Anger mounts as US troops kill four Afghans on bus

KANDAHAR, 13 April—Afghans burned tires and chanted “Death to America” after US troops fired on a civilian bus near Kandahar, killing four people and wounding more than a dozen. Afghanistan’s president accused NATO of violating its commitment to safeguard civilian lives. The attack Monday enraged Afghan officials and the public in Kandahar, the Taliban’s birthplace, and dealt a fresh blow to US and NATO efforts to win popular support for a coming offensive to drive the insurgents from the biggest city in the south. NATO expressed regret for the loss of civilian lives and said it was investigating.

Nearly 200 Afghans blocked highway where the shooting occurred, burning tires, firing weapons and chanting “Death to America” and other slogans. They also called for the ouster of Afghan President Hamid Karzai, a Kandahar native who has been appealing for the people here to support the US-led campaign against the Taliban.

“The Americans are constantly killing our civilians and the government is not demanding an explanation,” protester Mohammad Razaq said. “We demand justice from the Karzai government and the punishment of those soldiers responsible.”—*Internet*

Baghdad bombing kills 3, TV reporter wounded

BAGHDAD, 13 April—A bomb planted inside a Baghdad liquor store Tuesday killed three people and wounded seven, police and hospital officials said.

Separately, an Iraqi TV reporter was in critical condition after a bomb stuck to the underside of his car exploded.

The noontime liquor store bombing in an eastern Baghdad neigh-

borhood took place after people posing as customers left behind a black plastic bag filled with explosives in the shop, an Iraqi police official said. The Christian owner of the store was among those killed, the police official said.

The blast also damaged nearby stores. Broken bottles of alcohol and ripped beer cans could be seen scattered

outside. A doctor at the nearby al-Kindi hospital, where the victims were taken, confirmed the casualties.

At least 141 journalists and another 43 media support staffers have been killed in Iraq since 2003, according to the U.S.-based Committee to Protect Journalists.

Roadside bomb blasts kill 6 Afghan security forces

KABUL, 13 April—Roadside bombs killed four policemen and two Afghan soldiers, and three women died when mortars fired by suspected insurgents hit their homes in an increasingly volatile area just north of the capital Kabul, officials said on Tuesday.

Two other policemen were wounded and their vehicle was destroyed in the roadside blast Monday in northern Faryab province's Ghormach district, the Interior Ministry said. The Afghan Defense Ministry said two other soldiers were wounded when their vehicle hit a bomb Monday near Qalat city in Zabul province of southeastern Afghanistan.—*Internet*

Three killed in Navy plane crash in US

WASHINGTON, 13 April— Three crew members were killed in a Navy plane crash in northern Georgia of the United States on Monday, a Navy official said. There is no injuries on the ground, Naval Air Station

Pensacola spokesman Harry White said. The plane, which belonged to the Training Air Wing 6, crashed when it was conducting routine missions in the region. An investigation is underway, said White.—*Internet*

Sarkozy: France will not give up nuclear weapons

WASHINGTON, 13 April—French President Nicolas Sarkozy said Monday that France will not give up its nuclear weapons because doing so would put jeopardize the country’s “security and safety.”

“A virtual world where there would be no nuclear weapons... every one would applaud that, but I cannot jeopardize the security and safety of my country,” Sarkozy said in an interview with CBS News on the sidelines of a nuclear security summit in the US capital. The transcript of the interview was made available on the broadcaster’s

website.

“I have inherited the legacy of the efforts made by my predecessors to build up arms as a nuclear power,” he said. “And I could not give up nuclear weapons, insofar as I wasn’t sure that the world is a stable and safe place.” “It’s a dream, an awesome dream that can turn into reality,” he said. “But I will not give up that nuclear weapon because it underpins my country’s security. I will not do so on a unilateral basis, in a world as dangerous as the one in which we live in today,” Sarkozy said.

Chinese Naval fleet makes port call in Manila

MANILA, 13 April— At the invitation of the Philippine Navy, the naval Task Force 525 of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) arrived here Tuesday morning, kicking off a five-day visit to the Philippines.

The Chinese Naval

fleet consists of missile frigate Ma'anshan (flagship), missile frigate Wenzhou and comprehensive supply ship Qiandaohu. It came here after completing its escort mission in the Gulf of Aden.

As the fourth escort convoy dispatched by the

Chinese Navy, Task Force 525 escorted more than 600 Chinese and foreign merchant vessels, including six Philippine vessels, as well as vessels of some international organizations such as the World Food Program during its 128-day mission.

35 militants killed in Pakistan's tribal area

ISLAMABAD, 13 April — At least 35 militants were killed in clashes which followed a major attack by the security forces in northwest Pakistan's Orakzai tribal agency on Monday, army sources said.

Two Pakistani security personnel were also killed and another seven troops were injured in the ongoing operation at Shereen

Darra area of Lower Orakzai Agency, local officials said.

Officials claimed on Sunday that several bunkers in Orakzai built by militants had been destroyed on Saturday night.

They said the forces had set up their main base camp in Shereen Darra which was vital for the security of Kalaya, a main town in Orakzai.

Militants launched

rocket and mortar attacks in Shereen Darra.

Sources said that security forces used helicopters and heavy artillery in the operation and destroyed many of the militants' hideouts.

The army said troops have secured important heights in the area and have also seized arms and ammunition. It said troops have taken control of most areas of the agency and were advancing towards Upper Orakzai Agency.

Security forces backed by helicopter gunships killed over 300 Taliban militants so far in Orakzai since late March when the army launched a fresh offensive in the agency to flush out Taliban.

Six killed in southern Kyrgyz mudslide

BISHKEK, 13 April— Six people died in a mudslide in southern Kyrgyzstan, said the emergencies press ser-

vice on Monday.

A car was buried by the mudslide occurred in the southern region of Batken, said a press

release, killing all six passengers including two children. The driver was rescued and has been hospitalized.

Indonesian passenger plane plunges into river, causing injuries

JAKARTA, 13 April— A passenger plane operated by Merpati Airline skidded off runway while landing in heavy rains and plunged into a river near the airport in Manokwari of Papua on Tuesday, injuring some 20 people, police said.

The head of the plane sunk in the river and its body was broken into two parts, Papua police

spokesman Agus Rianto told Xinhua by phone.

The plane moved up to over 700 meters from the runway, he said.

"Several people were wounded and rushed to nearby hospitals," said Rianto.

The accident took place at 10:50 local time (0150 GMT), the spokesman said.

At least seven killed, over 80 injured in train accident in Italy

ROME, 13 April — A small regional train derailed on Monday morning in Italy's northern Alto Adige mountainous region causing at least 7 death while more than 80 people were injured, many in serious conditions.

According to the rescue operators and local authorities, the toll is likely to rise during the day.

The accident, which occurred after 9.00 a.m. local time near the town of Merano, was apparently caused by a

landslide hitting the railway.

According to some witnesses, mud and

debris collapsed on the train, which is now halfly covered by the fallen rocks while the remaining part is suspended upon a river. These wagons are thus in a very critical situation and relief efforts are hindered there.

The roads connecting to the area have been closed to facilitate the rescue operations. More than 200 rescuers are at work, transporting the people injured to the nearest hospitals.

Two Marines killed in S Philippine clash

MANILA, 13 April — Two Philippine Marines were killed in a running gunbattle between government forces and suspected members of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front in Isabela City, Basilan in south Philippines Tuesday morning, local media reported.

Tony Mendoza, Basilan police director, said a Hyundai van exploded near the grandstand in Isabela City at 10:30 a.m. followed by gunfire from an undetermined number of MILF fighters, abs-cbn

reported on its website.

Jamju Rivera, a candidate for councilor in Isabela City, described the situation as a "running gunbattle" between the military and suspected members of the MILF who posed as policemen.

Two Marines were killed and another was wounded in the firefight.

Mendoza said more explosions have rocked the Isabela City plaza, causing many residents to flee. The city proper has been closed due to the ongoing firefight.

Security guards to monitor buses during 2010 Expo

BEIJING, 13 April — During the World Expo from May 1 to Oct. 31, security inspectors will be stationed on all buses for the 42 Expo routes and at thousands of bus stops in a bid to ensure a safe Expo, according to local police.

Inspectors will be sent aboard every bus on all the Expo routes for security checks, Cheng Jiulong, deputy director and spokesman of the

Shanghai municipal public security bureau, was quoted as saying by Tuesday's China Daily.

Security guards will also be deployed at the 2,188 bus stops and 60 junction stations in the city to check luggage and bags, Cheng said.

Escape windows will be installed on buses on Expo routes and in key areas in case any accidents take place.

Each bus operating

on the inner-ring roads will be equipped with closed-circuit video to monitor any irregularities.

Shanghai has the world's most extensive bus system with nearly 1,000 bus lines. The buses have operated well in the past few years, with just a few accidents, terrorist attacks or passenger-induced accidents have been reported.

New Zealand wins victory over Australia in apple case 90 years ago

WELLINGTON, 13 April—New Zealand has won a long-running case it took to the World Trade Organization against Australia over access for its apples 90 years ago, New Zealand media reported on Monday.

However, the New Zealand government and apple growers said they cannot officially comment on the interim report.

The World Trade Organisation disputes panel has rejected Australia's defence that New Zealand apple

imports would risk the introduction of the bacterial disease fireblight, Radio New Zealand said.

The trade dispute has been running since the 1920s when New Zealand apples were first banned from Australia due to the discovery of fireblight in the country in 1919.

Singapore to provide more fund for SMEs productivity-related courses

SINGAPORE, 13 April —Singapore's small and medium enterprises (SMEs) will get more money to send their staff for productivity training, the country's Manpower Ministry said on Monday. According to local TV broadcaster Channel NewsAsia, the ministry has plans to develop targeted programs to help SMEs which hire nearly six out of 10 workers here.

Manpower Minister Gan Kim Yong said that the Workforce Development Agency (WDA), agency to develop the workforce, will work with SPRING, agency to promote productivity to develop the training which includes customized workshops and diagnostic tools to help SMEs implement productivity measures.

Gan also said that the Workforce Skills Qualification system will now be recognized as a national credential. This means that it will be included in the Singapore Standard Educational Classification which is a national standard for qualifications.—Internet

BEIJING, 13 April — Tianjin: A key player in the Bohai Bay economic zone, a manufacturing and shipping center in North China, with per capita GDP exceeding 62,000 yuan (\$9,082) in 2009.

Qingdao: A shipping center and seaside resort city, with per capita GDP exceeding 65,000 yuan in 2008.

Hangzhou: A key player in the Yangtze

River Delta, strong in education and financial resources, with per capita GDP of 60,000 yuan in 2009.

Suzhou: Strong in foreign direct investment (FDI) and trade-oriented manufacturing, with per capita GDP of more than 77,000 yuan in 2009, higher than Shanghai.

Hyundai Merchant signs 315 mln USD deal with China's Hebei Steel Group

SEOUL, 13 April —Hyundai Merchant Marine Co., South Korea's second largest shipper, in partnership with a Chinese local firm, announced Tuesday that it has signed a deal worth 315 million U.S. dollars with China's Hebei Steel Group to transport iron ore for the next 15 years.

The deal calls for Hyundai Merchant and China's ShangDong Far East Marine Group to deliver a total of 23 million tons of iron ore, including 1.5 million tons annually from Brazil and Australia, to China by 2025 for the Hebei Steel

Group, the world's second largest steelmaker, the company said in a statement. It added the deal could bring in 21 million US dollars in annual sales, which add up to a total of 315 million US dollars over the next 15 years for the South Korean company.

"China has the largest steel market in the world, and we will continue to expand our market presence there," Hyundai Merchant said in a statement. Hyundai Merchant and ShangDong Far East have signed a strategic partnership earlier this year.—Xinhua

Australia's growers upset with release ban on apple imports

CANBERRA, 13 April — Australian apple growers on Monday were angered by a report saying the World Trade Organization (WTO) will overturn Australia's 90-year ban on New Zealand apple imports.

Apple and Pear Australia Limited general manager Tony Russell told Australian Associated Press on Tuesday there were still persuasive arguments about the pest and disease risk posed by New Zealand apples.

"Rather than erring on the side of conservatism they have decided to take a more pro-trade stance and I think that's a rather dangerous precedent," Russell said.

"This would be a slap in the face to Biosecurity Australia in terms of their ability to conduct impact risk assessments."

In a statement, the government confirmed the interim report of the WTO panel had been issued to both Australia and New Zealand. "The interim report is released in strict confidence to the parties involved," the statement said.

The news was sweet for New Zealand apple growers. Pipfruit New Zealand chief Peter Beavan told Australian Broadcasting Corporation Radio they would treat Australia like a local market.

New lending slows on gov't curbs

BEIJING, 13 April — Bank lending slowed in March as the government took further steps to rein in credit, amid rising inflation and asset bubble risks.

Chinese banks advanced 510.7 billion yuan (75 billion US dollars) in new loans in March, down from the 700.1 billion yuan in February, the People's Bank of China, the nation's central bank, said on Monday.

That puts the total new loans for the first quarter at 2.6 trillion yuan, higher than the government targeted 2.25 trillion yuan, or some 30 percent of the planned 7.5 trillion yuan for the whole year.

"It is quite normal for the level of new loans in the first three months to exceed the planned target, as Chinese banks tend to lend more at the beginning of the year," E Yongjian, senior analyst at the research department of Bank of Communications, said.—Xinhua

Firecrackers accident destroys exhibition hall in central China county

ZHENGZHOU, 13 April — A hall for display of firecrackers in central China's Henan Province was ripped through Monday after the firecrackers being demonstrated exploded all of a sudden, local work safety authorities said.

The blast occurred at about 1:40 pm at the 30-sq-m hall in Mahuiying Village of Pingdeng Township, Yichuan County. The hall sat right next to a storehouse of fireworks and firecrackers, said a spokesman for the Yichuan County Work Safety Bureau. No casualties were reported.

No further details of damage in the accident were available.

The police was investigating the cause of the blast.

German supplier takes steaks from diners' plates

A German meat supplier has found a novel solution to unpaid bills: repossessing the steaks right off diners' plates.

Police in Aachen said Thursday that a dispute over money ended with the man grabbing his wares off the plates of some 20 bemused guests at a restaurant in the western city.

A furious argument erupted in the kitchen after the man made his daily delivery Wednesday evening but was told the restaurant didn't immediately have the euro400 (\$535) in cash to pay his bill.

The vendor then took back the meat he'd delivered - including steaks already being cooked or marinated. That still didn't cover the bill, so he continued collecting meat in the dining room.

Police arrived at the scene after he left but said they believed no offense was committed.

Traditional Rakhine Thingyan Festival

(Laywady Kyaw)

All Rakhine people who are mostly pure Buddhists, hold many festivals on auspicious days such as Thadingyut, Tazaung-daing and Thingyan. They hold Traditional Rakhine Thingyan Festival by three stages, which are incense grinding, offering of water to Buddha Images and holding the water festival.

Incense-grinding is the first stage. Rakhine girls in the village make incense-grinding on Thingyan eve for offering of water to Buddha Images. They are soon joined by the village boys, and together these boys and girls grind incense happily with to the accompaniment of music and dance. In Rakhine State, we call it "Incensegrinding Pwe".

The second stage is offering of water to Buddha Images. Rakhine people usually hold offering of water to Buddha Images at pre-Thingyan day. Some young girls carry incense-grinding pots on each head and some bring alm-rice bowls with things to offer and go to the monastery on that day. The young boys also accompany them and go to the monastery together, reciting and singing Thingyan rhymes and songs with music and dance.

When they arrive at the monastery compound, the girls fill the pots with water from the nearby ponds and wells, the boys wash the Buddha Images, stupas and the monastery with water and offer incense paste to Buddha images. On their return, they go around the village and do manicuring, hair-washing, cleaning and bathing the elderly people.

In the Traditional Rakhine Water Festival as the third stage, Rakhine girls sit at the pandal and wait for the boys who go round the town and come to participate in water festival from one pandal to another.

In the village or quarters, there are Pandals which depend upon the Rakhine young girls who participate as pandal members. There are usually twenty to fifty Rakhine young girls in a pandal. There is a big boat filled with water in the pandal. The girls sit facing the boat with their back to the pandal and wait for the boys who will come to one pandal to another and participate in the water festival. The boys can choose the girls, they like, as their mates and chat teasingly but politely.

When the boys invite the girls to join them for water festival, they pour water on the girls' backs and ask for more water saying "Please give me some more water, Sister". As soon as the girls realize that it is time to participate in the water festival, they all get up and fill the boys' buckets with water. Then they join in the water festival, pouring water facing each other, speaking politely and happily.

In the Traditional Rakhine Water Festival, the boys go around the town in groups by bullock-carts or by cars. Every group brings musical instruments together with them and go round the pandals by singing and reciting Thingyan Songs and Rhymes. Thingyan revellers will praise the good, but satire the bad. This is their habitual practice.

There are rules and disciplines in the Traditional Rakhine Thingyan Festival. Rakhine people obey and practice these rules and disciplines. I would like to mention them;

- The Thingyan Pandal-girls have to sit facing the boat with their backs to the pandal, and waiting for the boys who will come to do merry making at one pandal to another.
- The Thingyan Pandal-girls have to enjoy the water festival with the boys if they would like it or not.
- Every Thingyan group has to bring buckets and water-bowls together with them, they are not to borrow them in the pandal.
- Every Thingyan group has to wait for its turn while the other group is enjoying the water festival in the pandal.
- The Thingyan groups are not allowed to bring weapons of any sorts with them, and they also have to obey with the pandal-discipline.

As mentioned above it is disciplined and polite Traditional Rakhine Thingyan Festival where we all can enjoy and usher it in the good news.

Therefore this is a festival to build a cultural bridge among all nationalities of the Union of Myanmar.

She wasn't injured because she used her hands to douse her hair, which she had coated with a liberal layer of hairspray.—Internet

Exploding breast implant alert issued by British officials

LONDON, 13 April—UK officials issued an alert to plastic surgeons upon realising some breast implants manufactured in a France and sold worldwide are twice as likely to explode as standard implants, London's Daily Express newspaper reports.

The implants, which could rupture and cause gangrene or toxic shock, were made with an unapproved silicone gel and could affect 45,000 women worldwide who boast the breasts made in the now-closed French factory.

The French government banned the sale of the implants made by Poly Implant Prothese, but 90 per cent of them have already been shipped to surgeons abroad. Medical professionals urged women who may have the implants, which UK surgeons began using in 2001, to remain calm but to contact their physicians to have them removed.—Internet

China's busy port traffic points to strong economic recovery

BEIJING, 13 April—The third and fourth quarters are normally peak seasons for Chinese ports. This year, though, the busy season started in the first quarter, suggesting the nation's robust economic recovery is continuing.

"We have been quite busy in the last two or three months," said Guan Hui, who is in charge of unloading at Qiangang Company, a unit of Qingdao Port Corporation, as he supervised the discharge of 240,000 tonnes of iron ores from a bulk carrier while, just offshore, another three iron ore-laden ships waited for

their turn to unload.

The scene at the ports this year is different from last year when China's foreign trade slumped as the global economic recession dragged the country's economic growth down to a decade low of 6.1 percent.

In the first quarter this year, Qingdao Port, China's biggest port for crude oil and iron ores, recorded year-on-year 8.1 percent growth in

throughput in the first quarter with 84.79 million tonnes. Container throughput was up 8.9 percent to 2.72 million twenty-foot equivalent units. That growth brought delight to Qingdao Qianwan Container Terminal, whose three docks are for foreign trade by container—but the brisk business conditions have brought their own challenges.

New techniques trace ancient Antarctic break-up

ADELAIDE, 13 April—An Adelaide University geologist has outlined discoveries made by a team in the Antarctic about the break-up of the Gondwana continent 500 million years ago. Dr Kate Selway has returned from a three-month

study in the north-west Antarctic.

Scientists used three-dimensional imaging to look for evidence of how a former continent broke apart to form Australia, India and what remains of the Antarctic. Dr Selway says it has been a big task to piece together the latest geological evidence.

"We were looking for a specific zone where the geology suggested a big collision to form Gondwana and what we've seen is a large conductive region extending down about 30 kilometres into the earth that seems to be this collision zone," she explained. Dr Selway says the team used electromagnetic surveys to map evidence of the underground collision.—Internet

Top trainer robbed of £100,000 by gunmen

LONDON, 13 April—One of Britain's leading horse trainers and his wife were robbed of more than £100,000 (+113,000) in cash after masked raiders smashed their way into their remote luxury farmhouse and ordered them to empty the safe. Howard Johnson said he feared the two robbers, whom he described as calm and professional, would have killed them both had he not been able to hand over the money, which he was saving to buy his wife her "dream" holiday cottage.

With more than 60 winners to his name this season and prize money totalling £220,000 (+250,000), Mr Johnson had just returned from one of the busiest racing weekends of the year at Aintree—where one of his horses, Royal Rosa, had been running in Saturday's British Grand National. Speaking yesterday, he said he was accustomed to "hoarding" large amounts of cash at his house, a habit he developed when he was a heavy gambler.—Internet



Australian study finds new cause of heart disease in young women

CANBERRA, 13 April—An Australian study has identified a previously unsuspected cause of heart disease in women, the hormonal disorder polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), Australian Associated Press reported on Tuesday.

"The degree of blood clotting and blood vessel abnormalities seen in women with PCOS in this study was very striking," said Alicia Chan, a cardiologist at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital and PhD student with the University of Adelaide's Robinson Institute.

"... similar to what we would normally see in older patients with known heart disease. With women now making up almost half of all Australians affected by heart disease, it's very important that we understand the link between PCOS and these heart disease risk factors."

PCOS was seen in women of all body shapes, exploding a myth that it affected overweight women only, and the newly discovered PCOS-related heart problems occurred regardless of a woman's weight.

"It affected women of all body shapes and sizes including lean women," Chan said. "This is the first study to suggest that PCOS is strongly associated with an increased risk of heart disease independent of women's weight or evidence of diabetes."

A larger study will now be staged in a bid to confirm the results.

The PCOS is one of the most common female endocrine disorders that affects about ten percent of women of reproductive age, and it is a leading cause of infertility. Adelaide is the capital and most populous city of the Australian state of South Australia.

Blue ear disease reoccurs in Vietnam's N Province

HANOI, 13 April—Blue ear disease reoccurred in Vietnam as there were 91 pigs found infected with the disease in the northern province of Hai Duong, said a report of the Department of Animal Health under the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development on Monday.

Meanwhile, about 1,090 pigs are currently reported to have the disease in another northern province of Thai

Binh.

Earlier, 21 pigs were found infected with blue ear disease in Vietnam's northern province of Thai Nguyen on April 3. The pigs were all destroyed.

At present, health officials in affected provinces are taking appropriate measures to prevent the spread of the disease, said the report.

UCSD professor laureate of Pulitzer Prize for Poetry

LOS ANGELES, 13 April—University of California San Diego (UCSD) professor and famed poet Rae Armantrout has won the 2010 Pulitzer Prize for Poetry on Monday for her poetry "Versed", her 10th collection.

Born in Vallejo but grew up in San Diego, California, Armantrout has taught at UCSD where she is Professor of Poetry and Poetics for almost 20 years. A recipient of numerous other awards for her poetry, Armantrout has published many books of poetry including "Next Life," which was selected by The New

York Times as a notable book of 2007.

"Versed" is "striking for its wit and linguistic inventiveness" and the poems were "often little thought-bombs detonating in the mind long after the first reading," the Pulitzer board said.

shock when she heard the news, according to news reports. Armantrout had just taken a bath, was drying her hair for a lunch appointment before she got a phone call telling her that she's won a Pulitzer Prize. The prize carries a 10,000 dollar award for her.—Xinhua

Domestic ore prices up again, but cheaper than imports

BEIJING, 13 April—Domestic iron ore prices rose 17 percent in March over the previous month to 177 US dollars per ton on Monday, according to data from industry watcher Mysteel com. That price is for 66 percent iron ore and includes tax

and transport.

At 177 dollars per ton, the price is still lower than the spot price of imported iron ore.

Similar iron ore from Brazil rose to nearly 185 dollars per ton on Monday. Iron ore is typically classified as high grade

when its iron content is above 65 percent.

New Microsoft phones aim at young consumers

BEIJING, 13 April—Microsoft on Monday unveiled two new mobile phones dubbed "Kin One" and "Kin Two," aiming at young consumers who emphasize social networking.

Both the new Kin phones have touch screens, slide-out QWERTY keyboards and cameras, and are powered by Windows Phone 7 Series software which Microsoft launched in February.

Kin One is smaller, designed to be used with only one hand, while Kin Two has a larger screen and keyboard and more memory.

Touting the Kin as a new kind of "social phone," Microsoft said its new handset will have a fun and simple interface that can automatically bring together feeds from Facebook and other leading social networking services all in one place, making it easier for users to stay connected.

"Social's part of the DNA of this phone," said Derek Snyder, a product manager at Windows

Mobile, at an unveiling event for the new phones in San Francisco, "social networks are the cornerstone of this experience."

"Kin is an interesting attempt to target the 15 to 25 market," said Ross Rubin, consumer electronics and wireless industry analyst at market research firm NPD Group.

"Even if the device does not turn out to be successful, Microsoft is introducing some concepts that might be useful," Rubin added.

The two new phones are being manufactured by Japan's Sharp, and will be sold in the United States by U.S. telecom carrier Verizon Wireless online in early May and in stores shortly thereafter.

The phones will also be available in Britain, Germany, Italy and Spain in the fall by Vodafone Group PLC, which owns Verizon Wireless in partnership with Verizon Communications Inc.

River Plate coach sees plans scuttled

BUENOS AIRES, 13 April—Leonardo Astrada announced on Monday that he had been sacked as coach of ailing Argentina footballing giants River Plate after the worst series of results in its history. Astrada has guided River Plate - winner of two overall Argentinian League championships, six opening season titles and six closing season titles - to a winless streak of five matches, including four defeats with the 0-0 draw on Sunday against Atletico Tucuman the final straw for the club's board.

He tied a tournament record by making four eagles. He was never out of the top 10 from the opening round. He had his best 72-hole score at Augusta National in five years. None of that might have been possible without a spontaneous and warm reception on the first tee on Thursday.

Woods might have looked like the same player, but he wasn't the same person. The fans who came to watch his golf could not ignore the sordid lifestyle that kept him away from the game in the first place. That's why the cheers were so important. They put him at ease from the start, and he felt more comfortable as the week went on, even as his swing got worse.—*Internet*

Djokovic dumps coach Martin ahead of Monte Carlo campaign

Children use space to think about time



New research shows that children use space to measure the passage of time.

SCIENCE DAILY, 13 April—Space and time are intertwined in our thoughts, as they are in the physical world. For centuries, philosophers have debated exactly how these dimensions are related in the human mind. According to a paper to appear in the April, 2010 issue of Cognitive Science, children's ability to understand time is inseparable from their understanding of space.

To probe the relationship between space and time in the developing mind, MPI researcher Daniel Casasanto and colleagues at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and Stanford University showed children movies of two snails racing along parallel paths for different distances or durations. The children judged either the spatial or temporal aspect of each race, reporting which animal went for a longer distance or a longer time.

When asked to judge distance, children had no trouble ignoring time. But when asked to judge time, they had difficulty ignoring the spatial dimension of the event. Snails that moved a longer distance were mistakenly judged to have traveled for a longer time. Children use physical distance to measure of the passage of time.—Internet
