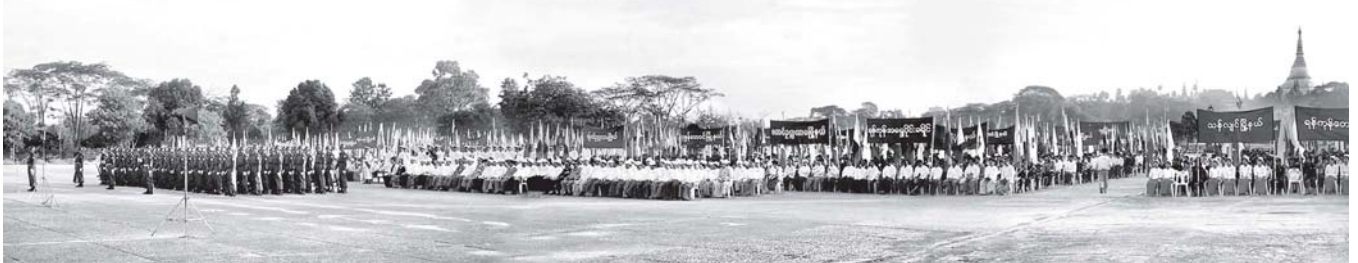

## Rich deposits of oil and gas discovered in Pahtolon Oilfield

The Ministry of Energy is in constant exploration of oil and gas to help fulfill the domestic demand. From 1963 to 1985, it found out onshore oil deposits in Man, Pyay, Myanaung, Shwepyitha, Letpanto, Petpei, Mintegy, Htauksharbin, Htantapin, Tetma and Kani, and gas deposits in Mottama Offshore Oilfield.

According to Foreign Investment Law enacted in 1988, the Myanma Oil and Gas Enterprise under the Ministry of Energy invited foreign oil companies and

started to explore potential regions for oil and gas with joint-venture system with the aim of boosting production of oil and gas. In the process, it systematically designated 49 onshore blocks along with 26 blocks in Rakhine, Mottama and Taninthayi offshore oilfields. The exploration of potential regions led to the discovery of onshore oil and gas deposits in Kyaukkhwet, Aphyauk, Nyaungdon, Thagyidaung, Zabei, Inndaw, Htangaing and Maubin; Yadana, Sein,

Padamya and Zawtika gas deposits in Mottama Offshore Oilfield; gas deposits in Yedagun gas field in offshore Taninthayi region; and Shwe Thabarwa gas field in offshore Rakhine region. Production of oil and gas has been launched those fields.

According to the geological conditions, Myanmar has 14 sedimentary geological valleys in inland regions that have potential for oil and gas deposits. Of them, (See page 8)

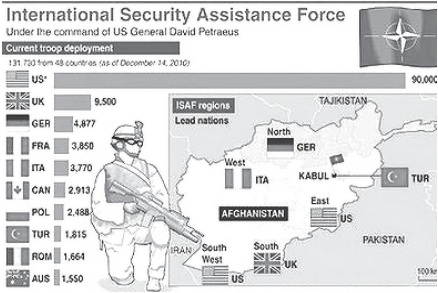

### Iraqi woman killed, female lawyer seriously wounded in Baghdad violence

BAGHDAD, 5 Jan—An old woman was killed and a female lawyer seriously wounded in bomb and gunfire attacks in Baghdad on Tuesday, an Interior Ministry source said.

An old woman was killed and her son wounded when a bomb exploded at the door of their home in Abu Ghraib area, just west of Baghdad, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident, Dhuha Ali, a female lawyer, was critically wounded when gunmen opened fire from silenced weapons at her car in Baghdad's central district of al-Alawi, the source said.

Violence and sporadic high-profile bomb attacks continue in the Iraqi cities despite the decrease of violence over the last three years.—*Xinhua*

### Child scavenges for family's survival in Afghanistan

KABUL, 5 Jan—Five-year-old Marjan sniffles from the cold as she struggles under her load. Hoisted on her back is a bag almost as big as she is.

Instead of going to school, Marjan scavenges for hours with her 10-year-old aunt collecting trash. It is a heavy burden for such a

small child but a necessary one. The trash she collects is what her family uses as fuel for cooking and, more importantly, to fend off Kabul's bitter winter.

It is a matter of life and death for someone so young.

UNICEF, the UN children's agency, says that Afghanistan is the worst place in the world to be a child. One in five children do not live past the age of five. Afghanistan is second only to Sierra Leone when it comes to child mortality.

Most of those deaths are caused by curable childhood diseases and malnutrition, compounded by the security situation, which means that parents are unable to access proper health care.—*Internet*

### Iraqi killed, four Iranian pilgrims wounded in Iraq's violence

BAGHDAD, 5 Jan— An Iraqi government employee was shot dead and four Iranian pilgrims were wounded in a gunfire and a bomb attack in Baghdad on Wednesday, an Interior Ministry source said.

An employee in the Iraqi Housing Ministry was killed when gunmen using silenced weapons opened fire on him while driving his car in al-

Waziriyah District in northern central Baghdad, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident, a roadside bomb went off near a bus carrying Iranian pilgrims travelling in Taji area north of Baghdad, wounding four pilgrims, the source said.

Militants frequently attacked Iranian

pilgrims who flock in large numbers to Iraq to visit holy Shiite shrines since the US-led invasion in 2003 that toppled former dictator Saddam Hussein.

Violence and sporadic high-profile bomb attacks continue in the Iraqi cities despite the dramatic decrease of violence over the last three years.

### Afghan police detects suicide vest, detain four suspected insurgents

PUL-E-KHUMRI, 5 Jan— Police found a suicide vest in northern Baghlan Province on Tuesday and thus foiled a possible terrorist attack there, provincial police chief said.

“Acting upon a tip off, police stopped a car outside provincial capital Pul-e-Khumri 160 km north of capital city Kabul and found a suicide vest hidden inside a bag of rice,” Abdul Rahman Rahimi told newsmen at a Press conference here.

Police by discovering and defusing the suicide vest have thwarted a terrorist attack, he further said. Four persons have been apprehended in this regard, he added. This is the second terrorist attempts of Taleban militants foiled by police in the past couple of weeks there, the police chief Rahimi said, adding police identified and apprehended an explosive-laden car in Baghlan Province about two weeks ago.—*Xinhua*

### Science, bugs team up to fight hemlock-eating pest

CONCORD, 5 Jan—For nearly 60 years, scientists have watched helplessly as a war of bug vs hemlock played out from Georgia to Maine. Now they've got a new weapon in their arsenal — another bug — and say the tide is turning, at least in New England.

The hemlock woolly adelgid, native to Asia, was discovered in Virginia in 1951. Since then, it has spread to suck up the sap of the stately evergreens in at least 16 Eastern states, including in New England, which hasn't lost large numbers of trees yet.

A beetle that eats the adelgid (pronounced uh-DEL-jid) was found in Idaho and was introduced to forests in Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine and New York in 2007. Since then, entomologists have determined that the predator, which is able to withstand cold weather better than its cousins, is doing its job.—Internet

### Genes predict hair colour, say scientists

PARIS, 5 Jan—Samples of DNA can give a high-probability estimate of someone's hair colour, a finding that will be a boon for forensic scientists, according to a new study published on Tuesday.

DNA taken from blood, sperm, saliva or skin cells can determine with more than 90-percent accuracy whether a person has red hair or black hair, and with an accuracy of more than 80 percent as to whether their hair is blond or brown, say its authors.

The technique, published in the European journal *Human Genetics*, can even differentiate between hair colours that are similar, such as red and reddish blond and blond and dark blond.

"That we are now making it possible to predict different hair colours from DNA represents a major breakthrough because, so far, only red hair colour, which is rare, could be estimated from DNA," said Manfred Kayser, a forensic molecular biology professor at Erasmus Medical Centre in Rotterdam in the Netherlands.

The research is based on 13 telltale signatures of DNA in 11 genes, which matched hair colours in hundreds of Europeans. It was based on hair on the head, and further research is needed to predict the colour of body hair.—Reuters

### NASA wants shuttle fuel tank reinforced

CAPE CANAVERAL, 5 Jan—NASA on Tuesday began modifications to shuttle Discovery's fuel tank, hoping to thwart a potential debris hazard during a planned February launch to the International Space Station.

Managers decided to buttress at least 34 of the tank's 108 metal support structures after cracks were discovered in five beams following a launch attempt on 5 November.

The launch initially was scuttled by an unrelated hydrogen fuel leak, but inspectors also found a 21-inch long crack in the fuel tank's insulating foam, which likewise would have mixed liftoff, said shuttle programme manager John Shannon.

The concern is that bits of cracked foam could break off and hit the shuttle during liftoff, such as what happened during the 2003 launch of shuttle Columbia. The damage caused the shuttle to break apart as it flew through the atmosphere for landing 16 days later, killing seven astronauts aboard.—Internet

### Remotes coming to Netflix-streaming devices

LOS GATOS, 5 Jan—Netflix fans will soon be able to use a remote controller to flick through their flicks available for streaming over the Internet on devices such as TV sets, Blu-ray players and others.

Netflix Inc said Tuesday that consumer electronics companies will begin selling remotes with "Netflix" buttons in the spring. The buttons will bring up the Netflix screen on users' TV sets, providing easier access to TV shows and movies. Though the button will likely only save couch potatoes a few seconds of time, its appearance is another sign that Netflix has become a household name.

Netflix says the list of companies that will make the remotes for some new

Blu-ray players include Best Buy's in-house Dynex brand, Memorex, Panasonic, Samsung, Sony and Toshiba. Some Blu-ray devices can connect to the Internet, which lets users stream movies.

Sharp, Sony and Toshiba will also place the Netflix button on some new Internet-connected TVs. Netflix, based in Los Gatos, Calif, has been spending heavily to obtain the streaming rights to movies and TV shows to help lure more customers and shift existing subscribers away from DVDs, which cost more to distribute.

Shares of Netflix rose 18 cents to \$181.55 in after-hours trading, having closed up \$2.96 at \$181.37.

### Impregnating plastics with carbon dioxide

NEW YORK, 5 Jan—Everyone has heard that carbon dioxide is responsible for global warming. But the gas also has some positive characteristics. Researchers are now impregnating plastics with compressed CO<sub>2</sub> in a process that could lead to new applications ranging from coloured contact lenses to bacteria-resistant door handles.

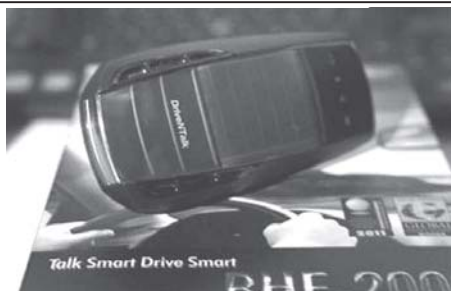
CO<sub>2</sub> is more than just a waste product. In fact, it has a variety of uses: the chemical industry makes use of this colourless gas to produce urea, methanol and salicylic acid. Urea is a fertilizer, methanol is a fuel additive, and salicylic acid is an ingredient in aspirin.

Researchers at the Fraunhofer Institute for Environmental, Safety and Energy Technology UMSICHT in Oberhausen are pursuing a new idea by testing how carbon dioxide can be used to impregnate plastics. At a temperature of 30.1 degrees Celsius and a pressure of 73.8 bar, CO<sub>2</sub> goes into a supercritical state that gives the gas solvent-like properties. In this state, it can be introduced into polymers, or act as

a "carrier" in which dyes, additives, medical compounds and other substances can be dissolved.

"We pump liquid carbon dioxide into a high-pressure container with the plastic components that are to be impregnated, then steadily increase the temperature and the pressure until the gas reaches the supercritical state. When that state is reached, we increase the pressure further. At 170 bar, pigment in powder form dissolves completely in the CO<sub>2</sub> and then diffuses with the gas into the plastic. The whole process only takes a few minutes. When the container is opened, the gas escapes through the surface of the polymer but the pigment stays behind and cannot subsequently be wiped off," explains Dipl.-Ing. Manfred Renner, a scientist at Fraunhofer UMSICHT.

In tests, the researchers have even managed to impregnate polycarbonate with nanoparticles that give it antibacterial properties.—Internet

## Blood test for cancer gets US boost

WASHINGTON, 5 Jan— Pharmaceutical giant Johnson & Johnson said it is partnering with US doctors to improve a blood test that could replace biopsies and transform the field of cancer treatment.

The Circulating Tumor Cell (CTC) technology, which inventors describe as a “liquid biopsy,” has been touted as a revolutionary approach to diagnosing cancer since it was first developed several years ago by doctors at Massachusetts General Hospital.

It works by detecting cancer cells that have detached from a tumor and are circulating at very low levels in the blood.

But until now, the technology has been unable to do much more than count cells, giving doctors an idea of what is happening with a patient’s cancer but not delivering the precision that the latest version can.

“The new technology allows us to not just count them but to understand the molecular changes that lead to the disease progression that is occurring in the cells,” said Nicholas Dracopoli, vice president of Ortho Biotech Oncology Research and Development (ORD), a unit of Johnson & Johnson.

With just a single blood draw, the new technology can find and trap a

single cancer cell from among a billion blood cells without the patient having to undergo invasive and often painful surgical biopsy procedures.

“That will then allow us to do sophisticated molecular analysis of those isolated cells so that we can then look and see if there are therapies that are optimally suited to a patient with those particular abnormalities,” Dracopoli said.—*Internet*

## Average child may get seven radiation scans by age 18

CHICAGO, 5 Jan—The first large study to examine the use of X-rays, CT scans and other medical radiation in children estimates the average child will get more than seven radiation scans by age 18, a potentially worrisome trend.

Most of the scans involve X-rays, which use relatively little radiation. But there is growing concern about CT scans, which entail far more radiation and can raise the risk for cancer, particularly in children.

The study found that X-rays of the chest, hand and foot are the most common. Forty-two percent of children had at least one radiation procedure and 25 percent had two or more during the three-year study period. Dental X-rays were not included in the

study.

More troubling is that 8 percent of the children got at least one CT scan. And more than 3 percent of children got two or more CT scans.

“That’s particularly concerning,” said lead author Dr Adam Dorfman of University of Michigan Medical School in Ann Arbor. “Today’s children are undoubtedly getting many more of these studies than previous generations.”

The rapid growth of CT scans, which provide extremely detailed pictures of the body, and other medical imaging in recent decades has led to big increases in the average American’s total radiation exposure.

The new study, published online on Monday in *Archives of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine*, is a best-ever snapshot of radiation use in US children. —*Internet*

NEW YORK, 5 Jan—The No 1 visited website in 2010 has raised \$500 mil from Goldman Sachs and a Russian investment firm, the *New York Times* said, citing unnamed sources. Goldman invested \$450 mil and Digital Sky Technologies \$50 mil, the *Times* said.

The SEC is said to be looking into the booming trade in private shares of popular social networking sites. Once a company hits 500 shareholders, it must disclose financial information to the public, even if it hasn’t done an IPO.—*Internet*

Rival Borders Group Inc (BGP.N), which has been seeking financing to fight credit woes, said on Monday that two top executives resigned. Its shares fell 8 percent after-hours. Borders has been hurt by an industry-wide decline in sales of physical books and has not developed an e-reader to compete with Amazon’s popular Kindle device. Barnes & Noble said that same-store sales, or sales at superstores open at least 15 months, rose 9.7 percent for the nine-week period ended on 1 January.—*Reuters*



## China’s 2010 GDP growth likely 10 percent

BEIJING, 5 Jan — China expects to register a double digit annual economic growth rate in 2010, the country’s central bank governor said.

Zhou Xiaochuan, in a speech carried on the Web site of the People’s Bank of China, said the country’s economy had returned to normal and that the 2010 economic growth was estimated to reach about 10 percent, the state-run *Xinhua* news agency reported. The governor called for prudence in setting macroeconomic policies and the need to conduct counter-cyclical adjustments against “over-expansion.”

Zhou said the government would promote a market-oriented reform of the interest rate regime in a gradual and unwavering way. China remains under pressure to control inflation and liquidity. Inflation hit a 28-month high of 5.1 percent in November, against the government’s target to keep it far below that level. *Xinhua* reported this week China was “very likely” to announce interest rate hikes in the New Year to cool the property market. Any such step would follow similar increases in October and December.—*Internet*

## Consumer bankruptcies hit 5-year high in 2010

NEW YORK, 5 Jan—The number of US consumers who filed for bankruptcy protection in 2010 was the highest in five years, and the figure could rise as Americans struggle with excess debt in an uncertain economy, a report issued Monday said.

Roughly 1.53 million

consumer bankruptcy petitions were filed in 2010, up 9 percent from 1.41 million in 2009, according to the American Bankruptcy Institute, citing data from the National Bankruptcy Research Centre.

Filings in December totaled 118,146, up 4 percent from a year

earlier and 3 percent from November’s total.

The full-year total is the highest since the 2.04 million recorded in 2005, when there was a rush to seek bankruptcy protection ahead of a stricter federal law taking effect in October of that year.

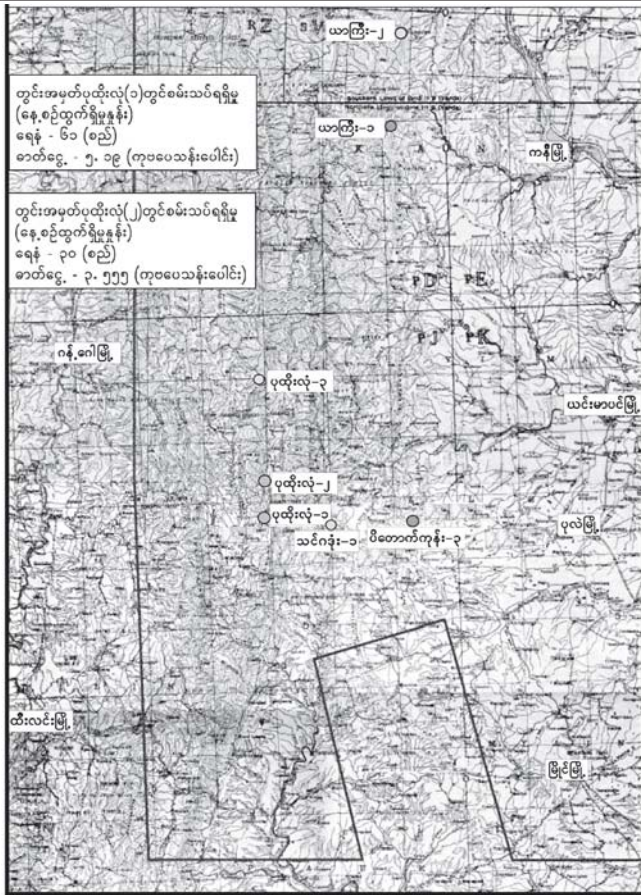

### Rich deposits of oil and gas discovered...

those in central Myanmar, Pyay and Delta are also under exploration now.

Recent test running of the oil-wells in Pahtolon, one of the oil blocks in central Myanmar, shows that the oilfield has rich oil and gas deposits.

Pahtolon test oil-wells in Onshore Oil Exploration Block D covering Gangaw Township in Magway Region, and Pale Township and Kani Township in Monywa

District, Sagaing Region. Standing at an altitude of 4000 feet with an area of 3,048,320 acres, the block is situated on Pontaung Ponnya mountain range. The Myanma Oil and Gas Enterprise and SIPC Myanmar Petroleum Co Ltd from the People's Republic of China signed Production Sharing Contract-PSC on 3 September 2004, and since then they have been exploring regions for oil and gas deposits.

SIPC Myanmar Petroleum Co Ltd launched 2D

Seismic work in 2007. Up to 2009, it has measured 2918 2D Seismic line kilometers. According to the 2D Seismic lines, four test oil-wells were sunk in Pahtolon and Yagyi oil-fields; and two test oil-wells in Thingadone and Padauk oilfields.

Pahtolon test oil-well No (1) is about 10 miles northeast of Kyaw Village, Gangaw Township, Magway Region. It was sunk on 2 September 2007. On 2 June 2008, it had been sunk as deep as 12,461. Tests were carried out in the sand layer as deep as between 7813 feet

and 7895 feet, and the sand layer between 7878 feet and 7906 feet. Then, 61 barrels of condensate and 5.19 million cubic feet of gas were produced per day.

The company sank Pahtolon test oil-well No (2), 14 miles northeast of Kyaw Village as deep as 12,307 feet on 1 August 2009. Tests carried out in the sand layer as deep as between 7743 feet and 7766 feet on 27 July 2010, and it produced 30 barrels of condensate and 3.555 million cubic feet of gas per day.

In the estimation of the company, the deposit stored as many as 909 billion cubic feet of gas, and 7.16 million barrels of condensate in Pahtolon oilfield. More oil-wells will soon be sunk in the areas of test oil-well Nos (1) and (2). Pahtolon Region is expected to produce gas and condensate for many years.

SIPC discovered 42 traps of oil and gas in Gangaw, Pahtolon, Mahutaung, Kani and

Thingadone oilfields in Block D, and in the boundary of Letpanto and Kyaukkhwet blocks being undertaken by MOGE. It sank potential oil-wells in three hopeful traps in Pahtolon, Mahutaung and Thingadone. For the time being, it is sinking test oil-wells with two drilling machines that can penetrate the ground as deep as more than 20,000 feet.

Now, it is sinking test oil-well No (3) in Padaukkone, about 16 miles west of Pale, Pale Township, Monywa District, Sagaing Region, and test oil-well No (1) in Thingadone, 10 miles east of Kyaw Village. The test oil-wells were found potential for oil and gas. Now, the company keeps sinking the oil-wells as deep as the targeted site. When those test oil-wells have been sunk, test oil-well Nos (3) and (1-1) in Pahtolon. When the sinking of the test oil-wells is completed and volumes of potential oil and gas can be estimated more exactly, the Development Plan will

be put into action to produce gas on a commercial scale in Pahtolon Region.

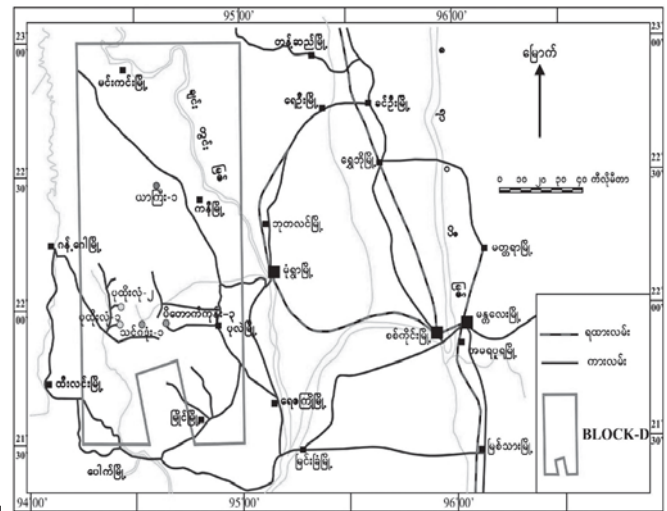
While the Development Plan is ongoing, more test oil-wells will be sunk according to the geological results in the potential areas in Block D, and 3D Seismic work will be carried out thoroughly in Pahtolon oil-field.

Based on the geological and geophysical results, the number of test oil-wells to be sunk and volumes of oil and gas will be estimated down to the smallest detail.

In-dept survey reveals that oil and gas can be produced on a commercial scale only in the oil-wells of Pahtolon Region. Geological positions have been discovered that oil and gas can be produced on a large scale in Block D. If the test oil-wells in Block D are found successful, the block can be a large deposit of oil and gas.

Pyinmana-Taungnyo Road Project is being implemented under the aegis of Public Works of the Ministry of Construction and the supervision of Chief Engineer U Win Pe. In that regard, the project is divided into parts: the section between mile post Nos 12/0 and 14/0 which has been completed by over 80 percent; between 14/0 and 16/0; and between 16/0 and 17/4 and Kyweshin Bridge at mile post No 17/4.

Deputy Superintending Engineer (Civil) U Than Toe Aung of Road Group (5) said that

the road section between mile post Nos 12/0 and 14/0 they were undertaking was divided into five parts; that in some parts, bad soil was replaced with selected soil; that they had to construct three medium bridges in the section; that the 18 feet wide two-lane Pyinmana-Taungnyo Road Section was being upgraded to a 48 feet wide four-lane one; that they were working day in, day out for high quality of the road; and that on completion, the road would also become the beginning part of Pyinmana-Taungnyo-Taungdwingyi road section and Pyinmana-Taungnyo-Kanbya-Magway Road.

Upon completion, Kyweshin Road will be five miles and furlongs long and 48 feet wide. And Kyweshin Bridge at the end of the road

section will be 180 feet long with two five-foot-wide pedestrian walkways on it. The bridge lies at mile post No 17/4 near Kyweshin Village, Nay Pyi Taw District. It will be able to withstand 60 tons of loads. Its clearance area will be 60 feet wide and 12 feet high. The broad crest type facility is being undertaken by Bridge Group (3).

Now, both urban and border areas are enjoying development owing to the benevolent attitude the government shows to the nation by building roads and bridges everywhere necessary throughout the nation.

## Israel arrests staff from British consulate

LONDON, 5 Jan—Israeli authorities have arrested two locally hired workers at the British consulate general in Jerusalem who were reportedly linked to a plot to attack a stadium, the Foreign Office in London said.

“I can confirm that two members of the local staff at the consulate general in Jerusalem have been arrested by Israeli authorities,” a Foreign Office spokesman said.

“We understand from reports that they have been charged with the illegal

sale of weapons and we are seeking confirmation of these charges. It is an ongoing legal process.”

The BBC reported the two men, who were maintenance workers at the consulate, were arrested over their alleged links to a plan to fire a rocket at Jerusalem’s Teddy Stadium.

The two men—one an Israeli citizen, the other a resident of East Jerusalem—had allegedly obtained weapons for two other men accused of planning the attack, said the broadcaster.—*Internet*

## France orders 200 air-to-air missile to equip Rafale

PARIS, 5 Jan — France has ordered 200 air-to-air Meteor missiles to equip its Rafale fighters serving in the air force and navy, the defence ministry said on Monday in a statement.

Defence Minister Alain Juppe welcomed the order of the long-

range missile designed for French jet Rafale under the cooperation between France, Germany, Italy, Sweden, Spain and Britain, according to the ministry.

The French General Direction for Ordnance (DGA) has awarded the order to multinational

missile producer MBDA.

“The first Meteor missile will be delivered to the French Air Force in 2018,” the statement said.

The Meteor missile, to be designed with a ramjet, can “intercept targets at ranges of several tens of kilometres,” the statement added.

With over 9,750 employees in Europe and the United States, the stake of MBDA group is shared by Britain’s BAE System (37.5 percent), European EADS (37.5 percent) and Italy’s Finmeccanica (25 percent).—*Xinhua*

## Fiji receives machines from China for development projects

SUVA, 5 Jan—Fiji has received 24 pieces of new machinery worth 4.1 million Fiji dollars (2.2 million US dollars), which is expected to assist the island nation’s rural development programmes, according to Fiji’s prime minister’s office on Wednesday.

Eliki Bomani, deputy secretary of the Development Cooperation and Facilitation in the prime minister’s

office, told local media that the construction and civil engineering equipment shipment comprises the Chinese government’s direct aid grant project.

He said formal delivery of the equipment, which arrived in a ship from China last week, will be done next week.

## Vienna witnesses solar eclipse

VIENNA, 5 Jan—A partial solar eclipse was visible on Tuesday morning in Austria. Under perfect weather conditions, spectators in Vienna watched the moon shadow covering the sun by 78 percent.

Although not being as spectacular as the total eclipse visible from Vienna in 1999, a large number of professional astronomers and hobby watchers observed the natural phenomenon with interest.

In Vienna the partial darkening of the sun started at 8:30 am, reaching the climax of a darkening by 78 percent at 9:15 am. In the western regions of Austria, the course of the eclipse differed slightly, with only 75 percent of the sun covered, reaching the climax at 9:25 am.

Due to the earth rotation, the moon

crossed the sun from right to left, leaving a gleaming crescent-shaped sun with both tips pointing upwards during maximum occultation.

However, even at the climax of the partial eclipse, there was no significant darkening as it happened during total solar eclipses.—*Xinhua*

## Korea’s Samsung to invest record 43.1 trillion won in 2011

SEOUL, 5 Jan—Samsung Group, South Korea’s largest business group that includes Samsung Electronics, said Wednesday that it will invest a record 43.1 trillion won (38 billion US dollars) this year, up 18 percent from last year.

The group has earmarked 29.9 trillion won for capital expenditures, including 10.3 trillion won for

semiconductors, 5.4 trillion won for liquid-crystal displays and 5.4 trillion won for new displays called OLED. It will also invest additional 12.1 trillion won on research and development.

The group also said in a statement that it will increase hiring by 11 percent to 25,000 people this year.

## Rain created in Abu Dhabi desert

ABU DHABI, 5 Jan—Scientists working for the ruler of Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates say they’ve used weather technology to create rain in the desert.

Most of the artificially created storms were at the height of the summer in July and August when there is historically no rain at all, *Britain’s Daily Mail* reported Monday.

Scientists working for United Arab Emirates President Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed al-Nahyan have been using giant ionizers, metal antennas on steel poles, to generate fields of negatively charged particles.

The particles attract tiny specks of dust ever-present in the atmosphere in desert regions, and are carried up from the particle emitter by rising air over the hot desert.

Once the dust particles reach the right height for

cloud formation, the charged particles attract water molecules present in the air, which then start to condense around them.

If there is sufficient moisture in the air, it induces billions of droplets to form that can create clouds and rain, the researchers say.

The founder of the Swiss company in charge of the project, Metro Systems International, says they’ve had success creating rainstorms in Abu Dhabi’s eastern Al Ain region.

“We have achieved a number of rainfalls,” Helmut Fluhrer says.

Some scientists are viewing the results with caution because Abu Dhabi is a coastal state and can experience natural summer rainfall when air picks up moisture from the warm ocean before dropping it on land.

## Australian elderly pilot killed in ultralight plane crash

CANBERRA, 5 Jan—An elderly pilot died on Tuesday, after his ultralight plane crashed to the ground in Victoria's north-west of Australia.

According to Victorian police, it is believed the aircraft crashed into a paddock about 3:30 pm local time at Cullulleraine off the Sturt Highway in Victoria.

Inspector Simon Clemence said the 72 years old man was the sole occupant of the plane.

"Sometime shortly before 4:00 pm we got a call that a light plane had crashed," he told ABC News on Tuesday. "We sent a unit down here from Werrimull and a short time later confirmed there was one deceased."

An Ambulance spokesman said there was no other person on board the plane.

## No treatment for some cancers

WELLINGTON, 5 Jan—New Zealand says a shortage of oncologists means patients with certain kinds of cancers will not be referred to specialists or be eligible for chemotherapy.

Hospitals in the central North Island have been instructed not to send people suffering a range of 14 cancers to oncologists, the *Wellington Dominion Post* reported Monday.

MidCentral District Health Board says it does not have enough oncologists, and doctors at local hospitals should not refer patients suffering particular cancers "unless there are active relevant clinical trials or overriding individual circumstance," it said in a letter to physicians.

Patients suffering relapses of some cancers, including cervical and esophagus, are on the list, as are those with melanoma.

"Of course, in a perfect world people would be able to get the very best of everything, but if we have to have a list, this is a good list," Cancer Society chief executive Dalton Kelly said. Making the list public was a step toward identifying where real treatment shortages were and where in the country there was spare treatment capacity, he said.

"It might not be what we want to hear, but it is honest. It is good to know they will not be hiding patients on waiting lists," he said. The letter, though not confidential, had been intended for clinicians, not the general public, MidCentral operations director Nicholas Glubb said.

Peter Foley, Hawke's Bay District Health Board chief medical officer of primary care, said it was time to be "open and honest" with patients who would not benefit from intensive treatment.—Internet

## Oil price retreats as investors take profits

New York, 5 Jan—US crude oil futures price dropped broadly on Tuesday as investors took profits after it rose to a 27-month high on Monday.

Investors began to feel unsafe when oil, which hit 27-month high on Monday, and other commodities surged rapidly in recent days, deciding to trim their long bets and took profits, despite a report on Tuesday showing that the US factory orders increased in November.

Not only the oil, but also some other commodities were hurt by profit-taking actions, as well as a stronger dollar on

Tuesday. Copper fell about 2 percent in Tuesday's trading, while soybean dipped almost 1 percent, which hit its highest level since mid-2008 recently.

Also, the Fed's comment on the economic situation hurt the market's confidence and pressured the oil price. The Fed minutes of December meeting released on Tuesday said the economy wasn't improving fast enough to make a noticeable dent in unemployment, and reiterated it would stick to its 600-billion bond-buying programme to stimulate the economy.—Xinhua

## Airbus launches air traffic management firm ProSky

PARIS, 5 Jan—Airbus has launched a new subsidiary company called "Airbus ProSky," aiming to enhance development and support of modern air traffic management (ATM) systems in Europe and other regions, the French company said Tuesday. Airbus ProSky will function to interact and develop ATM programmes such as "Single European Sky ATM Research"

(SESAR) in Europe, resembling what NextGen does in the United States, the European leading aircraft maker said in a statement. The Airbus subsidiary will also work to implement air traffic management cooperation between the European and the United States by "capitalizing on the technological, operational and commercial synergies," it added.—Xinhua

## Israeli PM wants nonstop talks with Palestinians

JERUSALEM, 5 Jan—Israel's prime minister on Sunday proposed nonstop, face-to-face talks with the Palestinian president until a peace agreement is reached — offering a possible way to advance talks that have stalled over the construction of Jewish settlements.

Benjamin Netanyahu's proposal offers the appeal of leaders working together to make history, and it comes in response to Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas' latest claim — made over the weekend in South America — that genuine talks could yield a deal within months. But the Palestinians showed little enthusiasm for Netanyahu's offer.

Reached by *The Associated Press* in Brazil on Sunday, Abbas reiterated his call for a settlement freeze. "If he does so, we can reach an agreement not in six months, but in two months," he said. Abbas' chief negotiator, Saeb Erekat, said Netanyahu's offer amounted to little more than an empty declaration. He called on the Israeli leader to spell out a vision of peace, and specifically to commit to a near-complete withdrawal from the West Bank and east Jerusalem.—*Internet*

## Oil hovers below \$92 as global equities rally

SINGAPORE, 5 Jan—Oil prices hovered below \$92 a barrel Tuesday in Asia near a two-year high as a stock market rally to start 2011 boosted crude trader optimism.

Benchmark oil for February delivery rose 2 cents to \$91.57 a barrel late afternoon Singapore time in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange. The contract rose 17 cents to settle at \$91.55 on Monday.

US stock markets advanced the first trading day of the year as data showed recent manufacturing activity and construction spending rose more than analysts were

predicting.

The S&P 500 stock index gained 1.1 percent Monday and major Asia equity markets rose Tuesday, led by a 1.7 percent jump in Japan's Nikkei 225 index.

Oil investors often look to equities as a barometer of overall investor sentiment.

"This ongoing burst of economic optimism is enhancing the oil market's attractiveness as an asset class," Ritterbusch and Associates said in a report. "We look for this momentum to be sustained as long as the stock market maintains a northerly course." *Internet*

## Iran to let countries visit nuclear sites, not US

TEHRAN, 5 Jan—Iran said on Tuesday it had invited the European Union and some other world powers — but apparently not chief critic the United States — to tour nuclear sites before the next round of international talks in late January on its disputed nuclear programme.

*The Associated Press* reported the invitation to tour the facilities on Monday, citing a letter from a senior Iranian envoy that suggested 15-16 Jan for the visit. A diplomat familiar with the letter said Iran invited Russia, China, Egypt, the group of non-aligned nations at the UN's International Atomic Energy Agency, Cuba, Arab League mem-

bers at the IAEA, and Hungary, which currently holds the rotating EU presidency.

Iran's economy appears to be struggling under the weight of four rounds of international sanctions over its nuclear programme, which the West suspects is aimed at producing weapons though Tehean denies that.

Iran returned last month to nuclear talks with the so-called 5+1 countries — the United States, Britain, France, Russia and China, plus Germany — which hold sway over the sanctions. And the invitation to visit nuclear sites may also be a sign that Teheran is looking for ways to ease its financial pain.—*Internet*

## Probe of Egypt church bomb focuses on local group

ALEXANDRIA, 5 Jan—Egyptian police are focusing their investigation into the New Year's suicide bombing of a church on a group of Islamic hard-liners inspired by al-Qaeda and based in the Mediterranean port city of Alexandria where the attack killed 21 people, security officials said Sunday.

The bombing touched off riots and protests by Egypt's Christian minority, who feel they are targeted and discriminated against and do not get adequate protection from authorities.

There were signs of beefed up security outside churches nationwide and dozens returned to pray

Sunday in the bombed, blood-spattered Saints Church — many of them sobbing, screaming in anger and slapping themselves in grief.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack on Coptic Christians leaving a midnight Mass about a half hour into the new year Saturday, the worst attack on Egyptian Christians in a decade.

In the immediate aftermath, President Hosni Mubarak blamed foreigners and the Alexandria governor accused al-Qaeda, pointing to threats against Christians by the terror network's branch in Iraq.

But on Sunday, security officials said police are looking at the possibility that homegrown Islamic extremists were behind it, and perhaps were inspired by al-Qaeda though not directly under foreign command.

## Depression, diabetes, heart disease linked

BOSTON, 5 — Women with depression and diabetes have a higher risk than others of death from heart disease, a six-year study found, US researchers say. Study leader An Pan of the Harvard School of Public Health in Boston and colleagues said the study indicated women with depression had a 44 percent increased risk of death, those with diabetes had a 35 percent increased risk of death and those with both conditions had approximately twice the risk of death — vs. women who had neither condition.

The study, published in the *Archives of General Psychiatry*, found when considering only deaths from cardiovascular disease, women with diabetes had a 67 percent increased risk, women with depression had a 37 percent increased risk and women with both had a 2.7-fold increased risk.

"The underlying mechanisms of the increased mortality risk associated with depression in patients with diabetes remains to be elucidated," the study authors say in a statement.

However, the researchers suggest diabetes and depression links to unhealthy behaviors such as smoking, poor diet and a sedentary lifestyle and noted depression could trigger changes in the nervous system that affect the heart adversely.

## Python newlyweds draw crowds in Cambodia

Hundreds of Cambodians on Monday celebrated an unusual wedding ceremony for a pair of pythons who they believe will bring good luck to their villages.

The marriage of serpent bride Chamreun to groom, Krong Pich, was held in Village One in Kandal Province, about 20 kilometres (12 miles) south of the Capital Phnom Penh, and attracted nearly 1,000

people, according to witnesses.

"We organized the wedding ceremony for the pythons in order to oust bad things and bring good luck and happiness for our villages," said 41-year-old Neth Vy, Chamreun's owner.

Neth Vy said his family had raised Chamreun in their home since 1994, after the then finger-sized snake got caught in his fishing net in

a lake.

He said Chamreun had gone missing for over a month but was found a week ago, at the same time people in his neighbouring village caught a male python, which they named Krong Pich.

Old villagers decided to wed the two pythons after a boy, who was believed to be spirit-possessed, said Krong Pich wanted to marry Chamreun, or "people in the villages will suffer illnesses and bad luck," Neth Vy told *AFP*.

He said some fortune tellers had also appealed for the marriage between the pythons in order to bring "good luck and harmony for the people in the villages".

"So we held the wedding ceremony for the pythons with blessings from Buddhist monks, in accordance with our tradition," he said.

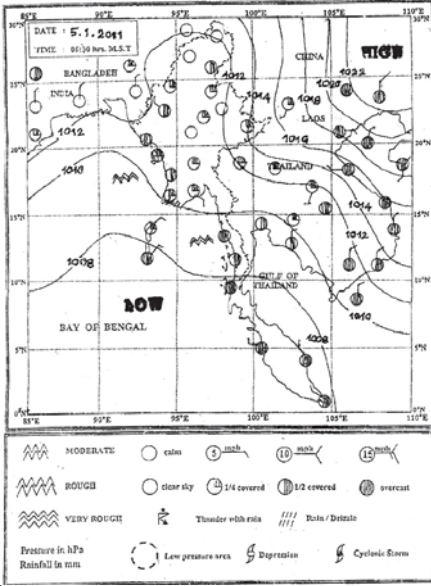
