## Information Ministry has grown 29,900 trees of various species up to date for helping green region

NAY PYI TAW, 16 June—The Ministry of Information held its monsoon tree-growing ceremony for 2011 at its compound here this morning.

Union Minister for Information and for Culture U Kyaw Hsan planted a commemorative sapling.

Deputy Minister U Soe Win planted a mango sapling, and departmental heads and officials, teak saplings.

The Union Minister and party encouraged staff members growing trees.

The Union Minister set free fingerlings of carp and hamilton's carp into Dam No. 38 of the ministry, so did the deputy minister, heads of department and staff members.

The Union Minister and party visited the mango farm of the Information and Public Relations

## Six killed in US drone strike in northwest Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 16 June—At least six people were killed as two missiles fired by US drones Wednesday night at a vehicle in the Miranshah area of North Waziristan in northwest Pakistan, reported local Urdu TV channel ARY.

This is the third strike launched by US drones on Wednesday in Pakistan's northwest tribal areas which border Afghanistan. Earlier on Wednesday afternoon, US drones fired four missiles at different targets in South Waziristan, killing at least ten people.

## Five Iraqi soldiers killed in gunfire attacks

BAGHDAD, 16 June—Five Iraqi soldiers were killed in a spate of gunfire attacks in central and northern Iraq, the police said on Wednesday.

In northern Iraq, gunmen opened fire during the day on a checkpoint in al-Quds neighbourhood in northern the city of Mosul, some 400 km north of Baghdad, killing two soldiers, a source from the police city told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

Also in the north, a mortar round struck an Iraqi army checkpoint in al-Rashad area, just

southwest of the city of Kirkuk, some 250 km north of Baghdad, wounding 10 soldiers, including two officers, a local police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

Earlier in the day, an Interior Ministry source reported the killing of three soldiers in attacks on their checkpoints by gunmen using silenced weapons in Baghdad.

In addition, two street cleaners were wounded in a roadside bomb explosion in Baghdad's southern District of Doura, the ministry source added.

Later on Wednesday, another roadside bomb ripped through Doura District, wounding four civilians, the source said.

The attacks are part of a wave of violence against Iraq's government officials, security forces and civilians during the past few months.—Xinhua

## Six injured in chopper crash in E Afghanistan, Taliban claim responsibility

ASSADABAD, (Afghanistan), 16 June—A helicopter crashed in Kunar Province 185 km east of capital city Kabul on Wednesday, an official said.

"The chopper crashed in Mandapul, a suburban area of provincial capital Assadabad, at around 10 am local time today. As a result, four foreigners and two Afghans were injured," spokesman for provincial administration, Wasifullah Wasifi, told Xinhua.

However, he did not give further details.

The mountainous Kunar Province along the border with Pakistan's tribal areas has been the scene of militancy over the past couple of years.

Helicopters mostly from NATO-led troops often fly over the militancy-hit areas in Afghanistan.

Meantime, Zabihullah Mujahid, who claims to speak for the Taliban outfit in talks with media via telephone from unknown location, claimed the Taliban militants shot down a NATO-led forces chopper, killing all aboard.

## Five Pakistanis killed in cross-border attack

KHAR, (Pakistan), 16 June—Scores of armed militants crossed the border from Afghanistan on Thursday and stormed a village in Pakistan's tribal belt, killing five civilians, Pakistani officials said.

It was the third such attack reportedly carried out by hundreds of fighters into northwest Pakistan this month, and underscored the porous nature of the border and systemic insecurity posed by militants in both countries.

The militants

targeted Mamoond village in Bajaur District, which borders the Afghan Province of Kunar, despite the presence of Pakistani security checkpoints erected to check Taliban militants.

"Some 250-300 militants targeted civilians in Mamoond. At least five civilians, including two women were killed," local government official

Fazle Akbar told AFP.

Akbar said three women were also wounded in the attack, which took place about 65 kilometres (40 miles) northwest of Khar, the main town in Bajaur.

"We have sent army and paramilitary troops to the area as we got reports that militants are still present there," a security official told AFP.

## US army helicopter fires on militants in southern Iraq

BAGHDAD, 16 June—US army helicopter opened fire on suspected militants after they fired rockets on Basra airport in southern Iraq, killing a suspect and wounding two, the US military said on Thursday.

The incident took place early on Wednesday morning when a US military base stationed in the airport came under barrage of seven 107 mm rockets, a military statement said.

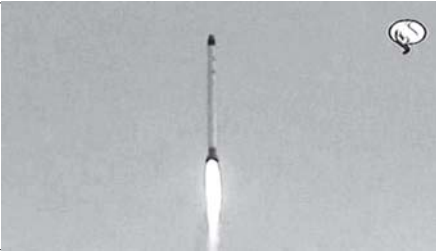
A US helicopter team was conducting a routine mission above the area when they received a report about the base attack, the statement said.

The team "viewed two males actively loading and launching the rockets and requested permission to engage", the statement added.

After the US strike, the military altered a team of Iraqi security forces and dispatched them to the site and found three men believed to be responsible for the attack, one of them was killed and the two others were injured, it said.

The incident came as Baghdad and Washington are in debate whether the US troops need to extend the presence of its troops in Iraq beyond the 2011 deadline.

## Iran puts "Rasad" satellite in orbit

TEHERAN, 16 June—Iran puts the *Rasad* (surveillance) satellite in the orbit on Wednesday, the state IRIB TV website reported.

The *Rasad* satellite will render images to the country, said the report.

All the procedure of designing, construction, testing and preparations

to launch the satellite have been conducted domestically by Iranian experts, according to IRIB. The *Rasad*, weighs 15.3 kilogrammes and has been designed to be launched at 260 kilometres above the earth, said IRIB, adding that it will circle the earth 15 times in 24 hours.—*Xinhua*

## UK charges man with four terror-related offenses

LONDON, 16 June—British police say a 25-year-old man has been arrested and charged on four terrorism-related offenses.

Greater Manchester Police say the charges facing Asim Kauser relate to accessing radical or extremist material through the Internet.

Police said Wednesday the alleged offenses took place between January 2009 and June 2011.

Police said Kauser, a British national, was arrested at his home on 6 June following an operation by the North West Counter Terrorism Unit.

It said Kauser will appear in London's City of Westminster Magistrates' Court on Thursday.

## Malaysia couple charged in Indonesian maid's death

KUALA LUMPUR, 16 June—A Malaysian couple has been charged with the murder of the family's 26-year-old Indonesian maid, a lawyer said Thursday, in the country's latest case of alleged abuse against foreign workers. Indonesia recently promised to lift a 2009 ban on sending maids to Malaysia after the neighbours inked a new deal for better working conditions to curb abuse and torture.

Lawyer Guok Ngek Seong said Fong Kong Meng, 55, and his wife, Teoh Ching Yen, 53, were charged Wednesday in a magistrate's court with killing their maid, Isti Komariyah.

Guok, who is representing Fong, said Isti had worked for the couple since July 2010. The court set 18 July for a mention of the case, which is expected to be transferred to the high court, he said, declining to give further details.

The *New Straits Times* newspaper said Isti, who had bruises and scratch marks on her body and forehead, was declared dead on arrival at a hospital 5 June. Indonesian Embassy officials have said they are keeping a close watch on the case.

## CIA website goes down, hackers claim responsibility

BOSTON, 16 June—The public website of the Central Intelligence Agency went down on Wednesday evening as the hacker group Lulz Security said it had launched an attack.

Lulz Security has claimed responsibility for recent attacks on the Senate, Sony Corp, News Corp and the US Public Broadcasting System television network.

The CIA site initially could not be accessed from New York to San Francisco, and Bangalore to London. Later in the evening service was sporadic.

"We are looking into these reports," a CIA spokeswoman said.

Lulz Security has defaced websites, posted personal information about customers and site administrators, and disclosed the network configurations of some sites.

Security analysts have downplayed the significance of these attacks, saying the hackers are just looking to show off and get as

much attention as possible.

In the case of the CIA attack, hackers would not be able to access sensitive data by breaking into the agency's public website, said Jeffrey Carr, author of the book *Inside Cyber Warfare: Mapping the Cyber Underworld*.

## At least 41 Malaysian gov't websites disrupted on hacking attacks

KUALA LUMPUR, 16 June—At least 41 Malaysia's governmental websites have been attacked and defaced by an unknown hackers' group, named itself "Anonymous", said an official.

Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC), the country's internet regulator, said in a statement here on Thursday that the attacks started at approximately 11:30 pm local time on Wednesday night and 51 government websites had been attacked in which at least 41 ones were disrupted at various levels. It said that the situation turned to a reduced level of attacks by 4:00 am local time on Thursday and upon further evaluation, so far there has been little impact on Malaysian users as a result of this attack. Many of the websites have already been recovered and it would not take long for an overall recovery, it added.—*Xinhua*

# UNSG's Message on World Day to Combat Desertification

17 June 2011

The people who live in the arid lands, which occupy more than 40 percent of our planet's land area, are among the world's poorest and most vulnerable to hunger. Frequently, they depend on land that is degraded and where productivity has shrunk to below subsistence levels. In the world's efforts to meet the Millennium Development Goals, the challenges facing these "forgotten billion" men, women and children deserve special attention.

This year's observance of the World Day to Combat Desertification falls during the 2011 International Year of Forests, declared by the United Nations General Assembly to educate the global community about the value of forests and the extreme social, economic and environmental costs of losing them. This effort is particularly relevant for drylands, where dry forests and scrubland provide the backbone of arid ecosystems.

Forty-two per cent of the Earth's tropical and subtropical forests are dry forests. Unsustainable land management and agriculture are a significant cause of their depletion – and of the land degradation and desertification that inevitably follow. Sadly, it is only after these ecosystems are compromised that many communities or authorities become fully awakened to the importance of dry forests to society's well-being and prosperity.

The management, conservation and sustainable development of dry forests are central to combating desertification. The ongoing greening of the Sahel and other success stories around the world show that degraded lands can be reclaimed by agroforestry and other sustainable practices. We need to scale up these interventions and disseminate their results widely.

We also need to reward those who make drylands productive, so they will prosper and others will seek to emulate their example. Resources currently under development under the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change — such as REDD Plus and the Green Climate Fund — can go a long way towards improving the resilience of dryland populations, who stand to be affected first and worst by climate change. Too often, investing in drylands has been seen as unproductive or risky, instead of a necessary avenue for improving the well-being of local communities and national economies. Our challenge is to change market perceptions so drylands cease to be investment deserts.

This September, the General Assembly will convene a High-level Meeting on Desertification, Land Degradation and Drought on the eve of the 66th session of the General Assembly. Next year, world leaders will attend the Rio+20 United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development. I urge governments and their partners to use these events to bring greater focus to the quest for solutions to this urgent challenge of sustainable development.

### Weighing cancer risks, from cellphones to coffee

Despite all the recent news about possible cancer risks from cellphones, coffee, styrene and formaldehyde in building materials, most people face little if any danger from these things, health experts say.—INTERNET

NEW YORK, 16 June—You're sitting in a freshly drywalled house, drinking coffee from a plastic foam cup and talking on a cellphone. Which of these is most likely to be a cancer risk?

It might be the sitting, especially if you do that a lot.

Despite all the recent news about possible cancer risks from cellphones, coffee, styrene, and formaldehyde in

building materials, most of us probably face little if any danger from these things with ordinary use, health experts say. Inactivity and obesity may pose a greater cancer risk than chemicals for some people.

"We are being bombarded" with messages about the dangers posed by common things in our lives, yet most exposures "are not at a level that are going to cause cancer," said Dr Len Lichtenfeld, the American Cancer Society's deputy chief medical officer.

Linda Birnbaum agrees. She is a toxicologist who heads the government agency that just declared styrene, an ingredient in fiberglass boats and Styrofoam, a likely cancer risk.

"Let me put your mind at ease right away about Styrofoam," she said. Levels of styrene that leach from food containers "are hundreds if not thousands of times lower than have occurred in the occupational setting," where the chemical in vapour form poses a possible risk to workers. "In finished products, certainly styrene is not an issue," and exposure to it from riding in a boat "is infinitesimal," she said.

### Olive oil could lower stroke risk

WASHINGTON, 16 June—Older people who eat olive oil have a lower risk of stroke than those who do not, suggested a study of more than 7,000 French people that was published Wednesday in the United States. Researchers at the National Institute of Health and Medical Research in Bordeaux, France followed 7,625 people age 65 and older from three cities — Bordeaux, Dijon and Montpellier — for a period of five years.

During that time, there were 148 strokes. The subjects were divided into groups according to their use of olive oil, ranging from people who did not use it at all to those who used it in dressing, cooking and on bread. When researchers adjusted for factors such as body weight, physical activity and overall diet, they found that the so-called "intensive" olive oil users had a 41 percent lower risk of stroke compared to those who never ate olive oil.—Internet

### Malaysia seals drug company over radiation

KUALA LUMPUR, 16 June—Malaysia's nuclear energy regulator has sealed off a pharmaceutical company following a radiation leak earlier this month, a minister said Wednesday. Science, technology and innovation minister Maximus Ongkili told AFP the Atomic Energy Licensing Board (AELB) sealed off the company after four of its employees set off radiation monitors when visiting the AELB's office on 2 June.

"The radiation reading on one of the workers exceeded more than 400 times the normal reading (of 0.5 microsieverts per hour)," he said. Ongkili said the AELB checked the company's premises in central Selangor state on the same day, finding the contamination there at 100 times the normal reading and sealed off the area to "ensure the radiation did not spread and prevent any radioactive particles from leaving the place."—Internet

### Honda headquarters is hot for delayed model launch

TOKYO, 16 June—Honda headquarters is sweltering, executives are without ties and reporters are fanning themselves in a scene illustrative of Japan's struggles to conserve electricity after the 11 March earthquake and tsunami sent a nuclear plant into meltdown. Honda Motor Co launched the Fit Shuttle station wagon, which includes hybrid versions, for the Japanese market Thursday, three months later than the initial plan — another sign of the disaster's

devastation.

The 9.0-magnitude quake and tsunami destroyed Honda's parts suppliers, dealers and design facility in northeastern Japan. Still, President Takanobu Ito was relieved the company had come this far. "It was a real tough three months for us," he told reporters, wearing a casual beige jacket but no tie, instead of his usual dark suits. The annual practice of allowing less formal attire for the office called "Cool Biz" is being backed by the Japan in a big way after

the disaster — now dubbed "Super Cool Biz," even encouraging Aloha shirts and shorts. Although no Honda executive was in shorts and their shirts were relatively staid, the nuclear crisis hung like a cloud over the event.

Tokyo-based Honda's invitation to the event one of the first auto launches after 11 March had warned the thermostats will be set at 28 degrees Celsius (82 Fahrenheit), and the executives will be in "Cool Biz" clothing.

### S Korea's retail sales growth slows in May

SEOUL, 16 June—Sales growth at South Korea's major discount outlets and department stores slowed in May due to weak demand for groceries and sports products, a government report showed Thursday.

Total sales at the country's three leading discount outlets, including E-Mart, Lotte Mart and Homeplus, rose 2.4 percent in May from a year earlier, down from a 4.6 percent on-year expansion the previous month, the Ministry of Knowledge Economy said in a statement.

The slower growth was mainly attributable to sluggish demand for groceries, which accounted for 51.4 percent of total sales last month, according to the ministry. Grocery sales grew 4 percent on-year in May, down from a 5.7 percent on-year advance a month earlier. Sales growth of sports-related products eased to 2.7 percent on-year in May from 9.4 percent in April, with clothing sales growth slowing to 0.1 percent last month from 5 percent the previous month.—Xinhua

### New Zealand launches financial literacy campaign to help economic renewal

WELLINGTON, 16 June—The New Zealand government Thursday threw its weight behind a campaign to improve the nation's economy by educating the public on personal financial issues.

Improving knowledge of personal finances would contribute to a healthier economy based on more savings and less debt, Finance Minister Bill English said.

"Better financial literacy is not only good for the economy, it also helps individual New Zealanders make better decisions about their own personal finances," he said, speaking at the

opening of the New Zealand Centre for Personal Financial Education in Wellington.

"The new centre is consistent with the government's programme to move the economy away from excessive borrowing, consumption and government spending," said English.

"We want to build faster growth based on savings, exports and productive investment. New Zealanders understand that challenge and we're already seeing some early signs of progress, with households saving a bit more and paying down debt."—Xinhua



## Japan quake may have caused plate shift

TOKYO, 16 June—Global positioning system data indicated a seismic shift occurred from the 11 March earthquake that devastated northeastern Japan, research indicates.

The 9-magnitude earthquake that shook Japan eased strain from the Japanese trench that had accumulated over hundreds of years, said the report published Wednesday on Nature's Website. The findings support the importance of GPS

observations when assessing future earthquake potential, the authors said.

To better understand the potential of major earthquakes, Shinzaburo Ozawa of the Geospatial Information Authority of Japan and his colleagues used GPS data to assess the megathrust fault off the coast of Japan. Data indicated the coseismic slip area — the ground deformed during the earthquake — stretched about 248 miles along the Japan trench, Ozawa said. Strain on tectonic plates in the region has been higher than normal recently, but the release of the strain during the earthquake partially resolved the issue, Ozawa said.

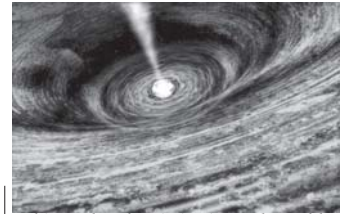
The researchers said the afterslip (slow earthquakes and aftershocks) is spreading into the coseismic slip area, expanding into the surrounding region and going about 62 miles deep, and could be an avenue of release for the remaining strain energy.

## Black holes tell tale of the infant Universe

PARIS, 16 June—Astronomers have detected faint X-ray signals that they believe were emitted by giant black holes billions of years ago when the Universe was a toddler, a study in the journal *Nature* said on Wednesday. The probe looked at more than 250 galaxies, the farthest of which was 13 billion light years from Earth — in other words, emissions that came only 700 million years or so after the "Big Bang" that created the cosmos.

The findings support the theory that super-sized black holes play a dual role of destruction and creation at the heart of galaxies, its authors said. "These observations indicate that extremely massive black holes already existed as early as 700-800 million years after the Big Bang, which suggests that either they were born massive to start with, or they experienced rapid growth bursts," said Yale University cosmologist

Priyamvada Natarajan. "Either scenario tells us much more than we previously knew, which is very exciting."

The black holes were discovered indirectly, thanks to telltale high-energy X-ray signals which escaped through thick clouds of dust and gas in their host galaxies. Ancient black holes have already been spotted in previous research, but this is the first wide-scale trawl to look across a range of galaxies.—Internet



## 5 e-book readers for less than \$175

NEW YORK, 16 June—When Amazon.com's ground-breaking Kindle e-book reader came out in 2007, it cost \$399. Now, some e-readers, including the most recent Kindle entry, can be had for just north of \$100.

At the price of five or so hardcover books, it's close to impulse-buy territory for many people. And if you give in to your desires, what do you get? Our test of five e-readers priced from \$114 to \$164 finds that cheap, in most cases, means good value.

All five have black-and-white screens that are about half the size of a paperback book. They can connect wirelessly to the Internet for e-book downloads.

I didn't look closely at battery life, because with one exception, they all claim more than a month of use. The company time machine was occupied. Here's the rundown:

Kindle with Special Offers (\$114) is the cheapest Kindle model yet. It's indistinguishable from a device that costs \$25 more, except that it shows advertising as its screen saver and at the foot of the menu. You don't, mercifully, see any advertising when you're reading, and overall the ads didn't feel intrusive. The selection was limited, for the most part, to Oil of Olay, Visa and a car company or two, making us wonder if advertising companies are really sold on Kindle ads.—Internet

## US computer pioneer IBM turns 100

NEW YORK, 16 June—US technology pioneer IBM turns 100 years old on Thursday and while "Big Blue" is no longer the dominant player in the computer industry it remains a force to be reckoned with.

With a market capitalization of \$197 billion, IBM is the world's 14th most valuable technology company, well behind California gadget-maker Apple's \$304 billion but close to software giant Microsoft's \$201 billion.

Thomas Misa, a history of science and

technology professor at the University of Minnesota, credits IBM's longevity to its "mastery of getting information processing power into users' hands in a form that they need and want."

"They did this in the 1930s with punch-card tabulation machines and they are doing the same, essentially, with the post-1993 shift to information services," Misa said.

While its ancestry stretches back to the 19th century, IBM dates its birth to the 16 June, 1911 merger of three firms: the Tabulating Machine Co,

## Analysis: Computer security attracts venture capitalists

SAN FRANCISCO, 16 June—Silicon Valley venture capitalists are betting big on new technologies to protect computer networks, hoping they will profit from a spate of high-profile cyber attacks on corporate and government bodies.

Many security start-ups are focusing on protection at the network level, rather than individual computers or hardware, spurred by the proliferation of mobile devices and cloud computing trend, where data is stored on the Web.

"It's an area of huge interest to us," said Bill Maris, managing partner for Google Ventures, which earlier this year invested an undisclosed amount

## Flights resume in Argentina after 10-day volcanic ash chaos

BUENOS AIRES, 16 June—All international and domestic flights from Argentina's Capital on Wednesday resumed normal schedules after 10 days of chaos due to the ashes caused by the eruption of the Puyehue Volcano in neighbouring Chile, officials said.

The national Aerolineas Argentinas, Austral and Chile's LAN airline group all returned to normal flight schedules out of the Buenos Aires Ezeiza International Airport and the Jorge Newbery Metropolitan Airport, which mostly is

used for domestic and regional flights. LAN started to normalize operations since 8:30 am local time (1130 GMT) but were still reporting some delays on flights to and from both airports, while Aerolineas Argentinas and Austral airlines resumed flights at 11:30 am (1430 GMT), airline officials told *Xinhua*. Aerolineas Argentinas resumed international flights to Mexico City, Miami and Madrid, and said an extra flight is scheduled to Miami Wednesday afternoon to start to

normalize the travels for over 1,000 passengers who were stranded since

## Man sues FBI for wrongful search

PITTSBURGH, 16 June—A Bellevue, Pa. man is suing a dozen FBI agents for allegedly violating his constitutional rights, authorities say.

Gary Adams filed the lawsuit Tuesday allegedly the federal agents violated his and his family's Fourth Amendment right to be free from unlawful search and seizure, and Fifth Amendment right to life, liberty and property, the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* reported.

The lawsuit comes after his home was searched 3 March by agents looking for a previous resident of what is currently the Adamses' home. The agents were looking for Sondra Hunter, one of 29 people charged with being part of a drug gang, the newspaper said. Hunter lived at the property, but left months before the Adamses moved in. The agents had an arrest warrant, but no warrant to search the premises.

The agents "battered down the door to his home and, armed with assault rifles, stormed into his house 3 March in a misguided attempt to serve an arrest warrant on a person who was not related to or who had ever resided with" said Pittsburgh attorney Timothy P O'Brien, representing the family.

The complaint was filed by 11 family members and names 12 FBI agents.—*Internet*

## Boeing to build 10 C-17 airlifters for India

WASHINGTON, 16 June—Boeing said Wednesday that India's defence ministry has signed an agreement with the US government to buy 10 *Boeing C-17* transports, making India the plane's largest international customer.

Boeing said that under the deal, India will take delivery of its *C-17 Globemaster III* airlifters in 2013 and 2014. The US aerospace giant's announcement followed unofficial news earlier this month that the big sale, approved by the US Congress in May 2010, was in the pipeline.

The biggest defence deal in history between the two nuclear powers "will elevate India's leadership in the region," Dinesh Keskar, president of Boeing India, said in the statement.

## Now, a safety device that protects bicycle riders by projecting laser image on road

LONDON, 16 June—A UK student has invented a unique safety device that projects a bright green laser image of a bicycle on to the road ahead, alerting motorists to its

presence.

Emily Brooke, a Brighton University student, has developed 'BLAZE', which is a small, battery-powered device that is attached to the handlebars of bicycles, motorcycles or scooters, and projects a laser image on to the road ahead. *The Age* reports.

The bright green bicycle symbol travels ahead of the cyclist, alerting others to its presence.

The image can be flashing to make it more visible and can be seen even in daylight.

Brooke's invention is being hailed as a

potential life saver and has won her a place at a prestigious college in the USA, on an entrepreneurship programme.

"I wanted to tackle the issue of safety of cyclists on city streets by increasing the visibility, footprint, and ultimately the awareness of the bicycle," said Brooke.

"With BLAZE, you see the bike before the cyclist and I believe this could really make a difference in the key scenarios threatening cyclists' lives on the roads," she added.

Bacterial resistance to commonly prescribed antibiotics is an enormous and growing problem, largely due to misuse of antibiotics to treat non-bacterial infections and environmental exposure of the bacteria to low levels of antibiotics used, for example, in agriculture. In the new study, the authors studied the mechanisms by which *E coli* acquire resistance to three common antibiotics: amoxicillin, tetracycline, and enrofloxacin.

They found that exposure to antibiotics at relatively low levels—below those needed to inhibit growth of the bacteria—are more likely to result in the development of antibiotic resistance.

"Exposure to low levels of antibiotics therefore clearly poses most risk," concluded the authors.

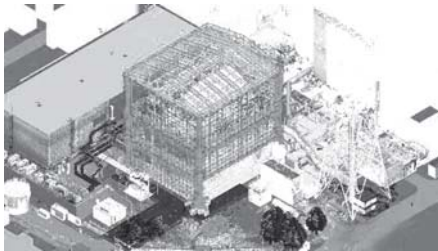
The teenager suspended the struggling puppy from the skin on its back as he took photographs from different angles.

## US husband kills wife for disturbing his sleep

LONDON, 16 June—A husband has been arrested after he murdered his wife because she kept disturbing his sleep at their home in Vernon Hills, Illinois. Ronald Stolberg is alleged to have suffocated his 54-year-old wife Rachel after she woke him up several times during the night.

Prosecutors said that Stolberg held his wife

face down on the ground with such force that she suffocated.

"He pushed her so hard her teeth bit into her lips," the *Daily Mail* quoted Steve Scheller, Lake County State's Attorney, as saying.

The 47-year-old convict had gone back to sleep while his wife's body lay on the floor next to the bed.

Prosecutors said that he got up in the morning and noticed that his wife's hands were blue, but continued with his daily routine and went to work.

According to Scheller, after Stolberg returned from work he called his mother and waited for her to arrive and then told her his wife was dead.—*Internet*

## Laptop with over eight mil medical records missing

LONDON, 16 June—A laptop containing more than eight million medical records of patients has gone missing from a research building in a biggest-ever security breach of its kind in Britain, a media report said Wednesday.

The computer vanished from the National Health Service (NHS) building three weeks ago but it has only just been reported to police, *The Sun* reported.

The unencrypted laptop contains sensitive details of 8.63 million people plus records of 18 million hospital visits, operations and procedures, the report said.

The data does not include names but patients could be identified from postcodes and details such as gender, age and ethnic origin, it said.

The computer was one of 20 lost from a store room at London Health Programmes, a medical research organization based at the NHS North Central London health authority, *The Sun* said. Eight have been recovered but a search is still being carried out for the other 12. The records include details of cancer, HIV, mental illness and abortions. A source said: "This laptop would be a devastating tool in the hands of a blackmailer."

## Guard shoots off finger with shotgun to remove wart

LONDON, 16 June—A security guard in Britain shot off his own finger with a shotgun to remove a wart, a media report said Wednesday.

Sean Murphy, 38, from Doncaster, had tried a variety of traditional ointments and creams. But when the persistent wart refused to disappear, he opted for the firepower of a 12-bore Beretta

shotgun, *Daily Mail* reported.

He claimed he found the shotgun under a hedge a few months earlier. His technique successfully removed the wart - along with most of the middle finger of his left hand.

The solution also landed Murphy in court this week for illegal possession of a firearm, the *Mail* said.

He received a suspended 16-week prison sentence from the Doncaster Magistrates' Court.

"I know I could have gone to jail for up to 15 years for a firearms offence. My solicitor did a very good job. The best thing is that the wart has gone. It was giving me a lot of trouble," the *Mail* quoted him as saying.

Murphy was employed as a security officer at Markham Grange Nurseries in Doncaster at the time of the incident in March, but has since lost his job, the *Mail* said.—*Internet*

## US scraps missile defence plan for Czech Republic

WARSAW, 16 June—The US has abandoned plans to deploy a missile early warning centre as part of a European missile defence system in the Czech Republic, a media report said Wednesday. "The Czech Republic will look for other options to participate in the project," Defence Minister Alexandr Vondra was quoted as saying by CTK news agency after his meeting with US Deputy Defence Secretary William

Linn. The centre was to replace a radar facility planned by the former US administration under president George Bush. The Barack Obama administration scrapped the plan in 2009 and opted for a missile early warning centre instead.

Vondra said last week that Prague did not want a mere "consolation prize" from the US to make up for the scrapping of the original plans.

Russia is opposed to the US plans to deploy missile defence systems near its borders, claiming they would be a security threat. The US is reluctant to provide legally binding guarantees that the system will not be directed against Russia.—*Internet*

**Sleep position during pregnancy**  
**'link to still-birth'**

LONDON, 16 June—Experts want urgent research to see if the position a woman chooses to sleep in during late pregnancy affects still-birth risk, as a study suggests a link. The University of Auckland compared 155 women who had late still-births with 310 who had healthy pregnancies. Sleeping on the back or right side, rather than the left, doubled the risk—but only to almost four in 1,000. Left-side lying aids blood flow to the baby, as the mother's major blood vessels are unimpeded by a heavy womb.

A third of still-births have no clear cause.

### Street closed due to bee swarm

New York police said they had to divert traffic from a Chinatown street when approximately 15,000 bees swarmed the area.

Police said they closed Mott Street between Bayard and Pell Monday and the road was reopened at about 5 pm after a police department beekeeper captured the insects, the *New York Daily News* reported Tuesday.

The department said the swarm was only the latest in a recent string of bee incidents in the city. Police said a mailbox in the Little Italy neighborhood was swarmed about two weeks ago and a second swarm was spotted around a Washington Heights fire escape a few days later.

### Elderly woman uses AIDS threat to rob Colorado bank

A woman robbed a Colorado bank by passing a note saying she would infect a teller with AIDS if the clerk didn't hand over money, police said.

Jeff Satur, spokesman for the Longmont, Colorado police department, said detectives are searching for a pale woman between the ages of 55 and 75 with a "boney build."

Satur said a woman, who was wearing a train conductor's cap and a gray sweat shirt, walked into a Wells Fargo bank inside a Safeway grocery store on Thursday night and handed a note to a teller.

"She indicated she had AIDS and would give it to a teller if she didn't cooperate," Satur said. The woman coughed frequently into

a blue bandana during the robbery, and fled with an undisclosed amount of cash, Satur said.

Police and the FBI released still photographs of the robbery and are reviewing additional photographs and surveillance video from the bank's parking lot to try and identify the suspect.

### Wrong team: Paper runs ad touting Miami Heat win

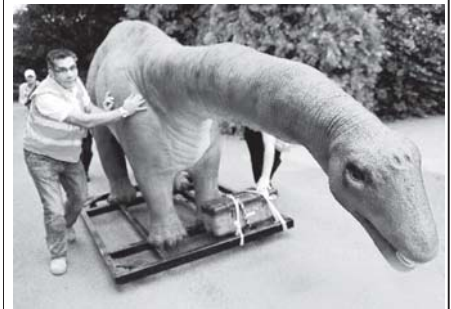

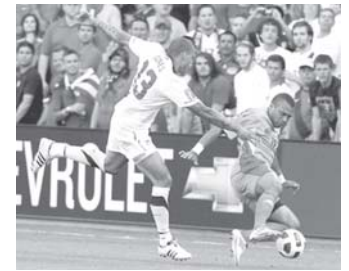
## US beats Guadeloupe to advance in Gold Cup

## Chelsea say they will name coach within two weeks

EASTBOURNE, 16 June — Serena Williams hit the wall in her career comeback at Eastbourne on Wednesday after only one victory, with top seed Vera Zvonareva sending the American back to the practice courts. The Russian's 3-6, 7-6 (7/5), 7-5 three-hour triumph was revenge for the Wimbledon final a year ago won by Williams, now ranked 26th after

nearly a year out of the game. Williams was appearing at Eastbourne for the first time after two operations on a foot she cut after last year's Wimbledon followed by further surgery in February to remove blood clots from her lungs.

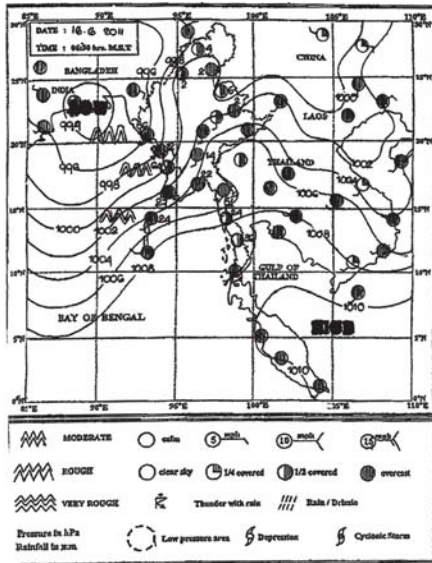

M.S.T.** During the past 24 hours, rain have been isolated in Lower Sagaing Region, scattered in Kayah State, fairly widespread in Mandalay and Magway Regions, Kayin State and widespread in the remaining Regions and States with regionally heavyfalls in Rakhine and Mon States and isolated heavyfalls in Ayeyawady Region and Chin State. The noteworthy amounts of rainfall recorded were Taungup (4.49) inches, MraukU (4.29) inches, Kyeikkhame (4.06) inches, Maungdaw and Kyeikmaraw (3.70) inches each, Paung (3.60) inches, Sittway (3.58) inches, Kyauktaw (3.54) inches, Paletwa and Chaungzon (3.50) inches each.

Rainfall on 16-6-2011 was (0.20) inch at Nay Pyi Taw, (3.90) inches at Yangon (Kaba-Aye) and (Tr) at Mandalay. Total rainfall since 1-1-2011 was (16.26) inches at Nay Pyi Taw, (33.82) inches at Yangon

(Kaba-Aye) and (13.39) inches at Mandalay. Maximum wind speed at Nay Pyi Taw was (18) mph from Southwest at (00:30) hours MST on 16-6-2011.

## China has 657 cities at all levels

BEIJING, 16 June—After a series of administrative changes to urban divisions last year, China currently has 657 cities at all levels, said a report released by the country's Ministry of Civil Affairs Thursday.

According to the document, entitled "The Statistical Report on China's Social Service development in 2010," the central government approved nine applications on administrative area changes in 2010, during which, three county-level cities were newly established.

Chinese cities across China largely fall into three levels: province-level cities, also known as municipalities, such as Beijing and Shanghai, prefectural cities and county-level ones.

The minimum population density for a county to be upgraded to a city in China is 100 people per square kilometer.—Xinhua
