PITTSBURGH, 21 Aug-The flash flooding that killed four people and forced others to swim to safety or climb onto car roofs was a freak accident caused by heavy rainfall that overwhelmed the sewer system just as rush-hour traffic clogged low-lying city streets, officials said Saturday.

A mother and her two daughters died in Friday's flood after becoming trapped in their vehicle and rising water pinned it to a tree. Another woman's body was washed into the Allegheny River, where she was found Saturday morning. Back-to-back storms pounded the city with 3 to 4 inches of rain. The water drained rapidly onto Washington Boulevard, a main street near the Allegheny River on the city's east side, with a force too great for a pair of sewer pipes 9 feet in diameter. NATO drone crashes in east Afghanistan

JALALABAD, 21 Aug—A pilotless plane of NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) has crashed in Nangarhar Province in east Afghanistan, spokesman for the provincial government said on Sunday. "An ISAF drone crashed in Naranj Bagh neighbourhood in provincial capital Jalalabad City at around 9:00 pm local time on Saturday," Ahmad Zia Abdulzai told Xinhua

Abdulzai also said the incident caused no loss of life on the ground according to initial investigation. Meanwhile, purported Taleban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid told local media via telephone from undisclosed location that the militants shot down the drone.

Trio roadside bombs kill seven Afghans, wounds 16

KABUL, 21 Aug-A string of three roadside bombings organized by militants in the militancyhit Afghanistan claimed the lives of seven people including four civilians and injuring 16 others on Saturday, Afghan officials confirmed.

In the latest wave of using roadside bombs as lethal weapon, the militants planted a mine on a road in Helmand Province, 555 km south of Afghan capital Kabul, leaving four civilians dead.

"A mine planted by militants struck a civilian car in Naw Zad District at around 12:30 pm local time (0800 GMT) leaving all the four commuters aboard dead," a Press release issued by Helmand's provincial administration said.

Earlier, two more identical incidents in the western Herat and eastern Nangarhar Provinces claimed the lives of two and one person respectively and injuring 16 others.

The American Academy of Family Physicians mentions these suggestions when using a nasal spray:

- * It may take as long as two weeks before you notice the spray's full effect.
- * At least once per week, wash the canister that delivers the spray.
- * Before you spray, sniff air into each nostril to allow the medication to go deep inside the nose.
- * Aim the spray straight toward the back of your head.
- * If used correctly, the spray shouldn't leak from your nose or down your throat.
- * Stop using the spray for a few days if you have a nosebleed or feel pain in the nose.

Did the market get it wrong about Hewlett-Packard?

WASHINGTON, 21 Aug-Hewlett-Packard has announced that it will either spin off or sell its PC and mobile computing business units. After this announcement, the market took HP's stock price down 20 percent. My question is: did the market get it wrong about Hewlett-Packard?

IDC and other tech industry observers will note that while Apple has roughly 15 percent of market share of unit sales of personal computers, Apple has roughly 90 percent of all earnings created by sales of personal computers. Apple has purposefully avoided the low-margin commoditized segments of the personal computer market. The same can said about the mobile computing segments.

Renowned management theorist Peter Drucker said that only two things matter in a company: innovation and marketing; everything else was a (commoditized) expense. Innovation provides for differentiate products and services; marketing conveys the value of that differentiation.

Without a clear sense of product differentiation in the personal computer and mobile computing segments, products will be seen as commoditized. One should expect few profits without innovation and differentiation.

So, was HP's decision a good one? I would say yes. Capital that is currently allocated to these low-margin segments is a waste. Redeploying such capital seems smart. Now, what about HP's purchase of Palm. Yes, it's wasted money. But, it's a sunk cost. HP's management must look forward not back. It's about admitting that they tried something, it didn't work, now they're moving on. With HP selling at half of its 52-week high, it seems to be a buy .- Internet

WASHINGTON, 21 Aug-If or when intelligent extraterrestrials discover us, it's anybody's guess what they'll do. They might befriend us. They might eat us.

As Carl Sagan once noted, they might find amusement in some talent we have that they lack and use us as entertainment, just as we keep sea lions in captivity because of their remarkable ability to balance rubber balls on their noses.

A11 of these scenarios and more are fleshed out in a new article in the journal Acta Astro-nautica by researchers at Pennsylvania State University.

One possibility they've raised has garnered more attention than any other: An extraterrestrial civilization might notice our planet by detecting changes in the spectral signature of Earth-the light radiated by our planet and atmosphere-caused by



And they might frown funding their research.) upon our behavior. The group's thinking

goes like this: From the rate of change of the chemical composition in our atmosphere, the aliens will deduce our rapid expansion and, because of that, possibly view us as a threat. thinking we'll soon pursue resources on other worlds."If [they] doubt that our course can be changed, then they may seek to preemptively destroy our civilization in order to protect other civilizations from us," the researchers write. (Several media outlets have inaccurately reported that NASA is behind the new report. One of its authors, astrobiologist Shawn Domagal-Goldman, recently began working at NASA, but wrote the paper with former colleague Seth Baum and others at Penn State, whose institution was

New report: Aliens will fix Global Warming ... or Kill us

"This is a highly unlikely scenario," said Jacob Haqq-Misra, a meteorologist and astrobiologist at Penn State and a co-author of the new paper. "We're not really saying this is going to happen, but it's a possibility.

The motivation for explaining this possibility is that we are doing this technology already. We are looking at other planets and their spectral signatures."

Haqq-Misra explained that astronomers are currently capable of detecting spectral changes in light coming from large (Jupiter-size) planets up to 200 light-years away. In galactic terms, this is a very small neighbourhood (the Milky Way is 100,000 light-years across). However, more advanced civilizations would be capable of seeing much farther.

Bizzy app brings personalized local recommendations

NEW YORK, 21 Aug-Online marketing services company Reach-Local has recently expanded from its service targeting small to medium sized businesses with mobile consumer app Bizzy. Bizzy is an app for sharing and finding local businesses, particularly restaurants and bars. Instead of a "check-in" as on apps like Four-square, Bizzy has "check-outs."

The app is designed to encourage more reviews than other sites such as Yelp. On those sites the proportion of people who write reviews is relatively small. Bizzy is designed to encourage more participation through quick reviews with buttons ("Love it," "OK" or "No Thx") that people can click instead of writing a review. In tech lingo that's called "frictionless." People can also upload a photo of a dish as a sort of review.

It's also supposed to make it easier to find trusted recommendations than services like Yelp, which have many reviews but do not tell you which people have the sames tastes as you, Shamia savs.

Interaction between friends is also built into the app. People can view their stream of friends' activity in different restaurants, and then add it to a "trial list" to remember for later.

Then when people check-out the places that their friends have recommended, the original person gets a notification that a friend also liked the place, a kind of real-time feedback that encourages more checkouts, says Zorik Gordon, CEO of ReachLocal.

Cornell researchers working to scrub fake reviews off the Web

WASHINGTON, 21 Aug-A team of researchers at Cornell recently finished a paper concerning the development of а computer algorithm to determine if a review is fake or authentic. After publishing the research, many specialty travel sites approached the group to determine how this algorithm could be developed to weed out paid reviews. Some brands and companies covertly

use sites like Amazon's Mechanical Turk, Fivver and other freelance sites to build a library of positive reviews for cash. These freelancer meccas are designed to pump out results quickly, thus are exploited to create a plethora of bloated 5-star reviews to inflate the quality of products or services.

In order to establish common elements within fake reviews, the Cornell team was authorized to

the creation of 400 positive reviews of Chicago hotels. The only stipulation was that the review was to be fake. After combing through TripAdvisor, they specifically choose 400 reviews that they believed to be true and mixed them with the fake entries. These entries were shown to a group of judges, but they couldn't tell the difference between authentic and fake —Internet



Somali pirates hijack Indian ship with 21 crew off Oman

MUMBAI, 21 Aug-Somali pirates hijacked a chemical-oil tanker with 21 Indian sailors on board Saturday from near an Omani port, although the exact location was unconfirmed.

India's Directorate General of Shipping said the Fairchem Bogey, managed by Mumbaibased Anglo-Eastern Ship Management, was hijacked while anchored in Salalah port. A Salalah-based shipping source said the vessel was being loaded with methanol when it was seized.

The port's operator, APM Terminals, however, said pirates boarded the vessel while it was two miles off the coast of Oman, awaiting a berth, and comandeered it toward Somalia.

Andrew Mwangura, shipping editor of The Somalia Report, who is based in the Kenyan port City of Mombasa told Reuters the position of the hijacking showed the ship was inside Oman's territorial waters.

"It was captured six nautical miles south of Salalah so it is definitely inside Oman," he said,

adding that a country's territorial waters usually stretch out 12 miles into the sea.

"If it is Somali pirates, it means they have a mother ship they are operating with. The high season for piracy has just started."

The end of the southwest monsoon winds in August marks the end of very turbulent high seas In the Gulf of Aden, making it easier for Somali pirates with small vessels to sail out and attack ships, Mwangura said.





Murder and robbery exposed

The authorities concerned then investigated Aung Kyaw Phyo, aged 21, living on Bo Myat Tun Street in No. 3 Ward of Kayan Township and Zaw Lwin Oo (a) Zaw Lwin, aged 23, from Shwebosu Village, who were under suspicion of the murder and robbery, and found that Aung Kyaw Phyo was a pupil of the victim and often slept for nights at her house from 8-grade to matric. On the day the murder happened, he went to the victim's house for two times by motorbike. Zaw Lwin Oo was in need of money to repair his motorbike and Aung Kyaw

Phyo took him to the victim's house. Aung Kyaw Phyo first got into the house ahead of Zaw Lwin Oo shouting to the victim as "Teacher". Daw Hmwe Hmwe Khin who was in the bedroom shouted "thief, thief" as she saw him all of a sudden. Zaw Lwin Oo ran into her, covered her mouth and she fell down and died. They then moved her into the chair, wrapped her neck with red rubber band, made the victim appear to commit suicide by hanging.

Magnitude 7.5 quake hits Vanuatu in Pacific

WASHINGTON, 21 Aug-A powerful magni-tude 7.5 earthquake struck off the Pacific island nation of Vanuatu, the US Geological Survey reported Saturday.

It said the quake, which struck at 3:55 am local time on Sunday (12:55 pm EDT on Saturday), was centred 38 miles southwest of the town of Port-Vila and was quite shallow, at a depth of 25.2 miles.

The Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre said the major quake had not triggered a Pacific-wide tsunami but said: "Earthquakes of this size sometimes generate local tsunamis that can be destructive along coasts located within a hundred kilometres (80 miles) of the earthquake epicentre." There was no immediate information of any damage

'Some strengthening is forecast during the next 48 hours and Irene could become a hurricane on Monday," the NHC said.-Reuters

One sargeant was rescued alive after Wednesday's accident and the other nine died, including Vice Admiral Luis Berrios Pardo. Searchers earlier found the other five bodies.

The wreckage of the Bell 412 helicopter was found off the coast of eastern Anzoategui state.

Two shot in SF parking lot after Raiders-49ers game

SAN FRANCISCO, 21 Aug— A man wearing a shirt slamming the San Francisco 49ers was seriously wounded as gunfire erupted in the parking lot after the team's NFL preseason game, while another man sustained lesser injuries in an earlier shooting, police said.

The violence occurred after the 49ers' 17-3 victory Saturday night over the Oakland Raiders at Candlestick Park, police Sgt Michael Andraychak said. A 24year-old man was treated at San Francisco General Hospital for life-threatening injuries, and a 20-yearold man was hospitalized with less serious wounds, Andraychack told *The Associated Press*. Their names were not released.

Police Sgt Frank Harrell that the 24-year-old man, who was wearing a T-shirt referring to the 49ers with an obscenity, was shot two to four times in the stomach, according to reports in the Oakland Tribune and the San Francisco Chronicle. He drove his truck to a gate and stumbled to security, Harrell said.

The other man was shot before that in the parking lot and had superficial face injuries, Harrell said.

Over half of Australians with hearing loss do nothing to correct

CANBERRA, 21 Aug—Almost one in five Australians suffer from hearing loss, with more than half of them have not done anything to correct the problem, a survey found on Sunday.

The Newspoll survey on 1,200 adults with hearing difficulties, commissioned by implant maker Cochlear to mark the start of Hearing Awareness Week on Sunday, found that 52 percent of those with hearing loss have not done anything to correct the problem.

More than 40 percent had not even seen a doctor or health professional about it.

China becomes South Africa's biggest export destination

BEIJING, 21 Aug—China became South Africa's top export destination at the end of 2010 due to strengthened bilateral trade links, according to South African ambassador Bheki Langa.

Investment between the two countries surged to nearly seven billion US dollars at the end of last year, the ambassador told *Xinhua* in a recent interview.

China Customs statistics show that trade between China and South Africa totaled 25.6 billion US dollars throughout 2010. Imports from South Africa reached 14.8 billion US dollars during the same period.

Langa said what South Africa exported to China were mainly primary products and they hope to export products with more added-value to the Chinese market in future.

South Africa's abundant mineral resources will provide good opportunities for potential investors in China, he added.







More than 50 rockets fired from Gaza, Israeli killed

GAZA, 21 Aug-An Israeli man was killed on Saturday in a rocket strike launched from Gaza, medics said, the latest death in a three-day spasm of violence that has killed more than 30 people.

Israeli security officials said seven other people were wounded, including two children, by more than 50 rockets fired from the Hamas-ruled territory Saturday. In Gaza, an Israeli air strike wounded a Palestinian man seriously, medics said.

A militant group called the Popular Resistance Committees (PRC) claimed responsibility for the deadly rocket strike at a house in the southern City of Beersheba. Hamas's armed wing claimed responsibility for another attack that destroyed a home in the town of Ofakim.

It was the first time in months that Hamas had declared its involvement in rocket attacks against Israel, after largely observing a de facto truce since the end of a three-week offensive in January 2009.

Brazil claim impressive fifth title BOGOTA, 21 Aug-Brazil claimed their fifth FIFA U-20 World Cup crown on Saturday, beating Portugal after extra time in Bogota, the first time they have won the competition since 2003.

> The FIFA U-20 World Cup Colombia 2011 ended as it began, with rain teeming down in prelude to the match for third place at El Campin in Bogota.

> And for the second time in the competition, following on from their fightback in the Round of 16 against Cameroon, Mexico came from behind to beat France and take third place on the

Les Bleuets did not go away too disappointed, however, having completed their best ever campaign in the competition, despite conceding 12 goals, the joint-worst defensive record alongside Costa Rica and Guatemala.

The battle for the bronze medal was followed by the tournament showpiece, in which Brazil claimed their fifth title in the category, avenging the penalty shoot-out defeat they suffered against Portugal 20 years ago and erasing the memory of their loss on penalties to Ghana in the Egypt 2009 final.
