Man's fault or vehicle or road? (2)

I have presented common causes of traffic accidents on the expressway: over speed, drowsy driving, flat tire, pedestrians' reckless use of roads and playing on streets.

After driving for one hour or for 50 miles on a highway, the driver may have stiff muscles. If he has driven the car for about 25 miles after a meal, he may become drowsy due to the effects of the meal. If a

driver behind the steering of a vehicle running at the speed of 60 mph drowns for one second, the vehicle has run for 88 feet. So, maybe the vehicle may get out of the 50 feet wide concrete road, and it is likely to cause a traffic accident.

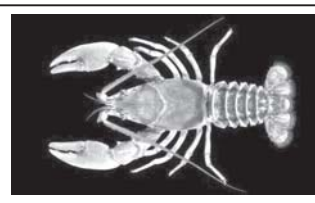

New roads for national development

At the same time, 180-foot Kyweshin Bridge was put into service. The facility has 48 feet wide motor way with a five feet wide pedestrian way on either side. It was the 252nd above 180 feet long bridge built in the entire nation by Public Works and the 14th facility of its kind in Mandalay Region.

Thanks to Kyweshin Bridge, Nay Pyi Taw-Taungnyo-Chaungnet-Taungwingyi Road and Nay Pyi Taw-Taungnyo-Myothit-Kanbya (Magway) Road are easily accessible to Mandalay and Mandalay Regions. Domestic products can be transported to Rakhine and Chin States through the roads. In fact, inauguration of new roads and bridges across the nation creates greater benefit for development of regions and enhancement of socio-economy.

Three killed, 27 wounded in suicide car bombing in Iraq's eastern Diyala

BAQUBA, 20 Jan—At least three people were killed and up to 27 injured Thursday in a suicide car bomb attack on a police headquarters in central Baquba, capital of Diyala Province, a provincial police source said.

A suicide bomber drove his explosive-laden car into the

checkpoint of the main entrance of the provincial headquarters of Diyala police and blew it up, causing severe damages to the surrounding buildings at the scene, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

"We have three people killed and 16 security members wounded, along with 11 civilians, according to the latest reports," the source said, changing his earlier report when he put the toll at three killed and nine wounded.

The attack came a day after two deadly suicide attacks in the province that killed eight

people and wounded some 89 others.

Diyala Province, which stretches from the eastern edges of Baghdad to the Iranian border east of the country, has long been a stronghold for al-

Qaida militants and other insurgent groups since the US-led invasion of Iraq in 2003 despite repeated US and Iraqi military operations against them.

NATO and Afghan forces kill ten militants in north

KABUL, 20 Jan—NATO and Afghan forces killed more than 10 militants in two days of fighting in northern Afghanistan, the alliance said Thursday.

The operation in Faryab Province was aimed at disrupting Taliban cells that have moved freely in the area, the statement said. The troops searched many houses without incident but were fired on from some compounds and returned fire, the statement said.

Meanwhile, militants attacks killed two NATO service members — one Thursday in the north and another Wednesday in the south, the alliance said. It did not identify their nationalities or give further details.

It was not clear if the NATO death in the north was related to the fighting in Faryab.

More than 20 NATO troops have been killed in Afghanistan so far this month — a bloody start to a year that NATO officials have said they expect to be particularly violent. NATO forces are pushing deeper into militants strongholds to try to undermine the strength of the Taliban enough to allow troops to start drawing down.—Internet

Afghan forces kill nine militants

QALAT, 20 Jan—Afghan security forces backed by NATO-led troops eliminated nine Taliban militants in Zabul Province 340 km south of Capital Kabul on Wednesday, spokesman for provincial administration Mohammad Jan Rasoulyar said Thursday.

"The security forces raided Taliban hideout in Arghandab District on Wednesday afternoon as a result nine insurgents were killed," Rasoulyar told *Xinhua*.

Air power was also used in the operation, the official further said without giving more details.

Taliban militants fighting Afghan and NATO-led troops have yet to make comment.

Taliban kill three NATO Pakistani transporters

ISLAMABAD, 20 Jan—Pakistani Taliban killed three Pakistani transporters for supply goods for NATO troops in Afghanistan, officials said Wednesday.

The bullet-ridden bodies of the drivers were found in Khyber tribal region on Wednesday, they said.

They were kidnapped by the militants two weeks ago from Landi Kotal, main town in Khyber Agency, bordering Afghanistan.

A note found near the bodies said that the drivers were killed for transporting supplies for NATO troops.

The note also asked transporters to stop supplies for foreign troops in Afghanistan otherwise they will also face the same fate.

At least one dead in explosion near Munich

BERLIN, 20 Jan—An old woman was found dead in a house explosion in Germering, a town near German City of Munich, police said on Thursday morning.

The explosion happened at the midnight and completely destroyed the house and shattered the windows of nearby buildings, police said.

The woman was found dead in the basement of the house and was thought to be the 84-year-old owner, said police.

The reason for the explosion was still not clear and the police are looking for her 88-year-old husband in the wreckage.

NATO Service members killed in Afghan attacks

KABUL, 20 Jan—NATO says two of its service members have died in militants attacks in Afghanistan.

In said one service member was killed Thursday in the north, while another was killed Wednesday in the south. It did not identify their nationalities or give further details.

More than 20 NATO troops have been killed in Afghanistan so far this month—a bloody start to a year that NATO officials have said they expect to be particularly violent as they push further into militants strongholds to undermine the strength of the Taliban enough to allow troops to start drawing down.

Emission mitigation could benefit oceans

LIVERMORE, 20 Jan—Chemically scrubbing a natural gas power plant's emissions then pumping the resulting compound into the sea could benefit marine life, US scientists say.

Greg Rau of the Institute of Marine Sciences at UC Santa Cruz, who also works in the Carbon Management Programme at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, conducted experiments to find out if a seawater/mineral carbonate (limestone) gas scrubber would remove

enough CO2 to be effective, and whether the resulting substance — dissolved calcium bicarbonate — could then be stored in the ocean where it might also benefit marine biota, a LLNL release said Wednesday.

In addition to affecting global warming, when CO2 is released into the atmosphere, some is taken up by the ocean, making it more acidic.

This acidification has been shown to be harmful to marine life, especially corals and shellfish.

If the calcium

carbonate created by the scrubbing process were released to the ocean it would add to ocean alkalinity and help buffer and offset the effects of ongoing marine acidification, Rau proposes.

In his experiments, Rau found that the scrubber removed up to 97 percent of CO2 in a simulated power plant flue gas stream, with a large fraction of the carbon ultimately converted to dissolved calcium bicarbonate.

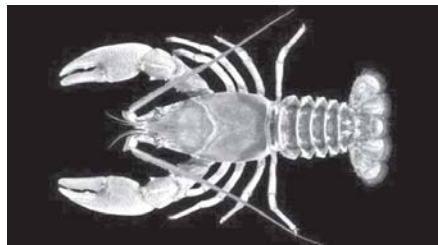
Giant crayfish found in Tennessee is new species

WASHINGTON, 20 Jan—A new species of giant crayfish literally crawled out from under a rock in Tennessee, proving that large new species of animals can be found in highly populated and well-explored places, researchers said on Wednesday.

The new crayfish should not have been easily overlooked, as it is huge — twice the size of other species, the team at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and Eastern Kentucky University said.

But the crustacean is also quite rare, they report in the *Proceedings of the Biological Society of Washington*.

"This isn't a crayfish that someone would have picked up and just said, 'Oh, it's another crayfish,' and put it back," said University of Illinois

aquatic biologist Chris Taylor, one of the researchers.

"You would have recognized it as something really, really different and you would have saved it," Taylor added in a statement.

Taylor and Guenter Schuster of Eastern Kentucky University found their first specimen of the new species under one of the biggest rocks in the deepest part of a commonly explored Tennessee creek.

The new species, called *Barbicambarus simmonsii*, is about 5 inches long and has antennae covered with a sensitive fringe of tiny, hair-like bristles, called setae.

More than half of the 600 known species of crayfish in the world are found in North America, Taylor said.

"This thing had not been seen by scientific eyes until last year," he said.

'Killer' paper could improve food safety

RAMAT-GAN, 20 Jan—Israeli scientists say they've tested a "killer paper" packaging material with silver nanoparticles to preserve foods by combating bacteria that cause spoilage.

Aharon Gedanken and colleagues at Bar-Ilan University have been exploring the use of silver nanoparticles — each 1/50,000 the width of a human hair — as germ-fighting coatings for plastics, fabrics and metals, an American Chemical Society release said Wednesday.

The researchers say nanoparticles, which have a longer-lasting effect than larger silver particles, could help overcome the growing problem of antibiotic resistance as bacteria develop the ability to shrug off existing antibiotics.

Paper coated with silver nanoparticles could provide an alternative to common food preservation methods such as radiation, heat treatment and low-temperature storage, they say.—Internet

Genius unveils go-anywhere Pen Mouse

NEW YORK, 20 Jan—Mice have undergone significant technological changes in the past couple of decades—when's the last time you saw a new roller-ball mouse?—but except for a few refinements, their design hasn't changed much over the years. Genius is hoping to change that with its new Pen Mouse.

Its name tells its story: The Pen Mouse is sized and shaped like a

traditional ink pen, measuring only 0.64 by 0.83 by 5.24 inches (HWD). It connects to Windows XP, Vista, or 7 desktop and laptop PCs with a USB Pico dongle that lets it operate wirelessly. It operates on a frequency of 2.4 GHz, is powered by one AAA battery, and enters into a power-saving sleep mode when not in use. Push slightly on the mouse to "left click," and use the flying-scroll button as a replacement for a scroll wheel.—Internet

'Road train' convoy technology tested

STOCKHOLM, 20 Jan—Technology that links multiple vehicles into "road trains" that can travel as a semi-autonomous convoy has had its first real world tests, Swedish engineer say.

The trials, held on automaker Volvo's test track in Sweden, electronically slaved a single car

to a lead truck to test the platoon system.

The test was carried out as part of a European Commission research project known as Sartre, Safe Road Trains for the Environment.

Project researchers believe platoons of cars under the control of a lead

driver could be travelling on Europe's roads within 10 years, cutting fuel use, increasing safety and even cutting congestion, the report said. In the proposed system, drivers would join and leave vehicle platoons via in-car controls.

Japanese hospital to test new cancer therapy

TOKYO, 20 Jan — Medical researchers in Japan say they will start the world's first clinical studies of a radiation therapy using accelerator-based neutron beams to kill cancer cells.

The National Cancer Centre in Tokyo and a Japanese medical equipment maker Cancer Intelligence Care Systems plan to start the studies using "boron neutron capture therapy (BNCT)" in three years, the centre said.

The BNCT is an innovative radiation treatment which kills cancer cells selectively without side-effects, but it requires a massive facility

including a nuclear reactor to produce neutron beams.

By using a particle accelerator, which is cheaper, safer and smaller than a reactor, it will become feasible for a hospital to provide the therapy on actual patients, the centre told journalists on Tuesday.

The centre hopes to try the special radiation therapy on patients with cancers that have been difficult to treat in conventional procedures, such as brain tumours and melanoma, it said.—Internet

One in five cancer survivors suffers chronic pain, study finds

ANN ARBOR, 20 Jan— More than 40 percent of cancer survivors experience pain, and the risk is highest among black and female patients, finds a new study.

Researchers at the University of Michigan Health System surveyed nearly 200 US cancer survivors and found that 43 percent had experienced pain since their

diagnosis, and 20 percent suffered chronic cancer-related pain at least two years later.

Among white patients, the most significant source of pain was cancer surgery (53.8 percent), and among black patients the greatest source of pain was cancer treatment (46.2 percent), according to the report.

In addition, the study found that compared to men, women had more pain, more pain flare-ups, more disability due to pain

and were more depressed because of pain.

The authors also noted that black patients were more likely to report greater severity of pain and more pain-related disability, and also expressed more concern about harmful pain treatment side effects.

The study was released online in advance of publication in an upcoming print issue of the journal *Cancer*.

"All in all, the high prevalence of cancer and pain and now chronic cancer pain among these survivors, especially blacks and women, shows there's more work to be done in improving the quality of care and research," lead author and pain medicine specialist Dr Carmen R Green, a professor of anesthesiology, obstetrics and gynecology and health management and policy at the University of Michigan, said in a university news release.—Internet

Health Tip: kick up your feet

Varicose veins are swollen, bulging veins — usually in the legs. They can make standing and other activities painful.

Although not all cases are preventable, the womenshealth.gov Web site suggests how to help thwart varicose veins:

- * Apply sunscreen to your skin daily.
- * Get regular exercise to help make your legs stronger and improve circulation. Concentrate on activities that benefit the legs.
- * Maintain a healthy body weight.
- * Don't cross your legs, and elevate your legs when you can.
- * Move around frequently, avoiding long periods of sitting or standing.
- * Don't wear clothes that are too tight. Also avoid high-heeled shoes.
- * Wear elastic support stockings.
- * Eat more fiber to help prevent constipation, which can trigger varicose veins. Also, cut back on salt in your diet.—Internet

China GDP up 10.3 percent in 2010

BEIJING, 20 Jan—China's economic growth showed no sign of weakening in 2010, with the government announcing Thursday the economy grew 9.8 percent in the fourth quarter.

The numbers pushed the 2010 gross domestic product growth rate to 10.3 percent from 2009, up sharply from the government's earlier target of 8 percent, the National Bureau of Statistics said. The GDP grew 9.2 percent in 2009, the state-run *Xinhua* news agency reported.

People's Daily, the official newspaper of the Chinese Communist

Party, said the country maintained its "rapid and healthy economic growth" in 2010, but said the country is "facing a mounting challenge to rein in inflation this year."

China's GDP in 2010 stood at \$6.1 trillion, making the economy the world's second-largest after the United States, whose GDP is close to \$15 trillion.

The latest Chinese GDP numbers were released as Chinese President Hu Jintao was on a state visit to the United States to discuss issues including Chinese currency valuation and market access for US exports.—Internet

Crude oil down; other commodities up

NEW YORK, 20 Jan—Crude oil prices settled lower Wednesday, dropping 57 cents to \$90.86 a barrel on the New York Mercantile Exchange. During intraday trading, crude oil prices reached \$92.11. Natural gas added 14 cents to finish trading at \$4.56 per million British thermal units.

Gasoline gained less than a penny to settle at \$2.48 a gallon. Home heating oil also gained less than a penny to close at \$2.6459 a gallon. At the pump, a gallon of regular unleaded gasoline cost \$3.108 on Wednesday, compared with \$3.10 on Tuesday, AAA's *Fuel Gauge Report* said.—Internet

S Korea considers implementation of emergency tariff quota system

SEOUL, 20 Jan—Seoul may seek to adopt an emergency tariff quota system if international raw material prices rise over current levels, the Ministry of Knowledge Economy said Thursday.

The ministry said applying emergency tariff quotas to key commodities, which South Korea imports, could help control local consumer prices that have seen a sharp rise in recent months.

"We can review the implementation of an emergency tariff quota system when raw material prices soar," a ministry official was quoted by *Seoul's Yonhap News Agency* as saying.

"But the issue needs to be discussed with the Ministry of Strategy and Finance and detailed talks have not been made," the source said.

Unlike the regular tariff quota system that is announced by the finance ministry twice every year, the emergency system temporarily lowers tariff rates for imports for a certain period of time when unexpected developments, such as skyrocketing prices, arise.

Reducing import duties can help contain price hikes on the local market and tackle inflationary pressure.—Xinhua

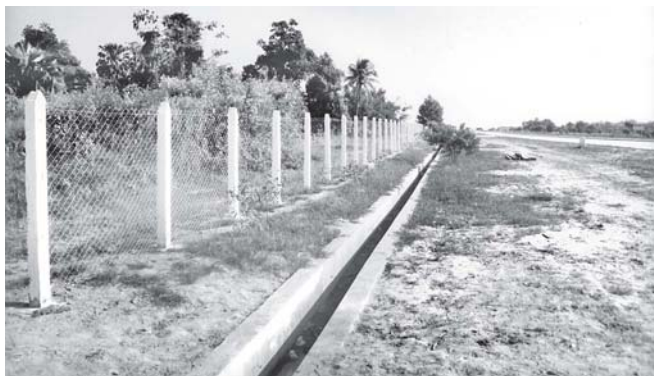


Floor traders walk inside the trading hall of the Hong Kong Stock Exchange on 12 May, 2010. INTERNET

only for Asian level but also international level

standardization. According to vertical levels of the parts

of a road, some traffic islands are high, and some are low. In particular, traffic islands are high in the middle of

the roads inside towns and villages where vehicles must slow down a little. And curbs and barrier types are at least one foot from the edge of a road. Traffic islands are low without any curbs or barriers outside a town. There is a drain in the middle of a traffic island. For instance, the traffic islands on the road from Bangkok to Kanchanaburi are low, and the ones in downtown cities are high.

Similarly, the ones on the road from New Delhi to Argaya are low. Traffic islands on the road from

Kunming to the hill station are high in towns and villages. And the remaining are low and there are no particular restrictions for the width of the road because the road was built in line with the characters of the mountain ranges. So, Yangon-Mandalay Expressway is designed to meet these characters of the international roads.

An express way does not need to cope with a lot of traffic and vehicles can run at high speed on it. Therefore, people onboard vehicles running on the expressway have to take

seatbelts in case they will be thrown off the seats when the driver slams on the brake or if an accident happens. Moreover, vehicles must have regular servicing to ensure that they do not have flat tire while running. So, there is no need to be confused about whether accidents are due to man's fault or vehicle of road. If people drive vehicles safely with constant attentiveness and abide by traffic rules, it will be safe on roads.

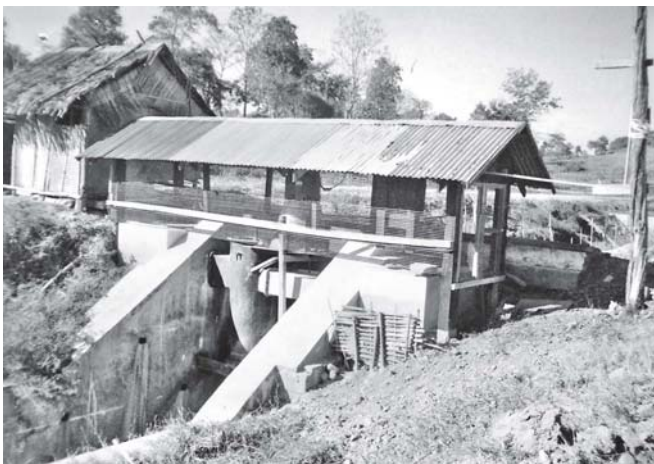

Aircraft maker eyes opportunities in China's regional aviation market

BEIJING, 20 Jan — China's fast expanding regional aviation market is attracting the attention of global aircraft makers, as it is expected to grow rapidly in the next few years with the government moving to tap its potential, said world leading jet maker Embraer. Guo Qing, vice-president of marketing for Embraer China, said Embraer is "very optimistic" about the future development of China's domestic regional aviation market, especially in

the country's under-developed regions. Embraer, the world's fourth-largest aircraft maker, last week signed an agreement with China Development Bank (CDB) Leasing and China Southern Airlines (CSA) to sell 10 E-190 jet planes to CSA, China's largest airline by fleet size, which will be put into service on routes in the country's northwestern Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region. *Xinhua*

Qantas flight from Australia diverts to Fiji

SYDNEY, 20 Jan—A Qantas passenger jet bound for New York made an unscheduled stop in Fiji after it developed a problem with one of its engines, the Australian airline said Wednesday.

Qantas said flight QF107, a Boeing 747, carrying 375 passengers from Sydney to New York via Los Angeles, touched down in Nadi on Tuesday for repairs to a fuel valve supplying one of its engines.

"Just past Nadi the flight crew got a message to say there was a fault with a fuel valve so they returned to Nadi to correct it," a Qantas spokeswoman said. "They could have flown on, it was just a precautionary measure."

The passengers were given hotel accommodation for the night and the flight continued early Wednesday, she added.

The hitch comes just days after another Qantas Boeing 747, QF11 to Los Angeles, experienced a contained engine failure on the runway of Sydney airport due to a turbine blade defect.

Media reports on that incident said that passengers heard "a loud bang" and saw black smoke pour from the affected engine, with the captain reportedly telling those on board that the engine had "cooked itself" over the plane's intercom.

The incidents follow a dramatic few months for the Australian airline which in November temporarily suspended flights of its Airbus A380 superjumbos after an engine on one exploded after taking off from Singapore, damaging the plane.—*Internet*

S Korea orders hotels, stores to turn down heat

SEOUL, 20 Jan—South Korea has ordered department stores, offices and hotels to turn down the heating, officials said Wednesday, amid fears of power blackouts

because of a prolonged cold spell. From next Monday, the temperature inside 441 buildings with large energy consumption will be limited to 20 degrees

Celsius (68 degrees Fahrenheit), the Ministry of Knowledge Economy said.

The order, effective until 18 February, covers department and discount stores, hotels, office buildings and schools and offenders face fines of up to three million won (\$2,690).

The ministry had earlier ordered civil servants to keep office temperatures below 18 degrees Celsius, and encouraged them to wear thermal underwear to battle the cold.

"As oil prices are expected to remain high throughout the winter and electricity demand is

setting new records, there is a common understanding that there needs to be tougher measures to reduce demand," the ministry said on its website.

Knowledge Economy Minister Choi Kyung-Hwan warned last week of possible blackouts after electricity demand soared to record highs this winter.

Sunday's temperature in Seoul fell to a 10-year low of minus 17.8 degrees Celsius. On Wednesday the low was minus 9 degrees Celsius, with the unusually severe cold spell forecast to continue for the rest of the month.

Explosions hit bars in France

PARIS, 20 Jan—Two bars located in the district of Cannes in Ajaccio, the largest city on Corsica Island of France, were virtually destroyed by separate bombings early Tuesday morning, local media reported Tuesday.

Inquired by *Xinhua* in telephone, an Ajaccio resident confirmed the explosions, saying "damages are considerable" and affected apartments and vehicles parked nearby. According to the same source, the double explosions occurred at about two o'clock in the morning with a few minutes' interval.

Three people slightly injured in the incident were carried to a hospital for treatment while twenty households were evacuated for fear of gas leaks.

District official told local media that around 15 kilograms of explosives were likely used in the attacks.

An investigation was started to look for the cause. The attacks have not been claimed so far.—*Xinhua*

German man admits mailing hundreds of tarantulas to US

LOS ANGELES, 20 Jan—A German national who shipped hundreds of live tarantulas into the United States through the mail pleaded guilty on Tuesday to a federal smuggling charge, prosecutors said.

In pleading guilty, 37-year-old Sven Koppler admitted mailing some 247 live tarantulas to federal agents in Los Angeles, who were posing as buyers as part of an investigation dubbed "Operation Spiderman." Koppler further admitted sending the agents 22 Mexican red-kneed tarantulas, a species of spider formally known as *Brachypelma smithi* that is protected under an international treaty.

Koppler, who lives in Wachtberg, Germany, faces a maximum of 20 years in federal prison when he is sentenced on 11 April, US Attorney's spokesman Thom Mrozek said.

Authorities say the investigation into Koppler began in March, when a routine inspection turned up about 300 live tarantulas in a package he mailed to Los Angeles.

US Fish and Wildlife Service agents ordered more spiders from Koppler and were sent a total of five packages containing dozens of live and dead tarantulas.

He was arrested on 2 December after arriving in Los Angeles to meet with an associate.—*Reuters*

Volcanic lava floods threaten Indonesia's ancient temples

JAKARTA, 20 Jan—An Indonesian geologist said that the cold volcanic debris currently flowing down the slopes of Mount Merapi, locally known as lahar, is not only threatening houses and infrastructure, but also archeological sites, local media reported on Wednesday.

Subandrio, head of the Volcano Investigation and Technology Development Institution (BPPTK), said a team of geologists and archaeologists was evaluating the physical condition of temples located near the paths of the lahar runoff from Merapi. "According to a letter from the Archaeological Heritage Conservation Centre of Central Java, we have to give particular attention to the safety of the Prambanan Temple and other temples in the complex," he said on Tuesday.—*Xinhua*

More heavy snow, icy rain continue sweeping east, south China

CHONGQING, 20 Jan—Heavy snow and icy rain are continuing to sweep east and south China, disrupting traffic, closing airports, cutting water and power supplies and causing havoc for ordinary Chinese.

Xiaoshan Airport in Hangzhou, east China's Zhejiang Province, has been closed since 4:30 am Thursday because of

snow since Tuesday. About 400 flights have been canceled. In parts of the province, the snow is more than 22 cm deep.

Continuous heavy snow and freezing rain have been falling in the southwest municipality of Chongqing since Monday.

By Thursday morning, the city's Zhouhai Airport was closed because of the ice on the

runway.

The Chongqing Meteorological Centre Thursday forecast that the snow and rain will continue till at least Friday.

Snow and sleet have swept provincial level areas, including Zhejiang, Jiangsu, Hunan, Guangxi, Chongqing, Guizhou and Yunnan since Monday.

5.1 magnitude aftershocks rattle New Zealand's Canterbury region

WELLINGTON, 20 Jan—Another aftershock measuring 5.1 on the Richter scale occurred in New Zealand central South Island's Canterbury region on Thursday morning, causing no casualties or significant damages.

The quake, which occurred at 6:03 am (1703 GMT Wednesday), centred 10 km southwest of Christchurch and at a depth of 10 km, New Zealand Institute of Geological and Nuclear Science (GNS Science) said.

Christchurch City Council said there were no obvious signs of damage to infrastructure, such as waste water equipment. Police have reported no incidents.

More aftershocks measuring 3.4 and 4.0 on the Richter scale also occurred following the 5.1 tremor.

The main quake was magnitude 7.1 on 4 Sept last year. The epicenter was 40 km west of Christchurch at a depth of 10 km.

GNS Science said Canterbury residents should prepare for a sizable aftershock about every four to six weeks.

Severe thunderstorms menace flood-hit Queensland

BRISBANE, 20 Jan—Severe thunderstorms in flood-hit Queensland of Australia have kept emergency services busy overnight and hampered the reconnection of power to flood-affected homes, the *Australian Associated Press* reported on Thursday.

Severe storms rolled across the Lockyer Valley, west of Brisbane, from 7 pm Wednesday, then moved east to Brisbane, bringing damaging winds and lightning to the region and hail to Oakey, 160 kilometers west of Brisbane, the Bureau of Meteorology said.

It caused headaches for locals who just want to clean up, or get on with life after the floods.

Emergency services said in the 24 hours to 5 am on Thursday, they received 134 calls for help in Brisbane, the state capital, and 39 in Ipswich, west of Brisbane.

Queensland electricity supplier ENERGEX said 30,000 properties lost power and crews had to be redirected from flood restoration duties. Power supplies were cut by high winds and more than 6,500 lightning strikes hit in the southeast areas of Queensland stretching from the Lockyer and Brisbane Valleys to Ipswich, Gold Coast and Brisbane.—Xinhua

Cyclone, heavy rain expected in Fiji

SUVA, 20 Jan—The Fiji Meteorology Services (FMS) said here Thursday that the Island nation will face the threat of two tropical cyclones forming this weekend or by early next week.

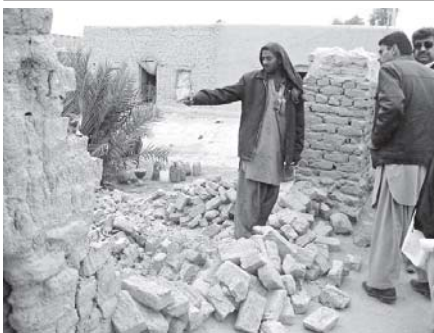
FMS Director Alipate Waqaicelua told the media that an active trough of low pressure with associated cloud and rain will cover Fiji from Friday through next week.

A tropical depression is likely to form from this system and further intensify into a tropical cyclone by the weekend, he said.

If the tropical depression does not come to pass, then Fiji may face a cyclone, he added.

Meanwhile, the new school term is starting on 24 Jan. People on the island have been asked to prepare for heavy rain in the next couple of days.

One week after Rio storms, death toll hits 742

RIO DE JANEIRO, 20 Jan—A week after storms devastated part of Rio de Janeiro State, southeastern Brazil, the death count reached 742, local authorities said Wednesday.

According to the authorities, there are at least 200 people missing. At least 15 neighbourhoods remain unreachable except by helicopters.

A total of 21,500 people had to leave their homes because of the floods and the risk of new mudslides. Thousands of families had nowhere to go and are currently living in shelters set up in schools

and clubs. Local governments are evacuating residents from risk areas.

It rained heavily in the damaged region on Tuesday, flooding several neighbourhoods and making it difficult for rescue teams to work. The rain is expected to continue in the next days.

The storms caused considerable damage to the production of vegetables in the state, and the fall in food supply has caused prices to rise in the state's capital city Rio.

Some temporary bridges will be built by

the army on the highways of the damaged towns. According to the local government, 52 bridges will be rebuilt in the area.

Fireball kills US gas firm worker

PHILADELPHIA, 20 Jan — A gas company employee was killed when a giant fireball ripped through a residential neighbourhood in the north-eastern US city of Philadelphia. Four of the man's colleagues, along with a firefighter, were injured by the explosion. The cause of the blast is not yet known, but local residents had reported smelling gas beforehand.

Several nearby buildings in the city's Tacony neighbourhood were evacuated, including an old people's home. The incident happened on Tuesday night as crews investigated a possible leak. Three of the injured gas workers are being treated in the burn unit at Philadelphia Temple University Hospital.

In a statement, Philadelphia Gas Works said: "We extend our sincerest condolences and continuing support to those involved in this tragic incident." An emergency centre, set up by the American Red Cross, helped about 75 people who were unable to return to their homes.— *Internet*

Genes behind bedbugs comeback

NEW YORK, 20 Jan — Researchers in the United States have sequenced the entire genetic map of the bed bug, and said they may be able to find out how and why the little pests can survive strong pesticides. The gene map has provided

some prime suspects for genes that confer resistance — the ability to survive poisons, the team at Ohio State University reported on Wednesday.

"The resurgence of bed bugs poses an urgent situation as infestations are rampant globally, nationally, and locally," they wrote in the Public Library of Science journal *PLoS ONE*. "The control of these medically important insect pests in urban environments costs billions of dollars annually and typically requires the use of large quantities of pesticides/insecticides." *Internet*

Russians hunt down rumoured 400-strong wolf pack

Moscow, 20 Jan — A rumoured 400-strong pack of wolves that has slain 30 horses and is said to pose a threat to human life has sparked fear in the northeastern Russian Region of Yakutia. Hunters have been dispatched to deal with the beasts, state-owned news agency *RIA Novosti* reported,

and a single pelt would be met with a reward of 10,000 roubles (\$335). "We have gathered 24 hunting parties to patrol the neighbourhood on snowmobiles. We also set traps. Using poison against wolves is forbidden though. When daytime becomes long enough, the hunters will shoot the predators from helicopters," said a spokesman

for the administration of the Verkhnyarsky region, where the wolf pack lives, as cited by *Interfax* news agency. But the Moscow News website said reports of the huge wolf pack should be tempered by the knowledge that wolves usually form groups of no more than 20, suggesting "a group of 400 would be difficult to sustain"— *Internet*

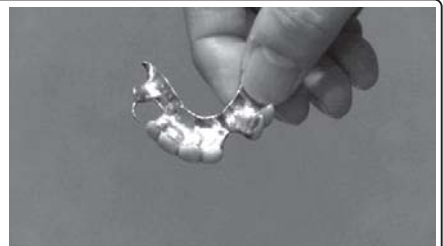
Conan Doyle estate approves new Holmes story

Wright says the Spiller & Burr revolver was one of the first Confederate-manufactured handguns. This one has an estimated value of \$50,000.

Burglars snort man's ashes, thought it was cocaine

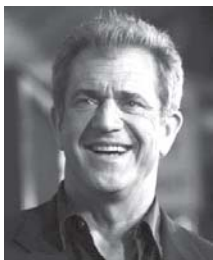

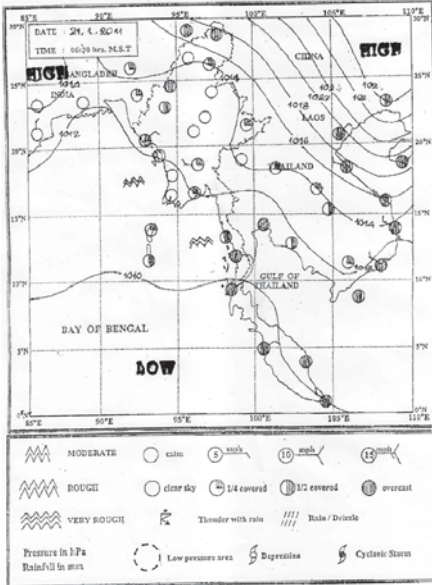

China's imports from ASEAN up 44.8 pct in 2010

BEIJING, 20 Jan — China's imports from the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) rose 44.8 percent to 154.56 billion US dollars in 2010, said the General Administration of Customs on Thursday.

Since the establishment of the China-ASEAN Free Trade Area at the beginning of 2010, bilateral trade had risen 37.5 percent year on year to 292.78 billion US dollars, the customs said.

ASEAN is China's fourth largest trading partner, after the European Union, the United States and Japan.

Mechanical and electrical products accounted for 53.7 percent of all imports.

In 2010, China's exports to ASEAN were up 30.1 percent from a year earlier to 138.22 billion US dollars. China's trade deficit with ASEAN saw a 30.7-fold increase to 16.34 billion US dollars.

tributary canals and drains for supply of water to summer paddy. Likewise, farmers were making preparations for cultivation of summer paddy.

We noticed that the main canal is 10 miles in length, and tributary canal is stretching 47.8 miles. There are 296 canal structures. The dam will irrigate Kanma Township only and benefit 4000 acres of irrigated area. Kanma Township has adequate water for cultivation of monsoon paddy in the rainy season, and the dam will be main water resource for summer paddy.

The local farmers grow monsoon paddy as soon as possible. After harvesting the monsoon paddy, they cultivate pigeon pea, chick pea, groundnut and sesame before cultivation season of summer paddy. Pigeon pea is the most favorite among the farmers. Therefore, the local farmers are engaged in cultivation of crops
