Two killed in bomb attack, rockets hit Baghdad Green Zone

BAGHDAD, 11 July—A police officer and his driver were killed in a sticky bomb attack in north of Baghdad on Monday, while a barrage of rockets struck Baghdad's Green Zone, the police said.

A sticky bomb attached to a police vehicle detonated in the morning in the city of Baiji, some 200 km north

of Baghdad, killing Salam al-Jubouri, a police Lieutenant Colonel, and his driver, a local police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity. Another police officer in the car was also injured by the blast, the source said.

In Baghdad, three Katyusha rockets in the morning landed on the capital's Green Zone,

which houses some of the Iraqi government offices and the US embassy, without causing casualties, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

The rockets were launched from the predominantly Shiite District of Zaafaranyah in southeastern Baghdad, the source said.—*Xinhua*

US soldier killed in Iraq

BAGHDAD, 11 July—A US soldier was killed in Iraq Sunday, the US military said.

The US military in a statement said the incident is currently under investigation and failed to give further details about how or where exactly the incident happened.

The deceased soldier's name was withheld pending notification of next of kin. The death brings to three the number of US

service members killed in Iraq this month.

US Defence Secretary Leon Panetta arrived in Baghdad on a surprise visit on Sunday. Panetta is expected to meet with US military commanders in Iraq and will hold talks with top Iraqi officials about whether a part of US troops will remain in Iraq after the deadline of the end of 2011. Some 46,000 American troops are still in Iraq.

Baghdad and

Washington are in debate whether the US troops need to extend the presence of its troops in Iraq beyond the 2011 deadline.—*Xinhua*

Three killed in Nigeria bomb blast

ABUJA, 11 July—Three persons were feared dead on Sunday afternoon, following a bomb explosion that occurred on Church Road, Suleja in outskirts of capital City of Abuja, the police said.

The bomb blast, the third of such incident in Suleja this year, occurred around 3 pm local time, causing extensive damage to some houses in the area.

State police spokesperson Richard Oguche confirmed the incident and casualties to reporters in Minna, Niger State capital, saying several others sustained varying degrees of injury.

The bodies of those confirmed dead had been deposited in the mortuary, he added.

The first bomb blast in Suleja, which occurred at a political rally on 3 March, killed seven persons, while the second explosion, which occurred at the electoral commission's office on 8 April, killed 11 persons.

Meanwhile, state governor Babangida Aliyu condemned the bomb blast that occurred in Suleja on Sunday afternoon as a terrorist act, vowing that the perpetrators would not go unpunished.

The governor said the bombing was an act of terrorism, which was the third in the state this year.

Aliyu stressed that the attack was inhuman, wicked and an attempt to intimidate law-abiding citizens of the state.

He urged the people not to be intimidated by the act of these agents of darkness.

Aliyu gave the assurance that the state government, in collaboration with security agents, would ensure that those responsible for the act were apprehended and punished according to the laws of the land.

Suicide blast kills six in N Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 11 July—At least six people including three policemen were killed and several others injured in a suicide blast attack at a political gathering held Monday morning in Pakistan's northern District of Batgram, reported local Urdu TV channel Geo.

According to the report, the blast took place at about 10:30 am local time when a suicide bomber blew himself up in front of a check post set up for the political gathering held by the local party PML-Q. The blast happened when a provincial leader of PML-Q was about to address the crowds gathering near a government building in the district which is located some 120 kilometres north of Pakistan's Capital Islamabad, said the report.

Other details about the suicide blast are not immediately available at this point.—*Xinhua*

Several people killed in explosions at Cyprus navy base

NICOSIA, 11 July—Casualties, including deaths and injuries, have been reported in Monday's massive explosions at a naval base in southern Cyprus, state TV reported.

The exact number of casualties and the cause of the explosions remain unknown.

Huge explosions ripped off the naval base in the Zygi Region of

southern Cyprus after two containers of gunpowder caught fire, said state CNA news agency reported, quoting a police spokesman.

The spokesman said the blasts struck shortly before 6 am local time (0300 GMT).

The explosions had caused severe damage to property, according to state TV.—*Xinhua*

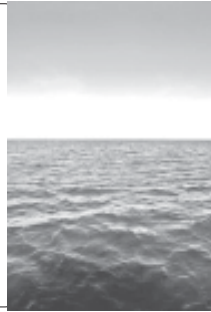
Potato genome is decoded in Scotland

DUNDEE, 11 July—Scientists in Scotland say they have decoded the entire DNA genome of the potato, which could bolster harvests of one of the world's most vital crops. Professor Iain Gordon, head of the James Hutton Institute in Dundee, told the BBC the breakthrough will help botanists develop new varieties, more nutritious, abundant and resistant to pests and diseases.

It can take more than a decade to breed an improved variety under current methods. Gordon said it will take several more years of study to apply the genome finding to crop production.—*Internet*

China aims high in space

BEIJING, 11 July—China is forging ahead with plans to put a man on the moon sometime after 2020. Some experts worry the US could slip behind China in human spaceflight. Former associate NASA administrator Scott Pace says that “a decline in space leadership will be seen as symbolic of a relative decline in US power and influence.”

An ongoing US space shuttle mission will be the last. NASA is ending the programme after 30 years. China is still far behind the US in space but has made steady progress in recent years.

It sent a probe to the moon in 2006 and carried out its first spacewalk in 2008.

This year it plans to launch a train-car size module into orbit as the first building block for a planned space station.—*Internet*

Astronauts get busy with space station stockpiling

CAPE CANAVERAL, 11 July—The astronauts aboard the orbiting shuttle-station complex will get cracking Monday on all their supply delivery work.

Space shuttle *Atlantis* has a 21-foot-long canister in its payload bay that's full of food, clothes and other Provisions for the *International Space Station*.

The astronauts will use a robot arm to lift the carrier out of the shuttle and attach it to the station.

It's enough to keep the outpost going for a full year in the post-shuttle era.

Atlantis is making NASA's final space shuttle flight.

NASA, meanwhile, expects to have a better idea Monday as to

whether the joined spacecraft will need to dodge a piece of space junk.

The piece of

orbiting debris may come too close Tuesday. The size of the object is not known.

Apple 'iPad HD' rumoured for fall release

NEW YORK, 11 July—The Apple rumour mill ramped up to full speed this week with reports that Apple has a new iPad model set for release this fall.

According to Joshua Topolsky at This Is My Next, Apple's newest tablet will be called the “iPad HD,” with the device expected to boast a screen with double the resolution (2048x1536) of the iPad 2 — a rumour we've heard before, but it hasn't been particularly believable until now.

Sources say that the device will be for the high-end “pro” market (meaning its price points will well exceed that of the iPad2), possibly for professional producers of video and photo content — though that doesn't mean anybody with a big enough bank roll can't enjoy the shiny

new tablet. Apple is said to have an iPad-friendly version of either Final Cut Pro or Aperture to go along with the iPad HD. And the device “is specifically said to not be the iPad 3, rather a complimentary piece of the iPad 2 line,” writes Topolsky, similar to the MacBook-MacBook Pro relationship.

News of a new, high-end iPad is corroborated by FBR Capital analyst Craig Berger, who says that Apple likely has an “iPad 2 Plus” in store for the holiday season.

That device, says Berger, will have a pixel density of 250-300 ppi, which adds more weight to the double-resolution screen. Berger stipulates, however, that “we await more confirming data points from other supply chain contacts before fully believing a new iPad device is

coming in 2011.”

Topolsky's report follows a big story from the *Wall Street Journal* that asserts Apple indeed has a thinner and lighter iPhone 5 in the works. While many have speculated that the next iPhone would look essentially the same as the iPhone 4, Topolsky says that we will in fact see an entirely redesigned next-gen iPhone.

The reason for the iPhone 4 look-a-like rumors is because Apple has been testing the iPhone 5 components in old iPhone 4 cases.

The reason Apple is ditching the iPhone 4 design so quickly is because high-level Apple executives are tired of it, and “are ready to move on to an entirely new product,” writes Topolsky.

These two socket-1567 systems feature up to 4 and 8 CPUs, up to 10 cores per processor, and up to 30MB of cache.

eRacks announces its latest offering of both the 4 and the 8 CPU Westmere-EX processors in its NAS (Network Attached Storage) line of servers. Earlier this year, Intel released two new lines of Xeon processors, the E7-4800 series (for systems with up to four processors)

and the E7-8800 series (for systems with up to 8 processors), both codenamed Westmere-EX. These CPUs sport a new socket (socket 1567), up to 10 cores per processor (for a total of 20 threads of execution) and up to 30MB of cache. The eRacks/NAS6X sports as many as 40 cores and 512GB of RAM, whereas the eRacks/NAS16X sports up to 80 cores and 1TB of RAM.

Both systems are therefore ideal for any applications that require massive parallelism and large quantities of memory. And, with Intel claiming 40% greater performance as compared to the Xeon 7500 series, the end user is assured more performance for less cost. Intel says that these processors “support massively scalable deployments and mission-critical workloads.”—*Internet*

First drug-resistant gonorrhea strain emerges

NEW YORK, 11 July— For the first time, international researchers have identified a strain of gonorrhea that is resistant to treatment with antibiotics, scientists announced at a sex disease research conference Monday.

The common bacterial infection, often called the “clap,” has until now been easily treatable with antibiotics but if left alone can cause infertility in women and painful urination and a pus-oozing infection in men.

“This is both an alarming and a predictable discovery,” said Magnus Unemo of the Swedish Research Laboratory for Pathogenic Neisseria.

“Since antibiotics became the standard treatment for gonorrhea in the 1940s, this bacterium has shown a remarkable capacity to develop resistance

mechanisms to all drugs introduced to control it.”

Details of the discovery were to be released by Unemo and colleagues at the 19th conference of the International Society for Sexually Transmitted Disease Research, on from 10 to 13 July in Quebec City, Canada. Since the finding is so new, scientists are unclear how widespread the resistant strain may be in the world population, but concerns are mounting that it could spread quickly.

“While it is still too early to assess if this new strain has become widespread, the history of newly emergent resistance in the bacterium suggests that it may spread rapidly unless new drugs and effective treatment programmes are developed,” Unemo said. As many as 700,000 people in the United States are believed to get gonorrhea annually, according to the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention.

Up to half of infected women experience no symptoms, while men usually see signs of infection within two to 30 days. “Anyone who has any type of sex can catch gonorrhea,” according to the US National Institutes of Health, which notes however that risks are higher among people with multiple partners and people who have unprotected sex.

“Gonorrhea is more common in large cities, inner-city areas, populations with lower overall levels of education and people with lower socioeconomic status,” added the NIH.

People who suspect they may be infected should see a doctor in order to obtain a prescription and should not attempt to treat the problem themselves, experts say.—*Interent*

Massage better than meds for back pain, research finds

NEW YORK, 11 July— Nagging back pain? New research reports that a weekly one-hour massage could be just the thing. A study shows that a 10-week massage treatment reduced pain more than medications and exercises, and the effects lasted for six months.

The research, published 5 July in the journal *Annals of Internal Medicine*, involved about 400 patients aged 20 to 65 with chronic low back pain.

Seattle-based researchers from the Group Health Research Institute examined the benefits of relaxation massage, such as Swedish-style massage, and more structural massage, a technique Provided by therapists

with advanced training.

The study found that both kinds of massage benefited the subjects.

At the end of the 10-week treatment, nearly 40 percent of patients in the massage groups said their pain was nearly or completely gone, compared to 4 percent in the usual care group, which included treatments such as taking pain medications or muscle relaxants, seeing doctors or physical therapists, or not doing anything.

A prior study from the National Institutes of Health found that massage therapy may have immediate benefits on pain and mood among patients with advanced cancer. The study appeared in a 2008 issue of the same journal.

US miner bids for australia’s Macarthur Coal

SYDNEY, 11 July—Australian miner Macarthur Coal said Monday it had received a takeover bid from US mining giant Peabody Energy and major steel producer ArcelorMittal valued at Aus\$4.68 billion (US \$5 billion).

Macarthur, the world’s top producer of a pulverised coal used to make steel, has rejected several previous takeover bids from Peabody in the past two years.

The latest offer is for Aus\$15.50

per share, less the final dividend for this year, under which the foreign-based firms would take control of Macarthur through a jointly-owned bid company.

“The board makes no recommendation in relation to the indicative proposal but will seek to engage with Peabody and ArcelorMittal in relation to the price and terms,” Macarthur said in a statement.

The proposal is subject to a number of conditions, including foreign investment review board requirements and the bid company achieving an interest in at least 50.01 percent of Macarthur shares.

The offer from Peabody, which previously offered Aus\$15 and Aus\$16 for Macarthur, and ArcelorMittal, the world’s largest steel producer, comes a day after the Australian government announced the details of its carbon tax.

The tax, which would remain fixed for the first three years before moving to an emissions trading scheme in mid-2015, has angered the coal industry, which says it will cost jobs.

Oil falls to below \$96 after weak US jobs report

SINGAPORE, 11 July—Oil prices fell to below \$96 a barrel Monday in Asia amid signs the US economy is struggling.

Benchmark oil for August delivery was down 50 cents to \$95.70 a barrel at midday Singapore time in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange. Crude gave up \$2.47 to settle at \$96.20 on Friday.

In London, Brent crude fell 63 cents to \$117.70 per barrel on the ICE Futures exchange.

On Friday, the US Labour Department said that employers added the fewest jobs in nine months and the unemployment rate rose to 9.2 percent in June, undermining investor optimism that the world’s biggest economy was improving.

“The report was negative from

just about every angle of approach,” energy consultant The Schork Group said in a report.

“That’s hardly what you would expect in the second year of an alleged economic recovery.”

Before the dismal jobs report, oil had rebounded from \$90 two weeks ago on expectations global supplies will tighten and demand will improve during the next 18 months.

“Although the employment data delivered a significant body slam to energy markets, we’re still reluctant to rule out one more run at the \$100 area,” Ritterbusch and Associates said in a report. “The energy market absorbed the important monthly employment figures well enough to make another push within the next several sessions.”—*Internet*

Radioactive beef found in Japan

MINAMI-SOMA, 11 July—High levels of radioactive cesium have been found in cattle in Fukushima Prefecture, the site of Japan's nuclear power plant crisis, authorities say. The metropolitan government reported having found levels of radioactive cesium 4.6 times the national standard in cows raised in Minami-Soma. *The Asahi Shimbun* reported. Friday's discovery was the first time national standards have been exceeded in beef. The contaminated cattle were raised on a ranch located within the zone in which people are subject to evacuate during emergencies related

to the earthquake-tsunami disaster at the Fukushima No 1 nuclear power plant, the newspaper said. Government officials tested 10 cows after being processed at the Shibaura slaughterhouse, and all 10 had high levels of radioactive cesium. The Fukushima prefectural government asked the Minami-Soma local government to stop shipping or transporting cattle raised there. All shipped cattle from Fukushima have their surfaces tested for radiation; the cattle in question were last tested June, and had shown no sign of 26 radioactive materials, government officials said.—*Internet*

Three planes violate Camp David airspace

WASHINGTON, 11 July—The airspace over the US presidential retreat at Camp David was violated three times by civilian aircraft this past weekend, military officials say. The North American Aerospace Defence Command said the first plane wandered into the restricted zone shortly after 12:15 pm Saturday. *The Frederick (Md) News-Post* reported. The second incident occurred at 6:56 pm Saturday and the third plane was

spotted at 10:36 am Sunday. In each case, fighter planes were sent up to intercept the civilian aircraft, the newspaper said. A fourth incident occurred the previous weekend. Pilots who violate the no-fly zone are usually met by law enforcement upon landing. President Barack Obama spent part of the weekend at the presidential retreat in Maryland.—*Internet*

Art scholar claims 'lost' Michelangelo find in Oxford University

LONDON, 11 July—A veteran Italian art scholar is claiming to have identified a previously unknown painting by Michelangelo at the University of Oxford. Antonio Forcellino made international headlines last month when he backed a wealthy New York family's claim that a painting they had stored behind their sofa was by the Renaissance master. Now he claims new research techniques applied to a piece owned by Campion Hall, an institution which allows religious scholars to study at Oxford, has revealed it to be an authentic Michelangelo.

'Crucifixion With The Madonna, St John And Two Mourning Angels' was believed to have been a work by Marcello Venusti, one of Michelangelo's contemporaries. "You can immediately see the difference between this work and that of Venusti," Forcellino, who used infra-red techniques to study layers beneath the finished painting, told *The Independent*. He writes in his new book "The Lost Michelangelos" that "no one but Michelangelo could have painted such a masterpiece". The hall bought

the painting at a Sotheby's auction in the 1930s. Forcellino claimed London's National Gallery continued to attribute the work to Venusti 'out of embarrassment' that they had not identified it. *Internet*

Cows suffer stress when separated from their best friends

LONDON, 11 July—Cows suffer from stress when they are separated from their "best friends" even for a short period of time, a scientist has found. Krista McLennan, who made the discovery while working towards her PhD at Northampton University, believes her findings could help improve milk yields, reports the *Daily Mail*. She measured the heart rates and cortisol levels of cows to see how they cope when isolated. Cattle were penned on their own, with their best friend or with another cow they did not know for 30 minutes and their heart rates were measured at 15-second intervals. The research showed cows were very social animals, which often formed close bonds with friends in their herd. "When heifers have their preferred partner with them, their stress levels in terms of their heart rates are reduced compared with if they were with a random individual," McLennan said.—*Internet*

Wales' first solar park powers up in Pembrokeshire

LONDON, 11 July—The first solar park in Wales is expected to start converting sunlight into electricity later at the Rhosygilwen estate in Pembrokeshire. Almost 10,000 solar panels have been imported from the United States and are placed in 12 lines in a six-acre field. The £2.5m investment will be onstream three weeks before the UK government lowers the subsidy for large-scale solar energy investors. The site's owner Western Solar still hopes to double its size.

It is run by Dr Glen Peters who owns Rhosygilwen mansion and art centre with his family. He said: "There are 10,000 panels here. They are very cutting edge from the States. "They are thin film, particularly suited to our climate here of largely cloudy skies." He has planning consent for a development twice the size but had to rethink his plans.—*Internet*

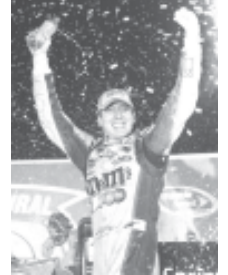

crowds descend on Royal St George's.

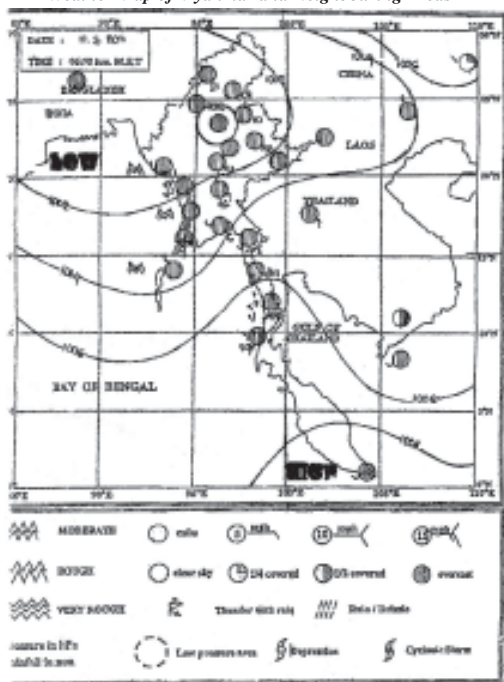

LONDON, 11 July—England women’s coach Hope Powell has accused her players of “cowardice” after she struggled to find volunteers for the World Cup quarter-final penalty shoot-out against France.

The England women’s team, mirroring the penalty failures of their male compatriots, lost the shoot-out in Leverkusen in what could be Powell’s last match after 13 years in charge before she takes up a new position within the Football

Association.

“And Kelly Smith was dying on her feet but she stepped up and took one. You’ve got to want to take a penalty, but other players should have come forward and they didn’t. That’s weak, it’s cowardice.”—Internet
