NAY PYI TAW, 4 Jan—*The following is the translation of the message sent by Chairman of the State Peace and Development Council Senior General Than Shwe on the occasion of the 63rd Anniversary Independence Day (2011).*

Esteemed national people,

Today is the 63rd Anniversary Independence Day, a day of historical significance for Myanmar. On this auspicious occasion, I would like to extend my warmest greetings, wishing the entire people every prosperity.

Myanmar people of us are, by nature, not aggressive to others, and willing to lead a peaceful life. However, in late Konbaung Period, our country fell prey to the colonial rule, due to lack of a strong army, and failure to complete the building of a strong army due to various reasons.

It was very inhumane of colonialists that annexed Myanmar through three aggressive wars from 1824 to 1885. In the wars, the people of all national races tried their utmost with the strongest sense of nationalistic vigour to repulse the attacks launched by the colonialists. However, the nation was reduced to a colony, stemming from the great gap of armed power. After occupying Myanmar, colonialists not only oppressed the people to the highest degree, but also implemented varieties of well-prepared schemes to exploit the people. In consequence, the people went through the hell of untold miseries. Doubts and hatred were running high among national races owing to the wedge driven by the colonialists who feared that the people, if they became united, would revolt against them.

Esteemed national people,

In colonial days, the people were in grinding poverty. The colonial education system brought about a class of people who were in favour of living under the colonial rule. However, brilliant, patriotic young people became knowledgeable about political affairs. Peasants and workers staged uprisings against the colonial government to help the nation free itself from the colonial rule, thus inculcating the people with a sense of revolutionary spirit. Becoming convinced that armed revolt was the only way to regain independence, educated, young people established a national army, risking life and limb. In the time of independence struggles, the people had to fall under Fascism which became intolerable. So, the Tatmadaw fought Fascists, in cooperation with the entire people.

After they had driven the Fascists out of the Myanmar soil, colonialists reentered the country. Leaders of Myanmar had to get involved in political campaigns for independence. On the ground of the enmity sowed between national races, national leaders had to hold heart-to-heart discussions with some leaders of national races for all regions of the nation to regain independence simultaneously.

Esteemed national people,

The Union of Myanmar again became an independent, sovereign land on 4 January 1948. So, Independence Day is in its 63rd anniversary this year. It cost greatly for the nation to regain independence and sovereignty. The value of independence and sovereignty is most notice-

able only when they are lost. Naturally, the people take independence and sovereignty for granted. It is not strange certain covetous, aggressive countries are anxious to gain political control over a geographically strategic country like Myanmar. Accordingly, all national races are to remain cohesive forever in order for perpetuation of independence and sovereignty. However much an alien says that he is in favour of the interest of Myanmar, it is merely a sugar-coated speech. Indeed, those who love the motherland best are none other than national brethren. If national solidarity is disintegrated, the nation will relapse into alien rule. The onus is, therefore, on the entire people to put in the fore non-disintegration of the Union and non-disintegration of national solidarity.

Esteemed national people,

The Union of Myanmar has passed through many periods. Unlike past multiparty democracy elections, general elections for the practice of multiparty democracy system were held successfully without any electoral violence. This is the pride of the nation and the people.

In its time, the Tatmadaw has improved political, economic and social infrastructures considerably to build the nation into a peaceful, modern one. Its effort to improve infrastructures in the national interest has gone down to the annals of the history of the nation. That is a fine tradition of the Tatmadaw, which shows benevolent attitude to the people and duty-consciousness. After the nation sees a new government elected by the people in line with the new constitution, all national people have to participate harmoniously in building a new nation with already-built foundations. And with a sense of Union Spirit and patriotic spirit, the entire people have to expedite the tasks for already-achieved stability, community peace, security, the rule of law, national unity, development and democratization.

Esteemed national people,

Ensuring perpetuation of the Union is at the forefront of building the Union of Myanmar. Today, some countries, despite their being developed ones, are on the verge of disintegration of the union and civil wars.

The Union of Myanmar is blessed with vast tracts of waters and lands, rich natural resources, temperate climate patterns, food security, and geographically strategic location. So, surely certain countries are desirous of having influence over Myanmar. To break up the Union and national cohesion is the major as well as only way to weaken Myanmar. In order to implement that point, external elements will be likely to organize and mobilize participation of some nationals who lack political awareness to disrupt national development. Therefore, I would like to urge the entire people to guard the nation with political awareness against any forms of disruptions in order that the mother country's independence and sovereignty will never be under alien influence.

Suspect loses head in attempted bomb attack

NAY PYI TAW, 3 Jan—A bomb explosion occurred near the kitchen of the home of a staff member in the compound of the auto exchange of the Myanmar Posts and Telecommunications in Ward (1), Kya-in Seikkyi, Kayin State, at about 1.40 am today, blowing off the head of the suspect bomber. The blast caused damage to the left brick wall of the kitchen, six corrugated iron sheets in the roof, a main door and two windows. Found about two feet from the building was the head; and about six feet from the compound, the right foot cut from the man.

An investigation is being made into the case in cooperation with

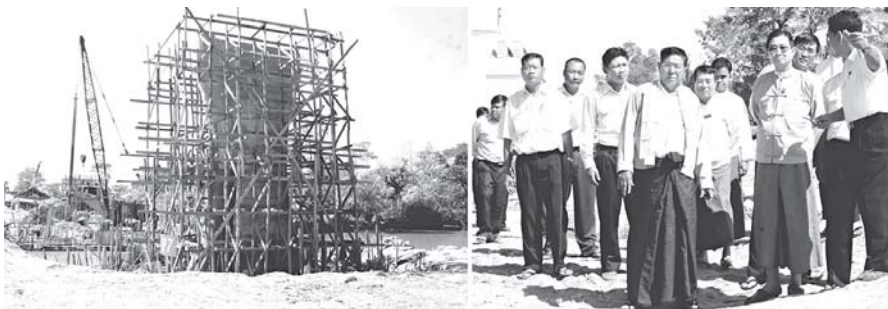

Iran Guards shoot down two 'Western spy' drones

TEHERAN, 3 Jan—Iran's Revolutionary Guards have shot down two "Western spy" drones in the Gulf, the *Fars* news agency quoted a top commander of the elite military force as saying on Sunday.

"Westerners have a series of capabilities which cannot be ignored, especially satellites, or for example they have spy planes which can take pictures in some places," Amir Ali Hajizadeh, head of the air force wing of the Guards said.

He said that the drones were mainly being used in Iraq and Afghanistan but "some violations against our soil" have also occurred.

"And we have so far downed many of their advanced spy planes. In the Persian Gulf, we have downed two of their planes and this is the first time that we are saying it," Hajizadeh said without specifying when exactly the drones were shot down.—*Internet*

Australian cinema roof collapses, injuring 36

SYDNEY, 3 Jan—Thirty-six people escaped serious injury when the ceiling of an Australian cinema partially collapsed Monday after heavy rain, scrambling under chairs to avoid falling debris, police and reports said.

Police said 36 people suffered minor wounds after a fierce storm in the regional centre of Bathurst, 175 kilometres (110 miles)

west of Sydney, brought down false ceilings.

"All these patients received minor injuries, including cuts and abrasions, with the most serious injury occurring to one person being a shoulder injury," ambulance service paramedic Craig Pusser said.

"That person has been conveyed to hospital." Early reports said 16 people had been trapped in the collapse but police said while all movie-goers had been rescued, emergency personnel were conducting a secondary sweep to ensure nobody had been overlooked.

Reports said that children were among those involved in the dramatic incident which occurred at about 0145 GMT.

Iraq gun and bomb attacks kill four, wound 18 same

BAGHDAD, 3 Jan—Bomb and gun attacks across Iraq killed at least nine people on Sunday, including six members of the Iraqi security forces, security and medical officials said.

In a two-hour stint of the early evening, a traffic police colonel, two other police, an army captain and an engineer were gunned down in five separate attacks in Baghdad, an interior ministry source said on condition of anonymity.

Gunmen also severely wounded a colonel with the interior ministry, he said, adding that security was stepped up in central Baghdad after the attacks.

Two people, including a soldier, were killed and three others wounded by a car bomb targeting an army patrol in Al-Qayyara, 50 kilometres (30 miles) from the northern City of Mosul, First Lieutenant Khattab Mohammed said.—*Internet*

NATO service member killed in south Afghanistan

KABUL, 3 Jan—NATO forces captured two key militant leaders in Afghanistan, while a service member was killed in a deadly bombing that raised to three the number of coalition troops killed since the new year began, the multinational alliance said Sunday.

The NATO fatalities — all in the Taliban's

traditional southern stronghold — opened 2011 on a grim note for the international coalition. One of the two service members killed Saturday was identified as British by that country's defence ministry.

NATO officials say they are making significant progress in the war, but also note that the gains are reversible. Militants are using Pakistan as a base for some of their operations and the government of President Hamid Karzai is widely seen by many Afghans and international observers as so far unable to offer key services to a population struggling for a sense of normalcy after years of war.—*Internet*

Bomb kills civilian in west Afghanistan

KABUL, 3 Jan—A police official in the western Afghan Province of Herat says a bomb planted outside a butcher shop has killed a civilian.

Noor Khan Nekzad, the spokesman for the provincial police chief, said the bomb, believed to be set on a timer, exploded at 8 am on Monday in the City of Herat. Nekzad

said four other civilians were wounded.

He said the butcher supplied meat to the Afghan army, and the bomb apparently targeted security forces.

The Taliban have expanded their attacks from their traditional southern strongholds to regions throughout the country, including areas that had been relatively calm.—*Internet*

Magnitude-7.1 quake shakes southern Chile

SANTIAGO, 3 Jan—A magnitude-7.1 earthquake shook southern Chile on Sunday, prompting tens of thousands to flee the coast for higher ground amid fears it could generate a tsunami like the one that ravaged the area last year. There were no reports of deaths or damage, and Vicente Nunez, head of the National Emergency Office, said no tsunami alert was issued.

"There has been no harm to people, no harm to property," Nunez said. "We will continue monitoring."

The Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre in Hawaii also said a destructive Pacific Ocean-wide tsunami was not expected. President Sebastian Pinera urged calm in an address to the nation.

"There was an exercise of self-evacuation, which is exactly what we have asked people to do," Pinera said. "Fortunately we do not have to lament accidents or losses of life."

Some cell-phone communications and electrical power were knocked out in the Araucania region where the quake was centred, 370 miles (595 kilometres) south-southwest of the capital, Santiago.

Scents latest weapons in fight against sea lamprey

HURON BEACH, 3 Jan—In the never-ending battle to prevent blood-sucking sea lamprey from wiping out some of the most popular fish species in the Great Lakes, biologists are developing new weapons that exploit three certainties in the eel-like parasites' lives: birth, sex and death.

Researchers are beginning the third and final year of testing lab-refined mating pheromones — scents emitted by male lampreys to attract females. They're also working on a mixture with the stench of rotting lamprey flesh, which live ones detest, and another that smells of baby lampreys, which adults love. If proven

effective, the chemicals will be deployed across the region to steer the aquatic vermin to where they can be trapped or killed.

Early results appear promising. Yet no one expects the lures and repellents to finally rid the lakes of the despised invader and enable fisheries managers in the US and Canada to end a battle that has cost more than \$400 million over five decades. Especially when a single spawning female lays up to 60,000 eggs.

China to explore Mars with Russia this year

BEIJING, 3 Jan—China's first Mars probe is expected to be launched in October this year in a joint operation with Russia after a two-year delay, state media reported Sunday. The probe, *Yinghuo-1*, was due to blast off in October 2009 with Russia's "*Phobos Explorer*" from the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan but the launch was postponed, the official *Xinhua* news agency said.

Quoting an unnamed expert at the China Academy of Space Technology, the report said the blast-off had been pushed back to October this year. It added that China planned to launch a Mars probe on its own in 2013. According to previous

reports, the orbiter is due to probe the Martian space environment with a special focus on what happened to the water that appears to have once been abundant on the planet's surface.

China has already begun probing the moon and this will be the next step in its ambitious space exploration programme, which it aims to be on a par with those of the United States and Russia.

It currently has a probe — the *Chang'e 2* — orbiting the moon and carrying out various tests in preparation for the expected 2013 launch of the *Chang'e-3*, which it hopes will be its first unmanned lunar landing.—Internet

No word from stuck NASA Mars rover Spirit

LOS ANGELES, 3 Jan—The odometre on the Mars rover Spirit has been stuck at 4.8 miles for more than 1 1/2 years and has been incommunicado since March.

This double dose of bad luck hangs over the scrappy spacecraft, which marks its seventh year on Mars on Monday.

NASA doesn't know if the Spirit is dead or alive, but it's diligently listening for any peep as the rover remains mired in a sand trap.

"There's a realistic possibility that Spirit may never wake up again," said Dave Lavery, Mars rovers programme executive at NASA headquarters.

A pair of Mars orbiters has been making daily overhead passes listening for a signal from Spirit, which became stuck in April 2009 while driving backward. After several attempts to free it were unsuccessful, Spirit got new instructions to conduct science observations while mired in the sand.

It suddenly stopped talking with Earth last March and is presumed to be in hibernation to conserve power. During this deep sleep, communications and other activities are suspended so that energy can go to heating and battery recharging.—Internet

Google exploring digital newsstand

SAN FRANCISCO, 3 Jan—Google Inc has approached several magazine publishers about creating a digital newsstand, in a move that could open a new front in the Internet company's rivalry with Apple Inc, according to a news report.

The digital newsstand would provide a way for media companies to sell versions of their publications designed for tablet PCs and smartphones based on Google's Android operating system, according to a story in the *Wall Street Journal* on Sunday, citing anonymous sources.

Google has discussed the venture with publishers including Time Warner Inc's Time Inc unit, Conde Nast and Hearst Corp, and has told some publishers it would take a smaller cut of revenue than the 30 percent that Apple typically takes from iTunes sales, the report said.

Google has also offered to provide publishers with certain personal data of customers who purchase the digital versions of their publications.

The report said that Apple is also planning several changes with its iTunes online store, including making

it easier for publishers to sell subscriptions — in addition to single issue sales — as well as the possibility of sharing more customer information with publishers.

People turn to technology to help control impulses

NEW YORK, 3 Jan—Dan Nainan can't trust himself to work at his computer without clicking on distractions, so he uses an Internet-blocking programme to shut down his web access twice a day.

"I'm sorry, but try as I might, I could never, ever do this on my own," said the New York City comedian who's struggling to finish a book. "I wish I could, but I just don't have the discipline."

Nainan's system of two, two-hour blocks is one example of how Americans are trying to control their impulses using technology that steps in to enforce good behaviour.

With the new year days away, many tools are now available to help people stay in line, including a GPS-enabled app that locks down texting once a car gets rolling and a programme that cuts off credit-card spending. Another device monitors your workout and offers real-time voice feedback.

2011 starts with a glitch for some iPhone users

CUPERTINO, 3 Jan—Many iPhone customers had some explaining to do after they overslept to start the new year, due to a glitch in the gadget's alarm clock feature.

Users who set their iPhone alarm for a single wake-up rather than recurring use found the alarm didn't go off with the year's arrival, Apple Inc spokeswoman Natalie Harrison said Sunday.

A fix is in the works, and all iPhone alarms will work properly starting Monday, she said.

The glitch affects iPhones using Apple's latest iOS 4.0 operating system, including earlier versions of the smart phone whose users have downloaded the latest software.

It wasn't immediately clear what caused the alarm problem, or how many iPhone users were affected. Online postings on blogs and social media sites described people being late for work, church services and other appointments on Saturday and Sunday because of the problem.

The problem is the second in two months involving the iPhone's alarm clock.—Internet

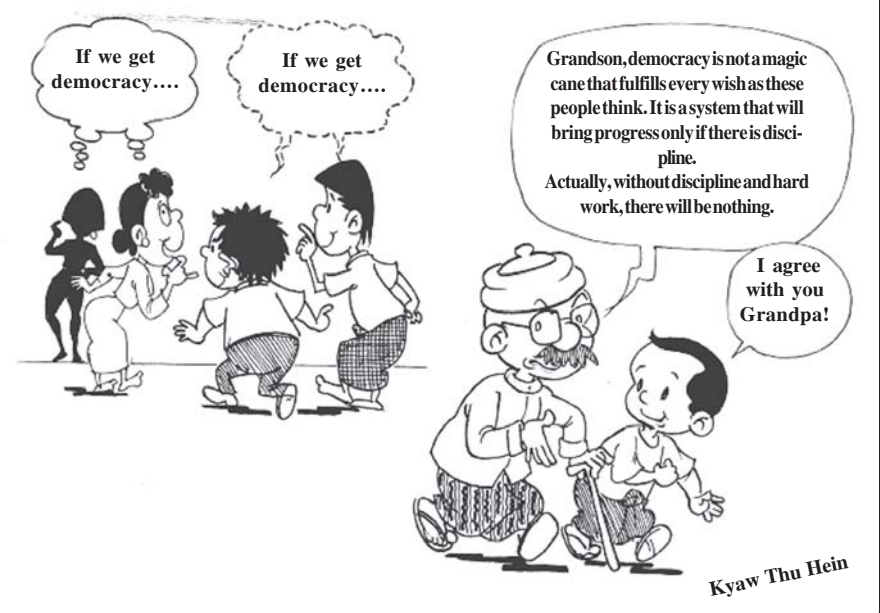

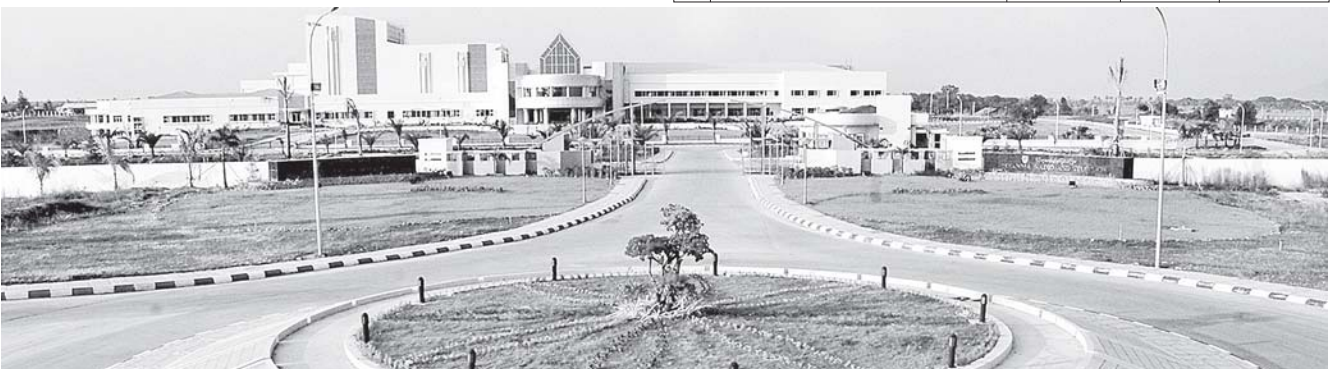

Hungry pet python kills two-year-old

ORLANDO, 3 Jan — The pet python that strangled a two-year-old girl in Sumter County, Florida, 18 months ago hadn't been fed in about a month and had escaped from its tank 10 times since its last meal — a road-kill squirrel, according to newly released documents.

Gypsy, the 2.6m albino python, was most likely hungry when it escaped its terrarium and attacked Shaianna Hare in a crib, according to investigation documents examined by *The Orlando Sentinel*.

A review of reports regarding the tragedy on 1 July, 2009, show that the child's mother and the mother's boyfriend had kept the snake in violation of wildlife rules and apparently could not afford to feed it. The death spurred a statewide hunt of exotic reptiles and fuelled a crackdown on the imported constrictors.

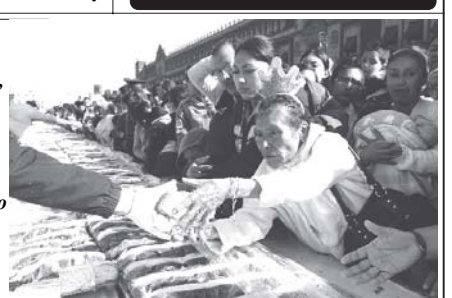

Tsonga was struck down again in October and forced to miss the Davis Cup final in which

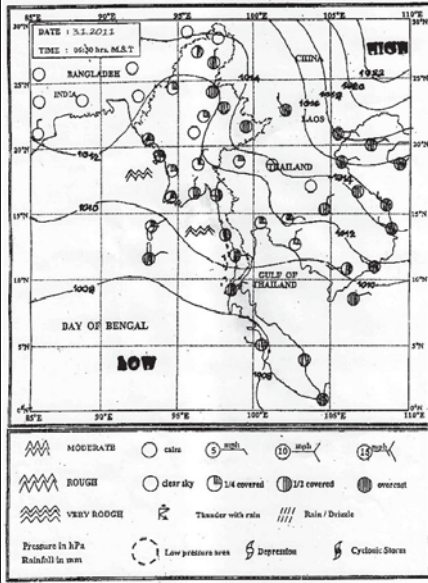
France lost 3-2 to Serbia in Belgrade last month.

Bomb threat on Turkish airline plane found to be hoax

ISTANBUL, 3 Jan—The Turkish police said here on Monday that it is investigating a bomb threat on a Turkish Airlines (THY) passenger plane, so far no explosives were found and no arrests were made.

According to the semi-official *Anatolia* news agency, a short time after the plane took off on Sunday from Ercan Airport in Lefkosa, a cabin attendant of the Airbus 319 THY plane found a note claiming there was a bomb on board and would explode in 45 minutes.

The plane landed at Istanbul's Ataturk Airport safely and its 105 passengers and crew were evacuated.

After the plane was swiftly emptied and searched together with the baggage, the threat was found to be a hoax but police are investigating in a bid to ascertain who was responsible for the note.—*Xinhua*

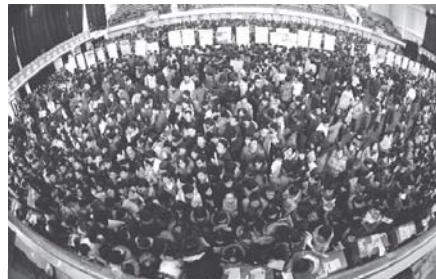
