### British soldier shot in Afghanistan dies in hospital

WASHINGTON, 14 May—A soldier shot in Afghanistan died in the UK after being flown back for treatment, the Ministry of Defence said on Wednesday.

The officer with the 1st Battalion the Welsh Guards died in Birmingham's Selly Oak hospital on Tuesday with his family by his bedside.

He was shot in Haji Halem, Helmand Province, on Saturday. Medics treated him on the ground and at a field hospital before he was flown back to the UK for specialist treatment.

The death means 158 British troops have been killed in Afghanistan since operations began in 2001.

Last Thursday four soldiers were killed in separate incidents during one of the bloodiest days for UK forces in the country.

More than 8,000 British troops are based in Afghanistan, most of them in the southern province of Helmand.—*Internet*

## Taleban step up attacks as weather gets warm in Afghanistan

KABUL, 14 May—Taleban militants fighting Afghan and US-led forces based in Afghanistan have stepped up activities as they have carried out a series of suicide and roadside attacks since last weekend.

In the new wave of violence which targeted a US military base outside Khost City, capital of Khost Province in east Afghanistan, Wednesday morning, at least seven people were killed and 21

others injured. All the victims were civilians.

Taleban purported spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid who claimed sending over 30 suicide bombers to Khost province, in talks with media from unknown location said on Wednesday that a Taleban fighter Zukria carried out the bombing, inflicting huge casualties on the troops.

According to Taleban claim, Zukria rammed his explosive-packed car into

the gate of US military base in Sahra Bagh area leaving over three dozen foreign and Afghan troopers dead, a claim rejected by troops as utterly groundless.

The bloody incident follows the multiple suicide attacks against government buildings in Khost City Tuesday killing nine people, including four policemen, and wounding some 30 others.

### Afghan suicide attack kills one policeman

KANDAHAR, 14 May—A suicide attacker blew up a car bomb at an Afghan police station about 500 metres (yards) from the Pakistan border Thursday, killing one policeman and wounding four, a commander said.

It was the third deadly suicide attack in as many days in Afghanistan, where Taleban militants warned last month they would step up attacks on Afghan officials and the local and international security forces.

The driver of the car had been trying to enter a border police compound at the town of Spin Boldak, the border police commander for southwestern Afghanistan, Sayfullah Hakim, told *AFP*.

“Police became suspicious of the vehicle and would not let it in. They took cover. The attacker detonated and wounded five border policemen,” he said. One of the wounded later died. The attack was similar to scores carried out by Taleban militants but there was no immediate claim of responsibility.—*Internet*

### Int'l troops kill two civilians in central Afghanistan

KABUL, 14 May—A father and son were killed and three others sustained injuries as they came under fire of international troops in Afghan central province of Wardak Wednesday morning, provincial administration spokesman said.

“It occurred in the morning when a car of civilians was fired upon by international troops on the road of Jaqhato district, as a result an Afghan father and his teenage boy were killed,” Adam Khan Sirat told *Xinhua*. He also said that three other member of family sustained injuries.

However, he failed to disclose troops of which country were behind the attack, adding that the investigation is underway.

### New threat for Iraqi military: Drop in oil prices

BAGHDAD, 14 May—Lower oil prices are threatening Iraq's efforts to build a military capable of defending the country, raising the possibility that the Iraqis will need substantial US help for years after the Americans leave by 2012.

The budget crunch not only affects ground forces that bear the brunt of the fight against Sunni and Shiite extremists — it also slows development of an air force capable of defending the skies and a navy able to protect vital oil exporting facilities in the Persian Gulf from terror attacks.

All that is forcing US and Iraqi planners to make tough choices during the countdown to the withdrawal of all American troops by the end of 2011. With the Obama administration shifting resources to Afghanistan, the US is not in a position to finance the Iraqi budget shortfall.

“Realistically, as we look out to 2011, this year's budget will not keep them on track they need to be on,” said Army Lt Gen Frank Helmick, the American officer in charge of training the Iraqi security force.

“These ministers in defence and interior are having to make very, very difficult decisions, having to prioritize their requirements.”

## GM, Chrysler to cut up to 3,000 dealers

DETROIT/WASHINGTON, 14 May—General Motors Corp and Chrysler aim to drop as many as 3,000 US dealers and are expected to begin sending notifications as early as Thursday, three people briefed on the still developing plans said.

GM, facing a US government-imposed deadline of 1 June to restructure or file for bankruptcy, is expected to send termination notices to up to 2,000 dealers — a third of its roughly 6,000 US dealers, the sources told Reuters.

Chrysler, which filed for bankruptcy on 30 April, will also tell up to 1,000 of its 3,189 US dealers it is terminating their franchise agreements, according to the sources who asked not to be identified because the controversial closure plans have not been yet announced.

## Sing Tel says Q4 profit down 17.3 percent

SINGAPORE, 14 May—Singapore Telecommunications (SingTel) said Thursday fourth quarter net profit fell 17.3 percent and warned that the weak economic environment would continue to hit earnings.

Net profit in the three months ended March totalled 903 million Singapore dollars (619 million US), down from 1.09 billion dollars in the same period a year ago.

However, the figure was better than the 851.8 billion dollar average net profit forecast by analysts in a Dow Jones News-wires poll.

And the largest telecommunications firm in Southeast Asia will see earnings impacted further as regional economies such as Australia are likely to slow this year due the global slump, said chief executive Chua Sock Koong.

## US Continental Airlines to cut 500 jobs, shut reservation centre amid weak economy

HOUSTON, 14 May—US Continental Airlines said on Wednesday it will cut about 500 reservation agent positions company wide and close a reservations centre in Tampa, Florida, on grounds that the economy is weak and more passengers prefer online reservations.

The job cuts and centre closure will be completed by 19 July this year “in response to reduced call volumes caused by a

customer shift towards Web self-service and the global economic recession,” the Houston-based carrier said in a bulletin to its more than 43,000 employees. “We must make these changes to adapt to changing customer preferences toward the Web,” Continental’s Reservations and eCommerce Vice President Martin Hand said.

“Adding to the structural decline in call volumes caused by the Web has been the effect of the global recession, which has resulted in fewer calls into our reservations centres,” he said.

Continental said it is offering a number of benefits to employees, including “early out” severance and leaves of absence programmes.—Internet

## Spain to reward airlines for increased passenger numbers

MADRID, 14 May—In a move to boost its flagging tourist industry, Spain announced on Wednesday that airlines that increase passenger numbers in the first half the year would receive tax breaks in the second half.

Prime Minister Jose Luis Rodriguez Zapatero told parliament the measure was aimed at “supporting the tourism sector.”

He said airlines that increase passenger numbers in the first six months of 2009, compared to the second half of 2008, would see airport taxes cut by 100 percent for the rest of the year.—Internet

## Economic crisis ‘life and death’ for Africans

DAKAR, 14 May—The global economic crisis is a matter of “life and death” in the world’s poorest continent, the African Union’s top official Jean Ping told the African Development Bank (AfDB) annual meeting on Wednesday.

“If in developed countries, the crisis is being felt in terms of job losses, in ours it is a question of life and death, with the risk of more conflicts, in particular,” said Ping, who is head of the AU Commis-

sion and a former foreign minister of Gabon.

Ping was speaking at the opening of AfDB’s 44th annual assembly.

According to the bank, the effects of the crisis will create 27 million new poor in Africa in 2009.

“The risks of the crisis are weighing heavily on the democratic advances which he have made recently,” Ping said,

The downturn “threatens state of law, human rights, threatens the shared values that we are

trying to promote on the continent. This concerns everyone,” he said.

Ping said another threat to the world economy was piracy off Somalia, a country “which has been forgotten, neglected, abandoned for 18 years” since it descended into anarchy with the fall of dictator Mohamed Siad Barre.—Internet

## Message of the Secretary-General of the United Nations on the International Day of Families 15 May 2009

This year’s International Day of Families, being commemorated under the theme, “Mothers and Families: Challenges in a Changing World,” focuses on the important role of mothers for families and communities around the world.

Mothers play a critical role in the family, which is a powerful force for social cohesion and integration. The mother-child relationship is vital for the healthy development of children. And mothers are not only caregivers; they are also breadwinners for their families. Yet women continue to face major – and even life-threatening – challenges in motherhood.

Childbirth, which should be a cause for celebration, is a grave health risk for too many women in developing countries. Improving maternal health is the Millennium Development Goal on which the least progress has been made. A woman in a least-developed country is 300 times more likely to die in childbirth or from pregnancy-related complications than a woman in a developed country. We must make pregnancy and childbirth safer by enabling health systems to provide family planning, skilled attendance at birth and emergency obstetric care.

Violence against women, many of whom are mothers, remains one of the most pervasive human rights violations of our time. It has far-reaching consequences –endangering the lives of women and girls, harming their families and communities, and damaging the very fabric of societies. Ending and preventing violence against women should be a key priority for all countries.

We must also ensure universal access to education. The benefits of educating women and girls accrue not only to individual families but to whole countries, unlocking the potential of women to contribute to broader development efforts. Statistics also show that educated mothers are much more likely to keep their children in school, meaning that the benefits of education transcend generations.

As we strive to support mothers in their caregiving work, we should develop and expand family-friendly policies and services, such as child care centres, that would reduce some of the workload placed on women. Women and men alike need stronger public support to share equally in work and family responsibilities. Families built on the recognition of equality between women and men will contribute to more stable and productive societies.

We face multiple challenges in our changing world, but one factor remains constant: the timeless importance of mothers and their invaluable contribution to raising the next generation. By rewarding their efforts and enhancing their living conditions, we can secure a better future for all.—UNIC





## Bangladesh, Russia sign MoU on nuclear power plant

DHAKA, 14 May—Bangladesh and Russia Wednesday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) here to enhance cooperation between the two countries in peaceful use of nuclear energy.

Main purpose of the MoU signed between the state-owned Bangladesh Atomic Energy Commission (BAEC) and the Russian State Atomic Energy Corporation-Rosatom, is to take necessary steps for setting up a 600-1000 MW power plant in Bangladesh, officials said. "This is a great moment for us. Through signing of this agreement, we are moving forward to implement our election commitment to build up a nuclear power project," Science and ICT State Minister Yeafesh Osman said at the signing ceremony.

NN Spasskiy, Deputy Director General of Rosatom, who signed the agreement on Russian part, said, "This agreement will enable us to provide avenue for cooperation in peaceful use of nuclear energy. But one thing is in our mind to design and build Bangladesh's first nuclear power plant."

BAEC acting chairman Mosharraf Hossain signed the MoU on behalf of his organization. Both sides, however, termed the MoU a very preliminary stage after an initial negotiation. If negotiation proceeds on, a state level agreement will be signed later.—Xinhua

## China-Russia partnership enjoys all-round, fast growth

Moscow, 14 May—China's top legislator Wu Bangguo said here Wednesday the strategic partnership of cooperation between China and Russia is currently showing a momentum all-round and rapid growth, as high-level contact remains frequent.

Wu said in recent years, China-Russia relations have been lifted to new stages as cooperation in all fields reached an unprecedentedly high level.

Wu made the remarks as he met with Russian President Dmitry Medvedev Wednesday afternoon. Wu, chairman of the Standing Committee

of the National People's Congress (NPC) arrived here for an official goodwill visit Wednesday.

Wu conveyed Chinese President Hu Jintao's greetings to Medvedev. He highly appreciated frequent contact between leaders of the two countries, saying Medvedev's visit to China last year contributed to the continuous growth of the strategic partnership between the two countries on a high level.—Xinhua

## Reports say Nigerian militants warn oil firms to pull staff out

LAGOS, 14 May—Nigerian major militant group warned oil companies in the Niger Delta to pull their staff out, according to agencies' reports on Wednesday.

"Oil companies operating in the region are advised to evacuate their staff within the next 24 hours to avoid them being part of the statistics of an emerging civil war," the Movement for the Emancipation of the Niger Delta (MEND) said in a statement. The Nigerian military clashed with MEND in southern Delta State Wednesday morning.

Military spokesman Col Rabe Abubakar said the security forces accidentally encountered the militants, sparking a gunfight.

However, MEND said the military attacked its camps in the region, but it had destroyed two military boats and inflicted several security force casualties. "At about 0930 Hrs today, 13 May, 2009, the Nigerian armed forces launched an unprovoked attack on two

major MEND camps in Delta state hoping to overwhelm them with the element of surprise," MEND said in the statement reaching here on Wednesday.

"Unfortunately for the raiders, we were waiting for them, a bloody battle is ongoing and two gunboats belonging to the army have already been sunk by mines with several casualties on the side of the army," it said. The statement said other freedom fighters in the Niger Delta have been placed on alert to defend their positions and unleash a horrible toll on the oil industry and the Nigerian economy.

MEND, one of the main militant groups in the Niger Delta Region, had rejected Nigerian President Umaru Yar'Adua's offer of an amnesty to rebels in the region in April this year.

It has been the mastermind behind most kidnappings in the Nigeria, and it always uses kidnapping and hostage taking as a source of fund raising, while over 200,000 US dollars is usually the ransom per head.—Xinhua

## UN says dozens of civilians killed in DR Congo over weekend

KINSHASA, 14 May—The United Nations has said that dozens of civilians were killed in an attack over the weekend in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo (DR Congo), according to media reports reaching here.

In a statement on Wednesday, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs cited local sources as saying that the attack claimed the lives of at least 90 people in North Kivu Province of the country.

The Rwandan Hutu rebels were blamed for the attack.

## Ten immigrants dead after boat sinks off Florida

HOUSTON, 14 May—Ten immigrants are dead and 17 rescued on Wednesday after an overloaded boat carrying immigrants sank off the coast of the southern US state of Florida, local media reported.

The search for survivals is underway and local officials say they do not know exactly how many people were aboard the boat, said Coast Guard Captain James Fitton, quoted by the reports.

Fitton believed around 30 were dumped into the sea. The boat "apparently left Bimini in the Bahamas" on Tuesday night and "apparently" carrying immigrants of Haiti, the reports added.

## Severe storms hit three states, kill Missouri woman

KIRKSVILLE, 14 May—Violent storms that spawned at least one tornado left a path of destruction in northern Missouri on Wednesday, killing a woman and damaging dozens of buildings.

The city of Kirksville apparently took the hardest hit. Police Det Sgt Ron Celian said about 30 to 40 homes were damaged, one was destroyed and an auto dealership sustained significant damage.

Two people were injured near the dealership when their car was blown off the road, Kirksville police Det Sgt Ron Celian said.

said a woman was killed when what appeared to be a tornado struck a mobile home east of Milan. Her name had not been released late Wednesday.

## Pirates coordinating attacks off Somalia

BRUSSELS, 14 May—Searches of captured mother ships operating off the Somali coast have revealed for the first time that pirate gangs are coordinating their attacks against commercial shipping, the commander of the European Union's naval task force said on Wednesday.

British Rear Admiral Philip Jones said that in recent weeks his flotilla had captured four of the mother ships used to resupply the small pirate speedboats that operate far offshore in the Indian Ocean.

"We do fairly extensive trawls of all the vessels we capture to look for ... evidence we can use to work (out) ourselves what the pirates tactics are," Jones told reporters.—*Internet*

## Pan-Asian free trade deal could generate \$260bln in extra income

MANILA, 14 May—A free-trade agreement covering both East and South Asia could generate around 260 billion US dollars in additional income and trade benefits could be shared more evenly between the fast growing economies and the disadvantaged ones in the region, a book released on Wednesday by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) finds.

The ADB said East and South Asia have been at the forefront of the global drive to establish free-trade agreements in recent years, with around 20 either signed, under negotiation, or proposed by the two regions as of January last year.

Trade between East and South Asia soared by over 114 billion US dollars between 2000 and 2007. Despite that progress, the benefits of the trade were limited and spread unevenly, the ADB said.—*Internet*

## 20 armed militants surrender to Gov't in N Afghanistan

KABUL, 14 May—Nearly two dozen Taliban fighters laid down their arms and joined government in Baghlan Province north of Afghanistan, police said on Thursday.

"Twenty armed rebels under the command of Mullah Abdul Jabbar handed in arms in Jilga district and vowed to defend the government and work for peace," Police spokesman in the province Ahmad Jawed Basharat told *Xinhua*.

With the surrender of these people, he added, that Jilga district and surrounding areas would have peace and stability.

Jilga and neighboring Birka districts have seen escalating Taliban activities over the past couple of months. Militants just weeks ago raided Birka district and after killing three police took away eight others but set them free later.—*Internet*

## Spanish ticket wins 126 million euros in lottery

A lottery player in Spain has won 126 million euros (112 million pounds), the biggest ever European jackpot for a single ticket, lottery organizer EuroMillions said Saturday. The winner of the on Friday night draw conquered odds of 76 million to one to snare the windfall which ballooned after the jackpot was not won in the previous six weekly draws.

"The record for a single win in EuroMillions is believed to have been broken when on Friday's sixth-rollover draw was won by a single ticket holder," EuroMillions said on its website about the game which pools stakes from nine European lotteries.

## Viking ship found on Swedish lake bottom

Divers stumbled on the wreck of a Viking ship this week on the bottom of the largest lake in Sweden. Archaeologists say the ship is the first from the Viking era found underwater in Sweden, *The Local* reported. Previous Viking ship discoveries have been used for land burials.

The boat was in the midst of an island group in the centre of Lake Vanern. Most of the wreck was covered with 3 feet of mud with a single rib sticking out of the ooze, the divers said. Roland Peterson, an archaeologist with the Vanern Museum, said that a sample of the ship's wood and iron from a sword and shield found in the wreck are being tested to determine the age of the vessel. But he said the sword resembles those from other Viking-era sites. The divers discovered six more shipwrecks within 300 feet of the Viking ship, including three in the same spot. Peterson said the age of those wrecks is still completely unknown. Vanern, which lies west of Stockholm, is one of a chain of lakes in the Gotha Canal system, connecting the capital and Gothenburg. The lake is the third largest in Europe.

## Over 500 twins in one Indian village

Doctors are studying a unique village in the southern Indian state of Kerela that has over 500 twins in just 2,000 households, the local Hindi daily *Danik Bhaskar* said Thursday. While twin births in the village has been observed for at least three generations, the number of twins born in village Kodinhi is increasing every year, said the report. Dr. Krishan Sribhuj, who has been studying the village for the last two years, said while number of registered twins stood at 500, the actual number of twins exceeded 600.

The doctor has ruled out environmental causes or pollution as a factor, saying all twins are healthy and without any disorders. He suspected that the phenomenon is related with the feeding habits of the villagers, who have 45 twins for every 1,000 people, six times higher than average. In 2008 alone, 30 twins were born in the village.

# Ongoing hydropower projects to help satisfy domestic electric power demand

All the townships in Shan State (South) that have got grids linking with the national electric power network such as Langkho, Mongpan, Mongnai, Maukmai, Namhsan, Loilem, Leikha, Mongpon and Hopong are enjoying sufficient electric power supply. That evening, I watched a song on TV to the accompaniment of Shan traditional drums and dances, portraying that the government has constructed Kengtawng Hydropower Plant thanks to unprecedented peace and stability and national unity in the area, and that all local people will equally share the fruits of unity. I also noticed that at the opening ceremony, Shan nationals were much pleased with the facility.

Thanks to many more hydropower plants, grids and power stations, the people can visualize what the electric power sector will be like in next three or four years. I noticed Yenwe Hydropower Plant with generating capacity of 25 megawatts that can generate 120 million kilowatt hours a year was opened on 10 February 2007; Pathi Hydropower Plant with generating capacity of two megawatts, on 2 January 2008; and Khabaung Hydropower Plant with generating capacity of 30 megawatts that can generate 120 million kilowatt hours a year, on 2 February 2008. At the opening ceremony of Khabaung Hydropower Plant, officials in their speeches disclosed that the government was trying its utmost to complete six large hydropower projects between 2007 and 2010: Kengtawng Hydropower Project (54 megawatts), Shweli Project (1) Hydropower Project (600 megawatts), Yeywa Hydropower Project (790 megawatts), Kunchaung Hydropower Project (60 megawatts), Pyuchaung Hydropower Project (40 megawatts) and Shwegyin Hydropower Project (75 megawatts).

I feel very heartened to watch on TV news and news in the newspapers that the Head of State and members of the State Peace and Development Council occasionally make inspection tours of hydropower projects. Officials concerned from the related ministries and the projects are working hard. It implies that the government is putting huge efforts into hydropower projects to supply greater power to the people. I have also learnt that Shweli (1) Hydropower Plant with generating capacity of 600 megawatts is going to be commissioned. The purpose of this article is to present what the electric power sector will be like in future for public knowledge.

## Generating capacity of the nation

On 16 May 2006, the Ministry of Electric Power was reconstituted into the Ministry of Electric Power (1) and the Ministry of Electric Power (2). The Ministry of Electric Power (1) is responsible for conducting feasibility study to find out water resources, constructing hydropower plants and power stations, and generating electricity. The Ministry of Electric Power (2) takes responsibilities for building an electric power network system, supporting electricity to the grids, and distributing electricity to the people. Generation of electric power will be on sharp increase in several years due to the harmonious cooperation of the two ministries.

The following 15 hydropower plants are under the Ministry of Electric Power (1).

Shweli (1) Hydropower Plant is due to be equipped with six 100-megawatt generators. So far, five of them have started generating electricity, and the last one will be installed in the plant soon.

The generating capacity the hydropower plants under the Ministry of Electric Power (1) totaled 1441 megawatts. Up to 1988, the ministry had only two hydropower plants: Baluchaung (2) Hydropower Plant (168 megawatts) and Kinda Hydropower Plant (56

megawatts), totalling 224 megawatts.

The Ministry of Electric Power (2) operates the following 15 gas-fired and steam hydropower plants.

So far, the generating capacity of the hydropower plants under the Ministry of Electric Power (2) has reached 723.62 megawatts, and all the hydropower plants are gas-fired and steam ones. Up to 1988, the nation had only seven gas-fired and steam power stations with generating capacity of 268.2 megawatts in total.

The generating capacity of the two ministries stands at 2164.62 megawatts. The hydroelectricity generated by the 30 hydropower plants is distributed to the consumers through grids. The two ministries generated 6088 million kilowatt hours and distributed 5543 million kilowatt hours in 2006-2007; generated 6299 million kilowatt hours and distributed 6068 million kilowatt hours in 2007-2008; and generated 6537 million kilowatt hours and distributed 6334 million kilowatt hours in 2008-2009.

The greater economic growth the nation achieves, the higher the demand of electric power will be year by year. As mentioned above, Shweli (1) Hydropower Plant will be able to generate 100 more megawatts if the last generator is installed. By 2010, Yeywa (790 megawatts), Kunchaung (60 megawatts), Pyuchaung (40 megawatts) and Shwegyin (75 megawatts) will have been completed. If so, the generation of hydropower will increase by 1065 megawatts. By then, the nation's generating capacity will increase to 3229.62 megawatts. As a result of the government's effective encouragement, and the hard work of responsible persons, the hydropower projects are expected to be completed on schedule. In order to complete hydropower projects, diversion tunnels and intake tunnels are constructed. If there is no unforeseen geographical barrier and difficulty, the projects will be over in time.

The projects imply that the government is pursuing a master plan to satisfy the people's growing demand of electric power.

Moreover, five SSMT-Jeeps were assembled and sold in the local automobile market. ## Illegal medicines, narcotic drugs seized in Shan States (East) and (South), Mandalay, Sagaing and Yangon Divisions

They seized 41 packets of illegal medicines made in Thailand with the brands of Triprodrine, Triofed, Sulidine, Siam, Bated, Pmdma's, B, Sinysaid/SPS, CO, GX/CTZ, ML, P&U and MP in a plastic bag from two noodle boxes. According to the investigation, owners of illegal medicines were Sai

Pan Shwe of Haungleik Ward of Tachilek. Driver Zaw Hlaing Win and bus conductor Win Kyaing are under investigation, and the authorities are trying to arrest Sai Pan Shwe.

At 4.30 pm on 6 May, the authorities of Mandalay Special Anti-Drug Squad searched the house at No. 27/61 to 66 on Sanpya Road in Sethmu Ward 1 of Pyigyidagun Township. They saw Kyaw Kyaw Maung from No. Ah-7/107 of Ward 8, and seized 2250 cards of Pseudoephedrine from a polyethylene bag. At 3.30 pm on 8 May, the authorities of Yangon

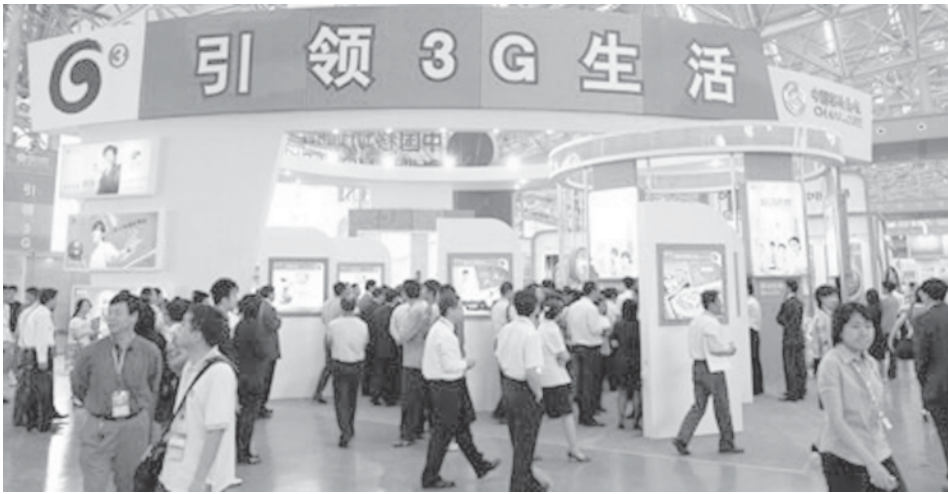

## Russia to charge NASA \$51M per space flight

MOSCOW, 14 May—Russia will charge US astronauts 51 million US dollars per return trip to the International Space Station (ISS) from 2010 and will resume selling seats to space tourists, Russian news agencies reported on Wednesday.

NASA needs to use the Russian Soyuz capsule because its own Space Shuttle will be retired next year after nearly three decades in service and a replacement is not due until 2014 at the earliest.

Russia's own plans for a new spacecraft are running behind schedule, with the planned unveiling of a mock-up now delayed by a year to 2010, *Interfax* quoted Anatoly Perminov, head of Russian space agency Roskosmos as saying. "We've agreed with our American partners the sum of 51 million US dollars, starting in 2011," Perminov was quoted as saying by *ITAR-TASS* news agency.

He did not specify how much astronauts will be charged between 2010 and 2012, but in 2006 Russia charged the United States 21.8 million per US dollars return flight to the ISS. Since then the price for of a space tourist ticket to the ISS has climbed to 35 million US dollars from 20 million US dollars.—MNA/Reuters

## Ban urges collective action against human trafficking

UNITED NATIONS, 14 May—UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon Wednesday called for united and real efforts from all member countries to combat human trafficking. In a address to a thematic debate of the General Assembly on human trafficking held on Wednesday, Ban said trafficking in weapons, drugs and blood diamonds has long been on the UN

agenda, "now we must add people to that list".

Ban said millions of people, most women and children are "brought and sold like chattel" in a number of countries from Asia, Africa, across the Americas, to Europe. "Human trafficking is indeed one of the worst forms of violence against women and girls," he told the meeting.

Noting that UN member states are starting to shoulder a greater share

of responsibility and UN organizations and NGO community are raising awareness, Ban said those efforts need "greater coherence", "We have to take a tougher line against this crime," the Secretary-General said. Describing the meeting "a call for action," Ban said human trafficking should be criminalized, urging all countries must ratify the UN anti-trafficking Protocol.

## China willing to enhance education co-op with other ASEM members

HANOI, 14 May—China is willing to strengthen education cooperation with other Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) members in a wide range of areas, said Chinese Vice Education Minister Hao Ping here on Thursday. Hao made the remarks in his speech at the Second Asia-Europe Education Ministers' Meeting that opened in Hanoi on Thursday.

The meeting, within the framework of ASEM, drew minister-level officials and education specialists from 39 ASEM members and international organizations. He expected strengthening cooperation in "curriculum development, language learning, scientific research, training for school teachers and principals, and more sharing of information and resources".

Hao highlighted the needs to develop vocational education as the key to sustainable development of human resources. During the two-day conference, participants discussed credit recognition and transfer in ASEM and sustainable human resources development for ASEM future needs.

Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyen Tan Dung delivered opening remarks at the meeting, calling for closer Asia-Europe education cooperation to combat negative social impacts of the current financial and economic crisis.—Internet

## 140 Afghans dead in US airstrikes last week

KABUL, 14 May—Ninety-three children and 25 adult women are among a list of 140 names of Afghans who villagers say were killed in a battle and US airstrikes last week, causing a crisis between Washington and its Afghan allies.

The list, obtained by *Reuters*, bears the endorsement of seven senior provincial and central government officials, including an Afghan two-star general who headed a task force dispatched by the government to investigate the incident. Titled "list of the martyrs of the bombardment of Bala Boluk District of Farah Province", it includes the name, age and father's name of each alleged victim.

The youngest was listed as eight-day-old baby Sayed Musa, son of Sayed Adam. Fifty-three victims were girls under the age of 18, and 40 were boys. Only 22 were men 18 or older. The US military continues to dispute the toll and a military spokesman said some of the names could be fake.

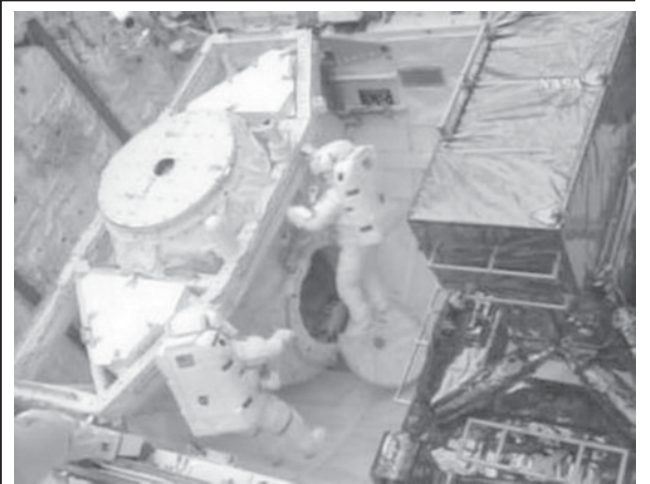
The dispute over the number of dead has worsened tension between Washington and Kabul, despite apologies President Barack Obama and Secretary of State Hillary Clinton made during a visit to Washington by President Hamid Karzai last week.—MNA/Reuters

## Only a third of terrorism arrests led to charges in UK

LONDON, 14 May—More than 1,400 people have been arrested in Britain under the Terrorism Act since September 11, 2001 but only a third of them ended up facing charges and even fewer were convicted, government data showed on Wednesday.

The data, which cover the period from the Twin Towers attacks on the United States to the end of March 2008, showed that of 1,471 people arrested, only 196 were convicted, and only 102 of those were found guilty under terrorism legislation.

"The main offences for which suspects were charged under terrorism legislation were possession of an article for terrorist purposes, membership of a proscribed organization and fundraising—all offences under the Terrorism Act 2000," said Paul Wiles, chief scientific adviser at the Home Office.—MNA/Reuters

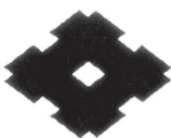

**Doctors warn climate change biggest threat to global health**

BEIJING, 14 May—Global health is at greater risk in the 21st century because of the increase in greenhouse gases, senior UK doctors warned on Thursday.

The first major report—compiled over a year by *The Lancet* medical journal and experts from the Institute for Global Health at University College London—investigating the effects of climate change on people's health was published Wednesday.

A panel of doctors said rising global temperatures would have a catastrophic effect on human health through floods, droughts and rising sea levels. "Even the most conservative estimates are profoundly disturbing and demand action," said the doctors.

"Climate change is the biggest global health threat of the 21st century. It's a threat that's been completely neglected, marginalised, ignored, by not just the global health community, by doctors, nurses and other health professionals, but also by policy-makers. And yet, in terms of our well-being, in terms of our survival over the next 100 years, it is absolutely the top political issue that we should be talking about," said the doctors.

### Massachusetts stops drivers carrying mobiles

BOSTON, 14 May—Massachusetts on Wednesday banned drivers of trains, street cars and buses from using or even carrying mobile phones at work, the toughest such measure imposed by a US state transit agency.

Any driver working for the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority caught talking or text-messaging on a mobile or similar device will be suspended for a month and managers will recommend

their dismissal, the state said. Drivers found carrying their phones on duty face a 10-day suspension for a first offense. If it happens again, they will be suspended for a month and face a dismissal recommendation.

The tough new rules were imposed after two trolleys collided in a Boston tunnel on Friday, injuring 49 people, when one of the drivers failed to stop. He told authorities later he was sending a text mes-

sage to his girlfriend at the time. "I know what I saw on Friday night in that tunnel. I know what the cause was. And I know that this new policy would have prevented it," said Daniel Grabauskas, general manager of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority.

The National Safety Council, an independent, nonprofit group, said the rules were the most stringent of any US state transit authority.—Internet

### Dying oceans 'life and death issue'

MANADO, 14 May —The destruction of the world's oceans due to climate change and overuse is a "life and death issue" for humanity, Indonesian President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono said on Thursday.

"We must come to the rescue of the oceans. We must save them from the ravages of abuse and over-exploitation by humankind, from the havoc due to pollution and dire effects of climate change," Yudhoyono said at a global conference on oceans.

"This is a life and death issue for the community of nations, including Indonesia, who prides itself on being the world's largest archipelago." Ministers and officials from more than 70 countries are meeting in the Indonesian city of Manado for the World Ocean Conference, the first global meeting on the relationship between oceans and climate change.—Internet

### UN says 5,900 languages risk extinction

LAGOS, 14 May — The United Nations (UN) said on Tuesday that 5,900 languages worldwide may become extinct before the end of the 21st century if measures to protect them are not introduced, the *News Agency of Nigeria* reported Tuesday.

The United Nations, in a statement issued by the UN Information Centre (UNIC) in Lagos, urged countries to introduce measures to secure their languages, noting that only 600 of the world's 6,500 languages would survive.

"There are at present 6,500 languages in the world and by the end of the century, only 600 of them will survive through technological documentation," the statement said.

The United Nations said that languages remain critical to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) on education, urging that children should be taught their dialects at an early age.

"Governments should introduce policies that would promote speaking of mother tongue," the United Nations statement said.

Meanwhile, the Nigerian federal government has initiated efforts to achieve technological documentation of languages in the country.

### Internet hacking popular among teenagers

LOS ANGELES, 14 May—Two-thirds of teens polled in a recent survey admitted that they have tried to hack into a friend's instant messaging or social networking account, an Internet security firm said on Wednesday.

A total of 67 percent of the teens polled said they had tried to hack into the Instant Messaging (IM) or social-networking accounts of friends, according to the survey by Panda Security, which is based in Glendale, Los Angeles. The survey of 4,000 adolescents between the ages of 15 and 18 found that 17 percent of the young computer users claim to have advanced technical knowledge and can find hacking tools on the Internet.—Internet

### Mexico's A/H1N1 flu death toll rises to 60, infected toll to 2,446

MEXICO CITY, 14 May — Mexico's Health Minister Jose Angel Cordova Villalobos raised the confirmed death toll from new strain A/H1N1 flu to 60, and the total confirmed infected to 2,386 at Wednesday morning press conference.

Cordova also said that the most recent death confirmed as from the new virus — which causes breathing difficulties, headaches, high body temperature and muscular pain — was around a week old, and that 56 of the 60 confirmed deaths were infected before 23 April, when the Mexican government declared an alert and ordered all educational institutions closed.

"There are still two states which have no confirmed cases and 89 percent of the municipalities in Mexico still do not have any confirmed cases," Cordova said. He added that the disease has turned out to be mostly in poor urban areas, because populations tend not to be so dense in the countryside.

### Confirmed A/H1N1 flu cases in US rise to 3352

WASHINGTON, 14 May — The number of confirmed human A/H1N1 cases has risen to 3352 in 45 US states, with three deaths, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reported Wednesday.

According to the CDC, the state of Illinois has 592 confirmed cases of the A/H1N1 flu, followed by 496 of Wisconsin, 293 of Texas, 221 of California and 211 of New York.—Internet

### First case of A/H1N1 flu confirmed in Belgium

BRUSSELS, 14 May — Belgian Health Minister Laurette Onkelinx said here Wednesday that a case of A/H1N1 flu had been confirmed in Belgium.

This made Belgium the 16th country in Europe and the 34th country in the world which was affected by the disease. The 28-year-old patient, who is from the northern Belgian city of Ghent, fell ill Monday after his return from a two-week trip in New York and Chicago in the United States, Onkelinx said.—Internet

### All 147 passengers with exposure to Sichuan A/H1N1 flu case found

BEIJING, 14 May — All the 147 passengers, who had exposure to the confirmed A/H1N1 flu patient surnamed Bao in Sichuan Province on the flight NW029, had been contacted by Beijing Health Department, said the department on Wednesday.

June 2011. The Dutchman will ink the deal within the next few days, according to the official website of Bayern.

The Bayern Munich AG board of directors, comprising Karl-Heinz Rummenigge, Uli Hoeness and Karl Hopfner, travelled for talks with Van Gaal's current club AZ Alkmaar of The Netherlands on Wednesday. Alkmaar agreed to cancel Van Gaal's contract with AZ a year early, unconditionally releasing the coach to join his new club at the start of the new season.

As a reciprocal gesture, Bayern will visit the Netherlands for a friendly against the freshly-crowned domestic champions. There will be no appearance fee charged for the match, provisionally scheduled for summer 2010. "We're delighted to be bringing Louis van Gaal, a very experienced and successful coach, to FC Bayern Munich," Bayern chairman Rummenigge commented after the talks in Alkmaar.

Van Gaal boasts rich coaching experience as he had served as head coach of Spanish Barcelona, Dutch Ajax and the national squad of The Netherlands. Under his helm, AZ Alkmaar took the top title of Dutch top league this season with three rounds remaining.—INTERNET

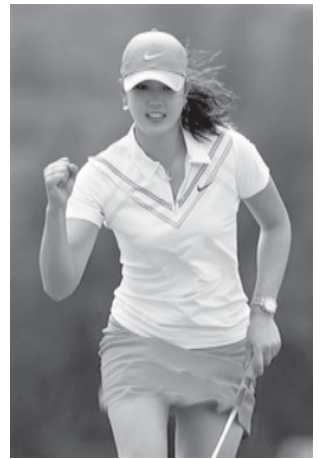
"We hope it's an historic week and we will go for the second title this weekend," said defender Gerard Pique.

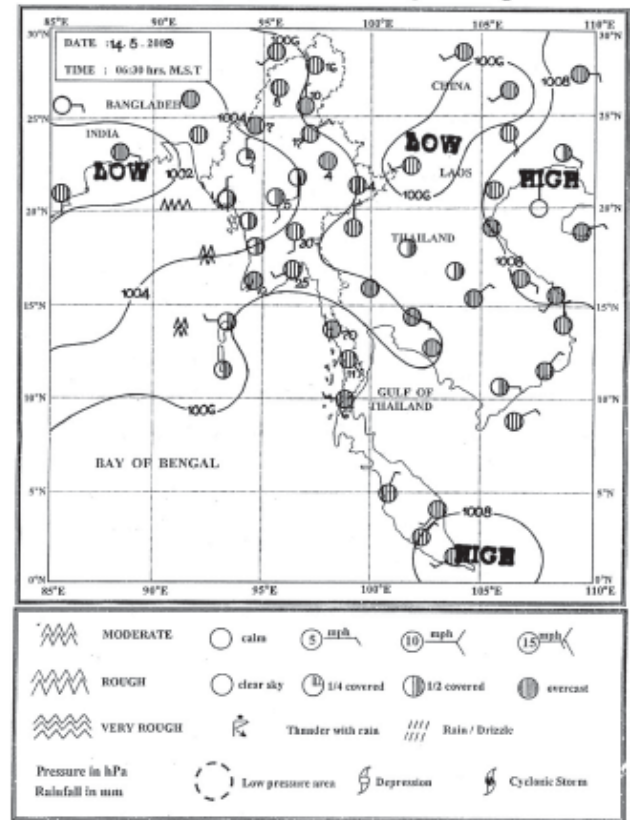

#### Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr MST:

During the past 24 hours, water has been partly cloudy in Chin and Rakhine States, Magway and Ayeyawady Divisions, rain or thundershowers have been isolated in Mandalay Division, scattered in Mon and Kayah States, lower Sagaing, Bago and Yangon Divisions and widespread in the remaining areas with isolated heavyfall in lower Sagaing Division. Day temperatures were (3°C) to (4°C) above May average temperatures in Kachin and Rakhine States, Mandalay, Magway, Ayeyawady and Taninthayi Divisions, (5°C) to (6°C) above May average temperatures in Shan State and upper Sagaing Division and about May average temperatures in the remaining areas. The significant day temperatures were NyaungU and Minbu (42°C) each. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Belin (2.83) inches, Dawei (2.75) inches, Moekok (2.64) inches, Khayan (2.52) inches, Kawkayeik (2.36) inches, Myawaddy (1.93) inches, Kanbalu and Taunggu (Aviation) (1.65) inches each.

Maximum temperature on 13-5-2009 was 96°F. Minimum temperature on 14-5-2009 was 68°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 14-5-2009 was 100%. Total sunshine hours on 13-5-2009 was (4.9) hrs approx.

Rainfall on 14-5-2009 was (0.83) inch at Mingaladon, (0.99) inch at Kaba-Aye and (Tr) at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2009 was (3.43) inches at Mingaladon, (4.61) inches at Kaba-Aye and (5.67) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum wind speed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (10) mph from Southwest at (23:30) hour MST on 13-5-2009.

**Bay inference:** Weather is partly cloudy in the Central Bay and partly cloudy to cloudy in the Andaman Sea and elsewhere in the Bay of Bengal.

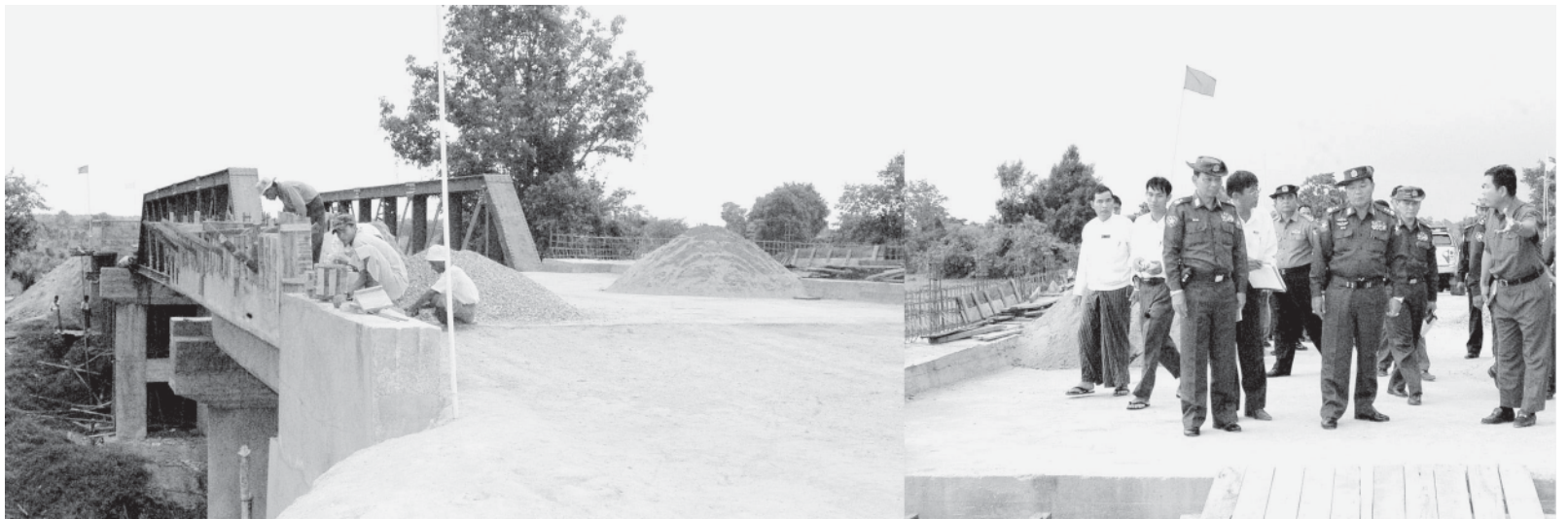


## Lt-Gen Khin Zaw on inspection tour of Kyain-seikkyi Township

### MPF manages to arrest armed robbers in seven days

NAY PYI TAW, 14 May—The Myanmar Police Force managed to arrest in a week the four men who robbed a jewellery shop in Myoma Market in Yamethin, shot a motorcyclist to death, and shot a sales assistant and other one.

Three men on a bicycle arrived at Ngwe Yadana Aung jewellery shop at No (28/29), Building No (10) of Myoma Market in Yamethin at about 4.10 pm on 6 May. Then, they broke the counter with a long-barrel gun and took about five viss of gold necklaces and one viss of gold bracelets worth about K 240 million and drove away. Sales assistant Daw Cho Pyone, who stopped the men from taking jewellery, sustained gunshot injuries in her left knee, and U Myo Thant of a nearby drug store, in his right shoulder. The three robbers shot to death Maung Maung Swe, 24, motorcyclist, son of U Myint Swe, of Hsegyi Village, near Hsegyi Village, about one mile east of Yamethin. And they took the motorcycle and drove to Theingon Village and left it at the village.

Copies of the police sketches of the robbers were distributed to the state/division Police Forces to catch the culprits at large, and the measure led to the arrest of the two brothers: Ko Lay (a) Myo Win Zaw and Khin Maung Htwe (a) Gyapu at about 1 pm on 7 May who stayed hiding near Yinmabin Village; Nyi Nyi Naing and Khaing Zaw Win, who helped steal small arms, at Myohaung railways staff quarter in Chanmyathazi Township at about 11.30 am on 13 May; and first-degree culprit Nyi Nyi Naing at his house in Mawhit Village in Kutkai Township at about 11.59 pm on 13 May. The five small arms Nyi Nyi Naing and Khaing Zaw Win had stolen from a regiment in Yesagyo from 6 to 14 May, and two viss, three ticals and three annas of the six viss of gold necklace and bracelets were recovered. Investigation is under way to file a lawsuit against them.—MNA
