Deal on US healthcare overhaul still uncertain

WASHINGTON, 29 June — President Barack Obama's drive to overhaul the US healthcare system may be back on track thanks to Senate efforts to cut the price tag to \$1 trillion, but a bipartisan deal on the sweeping proposal still is far from certain.

Obama wants changes that rein in the escalating costs of healthcare in the

United States and bring insurance to most of the 46 million Americans who currently lack it.

He also wants a bill that the Democrats who control Congress and the Republican minority can support to give a bipartisan stamp of approval to his top legislative priority.

Senate Finance Committee Chairman Max Baucus was upbeat

last week after announcing that panel members had found ways to bring the price tag to about \$1 trillion over 10 years, down from an earlier estimate of a staggering \$1.6 trillion.

The new estimates helped move lawmakers closer to an agreement, Baucus said. But he was unable to close the deal with Republicans before senators left for a weeklong on 4 July Independence Day holiday recess.

Instead, the core group of negotiators — three Democrats and four Republicans — issued a tepid statement on Thursday merely affirming their commitment to continue negotiations.—*Internet*

Rains, flooding hit parts of Czech Republic

PRAGUE, 29 June — Heavy rains are flooding southern parts of the Czech Republic, with mudslides damaging houses and roads in the region.

Rivers have been swelling in rural areas some 60 miles (100 kilometres) south of Prague, the capital, Sunday but no casualties had been reported. Army troops and firefighters are helping to restore roads in the region and authorities in Prague on Sunday afternoon were shoring up the banks of the Vltava river which caused severe damage to the historic city in 2002.

Flash floods hit the region of northern Moravia earlier in the week, killing a total of 13 people.

Six dead in Sudan tribal clashes

KHARTOUM, 29 June — Six people were killed in weekend tribal clashes in Sudan's South Kordofan region, which borders Darfur, a lawmaker from the oil-rich area told *AFP* on Sunday.

The clashes took place between Nuba and Misseriya tribesmen, Hamid al-Samani, a member of Sudan's parliament who represents the region, said.

"Six people died in the clashes and 30 were injured," he said. The fighting took place in the Lagowa district, about 800 kilometres (500 miles) southeast of Khartoum, he said. The Nuba and Misseriya tribes have a history of conflict, usually over access to water and pasture grounds for their cattle.

South Kordofan state, which stretches between Darfur and south Sudan, is one of the most unstable parts of the country.

It has been rocked by tribal clashes, with 244 people, including policemen, killed in May in fighting between the Misseriya and the Rizeyqat tribes.

The interior ministry said at the time that policemen who moved in to contain the fighting were attacked by 3,000 horsemen from the Rizeyqat tribe.—*Internet*

Three killed in passenger train collision in central China

CHANGSHA, 29 June — Two passenger trains collided in central China on Monday morning, leaving at least three people dead and 60 injured. The accident took place at 2:34 am at Chenzhou railway station in Hunan Province, according to local railway company sources.

A train going from Changsha to Shenzhen collided with another train from Tongren to Shenzhen, causing several cars to derail, according to the sources.

Liu Zhijun, minister of railway, has gone to Chenzhou, 300 kilometres from Changsha, capital of Hunan Province, to oversee the rescue work.—*Internet*

Egypt police kill migrant at Israel border

CAIRO, 29 June — Egyptian police shot dead a migrant and wounded two others as they tried to enter Israel illegally on Sunday, a security official told *AFP*.

The official did not identify the nationality of the dead man, who was killed by a bullet to the

chest.

He was the third migrant killed by police at the border with Israel this month.

"They were told to stop and warning shots were fired," the official said.

The two wounded men, one of whom was

shot in the back, are Eritrean and Rwandan. Egyptian police killed at least 28 sub-Saharan migrants near the border last year.

The porous 250-kilometre (155-mile) frontier has become a major transit route for migrants, asylum-seekers and drug smugglers.

Israel has asked Egypt to clamp down on the traffic.

Experts optimistic Turkey can ban smoking

ISTANBUL, 29 June — Turkey will successfully adjust to a smoking ban in its restaurants and bars if it follows the same path as France, an international health expert says.

Speaking last week in Istanbul as a 19 July deadline approaches banning tobacco from public spaces, Sylviane Ratte, a tobacco control expert with the International Union against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease, said Turkey will eventually become smoke-free if, like France, leaders follow a set and certain path, *Today's Zaman* reported on Sunday.

"Turkey will be the best example for the world with its two-year journey to enact and implement the law," she said, stating that skepticism abounded in 1991 when France took its first steps to ban smoking in closed areas. But, she said, advocates overcame opposition from the tobacco industry to become smoke-free in public areas.

"The tobacco industry tried to stop the process by arguing that this was legislation against the right to smoke, turning the ban into a human rights issue. This is a habit that kills and has nothing to do with human rights," Ratte said.

"There is a great political will to impose the ban (in Turkey)," Stephen Hamill of the World Lung Foundation told the newspaper.

Surprising number of teens think they'll die young

CHICAGO, 29 June—A surprising number of teenagers — nearly 15 percent — think they're going to die young, leading many to drug use, suicide attempts and other unsafe behavior, new research suggests.

The study, based on a survey of more than 20,000 kids, challenges conventional wisdom that says teens engage in risky behavior because they think they're invulnerable to harm. Instead, a sizable

number of teens may take chances "because they feel hopeless and figure that not much is at stake," said study author Dr Iris Borowsky, a researcher at the University of Minnesota. That behaviour threatens to turn their fatalism into a self-fulfilling prophecy. Over seven years, kids who thought they would die early were seven times more likely than optimistic kids to be subsequently diagnosed

with AIDS. They also were more likely to attempt suicide and get in fights resulting in serious injuries.

Borowsky said the magnitude of kids with a negative outlook was eye-opening.

Adolescence is "a time of great opportunity and for such a large minority of youth to feel like they don't have a long life ahead of them was surprising," she said.—Internet

Australian A/H1N1 flu death toll reaches seven

CANBERRA, 29 June — Australia's tally of A/H1N1 flu-related deaths reached seven on Monday following the deaths of two Victorian men.

The two men, aged 50 and 85, had underlying medical conditions. Victoria's deputy chief health officer Rosemary Lester revealed the Department of Human Services was told of the deaths over the weekend. "The 50-year-old was being treated for a life-threatening cancer and was later diagnosed with A/H1N1 flu," Lester said, adding "he died while receiving treatment in hospital.—Internet

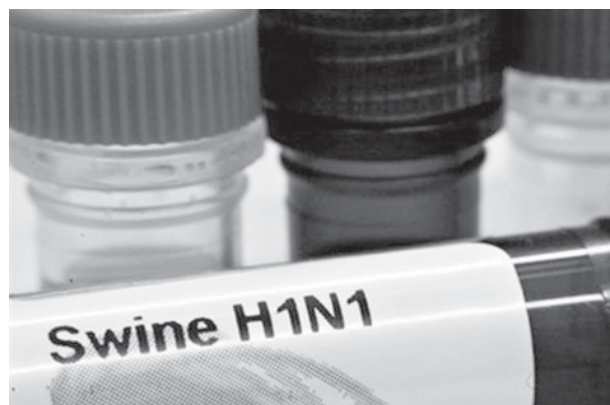
Brazil reports first swine flu death

BRASILIA, 29 June—Brazil reported its first swine flu fatality on Sunday, saying the woman died after returning to South America's most populous nation from a trip to neighbouring Argentina. Brazil's health ministry said in a statement that the victim was "an adult woman from the state of Rio Grande do Sul who had spent one week in Argentina," but it did not release the woman's identity.—Internet

Second Briton with swine flu dies

LONDON, 29 June—A second Briton has died after contracting swine flu, the Scottish government said on Sunday. The 73-year-old man died in hospital in Paisley, central Scotland, late Saturday and had "serious underlying health problems", having been in intensive care for two weeks.

Scotland's Health Secretary Nicola Sturgeon said: "Although it is concerning that the patient had swine flu, we are aware that the patient had very serious underlying health issues.—Internet

First solid-state quantum processor created

WASHINGTON, 29 June—US researchers said on Sunday they had created the first rudimentary solid-state quantum processor and used the superconducting chip to successfully run elementary algorithms.

The findings, which appeared Sunday in Nature's advanced online publication, are seen as another step toward the ultimate dream of building a quantum computer. "Our processor can perform only a few very simple quantum tasks, which have been demonstrated before with single nuclei, atoms and photons," said Professor Robert Schoelkopf of Yale University.

"But this is the first time they've been possible in an all-electronic device that looks and feels much more like a regular microprocessor," Schoelkopf said.

Unlike regular processors, which store information in the form of digital bits that each possess a value of either 0 or 1, quantum processor use qubits, or quantum bits, which can hold values of 0 and 1 at the same time.

Qubits in this "superposition" of both values may allow many more calculations to be performed simultaneously than is possible with traditional digital bits, thus allowing for greater information storage and processing power.

The Yale team made their device out of two qubits, each of which is actually made up of a billion aluminum atoms. The device processed a simple search algorithm, also known as the reverse phone book search, where someone's number is known but not the name. The processor essentially reads all the numbers in the phone book at once to find the right number.—Internet

Vodafone may bid for rival UK operator T-Mobile

BEIJING, 29 June—The world's largest mobile company, Vodafone is believed to be interested in buying up rival operator T-Mobile UK in what many believe to be an audacious move that may create huge repercussions within the mobile industry.

Vodafone has so far made no comment on the bid which may run into problems with UK regulators which oversee the mobile industry.

T-Mobile, which is owned by Deutsche Telekom and valued at between 2.5 and 3.4 billion pound (4.12 and 5.6 billion US dollars), holds only 15 percent of the UK mobile market compared to Vodafone's 25 percent.—Internet

US company expands recall of E coli contaminated beef

BEIJING, 29 June — A Colorado meat company expanded voluntarily its beef recall due to possible contamination by E coli O157:H7 bacteria, according to media reports on Monday.

The JBS-Swift Beef Co made a recall on 24 June 24 and the expanded one came after an investigation found 18 illnesses may be linked to the meat.

The expansion further included about 171,000 kg of assorted beef products, for a total recall of

about 189,450 kg now.

The affected beef was produced on 21 April and was distributed nationally and internationally.

The contamination was investigated by the Food Safety and Inspection Service of United States Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the Centers for Dis-

ease Control and Prevention.

E coli O157:H7 is a potentially deadly bacteria that can cause bloody diarrhea, dehydration, and, in severe cases, kidney failure. The very young, seniors, and persons with weak immune systems are at the most risk.—Xinhua

Iran's warship thwarts hijack of its oil tanker by pirates

TEHERAN, 29 June— Iran's navy has prevented an attempt to hijack an Iranian oil tanker by pirates in the Gulf of Aden, the official IRNA news agency reported on Sunday.

According to a report by the public relations department of Iran's Navy Force, pirates in the Gulf of Aden planned in the past days to hijack an Iranian oil tanker named "Hadi" but its warship arrived in the scene on time to rescue it, IRNA said.

In May, Iran announced that it will send two warships to Somali coast to fight pirates. Iran's ambassador to the United Nations informed UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon in a letter of Teheran's decision to send two warships to the Somali coast waters and the Gulf of Aden for at least five months to confront pirates, according to IRNA.—Xinhua

At least five killed in building collapse in Nigeria

LAGOS, 29 June—At least five people were killed and many others injured in a building collapse here on Sunday, reports from the local media said.

The three-storey building was located at Lagos's Ebutte neighbourhood and the collapse was probably triggered by the heavy rains the commercial city has experienced these days, the reports said.

Rescue workers were working on the spot and the casualties may rise, the reports said.—Xinhua

One woman dead, three wounded in West Beirut clashes

BEIRUT, 29 June — One woman was killed and three other people were wounded in West Beirut area of Aysha Bakkar on Sunday when clashes erupted between Shiite members of Speaker Nabih Berri's Amal Movement and Sunni supporters of designated Prime Minister Saad Hariri, local Elnashra website reported.

Rockets and machine-

guns were used during the clashes which were intensified Sunday afternoon due to Saturday's provocations after celebrating gunshots were fired by Hariri's supporters for his designation as prime minister, local New TV reported.

"Since yesterday, tension increased between the two sides when Hariri's supporters intimidated Berri's followers," New TV reporter said.

Overnight shooting kills four in Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES, 29 June— Four people were killed and six other people wounded in an overnight shooting that broke out at a motorcycle club's charity event in Pico Rivera of Los Angeles, authorities said on Sun-

day.

Los Angeles Sheriff's detectives launched an investigation into the homicide possibly related to a motorcycle club, according to deputies of the Sheriff's Headquarters Bureau.

Three men, two of whom were brothers, died at the scene, Deputy Byron Ward said.

Seven other people were wounded and taken to hospitals, and one of them died later, he said.

Japan's industrial output rise 5.9% in May

TOKYO, 29 June— Japan's industrial output in May rose 5.9 percent from the previous month for the third straight month of gain, but the rise is lower than expected, the government data showed on Monday.

The market's average forecast for the seasonally adjusted May output growth stood about 6.7 to 6.9 percent.

The index of output at mines and factories stood at 79.2 against the base of 100 for 2005, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry said in a preliminary report.

The index of industrial shipments gained 4.5 percent to 78.7 and that of industrial inventories was down 0.6 percent to 96.5.

Govt, bankrupt GM reach liability deal

NEW YORK, 29 June — The White House and General Motors have resolved liability issues that could have derailed the US automaker's emergence from bankruptcy, documents show.

Documents filed in bankruptcy court late last week indicated a deal has been reached in which a successor company to General Motors would remain liable for claims filed against GM products, even though it would no longer be the same company, *The New York Times* reported on Sunday.

The liability issue had threatened to stall the post-bankruptcy plans for GM after several state attorneys general raised concerns that car buyers who currently have legitimate claims against GM wouldn't be able to litigate them in state courts after the automaker emerges in a new corporate identity, the newspaper said.

"While the sacrifices being made in this process — by workers, retirees, creditors, dealers, suppliers, communities and individuals injured by

GM products — are painful, there is nothing exceptional about these bankruptcy terms," an unnamed administration official told the *Times*.

Shackled Mass girl escapes kidnapper

HANOVER, 29 June — Massachusetts police said a Hanover man was in custody Sunday on charges he allegedly kidnapped, shackled and intended to rape a 6-year-old neighbour girl.

Justin Shine, 26, was hospitalized for injuries suffered when he was arrested on Saturday on kidnapping and attempted rape charges. WCVB-TV in Boston said Shine allegedly grabbed the child while she was riding her bike in her neighbourhood and then shackled her ankles.

Chrysler says ready for plant relaunches

DETROIT, 29 June — US automaker Chrysler LLC says all is ready for the bankruptcy-salvaged company's restart of its seven assembly plants, powertrain plant and other facilities. Chrysler said late last week it is on target to reopen the plants on Monday after a shutdown that began with its 30 April bankruptcy filing, *The Detroit News* reported.

The new company that emerged after the bankruptcy is a partnership with Italian automaker Fiat.

Its biggest concern had been making sure that parts would be available

after stocks were depleted by lower volumes and an inability to secure credit to restart production lines, the newspaper said.

Chrysler, however, has not resolved all unpaid bills with suppliers, the News reported. But company spokesman Dave Elshoff asserted those issues won't jeopardize Monday's assembly plant relaunches, saying,

"When necessary, we will negotiate in good faith to resolve our business issues and assure the timely and efficient commencement of our manufacturing operations."

A number of Chrysler suppliers are in bankruptcy themselves, including Delphi Corp, Visteon Corp and Metaldyne Corp, the News said.

Oklahoma pile-up death toll hits 10

MIAMI, 29 June — A 10th victim from a multi-car pileup on the Will Rogers Turnpike in Oklahoma died on Sunday, the state highway patrol said.

The death of Shelby Hayes, 36, Frisco, Texas, left only two survivors — a 12-year-old Phoenix girl whose mother and father perished in the accident, and a 76-year-old semi-truck driver — of Friday's crash that occurred near the town of Miami, Okla.

The Oklahoman reported Hayes had been pinned in the wreckage of her family's vehicle for two hours after the semi-truck driven by Donald Creed slammed into a line of cars that had slowed at another accident scene.

Creed, who is from Willard, Mo, was listed in good condition at a hospital in Joplin, Mo. Andrea Reyes, 12, was listed in critical condition at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City, Mo. The highway patrol was continuing its investigation on Sunday.

Intact ancient tomb uncovered in Bethlehem

Workers renovating a house in the traditional town of Jesus' birth accidentally discovered an untouched ancient tomb containing clay pots, plates, beads and the bones of two humans, a Palestinian antiquities official said.

The 4,000-year-old tomb provides a glimpse of the burial customs of the area's inhabitants during the Canaanite period, said Mohammed Ghayyada, director of the Palestinian Authority's Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities.

Workers in a house near the Church of the Nativity uncovered a hole leading to the grave, which was about one metre (yard) below ground, he said. They contacted antiquities officials, who photographed the grave intact before removing its contents.

They dated the grave to the Early Bronze Age, between 1,900 BC and 2,200 BC.

Pregnant woman falls four stories in car

Police in Massachusetts said a 31-year-old pregnant woman was miraculously unharmed after accidentally backing her car off the fourth story of a parking garage.

Springfield Police Lt Rupert Daniel said the woman, who was alone in her car at the time, accidentally put her Hyundai Sonata in reverse and drove off the fourth story of the downtown garage, plunging 40 feet to the sidewalk below, WWLP-TV, Springfield, reported.

The woman was treated for minor injuries at Baystate Medical Center and released.

Firefighters called to own station blaze

Firefighters in Waipahu, Hawaii, said food left cooking while they were out on a call caused an embarrassing blaze at their own station house.

Fire Capt Terry Seelig said firefighters left food cooking when they responded to reports of a traffic crash 22 May. They received a second call on their way back from the crash to put out a fire at their own station, the Honolulu Advertiser reported. "The firefighters (at the station) are very chagrined about it," Seelig said. "It goes to show that no one is immune."

Seelig said unattended cooking is one of the top causes of fires locally.

"The fire's cause was attributed to unattended cooking," Seelig said. "We, like everybody else, need to be careful and attentive when cooking."

The fire caused about \$25,000 worth of damage to the station house, Seelig said. He said the kitchen was previously scheduled for renovation and the damage has already been repaired.

Supreme Court (Yangon) dismisses criminal revision case for refusing nomination of two defence witnesses in trial against US citizen Mr John William Yettaw, Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, Daw Khin Khin Win and Ma Win Ma Ma

YANGON, 29 June—Final statements of both sides were heard at Supreme Court (Yangon) on 24 June for Criminal Revision Case No 333 (b)/2009 filed by Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, Daw Khin Khin Win and Ma Win Ma Ma in dissatisfaction with Yangon Division Court's order of confirming Yangon North District Court's order of refusing nomination of defence witnesses U Win Tin and U Tin Oo in Yangon North District Court's Criminal Case No 47/2009 against US citizen Mr John William Yettaw, Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, Daw Khin Khin Win and Ma Win Ma Ma.

Supreme Court (Yangon) pronounced the judgment on the Criminal Revision Case at 10 am today.

In the judgment, Supreme Court (Yangon) said that the lawsuit against applicant No (1) Daw Aung San Suu Kyi was filed under Section (22) of the Law to Safeguard the State Against the Dangers of Those Desiring to Cause Subversive Acts; that the Section is to take action if a person against whom action is taken opposes, breaches or fails to abide by the restriction order (or) prohibition order; that Daw Aung San Suu Kyi just needs to argue, providing an evidence that she did not oppose or breach the restriction order (or) prohibition order in the trial filed by the initial court; that the lawyer of Daw Aung San Suu Kyi in the case said that the witnesses they nominated were important for the judgment, U Tin Oo, for instance, was nominated as he was assumed to be a witness capable of giving profound statements that action should not be taken under the Law to Safeguard the State Against the Dangers of Those Desiring to Cause Subversive Acts; that according to the provision of Section (7) of that Law, the provision is that the cabinet is authorized to pass an order, as may be necessary, restricting any fundamental right, not the provision that action is

taken in accordance with the judiciary or judicial trend; that therefore, it is to be assumed that there is no need to take into consideration the statements of the lawyer of the applicants; that the lawyer of the applicants also demanded that U Win Tin and U Tin Oo should be examined as defence witnesses regarding political character of Daw Aung San Suu Kyi; that the explanation of the provision of Section 55 of the Evidence Law says that the term "character" stipulated in Sections 52, 53, 54 and 55 comprises both reputation and disposition; that according to the explanation, there is no provision in the Evidence Law that says there is the right to nominate a witness regarding political character; that in view of the statements given by the witnesses in the case of the initial court, there is not any argument regarding character or political character of applicant Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, the accused of the initial court; that therefore the character of Daw Aung San Suu Kyi does not attract any argument in the initial case; that according to the documents of the file of the initial court, applicant Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, the accused of the initial court, was examined as the accused, not as a witness in the court; that so it can be deduced that the application for examining U Win Tin and U Tin Oo as defence witnesses for character of Daw Aung San Suu Kyi is particularly intended to disrupt and delay the case; that the district court refused to summon and examine U Win Tin and U Tin Oo as defence witnesses in accordance with the provision of Section 257 (1) of Code of Criminal Procedure; that the lawyer of the applicants publicly admitted that the judge of the district court pronounced an order according to Section 257 (1) of Code of Criminal Procedure; that Yangon Division Court reviewed that it dismissed the revision case as it is designed to delay the trial as evidenced by the

documents of the initial court, although the initial court's order does not enumerate, in accordance with Section 257 (1) of Code of Criminal Procedure, the reason of why the nomination of three defence witnesses was refused; that however, it cannot be said that the review of the division court is wrong; that the lawyer of the applicants submitted that the division court pronounced an order "it is right according to Paragraph 1115 of Manual to Courts" and it did so without any authority bestowed on it; that it is required to find out whether his statement is right or not; that with daily records, stating in brief the reason of refusing the nomination, the district court pronounced the order to refuse the nomination of defence witnesses, according to Paragraphs 1115 and 1116 of Manual to Court, and the court procedure, so it is not wrong; that it is virtually illogical to say that the division court's confirmation of the district court's daily records, referring to Paragraph 1115 of Manual to Courts, is beyond its authority; that therefore, it is assumed that the criminal revision case to summon and examine U Win Tin and U Tin Oo as defence witnesses is intended to hinder and delay the trial because they just wanted to submit a subject that does not need any argument in the case; that the district court's order to refuse to summon and examine U Win Tin and U Tin Oo as defence witnesses, and the division court's confirmation of the district court's order are in accordance with the law; and that therefore making a deduction that the Supreme Court does not need to intervene in the case with the authority to revise the orders of the district and division courts, it pronounced the order to confirm Yangon Division Court's order dated 9 June and dismiss the Criminal Revision Case.—MNA

How high carbohydrate foods can raise risk for heart problems

Tel Aviv, 29 June — Doctors have known for decades that too much carbohydrate-laden foods like white bread and corn flakes can be detrimental to cardiac health. In a landmark study, new research from Tel Aviv University now shows exactly how these high

carb foods increase the risk for heart problems.

"Looking inside" the arteries of students eating a variety of foods, Dr. Michael Shechter of Tel Aviv University's Sackler School of Medicine and the Heart Institute of Sheba Medical Center — with collaboration of the

Endocrinology Institute — visualized exactly what happens inside the body when the wrong foods for a healthy heart are eaten. He found that foods with a high glycemic index distended brachial arteries for several hours.

Elasticity of arteries anywhere in the body can be a measure of heart health. But when aggravated over time, a sudden expansion of the artery wall can cause a number of negative health effects, including reduced elasticity, which can cause heart disease or sudden death.—Internet

BRISBANE, 29 June — Scientists are studying footballing ability (known as soccer ability in the US) to gain insight into the role that skill plays in the physical performance of vertebrates.

The results show that skill is as important, if not more important, than athletic ability.

The study also suggests a scientific method that could help professional football clubs in the selection and identification of new talent.

While most fans are in awe of what their football heroes can do with

a football, the source of their remarkable skill remains strangely mysterious.

Although being in excellent physical condition undoubtedly helps, few people actually believe that intense

physical training alone can turn an average bloke into a Ronaldo. Now, scientists from the University of Queensland have decided to study what this "something else" might be.

 - throw away garbage and waste systematically
 - sterilize personal goods, ladders, lifts, walls and office furniture two to three times a day
 - watch health conditions of all persons at schools, worksites, hotels, social centres and homes
 - deal with the health care centre concerned if there is a suspicious person with influenza

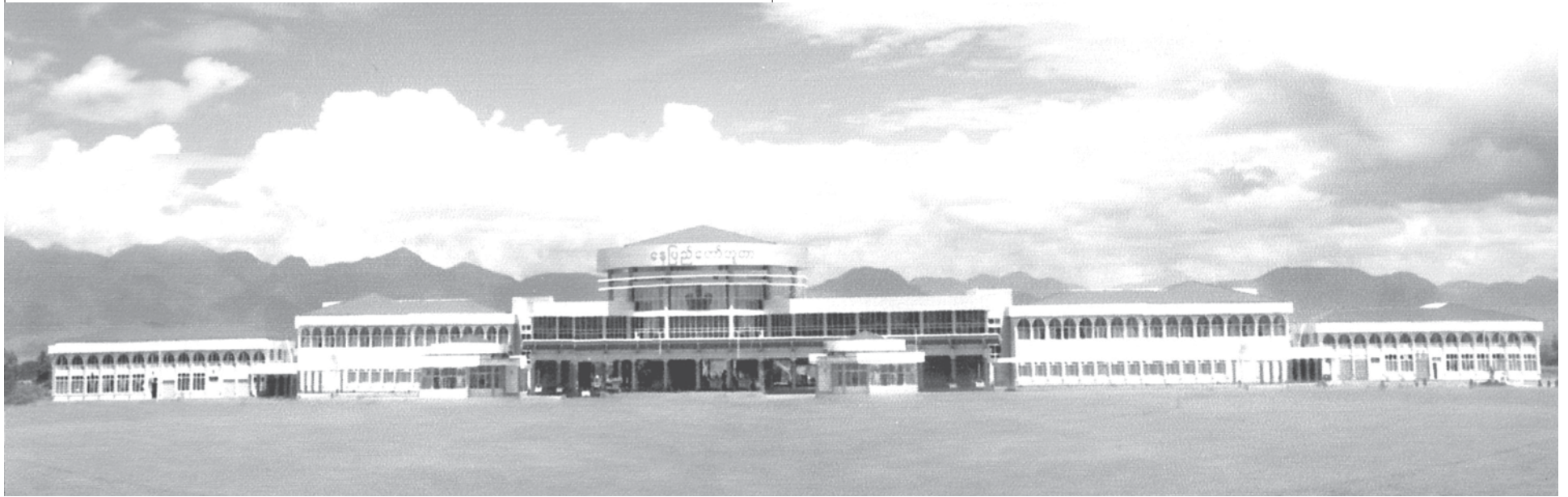

Vietnam's fish export to Russia expected to rise

HANOI, 29 June—Vietnam's Steering Committee for Tra and Basa Fish Export to Russia predicted that the country could earn about 1.3 billion US dollars from tra and basa fish export this year, the local newspaper *Vietnam Economic Times* reported on Monday.

The prediction, which exceeded the previous projection of one billion US dollars by the Vietnam Association of Seafood Exporters and Producers (VASEP), was made on the fact that Russia and several other foreign markets had increased purchases of tra and basa fish from Vietnam.

Regarding Russian market, Vietnamese fish will have more opportunities to be consumed in this huge market as Russia will stop importing fish from Chile, Canada and China from July.

The country would export 70,000 tons of tra and basa fish to Russia till the end of this year, bringing total export volume of tra and basa to Russia to 100,000 tons this year, worth about 200 million US dollars, said Duong Ngoc Minh, head of the steering committee. The steering committee was set up under Vietnam's Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD) to monitor the exports to this market.—MNA/Xinhua

Jaguar, Land Rover roll into India

MUMBAI, 29 June—Two of Britain's most luxurious and elegant auto brands, Jaguar and Land Rover, were launched here on Sunday at prices as rich as their features, although their Indian owner Tata Motors swallowed a 25-billion-rupee loss on account of them.

Tata will sell the Jaguar, which had its origins in a motorcycle sidecar company, XF and XKR series for between 6.3 million rupees and 9.2 million rupees, while Land Rover's Discovery and Range Rover would be priced between 6.3 million rupees and 8.9 million rupees. "It's quite

a memorable day in the history and heritage of Tata Motors... JLR has been well received and well established in India (in the past), but over the years this brand has been disconnected from India," Tata group chief Ratan Tata told reporters here announcing the launch.

Tata Motors, the country's largest automobile company, suffered a net loss of 2,505.25 crore rupees in 2008-09 mainly on account of JLR that it acquired in March 2008. The expensive JLR marquee suffered on account of the economic meltdown.

Michael Jackson reaches "number one" in UK album charts

LONDON, 29 June—Pop star Michael Jackson's greatest hits album "Number Ones" became Britain's top-selling album this week, after his death on Thursday spurred interest in his back catalogue, lifting five albums into the top 20.

Britain's Official Charts Company said on Sunday "Number Ones" shot up to the top spot from 121st last week, knocking electronica-infused rock group Kasabian's "West Ryder Pauper Lunatic Asylum" into second place. Jackson's albums "Thriller", "King of Pop", "Off the Wall" and "The Essential" also re-entered the top 20.

The singer fared slightly less well in the singles charts, where "Man in the Mirror" was his highest entry at number 11, though "Thriller", "Billie Jean", "Smooth Criminal", "Beat It" and "Earth Song" also entered the top 40. In total, Jackson's music accounted for more than 300,000 album and single sales in the space of just two days, Synthpop duo La Roux's single "Bulletproof" was the new entry at number one, pushing French house DJ David Guetta's anthem "When Love Takes Over", featuring vocals by Kelly Rowland down to number two.

Putin says CIS remains key priority of Russia

Moscow, 29 June—Countries of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) are pivotal political and economic priority of Russia, said Russian Prime Minister Vladimir Putin on Sunday. "Cooperation is profound. We have common transportation and energy networks and speak Russian," Putin was quoted by the *ITAR-TASS* news agency as telling leaders of political groups in Russia's State Duma, the Lower House of Parliament.

The CIS, an alliance of 11 former Soviet Republics, groups Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Azerbaijan, Armenia, Moldova, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Ukraine and Turkmenistan. Georgia withdrew from the bloc due to the South Ossetia conflict

last year. Putin also said that entering the World Trade Organization (WTO) remains on Russia's agenda, but "the customs union of Belarus and Kazakhstan has come to the forefront". Russia, Belarus and Kazakhstan agreed on June 9 to start new talks on WTO accession as a single customs union, and thus suspend individual talks.

Russia, which has been seeking WTO membership for more than 15 years, is the largest economy remaining outside the global trade watchdog. Putin also recalled the recent Yekaterinburg summits of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) and BRICs (Brazil, Russia, India and China). "We will build up cooperation in these formats," he said.—MNA/Xinhua

Kadafi urges quick steps to form AU authority

CAIRO, 29 June—Libyan leader Moammar Kadafi underlined the necessity to take quick steps for the formation of African Union (AU) authority, Libyan official news agency *Jana* reported on Sunday.

During the opening of the 15th Ordinary Session of the AU Executive Council, the Libyan leader said the formation of AU authority is a necessary step for Africa to be capable of defending its political, economic and social interests. Anti-smoking campaign targets young grooms

RIYADH, 29 June—The catchy slogan, "Kicking the habit is on you, and marriage is on us," is meant to entice young grooms to give up smoking by offering an attractive incentive.

And, indeed, hundreds have expressed interest in the first anti-smoking drive of its kind in the kingdom, with one man saying he is ready to take up smoking just to be eligible for the grand prize — an all-expenses-paid wedding.

In much of the Arab world, the groom alone bears the cost of getting married, including an expensive party, a dowry and a fully furnished house. Men often put off marriage until they've saved enough money to take a bride.

Several commentators have complained that the campaign is turning women into a commodity, but organizers have taken the criticism in stride, saying they're thrilled to get people talking about the dangers of smoking. About one quarter of Saudi Arabia's 27.6 million residents indulge.—*Internet*

Europe's oldest person dies

ROME, 29 June—The oldest person in Europe, Italian Lucia Lauria, has died at the age of 113 in the village where she was born, news agency ANSA reports. Lauria passed away in Pietrapertosa, in the southern Basilicata region of Italy, aged 113, three months and 24 days.

She returned several days ago to the village where she was born on 4 March, 1896, and died early today. Lauria is survived by two children, both aged over 80, one who used to spend part of the year with her and a second who has emigrated to the United States. She was considered the oldest living person in continental Europe. A Frenchwoman, Eugenie Blanchard, is actually several weeks older than Lauria, but lives in Guadeloupe, an overseas department of France in the Caribbean.—*Internet*

Anyone can get swimmer's ear

DALLAS, 29 June—People who swim in pools and lakes this summer should remember their refreshing swims can lead to painful ear infections, a US expert says. Dr Barbara Schultz, associate professor of otolaryngology — head and neck surgery — at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, recommends treating ears after leaving the water for the day with over-the-counter drops that cost about \$3 per bottle or with a 50-50 mix of white vinegar and rubbing alcohol.

"When water mixes with ear wax, that's a perfect growth medium for bacteria in a dark, somewhat enclosed space like the ear," Schultz says in a statement. "Swimmer's ear is painful, and the antibiotics we use to treat it are much more expensive than the preventive measures."

People with surgically implanted tubes or damaged eardrums often can swim, but they should do so with a doctor's approval, Schultz adds.

Somali 'killer' stoned to death

MOGADISHU, 29 June — Hardline Islamist militia-men in Somalia have stoned to death a man accused of raping and murdering a woman. The execution took place in front of a large crowd in the town of Wanlaweyn, about 90km (55 miles) south of the capital Mogadishu.

The man was convicted by an unofficial court set up by the al-Shabab movement. On Thursday in Mogadishu, al-Shabab - which advocates a strict form of Sharia - publicly amputated a hand and a foot from each of four men accused of theft.

"This man was accused of raping and killing an 18-year-old girl in May this year. The court found him guilty of the charges brought against him," Sheikh Mohamed Saleban, a local al-Shabab official, told AFP news agency on Sunday.—*Internet*

Paraplegic suicidal gunman shot dead in Burnside

BURNSIDE, 29 June — New Zealand police have shot dead a wheelchair-bound suicidal gunman after he fired on police, hitting an officer in the head. The 40-year-old paraplegic man fired more than 100 rounds from a shotgun and .308 "indiscriminately" down Wadhurst Place, Burnside, about 9pm last night police said.

North Canterbury District Commander, Inspector David Lawry, said the man suffered from a head injury and was understood to have been drinking. He said the man had contacted his family earlier in the day saying he was suicidal.

When contacted by a negotiating team, the man threatened police, Mr Lawry said. Up to 40 residents were evacuated to the nearby Burnside High School. One neighbour hit by shotgun fire was taken to Christchurch hospital.—*Internet*

Old Summer Palace to kick off Lotus Festival

BEIJING, 29 June—Lotuses are in full bloom again at the Old Summer Palace. They fill the ponds. They line the paths: bright pink and yellow blossoms amidst a sea of round green leaves.

Yuanming Yuan, or Garden of Eternal Brightness, is set to kick off its 14th annual Lotus Festival on Wednesday. The garden has the largest area covered by lotuses and the most lotus breeds in Beijing. But this year's festival will feature more than just lotuses.

Eighty-eight red stars fill the square lawn outside the South Gate. Designed by land artist Di Naizhuang, the decoration celebrates the 88th anniversary of the Communist Party's

founding, which coincides with the start of the festival. The decoration also is a gift for the 60th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China.

"We've always wanted to have a special design for this year's Lotus Festival, and the current

"I had seen calligraphy in exhibitions and I always wondered how they could get those wide strokes with such a small brush," Cavanagh says. "When I was asked to have a look at Chen's

Study says one in ten kids bullied online

TUCSON, 29 June—Nearly 10 percent of children are bullied by electronic means such as text messages, with girls more likely to be victims, US researchers said.

The study published in the *Journal of Adolescent Health*, found bullying remains much more common in person, with large numbers of kids continuing to harass one another by spreading

rumors, turning fellow students into outcasts and intimidating others through words and violence. Thirteen percent of students said others physically bullied them — hit, kicked, pushed or shoved them or locked them indoors.

Stephen Russell, director of the Frances McClelland Institute for Children, Youth & Families at the

University of Arizona, said there was a bright spot in the study — the findings suggest parents have the power to prevent kids from bullying or being bullied.

"Parental warmth and support may improve your own psychological development, meaning you're less likely to feel a need to degrade others to improve your own self-esteem," study co-author Ronald Iannotti, a researcher with the National Institutes of Health, said in a statement.

Bomb blast hits Philippines market

MANILA, 29 June—At least one person has been killed in a bomb blast at a market in the southern Philippines.

Fifteen people were wounded when the blast ripped through the market in Datu Saudi Ampatuan

township in Maguindanao Province early on Monday. According to witnesses, the dead man was the suspected bomber who was seen placing an explosive device inside a rubbish bin near a coffee shop.

"Military bomb experts told me that two bombs simultaneously exploded and they are still looking for the third explosive," Eduardo Vasquez, a local priest who witnessed the attack, told AFP news agency.

There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the attack, although military officials said they suspected a faction of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front, a separatist group fighting government forces in the area, may have been behind the attack.—Internet



26 new A/H1N1 cases confirmed in Europe

STOCKHOLM, 29 June—A European health agency said Sunday that 26 new A/H1N1 flu cases were reported in European countries within the last 24 hours.

Of the new cases, 16 were confirmed in Switzerland, four in Ireland, two in Portugal, one respectively in Belgium, Poland, Romania and Denmark, the European Center for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) said in its daily situation report.

The total number of confirmed cases of the H1N1 flu virus in the European Union (EU) and European Free Trade Association

(EFTA) countries rose to 6,118, with 541 cases in Spain and 4,250 in Britain, 191 in France and 366 in Germany, the ECDC said.

The ECDC publishes a daily situation report about the H1N1 flu cases in the EU and EFTA countries based on official information from these countries.

Number of Canada's A/H1N1 flu deaths reach 25

OTTAWA, 29 June—Twenty-five people have died of A/H1N1 flu in Canada, health officials said on Sunday.

The western province of Saskatchewan has recorded its first death, provincial Health Ministry officials said on Sunday. The victim was a woman in her 40s with underlying health conditions.

Another death was reported in Quebec on Friday, bringing the total in the province to 12.—Internet

New Caledonia reports first case of influenza A/H1N1

WELLINGTON, 29 June—Two men have tested positive for influenza A/H1N1 in New Caledonia, the first cases in the French Pacific Ocean territory, the *Pacnews* reported on Monday.

The health officials said the two, who are aged in their 20s, have both spent time in Australia. The men have been placed in quarantine in the capital Noumea and have been prescribed the anti-viral drug Tamiflu.—Internet

Australian scientists kill cancer cells with "trojan horse"

SYDNEY, 29 June—Australian scientists have developed a "trojan horse" therapy to combat cancer, using a bacterially-derived nano cell to penetrate and disarm the cancer cell before a second nano cell kills it with chemotherapy drugs.

The "trojan horse" therapy has the potential to directly target cancer cells with chemotherapy, rather than the current treatment that sees chemotherapy drugs injected into a cancer

patient and attacking both cancer and healthy cells.

Sydney scientists Dr Jennifer MacDiarmid and Dr Himanshu Brahmbhatt, who formed EnGeneIC Pty Ltd in 2001, said they had achieved 100 percent survival in mice with human cancer cells by using the "trojan horse" therapy in the past two years.

The scientists plan to start human clinical trials in the coming months.

Brazil rallies to beat US in Confed Cup final

JOHANNESBURG, 29 June — Next year's World Cup just got a little more interesting.

Forget that the final score of the Confederations Cup final on Sunday was Brazil 3, the United States 2.

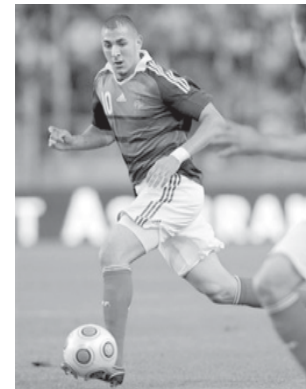

Iran detained eight local employees of British Embassy

Iran has condemned the interference in the country’s internal affairs by some Western countries, particularly the United States, Britain, France and Germany.

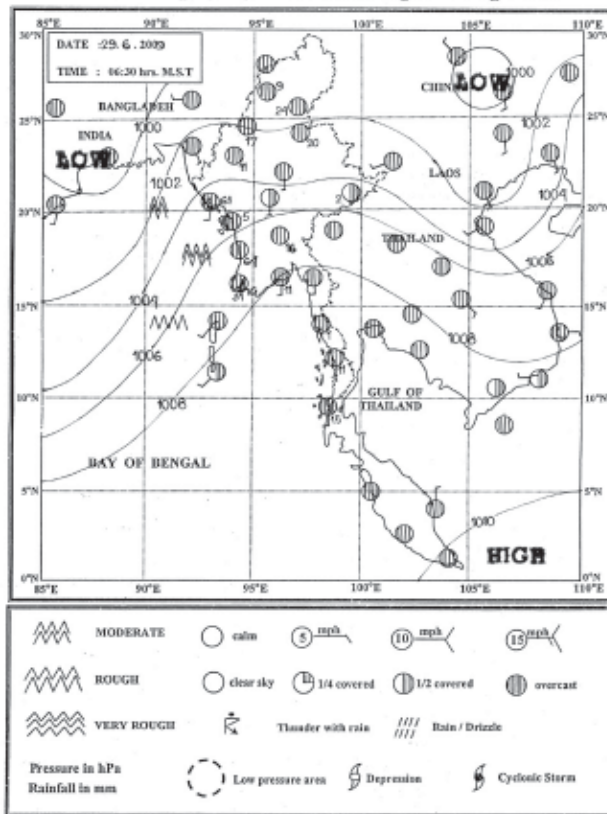

Summary of observations recorded at 09:30 hr MST: During the past 24 hours, weather has been partly cloudy in Kayah State, rain or thundershowers have been isolated in Chin State, lower Sagaing and Magway Divisions, scattered in Shan State and Mandalay Division, fairly widespread in Yangon Division and widespread in the remaining areas with isolated heavyfall in Kayin State. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Nay Pyi Taw (Thapayaykone) (0.87) inch, Nay Pyi Taw (Yesin) (0.47) inch, Thandwe (2.87) inches, Moekok (2.84) inches, Sittwe (2.56) inches, Hinthada (2.52) inches, Shwegyin and Theinzayat (1.77) inches each and Bago and Kyaikkhame (1.73) inches each.

Maximum temperature on 28-6-2009 was 86°F. Minimum temperature on 29-6-2009 was 70°F. Relative humidity at (09:30) hours MST on 29-6-2009 was 100%. Total sun shine hour on 28-6-2009 was (1.9) hours approx.

Rainfall on 29-6-2009 was (0.47) inch at Mingaladon, (0.43) inch at Kaba-Aye and (0.16) inch at Central Yangon. Total rainfall since 1-1-2009 was (36.26) inches at Mingaladon, (41.69) inches at Kaba-Aye and (46.10) inches at Central Yangon. Maximum wind speed at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) was (4) mph from Southwest at (18:35) hours MST on 28-6-2009.

Bay inference: Monsoon is moderate in the Andaman Sea and Bay of Bengal.

Forecast valid until evening of 29th June 2009: Rain will be widespread in Kachin, Rakhine, Mon States and Taninthayi Division, fairly widespread in Shan and Kayin States, upper Sagaing, Bago, Ayeyawady and Yangon Divisions and isolated to scattered in the remaining areas. Degree of certainty is (80%).

State of the sea: Seas will be moderate in Myanmar waters.

Outlook for subsequent two days: Moderate monsoon.

Forecast for Nay Pyi Taw and neighbouring area for 30-6-2009: Isolated rain. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Yangon and neighbouring area for 30-6-2009: One or two rain. Degree of certainty is (80%).

Forecast for Mandalay and neighbouring area for 30-6-2009: Likelihood of isolated rain. Degree of certainty is (60%).

NAY PYI TAW, 29 June — Hti-se-kha Bridge in Loikaw Township, Kayah State, was inaugurated today. Chairman of Shan State Peace and Development Council Commander of Eastern Command Maj-Gen Yar Pyae, Chairman of Kayah State Peace and Development Council Brig-Gen Win Myint and the manag-

ing director of the Public Works formally opened the bridge. The newly opened bridge is located on Thabat Creek near Hti-se-kha Village in Loikaw Township. The 241-foot-long and 24-foot-wide bridge is flanked by 3-foot-wide walk ways. The bridge can withstand

60 tons of load and the clearance of the bridge is 40 ft wide and 6 ft high.

The bridge is the 227th one among the 180-foot-long and above constructed by Public Works of the Ministry of Construction.

Hti-se-kha Bridge is the first of its kind in Kayah State. Thanks to the opening of the bridge, the region will enjoy smooth transportation and fruits of development in the education, health, economic and transportation sectors.

Railway schedules of Pyinmana Station to be shifted to Nay Pyi Taw Station

NAY PYI TAW, 29 June—Myanma Railways has extended railway schedules based on Nay Pyi Taw by building Nay Pyi Taw Railway Station. They are four Yangon up/down trains, two up/down Mandalay trains, two up/

down Myingyan trains, two up/down Mawlamyine trains, two up/down Mandalay trains, two up/down Bagan trains, two Pyay up/down trains, two up/down Shwe Nyaung trains, two up/down Loikaw trains and two

Chauk up/down trains totaling 20 railway routes. As there are difficulties and limitations in the yard of Pyinmana Station where regular railway schedules—eight Yangon-Mandalay up/down expresses, two up/down mail trains and two

local up/down trains – are running, all trains except mail trains and local trains will stop at Nay Pyi Taw Railway Station without stopping at Pyinmana Station starting from 5-7-2009 (Sunday), announced Myanma Railways.

For the convenience of railway passengers, Tawwin buslines and other car lines will be launched.

The departure time of No 32 down (Nay Pyi Taw-Yangon) train, No 8 down (Nay Pyi Taw-Yangon), No 16 down/15 up (Nay Pyi Taw-Mawlamyine), No 109 Up (Nay Pyi Taw-Pyay), No 107 Up (Nay Pyi Taw-Bagan), and 101 Up (Nay Pyi Taw-Chauk) from Nay Pyi Taw has changed slightly and their new schedules have been announced at respective stations. There is no change in arrival and departure schedules of all trains except No 32 down. (See page 10)
