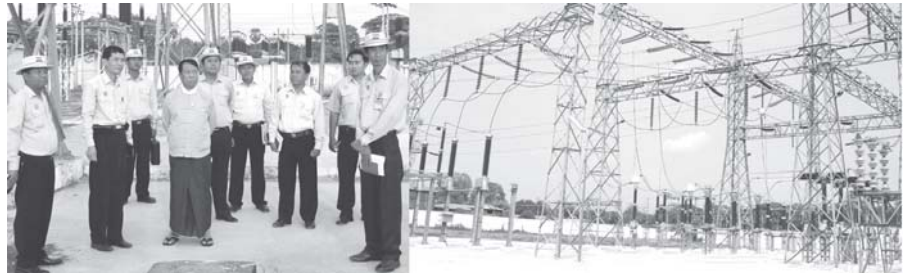

Ex-Marine, advocate kills self after war tours

WASHINGTON, 15 April—Handsome and friendly, Clay Hunt so epitomized a vibrant Iraq veteran that he was chosen for a public service announcement reminding veterans that they aren't alone.

The 28-year-old former Marine corporal earned a Purple Heart after taking a sniper's bullet in his left wrist. He returned to combat in Afghanistan. Upon his return home, he lobbied for veterans on Capitol Hill, road-biked with wounded veterans and performed humanitarian work in Haiti and Chile.

Then, on 31 March, Hunt bolted himself in his Houston apartment and shot himself. Friends and family say he was wracked with survivor's guilt, depression and other emotional struggles after combat. Hunt's death has shaken many veterans who served in Iraq and Afghanistan. Those who knew him wonder why someone who seemed to be doing all the right things to deal with combat-related issues is now dead. "We know we have a problem with vets' suicide, but this was really a slap in the face," said Matthew Pelak, 32, an Iraq

veteran who worked with Hunt in Haiti as part of the nonprofit group Team Rubicon.

After news of Hunt's death spread, workers from the Tragedy Assistance Programme for Survivors met with veterans visiting Washington for the annual lobbying effort by the nonprofit Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans, or IAVA. A year earlier, Hunt had been with other veterans in dark suits calling on Congress to improve the disability claims process.—*Internet*

Belarus bombing death toll rises to 13

MINSK, 15 April—The toll of the Minsk metro bombing rose to 13 on Friday after a victim died from wounds in hospital, a spokeswoman for the health ministry said.

"One of the wounded died during the night in Minsk's Hospital Number 6," the spokeswoman said.

The toll previously stood at 12 dead and 200 injured after a bomb exploded on the platform of a crowded metro station on Monday evening.

So far Belarus has detained five people in its investigation and formally arrested two people who are suspected to be the perpetrators and an accomplice, the deputy prosecutor general said on Thursday.

President Alexander Lukashenko called for a "cleansing" of the country after the attack, the most deadly in the country's post-Soviet history, but admitted the motives for the crime remained unclear.

Two people killed, 18 wounded in bomb attacks in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 15 April—Iraqi army patrol near the al-Liqaa square in western the capital, damaging a military vehicle and wounding three soldiers aboard, the source said.

Two people were killed and 13 wounded when twin roadside bomb explosions ripped through the town of Yousifiyah, some 30 km south of the capital Baghdad, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Yousifiyah is part of the once restive area dubbed Triangle of Death, which is a cluster of towns scattered north of Hilla City, the capital of Babil Province, some 100 km south of Baghdad.

In Baghdad, a roadside bomb struck an

Incident, a roadside bomb went off in al-Taji area, some 20 km north of Baghdad, wounding two civilians, the source added.

Violence and sporadic high-profile bomb attacks continue in Iraqi cities as the US troops are expected to completely pull out from Iraq by the end of 2011 according to the security pact named Status of Forces Agreement, or SOFA, signed in late 2008 between Baghdad and Washington.

14 killed, 22 injured in bus accident in Chile

SANTIAGO, 15 April—Fourteen people were killed and 22 others injured in Chile on Thursday when a passenger bus turned over on a highway connecting Chillan and Concepcion in the Bio bio region, some 550 kilometers south of the national capital Santiago, authorities said.

Earlier reports said that at least 11 died and 17 were injured.

Chile's National Office of Emergencies (Onemi) said the deceased included 10 women, two men and two children, while six of the injured were in serious condition.

The accident occurred at about 2:30 pm local time (1730 GMT) at an intersection of the highway, when the bus suddenly skidded off the road.

The exact cause of the accident remains unclear, but some survivors said the driver had entered a curve without reducing the speed.

The bus carried 40 passenger and a crew of three, authorities said.

Blast rocks Afghan Kandahar town, kills police chief

KANDAHAR, 15 April— Bomb blast rocked Afghan Kandahar town on Friday killing provincial police chief, an official said.

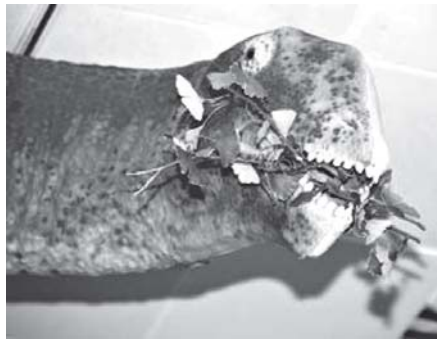
"A terrorist dressed in police uniform strapped explosive device in his boy blew himself up inside police department, leaving the police chief Khan Mohammad Mujahid dead," the official told *Xinhua*, but declined to give his name, saying authorized official would brief media after investigation.

Spokesman for Kandahar provincial administration Zalmay Ayubi also confirmed the incident, saying the provincial police chief was killed and two others sustained injuries.

"A suicide bomber exploded himself at the entry gate of provincial police department this afternoon as a result police chief Khan Mohammad Mujahid was martyred and two policemen sustained injures," Ayubi told *Xinhua*.—*Xinhua*

active by day or night, a release by the National Science Foundation, which funded the study, said Thursday.

Ryosuke Motani and Lars Schmitz at the University of California, Davis applied the technique to fossils of plant-eating and carnivorous dinosaurs, flying reptiles called pterosaurs and ancestral birds.

The big plant-eating

dinosaurs were active day and night, probably because they had to eat almost all of the time, whereas velociraptors and other small carnivores were night hunters, the study found.

Schmitz and Motani were not able to study the largest carnivores such as Tyrannosaurus rex because there are no fossils with sufficiently well-preserved eyes, they said.—*Internet*

DAVIS, (Calif), 15 April — The movie "Jurassic Park" got one concept right, US researchers say: Velociraptors hunted by night while big plant-eating dinosaurs browsed around the clock.

Conventional

wisdom has held that dinosaurs were only active by day while the night was the domain of small, early mammals, but a study of fossil dinosaur skulls and their eye sockets proved effective at predicting whether the animals were

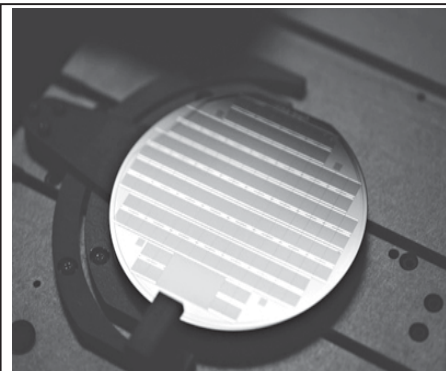

E coli shows useful side in pollution

BEIJING, 15 April — E coli bacteria, feared for its ability to cause food poisoning, could be used to extract pesticide vapors from polluted air, Chinese researchers say.

Researchers at the Chinese Academy of Sciences in Beijing have discovered that a genetically modified form of the bacteria can be used in a biofilter to extract the

toxic pesticides parathion and methyl parathion from the air, and article published in the *International Journal of Environment and Pollution* reported.

Junxin Liu and colleagues have demonstrated average removal efficiencies of 95.2 percent for parathion and 98.6 percent for methyl parathion, using a biofilter based on the engineered bacteria E coli BL21, and say optimization could allow for 100 percent removal. Parathion and methyl parathion are highly effective agrochemicals used in more than one-third of agricultural crop protection worldwide. However, they can accumulate in the environment and pose a risk to human health under some conditions, researchers said.

Huawei to double UK headcount

BEIJING, 15 April— Vendor will create 500 new permanent roles in the UK bringing its total headcount to 1,000

Chinese vendor Huawei says it plans to create 500 new jobs in the UK over the next three years, doubling its overall headcount in the country to 1,000.

The move will, according to Huawei extend its enterprise and device business bases and generate revenue growth as well as help it "explore broader ICT ad consumer business" across the UK.

As well as increasing its employee base, Huawei says it will generate another 1,000 to 1,500 subcontracting roles over the next three years.

It says it currently has around one hundred permanent and fixed term contracts available across its UK business.

As part of the plans to

increase its head count, Huawei is also in the process of developing a graduate programme to attract a "new generation" of British talent.

Huawei UK chief executive Victor Zhang said: "We are committed to bringing more job opportunities to the UK which is a key market for us.

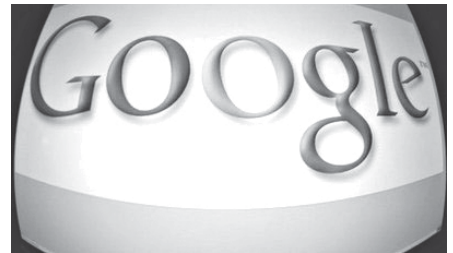

Google accused of unfair trade in S Korea

SEOUL, 15 April — South Korea's top two Internet companies filed complaints with the antitrust watchdog Friday over Google's alleged practice of stifling competition in the local mobile phone search market.

Daum and NHN Corp told the Korea Fair Trade Commission (KFTC) that Google exploited its position as developer of the Android mobile operating system to have its search function preloaded on local smartphones.



They said this limited access by local search engines to smartphones using the Android operating system.

NHN's Naver has a market share of around 56 percent of the domestic mobile search market

while Daum had around 16 percent as of last month, NHN said, citing market research data.

"Google's market share in the local internet search market only accounts for around 2 percent but due to such an unfair act, its share in the mobile market is fast rising in Korea, and it stands at around 15 percent," a NHN spokesman said.

Google denied the accusations, asserting that it has never pressed device manufacturers or mobile operators to use its mobile platform.

Paul Allen says new book isn't revenge on Gates

CALIFORNIA, 15 April —The controversy over Paul Allen's new book, which hits stores next week, has taken a different turn, with Allen playing defence against critics over the memoir's sometimes negative portrayal of Microsoft co-founder Bill Gates.

In an interview with "60 Minutes," which airs recently, Allen rebuffs criticisms from last month, saying the book is not an act of revenge against Gates, and is instead meant to serve as a record of what happened.

Excerpts from the book have Allen going into detail about how Gates had split up ownership in the company giving Gates nearly two thirds of ownership.

Patient's own cells used to probe schizophrenia

PARIS, 15 April—Skin cells have become lab-dish tools for probing one of the most enigmatic and distressing disorders of the mind, scientists reported on Wednesday.

Researchers in the United States took samples of skin cells from schizophrenic patients and turned them back to a primitive, versatile state called induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSCs).

From this blank slate, the cells were then cultured to become brain cells, enabling them to be used for lab-dish investigations into schizophrenia that can be tailored to the individual.

"Using this method, we can figure out how a particular drug will affect that particular patient's brain cells without needing the patient to try the drug and potentially suffer the side effects," said Gong Chen of Penn State University in Pennsylvania.

"The patient can be his or her own guinea pig for the design of his or her own treatment, without having to be experimented on directly."

Schizophrenia is a complex condition that is believed to have environmental as well as hereditary factors.

It is characterised by paranoid delusions and hallucinatory voices. Around one percent of the population worldwide are believed to be afflicted by the disorder.

Tests found that lab-dish neurons from schizophrenic patients had fewer connections with each other compared to cells taken from healthy individuals.—*Internet*

Fish oil may reduce postpartum depression

WASHINGTON, 15 April—Omega-3 fatty acids consumed during pregnancy may reduce the risk of postpartum depression, but a larger study is needed, US researchers say.

In a randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled dietary intervention trial, 52 pregnant women took either a placebo, corn oil,

or a fish oil capsule containing 300 milligrams of DHA five days each week from 24-40 weeks of pregnancy — the same amount a woman would consume if she ate about one-half serving of salmon.

Dr Michelle Price Judge of the University of Connecticut School of Nursing says dietary DHA intake during pregnancy has been estimated to be 50 to 70 milligrams of DHA daily — a fraction of the 200 milligrams daily that is considered optimal during pregnancy by most experts.

Judge and colleagues concluded DHA consumed during pregnancy — at levels that are reasonably attained from food — has the potential to decrease symptoms of postpartum depression.—*Internet*

Vegetarians have less metabolic syndrome

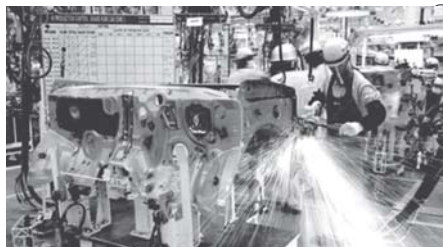
LOMA LINDA, 15 April—Vegetarians have lower prevalence of metabolic syndrome — a precursor to heart disease and diabetes — than non-vegetarians, US researchers say.

Metabolic syndrome involves having three or more of the following — blood pressure equal to or higher than 130/85 millimetres of mercury; fasting blood sugar equal to or higher than 100 milligrams per deciliter; large waist circumference [for men, 40 inches or more, for women 35 inches or more]; low high-density lipoprotein cholesterol [for men, under 40 mg/dL, for women, under 50 mg/dL; and triglycerides equal to or higher than 150 mg/dL.

The study examined more than 700 adults — 35 percent were vegetarians — randomly selected from Loma Linda University's long-term study of the lifestyle and health of almost 100,000 Seventh-day Adventists across the United States and Canada.—*Internet*

Toyota to halve Japan domestic production in May

TOKYO, 15 April—Japan's Toyota Motor Co said Friday it would operate all its domestic plants at half normal volume from 10 May to 3 June, citing problems with parts supply following the quake and tsunami disaster.

"As (Toyota) continues to address its production situation in Japan following the disaster, it has decided that vehicle production from 10 May to 3 June will proceed at approximately 50 percent of normal," the company said.

Toyota said in a statement it would

"decide on production after this period after assessing the situation of its suppliers and other related companies."

The Japanese giant last week said it would restart work at all its

Japanese vehicle-production facilities from 18 April to 27 April at approximately 50 percent of normal pace, before an annual Japanese holiday through 9 May.

Nestle sales fall on strong franc

ZURICH, 15 April—Swiss food giant Nestle said Friday its first quarter sales fell 9.3 percent to 20.3 billion francs (15.7 billion euros, \$22.7 billion), hit by the strong Swiss franc and costs arising from its sale of eyecare group Alcon.

"Sales were impacted by -9.8 percent from foreign exchange and by -5.9 percent from divestitures net of acquisitions," the group said in a statement.

The world's biggest

food company also noted that the first three months of the year was marked by "high-impact events ranging from civil unrest and natural disasters to extreme volatility in raw material prices."

Nevertheless, Nestle said it would be able to meet its full year target of

organic growth of between 5 and 6 percent.

The group reported in February that its 2010 net profits more than trebled to 34.2 billion francs on the sale of eyecare group Alcon to Swiss pharmaceutical group Novartis.

China growth eases, inflation hits 32-month high

BEDJING, 15 April—China said Friday its robust economy slowed slightly in the first quarter of 2011 but inflation hit a 32-month high, suggesting Beijing's efforts to rein in soaring costs are still falling short.

Gross domestic product in the world's second-largest economy expanded 9.7 percent on

Shortage of spare parts ground RAF jets

LONDON, 15 April— Pilots of the RAF's most advanced fighter aircrafts are being forced to cut down on flying hours owing to an acute shortage of spare parts, MPs warned on Friday.

The Commons Public Accounts Committee said five Typhoon pilots were temporarily grounded, unable to fly training sorties, last year because of a lack of available aircraft.

The report pointed out that shortages took a toll on training programmes with only eight of 48 Typhoon pilots capable of carrying out ground attack operations last year.

The committee claimed that the RAF had no option but to cannibalise jets for parts in order to keep the maximum number of Typhoons in flying condition in any given day.

MPs added that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) had warned that the supply of spare parts would reach a "steady state" only after 2015.—*Internet*

World's oldest man Walter Bruening dies at 114

WASHINGTON, 15 April—Walter Bruening, a retired railworker who was the world's oldest man, has died in the US state of Montana at the age of 114.

Breuning died Thursday of natural causes at a Great Falls hospital, Stacia Kirby, spokeswoman for the Rainbow Senior Living retirement home where he has lived since 1980, told local media.

Breuning attributed his long life to eating only two meals a day for the past 35 years.

"I think you should push back from the table when you're still hungry," he told the *Great Falls Tribune* newspaper in 2009.

"You get in the habit of not eating at night, and you realize how good you feel. If you could just tell people not to eat so darn much," he said.

"I am deeply saddened by the loss of my dear friend and a great Montanan," state Governor Brian Schweitzer said in a statement, reported the *Tribune*.

Kidnapped Italian activist found dead in Gaza

GAZA CITY, 15 April— An Italian activist kidnapped in Gaza by Palestinian extremists inspired by al-Qaeda was killed by his captors and found hanged several hours after his abduction, Gaza's Hamas rulers said early Friday.

Hamas officials said police stormed an apartment in Gaza City where Vittorio Arrigoni, 36, was being held by members of a small Islamic group that had kidnapped him on Thursday. Arrigoni was dead and the apartment was otherwise empty, the officials said.

In Rome, the Italian

Foreign Ministry condemned what it called a "barbaric murder" and a "vile and irrational gesture of violence on the part of extremists indifferent to the value of a human life."

The group, calling itself Monotheism and Holy War, had released a video Thursday showing the kidnapped activist blindfolded and with cuts on his face, held in front of the camera by a fist gripping his hair. The group demanded that Hamas free its leader and two other members jailed by Hamas.

The abduction highlights challenges that

Hamas — an Iran-backed group with a militant Islamist ideology that is considered a terror organization in the US, the European Union and elsewhere — has faced from smaller factions in Gaza.

Australian water polo star jailed for killing baby

SYDNEY, 15 April— A talented Australian water polo player accused of killing her baby daughter to focus on competing at the Sydney Olympics was Friday jailed for 18 years for murdering the infant.

Keli Lane, 35, was found guilty in December of killing newborn Tegan — the result of a pregnancy she had kept secret from her partner, family and teammates — in September 1996.

Lane had maintained her innocence, saying she had handed the child to its father shortly after the birth and never seen it again, but New South Wales Supreme Court Justice Anthony Whealy accepted she killed the girl.

Whealy said "golden girl" Lane, who represented Australia as a junior water polo player, had been desperate when she murdered the baby, whose remains have never been found.

"The present case may properly be seen, in every sense, as a tragedy involving mother and daughter," he said, Australian news agency AAP reported.

The fact that Lane had destroyed the natural relationship between mother and daughter would haunt her for the rest of her life, Whealy said as he set a maximum term of 18 years, with a non-parole period of 13 years and five months.—*Internet*

Two people killed as storms tear through Oklahoma

TUSHKA,(Okla) 15 April —A large tornado that cut through a tiny southeastern Oklahoma town in America killed at least two people and injured dozens more as it tore up roofs, shattered windows and tossed power lines and trees

The storm that ripped through Tushka, some 120 miles southeast of Oklahoma City, on Thursday night left the town of about 350 people, without a public school and forced many people to seek shelter with relatives, friends or churches serving as shelters. Semi-trailers and trees were scattered on the main highway, and authorities closed off some roads because of downed power lines and trees.

"It felt like a bomb," said Jennifer Buffington, who fled to a storm's cellar with her husband, Tony Stiles, and their seven children when the tornado sirens sounded.

When the family emerged, they found the windows blown out of their house. The family sought shelter at First Baptist Church in nearby Atoka.

Air France jet makes emergency landing in Caracas

Sri Lanka to do more radiation tests

COLOMBO, 15 April—Sri Lanka is to do more tests in connection with possible radiation following the Japanese nuclear station accident, officials said Thursday.

The next week's tests are to be done after all previous such tests had proved negative and sea water samples from eastern seas would be subject to the tests, said the Marine Pollution Prevention Authority.

Sri Lanka subjected rain water samples from different parts of the island for radiation tests following the Fukushima nuclear power plant accident caused by last month's earthquake and tsunami in northeast Japan.

Over 200 Sri Lankans who returned from Japan after the disaster were made to go through tests for radiation attacks while

the goods coming in from the East Asian country were also tested at the Colombo port.—Xinhua

Police divers search for NY serial killer victims

HEMLOCK COVE, 15 April—New York police divers scoured the gray waters near a popular beach as the search widened in a suspected serial killer case feared to have claimed up to 10 victims.

Suffolk County police on Long Island closed off a stretch of scrub-covered bank leading down to the inlet at Hemlock Cove in their latest check on the grisly body count piling up in the nature reserve about an hour from New York City.

Three divers in hooded black and orange dry suits waded into the fog-shrouded water carrying digging implements and metal detectors.

County Police Commissioner Richard Dormer told a news conference that aircraft would be brought in to help the search.

"They are looking for evidence, any evidence connecting to the found remains," he said.

Investigators are officially still focusing on the search for Shannan Gilbert, a prostitute who vanished nearby in May. However, that probe has morphed into a far more chilling hunt after the discovery of at least

four other slain prostitutes and possibly six more sets of human remains.

The latest finds — bones and a skull — came Monday and police confirmed they are human, although not necessarily from different people. There have also been unconfirmed reports of the skeleton of an infant or fetus being found.

All the remains have turned up in the same stretch of thick, almost impassable scrubland and dunes lining the lonely Ocean Parkway as it runs through Gilgo State Park.

Another corpse found in western Mexican pits

CULIACAN, 15 April—Authorities in the northwestern Mexican state of Sinaloa say another body has been recovered from a series of pits, bringing to 13 the number of corpses found there.

Attorney General Marco Antonio Higuera Gomez says the bodies had apparently been in the pits for at least six months. The bodies are undergoing DNA tests and police are searching for the owners of the property where they were found by a farmer earlier this week. Higuera Gomez said Thursday that most of the bodies had a bullet hole to the head.

The discovery comes as authorities continue extracting bodies from mass graves in the northeastern state of Tamaulipas, where 122 corpses have surfaced so far.—Internet

Road accidents kill 116 in first 3 days of Songkran festival

BANGKOK, 15 April—Road accidents killed 116 people and injured 1,760 others in the past three days in Thailand as the country is celebrating the annual Songkran festival, the Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Department reported on Thursday.

The department said that from 11 to 13 April, a total of 1,626 road accidents happened nationwide and on Wednesday alone, 57 people lost their lives and 784 got injured in traffic accidents.

The department said most of the accidents were caused by drunk driving and overspeeding.

Songkran Festival, the traditional Thai new-year festival which is famous for water-splashing celebrations, falls on 13-17 April this year. Many Thais started to leave or enter cities since early this week.

Hundreds of people die each year on the roads during Songkran festival. Motorcycles are usually involved in most of these road accidents, followed by pick-up trucks.—Xinhua

Radiation level of groundwater up 10-fold at troubled nuke plant

TOKYO, 15 April—The radiation level of the groundwater had increased 10 fold in one week at the troubled Fukushima No 1 nuclear power plant, *Kyodo News* reported on Thursday, citing operator sources.

Earlier on Thursday, the country’s nuclear safety agency said that the level of contaminated water in its underground trench turned out to be rising again.

The operator of the plant, Tokyo Electric Power Co, removed some 660 tons of highly contaminated water in the past two days from one of the trenches to a “condenser” inside the No 2 reactor turbine building. The condenser has a

capacity to store 3,000 tons of liquid.

Radioactive water was found in the basements of the Nos. 1 to 3 reactor turbine buildings, and the nearby trenches connected to them. The water totaled about 60,000 tons.

Removing the water to nearby tanks and other storage places is considered vital to the attempt of restoring the key cooling functions at the reactors.

Japan’s nuclear safety agency on Tuesday had raised the severity level of the accident at the crippled Fukushima No. 1 nuclear power plant to 7, the worst on an international scale, from the 5 current. —Xinhua

Fiat recalls 130,000 Puntos on brake problem

MILAN, 15 April—Italian auto giant Fiat has recalled over 130,000 Fiat Puntos because of a possible problem with the anti-lock braking system that could cause a short circuit, a company spokesman said on Thursday.

“The recall concerns over 130,000 vehicles including the Grande Punto, Punto Evo, Grande Punto Van and Punto Evo Van models.” Fiat began sending out letters to affected owners at the beginning of February, the spokesman said.

The autos were recalled after a problem with the anti-lock braking system was found in a vehicle, he said.

The Fiat spokesman said it was possible cables in the system may have been “pinched” during assembly and could “be damaged, provoking a short circuit.”

Over half the vehicles are in Italy and the rest are in Europe, he added.—Internet

Death toll reaches 13,498 from great quake-tsunami in Japan

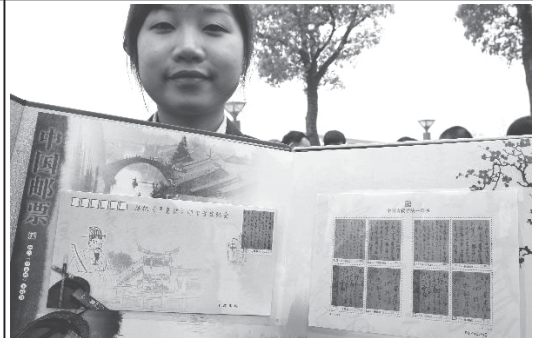
TOKYO, 15 April—The National Police Agency said on Thursday that the March 11 earthquake and tsunami have left 13,498 people dead and 14,734 others unaccounted for in Japan by 19:00 pm local time (10:00 GMT).

About 139,000 survivors are staying in 2,300 shelters across the country as one month has passed since the quake and tsunami.

A 9.0-magnitude earthquake hit the Pacific coastal areas of northeastern and eastern Japan on 11 March, triggering enormous tsunami.

Heavy casualties and extensive damage have been caused by the twin disasters.

Saudi Airlines plane makes emergency landing in Athens airport due to false alarm for fire, no injuries

ATHENS, 15 April—A Saudi airlines plane made an emergency landing in Athens International Airport on Thursday due to a false alarm for fire in the luggage area, according to Greek media reports.

According to early information, the pilot of the Boeing 777 which had taken off from Washington US for Riyadh with 239 passengers on board, requested Greek authorities permission to land due to an electronic indication that there was a small fire in the luggage area.

All passengers evacuated safely, no injuries occurred and after a swift check by the “Eleytherios Venizelos” airport experts it was proved that the alarm was false.—Xinhua

Yellowstone supervolcano fed by bigger plume

SALT LAKE CITY, 15 April — The underground volcanic plume at Yellowstone in the US may be bigger than previously thought, according to a new study by geologists. The volcanic hotspot below Yellowstone feeds the hot springs, mud pots and geysers that bring millions of visitors to the US national park each year. But the Yellowstone "supervolcano" has erupted violently in the distant past and could do so again at some point.

The new study is set to be published in *Geophysical Research Letters* journal. In 2009, researchers used seismic waves from earthquakes to build up an image of the hotspot beneath Yellowstone, which straddles the US states of Wyoming, Montana and Idaho. The authors of the latest work used variations in the electrical conductivity of rocks to produce a new picture of the plume. This conductivity is a property of the molten silicate rocks and the hot briny water that is naturally present in them. "It's like comparing ultrasound and MRI in the human body; they are different imaging technologies," says co-author Michael Zhdanov, a professor of geophysics at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City.— *Internet*

New Orleans police convicted over killing in wake of Katrina

WASHINGTON, 15 April — The New Orleans police department's reputation was further tarnished on Wednesday when two officers were convicted in relation to the killing of a handyman in 2005 in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The case is one of a string that department

is facing, many of them relating to the period immediately after the hurricane.

In Wednesday's case, a patrolman, Melvin Williams, was found guilty of kicking and beating with a baton Raymond Robair and submitting a false report about the incident. A fellow officer, Matthew Dean Moore, was also found guilty of submitting a false report and lying to the FBI. Williams could be jailed for life, and Moore for up to 25 years. They are to be sentenced on 14 July.

New Orleans PD has been under investigation by the US justice department, and there are at least a dozen cases pending against either serving or former officers in the city. The prosecution said Williams beat Robair, put him in a police car and took him to hospital, telling staff he was a known drug user.— *Internet*

Australia mate on China Barrier Reef ship 'tired'

LONDON, 15 April—The Australian Transport Safety Bureau has found that a Chinese cargo ship ran aground on the Great Barrier Reef because the chief mate was tired.

The coal-carrying Shen Neng 1 foundered on the reef on 3 April 2010, leaking tonnes of oil into the protected area. The accident left a hole in the reef 3km (1.8 mile) long; the ship was stuck for nine days before refloating.

Environmental officials say it could take 20 years for the reef, and its turtle breeding grounds, to recover.

The ship's chief mate had managed just 2.5 hours of sleep in the previous 38.5 hours. "The chief mate was affected by fatigue and this resulted in a decreased level of performance while he was monitoring Shen Neng 1's

position," the bureau's final report on the incident concluded.

"The ship did not have an effective fatigue management system in place to ensure that the bridge watchkeeper was fit to stand a navigational watch," the report said. The bureau found that the ship lacked proper procedures for planning routes and for handling fatigue.—*Internet*

LONDON, 15 April — In a nation known as one of the world's healthiest, it remains to be seen what Japanese consumers will make of the Meat Monster. The gut-busting sandwich, unveiled only in Japan by Burger King, is a mountain of mixed meat weighing in at 1,160 calories.

The creation houses two hamburgers, a chicken breast fillet, two slices of processed cheese, three rashers of bacon and all the trimmings. It has more salt than four bags of crisps and would take two hours to jog off – if you can move after devouring it.— *Internet*

Max, a three-year-old black and white cat owned by a Santa Cruz area couple, was apparently shot with the arrow sometime over the weekend, a fact his owners discovered on Sunday evening. "According to the owners, the cat had been missing for two days and when they opened their front

door the cat came in," Santa Cruz County Animal Services Manager Todd Stosuy told Reuters.

"That's when the owners, much to their shock, saw an arrow sticking out of the cat's head," he said. "The cat was acting normally, eating normally. It almost looked like one of those fake arrows."

Stosuy said Max was taken to a veterinary hospital that night to have the arrow removed, under anesthesia.

MONTE CARLO, 15 April—Rafael Nadal and Roger Federer moved closer to a fourth final meeting at the Monte Carlo Masters on Thursday as both posted straight-set third round wins to coast into the quarter-finals.

Third seed Andy Murray, meanwhile, drew jeers for drop shots against an injured opponent, with the Scot shunning the popularity contest in his 6-3, 6-3 defeat of French 16th seed Gilles Simon. The win was the second in as many days for Murray, who had lost a career-worst four straight matches over the last two months without winning even a set.

Top seed Nadal, a consecutive six-time cham-

pion who is now unbeaten in 34 straight matches in the principality, maintained his traditional momentum to see off Frenchman Richard Gasquet 6-2, 6-4. Three-time losing finalist Federer, the number two seed, was equally ruthless as he dispatched Croatian Marin Cilic 6-4, 6-3 in 71 minutes with a break of serve per set enough to see him through. Federer won his 24th match of the season for four defeats—his last to Nadal in Miami, the other three to Novak Djokovic.—Internet

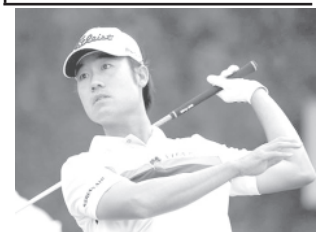

Cink, Henry lead Texas Open after Na's meltdown

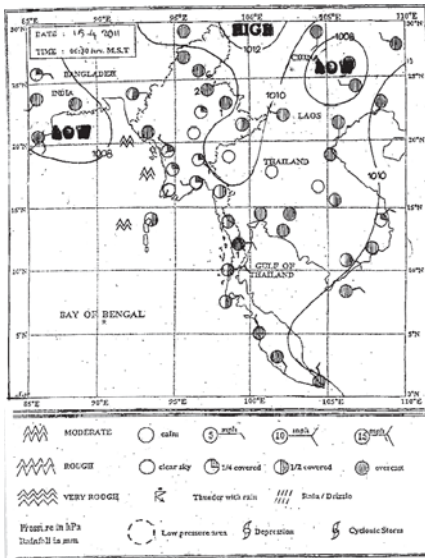

"Boeing confirms that Air Pacific no longer is a Boeing 787 customer," the Chicago-based firm said in an email to AFP Wednesday.

Aviation Week earlier reported that Air Pacific, the official international airline of Fiji, had canceled orders for five Dreamliners placed in 2006 and three in 2008.

The 787 programme has been beset by technical problems that have delayed the timetable for delivery of the inaugural aircraft to All Nippon Airways by three years.

"We recognize that Air Pacific's evolving

Plum growers enjoying big harvest in Yamethin Township

Due to the unusual rainfall, the yield of plum trees that grow naturally at crop plantations and paddy fields in rural areas and the farmed plum trees in Yamethin Township, Mandalay Region, is far higher than previous year. So, the plum brokerage houses and plum mills in urban

areas of the township are thronged with plum dealers.

Local plum growers are making hefty profits from plum farming at low expenses this year. Inspired by the good news, I visited Yaza Phyto Plum Brokerage House and Plum Mill at Wa-toe Zaygon Ward in Yamethin

Township.

There, a plum farmer said that plum started to be in fruit in the Myanmar month of Tazaungmone and were in season in Pyatho and Tabodwe; that plum was of two types — thick flesh and thin flesh; and that thin-flesh plum was exposed to the sun for five days and thick-flesh plum,

for 10 days to be dried.

I also heard that thick-flesh plum was priced at 2200 kyats and thin-flesh plum, at 2600 kyats a basket; that it rained a lot this year, so every plum tree was in cluster; even at the beginning of the plum season, plum was sold at the price of 2500 to 2600 kyats a basket, which was two times the price last year; and that therefore, after the harvest of monsoon paddy, farmers also got extra money from the trade of plum.

Owing to the abundant plum harvest, Yamethin Township sees 17 plum wholesale centres this year. Plum merchants are visiting the villages (See page 10)
