



Three bodies found, 11 people wounded in Iraq's violence

BAGHDAD, 12 July- Beheaded bodies of three brothers were found in western Iraq on Monday, while 11 people wounded in a car bomb attack on a police patrol in northern the country in the day.

Police found the bodies of a Sunni cleric and two of his brothers, who were kidnapped ten days ago by gunmen wearing police uniforms in the City of Rutba, some 375 km west of Baghdad, a local police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

The bodies were handcuffed with bullets holes in the heads and chests, and their heads were separated, the source said.

Militant attacks continue in the once volatile Sunni Arab area in west of Baghdad that stretches through Anbar Province to Iraq's western borders with Syria, Jordan and Saudi Arabia.

In a separate attack, a car bomb went off near a police patrol in the City of Yuz Khurmato, some 170 km north of Baghdad, damaging two police vehicles and wounding 11 people, including two officers and three policemen, a local police source told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

Violence and sporadic high-profile bomb attacks are common in the Iraqi cities despite the dramatic decrease of violence over the past few years.—Xinhua





Blast in bus kills 10 near Pakistani capital

RAWALPINDI, 12 July-A blast in a passenger bus killed at least 10 persons Tuesday in Rawalpindi near Pakistani capital Islamabad, local media reported. Nature of the blast was not clear and TV channels reported that gas cylinder may have caused the explosion.

The bus with 30 people onboard caught fire after the blast and 10 passengers died of burn wounds. Correspondents at the scene said they have counted 10 bodies. Several were injured and were shifted to hospitals by the police rescue teams. TV footage showed the burnt body of the bus and the rescue teams were collecting bodies of those dead.—MNA/Xinhua

US drone strikes kill 45 suspected militants in Pakistan



Another strike hours later in South Waziristan killed five suspected militants. Then on Tuesday morning, a drone fired two missiles at another compound in North Waziristan. "The missiles were fired as militants sitting in a vehicle were entering into a house used by them as a hideout," an intelligence official said, adding that 15 militants were killed in the strike. "The house is on fire." There was no independent confirmation of the death tolls, and militants often dispute official death figures.

MIRANSHAH, 12 July-At least 45 suspected militants were killed by missiles launched by US aircraft in drone Pakistan's northwest in less than 24 hours, local intelligence officials said on Tuesday, one of the largest death tolls to date in the controversial air bombing campaign.

The attacks started on Monday night, when remotely piloted drones fired nine missiles into a militant compound and at a vehicle in North Waziristan, killing 25 suspected insurgents.


Single spacewalk left for NASA's shuttle era

CAPE CANAVERAL, 12 July— It's the last spacewalk of the shuttle era. But it will be conducted by a pair of space station residents.

Astronauts Michael Fossum and Ronald Garan Jr will venture out Tuesday to retrieve a broken ammonia pump outside *the International Space Station*. They will stow the pump aboard the docked shuttle Atlantis, so it can be returned to Earth for evaluation. The two will also install a robotic refueling experiment on the 245-mile-high outpost.

Only four astronauts are flying aboard *Atlantis*. It's the smallest crew in decades — too small, in fact, to have had time to train for this spacewalk. That's why the job was handed over to the space station crew.

The 13-day flight by *Atlantis* is the last for NASA's 30-year shuttle programme.—*Internet*

TALLAHASSEE, 12 vent. July—US researchers T

Tapping or capturing this slow stream of the gas is not viable technologically or economically, they say, although methane has a global warming impact 21 times greater than carbon dioxide and must be considered when attempting to balance the climate change books.

Old landfills typically have passive gas vents that simply release the gas into the atmosphere, but US researchers say methane oxidation is a better alternative to venting of landfill methane.

The researchers tested two biofilter designs capable of oxidizing methane gas into carbon dioxide and water by using so-called methanotrophic bacteria, microbes that digest methane.

Both types of filter, a radial model and a vertical type, were effective in converting methane, they said, providing a significant oxidation rate.—Internet

EA Scrabble lets iPhone play with Android

NEW YORK, 12 July— US videogame titan Electronic Arts (EA) on Monday released a version of word game Scrabble that people can play together whether they are using Apple devices, Android gadgets, or Facebook.

Scrabble Free broke from the pattern of limiting adversaries to folks using similar operating platforms, such as iPhone versus iPad or Android smartphone versus a tablet computer also running on the Google-backed operating software.

Scrabble Free was available as a no-cost download at Android Marketplace.

"We really are kind of obsessed right now about how to tear down boundaries of entry to some of these games,"

WASHINGTON, 12 July-Web discovery tool StumbleUpon launched a revamped iPad app on Tuesday features the service's first "social bar." The new bar creates a section on each "Stumbled" page that highlights a user who also liked the page. If someone who you follow on Stumble-Upon liked the page, his or her avatar might show up there.


If not, now might be the point when Stumble-Upon introduces you to someone new who you'd like to follow. You can click through to his or her Stumble-Upon profile to see whether this is the case. "We do a good job of connecting people algorithmically who might never meet in the real world," says StumbleUpon VP of

Business Development Marc Leibowitz. But, he says, the company has received a lot of feedback from users who also want to see what their friends are liking.

The new feature is a response to that feedback, and one that could expand to include more than one featured "liker" or extend to other StumbleUpon platforms. Though the only new functionality, the social bar is just one small tweak in a completely revamped user interface for the app.

Photo thumbnails for your interests and the people who you are following have repplaced a "recommended for you" list. Quick links to photos, videos and news have replaced a long sidebar of categories. And you can now swipe to stumble instead of hitting the button, which is not an easy feat considering the data involved in the personal recommendation process.

It makes sense that StumbleUpon is investing in its mobile apps — like most web companies, mobile is its fastest growing area.

Smoking during pregnancy may predispose kids to heart trouble

SYDNEY, 12 July-Children born to mothers who smoked during pregnancy have lower levels of "good" HDL cholesterol, which may increase their risk of heart attack and stroke later in life, a new study suggests. Australian researchers looked at 405 healthy 8-year-old children and found that those whose mothers smoked during pregnancy had HDL levels of about 1.3 millimoles per liter (mmol/L), compared to a normal level of 1.5 mmol/L in children whose mothers didn't smoke.

It's not known how smoking during pregnancy lowers HDL levels in children.

study The was published 21 June online in the European Heart Journal

"Our results suggest that maternal smoking 'imprints' an unhealthy set of characteristics on children while they are developing in the womb, which may well predispose them to later heart attack and stroke.

imprinting This seems to last for at least eight years and probably a lot longer," study leader David Celermajer, a professor of cardiology at the University of Sydney, said in a journal news release.

He and his colleagues noted that rates of smoking by pregnant women are still high about 15 percent in most Western nations. This means their findings could prove important in efforts to prevent heart disease.

Vitamin D may help prevent Alzheimer's

SENDAI, 12 July-Low levels of vitamin D may be involved in agerelated decline in memory and cognition as well as Alzheimer's disease, researchers in Japan say.

Tetsuya Terasaki of Tohoku University in Japan found vitamin D injections improved the removal of amyloid beta - the build-up of the peptide amyloid beta in the brain is linked to Alzheimer's disease - from the brain of mice.

"Vitamin D appears to increase transport of amyloid beta across the blood brain barrier by regulating protein expression, via the vitamin D receptor and also by regulating cell signaling," Terasaki says. These findings, published in the journal Fluids and Barriers of the CNS, lead the way toward new therapeutic targets in the search for Prevention of Alzheimer's disease.-Internet

Sleep apnea linked to blood vessel disorders in study

BIRMINGHAM, 12 July-Obstructive sleep apnea, a condition that causes pauses in breathing during sleep, plays a role in blood vessel abnormalities and should be treated to prevent potentially fatal heart conditions, a new study suggests. About 15 million adults in the United States have obstructive sleep apnea, according to the American Heart Association.

The condition may cause changes in blood vessel function, cutting blood supply to the heart in otherwise healthy people. Blood vessel dysfunction has been linked in previous research to cardiovascular disorders. For the study, published 11 July in Hypertension, researchers monitored blood vessel function in 108 healthy people.

The participants were divided into three groups: those with moderate or severe obstructive sleep apnea without high blood pressure, those with high blood pressure but no sleep apnea, those with neither sleep apnea nor high blood pressure.

The researchers found that among those with sleep apnea, blood supply and function improved after the participants received 26 weeks of continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) using a device that holds the airway open during sleep.

"The findings should change how doctors treat patients with obstructive sleep apnea," study author Dr Gregory YH Lip, a professor of cardiovascular medicine at the University of Birmingham in England, said in a journal news release.-Internet

Cisco could eliminate as many as 10,000 jobs

July-Networking equipment company Cisco Systems Inc could eliminate as many as 10.000 jobs, or about 14 percent of its workforce. to revive profit growth, Bloomberg said, citing two people familiar with the matter.

As many as 7,000 jobs would be eliminated by the end of August, the people told the agency. Cisco is also providing early-retirement packages to about 3,000 workers who took buyouts, according to Bloomberg.

Early on Monday, Reuters reported that Cisco may slash about 5,000 jobs to meet Chief Executive John Chambers' goal of slashing costs by \$1 billion. Reuters had cited

Retailers, cash rich, to spend on IT

CHICAGO, 12 July-Retailers have cash on their balance sheets and nearly half of 100 top retail executives said they are planning to spend it on technology, a survey said on Tuesday.

Forty-seven percent of executives said they will be investing primarily in calendar year 2012 in analytical tools to improve company growth, expansion and planning. The survey, conducted in May and June by audit, tax, and advisory firm KPMG LLP, showed that 72 percent of the retailers said they have a great deal of cash on their balance sheets.

Fifty-six percent of them said they only expect a modest improvement in the economy, revenue, and hiring in

2012. The outlook beyond 2012 does not appear promising either: 40 percent of the survey respondents said they don't expect a full economic recovery until 2013-2014 or later.

And of the 100 retail executives, 23 percent said headcount would never return to prerecession levels.

According to Mark Larson, KPMG global retail leader, retailers and their suppliers will spend money on analytical tools to examine the enormous amount of data captured online and at the cash register.

"Analytics says let's use emerging technology to do a deep dive into that data to make it useful," he said. Reuters

Pragmatic approaches to rural development and poverty alleviation

Rural populace constitute the majority of the population not only in Myanmar but also in most countries. Rural people engage in agricultural farming and raising farm animals. They live in poverty. In Myanmar, 70 % of the population reside in rural areas, the majority of whom live at or below the poverty line.

Today, issues of poverty alleviation have become at the centre of the attention of the United Nations and the global community. From the political point of view, North America and Europe first witnessed industrial countries practising capitalism. The exercise of industrialism and capitalism was followed by colonialism. Taking full advantage of technological upper hand, those countries built seagoing vessels and colonized many countries in South America, Africa, southeastern Asia, southern Asia and the Middle East. They unfairly exploited natural resources and products of their colonies. Therefore, the peoples of the colonies were under the yoke of colonialism. That was the reason why rural farmers got involved in anti-colonialist campaigns, independence struggles and revolutions.

Having a look back to the history of human beings (world history), the majority of world people became slaves in the feudal age. In the age of landlords, the majority of world people became farming slaves. And in the colonial age, the majority of world people became dust-cheap labourers and slaves of colonialists.

Myanmar people fell under the subjugation of British colonialists and withstood oppression, tyranny and unfair taxes for more than 100 years. Therefore, workers staged Oilfield Workers' Uprising and peasants, Myanmar Era 1300 Peasants' Uprising as the colonialists' treatment became intolerable.

Myanmar peasants (rural people) existed on agricultural farming with conventional farming methods. British colonialists imported Chettyars from India. They lent the imported Indians money at the monthly interest rate of three kyats in every 100 kyats. The Indians lent money torural farmers, urban wage earners, vendors and lowly-paid servants at the monthly interests of 20 to 40 kyats in every 100 kyats. In some years, crops failures occurred due to climate changes or pests, peasants were unable to settle the loans with high interests, and pay tenant fees to the land owners. Then, Chettyars filed lawsuits against borrowers. Farms, cattle, farm equipment and houses of farmers were seized and auctioned.

Such British companies as Steel Brothers and Boolinger Pool bought farmers' agricultural produce at lowest prices, and exported the crops, thus making substantial profits. In consequence, the whole life of Myanmar farmers was a constant battle against poverty. At that time, a basket of paddy was sold only for five annas, and Myanmar people had to use Indian currency Rupee. One Rupee is equal to 16 annas. So, three baskets of paddy were sold for less than one kyat. It culminated in the Myanmar Era 1300 Farmers' Uprising led by traditional medical practitioner Supannaka Galuna Raja Galon Saya San (a member of General Council of Buddhists Association led by U Soe Thein).

In the post-independence period, the nation saw the civil war owing to different dogmatisms, mushrooming political parties, so many factions, and rebellions. Rural people could not work well. They had to depend completely on the rainfall to grow crops. There were no dams for agricultural purposes. They suffered landlords' exploitation up to 1960. Only after the Tatmadaw took up State responsibilities, the nation came to witness stability and peace. It built about 270 dams and large numbers of roads, railroads and bridges for swift commodity flow.

It adopted the five tasks for rural development and reclaimed millions of acres of vacant lands for agricultural purposes. Then, farmers could launch mixed- and multiple-cropping patterns, and the nation saw signs of mechanized farming.

The 7-6-2011 issue of the Mirror Daily carries a news story with the headline "According to statistics, poverty rate in Myanmar declines remarkably, poverty rate stood at 32% in 2004-2005, poverty rate reduced to 26% in 2009-2010".

At the National Workshop on figures and data collected jointly in 2010 by the Planning Department under the Ministry of National Planning and Economic Development, the United Nations Development Programme, UNICEF, and Sweden International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), Union Minister for National Planning and Economic Development and for Livestock and Fisheries UTin Naing Thein disclosed that poverty rate in Myanmar fell from 32 % to 26 %.

The Union government led by President U Thein Sein that emerged in accordance with State Constitution (2008) has formed the Central Committee for Rural Development and Poverty Alleviation, work committees and State/Region committees. At the National Workshop on Rural Development and Poverty Alleviation held from 20 to 22 June, experts, scholars and departmental officials presented papers and compared notes on tasks for rural development and poverty alleviation.

Meeting (1/2011) of the Committee for Rural Development and Poverty Alleviation took place at the President Office in Nay Pyi Taw on 20 June 2011. On the occasion, President UThein Sein in his speech said that about 70% of the Myanmar's population of about 60 million were rural residents; that the majority of the poor lived in rural areas; that the previous government laid down the five tasks for rural development to improve the socioeconomic status for needy people in rural areas; and that so success was achieved to some extent in building sound foundations in education, health, transport, and supply of clean water and irrigation water.

The Workshop on Rural Development and Poverty Alleviation adopted eight tasks: development

of agricultural productivity, development of livestock breeding and fisheries, development of small-scale rural productivity, development of microfinance institutions, development of cooperative tasks, development of rural socio-economy, development of rural energy, and environmental conservation.

Regarding the plan of action to reduce poverty, President U Thein Sein said that according to the statistics on basic needs of households collected jointly by the UNDP and the Ministry of National Planning and Economic Development, poverty rate in Myanmar had dropped from 32 % to 26%; that however, to meet the goal (1) of the UN Millennium Development Goal, poverty rate was to be halved by 2015; that therefore Myanmar's poverty rate would have to be reduced to 16% by 2014-2015; that in order to implement those tasks effectively, the Union level central committee, work committees and Region/State level work committees had been formed; that the central committee would adopt and supervise policies; and that for the Union level work committee. Union ministers would take charge of a task each and support the region and state level rural development and poverty alleviation work committees, which would have to take practical measures.

And Region and state level work committees are to go down to 330 townships and 82 sub-townships and accomplish the tasks in cooperation with the rural people who really want to work in their own and public interests.

The meeting of the Central Committee held on 20 June 2011 passed a frame of Action Plan for rural development and poverty alleviation. Union ministers from respective ministries reported on how they would implement tasks ministry-wise. It is therefore safe to say that enough arrangements for rural development and poverty alleviation have been made. The term of the Action Plan is from 1 July 2011 to 31 December 2015.

To achieve the Action Plan, societies will be formed with congenial persons in townships and villages. The societies will be transformed into cooperatives societies with bottom up initiative, not with top down policy. So, there will be smooth relations between superiors and subordinates.

Detailed programmes have been laid down to carry out the eight tasks in combination. The previous (Tatmadaw) government restored stability and peace, built national unity and improved infrastructures. It also built inter-village roads, roads linking rural and urban areas, Union highways and roads. They serve as sound foundations for rural development and poverty alleviation. Now, the people have launched a good start to implement the tasks. If rural people do their bit in the tasks with a sense of obligation, their dreams of development and poverty alleviation will come true sooner than on schedule.

B'desh crash kills 53 schoolboys after football match

CHITTAGONG, 12 July—A bus carrying scores of Bangladeshi schoolboys celebrating a football match victory against another school plunged off a hill road on Monday killing at least 53, police said.The accident happened at Mirersarai, 240 kilometres (150 miles) southeast of the capital Dhaka, near the port of Chittagong.

Survivors told reporters at the hospital that the children were in a happy mood, singing and dancing, when the bus crashed 50 feet into a flooded ditch. The weather was cloudy after days of rain. Police and witnesses said that as many as 80 children between eight and 12 were on board. Local official Giasuddin Ahmed said 53 bodies had been recovered and 15 injured boys were taken to hospital, including 10 in critical condition.—*MNA/Reuters*

UK author jailed for criticizing 'Singapore's use of death penalty' freed

LONDON, 12 July —A British author has been freed from a Singapore prison after serving time for contempt of court over his book that insulted the judiciary in Singapore.

Alan Shadrake, 76, was sentenced to six weeks in jail and fined 20,000 dollars for scandalizing the judiciary in his book Once A Jolly Hangman: Singapore Justice System In The Dock about the use of the death penalty, *the Scotsman* reports. Shadrake could not pay the fine that increased his jail sentence to eight weeks. M Ravi, who represented Shadrake in court, has said the author was released early due to good behaviour.

"He is on a plane going to London," said Ravi, adding that Shadrake had been treated at the prison hospital for a slipped disc.

Singapore imposes the death penalty for crimes such as murder and has a mandatory death sentence for drug trafficking. It boasts one of the lowest crime rates in the world.

The country has, however, been criticized for its harsh laws and use of lawsuits against critics.—*Internet*

Death toll of Russian ship sinking rises to 65

Moscow, 12 July— The Russian Emergency Situations Ministry has confirmed early Tuesday that at least 65 were killed in Sunday's ship sinking in the Volga River.

A ministry spokesman told Interfax news agency that as of 9:30 am Moscow time (0530 GMT), a total of 65 dead bodies have been lifted from the sunken cruise ship "Bulgaria," which was heavily

overloaded with some 200 passengers than its capacity limit of 120.

The spokesman said rescuers and divers continued searching in the wreckage.

According to the Russian Transport Ministry, the 56-year-old ship was not allowed to transport passengers and the shipowner did not acquire a license for the voyage. *Xinhua*

Spiked soda kills NorCal teenager

SANTA ROSA, 12 July — A Northern California teenager died and three friends became violently ill after sharing a soda at a weekend sleepover party, authorities said.

The 14-year-old girl was pronounced dead after being found unresponsive on the floor of her Santa Rosa home, Sonoma County sheriff's deputies told The San Francisco Chronicle.

Investigators said all four girls had become sick the night before. They told the dead girl's mother they suspected they were suffering food poisoning. "However, it was learned that the victim had passed around a soda that had a yet-to-be-determined substance mixed in it," Sheriff's Lt Steve Brown said. Official asked the parents of the other three girls to take them to a hospital to be checked out. The names of the girls were not released .- Xinhua

Gold hoard found in **French cellar**

Paris, 12 July — A French couple have found a hoard of gold coins worth at least 100,000 euros (£89,000; \$140,000) in the cellar of their home in the town of Millau. They were working on their drains when they dug up the 34 coins in a little clay pot, French media said. The coins date from 1595 to the French Revolution. which began in 1789, said a local coin expert who evaluated them. The most valuable is a double louis from 1640, during the reign of Louis XIII, worth 6,500 euros.

Ten decapitated bodies found in Torreon, Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 12 July -The decapitated bodies of three women and seven men have been found in an abandoned lorry in the northern Mexican city of Torreon, police say. One head was found on the windscreen. The others were dumped by the roadside, along with threatening messages. They were found after a night of violence across northern Mexico.

National Security Spokesman Alejandro Poire attributed the beheadings to a battle between two drugs gangs, the Zetas and the Sinaloa cartel. Police said the 10 had probably been killed a few days back, as the bodies were showing signs of decomposition. During the previous night at least 40 people were killed in suspected drugrelated violence. Mr Poire said the government was not letting up in its fight against the drug cartels.

"The violence won't stop if we stop battling criminals," he said. In January, the government of President Felipe Calderon said more than 34,000 people had been killed in a four-year offensive against drug gangs. The figure is believed to have risen considerably since then.



WASHINGTON, 12 July - Living in the US are on average aged 75 when they die. That is 1.5 years younger than men in the UK and 3.5 years younger than men in Australia, says a new study. American women live on average to just under 81 - about three years younger than the average Australian woman.

While life expectancy in the US continues to improve, says the report by researchers at University of Washington in Seattle and Imperial College, London, it is not increasing as quickly as in other Western countries, so the gap is widening. "The researchers suggest that the relatively low life expectancies in the US cannot be explained by the size of the nation, racial diversity, or economics," says the document, which ranks the US 38th in the world for life expectancy overall .- Internet




