Kabul, 17 June — Two | statement. Afghan soldiers and several suspected militants were killed in fighting and raids across insurgency-hit Afghanistan, authorities said Tuesday.

The soldiers, from the US-trained Afghan army, died after their patrol was attacked by rebels in the northeastern province of Kunduz on Monday, the

Three militants were also killed during "very intense fighting," the statement said. Eight rebels were injured and four others captured, it added.

Kunduz, where hundreds of German troops have deployed under a UN-mandated force that arrived in Afghanistan in 2001, has seen a surge in defence ministry said in a | militant violence in recent |

months as have other parts of Afghanistan.

Most insurgent attacks are however concentrated in the south and east of the country. Several suspected militants were killed in operations on Monday by Afghan and US-led military forces in the country's south, a joint statement by the US-led force and Afghan defence ministry said.—Internet



House votes to fund wars in Iraq and Afghanistan

WASHINGTON, 17 June — The House has narrowly approved a \$106 billion bill to ensure financing for war operations in Iraq and Afghanistan over the coming months. Passage of the bill comes over almost united opposition from Republicans, who objected to the inclusion of money in the legislation for an International Monetary Fund loan programme for poor countries.

The vote was 226-202. The measure contains about \$80 billion to fund defence activities in Iraq and Afghanistan through the end of September. It also contains some \$10 billion for foreign aid, \$7.7 billion to combat the flu pandemic, and \$1 billion in rebates for consumers who turn in their old cars for more fuel-efficient models.—Internet

US military deaths in Iraq war at 4,315

Washington, 17 June — As of Tuesday, 16 June, 2009, at least 4,315 members of the US military had died in the Iraq war since it began in March 2003. The figure includes nine military civilians killed in action. At least 3,454 military personnel died as a result of hostile action, according to the military's numbers.

The British military has reported 179 deaths; Italy, 33; Ukraine, 18; Poland, 21; Bulgaria, 13; Spain, 11; Denmark, seven; El Salvador, five; Slovakia, four; Latvia and Georgia, three each; Estonia, Netherlands, Thailand and Romania, two each; and Australia, Hungary, Kazakhstan and South Korea, one death each.

Since the start of US military operations in Iraq, 31,354 US service members have been wounded in hostile action, according to the Defence Department's weekly tally.—Internet

US soldier killed, six people wounded in Iraq violence

BAGHDAD, 17 June—A US soldier was killed and six people were wounded in violence across Iraq on Tuesday, two weeks before the scheduled American pullout from the country's urban centres.

The soldier was killed by an improvised explosive device outside Samawa, 250 kilometres (155 miles) south of Baghdad, the US army said in a statement, which did not give further details.

The death bring to 4,313 the number of American troops killed since the 2003 US-led invasion that ousted Saddam Hussein but sparked a deadly insurgency, according to an AFP count based on the independent website icasualties.org.

The army is just shy of a 30 June deadline to leave cities and major towns ahead of a complete withdrawal from Iraq by the end of 2011, as part of a security accord signed between Baghdad and Washington.

Meanwhile, in an attack in the Al-Husseiniyah district of northeast Baghdad, one US soldier and two civilians were injured and a Humvee was damaged by a bomb targeting a US patrol in the area, the police and US army said.

And a senior Iraqi judge and his two bodyguards were hurt by a roadside bomb as they drove through Mosul, according to police. Mosul, 370 kilometres (230 miles) north of Baghdad, is considered to be the last bastion of Al-Qaeda in Iraq and one of the country's most dangerous cities.

Death toll from mine blast in Indonesia reaches 28

JAKARTA, 17 June—An explosion ripped through a coal mine in western Indonesia, killing at least 28 people and burying 12 others who were feared dead, officials said on Wednesday.

Dozens of rescuers tried to reach the trapped men after the Tuesday morning blast, but rock slides and a mix of gas and coal debris forced them to resurface after four hours of digging, district police Chief Yasman Esha in West Sumatra Province said by phone from the scene.

"We fear the miners are dead by now," Esha said.

Four bodies were recovered soon after the morning blast at the 300-foot (100-metre) -deep mine in Sawahlunto regency on Sumatra island, he said. Eight more were pulled out late Tuesday after teams pumped oxygen into the mine shaft to allow rescuers to breathe.

Health Ministry Crisis Center chief Rustam Pakaya said rescuers have found 11 more bodies, bringing the death toll to 28, including five who were rescued but died at a hospital.—Internet

Britain seeks to become world's 'digital capital'

London, 17 June—Britain declared a goal to become the world's "digital capital" on Tuesday by building cutting-edge broadband, telecoms and media infrastructure to cement its role as a "global economic powerhouse".

Prime Minister Gordon Brown compared the digital revolution to the 19th century construction of roads and railways which laid the foundations for the Industrial Revolution in Britain.

Although it currently trails many countries in criteria such as broadband penetration and mobile phone usage, Brown said Britain could leapfrog into the global lead. "Britain is going to lead the world. This is us taking the next step into the future, being the digital capital of the world," he said.

The long-awaited "Digital Britain" report set out wide-ranging aims for Britain's communications industry, including a new broadband access commitment and new powers to crack down on illegal downloading of films and music. It also outlined plans to upgrade all radio from analogue to digital by 2015 and to enhance the coverage of 3G and next generation mobile services.

Brown, who visited a media firm in southeast London ahead of the launch, said high-speed broadband access would be as essential in the future as gas, electricity or water are now.—Internet

US economy out of intensive care but still very sick

Los Angeles, 17 June—The American economy is out of intensive care but still very sick, economists said here in a report released on Tuesday.

David Shulman, senior economist at the Anderson Forecast, University of California in Los Angeles (UCLA), said in the report: "The free fall stage of the recession appears to be over and in fact we anticipate that the economy will record positive, albeit minimal, growth as early

as the third quarter."

After declining by as estimated 2.9 percent in the current quarter, Shulman forecast that real GDP growth will be zero in the third quarter and 0.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 and the first quarter of 2010.

"Thereafter we forecast growth will be in the very modest 2-3 percent range," Shulman said.

However, he added, with the economy growing at such a tepid pace, the unemployment rate

will continue to climb well into 2010 where it is expected to peak at 10.4 percent. "Job losses will likely continue for the remainder of the year," said Shulman.—Internet

Vancouver Winter **Olympics** sponsors scale back

OTTAWA, 17 June— Some major sponsors of the 2010 Vancouver Winter Olympics are poised to re-evaluate their hospitality plans for the Games because of the unexpected tough economic times.

Royal Bank of Canada, which paid 110 million Canadian dollars (96.9 million US dollars) for the banking rights to the 2010 Games, is finalizing its sponsorship programme to ensure money to be spent "effectively".

RBC spokesman John Groves told Canwest News Service on Monday that the bank "had to be prudent" on how to focus on all aspects of the Olympics as no one could have foreseen the economic situation unfolding the way it did.

RBC has not cancelled its hospitality, employee activation and client appreciation programme, he said. But it needs to get the best bang for its buck.

Explosion occurs in Indonesia's military headquarters

JAKARTA, 17 June—An explosion occurred in a mobile brigade military headquarters in Depok, of Indonesia's West Java Province, the private television MetroTV reported on Wednesday.

The explosion damaged the bomb squad simulation room at around 7:25 am local time.

"The explosion was started by a fire in the bomb squad simulation room," said the Indonesia's police headquarters.

An ambulance came in but officials said that there was no casualty. People lived around the headquarters were outside to wait for the official statement from the headquar-

Police is investigating the cause of the fire that triggered the explosion.

Environment threats hit Pacific

Suva, 17 June—Pacific Island countries including Fiji must sustainably use and manage their scarce natural resources as environmental threats like land degradation grow in the region, Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC) said on Wednesday.

The SPC made the statement as the Pacific joins the rest of the world in marking World Desertification Day on 17 June. SPC Land Use Policy Advisor Inoke Ratukalou said the Pacific needs to embrace sustainable development through a holistic approach such as ecosystem-based management.

"This approach would address interactions among land resources, water, air, biota and human activities, in order to meet the priority challenges of desertification and drought, sustainable mountain development, prevention and mitigation of land degradation, sustainable development of coastal zones, deforestation, climate change, rural and urban land use, urban growth and conservation of biological diversity," he said.—Xinhua

30 heads of state commit to UN economic, financial crisis meeting

June—Some 30 heads of state and more than 100 nations have signed up to attend the UN high-level summit on the global economic crisis next week, a UN official said here on Tuesday.

UNITED NATIONS, 17 | 24-26 June continue with delegates "making progress," said Enrique Yeves, spokesman for the president of the UN General Assembly, Miguel Escoto Brockman. The General Assembly president had asked the document be ready around 15 June, Monday.

"Negotiations continue and progress has been made by members states," Yeves told reporters. "In terms of attendance there already are around 100 delegations that have confirmed their participation and we expect around 30 heads of state."

There had been fears of a slim attendance figure because the meeting was pushed back from 1 June.

Brockman, who had been traveling around the world to encourage heads of state and government to attend, sought the delay citing conflicts high-level personalities claimed on their calendars.

Honduras declares emergency due to earthquakes

TEGUCIGALPA, 17 June—The Honduran government declared on Tuesday a national emergency due to a series of earthquakes after the one measuring 7.1 on Richter scale that killed seven people on 28 May.

"The government has decided to declare a national emergency as a consequence of the earthquake and aftershocks in the country," said Honduran President's Private Secretary Enrique Reina in a press conference.

The government also ordered the finance ministry to distribute the funds from the Bolivarian Alternatives for the Americas (ALBA) and the international community to rebuild the affected area.

On 28 May, a strong earthquake in northern Honduras killed seven people and caused damages worth some 100 million US dollars.

The authorities said that the country has been shaken by at least 400 aftershocks without victims or material damages reported.—Xinhua

MySpace to cut staff by about 30%

Los Angeles, 17 June—Social networking Web site MySpace will cut its staff by about 30 percent so as "to return to an environment of innovation," company executives confirmed on Tuesday. The job cuts will affect about 425 employees across all its US divisions, the company said.

The company took the move after it had been steadily losing ground to rival Facebook, MySpace CEO Owen Van Natta said.

"Simply put, our staffing levels were bloated and hindered our ability to be an efficient and nimble team-oriented company," said Van Natta.

Hydrogen gas leak forces another launch delay

CAPE CANAVERAL, 17 June—For the second time in less than a week, a hydrogen gas leak on shuttle Endeavour's fuel tank early Wednesday forced a launch delay, pushing the space station construction mission into July.

NASA waited almost an hour after the leak appeared, trying to fix it through remote commands, before calling off the predawn launch attempt.

Launch officials said the leak occurred in the same place as one that cropped up Saturday during fueling, in the hydrogen gas vent line that hooks up to the external fuel tank.

On Wednesday, engineers opened and closed a valve in hopes of stopping the potentially dangerous leakage or, at the very least, better understanding it. But that did not work and the countdown was halted just 3 1/2 hours before the scheduled launch time.—*Internet*

Mexico finds cocaine haul hidden in frozen sharks

Mexico City, 17 June— Mexico's navy has seized more than a tonne of cocaine stuffed inside frozen sharks, as drug gangs under military pressure go to greater lengths to conceal narcotics bound for the United States.

Armed and masked navy officers cut open more than 20 shark carcasses filled with slabs of cocaine after checking a container ship in a container port in the southern Mexico state of Yucatan, the navy and Mexican media said on Tuesday.

"We are talking about more than a tonne of cocaine that was inside the ship," Navy Commander Eduardo Villa told reporters after X-ray machines and sniffer dogs helped uncover the drugs. "Those in charge of the shipment said it was a conserving agent but after checks we confirmed it was cocaine," he said.—*Internet*

Syria plays down uranium find by UN nuclear agency

VIENNA, 17 June—Syria's nuclear chief is suggesting the UN nuclear agency's discovery of new uranium traces in the country do not harden allegations that Damascus has a hidden nuclear programme.

Ibrahim Othman's comments are the first from Syria about the International Atomic Energy Agency's recent announcement that it found unexplained traces of uranium at a Syrian site for the second time.

Othman played down the discovery on Tuesday and described it as only "one particle or two particles."

The IAEA has been investigating Syria since Israel bombed a Syrian site in 2007 that the US says was a secret nuclear reactor built with North Korean help.

The agency's 35-nation board is preparing to debate allegations that Damascus was running such a programme.—*Internet*

Badiraguato, 17 June—The Mexican Navy gave reporters a firsthand look on Tuesday at what they described as one of the largest methamphetamine labs ever found in the country, with enough ephedrine to produce more than 40 tons of the drug.

The smell of chemical solvents was overwhelming at the remote mountaintop site in the northern state of Sinaloa, where Navy personnel on patrol last week stumbled across an enormous holding tank they initially thought might be used to water a marijuana plantation.

Instead, the tank fed water to a pair of enormous sheds where sailors found 49,640 liters (13,000 gallons) of ephedrine, a chemical used to make methamphetamine.

That is enough to produce 40.2 metric tons of the drug, or about 309 million individual doses.

The members of the Navy patrol found drums, barrels and other chemicals used in the process at the site, located on a dirt road miles from the nearest town.

The young man came from a prominent family in the southern Egyptian province of Qena, one of Egypt's poorest and most conservative areas that is also home to the famed ancient Egyptian ruins of Luxor.

Parking space sells for \$300,000 in Boston

Boston real estate officials said an anonymous buyer set a city record by paying \$300,000 for a private parking space.

Listing Information Network, which tracks the real estate market in Boston, said the price tag makes the spot, located in the upscale Back Bay neighbourhood, the most expensive to be sold in the city, *The Boston Globe* reported.

Debra Sordillo, the Coldwell sales agent who handled the parking spot account, said the original asking price of \$250,000 was driven up by a bidding war that brought it to the record-breaking \$300,000 total. Sordillo said the sale is an indication of the difficulty people have parking near the city's Public Garden." There's only so many parking spaces in the city," Sordillo said. "And in this part, there's very few."

Climate change blamed for Caribbean coral deaths

Climate change has contributed to a flattening of the complex, multi-layered architecture of Caribbean coral reefs, compromising their role as a nursery for fish stocks and a buffer against tropical storms, a study shows.

The analysis of 500 surveys of 200 reefs, conducted between 1969 and

2008, showed the most complex types of reef had been virtually wiped out across the entire Caribbean.

Such reefs — typified by Table Corals of over 1 meter across and huge antler-shaped Staghorn Corals — act as a sanctuary for local fish stocks and a hunting ground for larger, commercially fished species.

Many have been replaced with the flattest types of rubble-strewn reef, which now cover about three quarters of the Caribbean's reef area, up from about a fifth in the 1970s, said the study, published in the Royal Society journal Biology Letters.

The biggest impact has occurred in the last decade, said the report by researchers from Britain's University of East Anglia and Canada's Simon Fraser University.

Polish woman wakes up in morgue

An 84-year-old woman, declared dead by a doctor in central Poland, woke up in a morgue as morticians were preparing her for a funeral, doctors said.

Police in the central Polish town of Zwolen opened an investigation, *Polish Radio* reported on Monday.

In the nearby village of Jablonowo on Friday, the husband called an ambulance when his wife fainted and the emergency service doctor declared her dead and sent her to the morgue. When morticians saw the woman was moving, they called a doctor who diagnosed she was sick but alive.

The woman was rushed to the Zwolen hospital where doctors said she was in a serious condition and placed her in an intensive care unit.

Hsenwi is surrounded

by large paddy fields apart from mountain ranges. And it has a large number of fine and beautiful buildings and houses in it, thus reflecting the higher living standard of local people.



"Our company produces steamed rubber wood and exports it to Malaysia. We sends 100 tons of rubber wood monthly. As the company buys old rubber trees at high price, the rubber growing entrepreneurs can secure the benefits,"

explained in-charge of the factory U Maung Soe of Asia Shwegabar Company.

He said, "Our company buys one old rubber trees for K 1000. We cut old rubber trees into three and a half feet long size logs and five feet long logs. After that, the rubber logs become the

sawn rubber wood at sawmill. The sawn rubber woods are to be steamed for eight-10 days."

We saw that workers turned the logs into sawn wood in different sizes, and then the rubber wood is steamed. After steaming the rubber woods for eight-10 days, the workers classify the timber and

them package systematically.

Nowadays, the steamed rubber wood is being used widely in making modern furniture across the world. As the prices of teak and other hardwood are rising in the international timber market, the customers turn to steamed rubber wood instead of hardwood.

The furniture made of steamed rubber wood is favourite among the people due to high quality and bright colour. In the international timber market, rubber wood is attracting greater attention of customers.



Ultrasonics improves surgeons' view when removing tumors from the pituitary gland

Science Daily, 17 June—Ultrasonics improves surgeons' view when they remove tumours from the pituitary gland.


Hidden in a little hollow in the skull, at about the level of the eye, we have a gland about the size of a blackcurrant. This is the hypophysis, or pituitary, the body's centre for hormone manufacture. The gland produces a wide range of hormones which in turn control other organs that manufacture yet more hormones.

Every year, some 120 Norwegian patients are

operated for tumours in the pituitary gland. Now SINTEF, NTNU and St. Olav's Hospital in Trondheim have joined forces to develop an ultrasonic instrument that give Trondheim's neurosurgeons an extra "eye" during interventions of this sort.

Promising method

"We are probably able to remove more tumour tissue than we would have been able to do otherwise, which reduces the chances of the tumour returning, and increases the likelihood of obtaining a nearly normal hormonal balance. The instrument also makes it easier to see where the tumour cells lie relative to the visual nerves and blood vessels – structures close to the pituitary that we must avoid damaging during the operation."—Internet

Dr Ruchi Gupta of Children's Memorial Hospital and Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago focused on 287 Chicago neighbourhoods where nearly 50,000 children grades K-8 were screened for asthma. Chicago has twice the national average asthma

A US study suggests radiologists, like pilots, should be required to undergo regular vision testing.

The University of Maryland School of Medicine research determined approximately 50 percent of 48 radiologists surveyed don't recall ever having their vision tested or it had been two years or longer since their last vision exam.

"Of the 48 participating radiologists, eight could not recall ever having their vision Safdar, lead author of the study, said.

Study says skin cancer drugs smooth wrinkles

Beijing, 17 June—US researchers said Monday a skin cream used to treat the early signs of skin cancer may reduce wrinkles and sun-damage patches.

The study published in the Archives of Dermatology showed that Valeant's Efudex cream, which is used to treat actinic keratosis, a precursor to skin cancer, improved the appearance of skin, smoothed rough spots and wrinkles, improved skin colour and erased brown spots.

University of Michigan researchers studied 21

healthy volunteers who had sun-damaged facial skin and actinic keratoses. The participants applied 5 percent fluorouracil cream to their faces two times a day for about a fortnight.

The researchers followed the participants for nearly six months, during which they underwent regular skin biopsies, close-up facial photographs, and dermatology checkups. Though initially their facial skin got dry, itchy, and peeled; it later recovered, with lesser wrinkles and a soft, smooth texture.—Internet



Over 300 in Philippines tested positive for A/H1N1 flu

Manila, 17 June—The Philippine health authorities on Wednesday said another 64 people were tested positive for the A/H1N1 flu in the country, bringing the Philippines' tally of confirmed cases to a staggering

In a press release, Health Secretary Francisco Duque III said, however, 93 patients had fully recovered and more were sent home from hospitals as they exhibited only mild symptoms.

"So far the country has no reported case of death or severe illness in all of the 311 documented positive cases," Duque said in the release.

Among the latest 64 infected, all but two are Filipinos, with an average age of 18, Duque said.

The health department on Monday confirmed a community-based outbreak in a northern town where more than 30 people were infected.



WEATHER

Wednesday, 17 June, 2009

Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr MST: During the past 24 hours, weather has been partly cloudy in Kayin Stat, rain or thundershowers have been isolated in Kachin, kayah States and lower Sagaing Division, scattered in Shan, Chin and Rakhine States, upper Sagaing, Mandalay and Magway Divisions, fairly widespread in Bago, Yangon and Ayeyawady Division and widespread in the remaining States and Divisions with isolated heavyfalls in Mon State, Yangon and Taninthayi Divisions. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Paung (4.72) inches, Coco Island (3.59) inches, kawthong (3.23) inches, Kyeikkhame (2.36) inches, Pyay (2.01) inches, Dawei (1.97) inches, Bago (1.65) inches and Moekok (1.62) inches.

Maximum temperature on 16-6-2009 was 90°F. Minimum temperature on 17-6-2009 was 72°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 17-6-2009 was 84%. Total sun shine hours on 16-6-2009 was (1.1) hours approx.

Rainfall on 17-6-2009 was (0.35) inch at Mingaladon, (0.35) inch at Kaba-Aye and (0.20) inch at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2009 was (29.76) inches at Mingaladon, (35.47) inches at Kaba-Aye and (40.75) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum wind speed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (4) mph from Southwest at (09:30) hours MST on 17-6-2009.

Bay inference: Monsoon is strong in the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal.

Forecast valid until evening of 18th June 2009: Rain or thundershowers will be isolated in lower Sagaing and Magway Divisions, scattered in Kachin, Shan, Kayah States and Mandalay Division, fairly widespread in Kayin State and upper Saging Division and widespred in the remaining States and Divisions with likelihood of isolated heavyfall in Rakhine, Mon States and Taninthayi Divisions. Degree of certainty is (80%).

State of the sea: Squalls with moderate to rough seas are likely at times off and along Myanmar Coast, Surface wind speed in squalls may reach (35) to (40) mph.

Outlook for subsequent two days: Likelihood of increase of rain in the Coastal areas.

Forecast for Nay Pyi Taw and neighbouring area for 18-6-2009: Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Yangon and neighbouring area for **18-6-2009:** Some rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring area for 18-6-2009: Isolated rain or thundershowers. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Steamed rubber wood with export quality used in making modern furniture

After Mon State, Taninthayi Division is growing the largest number of rubber plants across the country. As Taninthayi Division is fertile region and has favourable weather for cultivation of rubber, the local people are enjoying the fruits of rubber cultivation and production industry on a commercial scale.

In Taninthayi Division, Palaw and Palauk townships in Myeik District grow rubber plants more than other townships in the division. In Dawei District, local growers also cultivate rubber plants.

The rubber entrepreneurs can earn income by producing rubber latex collected from young rubber plants. Moreover, they can sell the steamed rubber wood extracted from old rubber trees to earn more income.

Fossil teeth of three-toed browsing horse found in panama canal earthworks

Science Daily, 17 June—Rushing to salvage fossils from the Panama Canal earthworks, Aldo Rincon, paleontology intern at the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute, unearthed a set of fossil teeth. Bruce J. MacFadden, curator of vertebrate paleontology at the Florida Museum of Natural History, University of Florida in Gainesville, describes the fossil as Anchitherium clarencei, a three-toed browsing horse, in the May 2009 issue of the Journal of Paleontology.

By far the most complete fossil of a horse collected at the site in excavations spanning the last century, characteristics such as the shape of the teeth confirm the identity of two earlier finds and indicate that this horse was primarily a forest-dwelling browser living in the area between 15 and 18 million years ago. This evidence supports MacFadden's earlier proposal that the habitat was probably a mosaic of relatively dense forest and open woodlands. The presence of this browsing horse in Panama significantly extends the southern tip of its range from previous finds from roughly the same period in Florida, Nebraska and South Dakota.—*Internet*

Same-sex behavior seen in nearly all animals, review finds

SCIENCE DAILY, 17 June—Same-sex behavior is a nearly universal phenomenon in the animal kingdom, common across species, from worms to frogs to birds, concludes a new review of existing research.

"It's clear that same-sex sexual behavior extends far beyond the well-known examples that dominate both the scientific and popular literature: for example, bonobos, dolphins, penguins and fruit flies," said Nathan Bailey, the first author of the review paper and a postdoctoral researcher in the Department of Biology at UC Riverside.

There is a caveat, however. The review also reports that same-sex behaviors are not the same across species, and that researchers may be calling qualitatively different phenomena by the same name.
