### Take preventive measures against floods

Monsoon wind is picking up these days according to observations. Along Myanmar's coastal line and in offshore areas, there will be squalls sometimes and moderate to large waves. There will be more rainfalls in the northern parts of Myanmar as well as in Lower Myanmar.

With heavy rainfall, it is likely that the water level of Yangon River is above tidal datum. Meteorology and Hydrology Department has announced that the water of Thanlwin River and Ngawun River may reach danger level. Some towns and villages may see floods due to isolated heavy rain in some regions.

Preparedness measures should be taken in flood-prone regions to prevent transportation routes and houses from being flooded. Preventive measures against floods and natural disaster must be taken in parallel with times. Preparations must be made to maintain communication links and timely supply food and medicine.

Flood-prone areas are to keep a watch on whether or not the river water level is above danger level. By setting up checkpoints, they must keep a close watch along the river banks.

Taking flood warnings seriously, those areas are to stockpile and keep bags of sand and stones. Moreover, town and ward flood prevention groups and rescue and health groups need to be formed.

In addition, preventive measures must be taken on a constant basis as natural disaster, including floods, may fall at any time. Local administrative bodies, social organizations and local people are urged to work together for preparedness against natural disaster.

## Two killed, 14 injured in blast in Peshawar, Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 1 July—At least two people were killed and 14 others injured in a blast late Thursday night at a market place in Peshawar in northwest Pakistan, reported local Urdu TV channel ARY.

According to the local media reports, the blast took place at about 9:30 pm local time inside a vehicle at the Shoba market in downtown Peshawar.

Police have arrived at the scene shortly after the explosion was reported. The injured people have been rushed to hospital.

Nature of the blast is yet to be determined. Some local media reports said that it could be a CNG cylinder blast of the vehicle.

Other details about the blast are not immediately available.

On the night of 12 June, a twin blast attack took place in a market in downtown Peshawar, in which the first blast was initially reported to be a gas cylinder blast followed by a huge suicide bomb attack which killed 39 people and injured over one hundred others.

## 20 civilians killed in southwest Afghanistan

KABUL, 1 July—Altogether 20 civilians were killed on Thursday afternoon in a mine explosion in southwestern Afghan Province, Nimroz, Afghan police officer told Xinhua.

The explosion broke out when a bus ran over a landmine on Thursday afternoon in Khash Rod District, in the north of Nimroz Province with Zaranj as its provincial capital, some 790 km southwest of Afghan Capital Kabul.

"The ill-fated passenger bus hit a mine in Khash Rod District in the afternoon, leaving 20 dead and the driver injured," Mohammed Musa Rasuli, deputy police chief of Nimroz Province told Xinhua reporter on Friday night.

"It is Taleban who planted the landmine," the deputy police chief said. Afghan Taleban are frequently engaged in IED ( Improvised Explosive Device) attack, always in the forms of suicide bombing and roadside bombing.

However, Taleban are not available to make any comment over the incident so far.—Xinhua

## US-led raid kills five in Afghanistan

KABUL, 1 July—US-led forces have killed at least five private security contractors and injured nine others in an airstrike in the troubled eastern Afghanistan.

The strike took place on a NATO logistics convoy in Sayedabad district of Wardak Province, a Press TV correspondent reported on Thursday.

The US led forces reportedly hit the convoy after it was attacked by militants. NATO officials claim they have only killed militants in the air strike.

In a separate development, a roadside bomb has killed six civilians in southern

Helmand Province. Afghan officials say four children are among the dead.

All the victims were members of a family in a vehicle that was hit by the blast. No group has claimed responsibility for the attack. Civilian casualties by US-led foreign forces have been a major source of friction between Kabul and Washington.

Hundreds of civilians have lost their lives in the US-led airstrikes and ground operations in various parts of Afghanistan over the past few months, with Afghans growing frustrated over the seemingly endless number of deadly

assaults.

Afghan authorities have repeatedly warned NATO forces to avoid killing civilians during military operations.

The attacks have left a large number of Afghan civilians dead since the start of the US-led invasion in 2001. The war in Afghanistan, with civilian and military casualties at record highs, has become the longest war in US history.

## US official: Local cops help fight domestic terror

VIENNA, 1 July—The head of America's Homeland Security department says it is increasingly recruiting local police forces to help in tracking down US extremists planning terrorist acts.

Janet Napolitano says the number of such "home-grown" — US citizens with terrorist intentions — is increasing and her department is reaching out more often to municipal and other local police departments.

Napolitano spoke to reporters after addressing the Vienna-based Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe on joint ways to battle international cybercrime, terrorism, and trafficking in drugs, weapons and people.

KABUL, 1 July—The number of Iraqis killed in violence in June was the highest since the start of the year, according to figures released on Friday.

A total of 271 people — 155 civilians, 77 policemen and 39 soldiers — died in attacks last month, data compiled by the health, interior and defence ministries showed.

## Key colour pigment found in ancient birds

MANCHESTER, 1 July—An international team of researchers using sophisticated x-ray technology has found chemical traces of a key colour pigment in 100-million year old fossilized birds that once formed their feather patterns.

The study, reported Thursday in *the journal Science*, provides a glimpse into the biochemistry of prehistoric animals and greater understanding of their diets and environment.

Working at Stanford University's National Accelerator Laboratory in California, the author's discovered chemical traces of a pigment, known as eumelanin, that is one of the colouring agents responsible for brown eyes and dark hair in many modern species, including humans.

"This is a pigment that evolved a very, very long time ago, but is still actively synthesized by organisms on the planet," said geochemist Roy Wogelius of the University of Manchester, one of

the leaders of an international team that reported the discovery.

"We found a way to map it and show its presence over 120 million years of geological time passing," he said.

"It is a direct relationship between you, me, and some extremely old organisms."

Using synchrotron radiation, the researchers examined two fossilized birds, *Confuciusornis sanctus*, which lived 120 million years ago, and had the first known bird-like beak, and *Gansus yumenensis*, considered the oldest modern bird, which lived more than 100 million years ago and looked a bit like a modern grebe, a type of freshwater diving bird.—*Internet*

## Running and learning use same brain waves

LOS ANGELES, 1 July—What do learning and running have in common? They seem to use the same brain waves

The pattern of brain waves, called the gamma rhythm, "is known to be controlled by attention and learning, but we find it is also governed by how fast you are running," said Mayank Mehta of the University of California, Los Angeles, a researcher in a new study involving mice. "This research provides an interesting link between the world of learning and the world of speed."

The gamma rhythm comes from the hippocampus, the part of the brain associated with memory during concentration and learning. The hippocampus records facts and events as they happen, holding them until they can be formed into long-term memories during sleep. (Injuries to the hippocampus result in damaged ability to form new memories.)

The researchers studied the brain

waves of mice as they ran in the lab. Specific spikes in the brain's electrical activity — one way the brain cells communicate — seemed to show an increase in the gamma rhythm as the mice moved faster.

The researchers don't know how this might influence the learning process in the hippocampus.

"Deciphering the language of the brain is one of the biggest challenges that human beings face," Mehta said.

Learning about how the brain works can help researchers understand how the signals go awry, Mehta said. "If we can learn to interpret these brain oscillations, it may be possible to successfully intervene in cases ranging from learning disorders to post-traumatic stress, or even to mitigate the effects of cognitive decline with aging."

The study was published 24 June in *PLoS ONE*.

## Skype introduces video calling for Android phones

LONDON, 1 July—Skype, which is being bought by Microsoft for \$8.5 billion, introduced a new service on Thursday allowing users of Android phones to make free video calls to Skype contacts, including those on Apple iPhones.

The company whose name became synonymous with Internet calling in the mid-2000s said its updated Android app would initially support video calling on selected HTC and Sony Ericsson Phones, with more to follow soon.

"We are committed to bringing Skype video calling to as many platforms as possible," Skype's product and marketing chief Neil Stevens said in a statement.

The move will help makers of

phones based on Google's Android software compete with Apple's FaceTime video-calling service launched last year for the iPhone and now available on its iPad 2 tablet and Mac computers.

Video calling could also help new Skype owner Microsoft promote its Windows Phone smartphone platform, which it is merging with Nokia's in an effort to become competitive with Android and Apple.

Skype had an average of 145 million connected users per month in the fourth quarter of 2010. Together, they made 207 billion minutes of calls in 2010, about 42 percent of which was video calls.

Mobile video calling is in its infancy, but the fixed-line Internet calling market grew 12.6 percent to \$17.3 billion last year, according to UK-based telecoms research firm Point Topic.

With the new Android Skype app, users will be able to make free one-to-one video calls between Android phones, iPhones, Mac computers, Microsoft Windows PCs and televisions.

The first Android handsets to support Skype video calling are the HTC Desire S, Sony Ericsson Xperia neo, Sony Ericsson Xperia pro and the Google Nexus S.—*Reuters*

## Scam Detector iPhone app will give you an education on getting ripped off

NEW YORK, 1 July—I'm familiar with Nigerian scams, but I hadn't heard of the docu-drama 419: The Nigerian Scam, which tells a fictional account of the 419 email ruse. Expanding on the knowledge gained while making the movie, the film's creators developed the app Scam Detector for iPhone and iPod Touch.

If you're expecting Scam Detector to spot a shady situation for you, then you'll probably feel taken by the 99 cent price tag. Scam Detector won't be a substitute for your intuition, but

what it does provide is a large encyclopedic database of the ins and outs of more than 350 scams — many of which I'd never heard of, like the fake hotel receptionist who calls your room asking for credit-card verification or the invitation to participate in a fake bus accident.

The app is divided into five sections: auto scams, face-to-face scams, Internet scams, telephone scams and travel scams. Within each, you'll find an alphabetical list of known scams.

Tap into a scam to see how it works, and how you can avoid it. The app allows you to post the scam directly to Facebook or Twitter if you think it's something others need to be aware of ASAP.

There aren't any bells and whistles in Scam Detector — it is purely a text app — but it does have an excellent search engine. Want to know if that work-from-home ad is legit? The search will pull up anything related.

The vast info provided makes Scam Detector a good buy at 99 cents. In case you still don't want to spend, there's a free lite version of the app with a portion of the information available.

## Programme shrinks time-to-treatment for heart attack

NEW YORK, 30 June— The time it takes to transfer heart attack patients to hospitals that provide emergency coronary angioplasty was greatly reduced when a statewide transfer programme was launched in North

Carolina, a new study finds. It included 436 patients with ST-elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI), the most lethal form of heart attack that occurs when a large area of the heart is deprived of blood supply. These patients

generally need coronary angioplasty to open blocked coronary arteries within 90 minutes of first being assessed by emergency medical personnel.

However, only 25 percent of hospitals in the United States can

perform emergency coronary angioplasty, in which a balloon-tipped tube is threaded through an artery in the heart. The balloon is then inflated to open the artery and restore blood flow.

14,000 women in the United States each year. It's usually not spotted until at an advanced stage. The gene sequencing was carried out by The Cancer Genome Atlas, a federally funded network of medical centres that analyzed 316 ovarian tumours. Scientists found that 96 percent of the tumours had mutated TP53 genes. The mutations were not present in normal tissue from the patients, showing they arose within the tumours. Normally, the gene directs the cell how to make a protein that acts as a tumour suppressor, keeping cells from growing and dividing uncontrollably. Alterations in nine

other genes also played a role in ovarian cancer, though to a much lesser extent, the researchers reported. Among them were the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes, which increase the risk of breast and ovarian cancer. "In other cancers, there are usually several genes that are involved" on almost equal footing, said one of the study authors, Dr David Wheeler of Baylor College of Medicine. "This is an unusual pattern." The new work "is producing impressive insights into the biology" of ovarian cancer, Dr Francis Collins, who heads the National Institutes of Health, said in a statement. LOS ANGELES, 30 June—Researchers analyzing the genetic makeup of ovarian cancer tumours have found a gene mutation that is surprisingly frequent, suggesting it plays a key role in driving the cancer. The finding, appearing in Thursday's issue of the journal Nature, may eventually lead to tests for earlier diagnosis of the disease and to better treatment. Ovarian cancer kills nearly

# Harmonious contributions of people toward tourism industry

Geographical conditions of Myanmar are appropriate for tourism industry. Archaeological regions such as Bagan, Mandalay, MraukU and so on, archaeological buildings and handicrafts attract the tourists. Likewise, Inlay Lake, Indawgyi Lake and snow-capped Mount Khakaborazi are tourist destinations. Moreover, tourists can take relaxation at natural beaches namely Chaungtha and Ngwehsaung.

Thus, the number of tourists paying visits to Myanmar has been increasing year by year. About 800,000 tourists visited Myanmar in 2010 indicating a 3.8 per cent increase when compared with the previous year. Over 140,000 tourists arrived in Myanmar during the period from January to April this year, increasing over 30,000 more tourists than the same period of last year.

With the aim of achieving greater success in the tourism industry, the Ministry of Hotels and Tourism formed the Myanmar Tourism Board to do the works in cooperation with the international travel entrepreneurs and companies.

The Myanmar Tourism Board was constituted with 11 associations namely the Myanmar Hoteliers Association, the Union of Myanmar Travels Association, the Myanmar Market Promotion Committee, the Myanmar Hotels and Tourism Skilled Employees Association, the Myanmar Tour Guides Association, the Myanmar Restaurant Entrepreneurs Association, the Myanmar Tourism Transport Entrepreneurs Association, the Myanmar Tourism Souvenirs Shops Association, the Myanmar Internal Tourism Services Association, the Myanmar Tourism Health and General Services Association and the Myanmar Hotels and Tourism Training Schools Association. The board was formed with the aim of systematically developing hotels and tourism services.

With a view to performing coordinated works for hotel services, a total of 11 hotel zones have been formed in Nay Pyi Taw, Yangon, Mandalay, Bagan, Chaungtha, Ngwehsaung, Taunggyi (Inlay), Mawlamyine, Bago, Rakhine and Golden Triangle regions.

Of them, Nay Pyi Taw Hotel Zone is gaining development in leaps and bounds in a short period. There are 24 hotels in Nay Pyi Taw and plans are under way to build over 50 hotels. In 2006, the hotel service commenced its functions there with five hotels. Some hotels comprised about 30 rooms each and some 15

rooms each. At that time, the number of hotel rooms could not hit less than 100. During five years period, the hotel service gained progress significantly.

As Nay Pyi Taw is the capital of the nation, State level ceremonies, ministerial ceremonies and international level ceremonies are often held at hotels in the Nay Pyi Taw Hotel Zone. Recently, hotel receptionist course, hotel room keeping course, beverages catering service course and beverages production course were conducted for enabling the hotel staff to become proficient staff members so as to provide accommodation services to the guests. Opening the courses was aimed at turning out the skilled and proficient hotel staff. At present, arrangements are being made for conducting more courses in Bagan Hotel Zone and other hotel zones.

In fact, the tourism industry is a business with the participation of the majority of private sector. The government is to adopt necessary policies, rules and regulations for coordination of smooth working processes. Most of the incomes from the industry flows into the private sector.

Better services play an important role in development of tourism industry. Not only hotel service but also tourism service is necessary to provide better services to the guests for their convenient traveling and accommodation. Better hotel services are to be combined with politeness and hospitality of Myanmar traditions.

In the past, the tourism service was run as a State-owned industry. By promulgating the law and bylaws, the people was allowed to freely engage in hotel service, tourism service, transport service and tour guide service for 20 years. At present, there are over 700 hotels and inns in 46 towns. Exactly, there are 22 foreign invested hotels, four foreign joint venture hotels, nine State-owned hotels and 678 private-owned hotels, totaling 713 hotels that comprise 24,234 rooms. About 700 tourism companies and over 4000 multi-language tour guides come into service. In the past, the best hotels in Yangon were Inya Lake Hotel, Thamada Hotel and the Strand Hotel. Beginning 1992, the national entrepreneurs have built hotels, motels and inns. Now, over 180 hotels and inns can give service to the guests at about 7600 rooms. Likewise, the hotels set the Master Plans for hotel service, room service and construction services.



**China's first module of planned space station  
to undergo final testing before launch**

BEIJING, 1 July—China's first module of a planned space station has been transported to a launch center in western Gansu Province where it will undergo final tests before its scheduled launch later this year.

Designed to serve as a platform for China's future spacecraft to rendezvous and dock with in outer space, *Tiangong-1* will be carried into space on a Long March II-F carrier rocket, according to a spokesman for China's manned space

engineering.

After passing examinations upon leaving the factory, the unmanned space vehicle was taken to Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in Gansu on Wednesday, said the spokesman. China plans to launch *Tiangong-1* and *Shenzhou-8* spacecraft in the latter half of this year, and they will perform the nation's first space docking.—Xinhua

**Humans must guard against  
animal disease risk: WHO**

BEIJING, 1 July—China must adopt a holistic approach to addressing food safety challenges connected to the risk of contracting infectious diseases from contact with animals, the World Health Organization (WHO) has said. Peter Ben Embarek, food safety officer at WHO's China office, said the country faces risks connected to the need to produce more meat, eggs and milk to feed its growing population. He said the increased production will ramp up the risk of people being infected by food-borne diseases because of poor slaughtering oversight and the absence of proper surveillance and inspection systems.

About 50 percent of pigs in China are slaughtered outside of formal facilities without the inspection of veterinarians or food safety officers. He said poorly trained producers have little or no awareness of food safety or the risk of animal diseases being passed on to humans. Such an environment could lead to the emergence of a new pandemic of influenza. During the past 60 years, 30 percent of the 335 new infectious diseases worldwide were transmitted through food, he said. Yet in many parts of China, public awareness remains low about such things.—Xinhua


**China's submersible  
to go 5,000 metres deep  
in Pacific Ocean**

JIANGYIN, 1 July—The Jiaolong, China's manned deep-diving submersible, began its journey on Friday for a 5,000-meter dive in the Pacific Ocean, following last year's successful 3,759-metre dive.

The Jiaolong, designed to reach a depth of 7,000 metres, completed 17 dives in the South China Sea from 31 May to 18 July last year, with the deepest reaching 3,759 metres with three crew members on board.

It makes China the fifth country, following the United States, France, Russia and Japan, to have the technology to send a manned dive over 3,500 metres below sea level.

"He just scared me, though. I just wanted him to get out." Police said they are searching for the suspect.

**Suspect stole police cruiser during arrest**

The lawyer for a Kentucky drunk driving suspect accused of stealing a police cruiser during his arrest blamed his client's actions on the influence of alcohol. Heritage Creek police said Theodore Bickel of Louisville was handcuffed and placed in the back of a police cruiser 19 June when he managed to remove his seat belt, move his handcuffed hands to his front, make his way to the front seat of the car and speed off in the vehicle, *The Louisville Courier-Journal* reported Thursday. Bickel, 25, crashed the car a few miles away and it flipped over a guardrail onto the roof. Bickel fled the scene and was arrested the following day, police said.

**Alligator found on 24-mile La bridge**

Authorities in Louisiana said a 6-foot alligator found on the Lake Pontchartrain Causeway may have fallen from a truck crossing the bridge. Causeway officer Tiffany Daw responded to reports Saturday of an alligator on the 24-mile bridge and discovered the reptile in the southbound span of the bridge about nine miles from Metairie, *The New Orleans Times-Picayune* reported Thursday. Sgt Michael Kelly, Daw's supervisor, arrived soon after the officer. "He was on all fours," Kelly said Wednesday of the gator. "But you could tell he was stunned, kinda dazed. I thought, 'We can't just leave him here in the road.'" Kelly said the alligator attempted to bite him, but the animal seemed slow and weak. "So I ease up behind

him, grab his tail and just start walking backward with him," Kelly said. He said the alligator was lassoed and pulled onto a construction company's truck while awaiting Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries officers. Department officials said the gator may have been illegally caught and transported. They said an investigation is under way.

Hilton posted a photo on her Twitter page of police outside her house and a man in handcuffs. She wrote, "just got woken up to a guy trying to break into my house holding 2 big knives (sic)." Parada was convicted of one count of attempted first-degree residential burglary in April after jurors spent less than an hour deciding his fate. He faced a three-year term. Van Nuys Superior Court Judge Michael Kellogg recommended that he receive mental health counseling while in prison.—Reuters


