U Ar Min of Madauk, Bago Region, on his way to the forest to cut down bamboo, lost his right foot when he stepped on a KNU mine at a place about 10 miles north-east of the town at about 8 am yesterday.

Authorities are taking care of the victims who are now receiving treatment in Shwegyin General Hospital.—MNA

## Ten Afghans killed in bomb blast

ARGHANDAB, 27 Feb—Two bomb explosions on Sunday tore through a crowd of villagers watching a dogfight in the southern Afghanistan Province of Kandahar, killing at least 10, officials said.

Zemarai Bashary, Afghan interior ministry spokesman in Kabul, told *AFP* the bombing in Arghandab District targeted villagers and a police vehicle, killing eight civilians and two police.

“There have been two bomb blasts, one at the middle of a gathering and the other on the side of the road nearby. Eight civilians have been killed, two cops have been killed,” the spokesman said.

He said a dozen civilians and five police were injured. He did not give details.

Shah Mohammad, the district chief of Arghandab, said the attack was aimed at villagers watching a dogfight.

“People had gathered to watch dogfighting. Two explosions, from planted bombs, happened. Eight people, all civilians, have been killed,” he said.—*Internet*

## NZ’s Christchurch quake death toll stands at 147

CHRISTCHURCH, 27 Feb— The toll from Christchurch’s magnitude 6.3 earthquake stood at 147, New Zealand police said on Sunday. They plan to release two more victims’ names on Monday, bringing to eight the total number of people officially named as fatalities from the quake.

Superintendent Dave Cliff said more than 200 people were missing in the worst disaster of the city.

People from more

than 20 countries are among the dead, he said.

Search and rescue teams continued to scour the rubble of buildings that collapsed in the earthquake on Tuesday, but no survivors have been found since Wednesday afternoon.

Cliff said situations where there was intense fire, as there had been at the Canterbury Television (CTV) building, presented real difficulty and there is a risk not all those who died will be able to be identified.

“I don’t want to preempt what will happen in respect to that, but we need to brace ourselves for the fact that that possibility does exist.”

## Bomber kills at least four in northwest Afghanistan

KABUL, 27 Feb— Amid screams of “Suicide bomber! Suicide bomber!” an militant detonated his vest of explosives Saturday, killing at least four people at a sports field in northwest Afghanistan.

It was the latest in a spate of attacks that have hit nearly every corner of the country in recent weeks. A roadside bomb also killed nine people Saturday near the eastern city of Khost.

The suicide bomber struck a game of buzkashi, a traditional Afghan sport in which players on horseback wrangle for a headless goat carcass, said Abdul Haq Shafiq, governor of Faryab

Province.

“The people and the police became suspicious of the bomber,” Shafiq said. “People started running. Everyone was scared. The people called out, ‘Suicide bomber! Suicide bomber!’ and then the bomber blew himself up.” Besides the dead, 19 people were wounded, said Shafiq. About 2,000 people were at the event when the blast occurred.

Three men, two women and four children also were killed when their vehicle hit a roadside bomb in the militant-ridden Lakan area of the capital of Khost Province, according to the Afghan Interior Ministry.—*Internet*

## One Taliban militant killed in NATO operation

KABUL, 27 Feb— Afghan and NATO-led forces killed a Taliban weapons facilitator in Afghanistan’s southern Zabul Province on Saturday, said a NATO Press release issued here Sunday. “Afghan National Security and International Security Assistance Forces killed Mullah Faizulla, a Taliban weapons facilitator along with one male, who threatened the security force during a security operation in Tarnek wa Jaldak area, Zabul Province yesterday,” the NATO-led ISAF said.

The targeted militant was responsible for distributing weapons and funding Taliban militant activities and attacks against Afghan and coalition forces, the Press release stated.

## San Francisco hill regions get dusting of snow

SAN FRANCISCO, 27 Feb— Hilly areas of San Francisco got a rare light dusting of snow, the National Weather Service said Saturday.

Snow fell briefly late Friday and early Saturday on the city’s Twin Peaks neighbourhood and some other areas with higher elevations, meteorologist Mark Strobin said. “A little bit up in the hills,” Strobin said. “It snowed down to about 400 feet.”

But there was only rain downtown and in other other areas of the near sea level city, and the snow that did fall disappeared rapidly.

The city last saw snow on the ground in 1976, when an inch fell.

Strobin said the higher regions might have had snow dustings since that measureable snow fell 35 years ago. He

said it was still too early to tell how this event will be recorded.

Strobin, who is based in Monterey, Calif, said that city also got a rare dusting of snow.

The storm system moving across Northern California responsible for San Francisco’s snow also dumped more than 2 feet of snow in the Sierra Nevada mountains. Just the idea of possible snow had the tech-savvy city looking skyward with anticipation.

One blogger posted a pretend ski map, noting possible beginner, intermediate and expert runs in the city’s hilly Bernal Heights neighbourhood. A newly created website — [isitsnowinginsfyt.com](http://isitsnowinginsfyt.com) — gives a simple answer for anyone who is wondering.

## Gunmen torch two NATO oil tankers

QUETTA, 27 Feb—A police official says gunmen have torched two NATO oil tankers in southwestern Pakistan.

Abdullah Lango says the attack occurred in the area of Mangocher, about 250 miles (400 kilometers) east of Quetta, on Sunday. Quetta is the capital of Baluchistan Province.

He says the attackers fired at the tankers but let the drivers go before torching the vehicles.

Oil tankers carrying supplies to NATO forces in southern Afghanistan travel from the Pakistani port city of Karachi to the border town of Chaman through the militancy plagued Baluchistan, where they routinely come under attack.

## Hawaii board OKs plan for giant telescope

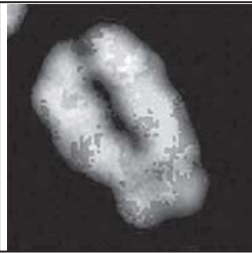
HONOLULU, 27 Feb—Hawaii has moved a step closer to the construction of the world's largest telescope on the summit of Mauna Kea.

The state Board of Land and Natural Resources unanimously approved the plan Friday. A consortium of California and Canadian universities had applied for a permit to build the Thirty Meter Telescope on conservation land.

The board, however, also granted a request by opponents for a case hearing on the telescope.

Some Native Hawaiians say the construction would defile Mauna Kea's summit, which they consider sacred. The telescope would be able to observe planets that orbit stars other than the sun and enable astronomers to watch new planets and stars being formed.

## Full house at space station as Discovery docks

WASHINGTON, 27 Feb—The US shuttle *Discovery* docked for its final visit at the orbiting *International Space Station*, where all five of the world's participating space agencies now have vehicles or equipment.

"This is the first time all visiting vehicles have something represented," NASA mission control in Houston said on Saturday, after the oldest and most heavily travelled US shuttle linked up with the space outpost 220 miles (350 kilometers) over western Australia.

Japan's *HTV* vehicle, Russia's *Progress* and *Soyuz* craft, the European *ATV-2* supply ship and the Canadian *Dextre* robot are all there, NASA said.

## Who knew? testicle colour matters

NEW YORK, 27 Feb—Dark testicles might protect birds from mutation, scientists find.

These findings could explain why such inky testicles are mysteriously found throughout the animal kingdom.

Scientists focused on the pigment melanin, which gives human skin its colour. Curiously, researchers have also seen melanin in the testes of a variety of species in all vertebrate groups. However, why this pigment is there and what it might do was unknown.

Melanin is also an antioxidant that can protect the body against reactive oxygen species, harmful compounds that can damage DNA. As such, scientists reasoned that melanin in testicles might guard against genetic mutations in sperm.

Evolutionary biologist Ismael Galván at the University of Paris-Sud in France and his colleagues studied 134 species of birds, concentrating on mutation rates in their mitochondria, which help cells respire oxygen and which possess their own DNA. Sperm need a lot of oxygen, and any mutations in mitochondria could hamper sperm and thus hobble a bird's chances at reproduction.

The researchers found the 42 species of birds with testicles darkened by melanin, such as owls and thrushes, had relatively higher mutation rates in their mitochondria than the 92 other birds without inky testes. They also discovered that melanin was most often seen in testicles during the breeding seasons of birds, when sperm was likely generated.

## Hacker writes easy-to-use Mac Trojan

NEW YORK, 27 Feb—In a sign that hackers, like everyone else, are taking an interest in everything Apple, researchers at Sophos say they've spotted a new Trojan horse programme written for the Mac.

It's called the BlackHole RAT (the RAT part is for "remote access Trojan") and it's pretty easy to find online in hacking forums, according to Chet Wisniewski a researcher with antivirus vendor Sophos. There's even a YouTube video demonstration of the programme that shows you what it can do.

Sophos hasn't seen the Trojan used in any online attacks — it's more a bare-bones, proof-of-concept beta programme right now — but the software is pretty easy to use, and if a criminal could find a way to get a Mac user to install it, or write attack code that would silently install it on the Mac, it would give him remote control of the hacked machine.—Internet

## Frustrated with facebook, 'Breakup Notifier' maker launches 'Crush Notifier'

WASHINGTON, 27 Feb—Facebook may have shut down your favourite stalker app, Breakup Notifier, but don't worry, creator Dan Loewenherz has released a new one for you: Crush Notifier.

"In short, it's anonymous crushing," Loewenherz, a 24-year-old programmer, explained in a blog post on Saturday. "Crush your friends without them knowing. If they crush you back, you both get an email. Simple as that!"

To start, log onto your Facebook account and accept the terms and conditions of the app. Then choose people on your Friends list on whom you have a crush. He or she won't know, but if the person happens to choose you too, both of you will be notified.

While the simplicity and aesthetics of Crush Notifier mimic its predecessor, the mechanics show a bit more sophistication. Loewenherz has implemented Facebook Credits to monetize the new app, which he hinted during an interview with PCMag on Thursday. Every user can anonymously choose two crushes for free, but to follow more, you'll have to either enter your friend's email address or purchase Facebook Credits with actual money.

### Health officials track measles exposure at three US airports

BOSTON, 27 Feb—State health officials are trying to track down travelers who may have been exposed to measles after a passenger who was contagious passed through three major US airports.

A woman with a confirmed case of measles travelled from the United Kingdom through Washington Dulles International Airport, Denver International Airport and on to Albuquerque International Airport last week, said Tom Skinner, spokesman for the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention.

The CDC has provided state health officials with information about passengers on those flights to begin tracing who may have had contact and if immunizations are current, said Skinner.

On Friday, Colorado health officials issued a warning to travelers and workers at Denver International Airport of possible exposure to the passenger who is from New Mexico and was at the airport for several hours on Tuesday night.

Officials believe the diagnosed case of measles was contracted overseas, said Skinner.

States, with assistance from the CDC, will determine who is at risk and typically look at other passengers seated near the confirmed case, he said.

### Health tip: If your child has cystic fibrosis

Children with cystic fibrosis may have different dietary needs than other children.

The Nemours Foundations says parents should make sure that children with cystic fibrosis get plenty of:

- \* Calcium for bone health, via dairy products and calcium-fortified foods and drinks.
- \* Essential fatty acids that may play a role in lung function, via walnuts, salmon, and flax seeds. Supplements are OK if your pediatrician approves.
- \* Vitamins A, D, E and K — the fat-soluble vitamins — via supplements to help boost the immune system.
- \* Iron to prevent anemia, via meats and dark green veggies.
- \* Salt, to counteract salt loss through sweat.
- \* Zinc, to boost the immune system and promote healing, via eggs, meat and seafood.—Internet



### Fatty liver increases risk of type two diabetes

LOS ANGELES, 27 Feb—Individuals with fatty liver were five times more likely to develop type 2 diabetes than those without fatty liver, researchers at Stanford University in California said.

This new finding was published by the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) on its website.

The researchers examined 11,091 Koreans who had a medical evaluation including fasting insulin concentration and abdominal ultrasound at baseline and had a follow-up after five years.

### Ford looking to retain Mercury owners

DEARBORN, 27 Feb—Ford Motor Co dealers in the Midwest said the company is attempting to retain its Mercury customers by offering discounts if they stay with the company.

The deals are exclusive to the Midwest, *The Wall Street Journal* reported Saturday. To keep Mercury owners loyal to Ford, the company is offering \$500 discounts toward the purchase of another Ford product and \$1,500 if they choose a Lincoln, the dealers said.

The programme is expected to end 4 April and is meant to corral Mercury owners who could wander off, as Ford discontinued the Mercury brand last year.

The programme is also intended to boost Lincoln sales, especially at exclusive Lincoln-Mercury dealerships that lost half their lineup when Mercury was phased out.—Internet

### Toys R Us mulls \$800 million IPO for April

CHICAGO, 27 Feb—Toys R Us Inc (TOY.UL) is looking to raise around \$800 million in an initial public offering in April, though a final decision has not been reached, *the New York Post* said on Saturday.

The New Jersey-based retailer, which operates stores under its namesake brand and the Babies R Us and FAO Schwarz labels, had put off plans for an IPO in 2010.

"Toys R Us took more market share from competitors last year than they have in the past 20 years," said one source the Post described as close to the company. "But I don't think they were satisfied with how they did on the profit level." Toys R Us spokeswoman Kathleen Waugh said the company could not comment on the matter.

For December 2010, Toys R Us reported a 5.4 percent total sales rise at its US unit as it lured holiday shoppers away from No 1 toy retailer Wal-Mart (WMT.N) with more temporary stores and exclusive toys. But same-store sales fell 5 percent at its international segment.

Overall, a tough 2010 holiday season had margins hit across the toy industry by bargain-seeking, recession-hit consumers. So the economic environment has stoked continued debate between management and owners at Toys R Us about whether this is the best time to re-launch an IPO, according to a source briefed on the situation, *the Post* reported.

Toys R Us was taken private in 2005 by Kohlberg Kravis Roberts (KKR.AS), Bain Capital and Vornado Realty Trust (VNO.N) in a \$6.6 billion deal.—Internet

### Dell to open 1,000 stores in China

BEIJING, 27 Feb—The US computer maker Dell Inc said on Thursday that it will aggressively expand its sales and after-sales service network in China this year as part of its efforts to tap the local market, where domestic player Lenovo Group dominates.

Michael Yang, president of Dell's operations on the Chinese mainland, said in an interview that the world's third-largest PC maker by market share will establish more than 1,000 new retail stores for commercial customers and also double the company's after-sales service sites in China this year.

"Although China's PC market has slowed down since last year, computer demand is still robust," Yang said on Thursday.

## Man blows himself up near Moscow supermarket

Moscow, 27 Feb—A man who apparently was distraught after an argument with his wife blew himself up near a Moscow supermarket, killing himself, *ITAR-Tass* news agency reported.

No other injuries were reported in the incident in the city's northeast.

The wife of the man told police that her husband had quarreled with her about three hours earlier, after which he grabbed a gun and left their home, police spokesman Anatoly Lastovetsky was quoted as saying by *ITAR-Tass*.

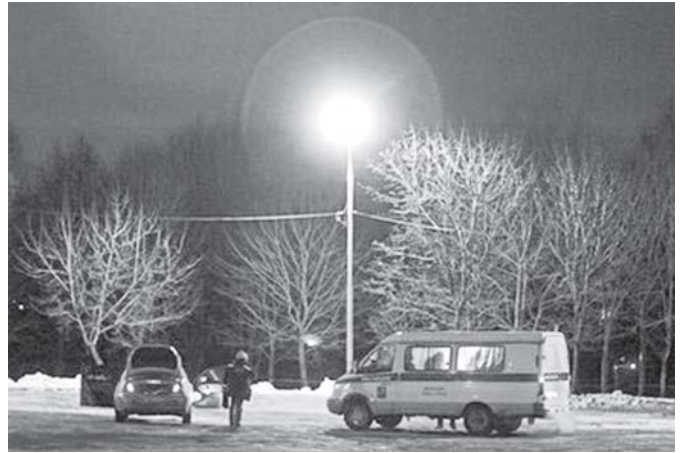
Lastovetsky did not specify how the man blew himself up, but the *Interfax* news agency reported that witnesses said he parked his automobile

near the supermarket, went to its entrance while muttering unintelligibly, pulled out a grenade and set it off.

There were no indications the act was intended as terrorism and *ITAR-Tass* cited the spokesman as saying the domestic quarrel was apparently the motivation.

But the explosion initially sparked fears that it could be a terror attack in a city that experienced one just over a month ago. A suicide bomber killed 37 people in a 24 Jan blast at Moscow's Domodedovo airport, the country's busiest. A leader of militants in Russia's Caucasus claimed responsibility for ordering that attack.

## Iran to build advanced fighter jet

TEHERAN, 27 Feb—The Islamic Republic of Iran Air Force has launched a project to design and build the country's most advanced fighter jet, the English language satellite Press TV reported Sunday.

Brigadier General Mohammadreza Karshki, a senior Iranian Air force commander, said Saturday that the Iranian Air Force is cooperating with the Defence Ministry in the project, which is now in the initial stages.

The new fighter jet is similar to the US-built *F/A-18*, while its appearance is similar to *F-5E/F Tiger II*, according to Press TV.

The new single-seater bomber has the ability to track down enemy aircraft, engage in combat, target locations on the ground, and carry assorted weapons and ammunition, said the report.

Iran said last February that it successfully tested the prototype of its first domestically-built stealth fighter, which, due to its physical attributes and the material used in its body, could not be detected by any radar.—*Internet*

## Southern Israel attacked by Gaza mortar shell

GAZA, 27 Feb—A homemade mortar shell was fired on Saturday night from the Gaza Strip at southern Israel, no injuries were reported, an Israeli army spokesman said.

The spokesman told Israel Radio that a mortar shell was launched from the Gaza Strip at Negev in southern Israel, adding that no injuries or damages were reported. No one claimed responsibility for the attack.

Earlier on Saturday, Israeli war jets carried out four successive airstrikes on southern and central Gaza Strip. Three airstrikes targeted training camps for Hamas militants, the fourth one was carried out on an empty house in central Gaza Strip town of Deir el-Ballah, said the witnesses and security sources.

Two people were reported injured in the airstrikes, added the witnesses and security sources.

In the early morning on Saturday, three successive airstrikes were also carried out on central and southern Gaza Strip. —*Xinhua*

## Int'l youths Conf on climate change ends in Indonesia

JAKARTA, 27 Feb—A five-day international youth conference held in Indonesia Yogyakarta ended here on Friday with a 32-point recommendation calling on each nation to address climate change and preserve the environment, local media reported here on Saturday.

"The recommendation, among others, urges each country to develop sustainable energy sources and promote the use of renewable energy such as solar, geothermal and wind energy," Gina Karina, a participant from Indonesia, said when reading the recommendation.

The recommendation also urged every country to promote awareness of environmental issues through mass media, education curricula and youth activities in support of environmental awareness, Gina said.

"The government of every country also needs to support community-based conservation projects, green technology and clean energy and give alternative income sources to the most vulnerable people because of climate change," she said.

Gina said each country needed to encourage development of conservation policies that take into account the needs of impoverished and marginalized people, she said.

SEATTLE, 27 Feb—John and Patricia Norvell kept thinking someone would come help them as they sat trapped for four days on a secluded, forest road near Mount St Helens with only jelly beans to eat and snow for water.

But as the third and fourth days approached, John said he felt dark at times, even as his wife's spirits remained high.

The 63-year-olds from Vancouver, Wash., played cribbage, spooned snow

into water bottles, and ran the engine just a few minutes at a time to stay warm and save gas. Sometimes, they turned the ignition just enough to run their heated seats off the battery.

Their ordeal, which began when the couple's Jeep Grand Cherokee slid into a waist-deep ditch, ended Friday when they were spotted by campers

"'Good Samaritan' doesn't even begin to cover these guys, what they did," John Norvell said in a phone interview Saturday. "They shoveled us out and they pulled us out, they gave me five gallons of gas and they didn't want nothing in return. I'll never forget these guys."

The couple was 30 miles from the nearest town when their SUV slid into the ditch Monday during a drive amid the snow-freighted evergreens. They wanted to try a new camera that John received from the Frito-Lay plant in Vancouver, where he worked for 38 years before retiring in January.—*Internet*

## Sailor shot after car chase at San Diego Navy base

SAN DIEGO, 27 Feb—Military officials say Navy police shot and injured one sailor and took another into custody following a car chase at Naval Base San Diego. ## NYC rower tries for third time to cross Atlantic

NEW YORK, 27 Feb—There is something about the sea that has caused Victor Mooney to lose all reason.

For years now, the 45-year-old New Yorker has believed that for all its vastness, the Atlantic Ocean is ripe for conquest; That a lone man pulling a pair of oars can shove off an African beach and slowly, steadily, row partway around the globe to New York harbour.

This is an idea he has refused to relinquish, despite repeated failure.

When the 24-foot wooden rowboat he built by hand for his first trans-Atlantic attempt in 2006 sank just hours into his trip from Senegal, he went out and got another, built by a professional. When that boat's drinking water systems failed two weeks into his 2nd attempt in 2009, necessitating a rescue, he chalked it up to bad luck, rather than fate telling him "No."

Now, he is trying again.

Mooney departed from a marina in the Cape Verdean islands at about 7:30 am Saturday, according to the local port captain. He pointed his bow west toward the Caribbean, and if his luck holds, and his latest boat remains afloat, and his back stays strong, and he doesn't go mad with loneliness, he plans to land in Brooklyn in six to eight months.

Speaking by telephone from the island of Sao Vicente on Thursday, Mooney said he was ready for the nearly 5,000-mile trip. He had already begun sleeping on his oceangoing rowboat to get his sea legs.

Gulati, who has had the licence revoked, "used the nose wheel to touch down instead of the rear landing gear" at the end of a commercial flight from New Delhi to Goa last month, the Times of India reported.

An inquiry into her performance then revealed she had landed planes incorrectly between 10 and 15 times, Indian media said, citing information from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA).

Gulati, who works for budget carrier IndiGo, was found to have forged papers

to get her airline transport pilot licence (ATPL).

"We have revoked her licence. The pilot seems to have obtained an ATPL by submitting forged documents," director-general of civil aviation Bharat Bhushan told the Times. "We are going to file a police complaint."

The DGCA is probing how she got her licence having failed the examination seven times, the paper added. IndiGo said: "We will follow any instructions from the regulator."—Internet

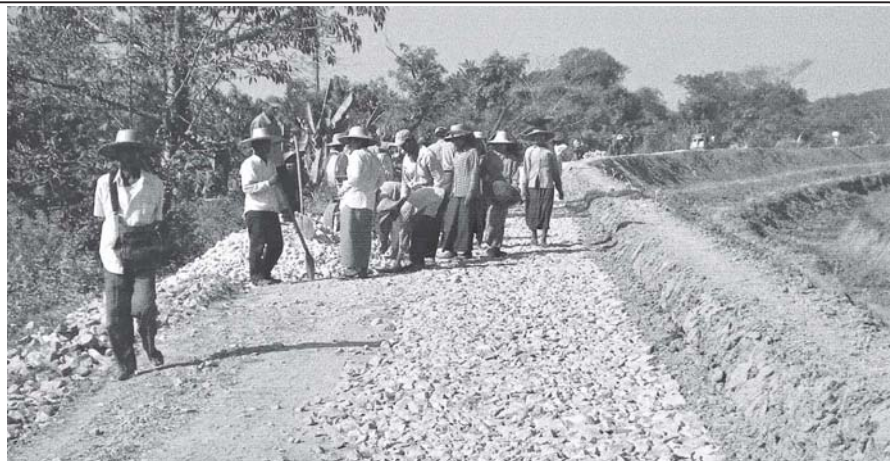
in Thongwakyun under the supervision of the Ministry for Progress of Border Areas and National Races and Development Affairs and the Ayeyawady Region Development Affairs Committee. Up to 2009-2010, the embankment has been paved with asphalt on 3.1 miles and four furlongs long section, gravel on 24.4 miles and three furlongs section and earth on 4.3 miles and one furlong long section. In addition, strand roads of Kyaung, Khanaungto and Pandaw villages and the roads in Thongwa Villages have been repaved with asphalt.

In 2008-2009

financial year, one brick bridge and three concrete conduits were built on the alignment leading to Kawakkin Village. The alignment was upgraded to the 8400 feet long and 8 feet wide gravel road in 2009-2010.

The original embankment of Thongwakyun was about 10 feet wide. At present, the embankment is being upgraded to the 12 feet wide gravel road on 18 feet wide earthen one. Out of 46 miles and four furlongs long embankment road, six miles and five furlongs long tarred road and 12 miles and six furlongs long gravel road have been constructed.

Senior Engineer U Tun Tun Naing and party

are constructing 25 miles long and 12 feet wide gravel on the 29 miles and two furlongs long and 18 feet wide earthen road linking Pantapuk to Kyonthin villages.

They are expanding the eight miles and four

furlongs long earthen road from Khanaung to Achan villages to the 12 feet wide facility. The Senior Engineer and party are carrying out the construction tasks with the use of eight backhoes, four dozers,

one loader and seven rollers.

The Development Affairs Department built 23 schools, one monastery and one dispensary, Senior Engineer U Tun Tun Naing explained.

Thongwakyun constituted with 76 villages in 17 village-tracts is home to 51771 people of 9568 households. The local people are engaged in cultivation of paddy, vegetables and horticultural tasks and fishery.

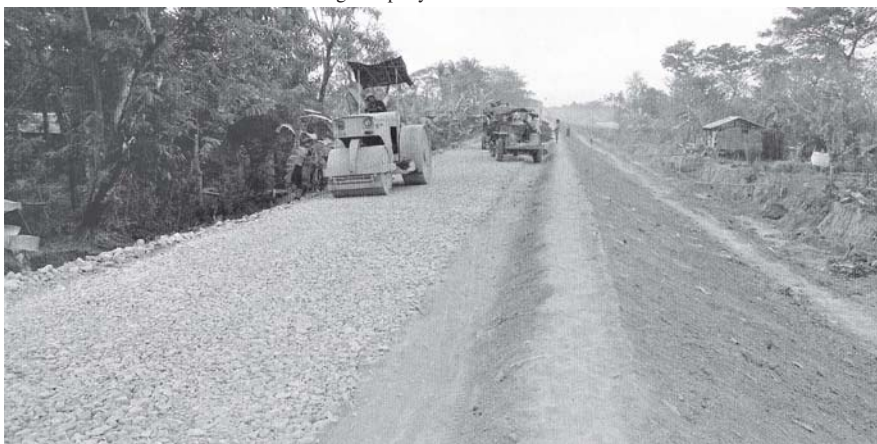

## Freight train derails near Tacoma

UNIVERSITY PLACE, 27 Feb—A freight train derailed and sideswiped another Saturday night on the banks of Puget Sound, sending some cars carrying a hazardous chemical careening off the rails near the water, officials said.

Fourteen cars derailed and most were empty, but four were tankers carrying sodium hydroxide, or lye, BNSF spokesman Gus Melonas said. The chemical is used in industry and

to regulate the pH levels of water but can be hazardous and cause breathing problems and burns.

No one was injured in the derailment, which occurred about 8:30 pm 13 miles south of Tacoma in Pierce County, he said.

Some of the derailed cars were lying near the shore of Puget Sound but none went into the water, he said.

One of the cars had leaked 10 to 20 gallons of the chemical and a hazardous materials crew was working to seal it.

Melonas said no evacuations had been ordered even though there are some homes in the area.

“Not much of the chemical leaked and there were no vapors,” he said. “A hazmat team determined that there was no public threat.”

The accident occurred as a 109-car BNSF train was heading north from Portland, Ore, passing an area known as the Tacoma Narrows.—Internet

## 31 Thai workers injured in gas explosion

BANGKOK, 27 Feb—Thirty-one workers were injured when a bio-gas pipe of a tapioca factory in northeastern province of Chaiyaphum exploded, causing massive fire that engulfed them, local media report on Saturday.

Police said the accident at the Chaiyaphum Starch Co Ltd in that happened at 4:30 pm local time on Friday, Thailand's English-language newspaper *The Nation* reported.

A factory engineer told police that the explosion was caused by sparks from wild grasses burning that were flown to the bio-gas pipe.

Police said 18 workers were severely injured in the fire and were rushed to hospital. The remaining injured workers were being treated at the Chaiyaphum Hospital. The tapioca factory used bio-gas, which was made from cassava wastes, to generate electricity for using in the factory.

## Vintage jet crashes in Hudson near Kingston, NY

KINGSTON, 27 Feb—A vintage military jet, now privately owned and flown in air shows, crashed into ice on the Hudson River on Saturday as it came in for a landing at an airport in Kingston, authorities said. The pilot was missing and feared dead.

A search for the pilot, identified as Michael Faraldi, 38, of Germantown, was suspended late in the evening,

state police said.

Divers searching the river for signs of Faraldi discovered that the front section of the plane, including the cockpit, had struck the river bed in about 5 feet of water, police said. The search was expected to resume Sunday.

The accident happened at about 1:30 pm near the Kingston-Rhinecliff Bridge, which spans the river midway

between Albany and New York City.

Federal Aviation Administration spokeswoman Holly Baker said the aircraft was partially submerged after the crash. Only one person was known to be aboard the plane when it went down.

Faraldi was piloting the plane from Nashville, Tenn, to an airport in Ghent, NY, state police said.—Internet

## Seven missing after cargo ship capsizes in East China Sea

HANGZHOU, 27 Feb—Seven sailors are missing after a cargo ship from east China's Zhejiang Province capsized in wee hours Sunday near Zhoushan of the province, according to company sources.

The ship, dubbed *Zheyuji No.618*, belonged to Haitong Shipping Business Company of Yuhuan County of Zhejiang, the sources said. It left Songmen Harbour of Wenling for Shanghai Saturday, carrying more than 500 tonnes of scrapped steels. It capsized after colliding with another cargo ship, and seven men aboard fell into the sea.—Xinhua

## Moderate earthquake hits central Japan

TOKYO, 27 Feb—A shallow earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 5.4 hit Japan's Honshu island at 5:38 am Sunday (2038 GMT Saturday), said the Japan Meteorological Agency.

There were no immediate reports of damage or casualties. No tsunami warning has been issued.

The quake was most strongly felt

in Takayama City of Gifu Prefecture in central Japan.

The inland quake hit at a shallow depth of 3.8 kilometers. The epicenter of the quake was around 221 kms west of Tokyo.

The United States Geological Survey (USGS) said the quake measured 5.2 magnitude.

## Philippine rebels kill three soldiers, wound four others

GAMU, 27 Feb—Philippine police say suspected rebels have killed three soldiers and wounded four others in an ambush despite the recent resumption of peace talks.

Police Senior Superintendent Laurence

Mombael says New People's Army rebels fired at about 30 army troops on patrol near Asipulo township in northern mountainous Ifugao province on Saturday then fled. Mombael said Sunday that reinforcement troops brought by a helicopter later clashed with and wounded an unspecified number of fleeing rebels.

Government and rebel negotiators last week resumed talks in Norway after more than six years and agreed to negotiate for a settlement of the 42-year conflict, one of Asia's longest, possibly by June 2012.—Internet



## Fresh case of bird flu confirmed in S Korea

SEOUL, 27 Feb — South Korea on Sunday confirmed an additional outbreak of bird flu in a southeastern region, raising fears of further spread, local media reported.

The deadly H5N1 avian influenza virus was found at a chicken farm in Yangsan, South Gyeongsang province, after some 60 chickens on the farm died Thursday.

Quarantine authorities had culled 300 chickens and 100 ducks on the

farm as a precautionary measure before the test results came out on Sunday.

The latest outbreak is the first to be confirmed in three years in South Gyeongsang province, and the provincial government plans to cull birds within a 500-meter radius of the infected farm.

A record 5.5 million birds have been put to death in South Korea since the outbreak of the disease started in December last year.—Xinhua

## China rail firms look abroad for expansion

BEIJING, 27 Feb—China's rail and train builders, who gained valuable experience at home in projects with Western heavyweights, are now competing with them for global contracts, but analysts say a lack of international savvy could clip their ambitions.

China already has 8,300 kilometres (5,150 miles) of high-speed rail and from next year will boast more than half of the world's fast tracks.

The country is also pouring money into its urban underground networks, with nearly two dozen major cities given the green light in late 2009 to build 89 metro lines by 2016 — at an estimated cost of 880 billion yuan (\$134 billion).

Train constructors China Northern Railway (CNR) and China Southern Railway (CSR), along with China Railway Group and China Railway Construction Corp Ltd, are now

confidently battling — and earning the respect of— industry giants Alstom, Bombardier and Siemens, from whom they acquired significant technology. Chinese firms gained the rights to use certain rail technology when they bought equipment from Western firms, which they went on to modify.

China says its products are the result of home-grown innovation, but some foreign executives complained in the past that technology meant for domestic use is now being used — unfairly — in products for export.

## Europe races to meet 'Mad March' debt deadline

BRUSSELS, 27 Feb—European leaders get back to the pressing business of trying to fix the eurozone debt crisis with a hectic series of summits counting down to a 25 March deadline.

Governments know they have their work cut out to satisfy expectant markets, with the heat still on over fears for Portugal and Greece, a country that wants its existing bailout renegotiated.

Final decisions are due to be reached on the size, shape and scope of a permanent financial rescue system being set up for 1 January, 2013.

A temporary fund, already tapped by Ireland in December, offers little room for manoeuvre if Portugal needs help in the short term.

Eurozone paymaster Germany won't guarantee its backing unless Berlin wins concessions on how other nations govern their finances first. Germany, supported by France, wants to reform everything from pensions to business taxation across the 17-nation eurozone in particular.

## US billionaire Buffett ready for more takeovers

NEW YORK, 27 Feb—US billionaire chief executive Warren Buffett said Saturday he is "itchy" for more takeovers less than one year after his \$26.5-billion purchase of the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway company.

In his annual letter to

his Berkshire Hathaway shareholders, Buffett wrote that in 2011 "we will need both good performance from our current businesses and more major acquisition."

"We're prepared," said Buffett, 80, the third richest man in the world. "Our elephant gun has

been reloaded, and my trigger finger is itchy."

Buffett said that his company is "envisioning a year free of mega catastrophe in insurance and possessing a general business climate some what better than that of 2010, but weaker than that of 2005 or 2006."

Berkshire Hathaway reported that 2010 net income was up 61 percent compared to the previous year to 12.97 billion dollars, and its per-share book value increased by 13 percent.

Buffett, widely seen as one of the most savvy investors in the United States, was bullish on the future of the US economy. "Money will always flow toward opportunity, and there is an abundance of that in America," he wrote.

## Anything really tasty promotes heartburn

DALLAS, 27 Feb—Eating or drinking certain types of foods, such as milk, in an attempt to reduce stomach acid generally doesn't work, a US digestive specialist advises.

Dr Stuart Spechler of the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Centre in Dallas says doctors used to suggest milk as an antacid, but it's really a very poor choice.

"Most of the foods that we eat buffer acid, but they also stimulate the stomach to produce acid later," Spechler says in a statement. "That's why we don't recommend them as a specific treatment."

However, avoiding foods that historically cause heartburn —

anything fatty or chocolate — is the better strategy, Spechler says.

Heartburn often is caused by reflux or backwash of acid from the stomach up into the esophagus — the long tube that carries food from the throat to the stomach. A valve at the end of the esophagus is supposed to function as a one-way release, relaxing to allow food into the stomach and closing back up so food and acid in the stomach stay there, but a leaky valve will result in heartburn, Spechler says.

"Anything that tastes really good is likely to give you heartburn and the reason is the fat content," Spechler says.—Internet

## Cancer test leading to 'needless biopsies'

NEW YORK, 27 Feb — Rapidly rising levels in a blood test for prostate cancer are a poor indication of whether or not a man has the disease, a study has shown. Doctors responding to the speed at which test results change — known as "PSA velocity" — may carry out unnecessary biopsies, say researchers. PSA, or prostate specific antigen, is a protein produced by cells in the prostate gland and also prostate tumours. Blood tests for PSA are routinely used to decide whether or not a man may have prostate cancer. Both higher-than-average PSA levels and sharp increases over time can lead doctors to perform follow-up biopsies. — *Internet*

## China's first law for preserving intangible cultural heritage passed

BEIJING, 27 Feb—China's top legislature has passed the country's first law for intangible cultural heritage. After ten years in drafting, the legislation is expected to ensure the better preservation of the country's cultural legacies.

With one of the world's few continuous civilization histories, China has a wealth of intangible cultural heritage.

As early as 1998, authorities organized nationwide investigations into folk art and ethnic customs, laying an important foundation for the law.

Zhu Bing has been working at the National People's Congress Standing Committee for over two decades, and has been involved in the whole process leading to the birth of the law.

Zhu Bing, NPC Standing Committee, said, "The primary target of China's heritage protection efforts used to be tangible items including all artifacts and historic relics. The enactment of the this new law means that for the first time Chinese traditional cultural practices now have legal protection. "

In 2004, China was enlisted into the UN Intangible Culture Heritage Protection Pact. Acting with a strong sense of obligation, China began speeding up the legislative process.—*Internet*

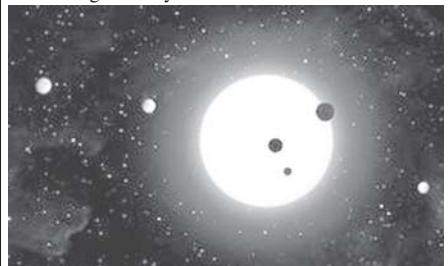
## European space concepts enter competition

## Two held over Vegas \$33,000 poker heist

LAS VEGAS, 27 Feb — Police in Las Vegas have made two arrests after an armed robber grabbed poker chips worth \$33,000 (£21,000) from one of the city's casinos. ## Cyclone puts cassowary in greater peril

LONDON, 27 Feb — The cassowary, one of the world's largest birds, beaten for size and weight only by the ostrich and emu, is in a fight for its life. The flightless bird has

talons that can tear open a human with one swipe, but it is normally a placid and shy fruit-eater. Now it is in peril as food supplies run low in the wake of Cyclone Yasi, which flattened vast swathes of rain-forest in northern Queensland earlier this month.

Emergency food drops have already been made in the Mission Beach area, south of Cairns. The Queensland government has set up more than 50 feeding stations to supplement the birds' diet. Graham Lauridon, a local vet, said the main threat is to younger cassowaries, unable to fend for themselves, who have to compete for food

with adult birds. "There's a strong likelihood we will lose quite a few in the next six months," he said.

Such was the devastation caused by Cyclone Yasi, which passed directly over Mission Beach, that much of the fruit that forms the principal ingredient of the bird's diet was left to rot on the forest floor. "Their habitat has been severely damaged, and very soon there won't be any fruit left for them to eat for some months," Mr Lauridon said. There are an estimated 200 cassowaries in the Mission Beach hinterland, roughly a 10th of Australia's population.

## Woman sues over lottery numbers miscue

A New Jersey woman says a New York City television station caused her thousands of dollars in emotional damage when it broadcast the wrong lottery numbers. In a lawsuit against WABC-TV and its parent companies, American Broadcasting Co and Walt Disney, Rakel Daniele of Fort Lee said she believed she was \$250,000 richer and was "severely damaged" upon learning that was not true, *The Record of Hackensack* reported on Saturday.

The suit, originally filed in New Jersey Superior Court, was transferred to federal court last week.

In legal papers, Daniele said WABC compounded the wrong by broadcasting the same incorrect numbers twice. On 29 June, 2009, the station said the winning numbers in the Mega Millions multi-state lottery were 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 with 12 as the Mega ball. Daniele had the first five numbers, which would have given her \$250,000.

## Worker rejects \$3.2M overpayment

A spokesman for a British company said a worker who immediately notified bosses of his mistaken \$3.2 million paycheck will be rewarded for his honesty.

The spokesman for Alcoa Howmet in Exeter, England, said the engineer, who makes turbine blades for the company, immediately informed his manager when he received a paycheck for \$3.2 million instead of the usual \$3,200 amount, the BBC reported on Friday.

"We are very happy that this employee acted so quickly but we are also looking into the incident," the spokesman said.

"We are obviously very pleased that the person acted in such an honest and immediate way, and showed so much integrity."

The vault's timers activated, locking the toddler inside. The mother and grandmother quickly realized where she was, and police rushed a technician to the scene. He drilled into the lock and rescued the girl after three hours, around 9 pm.

The girl was "crying a little bit, but doing well," Lee said. She had plenty of air and was safe, although "she was crying, which was certainly understandable," said bank spokesman Jay Lawrence.

The girl's mother and grandmother declined comment as they took the girl home. Their names were not released.

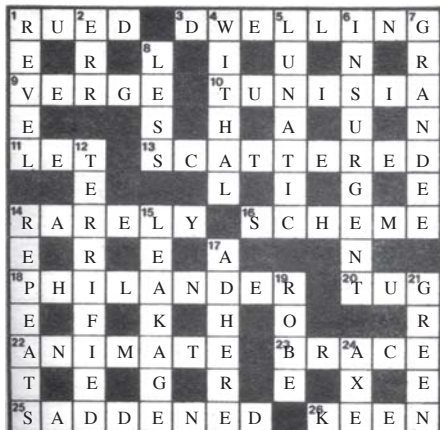

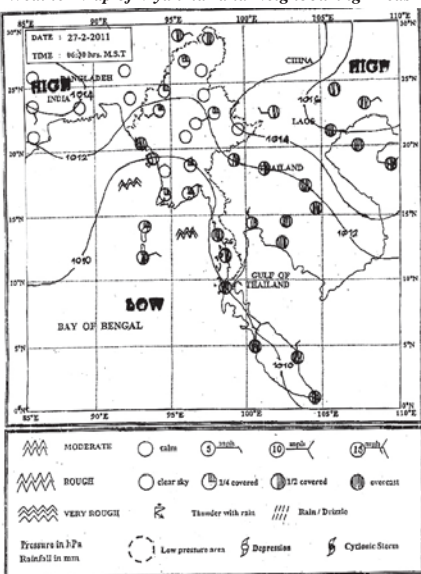

### Higher vitamin D intake could cut cancer risk

CALIFORNIA, 27 Feb— A new study says it takes far more vitamin D than initially thought to dramatically cut the risk of several major diseases, including breast cancer.

“We found that daily intakes of vitamin D by adults in the range of 4,000-8,000 IU are needed to maintain blood levels of vitamin D metabolites in the range needed to reduce by about half the risk of several diseases — breast

cancer, colon cancer, multiple sclerosis and type 1 diabetes,” study co-author Dr. Cedric Garland, a professor of family and preventive medicine at the University of California at San Diego, said in a university news release.

Garland admitted that he was surprised that the levels required were so much higher than the 400 IU a day needed to vanquish rickets in the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
