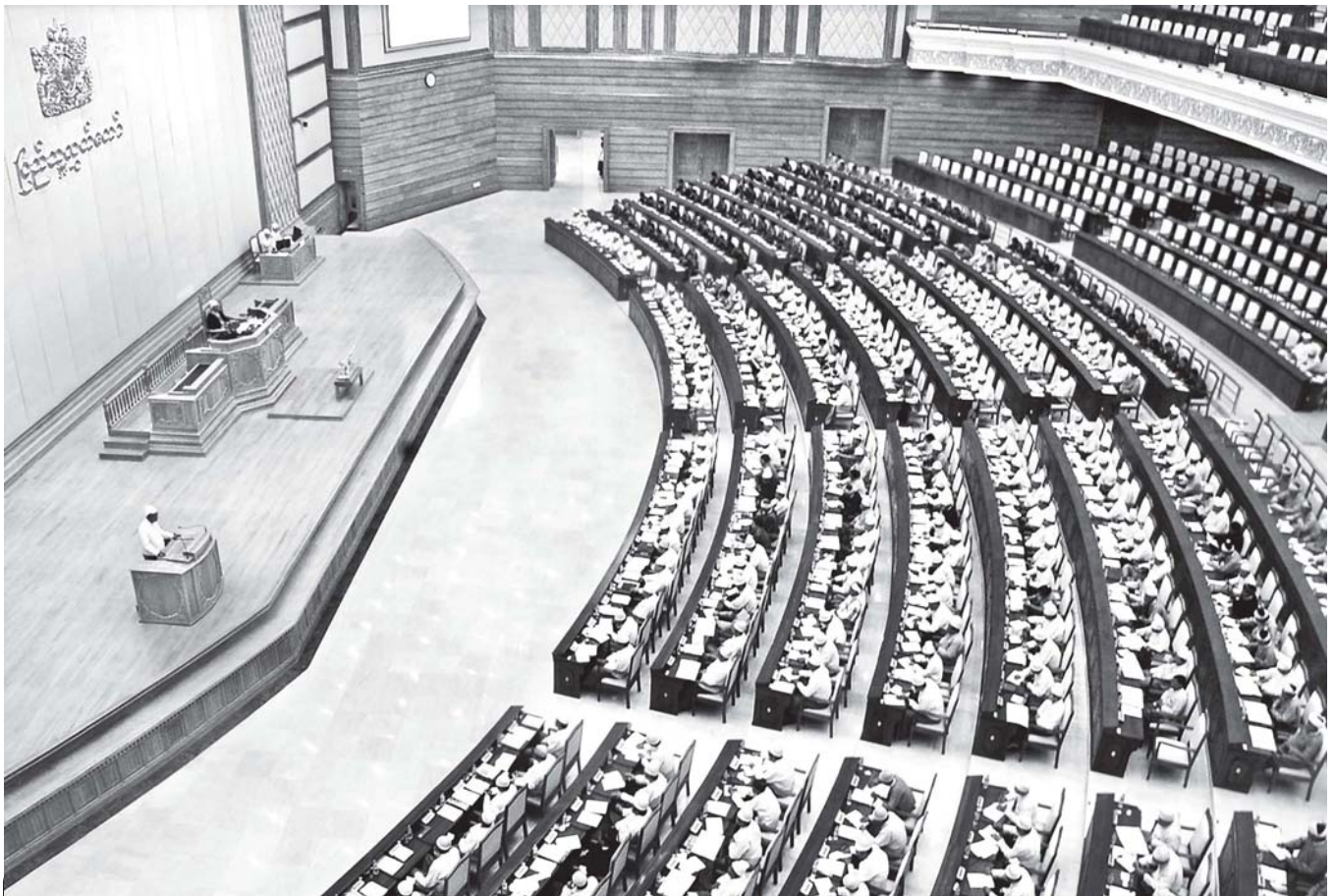

Pyithu Hluttaw continues first regular session for sixth day

NAY PYI TAW, 9 March—The first regular session of Pyithu Hluttaw went on for the sixth day at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Building here this morning.

The attendance of 431 made up 99.54 per cent of the 433 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives, and the sixth-day session was therefore valid, declared Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann.

Of the questions submitted under Pyithu Hluttaw Rule 116 by Pyithu Hluttaw representatives,

permitted ones were raised, and members of respective Union level organizations responded to the questions.

U Aung Tun Tha of MraukU Constituency asked if the government had a plan for MraukU archaeological region in Rakhine State to be on the list of UNESCO-recognized world archaeological sites.

Minister for Culture U Khin Aung Myint replied that the Ministry of Culture has submitted such Pyu city states as Srikestra, Vissano and Hanlin in accordance with the procedures of the

world heritage committee to UNESCO to put archaeological sites in Myanmar on the list of world cultural heritage sites in 2010.

He said that the ministry submitted the Pyu city states first that emerged between 1st century BC and 4th century AD which were earliest in the course of Myanmar history; that according to the conditions and evidences, the earliest three Pyu city states were submitted as related city states on the same list.

Goods flow picks up pace in northern Shan State

New Hsipaw Bridge was commissioned into service in Hsipaw Township, Shan State (North), on 6 March. Asia World Company built the bridge with the technological assistance of the Ministry of Construction.

The facility creates better transport of vehicles not only for Shan State (North) but also for other regions and states. The new bridge contributes much to export and import functions of border trade along Mandalay-Lashio-Muse Highway.

The old bridge of Hsipaw was gradually losing durability. Daily runs of trucks also caused damage to the bridge. In consequence, trucks had to wait for the whole night to cross the bridge, causing obstacles to smooth flow of commodities.

The already-inaugurated new Hsipaw Bridge is of reinforced concrete type steel frame type. The facility has a two-way motor road. The bridge is over 500 feet long. The bridge that can withstand 60-ton loads will be used as better facility for cargo trucks.

New Hsipaw Bridge is the 259th over 180 feet long facility in the entire nation and the 13th in Shan State (North). As small and large bridges and roads are being built as links among regions and states, the local people are enjoying fruits of smoother transport in their respective areas. Regional development helps uplift social-economy of the national people.

While building new roads across the nation, the government continues construction of river crossing bridges. As a result, growth in trade and business gain greater momentum. In fact, one after another emergence of roads and bridges is symbol of the nation and the people with strong strengths of economy, spirit and technology.

Five killed in 2nd US drone attack in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 9 March—At least five people were killed and three others injured in the second US drone strike in northwestern tribal area of Pakistan on Tuesday afternoon, local media reported. According to Urdu TV ARY News, US drones fired two missiles at a house in Datta Khel area of North Waziristan, a place bordering Afghanistan and is believed to be a stronghold of militants.

This is the second attack in the last four hours. Earlier, a drone strike killed five people in Azam Warsak area of South Waziristan.

US attack in Datta Khel is the 16th of its kind in the northwestern tribal belt of the country since the beginning of this year.—Xinhua

Some 2,777 civilians killed in Afghanistan in 2010

KABUL, 9 March—United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) said Wednesday that 2,777 civilians had been killed in Afghanistan in 2010.

“In Afghanistan 2,777 civilians had been killed in 2010 which indicates 15 percent increase compared with 2009,” a report released by UNAMA here said.

A total of 2,080 or 75 percent of the death toll had been killed by anti-government elements, 440 by pro-government forces and 257 others by unknown people, according to the report.

The report also said that 55 percent of all the fatalities had been inflicted by suicide bomb attacks and Improvised Explosive Device (IED) blasts.—Xinhua

Blast kills NATO soldier in Afghanistan

KABUL, 9 March—A soldier with NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) was killed in an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) blast in Afghanistan on Wednesday, a press release of the alliance said.

“An International Security Assistance Force service member died following an improvised explosive device attack in southern Afghanistan today,” the press release added, without revealing the victim’s nationality.



Over 30 killed as blast hits funeral prayers in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 9 March—Tehrik-e-Taleban Pakistan (Pakistan Taliban) claimed the responsibility for Wednesday morning’s suicide blast at a funeral that has so far killed over 30 people and injured more than 40 others in Pakistan’s northwest City of Peshawar, reported local Urdu TV channel Geo.

According to the local media reports, the blast took place at about 11 am (local time) at a funeral held for the deceased wife of a commander leading the local militia against Taleban in a small village, some 20 kilometres away from Peshawar.

About 200 people were present at the funeral when the blast took place. Dozens of people were killed right on the spot while some others died later in hospital, said local reports.

Some local media reports said the blast killed 25 people while others reported that over 30 people were killed and more than 40 others injured.

Details about the identity of the suicide bomber are not immediately available. Eyewitnesses said that a man walked into the crowds attending the funeral and blew himself up.

Three people killed in Iraq’s violence

BAGHDAD, 9 March—Three people were killed and five others wounded in separate gunfire and bomb attacks in central and northern Iraq on Tuesday, the police said.

Gunmen using silenced weapons shot dead a civilian in al-Jamhouriyah neighbourhood in central the city of Fallujah, some 50 km west of Baghdad, a local police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident, gunmen disguised in military uniforms stormed the house of a government employee and stabbed him to death in Abu Ghraib area, just west of Baghdad,

a local police source said. The attackers separated the victim from his family members and dragged him outside the house before killing him, the source said.

Earlier in the day, the police said that an Iraqi professor at the University of Mosul was shot dead by gunmen in the city of Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad, while five people were wounded in separate attacks in Baghdad and Iraq’s eastern Province of Diyala.

Also in Diyala, Iraqi security forces conducted search operations across the Province during the past 24 hours and arrested

14 suspects and wanted individuals, the provincial police said.

Violence and sporadic high-profile bomb attacks continue in the Iraqi cities despite the dramatic decrease of violence over the past few years.

Lack of oxygen likely fish kill cause

REDONDO, 9 March—Nature, not environmental foul play, likely was responsible for a fish kill of more than a million sardines in southern California, officials said Tuesday.

Redondo Beach Police Sgt. Phil Keenan said authorities were confident about test results indicating oxygen deprivation caused the fish kill because another part of the same sardine school was doing well at the mouth of King Harbor, *CNN* reported.

“All evidence points to oxygen deprivation as cause of death,”

California Department of Fish and Game spokesman Andrew Hughan said. “There is no oil sheen, nor is there a chemical sheen.”

Keenan said clean-up boats would spend the next few days removing the dead fish by net.

“Part of the sardine school is out in the channel of the harbor and they’re doing fine,” Keenan told *CNN*. “For some reason, this large school of sardines got chased into the harbor — and they died off.”

Robots can understand humans

ATLANTA, 9 March—A preliminary study found a robot can be programmed to understand when it gets a human’s attention and when it doesn’t, US researchers said. The researchers at the Georgia Institute of Technology used a socially expressive robot named Simon to see whether they could determine when the robot successfully attracted the attention of a human who was engaged elsewhere and when he didn’t, the Atlanta institution said Tuesday in a release.

“The primary focus was trying to give Simon, our robot, the ability to understand when a human being seems to be reacting appropriately, or in some sense is interested now in a response with respect to Simon and to be able to do it using a visual medium, a camera,” said Aaron Bobick, professor and chair of the School of Interactive Computing in Georgia Tech’s College of Computing.

With nearly 80 percent accuracy, Simon could tell whether someone was paying attention to him or ignoring him, researchers said.

“Simon would make some form of a gesture, or some form of an action when the user was present, and the computer vision task was to try to determine whether or not you had captured the attention of the human being,” Bobick said.

Vietnam, Denmark sign agreement on climate change cooperation

HANOI, 9 March— Vietnamese Deputy Minister of Science and Technology Tran Viet Thanh and Danish Ambassador to Vietnam John Nielsen signed here Wednesday an agreement to extend research cooperation on climate change between the two countries for another three years (2011-2013).

The research programme will focus on scientific and technological application in fighting climate change, especially in minimizing its negative impacts on Vietnam, training Vietnamese researchers to meet international standards, and improving the infrastructure quality of Vietnam’s scientific and technological institutions and organizations.

Denmark has planned to invest 45 million Danish krone (8 million US dollars) in the programme, of which 15 million krone (2.7 million US dollars) will be disbursed in 2011 to implement at least three selected projects.

Vietnam is considered to be among the worst-affected countries by climate change, while response to climate change is one of Denmark’s priorities in granting loans to developing countries.

New TV and social media trend among the youth

LONDON, 9 March—Young Britons have taken to a new television and social media trend which could have far-reaching consequences for the worlds of broadcasting and advertising, according to a new study.

Specialist digital marketing agency Digital Clarity (<http://www.digital-clarity.com>) on Tuesday published a survey of 1,300 British mobile internet users below the age of 25 which showed that most use a mobile device to talk to friends about the show they are watching.

The Social TV trend exposed by the study could change the landscape for broadcasters and advertisers chasing youthful eye for on-screen attention, Digital Clarity said in a statement.

Eight out of 10 respondents to the poll said they used Twitter, Facebook or other mobile applications to actively comment on shows and chat with their friends as they watch.

Wireless expert Parrot seeks acquisitions

PARIS, 9 March— French wireless devices specialist Parrot (PARR-OPA) is looking for acquisitions and has up to 40 million euros available to spend, its finance director told *Reuters* on Tuesday.

Parrot is looking at strengthening its technology portfolio or adding a new product but is not

chasing large transactions as it is “not a debt-oriented group”, Gilles Labossiere said in an interview.

“We needed a strong cash base to address risks, but we can say that we have achieved this and, like everyone else, we are looking for acquisition opportunities, we are curious,” Labossiere said.

At the end of 2010, Parrot had almost 91 million euros (\$126.6 million) in cash, of which 30 million to 40 million could be used for external growth, Labossiere said.

Parrot, founded in 1994, designs hands-free phone kits and car stereo devices allowing internet navigation, with clients such as Renault-Nissan (RENAPA) (7201T), Ford (FN), Volkswagen (VOWGDE) and BMW (BMWGDE).—*Reuters*

Google releases latest version of Chrome browser

SAN FRANCISCO, 9 March—Google on Tuesday released a new stable version of its Chrome web browser, which the company said is speedier, simpler and safer.

“With today’s stable release, even your most complex web apps will run more quickly and responsively in the browser,” Tim Steele, a Google software engineer, said in a blog post announcing the release.

The new version of Chrome features a simpler settings page that

opens in a tab rather than a dialog box, and contains a search box showing users the settings they are looking for while they type.

Users can also synchronize passwords in the browser across their computers, and will be able to encrypt those passwords for extra security.

Google said that the latest Chrome browser provides additional layer of protection against malicious web pages, with the extended application of sandboxing technology.—*Xinhua*

Boys' own cells used to build urethras

WINSTON-SALEM, 9 March— US researchers said they used the cells of patients to build urinary tubes — urethras — and successfully replace damaged urethras in all five.

Senior author Dr Anthony Atala, director of the Wake Forest Institute for Regenerative Medicine and a pediatric urologic surgeon, said from March 2004 to July 2007, the team built engineered urethras for the five boys, ages 10-14, using the patients' own cells.

Three of the boys had widespread injury due to pelvic trauma and two had previous urethra repairs — tissue graft, usually taken from skin or from the lining of the cheek — that had failed. The engineered tubes were used to replace entire segments of damaged urethra in the section that runs between the penis and the prostate.

The five boys were treated at the Federico Gomez Children's Hospital in Mexico City.

CDC: 'Diabetes belt' mostly in Southeast

ATLANTA, 9 March—Areas with high rates of diabetes — a "diabetes belt" — are clustered in 644 counties in 15 mostly Southeastern States, US health officials said.

Lead investigator Lawrence E Barker of the National Centre for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion at the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta said it was in the 1960s when Southern States were identified as the "stroke belt," but this is the first time diagnosed diabetes clustering was identified in all US counties.

The belt — diabetes prevalence rates greater than 11 percent — includes portions of Alabama,

Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia and the entire state of Mississippi. "Although many risk factors for type 2 diabetes can't be changed — age and race/ethnicity — others can such as physical activity and eating healthier food," Barker said in a statement.

"Community design that promotes physical activity, along with improved access to healthy food, can encourage the healthy lifestyle changes that reduce the risk of developing type 2 diabetes."

Colombia seeks closer trade relations with Asian countries

BOGOTA, 9 March — Colombian Foreign Minister Maria Angela Holguin on Tuesday said her country is looking for a commercial approach to increase its trade balance with several Asian countries. "Colombia must get closer to Asia.

Now we are opening embassies in Indonesia, Turkey, United Arab Emirates. Similarly, we will also improve the embassies in Korea, China and Australia," Holguin said. She said Colombia shares trade offices with Peru in several Asian countries such as Vietnam. "We are opening trade offices in Singapore, we are opening trade offices with Peru and Chile in Asia.

We will have nearly ten offices in Asia," she said. Holguin said Colombia expects to sign a free trade agreement (FTA) with the United States this year, and the trade balance with Venezuela is improving. Colombia has signed FTAs with Canada, as well as with El Salvador, Guatemala and Honduras (Northern Triangle), with Switzerland, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein (European Free Trade Association), and the European Union.—Xinhua

Queensland floods drag Australian home loans down in January

SYDNEY, 9 March— The latest Australian housing finance figures show a decline in the number of loans approved in January following flooding in Queensland State.

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) reported on Wednesday that home loans approved in January had fallen 4.5 percent in January to 48,871.

Economists' forecasts had centered on a 0.5 percent rise in housing finance commitments for the

month. Flood-ravaged Queensland alone recorded a drop of 16.4 percent to the lowest in just one month short of a decade.

Australia's financial services company, ICAP senior economist Adam Carr said it was pretty clear that recent flooding in Queensland had dampened the overall number, although he expected the number to pick up during the rebuilding period.

"There's a big rebuilding underway in Queensland and obviously that's going to flow through to lending numbers," Carr said.

China's February consumer confidence rebounds on food price drop

BEIJING, 9 March— Chinese consumers' confidence slightly rebounded month on month in February on lower food prices and a shopping spree on non-daily essential goods during the Spring Festival holiday, according to an index reading released Wednesday.

The Bankcard Consumer Confidence Index (BCCI), compiled by Xinhua News Agency and China UnionPay, a Chinese banking card industry association, rose to 86.04 points in February this year, up 0.51 points from January.

But the figure was down 0.59 points from the same period last year.

With the traditional Spring Festival season over and onset of warmer weather, food prices edged down due to weakening demand and stronger supply, said the February BCCI report.

The report said the wholesale price index of agricultural products had dropped to 186.26 last month, down nearly 5 percent from the January level, citing figures from the Ministry of Agriculture.—Xinhua

government promulgated Tenancy Law and The Law Safeguarding Peasant Rights in 1963; that the peasantry were pleased with the law enacted in their interests; that however, now lands of peasants are nationalized in terms of compensation, construction of factories,

related procedures, directives and orders.

Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation U Htay Oo said that the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation is safeguarding the rights and serving the interests of peasants who constitute the majority of the nation's population in accordance with

other provisions of this Act mentioned, the President or authority appointed by the President for this particular matter, may deem necessary, any agricultural land can be summoned to use specific mean or method", that The 1963 Tenancy Law was enacted under Law No (8) of the Revolutionary Council of the Union of Myanmar in 1963; that under the law, peasants enjoy the rights:

- (a) No one except farmers can do agricultural farming.
- (b) Land can be inherited if it is farmed as a family business.
- (c) No need to pay rent.
- (d) Land can be farmed as long as land rules are not violated.

In order to address farm issues, the government promulgated The 1963 Tenancy Law; that Article 3 (1) of The Law Safeguarding Peasant Rights promulgated under Law (91) of the Revo-

lutionary Council of the Union of Myanmar says, "Notwithstanding anything elsewhere contained in any existing law, a Civil Court shall not make a decree or order for:—

- (b) Prohibition of work upon or entry into agricultural land.
- (c) Prohibition of movement or sale in whole or part or use of employed livestock and implements, harrows and implements, other animate and inanimate implements, or the produce of agricultural land.
- (d) Arrest and detention of a peasant in connection with any matter included in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

Today, the laws are still in force; that in general, active lands of peasants are not nationalized; that however, there is a project in national interests, the maximum area of land was used, and there were events in which lands were nationalized under the arrangements of local authorities in line with the 1988 terms replacing act according to the power vested under Article 39

of The 1953 Land Nationalization Act; that in the process, coordinated arrangements are made under the supervision of local administrative bodies for reasonable compensations to peasants with grievances;

the laws, procedures and directives issued by regional authorities to avoid grievances of peasants.

U Ye Tun (a) U Min Tun of Hsipaw Constituency said that he learnt that some companies occupied farmlands but pay

that some lands nationalized in terms of compensations for urbanization projects cannot be launched on schedule; that before launch of such projects, green light is given to farm lands temporarily in the national interest; that sometimes, permission is granted to entrepreneurs for boosting agricultural production; that in that regard, administrative bodies supervise processes to keep balance of interests between the entrepreneurs and farmers who are farming the lands temporarily; and that the ministry works in cooperation with related bodies in line with

small amount of compensations, and peasants are angry with them; that Myanmar is an agro-based country, so he believes that only if farmland issues are addressed properly will it be possible to serve the interest of peasants; that in addition, peasants have to borrow money at high interest rates due to the fact that farmers have the right to farm lands but not every farmer has the right to own lands; and that in that regard, he asked if the forthcoming government has a plan to deal with such cases, promulgating necessary laws.

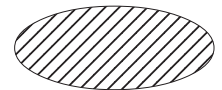

Minister U Htay Oo responded that Article 38 (1) of The Land Nationalization Act (1953) says, "If the President may deem beneficial to the State or to the agriculturalists, by growing some specific crops in some areas and by using specific means to agricultural lands, the President may deem to apply or ask to apply specific crops or specific means to use on agricultural land respectively"; that Article 39 of the law says, "However, other provisions of this Act mentioned, the President or authority appointed by the President for this particular matter, may deem necessary, any agricultural land can be summoned to use specific mean or method"; that if necessary, lands are nationalized, but in general active farmlands are not nationalized except unavoidable conditions; that regarding alternative means according to Article 39 of the Land Nationalization Act (1953), if and when there are projects for national development, related administrative bodies make sure that the minimum area of lands is to be nationalized and reasonable amounts of compensations are to be paid; that so if there is an unusual case, it is needed to deal with relating administrative bodies in the Region or State concerned; and that the ministry will help coordinate the tasks.

He said that all the lands belong to the State, but The Tenancy Law (1963) was enacted to protect the rights of farmers; that it says that no one except farmers can do agricultural farming; land can be inherited if it is farmed as a family business; no need to pay rent; and land can be farmed as long as land rules are not violated; that Article 3 (1) of The Law Safeguarding Peasant

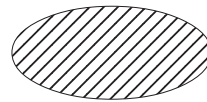
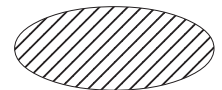

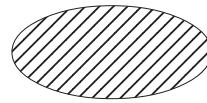

flowed to the in the hands of a handful of capitalists due to the rights to hand over, mortgage and sell farmlands; that under the existing laws and rules, the government has bestowed the right to farm lands to peasants who really farm lands; and that therefore, the existing farmland laws are the most appropriate to safeguard peasants' rights.

U Aung Thein of Ywangan Constituency asked if the government notices that local farmers are burdened with the land reclamation project that are not beneficial to them; if it notices some projects harm environmental conservation; and if it does not do so, he wants to know whether an investigation committee will be formed to review the project.

Minister U Htay Oo said with the aim to boost production of crops suitable for the regions, cash crops, and crops that can contribute to the State and neighbouring countries, the ministry is granting permission to persons and companies that can reclaim vacant lands for agricultural purposes; that vacant, fallow and virgin lands belong to the State; that these

lands are reclaimed to grow marketable crops in the interest of the nation and the people; and that in response to their application, permission is granted to only individuals and organizations capable of farming lands with capitals, so that does not burden local peasants; that the ministry does not grant permission to reclaim such lands that are not arable; that permitted crops are perennial crops such as rubber, oil palm, mango, cashew and coffee; that Ywangan Township grows commonly coffee and mango; that perennial trees give many benefits such environmental conservation, jobs to local people, improvement of the

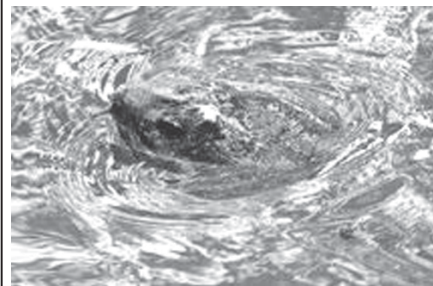

Drug dealer, wife killed in N Ireland

CRAIGAVON, 9 March—A man police identified as an Irish gangster and his wife were shot dead in their fortified home in Armagh in Northern Ireland, investigators said. The bodies of Hugh McGeough and his wife, Jacqueline, were found Monday afternoon by their son, *The Irish Times* reported. McGeough, 56, was described as a major drug dealer. Police said the house in Craigavon had bullet-proof glass in its windows, armored doors and security lights and cameras, and was only a short distance from a Police Service of Northern Ireland station. Investigators suggested the reinforced doors and windows may have delayed the discovery of the killings by muffling the sound of shots being fired.—Internet

Rescuers work to net Vietnam's 'sacred' turtle

HANOI, 9 March—Thousands of Vietnamese jostled and climbed trees around a lake in the capital on Tuesday hoping to see a rare giant turtle considered sacred by many but in desperate need of medical attention.

Dozens of workers waded chest-deep through the chilly green water in Hanoi's Hoan Kiem Lake to try to capture the giant

freshwater creature for the first time, so it could be pulled to an island and treated. It is one of the world's most endangered turtles — one of only four Rafetus swinhoei believed to be alive today — but its value to the nation transcends the natural world.—Internet

German, Italian police carry out mafia arrests

ROME, 9 March — Police in Germany and Italy arrested 35 alleged mafia members on Tuesday and five warrants have been issued in Australia and Canada in what is seen as a major blow to the 'Ndrangheta syndicate.

"We have hit at the central structure of the 'Ndrangheta," Carlo Pieroni, a spokesman for Carabinieri paramilitary police in the southern Italian region of Calabria who

led the operation, told AFP. "The 'Ndrangheta is on the brink or at least it will be forced to re-organize," he said, adding that the arrests were on multiple charges of extortion, drug trafficking and money laundering.

Interior Minister Roberto Maroni said: "This was an exceptionally important operation as it dealt a serious blow to the 'Ndrangheta in Italy and abroad."—Internet

Missing US student found dead in Madrid river

MADRID, 9 March—The body of a US exchange student from California was pulled out of a Madrid river on Tuesday, 10 days after he disappeared following a

night on the town, a police official said.

The cause of death was not known but there were no immediate signs of foul play in the death of 22-year-old San Diego State University business student Austin Bice, the National Police official said.

An autopsy will be carried out Tuesday or Wednesday. It is not clear when the results will be released but the information will be given to Bice's family and to a Spanish investigating magistrate, the Madrid regional government said.—Internet

Woman trying to pet moose in Alaska park gets kick

Don't mess with the moose. That's the warning police in Anchorage, Alaska, are repeating after one of the animals kicked a woman in the chest and shoulder at a city park. She was checked by medics Monday afternoon and didn't have to go to a hospital.

The Anchorage Daily News reports the moose had been in Town Square Park most of the day feeding on trees. The woman in her 20s was attacked when she tried to pet it. Police spokeswoman Anita Shell says the moose is not a threat unless provoked, so people need to give it space.

Oldest wild bird in US is new mother

The oldest known wild bird in the US is a new mother. A US Fish and Wildlife Service biologist spotted the Laysan albatross that's at least 60 years old a few weeks ago. It was with a chick at Midway Atoll, a remote wildlife refuge 1,300 miles northwest of Honolulu.

A US Geological Survey scientist first banded the seabird as she incubated an egg in 1956.

She was estimated to be at least 5 years old at the time. The albatross has since worn out five bird bands.

Bruce Peterjohn, the chief of the North American Bird Banding Programme, said the albatross is the oldest wild bird documented by the 90-year-old bird banding programme, which is run by the US Geological Survey, the Fish and



Wildlife Service, and Canada. "She looks great," Peterjohn said in a news release Tuesday. "To know that she can still successfully raise young

at age 60-plus, that is beyond words." The bird, named Wisdom, has likely raised at least 30 to 35 chicks during her life, Peterjohn said.

Thief pillages Caribbean flight via toilet

An ingenious thief swiped almost a quarter million dollars on a flight in the Caribbean after sneaking into the cash-laden cargo hold via the toilet, police said Thursday.

A Brink's security employee placed three sacks of cash containing a total 1.2 million euros in the hold of the *Air Antilles* plane before it headed from the French island of Guadeloupe to the Franco-Dutch island of Saint Martin.

The security guard took his seat on the *ATR-42* turboprop plane but when the flight landed 40 minutes later it was discovered that 172,000 euros (238,000 dollars) were missing from the sacks.

Police are seeking a man who complained he felt ill and spent most of the journey in the toilet. In

fact, he was removing panels to gain access to the hold in the rear of the plane. Shortly before landing, the unnamed man — who was travelling with a woman who appeared concerned about his health — asked a hostess for an ambulance to meet him on the tarmac, witnesses said.

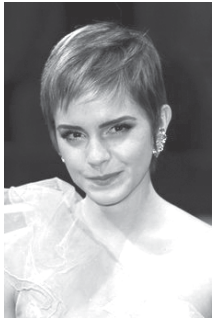
When the ambulance arrived, the man said he felt suddenly better and walked out of the airport without having to go through the normal security checks and disappeared, police said.

Cleaners who found bundles of notes in the toilet raised the alarm.

The woman travelling with him was questioned in the baggage arrival hall but did not have any of the missing money.

"We do well out of our supporting the team," said Engel, whose company specialises in chemicals.—*Internet*

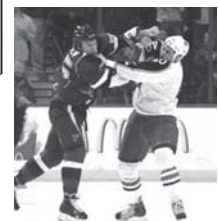

The Blues scored three

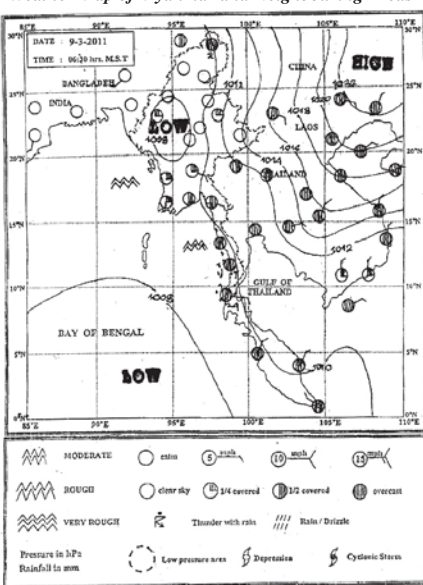


times on four shots against Steve Mason in the shootout with Alex Steen getting the deciding tally.

Satellite crash leaves NASA in fiscal dilemma

BEIJING, 9 March — The loss of NASA's Glory satellite last week has left NASA in a fiscal dilemma to finish its climate satellite missions, according to "ScienceInsider" news Wednesday. The 424 million US dollar satellite *Glory* blasted off last Friday but failed to reach its orbit. As part of the US remote observation system, it carried advanced equipment to help scientists understand how solar irradiation, clouds and other particles of matter in the atmosphere affect the climate.

Glory's loss increased pressure from the Congress to cut the budget for Earth science. The House of Representatives has already approved cutting NASA's budget for the rest of 2011 by 600 million dollars while the Senate Democrats, 200 million. NASA originally expected the Congress to approve the president's request to grow the agency's budget for Earth science in the next four years from 1.8 billion dollars to 2.3 billion.—Xinhua

NAY PYI TAW, 9 March—The first regular session of Amyotha Hluttaw continued for the sixth day at Amyotha Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Building, here, at 10.30 am today, attended by Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint and Amyotha Hluttaw representatives.

After taking position, Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint announced the validity and start of the sixth-day session as 222 or 99.55 per cent of 223 Amyotha Hluttaw representatives were present.
