### Myanmar, Indonesia to boost cooperation

President of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar U Thein Sein paid a State Visit to the Republic of Indonesia from 5 to 9 May at the invitation of Indonesian President Dr. Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono and attended the 18<sup>th</sup> ASEAN Summit held in Jakarta.

During the visit, the Myanmar delegation led by President U Thein Sein conferred with the Indonesian delegation led by the Indonesian President at Istana Merdeka Palace in Jakarta, Indonesia, on 5 May.

In his address, the Indonesian President said that Indonesia was in support of Myanmar's efforts to ensure national unity and perpetuation of sovereignty. He added that the country hoped to increase the bilateral trade volume to 500 million US dollars by 2015.

President U Thein Sein said that Myanmar had been transformed into new system, so it would make reforms more transparently in the economic system; and that Myanmar invited Indonesia to invest in agriculture, mining, industries and oil and gas.

Being ASEAN members, Myanmar and Indonesia have improved bilateral cooperation regularly for over 60 years, thereby strengthening the relations between the two neighbours. Now, 12 companies from Indonesia are making investments in Myanmar. The two countries are working closely to boost tourism industries and air flights.

President U Thein Sein in meeting the Indonesian President dealt with matters for further enhancing friendly relations and cooperation between the two countries, and active participation in international organizations including the UN and regional organizations.

The visit is a hopeful sign that Myanmar will enjoy greater economic development with better opportunities to bolster friendly relations between the two countries and between the two peoples.

### Gun battle kills militant, blast wounds four Afghan police

KUNDUZ, 10 May—Gun battle between Taleban militants and security forces left a Taleban militant, dead while a mine planted by militants wounded four policemen in Kunduz Province 250 km north of capital City Kabul on Monday, officials said.

“Security forces killed a Taleban militant, Qari Abdul Waheed, and captured another in Dasht-e-Archi District at 01:00 pm local time today” District governor Shikh Sadudin told *Xinhua*.

There were no casualties on security forces, he contended. In a related incident, a roadside bomb organized by Taleban militants struck a police van, wounding four police constables in the neighbouring Qalai Zal District on the same day Monday, District police chief Abdul Majid said. “A mine planted by Taleban rebels struck a police vehicle leaving four policemen injured,” Majid told *Xinhua*.—*Xinhua*

### Iraqi police chief escapes bomb attack in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 10 May—An Iraqi police chief escaped a roadside bomb attack targeting his convoy in central Baghdad on Monday while six people got wounded, an Interior Ministry source said. The attack took place around midday when a bomb explosion hit the convoy of Major General Sabah al-Shebli, which was moving near al-Firdous Square in Sa’doun Street in downtown the capital. Shebli escaped the attack unharmed, but the explosion damaged a police vehicle and wounded two policemen aboard and four bystanders at the scene, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Earlier in the day, the police reported the killing of a civilian and the wounding of nine people, including a policeman, in three bomb attacks across the capital in the morning.—*Xinhua*

### Man charged for allegedly trying to open plane door

ST LOUIS, 10 May—An Illinois man who allegedly tried to open an emergency exit door of a plane in mid-flight was charged by federal prosecutors on Monday with interfering with a flight crew and crimes involving aircraft, authorities said on Monday.

The man, Reynel C Alcaide of Burbank, Illinois, 34, could face 10 years in jail for each of the two counts.

According to prosecutors, Alcaide boarded *Continental Airline flight 546* in Houston on Sunday, heading for Chicago. After the flight took off he rushed up the aisle toward the front of the aircraft where a flight attendant tried to stop him.

He pinned the flight attendant against the wall and repeatedly tried to open the emergency door, the complaint added.

He was reportedly subdued by passengers and crew members, and the plane was diverted to St Louis where it landed at Lambert International Airport at 1:28 pm Central time. “Police officers boarded the plane and found the disruptive passenger on the floor near the front of the plane, being detained by a flight attendant and two passengers,” said Lambert spokesman Jeff Lea.—*Reuters*

### Air strike kills two Taleban commanders in Afghanistan

KABUL, 10 May—Air raids left two Taleban commanders dead in Taleban hotbed Helmand Province 555 km south of Afghan Capital Kabul on Sunday, said a statement released by Helmand’s Provincial administration on Monday.

“Air strike against Taleban hideout in Nad Ali District left two Taleban commanders Mullah Ahsanullah alias Mujahid and Mullah Hashim dead on Sunday,” the statement said.

Both the eliminated commanders were active in anti-government activities including organizing roadside bombings to target security forces in the Province, the statement further said.—*Xinhua*

### Indonesia waiting for Singapore’s decision on hijacked ship’s rescue

JAKARTA, 10 May—The Indonesian government was waiting for a decision from Singapore regarding efforts to free the MT Gemini ship and its crew, which some of them Indonesians, from Somali hijackers, a minister said here on Monday.

Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal and Security Affairs Djoko Suyanto was quoted by

Antara newswire as saying that the Indonesian government continued to communicate with the Singapore government for the release of the ship which carried 25 crew members, of whom 13 are Indonesian nationals.

Earlier, the Indonesian Defence Forces Commander Admiral Agus Suhartono said that the liberation of MT Gemini very much depended on

the Singapore decision because the ship was a Singapore-flagged commercial ship.

“Therefore, the efforts to release the pirated ship depend on the decision of the Singapore government,” the military chief said.

Singapore-based Glory Ship Management which owns the MT Gemini said the ship was pirated on April 30 while it was sailing to the port town of Mombassa, Kenya. It said the crew members included 13 Indonesians, five Chinese, four South Koreans and three Myanmar.—*Xinhua*

### Woman suicide bomber kills three police, injures eight in NW Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 10 May—At least three police including one police woman were killed and seven others were injured in a suicide blast that took place early Tuesday morning outside a local court in Nowshera, a city in northwest Pakistan, reported local Urdu TV channel Duniya. According to the report, the blast occurred at about 08:50 am local time when a woman suicide bomber exploded herself at the main entrance of a district court in Nowshera, a city which is about 50 km east of Peshawar.

The report quoted police as saying that the suicide bomber was also killed on the spot. Among the eight injured people, three were police, said the report. All the injured people have been shifted to nearby hospital. Police have cordoned off the area. No group has claimed the responsibility for the blast yet.—*Xinhua*





## Raging galactic ‘winds’ of gas detected

PARIS, 10 May —A European space telescope detected “winds” of cosmic gas streaming from galaxies that may have the power to bring star formation to a halt, astronomers say.

The winds discovered by the European Space Agency’s Herschel infrared space observatory blow at speeds of more than 600 miles a second, 10,000 faster than winds in a terrestrial hurricane, an ESA release said Monday.

These “winds,” or molecular gas outflows, are an important discovery because stars form from molecular gas, and these outflows are robbing some galaxies of the raw material they need to make new stars, researchers said. If the outflows are powerful enough, they could even halt star formation

altogether. Galaxies with the most vigorous outflows are losing mass at a rate of 1,200 times the mass of our sun every year, the astronomers said. These winds could be generated by the intense emission of light and particles from young stars, by shock waves from the explosion of old stars or they may be triggered by the radiation given off as matter swirls around a black hole at the centre of a galaxy, they said.

“By catching molecular outflows in the act, Herschel has finally yielded long-sought-after evidence that powerful processes with negative feedback do take place in galaxies and dramatically affect their evolution,” Goran Pilbratt, ESA’s Herschel Project scientist, said.—*Internet*

## Renewables could meet nearly 80 percent of world’s energy needs by mid-century: UN climate panel

UNITED NATIONS, 10 May — Nearly 80 percent of the world’s energy needs could be met by renewable energy by mid-century, and the renewable sources can play a key role in fighting global warming, a UN spokesman said here Monday. “Today, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released a report that concluded that close to 80 percent of the world’s energy supply could be met by renewable energy sources by the middle of this century, if backed by the right enabling public policies,” Farhan Haq, the UN spokesman, said at a daily press briefing.

“With such policies in place, the world would cut its greenhouse gas emissions by about one third, compared

to business-as-usual projections,” Haq said. “It could also help to meet the goal of keeping the rise in the global mean temperature from exceeding two degrees Celsius in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, a goal recognized by countries in the Cancun Agreements.” The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) was established by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) in 1988. Its main objective was to assess scientific, technical and socio-economic information relevant to the understanding of human induced climate change, potential impacts of climate change and options for mitigation and adaptation.—*Xinhua*

## NASA sets 16 May shuttle launch target

CAPE CANAVERAL, 10 May—NASA says the launch of space shuttle Endeavour will take place no earlier than next Monday on a mission lasting 16 days rather than the original planned 14. If the launch does in fact occur on the 16<sup>th</sup>, liftoff would be at 8:56 am EDT, a NASA release said Monday.

Kennedy technicians have installed and tested new wiring that bypasses the suspect electrical wiring connecting the switch box to fuel system heaters that scrubbed the original launch date. Workers said they expected to close out Endeavour’s aft compartment where the repairs were done and begin launch countdown preparations Monday.—*Internet*

## Google to launch online music service

SAN FRANCISCO, 10 May—Google Inc could launch a new online music service as early as Tuesday, which will be similar to a service recently started by Amazon.com Inc, *The Wall Street Journal* said, citing people familiar with the matter.

The *Journal* said Google is likely to announce the service

at its annual Google I/O developers conference in San Francisco, adding that the service will operate in a testing mode initially and not be available to the public at large.

In April, Amazon unveiled a service that allows customers to store about 1,000 songs on its web servers for free instead of their own hard drives and play

them over an Internet connection directly from web browsers.

Google could not immediately be reached by Reuters for comment.

The *Journal* said Google has not sought licenses from the four major recorded-music companies and the new feature is likely to include a system that functions much like a remote hard drive.

Users could listen to songs they have uploaded to the service in a “streaming” mode, but will not be able to download the files, the daily reported. Earlier in the day, Google-owned YouTube said it will add more than 3,000 main-stream movies for users to rent from Monday.

## Apple, Conde Nast reach “New Yorker” iPad deal

NEW YORK, 10 May—Apple Inc and magazine publisher Conde Nast reached a deal to offer the *New Yorker* on the iPad device in the latest sign that relationships are improving between the technology company and content owners. Conde Nast said iPad editions of other magazines will also be available by subscription through Apple’s In-App Purchase system on the popular App Store. Titles including *Vanity Fair*, *Glamour*, *Golf Digest*, *Allure*, *Wired*, *Self* and *GQ* will be available in coming weeks.

Publishers have eyed fancy digital versions of print publications for tablet computers like the iPad but have held back because of what they considered onerous terms. “Over time, we’ll see subscriptions leading to greater and greater scale, helping to drive overall industry growth,” said Robert Sauerberg, Conde Nast president, in a statement.—*Reuters*

## YouTube founders buy social media analytics firm

BEIJING, 10 May—YouTube’s founders announced Monday that they brought a social media analytics firm, which helps businesses keep track of what’s being said about them on Facebook and Twitter, media reports said Tuesday.

Chad Hurley and Steve Chen did not disclose financial terms of the deal to purchase Tap11.com, which came less than three weeks after the duo bought the social bookmarking service Delicious from Yahoo.

Hurley and Chen, who sold YouTube to Google for 1.65 billion US dollars in 2006, said they planned to integrate Tap11 and Delicious with their new San Mateo, California-based Internet company AVOS. Hurley said the goal is to “create the world’s best platform for users to save, share, and discover new content.”—*Xinhua*

## Call for junk food ad ban to tackle childhood obesity

MELBOURNE, 10 May—An obesity lobby group in Australia has called for a total ban on junk food advertising during children's peak-hour television scheduling. The call comes at a time when the Obesity Policy Coalition also released research finding 84 percent of consumers believe children should be protected from unhealthy food advertising.

The coalition's strategy is the most comprehensive produced in Australia to limit big business bombarding children with junk-food advertising. It proposes unhealthy food ads on TV be banned on weekdays from 6am to 9am and 4pm to 9pm, and weekends and school holidays from 6am to noon and 4pm to 9pm.

An OPC senior policy adviser, Jane Martin, said childhood obesity rates were of great concern. "We have a runaway train, and we need to slow this juggernaut, we need to slow it down and turn it around," News.com.au quoted Martin as saying.

"Compared to previous generations, young people are likely to suffer a decline in life expectancy because of obesity.—Internet

## Spinal fracture surgery reduces death risk by 44 pc

LONDON, 10 May—A new study has suggested that surgery reduces the likelihood of death by up to 44 percent for those suffering spinal fractures, compared with those who are just given bed rest and painkillers. Those treated with a pioneering procedure, in which balloons are inserted into fractures before the cavity is filled with bone cement, had particularly high survival rates.

Experts said that the study is the first to prove the benefits of surgery in spinal fractures and will lead to better treatment for patients.

"We've known for a long time about the benefits of minimally invasive surgical intervention in the

reduction of pain but this is the first time we seem to have robust data showing that it can highly contribute to saving lives. Treating vertebral fractures by balloon kyphoplasty is cost effective and prevents people from lingering in pain. We now have even more compelling reasons to make sure that this procedure becomes the standard of care for spinal fractures and ensure more patients have access to it," the Telegraph quoted Michael Kotrba, Consultant Orthopaedic and Trauma Surgeon at Croydon University Hospital, as saying.

The study showed for the first time that surgery is a far better option.—Internet

## First full production F-35 delivered

FORT WORTH, 10 May—The US Air Force has accepted into its fleet the first of a planned 1,763 production-model Lockheed Martin F-35 Lightning II stealth fighters. Lockheed said the formal acceptance documents for the jet were signed Thursday at Lockheed F-35 final assembly plant in Fort Worth, Texas.

The aircraft, designated AF-7, was flown to Edwards Air Force Base in California for its flight testing program. "This first aircraft is the beginning of the modernization of US Air Force, Marine and Naval Air power and for our coalition partners around the world," said Larry Lawson, Lockheed Martin executive vice president and F-35 programme general manager. "The F-35 family of aircraft will bring an incredible increase in capability that our men and women defending us deserve.

"Today we begin to fulfill the vision of our government and international customers." F-35s have completed more than 865 flights since flight-testing began in late 2006. In addition to AF-7, eight more

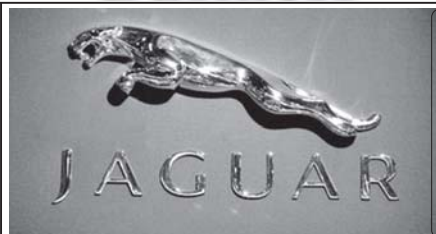


An F-35 Lightning II Joint Strike Fighter test aircraft banks over the flightline at Eglin Air Force Base, Florida on 23 April, 2009.

production-model F-35s have rolled out and are being prepared for delivery. Three distinct variants of the F-35 will replace the A-10 and F-16 for the US Air Force, the F/A-18 for the US Navy, the F/A-18 and AV-B Harrier for the US Marine Corps, and a variety of fighters for at least nine other countries.—Internet

## Jaguar Land Rover launches \$1.6 bln bond issue

MUMBAI, 10 May—Luxury carmaker Jaguar Land Rover has launched a £1.0 billion (\$1.6 billion) bond sale, the company's Indian parent Tata Motors said, as part of a drive to refinance debt and develop its operations.

A successful sale would highlight the profit-making firm's ability to raise debt without relying on the support of Tata Motors, India's leading vehicle maker. The money is earmarked for refinancing existing debt as well as for "general corporate

purposes," Jaguar Land Rover said in the statement on Monday.

Tata Motors bought Jaguar and Land Rover from US Ford Motor Co in 2008 for \$2.3 billion — a purchase that coincided with the global financial crisis that hit sales of the luxury cars. The Indian company took a \$3 billion loan to finance the purchase.

Jaguar Land Rover swung back to profit last year following a deep sales downturn during the financial slump. An investor roadshow will be held in Europe and

the United States ahead of the planned three-part bond issue. The three tranches will include a sterling bond and a dollar bond issue, both with a seven-year maturity. The final tranche will be a 10-year dollar-denominated bond.

Last week Jaguar Land Rover said it was looking for a partner in the fast-growing Chinese car market. It plans to invest five billion pounds (\$8 billion) in developing new high-performance vehicles over the next five years.

## Home values tumble 3 percent

SEATTLE, 10 May—Home values in the first quarter fell 3 percent from the fourth quarter of 2010, the largest drop between quarters since 2008, a home value index indicated.

The Zillow Home Value Index released Monday indicated the median home value fell 8.2 percent in a year-over-year comparison to \$160,600 in the first quarter of 2011, the Seattle-based real estate information marketplace said in a release.

Home values have fallen 29.5 percent since they peaked in June 2006, the organization said. "Home value declines are currently equal to those we experienced during the darkest days of the housing recession.

## All those responsible to try with all seriousness for another milestone in Myanmar history of hosting SEA Games

### Steering Committee for Making Arrangements for Hosting the XXVII SEA Games meets

NAY PYI TAW, 10 May—The Steering Committee for Making Arrangements for Hosting the XXVII SEA Games held its first meeting at the Myanmar International Convention Centre (MICC) here this afternoon, with an address by Patron of the Steering Committee Vice-President Dr. Sai Mauk Kham.

In his speech, the Vice-President said that Myanmar will host the XXVII SEA Games in Nay Pyi Taw in December 2013. The biannual games have been held since 1959. So far, Myanmar has hosted them two times: in 1961 and 1969. Due to various reasons, Myanmar will host the games for the third time in 44 years. To host such games is a source of national honour.

The functions of the Steering Committee that also comprises Union ministers and deputy Union ministers are: (1) to host SEA Games successfully, (2) to raise funds in line with financial rules, (3) to build sports grounds and lodging houses on schedule, (4) to win victory in all the games Myanmar will participate in, and (5) to hold the opening and closing ceremonies on a grand scale in accordance with Myanmar traditions.

Under the Steering Committee are subcommittees — Subcommittee for Building Sports Grounds and Gymnasiums chaired by Chairman of Nay Pyi Taw Council Mayor; Subcommittee for Ensuring Victory and Training Chaired by the Union Minister for Sports; and Subcommittee for Opening and Closing Ceremonies chaired by the Union Minister for Culture.

In addition, other subcommittees such as security, fund raising, health, transport, accommodation, reception, management, awarding and recording subcommittees will be formed as necessary.

The building of sports grounds and gyms is in progress. Zabuthiri Stadium and Zeyathiri Stadium, each of which has 30,000-seating capacity, are being built, and so are gymnasiums and swimming pools.

He called for sector-wise reports on the building of more high-standard gymnasiums and a 5200 seating capacity sports village, and other management buildings. It is required to camp talented athletes for the games to bring honour to the motherland. Myanmar has planned to organize 30 sports events. Myanmar stood first with 104 medals in the 1961 SEA Games, and with 149 medals in 1969 SEA Games, indicating that Myanmar emerged champion every time it hosted SEA Games.

All those responsible are to try with all seriousness for another milestone in the Myanmar history of hosting SEA Games.

SEA Games commemorative logos and mascots, posters, Websites, pamphlets, tracksuits, prize toys, and logos and mascots featuring in souvenirs are to reflect the national character.

Arrangements are to be made in advance for smoothly organizing sports games, meeting the standards set by the International Sports Federation, and installing sports equipment in time.

He spoke of the need for training enough number

of young interpreters for the sports teams from contestant countries, and training referees and juries at home and abroad for getting ISO certificates.

In conclusion, he urged those responsible for successfully holding the XXVII SEA Games to exercise the President's guidelines such as transparency, undertaking, working in accordance with the law, and putting public desire at the forefront as fundamental principles, and instructions given by the Steering Committee: to host XXVII SEA Games on a grand scale, to set another milestone in the Myanmar's sports history, and to show athletes and guests from various countries that Myanmar people are by nature very polite, hospitable and kind-hearted.

Chairman of the Steering Committee Union Minister for Sports and for Hotels and Tourism U Tint Hsan reported on participation and medals won by Myanmar in previous SEA Games, the 30 sports events and gold medals for XXVII SEA Games, requirements of sports grounds and gyms to be built, sports grounds and gyms under construction, proposed sports events, more sports grounds and gyms and management buildings to be constructed, halls that needs renovation, daily programmes in the MICC, formation of the Steering Committee and subcommittees, samples of logos and mascots, nomination for interpreters and referees and juries, requirements of sports equipment, daily schedules and scrutinization for main sponsors and co-sponsors.

BEIJING, 10 May—A hospital in southwestern China says conjoined twin baby girls with a single body and two heads have been born at its facility. A staffer surnamed Wang at Suining City Central Hospital in Sichuan province says the girls were born Thursday. Wang said Tuesday that the parents, who are farmers, did not want to have the babies at first, fearing they could not afford to keep them alive. She said they transferred the twins to a hospital in the nearby metropolis of Chongqing to be examined by experts. According to the local Huaxi Metropolis Daily, the twins weighed 9 pounds (4 kilogrammes) and measured 20 inches (51 centimetres). They have two spines, two esophaguses and share other organs. Doctors were quoted as saying it would be nearly impossible to separate them.—*Internet*

### Two dead in crash of two private planes in US state of New York

MIDDLETOWN, 10 May—Two people were killed and a third injured on Monday in an apparent mid-air collision of two single-engine aircraft in Orange County, near Middletown in the US state of New York, authorities said. New York State Police in Middletown told *Xinhua* the aircraft were found in Waywayanda, near Middletown, about 100 kilometres north of New York City shortly before 3 pm EDT. The first aircraft reported down was found near the intersection of county routes 12 and 37, while the second went down in a nearby heavily wooded area. The National Transportation and Safety Board dispatched a team to investigate, a spokesman in Washington told *Xinhua*. "Preliminary indications are it was a mid-air collision," Arlene Salac, a spokeswoman for the Federal Aviation Administration at Kennedy International Airport in New York City, told *Xinhua*. Wreckage of the first aircraft, a single-engine Piper PA28 registered

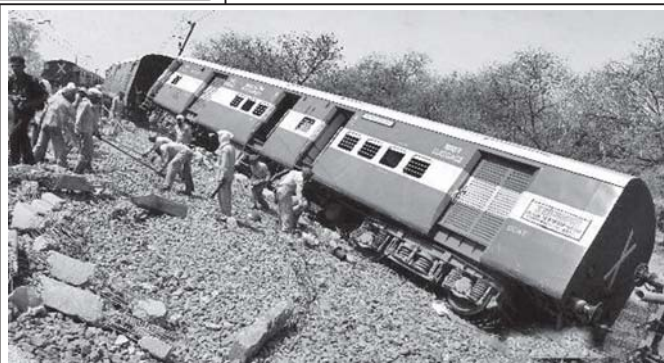
to Edward Crump of Boonton, New Jersey, was found at 1443 County Route 12, Waywayanda. The second aircraft, a Piper PA24 registered to Gary L Delia of Sussex, New Jersey, was found in nearby woods. There were reports that it had caught fire. Salac, who said identities of the victims had not been released, added that a state police helicopter responding to reports of the first plane down spotted wreckage of the second in the woods. *Xinhua*

### Tropical storm Aere kills 15 in Philippines

MANILA, 10 May—Fifteen people were killed and nearly 70,000 people were forced from their homes as tropical storm Aere pummelled the Philippines, the government said Tuesday. The death toll from Aere, which hit on Sunday, was raised from nine, with six more people reported killed in floods, landslides and road accidents, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Centre said. However, after two days of heavy rains across the main island of Luzon, the storm had weakened and was exiting the northern Philippines on Tuesday morning, according to the national weather bureau. "(The storm) is moving away from the country in a north, northeast direction," the bureau said, adding it was expected to move close to Japan's southwest coast by Thursday. It said Aere's maximum sustained winds had fallen to 65 kilometres (40.3 miles) an hour, from 85 kilometres (52.7 miles) an hour on Sunday. The disaster agency said that nearly 70,000 people had been forced to leave their storm-hit homes on Luzon, and the initial estimate of damages to the farming sector was more than \$2.7 million.—*Internet*

### Strong tremor jolted southern Philippines

COTABATO, 10 May—A 5.8 magnitude earthquake jolted Mindanao island in southern Philippines early Tuesday, the US Geological Survey said. The quake hit at 3:13 am local time (19:13 GMT Monday) with the epicenter located 160 kilometres east southeast of General Santos City at the depth of 35 kilometres. Officials are still determining if there were damages brought about by the quake. The Philippines sits in the so-called Pacific Ring of Fire, an area where continental plates collide producing fre-

quent earthquakes and volcanic activities. The worst earthquake in the country happened on 16 August, 1976 after a tsunami caused by a quake killed between 5,000 and 8,000 people in the Moro Gulf Region in southern Philippines. *Xinhua*

### "Violent" aftershock rocks Christchurch

WELLINGTON, 10 May—A large aftershock rocked the quake-stricken New Zealand City of Christchurch early Tuesday. The 5.3 magnitude quake hit at 3:04 am local time (15:04 GMT Monday) and was centered in Rolleston, 20 km west of Christchurch, at a depth of just over 14 km. Residents described the quake as "violent" and "brutal", TVNZ reported. Geological monitoring network GeoNet said the quake was the eighth biggest since the 4 Sept, 2010 earthquake and the fourth biggest since the 22 Feb tremor that killed at least 181 people. Seismologists said the size of the quake meant some homes might have received minor damage, TVNZ reported. Police said they had no reports of injuries or damage. It was the 25<sup>th</sup> earthquake measuring 5 or more on the Richter scale in Christchurch over the past six months. *Xinhua*

**US first full face transplant patient makes first public appearance**

BEIJING, 10 May—America's first full face transplant recipient, Dallas Wiens, made his first public appearance at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, according to media reports on Tuesday. Sporting a goatee and dark sunglasses, Wiens, the 25-year-old Fort Worth, Texas, man, said on Monday his new face feels natural just weeks after a 15-hour procedure that gave him a nose, lips, skin, muscle and nerves.

Wiens said he was able to smell again and breathe through his nose normally, adding his 4-year-old daughter told him when she saw him after the operation: "Daddy, you're so handsome." Wiens lost all of his features and eyesight in November 2008 after hitting a power line while painting a church and underwent

the transplant in March, 2011. The operation was paid for by the US Department of Defence which gave the hospital a 3.4 million dollar research grant for five transplants.

Surgeons said the transplant was not able to restore his sight, and some nerves were so badly damaged from his injury that he will probably have only partial sensation on his left cheek and the left side of his forehead.—Xinhua

**Victory Day military parade held on Red Square**

Moscow, 10 May—A military parade marking the 66th anniversary of the Soviet victory over Nazi in the Great Patriotic War was held on Moscow's Red Square on Monday. About 20,000 soldiers and cadets were marching through the square as Russian President Dmitry Medvedev, Prime Minister Vladimir Putin, foreign guests and hundreds of war veterans watched from a podium in front of Lenin's mausoleum.

According to local media, 200 officers from Russia's Space Force participated into the V-Day parade for the first time. Over 100 pieces of military hardware, including Topol-M ballistic missile launchers, S-400 Triumph air defence missiles and Iskander-M missile launchers, were also displayed in the march pass. A group of Mi-8 multirole helicopters flew over the Red Square during the parade, carrying Russian state and military flags.— Xinhua

### Too short' NYC woman seeks 12m dollars for firing her from job

A 4-foot-8 Bronx woman has sued a city job counselor for firing her from her gig as a Parks Department janitor in Queens because he thought she was too short to do the job.

In a lawsuit filed last week against the city and counselor Louis Marchi, Sandra Petersen has claimed the counselor got her booted from Parks, and she is now seeking 12 million dollars in damages for alleged discrimination.

Petersen, 51, said she never had a problem at work until she asked Marchi about switching her assignment.

"I could do the job. The managers really liked me and know I worked hard," she told *The New York Post*.

Petersen landed the six-month, subsidized city job in June, a position that was later extended by several months.

But she hoped to work as a home health aide, and wanted to discuss the change with Marchi.

"He said: 'You're too short. Are you sure you're working for Parks?'" Petersen recalled from their first meeting.

"I lost sleep. I lost appetite. I was crying. I was going out of my mind. I felt humiliated," she said.

### UK border agency rediscovers Einstein's immigration papers after 80 years

Border chiefs at London's Heathrow Airport have been left stunned by the discovery of immigration papers belonging to German-born scientist Albert Einstein that go back to the time he escaped dramatically from Nazi Germany almost 80 years ago.

The landing card marks the legendary scientist's arrival in the United Kingdom. Einstein was Jewish and escaped to England with a bounty on his head as an enemy of Adolf Hitler's regime, *the Daily Mail* reports.

According to the smudged document, the "father of modern physics" arrived at Dover on 26 May, 1933 from Ostende, Belgium. He describes his occupation as a professor and being of Swiss nationality. On the reverse, Einstein states to immigration officers that he is bound for Oxford.

The major historical find will now go on display at Liverpool's Merseyside Maritime Museum after curators snapped it up.

## Convict disguised as woman recaptured in Egypt

An escaped Egyptian prisoner was recaptured as he fled a police ambush disguised as a woman in the Suez canal city of Ismailia, security sources said on Saturday.

Adel Mohammed Dasouqi, 35, escaped from Cairo's Abu Zaabal prison earlier this year while serving a three-year sentence for robbery and extortion.

He was accused of using fierce dogs to force

shopkeepers and other people to pay him protection money.

Dasouqi was injured when he tried to escape by jumping from the third floor of a building as police closed in on Thursday, the security sources said.

They said he was dressed in a woman's outfit, including a burqa that covers the face.

"He suffered broken arms and legs. He is now

being held at a military prison," one source said.

It was the second time that security forces have recaptured him since he broke out of Abu Zaabal during the chaos that accompanied the uprising that ousted President Hosni Mubarak on 11 February. He was captured about a month ago but managed to escape from an Ismailia prison hospital where he was being held.

However, her 2010 tour overseas was troubled: Houston canceled some dates due to illness and received negative reviews from fans who were disappointed in the quality of her

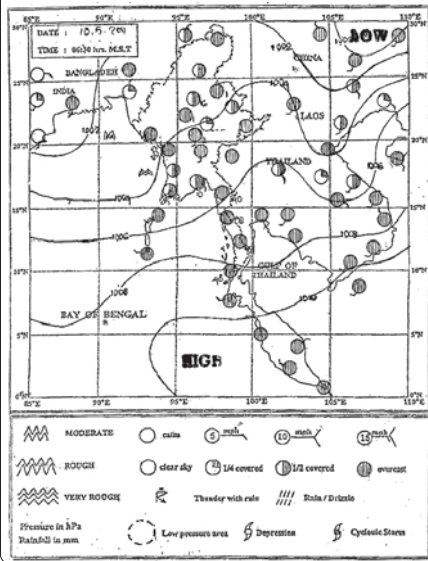

**Sony to restore PlayStation Network by end of May**

TOKYO, 10 May—Sony said Tuesday it aims to fully restore its PlayStation Network, shut down after a massive security breach affecting over 100 million online accounts, by the end of May. Sony also confirmed that personal data from 24.6 million user accounts was stolen in the hacker attack last month. Personal data, including credit card numbers, might have been stolen from another 77 million PlayStation accounts, said Sony Computer Entertainment Inc. spokesman Satoshi Fukuoka.

He said Sony has not received any reports of illegal uses of stolen information, and the company is continuing its probe into the hacker attack. He declined to give details on the investigation. Sony shut down the PlayStation network, a system that links gamers worldwide in live play, on 20 April after discovering the security breach. The network also allows users to upgrade and download games and other content.

Sony was under heavy criticism over its handling of the network intrusion. The company

did not notify consumers of the breach until 26 April even though it began investigating unusual activity on the network since 19 April.

Last month, US lawyers filed a lawsuit against Sony on behalf of lead plaintiff Kristopher Johns for negligent protection of personal data and failure to inform players in a timely fashion that their credit card information may have been stolen.

The lawsuit seeks class-action status. Fukuoka declined to comment on the lawsuit.—Internet
