NAY PYI TAW, 1 Nov—Prime Minister of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein attended 8th ASEAN-India Summit, 5th East Asia Summit, 2nd ASEAN-Russia Summit, ASEAN-Australia Summit and ASEAN-New Zealand Commemorative Summit held at the National Convention Centre (NCC) in Hanoi in the Socialist Republic of Vietnam on 30 October.

The 8th ASEAN-India Summit took place at Room No. 347 on the third floor of NCC at 9 am, which was attended by heads of State/Government of ASEAN countries, Indian Prime Minister Dr

Manmohan Singh and the ASEAN Secretary-General. Before the summit, they posed for documentary photos.

The summit focused on measures for effective implementation of peace, development and sharing work programme on ASEAN-India dialogue partner relation (2010-2015), boosting commerce, investment and service, and improving ASEAN-India relation.

The 5th East Asia Summit was held at Room No. 339 on the third floor of NCC at 10.35 am. It was attended by heads of State/Government of ASEAN

NAY PYI TAW, 1 Nov — U Nyan Win, Minister for Foreign Affairs who was in Hanoi as a member of Myanmar Delegation to the 17th ASEAN Summit and related summits attended the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting and the 7th Meeting of ASEAN Coordinating Council (ACC) at the National Convention Centre (NCC) in Hanoi in the afternoon of 27 October. At the 7th Meeting of ASEAN Coordinating Council (ACC), ASEAN Ministers exchanged views on the matters of preparations to the 17th ASEAN Summit and related summits, Regional Architecture, Report of the Secretary-General of ASEAN on the implementation of the Roadmap for the ASEAN Community, Report of the Committee of Permanent Representatives to ASEAN (CPR) and Report of the Initiative for ASEAN Integration (IAI) Task Force.

At the Informal Working Dinner, the Foreign Ministers exchanged views on regional and international issues and Minister U Nyan Win updated his counterparts on recent preparations for the forthcoming general elections in Myanmar.

In the afternoon of 30 October, Minister U Nyan Win attended the Signing Ceremony of the ASEAN and Russian Foreign Ministers held at the NCC and signed the Agreement on Cultural Cooperation between the Governments of the Member States of ASEAN and the Government of the

Russian Federation together with the ASEAN Foreign Ministers and the Russian Foreign Minister Mr. Sergei Lavrov.

On the sideline of the meetings in Hanoi, Minister U Nyan Win held separate bilateral discussions with Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Vietnam Mr. Pham Gia Khiem in the morning of 28 October and Japanese Foreign Minister Mr. Seiji Moehara in the morning of 30 October at their requests and exchanged views on promotion of bilateral relations and on issues of mutual interests.

Fifty-Two killed in Iraq church raid

BAGHDAD, 1 Nov — Fifty-two hostages and police officers were killed on Sunday when security forces raided a Baghdad church to free more than 100 Iraqi Catholics held by al-Qaeda-linked gunmen, a deputy interior minister said.

Lieutenant General Hussein Kamal said on Monday that 67 people were also wounded.

Gunmen took hostages at the Our Lady of Salvation Church, one of Baghdad's largest, during Sunday mass and demanded the release of al-Qaeda prisoners in Iraq and Egypt.

"This death toll is for civilians and security force members. We don't differentiate between police and civilians. They are all Iraqis," Kamal said, adding the number did not include dead attackers.

Suicide bomber wounds 15 in Istanbul

ISTANBUL, 1 Nov— A suicide bomber blew himself up in the centre of Istanbul on Sunday, wounding 15 people, the city's police chief said. "We think it was a suicide attack," said police chief Huseyin Capkin, adding that two of the wounded were in a serious condition. Six of the injured were civilians and nine were police, he said.

Turkish television said the attack targeted anti-riot police. The blast happened in Taksim Square, a major shopping and leisure district on the European side of the city. According to eyewitnesses quoted by

news channels, a powerful blast shook the area, which is right in the centre of the city. Footage showed police and ambulances rushing to the scene.

A security cordon was thrown round the area and the nearby pedestrianised Istiklal street was closed off, the CNN-Turk and NTV reported. Members of the separatist rebel Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) and extreme left-wing groups have carried out bomb attacks in the past in Istanbul, which is home to more than 12 million inhabitants.

Afghan official says 17 militants killed in south

KABUL, 1 Nov — An Afghan official says NATO and Afghan troops killed 17 militants in an hours-long gunbattle in southern Helmand Province. Provincial government spokesman Daud Ahmadi said on Sunday that the fighting lasted 12 hours and took place in the Dishu District.

NATO and Afghan troops began pushing into the militancy's stronghold in the south in July. The have established some pockets of security, but attacks have increased in other areas of the country.

In a separate incident, NATO said on Saturday that an airstrike killed a Taleban leader in southern Zabul Province as he was showing his fighters a new anti-aircraft heavy machine gun mounted on the back of his vehicle. The coalition says on Thursday's airstrike also killed one of his fighters.

At least 14 killed at Honduran football field

TEGUCIGALPA, 1 Nov — At least 14 people were killed by several gunmen during a football match in the northern Honduran city of San Pedro Sula. The attackers, armed with assault rifles, drove into the football field and opened fire, authorities said.

Ten people were shot dead at point-blank range and four died on the way to hospital, said Deputy Security Minister Armando Calidonio. Calidonio

said that many others were injured during the shooting spree and some of them were in critical condition now, but did not give a specific number of injuries.

The minister said the motive of the bloodbath was not clear yet. Honduras is plagued by gang violence and organized crime. Last month, a group of gunmen shot dead at least 15 people in a small shoe factory also in San Pedro Sula.

Yemeni arrested, al-Qaeda bomber eyed in mail plot

SAN'A, 1 Nov— Yemeni police arrested a woman on suspicion of mailing a pair of bombs powerful enough to take down airplanes, officials said Saturday as details emerged about a terrorist plot aimed at the US that exploited security gaps in the worldwide shipping system. Investigators were hunting Yemen for more suspects tied to al-Qaida and several US officials identified the terrorist group's top explosives expert in Yemen as the most likely bombmaker.

The explosives, addressed to Chicago-area synagogues, were pulled off airplanes in England and the United Arab Emirates early

Friday morning, touching off a tense search for other devices. It still wasn't clear whether the bombs, which officials said were wired to cell phones, timers and

power supplies, could have been detonated remotely while the planes were in the air, or when the packages were halfway around the world in the US But the fact that they made it onto airplanes showed that nearly a decade since the 11 Sept, 2001 attacks, terrorists continue to probe and find security vulnerabilities.

British army bomb disposal expert killed in Afghanistan

LONDON, 1 Nov— A British army bomb disposal expert was killed by gunfire while he was trying to clear a suspect device in southern Afghanistan on Saturday, the defence ministry said. The soldier, from 101 (City of London) Engineer Regiment (Explosive Ordnance Disposal), died in the Nahr-e Saraj district of restive southern Helmand Province.

"The soldier was part of a team responsible for clearing ground of explosive ordnance for coalition and Afghan forces... when he was killed by small arms fire," Task Force Helmand spokesman Lieutenant Colonel David Eastman said.

A total of 342 British troops have now died in Afghanistan from all causes since operations began in October 2001. Britain has around 9,500 troops in Afghanistan, mostly in Helmand, making it the second largest contributor to the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force.— Internet

Death toll of tsunami in Indonesia rises to nearly 450

JAKARTA, 1 Nov.—Tsunamis triggered by a magnitude 7.2 earthquake in West Sumatra province of Indonesia has claimed nearly 450 lives, with 96 others still missing, a senior official said here on Sunday. “As of Saturday, the tsunami has killed about 450 people,” Deputy minister for environmental damage control and climate change Arief Yuwono said.

It was predicted that the death toll will be increased as the searching and registration for the victims are being conducted on dozens of islands in the area. The Ministry of Environment has

NEW YORK, 1 Nov – When the dead are delivered, four mornings a week, the ferry Michael Cosgrove is waiting. A refrigerated truck from the city morgue follows Fordham Street to its stump, between a used boat dealership and a lot thick with weeds, and a high chain-link fence warning “Prison-Keep Off.” For New Yorkers who die without the money, family or identity required to get a proper funeral, the dock just beyond is the boarding point for a seven-minute journey to oblivion. The destination is Hart Island, 101 acres of wind-swept sand and trees crooked in the waters a half-mile off the Bronx, like a beckoning finger.

If the more than 800,000 people laid to rest on the island over the last 141 years were alive, it would be the state’s second largest city. Dead and buried, they populate what is almost certainly the country’s largest public cemetery. But there are no headstones, no eulogies and no regular visiting hours. In fact, most New Yorkers have never heard of Hart Island. In a city of 8.5 million lives, such a place may be a necessity. But it is one long deemed off-limits, home to stories better left untold. At least that was the case until Melinda Hunt discovered it.—Internet

UNICEF chief says community basis of women and children healthcare in developing countries

NAIROBI, 1 Nov —“I don’t think that you ever think you will thoroughly solve everything but we are absolutely convinced and we think that there is growing evidence that you can solve this problem largely by finding ways for people to take charge of their own lives and with the help of community’s health workers,” the Executive Director of the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF) Anthony Lake has said in an exclusive interview with *Xinhua*.

Cash transfers to the most needy families is also one way of ensuring more people access quality healthcare and education in poorer countries, he said. Access to affordable and quality healthcare and universal education are some benchmarks to achieving


Millennium Development Goals (MDG) of halving poverty in Third World Countries by 2015.

The MDG on health targets to reduce the number of women who die while giving birth by 75 per cent based in 1990 deaths by the year 2015 and to achieve universal access to reproductive healthcare by then. The MDG on education targets to ensure that by 2015, children — boys and girls will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling for free or at highly subsidized school fees. “The most important thing is that more and more governments are focusing more and more on health delivery systems that are concentrated in the poor communities,” said Lake.— *Xinhua*

BEIJING, 1 Nov — The newest Miss World is from the United States. Alexandria Mills, a soft-spoken 18-year-old, was named the winner in Saturday night’s contest in southern China. The tall blonde was a relative surprise winner after speculation focused on other contestants. Second place went to Emma Wareus of Botswana, and Adriana Vasini of Venezuela came third. The host country’s own contestant, Tang Xiao, also was among the final five. According to a brief biography on the Miss World website, Mills calls Louisville, Kentucky, her hometown, and she recently graduated from high school. She would like to become a teacher. “I’ve never met a stranger and enjoy meeting new people,” she says in the bio. For the final, she was wearing a shimmering ivory-coloured dress slit up the leg.

Mills takes over the title from Kaiane Aldorino of Gibraltar, who was named Miss World 2009 at a ceremony in South Africa last December. Women from more than 100 countries participated in the contest, organizers said. This is the 60th year of the Miss World Competition, and organizers brought back contestants from past decades to give the night a retrospective theme.— *Internet*

World's largest cruise ship clears bridge obstacle

KORSØER, 1 Nov— The brand new sister ship of the world's largest cruise liner narrowly passed under a Danish bridge Saturday, a feat that required smooth seas and adjustable smokestacks, officials said. The Allure of the Seas — a twin to Royal Caribbean's Oasis of the Seas, which made the same narrow squeeze under the Great Belt Fixed Link a year ago — measures around four football fields and accommodates 8,300 people, including crew members.

Hans Nilsen, an official at the Korsøer Naval Station, said the passage went fine, with about a 20-inch (50-centimetre) gap and 1.5 inches (4 centimeters) to spare to the safety margin when it squeezed under at around 1420 GMT after lowering its telescopic smokestacks. "It went great," Nilsen said. He said traffic on the bridge did not have to be stopped during the passage because the voyage was made during daytime, reducing any risks. The Allure of the Seas is worth about \$1.5 billion (euro1.08 billion). It left the shipyard in Turku, Finland, on Friday and is expected to reach its new home port in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, in a few weeks. The cruise liner measures 1,200 feet (360 metres) from bow to stern, and its height from sea level is 236 feet (72 metres).— Internet

Several automakers issue recalls in Chinese market in October

BEIJING, 1 Nov — Several automakers issued recalls in Chinese market in October. Japan's automaker Nissan Motor said on 28 Oct that it would recall 102,817 cars, including the Tiida and Sylphy in China due to a faulty engine control system. According to the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine (GAQSIQ), Honda started a recall a portion of 2007 version of import Acura RL cars in China on 21 Oct, 2010.

Tianjin FAW Toyota Motor Co would recall 134,234 vehicles beginning 15 November due to a flawed design that could affect brake function, GAQSIQ said. Earlier, China's quality watchdog said on 15 Oct that BMW Group began recalling more than 21,000 luxury sedans in China to fix a faulty brake system. Vehicles recalled by BMW in China included 21,383 imported BMW 5, 6 and 7 Series autos manufactured between 14 Dec, 2001, and 23 Nov, 2009, along with 388 Rolls-Royce Phantom luxury cars manufactured between 1 Jan,

2003, and 30 Nov, 2009.

Meanwhile British carmaker Jaguar Land Rover recalled 30 Discovery 3 TDV6 diesel vehicles. Another German luxury auto maker Daimler AG began recalling 9,201 Mercedes-Benz models of Vito and Viano autos in China to fix defective air conditioning systems, according to China's quality watchdog on 12 Oct. Besides, a total of 99 Bentley cars in Chinese mainland would also be recalled in November due to "defective mark", according to the GAQSIQ on 19 Oct.— Xinhua

US plagued by high unemployment, deficits in "Obama 2.0" era

WASHINGTON, 1 Nov—With the mid-term congressional election around the corner and wide prospects that the Republicans might gain a biggersay on the Capital Hill, economists held that the US slackening economy would continue trundling along amid challenges including high unemployment rate and deficits in the "Obama 2.0" era.

Various polls revealed that the US citizens were most concerned about the stubbornly high unemployment rate issue this year, as the world's biggest economy slashed 8.5 million jobs during the worst recession since the Great Depression.

"The high unem-

ployment in the United States is both structural and cyclical, and is likely to continue for many years, unless the US changes dramatically its domestic and international economic policies," Xiao Geng, director of the Columbia Global Center in East Asia, told Xinhua.

Data from the US Labour Department showed that the unemployment rate stood at 9.6 percent in September, and the monthly figure was never lower than 9.5 percent this year to date. Experts noted that financial and housing sectors, which created the boom and bust in the last economic cycle, had not regained their firm footing yet.

Apple now world's fourth largest mobile phone vendor

SAN FRANCISCO, 1 Nov— Apple had surpassed BlackBerry maker Research In Motion (RIM) and other companies, emerging as the fourth largest vendor on the global mobile phone market in the third quarter of 2010, research firm IDC said in a report released on Friday.

Nokia maintained the top spot

in the quarter with the shipments of more than 110 million devices, followed by Samsung and LG Electronics. RIM slipped to number five, one place down compared with the previous quarter.

According to IDC,

Apple shipped 14.1 million iPhones in the quarter while RIM sold 12.4 million units of Blackberry.

The fact that Apple joined RIM to become the second smartphone-only vendor in the top five ranking further showed the growing popularity of smartphones, IDC analysts said.—Xinhua



BG Group announces \$15 bln investment for LNG project in Australia

CANBERRA, 1 Nov—Integrated natural gas company, BG Group on Sunday announced it will commit 15 billion US dollars investment for the first phase of its massive Curtis liquid natural gas (LNG) project in Queensland state of Australia. During a conference held by BG's Australian head Catherine Tanna, the company has approved to spend 15 billion US dollars over the next four years developing two LNG trains with a combined capacity of 8.5 million tons per annum. The Queensland's Curtis LNG Project involves building a liquefied natural gas plant at Gladstone, a 450 km underground pipeline network, and expanding production in gas fields in the Surat Basin around Chinchilla in south west Queensland. BG plans to start shipping LNG to customers in Chile, China, Japan and Singapore from 2014. According to Tanna, the project will increase economic activity in Queensland by 32 billion dollars (31.4 billion US dollars) between 2010 to 2021, and will add nearly 10 percent to the value of Queensland's annual exports.—Xinhua

Let's welcome free and fair general elections on 7th November 2010

The multiparty general elections of the Union of Myanmar that not only the entire Myanmar but also the whole world focus on and aspire will be held on a grand scale on 7 November 2010.

The existing government will assist the Union Election Commission for supervising the election so that it will be free, fair and genuine for the people.

The commission has issued announcements for the parties as good citizens to follow the directives of organizing, holding talks and releasing publications without tarnishing the integrity of the country.

I welcome this election. I warmly welcome it.

Actually, I had never written this type of article before. I didn't have any idea. I have been writing articles regarding the religious affairs (Buddhism) steadfastly. Now, I created this article due to some reasons to write.

It is true. I have sound reasons to write it.

In my childhood, the Pha Sa Pa La (Anti-Fascists People's Freedom League) faced its problems of split. At that time, I remembered two major political parties, one small party and a few independent members of the Parliament in Myanmar before the Pha Sa Pa La got split into two. The Pha Sa Pa La was the first ever party in grasping the State power in all aspects, and the Pa Ma Nya Ta was the main opposition party. A small party with five colours and the independent representatives-elect were fillers.

After the Pha Sa Pa La split into two, U Nu and Thakhin Tin went into the Clean Pha Sa Pa La while U Ba Swe and U Kyaw Nyein became leaders of the Stable Pha Sa Pa La. The Clean Pha Sa Pa La means that the clean members of the Pha Sa Pa La broke away from the original league because unclean cases occurred in the original league. The Stable Pha Sa Pa La claimed that it was a league of stable members who accepted the good and bad legacies of the original Pha Sa Pa La established by Bogyoke Aung San.

When the Stable Pha Sa Pa La and the Clean Pha Sa Pa La became main rivals in the 1960 election, the Pa Ma Nya Ta participated in the

election as a small party.

At this juncture, I would like to recall some past events. Making a stepping-stone of religious affairs, the Clean Pha Sa Pa La organized the Buddhist people who constituted about 90% of the population. The Stable Pha Sa Pa La set its target to democracy socialism whereas the Pa Ma Nya Ta practised Communism.

Although newspapers and journals had to disseminate knowledge to the people with genuine goodwill and without bias, they exposed, purged and wrote sore points of rival parties and persons one another without dignity and shame by giving favour to their choices. The candidates inserted the sore points of their opponents into the talks in canvassing for votes without presenting policies, stances and work programmes of their respective parties.

Due to the fact that the persons of leading role in the State committed such activities, unity and amity disintegrated among the ordinary people such as workers and peasants. In consequence, quarrels and provocations occurred among them. Some murder cases occurred among the employees working together at same worksites and departments. Up to now, I remembered a past event of beating and killing among the workers of some worksites at the jetty on the Strand Road in Kyimyindine.

When the ballots were counted after completion of the election, both the Clean Pha Sa Pa La and the Stable Pha Sa Pa La missed the chances to lead the formation of cabinet after failing to obtain the designated seats in the Parliament. Thus, they needed the more ballots. Although Socialism and Communism were not far from one another in ideology, democracy socialists of the Stable Pha Sa Pa La and aboveground Communists of the Pa Ma Nya Ta were not in unity. At that time, U Nu formed an alliance with the Pa Ma Nya Ta to be able to form the cabinet. He gave a good post to U Aye Maung, leader of the Pa Ma Nya Ta. In fact, U Aye Maung embraced the title of unfaithfulness for power. After forming the cabinet, U Nu renamed the Clean Pha Sa Pa La as the Pa Hta Sa Party.

In studying these past events, it can be seen that the Stable Pha Sa Pa La, the Clean Pha Sa Pa

La and aboveground Pa Ma Nya Ta did not march on the genuine and united way of national politics. They did not focus on peace and prosperity of the nation. Although aims of their parties for the State were obscure, their activities for gaining State power were obvious.

The ruling party Pa Hta Sa at first solved its many internal problems such as sharing of power in the party and grouping of U-Bo faction and Thakhin faction without striving for any development task for the State. The ruling party found faults of opposition MPs who lacked loving-kindness and compassion and abusing power. The opposition MPs were also aggressive against the rival party without rejoicing the success of ruling party to form the cabinet. Although the people had elected candidates democratically, they became selfish bureaucrats. The people who cast votes missed the opportunity to enjoy fruits of democracy. They were in fear of unexpected dangers. Finally, the Revolutionary Council assumed the power of the State on 2 March 1962 due to attempts to secede from the Union.

Reviewing the rivalry and splits of multiparty system, the Revolutionary Council adopted the united single party system. The council chanted to march on towards the goal by practicing single party system and socialism. Beginning April of 1962, Myanmar Socialist Programme Party was established as a single party and cadres of the party organized.

Gradually, the number of party's cadres increased, and then the cadre party was transformed into the people's party. In addition, the Revolutionary Council held the first ever People's Hluttaw of the single party system after approval of the 1974 Constitution by reviewing weak points of the 1947 Constitution and some faults of multiparty system.

There had been some problems despite good progress in its first and second four-year terms. They were worker's unrest instigated by the communists, six districts protest and the incident arising from U Thant funeral service. The condition got worse due to government's announcement on currency demonetization, targeting the wealthy who were using their money as a political tool. This announcement had serious consequences. It was not a matter for rich men to worry, but it caused great hardship for the most people who possessed the small amount of money. The people felt a lot of anger towards the government. The case generated into public outrage.

In the third term of Pyithu Hluttaw, the government faced more difficulties. Chairman U Ne Win hinted at the multiparty and market economy without deviating from the path towards the goal of socialism. He tried in vain to maintain the country with the single party system up to the fourth term of Pyithu Hluttaw. The '88' unrest broke out due to hindrances and interferences of old politicians who were waiting for opportunity to take advantage of his hint.

On 18 September, 1988, Tatmadaw that

saves the nation in times of emergency took State's responsibilities for the sake of the nation in order not to break up, encounter civil war, fall again under the rule of colonialists and collapse as the nation was under threats of opportunists, internal and external destructive elements disguising themselves as democracy activists with the intent to break up the nation, interferences of alien countries, anarchy and riots.

Instructions to be followed in voting process

1. Try to know your serial number of ballot list in order to cast vote without any delay.
2. Voting process can be quick by giving your serial number of ballot list to the ballot list inspector.
3. Put a tick in the box next to the candidate and the symbol you want to choose on your ballot paper.
4. Do not sketch or write anything on your ballot paper, except putting a tick.
5. Do not sketch anything impossible to decide whether it is a tick or cross on your ballot paper.
6. Make sure that your ballot paper is not torn.
7. Put the ballot paper you have put a tick on into the ballot box concerned.

Notable points to avert having votes cancelled

Election Rule 66 (c) states that the following types of ballot papers shall be cancelled.

- (1) A ballot paper that does not have the seal of the commission
- (2) A ballot paper that does not have the signature of the returning officer
- (3) A ballot paper with more than one tick to favour more than one candidate
- (4) A ballot paper with no tick
- (5) A ballot paper with an unclear tick
- (6) A ballot paper the returning officer decides to be a fake one
- (7) A ballot paper with a mark designed to hint
- (8) A torn-up ballot paper

To amplify the provisions on cancelled votes for the knowledge of voters,

- (1) A voter must put a tick in the square box shown against the name of the candidate he favours.
- (2) If a voter puts at least two ticks or crosses in square boxes shown against candidates, the ballot paper is cancelled.
- (3) A vote with no tick is cancelled.
- (4) If a ballot paper carries only one mark in a box, but the mark is not clear enough to decide whether it is a tick or cross, it is cancelled.
- (5) However, if a vote is cast with one tick to favour only one candidate, it can be deemed to be a firm vote even if the tick is in the square box, or it passes through the line of the square box, or it is put diagonally or horizontally, or it has a bent line at its end or not.

To decide whether a ballot paper is valid or invalid is up to the returning officer. Candidates to hluttaws, their election representatives, and the representatives of a polling station are allowed to check the cancelled votes. The reason why a vote is cancelled will be put on record with the designated form.

**It's time to stop
putting clocks
back, says doctor**

LONDON, 1 Nov — Our health and well-being would "vastly" improve if the clocks did not go back this weekend, experts said yesterday. Not putting the clocks back tomorrow but still putting them forward in the spring would increase daylight hours and encourage more outdoor activity, a report in the 'British Medical Journal' suggests. Many chronic illnesses are caused by a lack of physical activity and extending the hours of daylight would lead to an increased opportunity for outdoor leisure activities and more exercise, said Dr Mayer Hillman, senior fellow emeritus at the Policy Studies Institute.

Dr Hillman said research showed people felt happier, more energetic and had lower sickness rates in the longer and brighter days of summer compared to the shorter days of winter.—*Internet*

ROME, 1 Nov — Lazio earned a hard-fought 1-0 win at Palermo on Sunday to open up a four-point lead at the top of Serie A ahead of next weekend's Rome derby.

Brazilian centre-back Andre Dias scored the only goal of the game with a somewhat fortunate volley to condemn the lacklustre Sicilians to defeat and dent their own Champions League aspirations.

Lazio lead champions Inter Milan by four points with AC Milan a single point further back in third.

Inter won 1-0 at Genoa on Friday night while Milan were downed 2-1 at home by fourth-placed Juventus on Saturday.

After this latest victory, Lazio's seventh in nine games this season, it would be hard to argue that they are not genuine title contenders.

But coach Edy Reja still insisted their primary aim would be to avoid relegation.

"We have 22 points, we're getting great results and we have character and fight and we know how to suffer, like we did today," he said.

SHANGHAI, 1 Nov — For the first time in more than five years, Tiger Woods is no longer golf's No. 1 player.

Lee Westwood of England took the top ranking Sunday after PGA champion Martin Kaymer failed to finish among the top two at the Andalucia Masters in Spain.

Westwood is the first European since Nick Faldo in 1994 to be No 1, and the 13th player to be No 1 since the ranking system began in 1986.

Woods had been No 1 since the week before the 2005 US Open, where he

was runner-up. He won the British Open a month later and his ranking rarely has been threatened since.

That changed this year, however, when Woods struggled through his worst season on and off the course. He took a five-month break from golf to cope with confessions of extramarital affairs, which ultimately led to divorce, and his game has not been the same.


