Two policemen killed in Baghdad violence

BAGHDAD, 1 July—Two policemen were killed and three people wounded in a shooting and bomb attacks in Baghdad on Wednesday, an Interior Ministry source said.

Gunmen in a civilian car opened fire from their silencer fitted pistols on a checkpoint manned by Iraqi police in

Baghdad's southern district of Doura, killing two policemen and wounding another, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In separate incident, a bomb hidden in a bag in front of a house in Baghdad's southwestern district of Amel, went off when police experts came to defuse

it, wounding a policeman and a civilian, the source said.

Violence continued in the Iraqi cities more than three months after the country held its landmark parliamentary election which is widely expected to shape the political landscape of the war-torn country.

Airstrike kills six militants in southern Afghan Province

GHAZNI, 1 July—Six anti-government militants were killed as NATO-led airpower pounded their positions in Ghazni Province south of Afghanistan, deputy to provincial police chief Nawroz Ali Mahmoudzada said on Thursday.

"The air strikes carried out against Taliban hideout in Aaband District on Wednesday night as a result six Taliban rebels were killed and five others sustained inju-

ries," Mahmoudzada told *Xinhua*. There were no casualties on the troops, he stressed. Taliban militants have yet to make comment.

Over a dozen militants, according to Mahmoudzada, have been killed over the past two days elsewhere in Ghazni Province.

Two PKK rebels killed in eastern Turkey

ANKARA, 1 July—Turkish security forces killed two members of the outlawed Kurdish Workers' Party (PKK) in eastern Turkey on Wednesday, the semi-official *Anatolia* news agency reported.

The patrolling security forces came across a group of PKK rebels in rural areas of Ovacik town of Tunceli Province and called them to surrender, said the report, adding two PKK members including one woman, were neutralized in an ensuing clash.

The security operations in fight against the PKK rebels are underway in the region, added the report.

Meanwhile, two PKK members who escaped from the camps of the PKK in north of Iraq surrendered to the security forces, said the

report.

The Turkish armed forces have warned that the PKK might intensify its operations over the summer, when warmer weather brings increased infiltration of PKK guerrillas from the mountainous areas in northern Iraq.

Listed as a terrorist organization by the Turkish government, the United States and the European Union, the PKK took up arms in 1984 to create an ethnic homeland in southeastern Turkey. Some 40,000 people have been killed in the conflicts.

Twelve corpses found in improvised graves in northern Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 1 July—Police found 12 bodies in improvised graves dug by drug traffickers in the northern Mexico state of Nuevo Leon, *Mexican* media reported Wednesday. The bodies were found in four separate graves in a ranch where two kidnapped people were rescued by government troops later Tuesday.

The corpses were in a state of accelerated decomposition and thus can't be identified. Four other graves nearby haven't been investigated yet with potentially more bodies to be found, police said.

A number of insurgents were wounded and captured, including the Taliban District chief of Now Zad, a district southwest of the fighting.

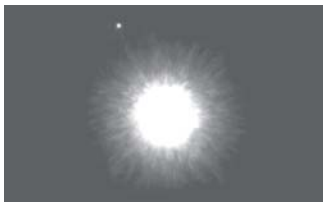

More proof that new planet and star are moving together



Newly confirmed planet is least massive planet known to orbit from its host star.—INTERNET

OTTAWA, 1 July—A planet about eight times the mass of Jupiter has been confirmed to orbit a Sun-like star that's some 300 times farther from its own star than Earth is from its sun.

The newly confirmed planet is the least massive planet known to orbit at such a great distance from its host star.

The discovery, first reported in September 2008, was made using high-resolution adaptive optics

technology at the Gemini Observatory. These latest results, published in the *Astrophysical Journal*, were led by David Lafrenière of the University of Montreal Department of Physics and a researcher at the Center for Research in Astrophysics of Quebec.

The suspected planetary system required further observations to confirm that the planet and star were indeed moving through space together. "Back in 2008 what we knew for sure was that there was this young planetary mass next to a young Sun-like star," says Lafrenière. The extreme proximity of the two objects strongly suggested that they were associated and not just aligned by chance.

"Our new observations rule out this chance alignment possibility, and thus confirms that the planet and the star are related to each other," says Lafrenière.—*Internet*

New Zealand launches emissions trading scheme

WELLINGTON, 1 July—New Zealand launched an emissions trading scheme on Thursday in a bid to curb the greenhouse gases

responsible for climate change but the scheme has angered both businesses and environmentalists. Energy, transport

and manufacturing industries will from Thursday have to start paying for their emissions of gases such as carbon dioxide and methane, which have risen 23 percent in New Zealand since 1990.

Prices for fuel and electricity will rise, with the government estimating households will pay an extra five dollars (3.50 US) a week, although some critics say this estimate is far too low.

Businesses say the extra costs of the scheme will hurt them, while environmentalists say those costs are too low to encourage emission cuts.—*Internet*

Swiss team postpones solar plane night flight

GENEVA, 1 July—A Swiss team planning to circle the globe in a solar-powered plane has postponed a 24-hour test flight because of an equipment problem.

Bertrand Piccard, co-founder of the Solar Impulse team, says he cannot say when the next attempt will be made.

But he says the test flight has to happen before the beginning of August because after that the days will be too short to charge the plane's batteries to last through the night.

Pilot Andre Borschberg says the problem is with a piece of measuring equipment.

Piccard told supporters and reporters at the Payerne airfield in Switzerland on Thursday that it was the team's first setback.

"If this project was easy, everybody else would have already done it," he said.

Some 70,000 turtle eggs to be whisked far from oil

PENSACOLA BEACH, 1 July—An effort to scoop thousands of turtle eggs from their nests to save them from death in the oily Gulf of Mexico will begin in the coming weeks in a desperate attempt to keep an entire generation of threatened species from vanishing.

The US Fish and Wildlife Service will coordinate the plan, which calls for collecting about 70,000 turtle eggs in up to 800 nests buried in the sand across Florida Panhandle and Alabama beaches.

It's never been done on such a massive scale.

But doing nothing, experts say, could lead to unprecedented deaths. There are fears the turtles would be coated in oil and poisoned by crude-soaked food as they hatch and swim out to sea.

"This is an extraordinary effort under extraordinary conditions, but if we can save some of the hatchlings, it will be worth it as opposed to losing all of them," said Chuck Underwood of the US Fish and Wildlife Service.

Russia sends cargo spaceship to ISS

Moscow, 1 July—A Russian cargo spaceship has been sent to the International Space Station (ISS) on Wednesday night from the Baikonur cosmodrome in Kazakhstan, said the Mission Control center outside Moscow.

The Progress M-06M spacecraft atop a Soyuz-U carrier rocket lifted off at 07:35 p.m. Moscow time (1535 GMT), delivering some 2.5 tons of fuel, oxygen, scientific equipment, video and photo equipment, containers with food and water and parcels for the ISS crew.

For the sake of interior adornment, some paintings by Russian famous artists were also delivered to the space station, so as to "bring the astronauts closer to the Nature," local media reported.

The space freighter is scheduled to dock with the ISS automatically on July 2 at 08:55 p.m. Moscow time (1655 GMT).

Earlier this month, the Mission Control has

raised the ISS orbit by 2.5 km to guarantee the ideal conditions for the docking of the Soyuz TMA-19 manned spacecraft and the Progress M-06M space freighter.

On Monday, the Soyuz TMA-19 spacecraft, previously docked with the Zvezda module, has been relocated to the Rassvet research module via a 24-minute maneuver to make room for the incoming cargo spaceship.

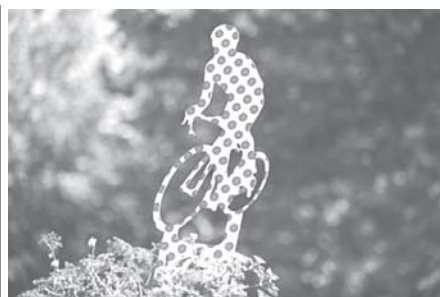
Experts optimistic about solving puzzle of Alzheimer's

WASHINGTON, 1 July— Research into Alzheimer's disease has reached a point of significant potential, even as the disease's looming impact on society grows more and more dire, experts say. Some leading scientists, in fact, worry that we may not be doing enough to press forward with key advances and new insights into Alzheimer's, the most common type of dementia among older people.

An estimated 5.3 million US residents have the disease, which results from the deterioration of nerve cells in the brain and leads to memory loss, impaired judgment, wandering and, as it progresses, to the inability to perform such normal daily functions as dressing, bathing and

eating. As the population ages, the number of people with Alzheimer's is expected to spike dramatically. Today, someone in the United States develops Alzheimer's every 70 seconds, according to the Alzheimer's Association — a number expected to rise to once every 33 seconds in a few decades.

Obesity ups cancer death risk in Asia-Pacific region

WASHINGTON, 1 JULY— Overweight and obese people in the Asia-Pacific region have a significantly increased risk of dying from cancer compared to those of normal weight, finds a new study. Researchers analyzed data from over 424,500 adults in Asia, Australia and New Zealand. Overall, those

who were overweight or obese were six percent and 21 percent, respectively, more likely to die from cancer (excluding those of the lung and upper digestive tract) than normal-weight people.

The study also found that obese people were significantly more likely than normal-weight people to die from colon, rectal, ovarian, cervical and prostate cancers and from leukemia. Obese women over 60 were also significantly more likely to die from breast cancer than women of normal

weight.

Despite differing dietary and other lifestyle risk factors, the study did not find "a higher relative risk for cancer mortality in Asian populations compared with Western populations for the same level of BMI (body mass index), as has been suggested for diabetes and cardiovascular disease," wrote Christine Parr, from the University of Oslo in Norway, and international colleagues.

Exercise may guard girls against dementia in senior years

TORONTO, 1 July — If you want to help your young daughter avoid dementia much later on in life, a new study suggests it might be a good idea to send her outside to play.

Canadian researchers believe they've found a link between exercise in adolescence and fewer cases of senility in a woman's senior years.

The study doesn't definitively prove that exercise lowers the risk of dementia. And the research is only based on the recollections of older women, some with signs of dementia, about their childhoods.

Still, the findings suggest that "early life physical activity is important to late-life health and in particular in preventing late-life cognitive impairment. The sooner you start being physically active, the better it is," said study author Laura E Middleton, a researcher at the Sunnybrook Health Sciences Center in Toronto.—Internet

Mouse study suggests caffeine boosts athletic performance

LONDON, 1 July— High doses of caffeine could increase muscle power and endurance during activities ranging from walking to running a marathon, British researchers report.

The finding

stemmed from testing on mice.

The researchers, from Coventry University, found that giving a caffeine dose of 70 micrometers to mice resulted in a 6 percent increase in the power output of lower leg muscles. They indicated that the effect in humans would probably be similar.

That amount "is the absolute maximum that can normally be achieved in the blood plasma of humans," Dr

Rob James, the lead researcher, said in a Society for Experimental Biology news release. "However, concentrations of 20 to 50 micrometers are not unusual in people with high caffeine intake."

The findings, to be presented on Wednesday at the society's annual meeting in Prague, Czech Republic, may have implications for the use of caffeine in sports.

Preterm births rarely discussed with doctors

LONDON, 1 July— Even though one in eight babies in the United States are born preterm each year, most new or expectant mothers and their doctors don't discuss preterm birth, a new survey shows.

Conducted by the March of Dimes and BabyCentre, the poll included more than 1,000 participants, including new or expectant mothers, mothers who've experienced preterm birth and their obstetricians/gynecologists.

Despite the fact that prior preterm birth is a major risk factor for delivering another baby prematurely, nearly 40 percent of women who had a previous preterm delivery were not informed of this by their doctors.

"If you've had a preterm birth, talk to your doctor because the greatest risk factor for having a preterm baby is if you've already had one," said Dr. Alan Fleischman, March of Dimes medical director. "Our survey found that a lot of moms don't feel informed about preterm birth's risk factors and potential consequences."—Internet

Toyota says 270,000 vehicles have faulty engines

TOKYO, 1 July—Toyota Motor Corp. said Thursday about 270,000 cars sold worldwide — including luxury Lexus sedans — have faulty engines, the latest quality lapse to hit the automaker following massive global recalls.

Japan's public broadcaster NHK and Kyodo News agency said Toyota, the world's No. 1 automaker, was considering recalling the vehicles but didn't name sources.

Toyota spokesman Hideaki Homma said the company was considering measures to deal with the problem of defective engines that can stall while the vehicle is moving. He would not confirm a recall was being

considered.

The automaker has been working to patch up its reputation after recalling more than 8 million vehicles worldwide because of unintended acceleration and other defects.

Of the 270,000 vehicles with engine problems, some 180,000 were sold overseas and the rest in Japan. They include the popular Crown and seven models of luxury Lexus sedans.

Toyota said there have been no reports of accidents linked to the faulty engines. It did not say how it learned about the engine troubles.

The automaker's shares fell 1.1 percent to 3,045 yen in Tokyo on Thursday.—Xinhua

Banking sector causes collapse of Spanish stocks

MADRID, 1 July—The Spanish stock market suffered this year's third major downfall on Tuesday.

(-5.45 percent) as a result of the banking sector's liquidity problems. Fears of a double dip world recession grew sharply ahead of US jobs report to be released on Friday.

Once again, banks caused the Ibex-35 to sink under 9,200 points. Santander and BBVA shares fell by 6.8 and 7.2 percent respectively, whilst Bankinter saw the value of its shares reduced by 8 percent.

The Spanish financial sector was once more under close scrutiny by the international press on Tuesday when its liquidity problems were highlighted. According to the *Financial Times*, Spanish banks have been exerting pressure on the European Central Bank (ECB) ahead of Thursday's redemption of 442 billion euro (539.7 billion US dollars) granted to European banks at an interest rate of 1 percent one year ago. The *London-based journal* reported that Spanish banks accuse the ECB of "absurd" behavior if the European monetary authorities finally decide to terminate their emergency-cash policies.—Xinhua

BEIJING, 1 July—Online shop owners in China will be required to submit personal information, including real names and addresses, to ecommerce agents before running their businesses online, according to a regulation which comes into effect on Thursday.

The regulation was issued by the State

Administration for Industry and Commerce.

The first Chinese regulation of online goods and services transactions, the regulation details the obligations of online shop owners and ecommerce agents. It also details authorities' administration of online shopping.

If online business owners fail to abide by the regulation, they may be imposed a fine of up to 30,000 yuan (about 4,410 US dollars).

Also to take effect Thursday, the Tort Liability Law will allow for the granting of compensation for psychological injuries and assessment of the sum to be granted. It also mandates better protection of personal privacy by imposing liability for unauthorized personal information leaks.

The Law on National Defence Mobilization will also come into effect on Thursday.

Brazil's inflation rate to reach 5.4% in 2010

RIO DE JANEIRO, 1 July—Brazil's inflation rate will reach 5.4 percent by the end of the year, according to the country's Central Bank's quarterly inflation report released on Wednesday.

The figures show a slight increase from the previous quarterly report, when the Central Bank foresaw an inflation rate of 5.2 percent. In 2011, the Bank expects an

inflation rate of five percent, up from 4.9 percent in the previous report.

The projections take into consideration a Brazilian Real-US dollar exchange rate of 1.80 reais a dollar and an annual basic interest rate of 10.25 percent. Both estimates are above the inflation target set by the Brazilian government for 2010 and 2011, which is of 4.5 percent with a tolerance of two

percentage points, which means that the inflation rate should not exceed 6.5 percent.

According to the report, there is a 12 percent chance the inflation rate will surpass 6.5 percent in 2010. In 2011, there is a 17 percent possibility.

Last year, Brazil registered an inflation rate of 4.31 percent. In the first five months of 2010, the country accumulated an inflation rate of 3.09 percent, up from 2.2 percent in the same period in 2009.

BEIJING, 1 July—China's economy is very likely to maintain steady and rapid growth in 2010, with more positive factors than last year boosting the economy, the People's Bank of China (PBOC), China's central bank, said on Wednesday.

But the nation's economy still faces a complex domestic and international situation, the central bank said in the summary of the 2010 China financial stability report posted on its website.

It is imperative to continue implementing the country's macro control policy and increase support for the economic restructuring and transformation of the economic growth pattern, the central bank said.

Further efforts are needed to strengthen prudent management of macro policies, deepen financial reforms and improve financial institutions' profitability, so as to maintain financial stability.—Xinhua

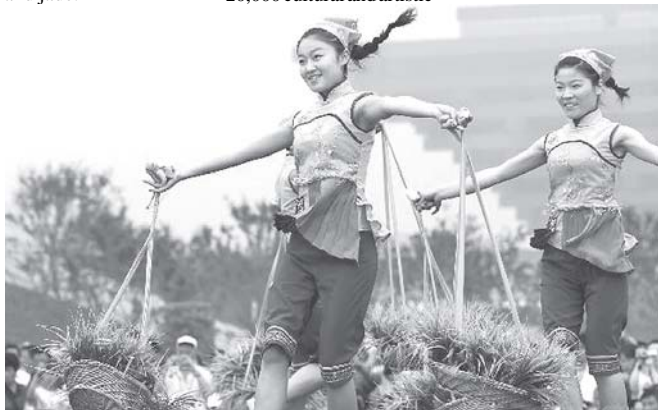

Newest waste-to-energy plant opens in Singapore

SINGAPORE, 1 July—Singapore's Keppel Corp's environmental technology and engineering arm, Keppel Integrated Engineering (KIE), on Wednesday opened Singapore's newest Waste-to-Energy (WTE) plant.

The new plant has the capacity to treat 800 tons of solid waste a day to generate more than 20 Megawatts of green energy, contributing to Singapore's electricity supply. It is the first

incineration plant in Singapore to showcase WTE technology from a local company, which is also one of the most compact WTE plants in the world.

The plant is also the first to be built under the government agency National Environment Agency (NEA)'s public-private partnership initiative. At the opening ceremony, Keppel also announced that KIE would complete construction of a

Memstill demonstration plant in the fourth quarter of this year.

Memstill is a new technology that produces desalinated water using waste heat and membrane-based distillation.

The plant, to be built on Singapore Refining Company's petroleum refinery located on Jurong Island, will have a freshwater production capacity of 100 cubic metres per day.

Two terrorist attacks rock SW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 1 July—Two terrorist incidents, a bomb blast and rockets firing, frightened local people early Wednesday morning in provincial capital Quetta, southwest Pakistan's Balochistan, local sources said.

A low intensity bomb exploded near the main commercial artery, Fatima Jinnah road. It broke the window pans of nearby buildings and created scare in the area.

Only one person was injured in the incident and had been discharged from the hospital after the treatment.

Two rockets were fired by unidentified terrorists at a paramilitary Frontier Constabulary (FC) checkpoint in Sharifabad, suburbs of Quetta. No one was hurt in the incident, official sources said.

Besides, late Tuesday night, at least two paramilitary troops were shot dead in an ambush on their checkpoint in Dasht area of district Mastung of the city, official sources said.

SHENZHEN, 1 July—Authorities in Shenzhen on Wednesday identified the six people killed in an amusement park ride accident on Tuesday in the southern Chinese boomtown neighbouring Hong Kong.

The dead, all Chinese nationals, included two men and four

women, and they were aged between 24 and 48-years old, according to a statement from the Yantian District government.

Five were residents of Guangdong Province and one was from central China's Hunan Province. The accident happened at 4:45 pm on Tuesday after the Space

Journey ride malfunctioned at the Overseas Chinese Town East (OCT East) amusement park. The ride simulates the conditions of a rocket launch with the passengers experiencing doubled gravity. It elevates and spins 11 cabins each carrying four passengers.

Gas tank blast kills three in Belgium

BRUSSELS, 1 July—A natural gas tank exploded on Tuesday in Belgian eastern city of Soumagne, killing a couple and a worker, witnesses said.

The deadly blast occurred at around 4 p.m. local time (1400 GMT) in a villa in Soumagne in the Province of Leige and buried five people inside, including a couple, two children and a worker, a local resident at the scene told Xinhua.

The two children were rescued shortly after the blast, but the other three under debris have been confirmed dead, the resident said.—Xinhua



Tibet's fourth civil airport opens

NGARI, 1 July— Gunsu Airport in southwest China's Tibet Autonomous Region started operation on Thursday, becoming the fourth civil airport on the "Roof of the World."

An Airbus 319 landed at Gunsu Airport, in Ngari Prefecture, at 10:20 am, marking the airport's formal opening.

The airport sits more than 4,200 metres above sea level and has a 4,500-metre runway. Its annual

throughput capacity is expected to reach 120,000 passengers by 2020.

Construction of the airport began in May 2007 and cost an estimated 1.65 billion yuan (241.22 million US dollars).

It is the fourth operational civil airport in Tibet after Gonggar Airport in Lhasa, Bamda Airport in Qamdo Prefecture and Nyingchi Airport.—Xinhua

HK allocates 544 mln HKD to 764 research projects

HONG KONG, 1 July— The Research Grants Council of Hong Kong has allocated 544.6 million HK dollars in funds to 764 research projects, according to local government website on Wednesday.

Including an extra 15 percent of the project grant allocated to the institutional management as on-costs, the grand total awarded in General Research Fund for 2010/11 is 626.3 million HK dollars. The council received a record high of 2,463 applications by academic staff of the eight tertiary institutions funded by the University Grants Committee, up 7 percent on last year. The overall success rate was 31 percent. The average funding amount per project has also risen 7 percent from 667,000 HK dollars last year to 713,000 HK dollars this year. The number of high quality projects approved has grown 25 percent on last year.—Xinhua

Man, 81, accused of machete chase near taco stand

Police said an 81-year-old man was arrested after he chased another man around a Salem taco stand while armed with a machete. Salem police said on Monday the man accused the taco stand owner of stealing a drill from his nearby business. When the taco stand owner denied it, the suspect left and returned with a machete.

Lt. Dave Okada said the suspect chased the unidentified man around the stand several times before officers arrested him on accusations of menacing and attempted assault. He was booked into the Marion County Jail.

Wu died last Friday aged 91 in a Beijing hospital.

His ashes would be scattered into the sea according to his will, said Lu Xinhua, former deputy chief of the School of Arts and Design at Tsinghua University. Lu knew Wu for more than 20 years.

Born in 1919 in Yixing in east China's Jiangsu Province, Wu is widely recognized as the father of modern Chinese painting. He integrated Chinese ink

and wash with Western painting methods.

Wu's works include the oil painting "Hometown of Lu Xun" and "The Three Gorges."

The works of the internationally acclaimed painter are in high demand.

Sales of his works at public auctions totaled 31.7 million U.S. dollars last year, according to a report compiled by the Hurun Report in partnership with the Shanghai Art Museum.

Wu donated five ink paintings to the Hong Kong Museum of Art last Friday. That brought his donations to the museum to 52. —Xinhua

LONDON, 1 July—Major changes in policy are still needed to meet climate targets despite emission cuts brought about by the recession, say government advisors. The Committee on Climate Change (CCC) calls for a "step change" in power generation, insulation and transport.

Continuing to rely on "light touch" approaches will not work, it says.

Cryosat-2 focuses on ice target

LONDON, 1 July—The Cryosat-2 mission is delivering on its promise to make high-precision radar measurements of polar ice. The first data from the European spacecraft has been presented at an Earth observation meeting in Norway.

The information clearly shows Cryosat has the required sensitivity to assess the state of Antarctic and Arctic ice, according to its lead scientist.

"All of the measurement concepts have been confirmed," UCL Professor Duncan Wingham told BBC News. The European Space Agency's Cryosat-2 satellite was launched in April on a quest to map the thickness and shape of the Earth's polar ice cover.

No escape yet from 'Swantanamo' for Ottawa royal swans

LONDON, 1 July—Plans to approve a new winter home for a flock of royal swans in the Canadian capital Ottawa in time for a visit by Queen Elizabeth II have been delayed.

Campaigners dubbed the animals' current off-season accommodation Swantanamo Bay, saying it is squalid and cramped.

Ottawa's city council has postponed a debate scheduled for Tuesday about a new home home for the birds. They are descendants of six pairs of mute swans presented by the Queen to Ottawa to mark Canada's 1967 centenary.—Internet

Cambodia expects to get first oil product by end of 2012

PHNOM PENH, 1 July—Cambodian government said Thursday that the first oil product is expected to materialize on December 12, 2012.

Sok An, deputy prime minister and head of Cambodian National Petroleum Authority said the "first drop of oil product" is expected to materialize at the end of 2012, but he has not indicated the production or capacity of processing facilities.

Earlier this month, Sok An said that 24 companies have had agreements with Cambodia for oil and gas explorations, but some of them have left when they found that oil and gas resources in the country are not sufficient for production.—Xinhua

Simple test could detect Down's

LONDON, 1 July—A blood test during pregnancy could one day replace more invasive tests for Down's syndrome, say researchers.

High-risk women are currently offered an amniocentesis test, which carries a risk of miscarriage.

But Dutch researchers told a fertility conference they are on the verge of developing an accurate way of testing the mother's blood for chromosome disorders in the foetus.—Internet

Ever since then, Hudson's various interviews for new entertainment projects generally were set-up with specifically requesting "no questions about her family tragedy."

Hudson said a key moment for her came when she reappeared at the 2009 Grammys, where she won best R&B album. "If there was anything to lift me up, that was it." She said.

Brazil demand end to violence

JOHANNESBURG, 1 July—Brazil demanded greater protection for their artists from World Cup assassins on Wednesday.

Midfield star Elano became the five-time champions' latest injury casualty when the Galatasaray player, who has scored twice in the tournament, was rated as doubtful for Friday's quarter-final against the Netherlands. Elano picked up an ankle injury in the group match win over Ivory Coast and he subsequently missed the scoreless draw with Portugal and Monday's 3-0 round-of-16 win over Chile.

"I didn't get the chance to speak to the referee (after the incident against the Ivory Coast), but he didn't even whistle for a foul. There was a foul on Robinho later that should really have merited a red card," said Elano.

The referee for that match, Stephane Lannoy awarded a drop-ball instead.

"We have various characteristics in our squad, but there is no-one who goes out there with the intention of injuring an opponent," added Elano.

"The problem is that it's me who pays the price because I can't be available for my team. These fouls must be punished."—*Internet*

Portugal strain too much for Ronaldo, says Queiroz



MAGALIESBURG, 1 July—Cristiano Ronaldo, the world's most expensive footballer, may find playing for Portugal too heavy a burden, under-fire coach Carlos Queiroz implied on Wednesday.

Ronaldo once again failed to reproduce his club form on the international stage as Portugal went out of the World Cup on Tuesday, losing 1-0 to Spain in the last 16.

While the 25-year-old Real Madrid star has denied criticising Queiroz for the team's exit, he revealed in comments on a website owned by his agent that he felt like a broken man and had never felt such sadness.

However, his emotional comments failed to move Queiroz, who along with Ronaldo was savaged in the Portuguese press on Wednesday. The player was criticised for being virtually anonymous during the finals while the coach was accused of a lack of imagination and ambition.—*Internet*

Federer out of Wimbledon, Nadal planning offensive

LONDON, 1 July—With Roger Federer put to the sword in stunning fashion, the fight for the Wimbledon title is more open than ever and that means Rafael Nadal will go on the offensive when he faces Andy Murray in the semi-finals on Friday.

Federer's shock defeat to 12th seed Tomas Berdych in the quarter-finals on Wednesday has given a huge shot of adrenaline to the four remaining players in the men's singles draw as they bid to replace the Swiss star as Wimbledon champion.

The chief beneficiary of Federer's exit could be

French Open champion Nadal has shrugged off a knee problem that bothered him earlier in the tournament and was

Tiger Woods interviewed in Galea probe

BUFFALO, 1 July—Tiger Woods has been interviewed by federal authorities investigating a Canadian doctor accused of distributing human growth hormone, a person familiar with the investigation told The Associated Press on Wednesday.

The person spoke on the condition of anonymity because the investigation of Dr. Anthony Galea is ongoing.

Woods previously acknowledged that he's been treated by the Toronto-based doctor but insisted that he did not receive any performance-enhancing drugs.

"Tiger willingly spoke to the authorities and cooperated fully," Woods' agent, Mark Steinberg, said in an e-mail. "It was confirmed that because he did nothing illegal, he is not the subject of any criminal investigation. Because there is an ongoing investigation involving others, there will be no further comment."

The New York Times first reported Woods' interview, citing two unidentified people.

Barbara Burns, a spokeswoman for US District Attorney William Hochul, declined comment.—*Internet*

Philippine boxing star Pacquiao enters politics

ALABEL, 1 July—Manny Pacquiao has taken his oath as a Philippine congressman, bringing the boxing star into a political arena that he said seemed more daunting than stepping inside the ring.

French parliament hosts hearing about W Cup fiasco

PARIS, 1 July—Lawmakers taking part in a closed-door hearing about France's World Cup fiasco said Wednesday that coach Raymond Domenech refused to take any responsibility for his team's misbehavior and offered no real explanation for their debacle.

Lawmakers said Domenech, who is retiring, tried to pin blame on the media during the parliamentary hearing. Prominent lawmaker Jean-Francois Cope said his testimony "wasn't very dignified."

Many had kinder words for French Football Federation president Jean-Pierre Escalettes, who plans to resign this week, and who also testified at the hearing held by the National Assembly's commission on culture and education.

The hearing went ahead despite a warning from FIFA about French government meddling in soccer affairs. FIFA

president Sepp Blatter said the country's national team risks suspension from global soccer if President Nicolas Sarkozy or political leaders interfere in the running of the federation.

Lawmakers retorted that it wasn't Blatter's place to tell them how to do their jobs.—*Internet*

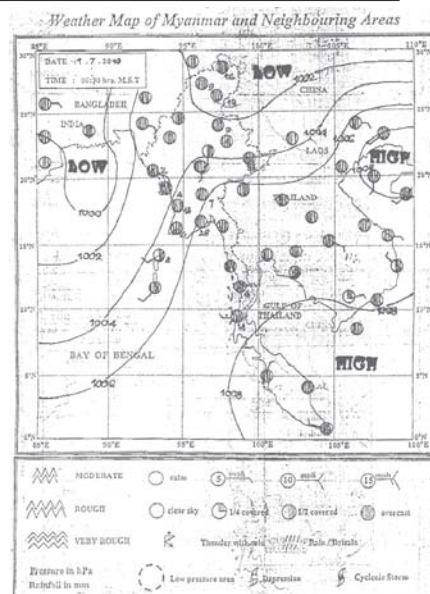
One Indonesia's last glacier will melt within years

JAKARTA, 1 July—Lonnie Thompson spent years preparing for his expedition to the remote, mist-shrouded mountains of eastern Indonesia, hoping to chronicle the affect of global warming on the last remaining glacier in the Pacific. He's worried he got there too late. Even as he pitched his tent on top of Puncak Jaya, the ice was melting beneath him.

The 3-mile- (4,884-metre-) high glacier was pounded by rain every afternoon during the team's 13-day trip, something the American scientist has never encountered in three decades of drilling ice cores. He lay awake at night listening to the water gushing beneath him.

By the time they were ready to head home, ice around their sheltered campsite had melted a staggering 12 inches (30 centimetres).
