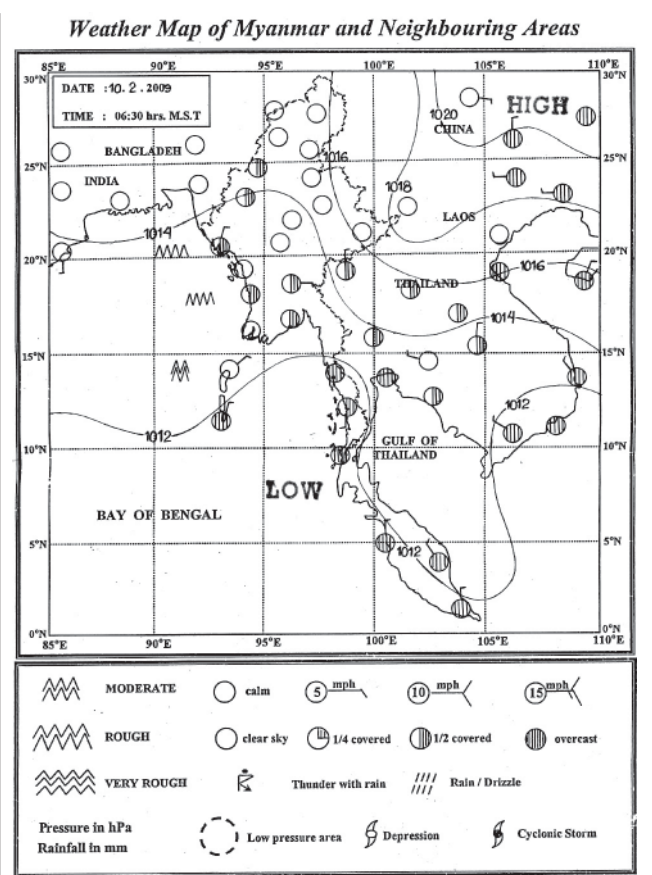
