Strive with added momentum in the fight against narcotic drugs

Production and trafficking of narcotic drugs spread across the world. Opium, heroin, opium oil and marijuana as well as stimulants that are produced with the use of precursor chemicals pose a major threat to the international community.

It is obvious that those who abused stimulants excessively have become mentally deranged and they are ready to commit serious crimes. The drug problem is closely linked to transnational crimes including terrorism. Being a global problem, it can only be addressed through close international cooperation.

The government has laid down the 15-year drug elimination plan since 1999 and is implementing it in all seriousness. In the process, poppy substitute crops were introduced in the border areas where poppy was previously grown. During the second five-year period of the plan altogether over 700,000 acres of seasonal crops and over 800,000 acres of perennial crops were grown. Likewise, cash assistance and techniques were provided to those engaged in livestock breeding.

At regional level, Myanmar is working together with neighbours, countries in the region and sub-regions and the international community in the fight against drugs. Myanmar has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with six countries for the creation of a Greater Mekong Sub-Region Drug Free Zone, and is joining hands with countries in the region for success of the drive.

Drug elimination measures are being taken with the participation of the entire national people. As a result, altogether 2,429 drug cases were exposed from January to December 2008, and action was taken against those involved in the cases.

As the government is making all-out efforts in its fight against drugs hand in hand with the entire national people with added momentum, we firmly believe that the drug elimination tasks will achieve greater success than ever.

US hopes Iran to attend Int'l conference on Afghanistan

WASHINGTON, 6 March — The United States hoped all Afghanistan's neighbours, including Iran, would attend an international conference on Afghanistan due to be held on 31 March, the White House said on Thursday.

"Afghanistan is something that presents a great challenge, not just for our country, but for the rest of the world ... Obviously we hope that all of Afghanistan's neighbours are available and that the dialogue is constructive and moves us forward," White House spokesman Robert Gibbs told reporters.

"I would expect that Iran would be invited as a neighbour and that we hope, if they decide to come, that they bring constructive solutions and ideas in working with the international community to address the challenges," Gibbs noted.

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton proposed in Brussels earlier in the day that an international ministerial conference be held on 31 March to contribute to stabilizing Afghanistan and fighting Taliban-led insurgency. "If we move forward with such a meeting, it is expected that Iran would be invited as a neighbour of Afghanistan," Clinton said. —Internet

US Senate to review CIA's handling of terrorist suspects

WASHINGTON, 6 March — The US Senate said on Thursday that it would start a one-year review of the Central Investigation Agency's handling of detained terrorist suspects.

In a joint announcement, Senate Intelligence Committee Democratic leader Dianne Feinstein and her Republican counterpart, Kit Bond, said that the review was to be conducted to assess the legality and effectiveness of CIA's tactics in the inter-

rogation of terrorist suspects, including those that were widely considered torture.

The review would look into questions like how the CIA handled its detention and determined if detainees possessed relevant information.

They also include whether CIA obtained useful intelligence by means of both standard interrogation techniques and "enhanced" methods, and whether it has accurately described its

handling of suspected terrorists to the Justice Department and the Senate Intelligence Committee.

The senators said that the conclusion of the review would help shape detention and interrogation policies in the future that have been mandated by President Barack Obama. However, no punishment would be resulted from the review on those that have carried out the interrogations, they clarified.

Israeli, Turkish foreign ministers meet secretly

JERUSALEM, 6 March — The Israeli and Turkish foreign ministers met secretly on the sidelines of a NATO conference Thursday — the first high-level contact between the countries since friction erupted over Israel's recent offensive in the Gaza Strip, the Israeli foreign ministry said.

Israeli Foreign Minister Tzipi Livni and Turkish Foreign Minister Ali Babacan met in Brussels to discuss opportunities to advance regional peacemaking, a statement from the Israeli ministry said.

The two emphasized "the strategic importance of the firm relations between the two states" in advancing Mideast stability, the statement said.

Sri Lanka to open safe passage for civilians

COLOMBO, 6 March — The Sri Lankan government appealed on Friday for tens of thousands of civilians to flee the northern war zone and said it would open two safe passages in the area for the exodus. The civilians are trapped along with the Tamil Tiger rebels inside a shrinking strip of land along the northeast coast.

International officials have issued increasing appeals to the military and the rebels to halt their battle temporarily to allow the civilians to escape, but the government has refused, saying it was on the verge of crushing the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam and ending the quarter-century civil war. Foreign Secretary Palitha Kohona said on Friday that the government was calling on the trapped civilians to flee to government-controlled areas to the north and south along a coastal road.

The United Nations cautiously welcomed the appeal.

Officials say Taliban kill two 'US spies' in Pakistan

MIRANSHAH, 6 March — Taliban militants in Pakistan's restive tribal area on Friday killed two men they accused of spying for US forces stationed across the border in Afghanistan, officials said.

The bullet-riddled bodies of Afghan refugee Sher Khan and Pakistani tribal elder Nazar Jan were found early Friday at separate places in the North Waziristan tribal district bordering Afghanistan, officials in those areas said.

"Notes found with the bodies said the men were killed for spying for the US," tribal police official Rukh Niaz Khan told AFP.

Islamist militants frequently kidnap and kill local tribesmen or Afghan refugees on charges of spying for the Pakistani government or US forces, who are battling a Taliban-led insurgency across the border in Afghanistan.—Internet

Aus, S Korea agree on security pact, free trade

CANBERRA, 6 March — Australia and South Korea agreed during a summit between Prime Minister Kevin Rudd and President Lee Myung-bak Thursday to deepen security ties and launch formal talks on a free trade agreement.

The security agreement calls for close consultations on issues of common strategic interest in the Asia-Pacific region, counter-terrorism strategies and transnational crime, a joint statement said. The two countries will

also sign a pact allowing for the secure exchange of classified military information between defence organisations and related industry contractors.

"We agreed to develop a closer defence and security relationship," Rudd told a joint news conference with Lee. "We believe it is important for our military to work more closely together and to deal with some of the common challenges of security together in the Asia-Pacific region."

IDB seeks urgent measures to address world financial crisis

MANAGUA, 6 March — The President of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) said here on Thursday that the body is seeking urgent measures to help countries in the region weather the world financial crisis.

Luis Moreno made the remark when inaugurating the 23rd Central America and Dominican Republic Governors Meeting, which aimed to come up

with ways of dealing with the negative effects of the crisis.

"We gathered together to put forward ideas at a moment when there is a lack of answers to address the world economic crisis," Moreno said.

The governors stressed the need to widen financing to counter the world economic crisis.

Moreno said the two-day meeting will analyze

the IDB's role in the region and discuss the agenda on its medium-term development.

IDB's governors from Nicaragua, Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Panama and Dominican Republic attended the meeting, which coincided with the 50th anniversary of the IDB foundation.

Vietnam to host int'l furniture exports fair

Nepal, India begins to review trade deal

KATHMANDU, 6 March — A meeting of joint secretaries of commerce of Nepal and India has begun here to review the Nepal-India Trade Treaty, the National News Agency RSS reported on Friday.

The meeting, started on Thursday, will try to reach an understanding in remaining issues as per the understanding reached in the inter-governmental committee meeting some three months ago, according to the leader of

Nepali delegation and joint secretary at the ministry of commerce and supplies Surya Silwal.

He said Nepal has presented an amended proposal to the treaty to control illegal trade in between the two countries.

The meeting concluded on Friday.

Joint secretaries of the two countries will sign the conclusion of the meeting.

The document signed by joint secretaries will be presented in the secretary-level meeting.

If approved by the secretaries, the document will be presented in the cabinets of the two countries for approval.

The Indian delegation is led by Rajiv Kher, joint secretary of Commerce of India.

Brazilian President to meet Obama in Washington

BRASILIA, 6 March — Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva will have his first meeting with US President Barack Obama on 14 March in Washington, a Lula spokesperson said on Thursday.

One topic of the meeting will be the tense relationship between the United States and Venezuela, which Lula has promised Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez he will mediate, the spokesperson told *Xinhua*.

In September 2008, Chavez expelled the US ambassador in Caracas and called back the Venezuelan ambassador to Washington. Chavez took the action because he said the United States was interfering in Bolivia.—Internet

US to use Colombian anti-drug programme in Afghanistan

BOGOTA, 6 March—Washington plans to implement part of Colombia's anti-drug programme in Afghanistan, the chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff said on Thursday.

Mike Mullen said the Colombian programme, which was founded by the United States, will be used in Afghanistan to contain the spread of drugs in the turbulent southwestern Asian nation.

Colombian Defence Minister Juan Manuel Santo said, however, that the programme will not be completely replicated in Afghanistan because the environment in that country is different from that of Colombia.

Mullen and Santos also discussed the possibility of sending Colombian troops to Afghanistan.

"We talked about Colombia's promise on sending troops to Afghanistan, which we consider a positive and needed step in that country," Mullen said.

Colombia has been receiving anti-drug funds from the United States for the past nine years.—Xinhua

Archaeologists find earliest known domestic horses

WASHINGTON, 6 March — An international team of archaeologists has uncovered the earliest known evidence of horses being domesticated by humans.

The discovery, which suggests that horses were both ridden and milked, could point to the very beginnings of horse domestication and the origins of the equine breeds we know today.

Led by the Universities of Exeter and Bristol in the United Kingdom, the research will be published Friday in leading academic journal *Science*.

The researchers have traced the origins of horse domestication back to the Botai Culture of Kazakhstan about 5,500 years ago. That is about 1,000 years earlier than previously thought and about 2,000 years earlier than domestic horses are known to have been in Europe.

The findings strongly suggest that horses were originally domesticated, not just for riding, but also to provide food, including milk.—Xinhua

China's largest PC maker targets rural market

BEIJING, 6 March—Lenovo, China's largest personal computer maker, aims to sell 5 million computers in rural areas within three years, reported Friday's *China Daily*.

The company plans to establish 700 sales and service outlets at township level, and to cover 320,000 villages across the country through 7,800 sales networks in the following three years.

It will introduce 15 new models specifically designed for the rural market. The retail prices of these models are set at as low as 3,000 yuan (about 440 US dollars), according to Xia Li, Lenovo's vice president.—Xinhua

Cuba calls to enhance exchanges between political organizations

HAVANA, 6 March—Cuban Vice President Esteban Lazo on Thursday urged to enhance exchanges between political organizations in order to seek solutions to common problems.

He made the call at a meeting with visiting German Communist Party (DKP) leader Heinz Stehr. Such exchanges are more necessary against the backdrop of current difficulties due to the deepening global economic crisis.

Lazo also appreciated DKP's financing and facilities-building aid in Cuba's local health sector, and hailed its moral support to the country.

On his part, Stehr praised Cuba's role on the revolutionary process of Latin America.

Singapore to build largest renewable diesel plant in Asia

SINGAPORE, 6 March—Singapore on Friday kicked off the construction of Asia's largest renewable diesel refinery invested by a Finland-based oil company.

The plant was invested by Neste Oil with 1.2 billion Singapore dollars (about 0.77 billion US dollars) to produce high quality biofuel from renewable feedstock. The plant's capacity of 800,000 tons per annum makes it the largest facility producing diesel fuel from renewable feedstock in Asia.

"Despite the immediate challenges, we are confident that the outlook of the energy and chemicals industries remains positive," said Lim Hng Kiang, Singapore's Minister for Trade and Industry at the foundation stone ceremony of the refinery. Over the next two years, Neste Oil will hire and train 100 personnel in Singapore, including engineers, technicians and operators, who will commence work in the facility.—Xinhua

Flash floods force thousands to evacuate in Indonesia

JAKARTA, 6 March — Flash floods, triggered by days of torrential rain, inundated dozens of villages in Tuban and Bojonegoro districts in Indonesia's East Java Province and forced thousands of people to evacuate on Friday.

The heavy rains caused Kali Kening, a tributary of the Bengawan Solo river, to burst its banks creating a flood that invaded villages in the districts of Tuban and Bojonegoro, according to *Antara* news agency.

The flood have forced 300 families in Selongabus village to abandon their homes and seek temporary shelter elsewhere, head of the village Mustain was quoted as saying. A number of people at first refused to evacuate but because the flood water level continued to rise, they eventually changed their mind and fled their homes, he said.

Kyrgyz President reiterates one-China policy

ALMATY, 6 March — Kyrgyz President Kurmanbek Bakiyev on Thursday reiterated his country's firm support for China's stance on Taipei and other issues.

Kyrgyzstan will also support China as it plays an important role in international and regional affairs, Bakiyev said. Bakiyev made the remarks while meeting with outgoing Chinese Ambassador to Kyrgyzstan Zhang Yannian in Bishkek.

The president presented Zhang with the Danaker medal of friendship for his contributions to the development of bilateral ties. Bakiyev hailed China-Kyrgyzstan relations during the presentation, saying bilateral cooperation has generated fruitful results in the fields of political and economic issues, transportation, culture, security and education. —Xinhua

Britain's Channel 5 may cut up to 87 jobs

LONDON, 6 March — British broadcaster Channel 5, which is owned by RTL Group, could cut up to 87 jobs as part of a restructuring to help it cope with the economic downturn.

The broadcaster said in a statement that the cuts, out of its total workforce of 354, were part of a restructuring aimed at making it more efficient. —MNA/Reuters



US not to open new military base in Central Asia

ALMATY, 6 March — US Ambassador to Tajikistan Tracey Ann Jacobson said the United States will not open a new military base in any Central Asian country to replace the Manas air base in Kyrgyzstan, local media reported on Thursday.

According to reports reaching here from Dushanbe, capital of

Tajikistan, Jacobson said in an interview with a local newspaper that she never heard any plan about opening a new military bases in Central Asia from her colleagues in the Pentagon.

Jacobson denied that the US will seek to open a new military base in Tajikistan or Uzbekistan. She said Tajikistan and

Uzbekistan have agreed to allow the US to transit non-military supplies through their territories, but have not inked a formal deal yet. On 20 February, Kyrgyz President Kurmanbek Bakiyev signed a law to officially close the Manas air base, a key logistic center for US-led operations in Afghanistan.

Fire injures one at Japan's Kashiwazaki-Kariwa N-plant

TOKYO, 6 March — One worker was injured when a fire broke out Thursday at the Kashiwazaki-Kariwa nuclear power plant in Niigata Prefecture, local media reported.

There was no other report of injuries or radioactive leak in the incident, its operator Tokyo Electric Power Co said.

Smoke was detected at

around 9:30 am from No 1 reactor of the nuclear plant, the world largest one in terms of output, and the fire was extinguished more than an hour later, it said.

The plant has been shut down since 16 July, 2007 when a magnitude 6.8 quake hit the area and some radioactive water leaked into the sea.

What's the best diet? eating less food

Low fat, low carb, high protein - there's a diet plan of every flavor. And if you're one of the millions of Americans who struggle with weight, you've probably tried them all, likely with little success. That wouldn't surprise Dr Frank Sacks, a professor at the Harvard School of Public Health and lead author of a new study published in the 26 February issue of the New England Journal of Medicine, whose findings confirm what a growing body of weight-loss evidence has already suggested: one diet is no better than the next when it comes to weight loss.

It doesn't matter where your calories come from, as long as you're eating less. (Read about environmentally friendly food.)

"We have a really simple and practical message for people: it's not so much the type of diet you eat," says Sacks. "It's how much you put in your mouth."



Give veggies a funny name to attract kids

Want your kids eat more vegetables, rename them next time you offer them to children, says scientists, suggesting the influence of names persists. In a new study, funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, four-year-olds were given regular carrots and, on other lunch days, they were given the same vegetables renamed X-ray Vision Carrots. On the latter days, they ate nearly twice as many.

Children continued to eat about 50 percent more carrots even on the days when they were no longer eating it.

The research was presented today at the annual meeting of the School Nutrition Association in Washington, DC. Lead author Brian Wansink of Cornell University said, "Cool names can make for cool foods. Whether it be 'power peas' or 'dinosaur broccoli trees,' giving a food a fun name makes kids think it will be more fun to eat. And it seems to keep working - even the next day," Wansink said.

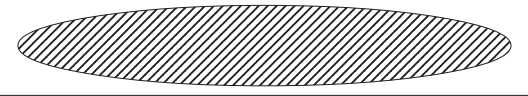

Department carried out the land survey work for the dam project in 1984 and the geological survey in 1986. The dam was built on Pyaing Creek near

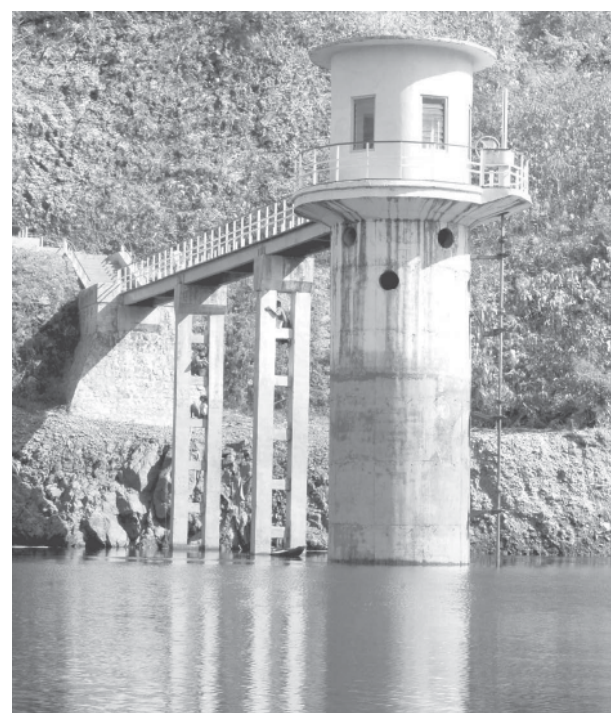
acres of summer sesame were irrigated. The irrigation tasks of Pyaingchaung Dam are being carried out to supply 4,000 acres of summer paddy and 700 acres of summer sesame for meeting the target in 2008-2009. To generate hydropower, efforts are being made for completion of the task this year."

With regard to cultivation of summer paddy in 2008-2009, he further explained, "As harvesting of monsoon paddy was late last year, the digging of canal delayed for supplying water. In December, January, February and March, the digging of

irrigation plan. However, all-out efforts are being made to complete the task to supply water to 4,000 acres of summer paddy in 2009-2010."

At present, the plan is being implemented to generate hydroelectricity. Two 40-kilowatt generators will supply 80 kilowatts to Kyauktaw and its surrounding villages. Arrangements are being made to launch the supply of electricity in coming May.

Pyaingchaung Dam has 29,985 acre feet of water inflow and it can store over 25,000 acre feet of water at the highest level. The water surface of the dam will be 625

**Amazon carbon sink
threatened by drought**

WASHINGTON, 6 March — The Amazon is surprisingly sensitive to drought, which causes massive carbon loss in tropical forests, mainly through killing trees, according to a 30-year study focusing on the world's largest tropical forest.

"For years the Amazon forest has been helping to slow down climate change. But relying on this subsidy from nature is extremely dangerous," said Professor Oliver Phillips, from the University of Leeds in Britain and the lead author of the research, whose findings are to be published on the journal Science on Friday. "If the earth's carbon sinks slow or go into reverse, as our results show is possible, carbon dioxide levels will rise even faster. Deeper cuts in emissions will be required to stabilize our climate."

The study, a global collaboration between more than 40 institutions, was based on the unusual 2005 drought in the Amazon. This gave scientists a glimpse into the region's future climate, in which a warming tropical North Atlantic may cause hotter and more intense dry seasons. —Internet

**EU report says online
shopping increasingly popular**

BRUSSELS, 6 March — Online shopping is increasingly popular in the European Union (EU) but barriers to cross-border trade are holding back its development, the European Commission said in a report on Thursday.

Between 2006 and 2008 the proportion of EU consumers buying at least one item over the Internet increased from 27 percent to 33 percent.

These average figures mark the huge popularity of online shopping in countries like Britain, France and Germany where more than half of Internet users have made online purchases in the last year.

In the Nordic countries, namely Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland and Iceland, the proportion of Internet users who bought products and services online was 91 percent in 2008, according to the report.

Countries like Italy and Spain are also fast growing markets. However, the extent of online purchasing cross border remains small, at only seven percent in 2008, compared to six percent in 2006.

**Police seize
645kg of
cocaine
in mid-western
Brazil**

RIO DE JANEIRO, 6 March—Brazil's Federal Police seized on late Wednesday a shipment of 645 kilograms of cocaine in Mato Grosso state, in the country's mid-western region, local police said.

The police said the shipment's value is estimated at 5.8 million reais (2.44 million US dollars).

The seizure, which was the largest of the region in the last eight years, took place on the BR-364 federal road, in the outskirts of Rondonopolis, during a routine traffic stop.

Police said the cocaine was found in tablets, hidden in a fake bottom of a truck which carried a large rice shipment. The truck belonged to the National Supply Company (Conab), a state-owned organization linked to the Brazilian Minister of Agriculture, Livestock and Supply.

Does educational TV viewing influence babies' brains?

BEIJING, 6 March — Educational programmes on TV are unlikely to stimulate brains of toddlers who are less than two years age, say a study.

Marie Evans Schmidt, a research associate at the Center on Media & Child Health at Children's Hospital Boston, studied more than 800 youngsters from birth to 3 years, recording the time that they spent on watching television or DVDs as reported by their mothers, as well as their performance on language

and motor-skill tests.

On average, the babies spent 1.2 hour per day watching TV during their first two years of life, slightly less than the average viewing time reported in previous studies.

In her initial analysis, Schmidt found that babies who spent more time in front of the TV performed worse on language and motor-skill tests at age three than those who watched less.

Two statues of ancient pharaoh found

CAIRO, 6 March — A team of Egyptian and European archaeologists has discovered two large statues of an ancient pharaoh who ruled Egypt some 3,400 years ago, the country's archaeology chief said on Thursday.

The two statues of Amenhotep III were found while the excavation team was clearing out a temple dedicated to him on the west bank of the Nile in the southern city of Luxor, according to a statement by Zahi Hawass, head of the Su-

preme Council of Antiquities.

Hawass said one statue is made of black granite and shows Amenhotep wearing a traditional pharaonic headcover, while the second one depicts him in the shape of sphinx — the mythological creature with a human head and the body of a lion.

The statues were said to be "large" but no other details were provided.

Amenhotep was the ninth pharaoh of the 18th dynasty, in what is known

as the New Kingdom. He ruled for around 40 years during the 14th century B.C. He was the father of pharaoh Akhenaten who tried to make ancient Egyptians worship a single god, the sun god Ra, making him one of the first known proponents of monotheism.

Luxor is one of the most popular tourist sites in Egypt, famous for its Valley of the Kings and other ruins from pharaonic times.

Researchers find common compound that can block HIV

WASHINGTON, 6 March — Researchers at the University of Minnesota have identified a compound that, applied vaginally, can prevent transmission of the nonhuman primate version of HIV, called SIV.

The discovery, which was published in the March 5 issue of the journal *Nature*, raises hopes of new treatment in the future to block HIV transmission in humans. The Minnesota research team focused on a compound called gly-

cerol monolaurate (GML), a widely-used ingredient in some foods and cosmetics.

In the study, two weeks after being exposed to SIV, five monkeys treated with a gel containing GML showed no signs of the virus spreading. By comparison, four of five monkeys that did not receive the GML gel were infected with SIV.

The compound may act by suppressing a counter-

productive immune response that helps the virus rather than fights it, the researchers explained. The GML compound could lead to a novel and cost-effective way to prevent HIV, even other sexually transmitted infections in women, said Dr. Ashley Haase, the lead researcher.

But he cautioned that their study was small and only tried in animals. More work was needed before human trials could take place.—Internet

French kisses cost British driver 150 Euros

SAINT-MALO, 6 March — A British man who drove with a licence plate modified to read "kisses" in French was fined 150 euros (190 dollars, 130 pounds) by a French court on Thursday.

Graham Moore, 60, from Yorkshire in northern England, had risked up to five years in prison for driving with the plate, B18OUS, modified to read BISOUS, which had belonged to his son's car.

Moore said his now deceased son had modified the plate to amuse his French girlfriend, and that he taken to using it in France in his memory.—Internet

China's Health Ministry gears up for food safety monitoring

BEIJING, 6 March — China's Ministry of Health issued a circular to health authorities on Thursday urging them to step up prevention of food contamination and monitoring of food quality-related illnesses.

The ministry urged health departments to strengthen the work of contamination monitoring stations in 16 provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities, and food-related illness monitoring

stations in 21 provinces. "New food safety problems keep arising, while the traditional food problems are still not effectively under control," said the circular, which followed the National People's Congress Standing Committee's adoption of the Food Safety Law on Saturday.

The circular required local health departments

to collaborate with local governments to step up inspections of milk products, and to build a platform to share information on food safety. Health Minister Chen Zhu said the ministry would create a national database of information about food contamination, food-related illnesses and diet surveys within two years.—Xinhua

Creamer, Park share HSBC Women's Champions lead

SINGAPORE, 6 March — Americans Paula Creamer and Jane Park shot 1-under 71s on Friday to share the second-round lead in the LPGA Tour's HSBC Women's Champions.

The third-ranked Creamer, coming off a third-place finish last week in Thailand, matched Park at 6-under 138 on the Tanah Merah Country Club's Garden Course. Creamer has eight LPGA Tour victories, four last season. Park, the former UCLA star who won the 2004 US Women's Amateur, is seeking her first LPGA Tour victory.

Katherine Hull, the Australian Ladies Masters winner last month, shot a 69 to join Mi Hyun Kim (68) at 5 under. Sun Young Yoo (69) and Ai Miyazato (72) were 4 under, and Angela Stanford (72) was another stroke back along with Lindsey Wright (69), Shanshan Feng (71) and Se Ri Pak (72). Stanford won the season-opening SBS Open.

Top-ranked Lorena Ochoa, the defending champion coming off her 25th LPGA Tour victory last week in Thailand, was 2 under after a 73. Fourth-ranked Suzann Pettersen (70) and Hall of Famer Juli Inkster (70) also were 2 under.—*Internet*

English teams aren't English, scoffs Italy coach Lippi

ROME, 6 March — Italy coach Marcello Lippi has dismissed notions of a battle between English and Italian teams in the Champions League this season by claiming that the Premier League sides aren't actually English.

The Italy coach, who guided the Azzurri to World Cup glory in Berlin three years ago, told a foreign press meeting that he believes the Italian teams can progress in the Champions League against their 'international' opponents.

Juventus and AS Roma lost 1-0 away in their round of 16 first legs against Chelsea and Arsenal respectively while Inter Milan were held 0-0 at home by Manchester United. Those results have cast a shadow over Italian football with many in the game convinced Serie A representatives will fall to English opposition for the second year in a row. But Lippi hit out at the make-up of the Premier League sides.

"Chelsea, Manchester (United) and Arsenal, like Liverpool, don't represent English football," said Lippi. "But instead, like in other countries, that of globalised football where the owners, coaches and the majority of players are not English."

The true clash between the two (English and Italian) is only between the national teams."

Of the four English clubs in the Champions League only Arsenal are not foreign-owned; none of the four have an English manager.—*Internet*

Ashley Cole arrested after drunken rant

LONDON, 6 March — Chelsea and England defender Ashley Cole was arrested for being drunk and disorderly overnight on Thursday, reports and police said. The 28-year-old left-back was detained and held in custody for some three hours after a drunken confrontation with police, media reported.

The *Daily Mail* newspaper said the player repeatedly swore at police after emerging from a nightclub in London's plush South Kensington district. After refusing to tone down his language, he was taken to a police station.

After three hours in a custody cell, he was given a spot fine of 80 pounds (113 dollars, 90 euros) and released. A spokesman for Scotland Yard said: "At about 2.15am today, a man was arrested in Brompton Road, South Kensington, on suspicion of being drunk and disorderly and taken to a central London police station."

"He was later issued with a fixed penalty notice for being drunk and disorderly and released at 5.37am," said the police spokesman, without identifying the man.—*Internet*

Blatter fears Premier League 'damage'

LONDON, 6 March — FIFA president Sepp Blatter believes the dominance of the Premier League's big four — Manchester United, Liverpool, Chelsea and Arsenal — is proving unhealthy for competition.

Since the formation of the Premier League in 1992, there have only been four different winners and Blatter is concerned that the priority of most teams is merely to avoid costly relegation.

"In a competition where two-thirds or three-quarters of the participants in the league play not to be first, but not to be relegated, there is something wrong," Blatter told the BBC.

The FIFA chief added that the global power and appeal of the English Premier League is damaging the sport worldwide.—*Internet*

New 'Musketeers' fire French Davis Cup hopes

PARIS, 6 March — France will take on the Czech Republic in their Davis Cup first-round tie bolstered by the feeling that their team is stronger than it has been for over 75 years. Gilles Simon, Gael Monfils, Jo-Wilfried Tsonga and Richard Gasquet are all either current or former top-10 players, while Michael Llodra is ranked among the best doubles players in the world.

Not since the glory days of the 'Musketeers' — Henri Cochet, Rene Lacoste, Jean Borotra and Jacques Brugnon, who won every Davis Cup between 1927 and 1932 — has France been able to call upon such talent. "Apart from perhaps the Musketeers, we've never had such a strong French team on paper in our history," captain Guy Forget said. Simon and Tsonga — who won tournaments in Johannesburg and Marseille in February — are expected to get the nod for Friday's first two singles matches, with former world number seven Gasquet tipped to pair Llodra in the doubles.—*Internet*

Balotelli discharged from hospital

ROME, 6 March — Teenage Inter Milan forward Mario Balotelli, who collapsed during Wednesday's Coppa Italia semi-final, has discharged himself from hospital in Genoa.

Balotelli fell to the ground and complained of respiratory problems just seconds after he had collided with a post during Inter's 3-0 first leg defeat at Sampdoria. He was carried from the field on a stretcher and taken to hospital. But hospital sources said they had wanted to keep the 18-year-old in overnight only for him to discharge himself and leave.—*Internet*

US say spectre of absent Federer won't haunt Davis Cup tennis tie

BIRMINGHAM, 6 March — James Blake said he won't be losing any sleep over the absence of Roger Federer as the Davis Cup World Group tie between the United States and Switzerland begins on Friday.

"I've been sleeping real well," said the American, who is hoping to revive his own fortunes in the global tennis competition after sitting out last autumn's losing semi-final against Spain due to fatigue and lack of motivation.

Federer, training at his base in Dubai along with possible coaching candidate Darren Cahill prior to returning to tennis at next week's Masters 1000 in Indian Wells, California, is skipping the tie. The official reason is the back pain which occasionally bothers the world number 2 and which also kept him out of his "home" ATP event in the emirate last week.

His absence makes the United States the favorites against a Swiss side led by 16th-ranked Stan Wawrinka, and Blake won't be wondering about what might have been with Federer out of the mix. American number one Andy Roddick agreed that for this weekend at least, Federer does not matter.—*Internet*

Taylor escapes extra sanction after Ronaldo clash

LONDON, 6 March — Newcastle's Steven Taylor will not face any further disciplinary punishment after being booked during the 2-1 loss to Premier League leaders Manchester United on Wednesday, the FA have announced.

Taylor appeared to foul Cristiano Ronaldo in the first-half before following up with another strong challenge on Michael Carrick. However, referee Steve Bennett told the Football Association here Thursday that Taylor's yellow card was for the foul on Carrick.

After watching video footage, Bennett said he would have booked Taylor for the Ronaldo challenge as well. That in turn would have led to the England Under-21 captain being sent-off for two bookable offences. However, under the rules of world football governing body FIFA, the FA cannot change punishments that would have involved two yellow cards as opposed to a single red.—*Internet*

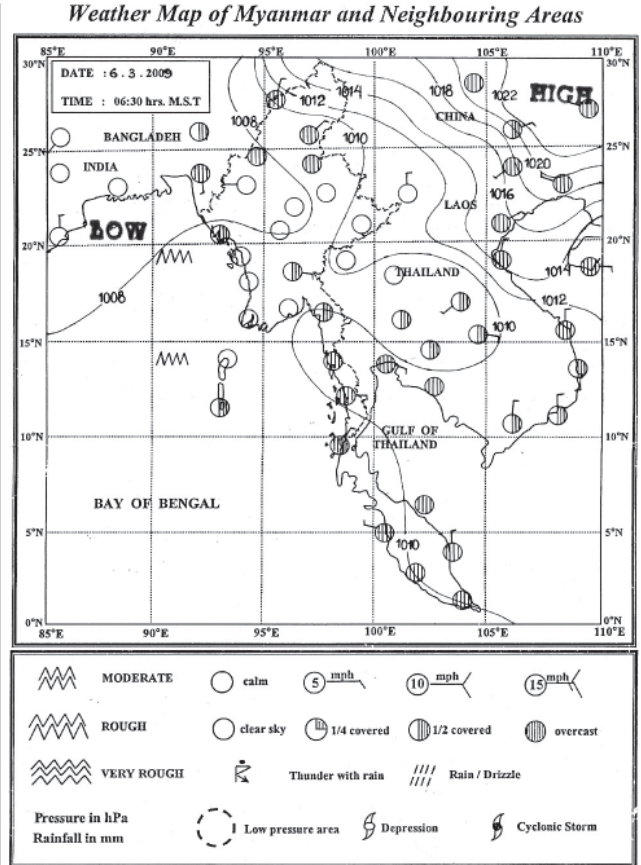
