Bomb kills three employees of Pakistani oil company

QUETTA, 21 July—Police say a bomb has hit a vehicle carrying employees of a national oil and gas company in southwest Pakistan, killing three people and wounding five others.

Police official Mohammed Tariq says Thursday's attack occurred on a road in the Jaferabad area of Baluchistan Province. The people who were killed worked for the state-owned Oil and Gas Development Corporation.

Police said the bomb was fixed to a motorbike and parked on the roadside about 170 miles (272 kilometres) southeast of the provincial capital Quetta.

"It was a remote-controlled device which hit the oil and gas officials' vehicle," Mohammed Tariq, a senior police official, said.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack. But Baluchistan has experienced frequent violence from nationalist groups that want a greater share of the province's natural resources.—*Internet*

Welding device explodes in Moscow market, one injured

MOSCOW, 21 July—One welder was injured after his device exploded in a market near Moscow Thursday, local media reported.

According to police, the blast occurred when a worker hooked up the welding device to an electric wire. The device's electric insulation was broken, causing a short circuit and a blast.

Initial reports suggested that a blast happened under a car parked at the market that sells gardening equipment.

Two Britons detained in Afghanistan

LONDON, 21 July—British forces have detained two British nationals in Afghanistan, authorities in London said Thursday, amid reports they were suspected of fighting with the Taliban.

"We can confirm that British forces have detained two individuals in Afghanistan who claim to be British nationals," the Ministry of Defence said in a statement.

A Foreign Office spokeswoman added: "We can confirm that two British nationals have been

detained in Afghanistan."

Neither ministry would confirm reports on the BBC and in Britain's *The Sun* newspaper that said the pair were suspected of fighting for the Taliban.

The Sun said two men wearing Afghan dress were arrested in the southern Province of Helmand, and were being held at a military base.

Britain has about 9,500 troops in Afghanistan as part of international forces fighting the Taliban military.—*Internet*

US drone attack kills four in N-W Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 21 July—At least four people were killed on Wednesday when a US drone targeted the North Waziristan tribal area in northwest Pakistan, local sources said. The pilotless aircraft fired two missiles at a house in Mir Ali area of North Waziristan which borders Afghanistan, they said.

The identities of the killed are not immediately known, but Washington often claims the US drone strikes aim to hit militant hideouts in Pakistan's mountainous tribal belt. Since the start of 2011, the US drones have launched at least 44 times (counted on daily times) of strikes in Pakistan's northwest

tribal areas, reportedly killing over 400 people in total.

While most of the people targeted by US drones in Pakistan are believed to be militants who often launch attacks on the US-led NATO troops in Afghanistan across the border, US drones do often mistakenly kill innocent civilians.

Petraeus says trusts Pakistan in fight vs al-Qaeda

PARIS, 21 July—US General David Petraeus, Washington's new intelligence chief, said on Wednesday he trusted Pakistan as an ally in the fight against al-Qaeda and gave a cautiously upbeat overview of the war in Afghanistan which he led for the past year.

Petraeus, who handed over command of foreign troops in Afghanistan on Monday, spoke in support of Pakistan's military leadership in the midst of heightened tensions between the United States and its at-times reluctant regional ally.

"I do believe they want to eliminate the al-Qaeda presence and I do believe they want to eliminate

the Taliban Pakistani presence," Petraeus said at a news conference in Paris, where he stopped on the way back to the United States from Afghanistan.

After many in Pakistan were infuriated by a secret US raid that killed al-Qaeda chief Osama bin Laden in May, US-Pakistan relations were further strained this week with the arrest in Virginia of a US citizen charged with illegally lobbying the United States for the Pakistani Government.

"It is credible they did not know" Osama bin Laden had been living in a compound in the city of Abbottabad, the site of a Pakistani military school, Petraeus added.—*MNA/Reuters*

Stone Age erotic art found in Germany

BAMBERG, 21 July—Researchers in Germany have discovered Stone Age cave art in the country for the first time including carvings of nude women that may have been used in fertility rites, officials said Wednesday. Archaeologists working for the Bavarian State Office for Historical Preservation came upon the primitive engravings in a cave near the southern City of Bamberg after decades searching, a spokeswoman for the authority said.

The spokeswoman, Beate Zarges, confirmed a report to appear in the weekly newspaper *Die Zeit* that the engravings were believed to be around 12,000 years old, which would make them the first Stone Age artwork ever found in Germany. "They include schematic depictions of women's bodies and unidentifiable symbols, among other

things," she said. The ancient artists appear to have taken their inspiration for the erotic images from rock formations in the caves resembling breasts and penises and then carved the images in the walls of the cave, Zarges said.

Die Zeit quoted geologist and archaeologist Bernhard Haack, a member of the discovery team, as saying that the five-metre-long (16-foot-long) chamber in the cave may have been used for

fertility rituals. "It is a place full of magic," he said. Zarges said the examination of the site was still ongoing and thus closed to the public. The world's oldest cave paintings are believed to be the Chauvet Pont d'Arc murals in southern France, the subject of German director Werner Herzog's most recent documentary, "Cave of Forgotten Dreams".

The artwork is thought to be more than 30,000 years old.—*Internet*

Atlantis has landed, ending NASA's shuttle era

CAPE CANAVERAL, (Florida) 21 July—The space shuttle *Atlantis* returned from NASA's final shuttle mission on Thursday, ending a 30-year era that opened the space frontier, exposed its dangers and established a toehold for future endeavors beyond Earth. NASA workers lined the runway at the Kennedy Space Centre before dawn to greet *Atlantis* and its crew upon their return from a successful 13-day cargo run to the International Space Station and to celebrate the conclusion of the shuttle programme after 135 flights.

"I saw grown men and grown women crying today, tears of joy to be sure," said shuttle launch director Mike Leinbach. "Human emotions came out the runway today. You couldn't suppress them."

Sailing through an unusually clear and moonlit night, *Atlantis* commander Chris Ferguson gently steered the 100-tonne spaceship high overhead, then nose-dived toward the swamp-surrounded landing strip a few miles from where *Atlantis* will go on display as a museum piece.

Atlantis' landing capped a three-decade-long program that made spaceflight appear routine, despite two fatal accidents that killed 14 astronauts

and destroyed two of NASA's five spaceships.

The last accident investigation board recommended the shuttles be retired after construction was finished on the space station, a \$100 billion project of 16 nations. That milestone was reached this year, leaving the orbiting research station as the shuttle programme's crowning legacy.

"Its job is done and we got them back and can put them safely in museums and be proud of what they did," said veteran astronaut Stephen Robinson, who was among those on the runway.—*Reuters*

Fake Chinese Apple store has even staff fooled

KUNMING, 21 July—China's passion for iPads and iPhones has triggered widespread cloning and even brawls. Now, it has gone further with a fake Apple store so convincing even the staff think they work for



An iPad look-a-like, using computer parts, a touch screen and a case with a keypad, made for gadget-crazy people in China who desperately want Apple's popular iPad tablet computer but cannot afford it. China's passion for iPads and iPhones has triggered widespread cloning and even brawls. Now, it has gone further with a fake Apple store so convincing even the staff think they work for Steve Jobs.—*INTERNET*

Steve Jobs. The store, in the southwestern City of Kunming, was uncovered by an American blogger who was initially fooled, before she noticed not everything was as it seemed. At first glance, the signs, computers and layout of the shop all look exactly like a genuine Apple store, says the blogger, who posts under the name BirdAbroad.

Photos posted by the blogger show the employees wearing Apple's trademark blue T-shirts with name badges hanging around their necks.

But a closer look reveals the winding stairs going up to the chill-out area are poorly made, the walls have not been painted well, and the shopfront sign says "Apple Store" whereas the real deal just sports the now-famous fruit logo.

The Apple website lists four official stores in China — two in Beijing and two in Shanghai, and none in Kunming. It has a list of approved retailers that sell its products, but none of those in Kunming corresponds to the fake store's address, according to the blogger.—*Internet*

Toyota's new pre-crash technology directs steering

SUAONO, (Japan) 21 July—Toyota is developing a safety technology that takes control of the steering so the vehicle can veer away when it isn't able to stop before impact.

Toyota Motor Corp. showed some of its up and coming safety innovations in a demonstration to reporters Thursday at its facility in this town, west of Tokyo, near Mount Fuji.

In the new system, Toyota uses cameras and a super sensitive radar called "millimetre-wave," both installed in the front of the vehicle, to

detect possible crashes such as a pedestrian crossing the road.

The vehicle calculates how braking and steering must be applied to avoid a crash, said chief safety technology officer Moritaka Yoshida.

Toyota said it was aiming for zero fatalities and injuries, although it did not say when that goal would be achieved.

Fatalities have been declining in auto accidents, because of better safety features, but deaths among pedestrians in traffic accidents have not gone down in Japan.—*Internet*

Chinese medicine could treat Parkinson's: HK study

BEIJING, 21 July—Chinese medicine may be effective in battling certain symptoms of Parkinson's disease, and lessening side effects from the drugs used to treat the condition, according to a new study.

Researchers at Hong Kong Baptist University said Gouteng, a traditional Chinese herb used to treat hypertension, helped patients better communicate and made them less prone to depression and sleeping difficulties.

"There is no cure for Parkinson's right now, but the study showed Chinese medicine can help treat the disease," a university spokesman said Thursday.

Parkinson's is a progressive motor-system disorder which usually affects people over the age of 50, although it can strike earlier, often causing severe symptoms including body trembling, stiffness and loss of balance.

The condition is usually treated with a drug called levodopa, which the brain converts into dopamine to

relieve the symptoms, but it can also cause nausea and hallucinations.

The Baptist University study found that patients who took Gouteng together with levodopa experienced fewer side effects from the drug while showing a marked improvement in their communication skills.

Li Min, an associate professor who led the study, said the findings could also help boost the profile of Chinese medicine. "They provide not only pharmacological proof of the efficacy of Gouteng in treating Parkinson's disease, but will also help promote the effectiveness and safety of Chinese medicine to the international medical arena," she said.

Li — whose team has applied for a US patent — told *the South China Morning Post* that she expects the herb would start being used to treat the disease after the second phase of the study in 2013.—*Internet*

Don't pack a choking hazard in kid's lunch

DALLAS, 21 July—When packing a child's lunch, parents should remember choking on food is one of the most common pediatric problems seen in emergency rooms, a US doctor warns.

Dr Pam Okada, a pediatrician at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Centre in Dallas, says adults should avoid giving small children hot dogs, grapes, peanuts and chunks of apples and carrots. Toddlers lack molars and the coordination necessary to chew and swallow hard foods, she says.

"The pediatric anatomy is perfect for choking," Okada says in a statement. "Their airway is approximately the diameter of their pinkie finger."

Lunch can hold dangers for

teenagers, too. Perhaps surprisingly, adolescents are at the highest risk for anaphylaxis, or severe allergic reaction, Okada says.

"This group tries crazy things," Okada says. "One study reported that teens purposefully eat food they know they're allergic to — they think they've outgrown their allergy or they succumb to peer pressure to try foods they're allergic to." Children and adolescents with food allergies should always carry an EpiPen, which contains a single dose of the medicine epinephrine, which they can quickly inject into their outer thigh to stop a severe allergic reaction. It's not fun, but it does the trick, Okada advises.

June shows first trade surplus in 3 months

TOKYO, 21 July—Japan recorded a trade surplus of 70.7 billion yen (\$898 million) in June, the first such positive number in three months, the government said Thursday.

However, the June surplus, still reflecting the effects of the 11 March earthquake and tsunami disaster, was down 89.5 percent from the same month of last year, ministry figures showed.

Nonetheless, the June performance pointed to growing signs of recovery, *Kyodo News* reported. June exports totaled 5,776 billion yen (\$73.3 billion), down 1.6 percent from the same month last year, the ministry said.—*Internet*

Microsoft profit set to rise but PC worries dominate

SEATTLE, 21 July—Microsoft Corp is expected to post a 9 percent increase in fiscal fourth-quarter profit on Thursday, helped by solid sales of its Windows and Office mainstays, but investors may be distracted by evidence of flickering computer sales, which are key to its success.

The world's largest software maker is set to follow Google Inc., Apple Inc. and IBM in reporting surprisingly good results as technology spending holds up relatively well in an uncertain economy.

"The mature market consumer segment is still soft," Intel Chief Executive Paul Otellini told analysts on a conference call on Wednesday, after the company cut its 2011 PC growth projection to a range of 8 percent to 10 percent from earlier estimates in the low double digits.

Even that could be optimistic. PC sales grew only 2.3 percent last quarter, according to research firm Gartner, as cash-strapped consumers held off buying or opted for an iPad instead.

The number of PCs sold — 90 percent of which come pre-loaded with Windows — directly affects Microsoft's top and bottom line.

Wall Street analysts expect Microsoft to post a profit of 58 cents per share for the quarter, up from 51 cents a year ago, while sales are expected to rise 7 pct to \$17.23 billion, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S. Microsoft's revenue and profit have recently slipped behind archrival Apple, which had more than \$28 billion of sales last quarter, helped by its explosively popular iPhone and iPad.

Microsoft shares have outpaced the tech-heavy Nasdaq over the past month, but still are perched around \$27, a level they have circled since 1998, adjusted for splits.

AMR Corp places huge order for new planes

FORT WORTH, 21 July—AMR Corp said it has placed the largest commercial aircraft order in history, splitting a purchase of 460 planes between US and European companies.

In a statement released Wednesday, AMR, the parent company of American Airlines, said it has ordered 200 Boeing 737 single-aisle aircraft and 260 planes of comparable size from Airbus.

Half of the order from Boeing is for 737 planes with a new engine that will "offer even more significant fuel-efficiency gains over today's models," AMR said in a statement. AMR said within five years it expects "to create the youngest, most fuel-efficient fleet among US industry peers." In addition to the order of mid-sized jets, which seat approximately 160, AMR said it "has plans to acquire 42 state-of-the-art Boeing 787 Dreamliners, to be delivered starting in late 2014."

On top of that, AMR said it has "firm orders" for seven 777-200 wide-body aircraft, which it expects to be delivered between 2013 and 2016.—*Internet*

Myanmar-Russia Hluttaws and Duma

Maung Than Nyein

At the invitation of The State of Duma of the Russian Federation with which Myanmar has maintained friendly relations for over 60 years, a nine-member delegation led by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar was on a goodwill visit to Moscow and St. Petersburg of the Russian Federation from 26 June to 1 July.

The visit was designed to foster bilateral friendly relations, exchange views through reciprocal visits between the parliaments and boost cooperation between the two countries.

The global community welcomed the holding of the free and fair multiparty democracy general election in line with the new constitution of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and the formation of Hluttaws. The Russian Federation is one of the countries that understand the objective conditions of Myanmar and welcome the emergence of Hluttaws. It therefore invited a Myanmar Hluttaw delegation with the aim of fortifying friendly cooperation between the two parliaments.

The delegation comprised five Pyithu Hluttaw members and four Amyotha Hluttaw members who are the speaker, secretaries and members of Hluttaw committees, the Union level bodies. The two Hluttaw members are successful entrepreneurs in the commercial field. Being knowledgeable about Hluttaw committee functions and related subjects, delegation members are capable of pursuing the objectives of the purpose of the goodwill visit.

Myanmar and Russia have maintained friendly relations with mutual understanding for a very long time. So, there have been many reciprocal visits of leaders of the two friend countries. According to the records, the two countries have organized about 30 State visits to each other in about 40 years.

The goodwill visits include the visits of Hluttaw delegations. The last time a Myanmar Hluttaw delegation visited Russia was in 1975. A delegation of the State of Duma visited Myanmar in 1995, and the Vice Speaker of the Federation Council of Russia, in 1996. The friendly relations between the two countries have been strengthened to some extent by the goodwill delegation of members of Myanmar Hluttaws that have been set up according to the new system.

The Myanmar delegation led by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann called on Speaker Mr. Gryzlov of Duma at the State of Duma in Moscow on 2 June. The two sides held frank relations. The Speaker of the State of Duma said that on behalf of Duma of the Russian Federation, he gave a warm welcome to the Myanmar delegation led by the speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw that had accepted his invitation immediately; that he was pleased that Myanmar had held a multiparty democracy general election freely and peacefully and the first sessions of the Hluttaws; that he welcomed the goodwill visit, regarding it as a visit for exchange of views and boosting cooperation between the parliaments of the two countries; and that the delegation could held discussions everywhere at any time.

Speaker of Pyithu Hluttaw Thura U Shwe Mann

extended greetings and expressed thanks for warm welcome to the delegation. He explained the purpose of the goodwill visit, and made clarification to political development in Myanmar.

The Speaker of the State of Duma said that he was a member of the Security Council of the Russian Federation and always had opportunities to watch Myanmar-Russian relations at the meetings; that he was glad to learn the political development in Myanmar; that he wished Myanmar a greater success in the political sphere; that the trade value between the two countries was still small, but was growing gradually; that he reckoned that the two countries needed to speed up bilateral cooperation; that bilateral economic cooperation was of great importance; that two countries could cooperate in the geological survey and exploration of gas and minerals; and that the State of Duma could push the Russian government to boosting bilateral cooperation.

The Pyithu Hluttaw speaker said that he believed that boosting Myanmar-Russia trade and economic cooperation; that while in service the two sides should try hard for greater success; that Myanmar was interested in cooperation in the oil and gas exploration and mining; that Myanmar could sell agricultural produce, marine products, forest products and teak; that raw rubber and garments are also included; that refined oil and fertilizers could be imported; that regarding the world tourism industry, Myanmar had pleasant and beautiful sea beach resorts in which Russians took interest and invited them to the tourist attractions; that during the visit, the Myanmar delegation would meet with the Russian Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry at its invitation; that the Myanmar delegation also comprised relevant businessmen as well as Hluttaw members who could hold discussions about trade; that Myanmar will work closely with Russia in the interest of the nation and the people; that the nation will learn the experiences of Russia; that the two countries can boost bilateral cooperation by exchanging views in the culture and sports fields apart from the political, economic and science and technology sectors; and that boosting cooperation between the two governments must be encouraged.

In his talks, the Pyithu Hluttaw speaker said that the new government will keep exercising the independent, active and non-aligned foreign policy; that he thanked Russia for standing on the Myanmar side in the field of international relations; that he praises and honours the Russian Federation for its leading role in world peace and security issues; that according to the Myanmar's foreign policy, the nation will participate in international affairs with congenial countries; and that Myanmar is dealing with international affairs in an honest and frank way. Then, the two sides held frank talks about Hluttaw affairs.

The State of Duma of the Russian Federation is part of the Federal Assembly of Russia. In Russia, senate is called Federation Council of Russia. The State of Duma was formed in 1906. It is the first elected parliament in Russia. The first to fourth sessions of the State of Duma were held from 1906 to 1917. The time of Tsar Monarchy met its end in 1917. Later, Supreme Soviet was formed with two legislative parliaments, which became the legislative body of highest power in the country.

The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics collapsed into pieces in 1991. The nation saw a new constitution in the time of President Boris Yeltsin in 1993. The State of Duma was reconstituted for the fifth time in place of Supreme Soviet. The State of Duma is in its five-year term with 450 elected MPs: 315 seats from United Russia led by Mr Putin, 57 from Communist Party; 40 from Liberal Democratic Party; and 38 from Fair Russia Party. In the December 2007 election, near 70 million of 109 million eligible citizens cast their votes, accounting for 63.7 per cent. Eleven parties stood for election. The parties that won less than 7% of votes are not allowed to stand on, and join suitable parties.

The State of Duma is constituted with 32 committees, some of which are related to the functions of the ministries, and some of which are separate work committees like work committee. Major tasks are the vetting of legislative cases and laws, and drafting, revoking, replacing and amending bills of respective sectors.

We learnt a lot about the State of Duma during our visit. The Myanmar delegation held discussions and compared notes not only at the State of Duma but also at the luncheon hosted by the vice speaker. The Russian ambassador to Myanmar also attended the luncheon.

On 28 June 2010, we called at the Federation Council of Russia. There, we received a warm welcome from Vice Speaker Mr. Shtyrov who exchanged views with the delegation. (The post for the speaker is vacant currently.)

The Federation Council of Russia and the State of Duma are under the Federal Assembly of Russia. The Russian Federation is made up of 83 Federal Subjects, from which two MPs each are elected to the parliament, like Amyotha Hluttaw in Myanmar to which 12 representatives each are elected from Regions and States.

Two MPs each to the 83 Federal Subjects are one from the legislative body and one from the executive body.

The Federation Council of Russia is composed of 16 committees and 7 commissions that are responsible to it. The functions of the Federation Council of Russia are not as many as that of the State of Duma. Mostly, the State of Duma makes final decisions. Activities associated with party affairs are prohibited in the Federation Council of Russia. We also studied the functions of the Federation Council of Russia. If the Federation Council of Russia does not agree with a bill approved by the State of Duma, they form a combined committee for talks, and the case can be presented to the two parliaments for voting. A bill the Federation Council of Russia refuses to approve can be approved if two-thirds of the MPs of the State of Duma vote for it.

St. Petersburg, a federal region of the Russian Federation as well as an ancient city, is a modern and developed economic hub. We visited the State of Duma of St. Petersburg, which was established by Peter, the Great, over 300 years ago (in 1703). In 1917 when the rule of Tsar Monarch was over, the capital was moved to Moscow.

There, Speaker of St. Petersburg State of Duma Mr. V. I Tyulpanou welcomed the Myanmar delegation with open arms. The talks of the two sides focused on boosting cooperation between the parliaments of the two countries. In particular, they presented a proposal to boost cooperation with organizations like Yangon Region Hluttaw.

We learnt that St. Petersburg State of Duma is constituted with 50 MPs from 50 constituencies; that every week, 18 offices of MPs of the State of Duma in St. Petersburg hold talks with voters, ascertain their wishes and hear their proposals, which are then submitted to sessions of St. Petersburg State of Duma for talks. It is noteworthy that MPs meet regular with the people they have voted them.

With the palaces, edifices and museums built in the times of Russian monarchs from Tsar to Peter The Great and Queen Catherine, St. Petersburg sees a large stream of European tourists.

As scheduled by the host country, the Myanmar delegation held talks on bilateral trade. While in Moscow, we called at the Russian Merchants Association. The meeting was also attended by Russian businessmen who are dealing with Myanmar. The two MPs of the Myanmar delegation are from the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry. So, we could reply to all queries raised by the Russian side. The Pyithu Hluttaw speaker and members held a wide range of talks including direct air flights between the two countries, schedules for foreign tourists, investments in the mining sector, exploration of oil and gas, export of agriculture produce, foreign products and marine products, and investments in garment factories. Similarly, some Russian entrepreneurs held informal meetings with Hluttaw members. Russian entrepreneurs arranged a boat trip for us in the River niber in St. Petersburg. On the trip, we held talks about bilateral trade at dinner. We noticed signs of marked increase in bilateral trade value. Holding discussions, we sought ways and means to sold possible problems. The meeting

reached an agreement that Myanmar with sea beach resorts and other tourist destinations should try to draw more attention from Russian tourists.

The goodwill visit not only enhanced the Myanmar-Russia friendly relations but also created good opportunities for relations and exchange of views between the parliaments of the two countries. The experiences of balanced exercise of the three powers of sovereignty: legislative power, executive power and judicial power are invaluable. We also gained golden opportunity to observe many functions of their parliaments such as duties of MPs in the Federation Council of Russian and the State of Duma, relations between MPs and voters, undertakings of MPs, and reciprocal relations. We also studied the functions of parliamentary committees and offices that are crucial for parliamentary proceedings. We could create opportunities for boosting friendly relations and economic cooperation between the two countries. All in all, the goodwill visit yielded fruitful results to both countries.

Speaking on the occasion, Union Minister U Kyaw Hsan said that the subcommittee held the meeting to successfully realize the adopted plan for development of rural socio-economy. He said that in accord with the constitution, He said that in accord with the constitution, a new democratic nation is being built with the facilities of political, economic, social, education and health sectors. Rural development and poverty alleviation is one of many tasks of the new government. The Rural Development and Poverty Alleviation Central Committee headed by the President has adopted eight tasks and is carrying out them. All walks of life are to work in concert in their respective sectors in undertaking the eight tasks, which are really necessary.

The Rural Socio-economic Development Subcommittee is to make utmost efforts for successful implementation of the tasks. Only when socio-economic life of the rural people develops, will the productive capability of the nation improve. The subcommittee is to take responsibility for undertaking six wide and important fields. All the subcommittee members are to consider development of six sectors on a wider scale and to cooperate with each other.

All ministries, respective region and state governments, district, township and Union level subcommittees are to hold coordination for implementing the tasks in the respective sectors in line with the Action Plans.

The subcommittee will carry out the tasks to realize the full success of free compulsory primary education system in education sector, to reduce the deliberate ending in education, to enable all students who passed matriculation examinations in rural areas to enjoy tertiary education; in health sector, to enable rural people to receive medical treatment within

Mongolia might be home for spent nuclear fuel: media

ULAN BATOR, 21 July—Japan, the United States, and Mongolia had agreed to establish spent nuclear fuel storage facilities in Mongolia, local media said Wednesday.

According to a draft agreement, that is likely to meet strong local opposition, Mongolia would set up locations for a nuclear fuel production

and spent fuel disposal cycle, in which Mongolia would export uranium fuel and provides facilities to store the resulting waste.

The International Atomic Energy Agency may play a role in providing technical support to Mongolia in establishing nuclear waste facilities in the country, according to the draft agreement.

Mongolia had contacted the United Arab Emirates about establishing such an export and disposal cycle, local media reported.

Reports of nuclear waste disposal have previously aroused fierce opposition in the country, despite the Mongolian government having repeatedly denied the reports.—Xinhua

5.4-magnitude quake hits south of Panama

BEIJING, 21 July—An earthquake measuring 5.4 on the Richter scale jolted south of Panama at 15:51:30 GMT on Wednesday, the US Geological Survey, monitored here, said.

The epicentre, with a depth of 17.60 km, was initially determined to be at 7.0785 degrees north latitude and 82.2921 degrees west longitude.

Hong Kong Observatory says 6.2-magnitude quake hits Solomon Islands

HONG KONG, 21 July—Hong Kong Observatory said an earthquake measuring 6.2 on the Richter scale hit Solomon Islands on Thursday.

Nine dead, four injured in vehicle collision on east China highway

WENZHOU, 21 July—The death toll in a vehicle collision accident occurred on a highway section in east China's Zhejiang Province Thursday morning has risen to nine, as police found one more body from the distorted van truck.

The overloaded van bumped into the rear of a heavy haul trailer at around 4:49 a.m. on the highway linking Ningbo and Wenzhou in the province.

All of the casualties occurred on the van. The 3-seat van carried 13 people with five squeezing in the driver's cabin and eight hiding in the carriage compartment.

The accident site remains cordoned off, as police are clearing steel bars dropped from the heavily-loaded trailer. Cause of the accident is still under investigation.

Dutch police arrests four in FBI hacker probe

THE HAGUE, 21 July—Four members of the group Anonymous Hackers were arrested in the Netherlands in an investigation launched by the US Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

Fourteen others were arrested in the meanwhile within the United States, and one was captured in Britain in the operation, Dutch Press agency ANP reported on Wednesday.

The FBI investi-

gation was focusing on an attack upon the Internet payment system PayPal.

The hacker group allegedly conducted attacks on PayPal after the company refused to channel payments to the whistleblower website Wikileaks.

Anonymous claimed to be responsible for attacks on websites including credit card companies Visa and MasterCard.

France seizes 250 kg cocaine

PARIS, 21 July—French customs have seized 250 kilogrammes of cocaine on a ship at the port of Dunkerque in northern France, local media reported on Wednesday.

The drug was hidden in the hull of a Liberian-flagged ship, which has been the target of the customs for a while. According to Le Figaro, several crewmen were taken into

custody when lawmen discovered the cocaine on Sunday.

The value of the haul was estimated between 5 to 10 million euros (7.11-14.22 million US dollars).

Early this week, French customs have snapped 175 kilogrammes of cocaine in Pyrenees-Orientales, a southern department near the border with Spain.—MNA/Xinhua

Hurricane Dora reaches Cat 4 strength off Mexico

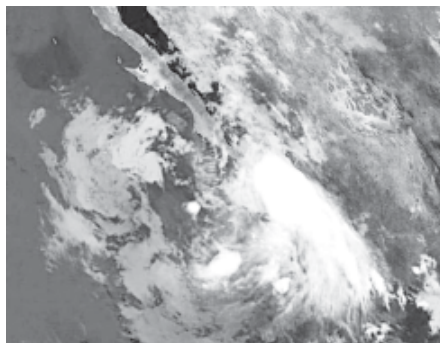
ACAPULCO, 21 July—Hurricane Dora rapidly grew into a Category 4 storm off Mexico's Pacific coast Wednesday while keeping out to sea and threatening coastal areas only with rain and tropical storm-strength winds.

The US National Hurricane Centre in Miami said late Wednesday that the storm's top sustained winds had reached 135 mph (215 kph). It said Dora's centre was about 220 miles (355 kilometres) south-southwest of Lazaro Cardenas and moving west-northwest at 15 mph (24 kph).

The fourth hurricane of the eastern Pacific season was forecast to stay offshore as it moved parallel to the coast for the next day or so. It could strengthen more before weakening begins Friday, forecasters said.

Mexican authorities issued a tropical storm watch from Lazaro Cardenas to Cabo Corrientes, meaning tropical storm conditions were possible within 12 to 24 hours.

The hurricane's outer bands brought rains to much of Mexico's southern coast, including the resort city of Acapulco. Police walked the beaches advising swimmers about the risk of strong waves.

In the Atlantic, Tropical Storm Cindy formed well out to sea and posed no threat to land. Its centre was 800 miles (1,290 kilometres) east-northeast of Bermuda.

Tropical Storm Bret was forecast to weaken to a tropical depression by Thursday as it moved northeast away from the Bahamas and well off the US Atlantic coast. Bret's maximum sustained winds were 40 mph (65 kph). Its center was about 235 miles (380 kilometres) south-southeast of Cape Hatteras, North Carolina, and 455 miles (735 kilometres) west of Bermuda.—Internet

Mexico on high alert for strengthened hurricane

MEXICO CITY, 21 July—Mexican authorities went on high alert Wednesday as Hurricane Dora upgraded into a Category 4 storm off the country's Pacific coast. The Mexican National Meteorological Centre, citing initial reports, said the hurricane had caused flooding in the southern states of Guerrero, Oaxaca and Chiapas, resulting in some damage. There were no immediate reports of casualties, but local residents were urged to be cautious, and Mexican emergency personnel had been put on full alert. The Miami-based US National Hurricane Centre (NHC) reported that at 5 pm local time (2200 GMT), Dora was located about 300 km southwest of Guerrero's Ixtapa-Zihuatanejo beach resort, and packed winds of over 215 km per hour.

"Some additional strengthening is forecast during the next day or so," the NHC said, adding the extremely dangerous major hurricane is "likely to cause life-threatening" conditions along the coast. The current forecast did not see a landfall as Dora raged northwest, but the storm was already whipping up waves as high as 3.96 metres off Mexico's southwestern shores.—Xinhua

Saudi Arabia bans iPhones, Samsung tablets in security areas

RIYADH, 21 July—The Saudi interior ministry recently announced that the iPhone and Samsung Galaxy Tab will no longer be allowed inside the country's security institutions, *Al-Arabiya* news channel reported Wednesday. The Saudi interior ministry cited concerns that these gadgets may be easily infiltrated via hacking,

Al-Arabiya reported. Also, IT specialists and experts reiterated the ministry's security concerns and agreed that these gadgets could potentially impinge on the privacy of people and institutions.

Al-Arabiya said that Saudi Arabia is not the first country that issues the ban, as the United States and a number of European countries have done the same at security organizations. It is not clear why the Saudi ministry think that these two gadgets in particular are more susceptible to an attack than any other smartphone or tablet.

Nearly two dozen dead as US heat wave moves east

CHICAGO, 21 July—A searing heat wave in the central and southern United States has killed at least 22 people this week, and forecasters on Wednesday said the heat was moving east and could last for weeks.

The National Weather Service said 141 million people in more than two dozen states were under a heat advisory or warning because of the soaring temperatures. The country's midsection has been scorched off and on since late May. In Wichita, Kansas, forecasters warned temperatures would hit at least 100 degrees Fahrenheit (38 degrees Celsius) every day through Tuesday. "It's just

draining, physically draining," said Chris Vaccaro, a Weather Service spokesman.

The inferno moved into the mid-Atlantic states. Temperatures reached above 90 degrees F (32 degrees C) in Washington, DC and were expected to hit 100 degrees on Thursday. Meteorologists said the heat wave could last into August over much of the eastern United States. Hospitals in Wichita treated 25 heat-related illnesses, according to the National Weather Service. In Des Moines, Iowa, 16 people have been hospitalized because of this week's high temperatures.—MNA/Reuters

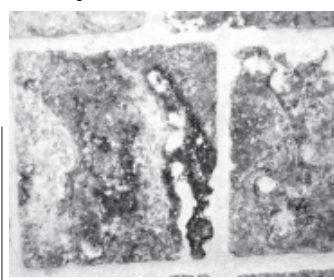
Hallucinating men called 911

“We have a young manager who is somewhat on the same wavelength with the players. This is wonderful to the team,” said Cole, who is rated one of the best players in the world in his position.

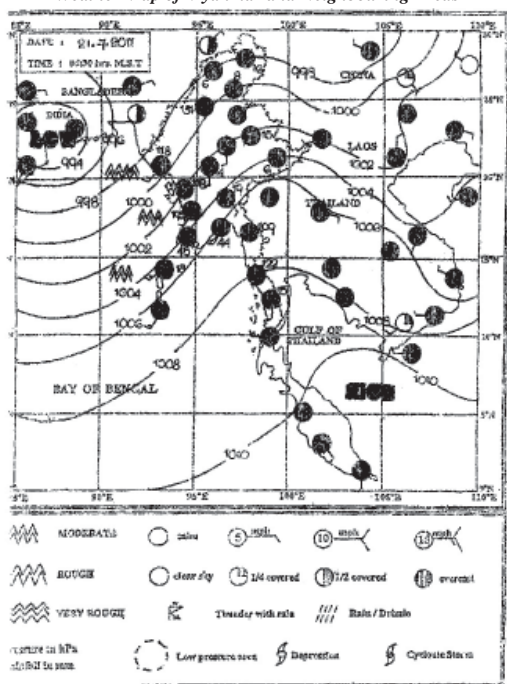

Husbands happier in marriage if wives are skinnier

KNOXCILLE, 21 July—Husbands are more satisfied initially and wives are more satisfied over time when wives weigh less than their husbands, a US study finds.

Andrea L. Meltzer and James K. McNulty of the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and colleagues say the four-year longitudinal study of 169 newlywed couples addressed the question of body mass index for the trajectory of marital satisfaction.

The findings suggest that a duel perspective may be more appropriate than an individual one for understanding how partners' qualities shape established relationships such as marriage.—Xinhua

China's telecommunication sector revenue grows 10.1 pct in H1

BEIJING, 21 July—China's telecommunication sector revenue grew 10.1 percent in the first half, surpassing that of GDP for the first time since 2007, a senior official said Thursday.

"A lasting sound macro economy creates a favorable environment for rapid growth in the telecommunications sector." Zhang Feng, director of the telecom development department of the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT) said at a press conference.

Mobile phones users increased by 6.15 million and broadband Internet users by 1.55 million in the first half, he said.

He said Chinese people were more willing to spend on telecommunications services as incomes of urban and rural residents increased 7.5 percent and 13.7 percent respectively in the first six months from the same period last year.

Upgraded information network infrastructure and transition to an integrated information service industry had also contributed to the growth in revenue, Zhang said.

Telecommunications providers invested 143.1 billion yuan (about 22.2 billion US dollars) in upgrading infrastructures in the first half, an increase of 56.5 percent year-on-year, according to MIIT figures.

NAY PYI TAW, 21 July—To bring about more human resources in the health field is crucial for providing international health care with modern medicine and technologies, said Union Minister for Health Dr Pe Thet Khin at the opening of the 9th Seminar on Medical Education at the Ministry of Health here this morning.

As of 2001, the medical and medicine-related universities under the Ministry of Health have been receiving a growing number of students with the opening of new universities to meet the nation's demand for human resource development, he said.

In pursuance of human resource development in the medical field, the



ministry has been setting up new and renovating old institutions, along with providing pedagogical aids, training students, replenishing lab equipment, and e-libraries and appointing more teachers to improve the medical education, he said.

Moreover, the ministry is creating opportunities for students to pursue higher subjects inside the nation and to attend post-graduate courses and seminars abroad with a view to sharpening the abilities of medical professionals, he noted.

The government is opening more post-graduate courses at home, spending huge funds, so producing enough post-graduate experts is high in the list of priorities, he said, adding that syllabuses of pre- and post-graduate courses will be reviewed and reformed. (See page 9)
