Second regular session of first Pyithu Hluttaw continues for third day

Questions raised and answered, proposals and bills submitted for approval

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Aug—The second regular session of the first Pyithu Hluttaw continued for the third day at the Pyithu Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Building, here, at

10 am today, attended by Speaker of the Pyithu Hluttaw Thura U Shwe Mann and 387 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives.

At the session, Union Minister for Border

Affairs Maj-Gen Thein Htay replied to the query on Nationalities Youth Resource Development Degree College raised by U Kyaw Myint (a) U Po Tok of Momeik Constitu-

ency. The Union Minister said that Nationalities Youth Resource Development Degree College prioritizes the eligible national race youths from border areas with lack of development to attend the courses. The degree college is striving for nurturing more youths year after year. Priority is given to selection of the youths who passed matriculation examination from remote areas and from 29 national youths and border region development training schools.

The degree college prescribes the qualifications for the youths who must be national race and is fluent in ethnic language, must pass the matriculation examination. They must not be over 20 years on 30 June in academic year. They must be single. They must be citizenship scrutiny card holders. The

candidate to the degree college must not be pursuing higher education of universities including University of Distance Education. They have to enter the personal test of the scrutiny board. The students must pass the medical test. The entrance scrutiny board chaired by the Deputy Minister for Border Affairs is systematically carrying out the tasks. In 2011-2012 academic year, arrangements have been made to admit 200 more arts and science students and 200 more engineering students.

Union Minister for Rail Transportation U Aung Min replied to two queries on Myanmar Railways raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

With regard to the question on Gokhtaik railroad viaduct raised by U Kyaw Myint of Nawngkhio Constitu-

ency, the Union Minister replied that according to the inspection of JICA and Myanmar Railways, the bridge is in good condition. If the bridge is maintained regularly, the facility can be used for the long term. Myanmar Railways is carrying out annual inspection and maintenance for the bridge. Moreover, specific technician teams of Myanmar Railways check the bridge. Not to be stopped the runs of train, a reserved railroad has been constructed downstream of the Gokhtaik Viaduct. Yearly, funds will be allotted for the facility and regular inspection and maintenance will be undertaken.

The Union Minister then replied to a query raised by U Myint Thu of Dagon Myothit (East) Constituency on upgrading passenger coaches,

Israeli airstrike kills Gaza militant after ceasefire

GAZA, 24 Aug—An Israeli airstrike killed a Palestinian militant in Rafah town in southern Gaza Strip early Wednesday, witnesses and security sources said.

The missile attack killed a member of the military wing of the Islamic Jihad movement and wounded two others, said Adham Abu Selmia, a spokesman for the medical services.

The incident came a day after the Islamic Hamas movement, which controls Gaza, announced that a ceasefire has been reached with Israel. The agreement aimed at ending four days of cross-border violence that flared up after Israel accused Gaza militants of being behind deadly attacks in the Red Sea resort of Eilat Thursday. By this strike, the number of Palestinians killed since Thursday rises to 16.—Xinhua

The forest fire broke out near coal mines in the area and caused damage to 5 hectares of agricultural land and 15 hectares of nearby pine forests.

An investigation is underway to determine the cause of the fire. Operations are ongoing to further cool the area by spraying water and a team of fire fighters will remain stationed in the area for 2 further days, the Denizli forestry region manager said.

Forest fires are a regular occurrence in the southern Aegean and Mediterranean regions of Turkey and neighbouring countries during the hot and dry summer season.—Xinhua

Afghan police kill 14 militants, detain 35

KABUL, 24 Aug—Afghanistan said in a Press release issued here on Wednesday. “Afghan National Police with the assistance of the Afghan army and Coalition forces have killed 14 armed militants and captured 35 others

during 16 joint and independent operations across the country over the past 24 hours,” the statement asserted.

Three more militants sustained injuries, it said. However, it did not say if there were any casualties on the troops.

These operations had been carried out in Parwan, Kandahar, Helmand, Maidan Wardak, Logar, Khost, Ghazni, Paktiya and Herat provinces during which a large number of light and heavy weapons had also been sized, according to the statement. Taleban militants fighting Afghan and NATO-led troops have yet to make comment.—Internet

ISTANBUL, 24 Aug—Fire-fighting teams on Monday managed to extinguish a forest fire in Turkey's Aegean Province of Denizli, a local news agency reported.

A team of 100 people assisted by 3 helicopters and 3 bulldozers managed to put out the blaze that

Teheran has put on display a new Iranian-made cruise missile, which it says has a range of 124 miles and is capable of destroying a warship.

The cruise missile, designed for sea-based targets, is the latest addition to Iran's growing arsenal.

President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad attended a ceremony

Tuesday that showed off the weapon, dubbed “Ghader,” or “Capable” in Farsi.

Iranian State TV says it can travel at low altitudes and has a lighter weight and smaller dimensions.

Iran has an array of short and medium-range ballistic missiles capable of hitting targets in the region, including Israel and US military bases in the Gulf. In 2010, Teheran displayed other Iranian-made cruise missiles but with a shorter range.

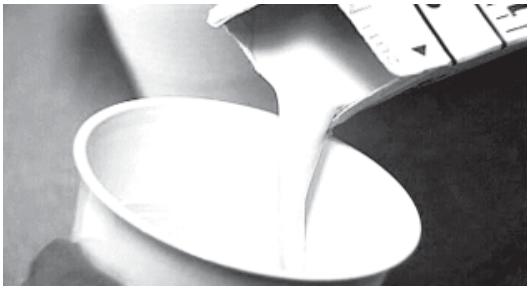
Risks of investing only in gold

Why so many kids are near-sighted

BEIJING, 23 Aug—Too much school work, TV and digital gadgets can cause squinting and near-sighted children. Giving tiny kids iPads with Tang poems and fairy tales is bad for them too. Zhang Qian takes an up-close look at the problem.

For children who haven't been chained to schoolwork, it's been a summer of watching TV, playing video games, surfing the net and tinkering with iPhones and iPads. Now, with school around the corner, eye doctors are seeing children who have been using their eyes too much.

Lin Zimin now finds her 11-year-old son often squints when he watches TV or looks at something in the distance. An eye exam showed he is seriously near-sighted.

"The two weeks before school opens is the peak time for parents to take their children for eye

checks," says Dr Ji Guifang, director of the Ophthalmology Department of Shanghai Children's Hospital. "When they finally got permission to watch TV and play video games in summer, many children just couldn't tear themselves away from the screen. And that often contributes to a quick deterioration in eyesight."

Near-sightedness, or myopia, is a serious problem for many children and teenagers in China.

S Korea, China, Japan to meet over feasibility study on three-way trade pact



SEOUL, 24 Aug—South Korea, China and Japan are scheduled to hold their sixth meeting aimed at assessing the feasibility

of the potential trilateral free trade agreement, the trade ministry said here on Wednesday.

During the three-day meeting opening next Wednesday in the northeast Chinese City of Changchun, representatives from the three Asian countries will discuss a draft of the joint report.

They will also hold a series of working-level meetings on issues including customs procedures, sanitary and phytosanitary (SPS) barriers and Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT), according to the ministry.

The three countries launched the joint project last year. Seoul had been in talks with Tokyo over a separate bilateral trade accord, but negotiations made little progress due to their differences over tariff issues.—Xinhua

Senior Chinese official discusses economic cooperation with Tajik PM

DUSHANBE, 24 Aug—Zhou Yongkang, a senior official of the Communist Party of China (CPC), held talks Tuesday with Tajik Prime Minister Akilov on bilateral economic cooperation.

Noting the two countries' economies are highly complementary and share a broad prospect, Zhou said China has become Tajikistan's most important trade partner and investor as their bilateral trade has increased by 14 times during the past five years.

Global market to be volatile for years: Australian MP

CANBERRA, 24 Aug—Uncertainty and volatility are likely to feature in global financial markets for years to come, Australian federal Treasury secretary Martin Parkinson warned on Wednesday.

Dr Parkinson addressed the University of Western Australia outlining Treasury's vision for Australia's economic future.

He said the troubles facing Europe and the US would weigh on the world economy, and domestically, for many years. "Unfortunately, recurrent episodes of volatility are likely to be a feature of our global financial marks over the next few years," he said.

Android becoming most attacked mobile platform in Q2

SAN FRANCISCO, 24 Aug— The amount of malware targeted at devices based on Google's Android platform surged 76 percent in the second quarter over the previous three months in 2011, making it the most attacked mobile operating system, computer security firm McAfee said on Tuesday.

A new McAfee study found that in the second quarter, Android-based malware surpassed Nokia's Symbian as the most popular target for mobile malware developers.

While Symbian and Java ME, a platform designed for mobile devices and other embedded systems, remain the most targeted

to date, the rapid rise in Android malware indicates that the platform could become an increasing target for cyber criminals McAfee said.

It warned that the attacks on Android

platform could affect everything from calendar apps, to text messages, and even a fake Angry Birds updates.

According to the study, malware on mobile platforms is

increasing steadily, often mimicking the same code as personal computer-based threats, as vast amount of personal and business data are now found on user's smartphones and other mobile devices.

"This year we've seen record-breaking numbers of malware, especially on mobile devices, where the uptick is in direct correlation to popularity," Vincent Weafer, senior vice president of McAfee Labs, said in a statement.

"Overall attacks are becoming more stealth and more sophisticated, suggesting that we could see attacks that remain unnoticed for longer periods of time," he noted.

Facebook to let users pre-approve photo tags

SAN FRANCISCO, 24 Aug—Drunken revelers rejoice: Facebook will now let you decide whether your friends can attach your name to a photo before it is circulated.

Currently, your friends can add your name to a photo on Facebook without your consent or knowledge. You can remove it later, but only after lots of others may have seen the embarrassing shots. Now, you can insist on pre-approval.

This won't affect whether your friends can add a photo of you, only whether your name is attached to it. Still, not having the name, known as a tag, can make it more difficult for people to find a potentially embarrassing photo in a search.

Facebook said on Tuesday that the change is in response to user requests. Pre-approving photo tags has been the most requested change, said Kate O'Neill, product manager for Facebook. The pre-approval process

will also apply to written posts that others tag you in. In addition, you have the option of pre-approving what others tag on your own photos and posts.

The company is making other changes to its privacy controls, too. These changes won't affect what information will be made public or private. Rather, they will affect how users can control what they are sharing in an effort to make the process simpler.—Internet

Samsung joins Apple in emerging markets smartphone push

SEOUL, 24 Aug—Samsung Electronics unveiled four new smartphone models under its flagship Galaxy line on Wednesday, expanding its offerings of cheaper phones to tap growth in emerging markets.

Samsung will enter a lower-end market ripe with cut-throat competition from Chinese producers including ZTE Corp and Huawei Technologies, as well as a host of no-brand producers pumping out hundreds of millions of phones for consumers in China, Africa and other developing economies. The move also signals an intensifying battle with Apple, Samsung's biggest competitor and customer, as the US firm is set to launch a lower-cost version of the iPhone 4 and its much-anticipated iPhone 5 soon, according to sources.

"Smartphone makers are increasingly moving down the value chain to target the low-end segment and attract mass customers, especially those in China and India," said Lee Seung-woo, an analyst at Shinyoung Securities. "It's an inevitable trend but will at the same time lower margins. Only a handful of top-tier manufacturers can survive in that end."

Beer-brewing yeast found

LONDON, 24 Aug— Scientists have identified a new species of yeast from forests in South America that was behind the discovery of lager, a type of beer brewed and stored at low temperatures.

The species was isolated from a beech tree in the frozen forests of Patagonia, where the minimum temperature hovers around minus-2 degrees Celsius.

The new yeast species has been named "Saccharomyces eubayanus", says the report in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

Usually, the yeast Saccharomyces cerevisiae is used across the world to ferment fruit and grains to make wine, cider and beer.

Lager—which is fermented slowly and at lower temperatures than beer—is believed to have been discovered when German monks moved beer barrels into caves to store it.

Saccharomyces cerevisiae, which grows just above room temperature, was believed to have been out-competed in the fermenting beer by a species that thrived at cooler temperatures.

The "modern-day" lager-brewing yeast—Saccharomyces pastorianus—is probably a hybrid of this "cool-loving strain" and the beer-brewing species, and survives because brewers keep back a little of the lager each time to develop the next batch with the same yeast, the report said.

UK family threatened with eviction over 'fire hazard' doormat

LONDON, 24 Aug—A British family was left stunned when an eviction notice was issued to their doormat after their housing association said it was a health and safety hazard. The offending mat was covered in warning tape and plastered with a sign reading 'move it or lose it'.

Lubin Reyes, 37, termed the move as 'ridiculous' and refused to remove the rubber mat from outside the first-floor flat where he has been lodging for 10 years.

"Someone is being paid to walk around and do this. It's ridiculous. I can't understand what they are thinking. It's my doorstep and my doormat," the *Daily Mail* quoted him as saying.

"I need to wipe the soles of my shoes dry or I might fall over in my house, then that would be a health and safety issue," he added.

When an astonished Reyes contacted Bedfordshire Pilgrims Housing Association, which issued the notice, it

said inspectors had ruled the mat was a fire hazard.

However, Reyes was undaunted by the notice and insisted on keeping the mat. "It's right at the end of a corridor so it's not like people will be rushing past it," he said. "It had 'move it or lose it' written on it, that's like a threat."

"It's like they are saying 'don't mess with us' - but it's only a doormat. I was very shocked that they would act in this way for something as minor as a doormat," he added.

Indian IT industry to grow 16-18 percent, market cautious

NEW DELHI, 24 Aug—Software industry body Nasscom Tuesday said it is confident about its projection that the IT industry in India will continue to be on the growth trajectory of 16-18 percent during 2011-12 fiscal even as the industry maintains a cautious outlook due to the economic uncertainty in US and Europe.

"There is no reason for us to be worried. We have spoken to customers and they are looking at expanding into geographies and bringing newer solutions to the market," Nasscom president Som Mittal told reporters on the sidelines of the Nasscom BPO strategy summit 2011.

Earlier during the month, the association had sought to clear the air about any possible impact of the ratings downgrade of US, the world's largest economy, on India's software and outsourcing exports.

Nasscom had said that the crisis in the US did not have any major bearing on the country's private sector. Although the global economic environment was a cause for concern, it was not likely to impact the Indian IT industry, in the near-term future. The international credit rating company Standard and Poor's earlier this month downgraded the top notch AAA credit rating of the US government's ability to pay back its creditors and investors to AA+.—Internet

US carrier Sprint to sell iPhone 5 in mid-October

SAN FRANCISCO, 24 Aug—Sprint Nextel, the third largest wireless carrier in the United States, will begin selling Apple's new iPhone 5 in mid-October, US media reported on Tuesday.

Sprint will also carry iPhone 4, the current generation of Apple's hot-selling smartphone, starting at the same time, *The Wall Street Journal* said in a report, citing people familiar with the situation.

Getting the iPhone 5 is a big win for Sprint, whose results have suffered without being able to sell Apple's popular device, and it will also benefit Apple with the addition of another marketing channel in the United States.

AT&T, the second largest US wireless carrier, has relied on previous versions of iPhone to drive its sales since 2007.

Verizon Wireless,

the country's No 1 wireless carrier, began selling the iPhone 4 this February.

Numbers showed that Sprint had more than 52 million subscribers at the end of the second quarter, compared with 106 million for Verizon and nearly 99 million for AT&T.

It was reported that Verizon and AT&T will also begin selling the iPhone 5 in mid-October.

Russia's Progress spaceship undocks

MOSCOW, 24 Aug—The Progress M-11M spacecraft undocked from the International Space Station Tuesday, said the Mission Control Centre outside Moscow.

After that the spaceship will be de-orbited and burn up in the Earth's atmosphere. Its fragments will fall into the remote area of the Pacific ocean.

The launch of next Progress cargo ship is planned on 24 Aug from the Baikonur space centre in Kazakhstan. It will dock with ISS on 26 Aug.

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Aug—The Union government, as a token of its encouragement to boosting the nation's export, has granted tax exemption from rice, beans and pulses, corn, sesame, rubber, freshwater and saltwater goods, animals and animal products (except prohibited items) in accordance with Section 8 (d) of Commercial Tax Law for a period of six months from 15 August 2011 to 14 February 2012. Ayeyawady Region, the granary of Myanmar, embraced the unique opportunity, exporting rice directly through Pathein Port on the morning of August: the first time in 15 years.

Under the close supervision of the Ayeyawady Region government and arrangements of Hinthada Rice Co, Ayeyawady Pathein Rice Co and Ayeyaya Dipa Rice Co, 3100 metric tons of rice were exported directly to the Philippines via Wedaung Port in Pathein. Ayeyawady Region Chief Minister U Thein Aung and

officials inspected the process.

Exporting rice through Pathein Port in Ayeyawady Region costs less, but ensures greater profits for farmers. More than that, milling and exporting rice directly saves warehouse charges and maintains the quality of the agricultural product, thus helping local farmers compete with foreign partners for bigger share in the international market. Arrangements are being made to keep exporting rice through Pathein and export steamed rice through Pathein Port when Ayeyawun Rice Co and Hinthada Rice Co put into action the programme to jointly produce steamed rice. Pathein Port occupies a strategic position, coping with local and international cargo vessels. So, the Delta is gearing up for dealing with a greater number of seagoing vessels in its bid to export regional goods on a larger scale including such agricultural products as rice and peas, along with salt and marine products.—MNA

Gravel roads in model villages will be upgraded to the asphalt sections and wooden bridges to RC facilities depending on the allocation in 2012-2013 financial year.

Being a seawater embankment, Pandaw-Meepya-Kamakalok road will be built as a road for all season use facility. There is no plan to build it as concrete road. Upgrading of gravel roads and bridges to RC ones will depend on the funds in 2012-2013 financial year.

Union Minister for Finance and Revenue U Hla Tun replied to two questions raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

I saw that the road section from Sawbwa Yayshin is smooth and straight. After entering Khampat of Tamu District, I proceeded to Kanan Village that shares border with Tiddim Township of Chin State. The village is located as a big village beside Kalay-Tamu Road. The village formed with over 1000 houses is home to Falam, Haka and Tiddim Chin national races.

I had an opportunity to visit the water inlet canal and self-reliant hydropower station in Kanan Village of Khampat Sub-Township. The canal, 200 feet long and six feet wide, is made of bricks. The canal takes water from Tioh Creek that flows from Tiddim Township of Chin State.

When a responsible person of the hydropower committee opened the bar, water fell to the turbine. The water pump linked with the turbine was switched on to light the hydropower station.

“Kanan Village Hydropower Station of my all works has the highest capability to supply electricity. In the past, water propeller could supply 500 fluorescence tubes. This facility can supply 800 two-

foot fluorescence tubes,” explained U Sein Toe and the head of the village.

The water propeller is located beside the hydropower station. However, the village is being supplied electricity by the hydropower station.

Many turbines installed by U Sein Toe are located in Kalay region. Moreover, turbine electrical generators installed by U Sein Toe, U Maung Win and U Kyaw Shwe are scattered in Kalay region. Hydropower is being generated from creeks that originate at Chin mountain range for supplying electricity to the local people. As such, the rural areas are enjoying fruits of electricity like urban regions.

The villages in Gangaw, Htilin and Saw townships are also supplied electricity through turbine hydropower stations. In Lonhaw Village, west of Zahaw Village, sponsors supply of electricity to the local people.

On my trip, I saw Tawma and Wetthet villages in Htilin Township illuminated with hydropower. Thanks to self-reliant hydropower facilities, villages in Kalay and Tamu districts and Yaw region are enjoying fruits of development through electricity. The local people have easy access to TV programmes of Myawady TV and MRTV daily. Moreover, some local people can watch international TV channels through satellite dishes. In fact, self-reliant hydropower supply programme

contributes a great deal to ensuring development and prosperity of the State.

Munching cakes, biscuits 3 times a week 'may up women's womb cancer risk'

LONDON, 24 Aug— three times a week could Women beware. Eating give you womb cancer, biscuits, buns or cakes says a new study.

The 10-year study from the Karolinska Institute in Sweden looked

at the eating habits of more than 60,000 women and found that those who gave themselves such a treat regularly were 33 percent more likely to suffer the disease.

And for those who indulge more than three times a week, the risk jumps to 42 percent, reports the *Daily Mail*.

The Swedish scientists wanted to see if there was a direct link between the amount of sweet foods eaten and the onset of cancer.

They studied data from thousands of women who, between 1987 and 1990, had answered dozens of questions on diet, lifestyle, weight and general health.

Ten years later, those

still alive answered an even more extensive battery of questions on their eating habits.

In 2008, the researchers matched up the women's answers with their medical records,

specifically looking for diagnoses of endometrial cancer—the most common form of womb cancer. They found 729 cases out of the 61,226 women studied.

Venezuelan flight makes emergency landing

CARACAS, 24 Aug—A Venezuelan flight with 95 passengers was on Tuesday forced to return to the airport of Maiquetia, north of the capital Caracas and made an emergency landing shortly after take-off, transportation authorities said.

Venezuelan Ministry of Transportation and Communication said the flight, a DC9 aircraft from the local Laser airline, declared a state of emergency because of "electrical problems" in the cabin when the plane was traveling at an altitude of just over 6,000 metres.

The aircraft, which was heading for El Vigia airport in Venezuela's western state of Merida, returned to the airport at 0705 local time (1135 GMT), half an hour after its departure from Maiquetia.

Venezuelan authorities said the plane landed without any problems and all passengers were transferred to another aircraft that belongs to the same airline. No further details were immediately available.—Xinhua

Magnitude 5.8 earthquake hits US east coast

WASHINGTON, 24 Aug —A magnitude 5.8 earthquake struck US east coast on Tuesday afternoon and was felt in Washington D C, New York City, North Carolina and even in Toronto, Canada.

The quake that lasted up to 45 seconds occurred at 1:51 pm local time (1751 GMT), 135 km southwest of US capital Washington DC, at a depth

of six km, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) reported on its

website.

The quake was also felt as far away as Martha's

line near quake site in Virginia. NRC officials are assessing the situation and

Pilot arrested in Madrid for smuggling cocaine

MEXICO CITY, 24 Aug — An Aeromexico co-pilot was arrested at the Madrid-Barajas International Airport on charges that he smuggled 42 kg of cocaine into Spain on a flight from Mexico City, officials said Tuesday.

Ruben Garcia Garcia was arrested last week by Spanish authorities for allegedly trying to smuggle the cocaine into the country, the Mexican Embassy in Spain said in a statement.

The Spanish Interior Ministry, Police General Administration and Civil Guard notified the embassy of the Aeromexico co-pilot's arrest.

Garcia arrived in Madrid 18 Aug aboard Aeromexico's flight AMX-001 from Mexico City.

The Aeromexico employee appeared before a judge and is being held at the Soto del Real prison.

"Mexican consular authorities met with the detained man and were able to verify his identity, state of health and to confirm that he has an attorney for his defense," the embassy said.

26 trapped in NE China coal mine flood

HARBIN, 24 Aug—Twenty-six miners were trapped underground when an illegal coal mine in northeast China's Heilongjiang Province flooded Tuesday, the local government said.

The flooding happened mid-day, when 45 miners were working in a pit of the Hengtai Coal Mining Co Ltd in Boli County in the coal-rich City of Qitaihe, a spokesman with the provincial work safety administration said.

He said 19 miners escaped and 26 others were stranded in the pit.

Wild fire destroys 170-hetare forest in southern France

PARIS, 24 Aug—A wild fire starting Sunday in southern France was finally put under control on Tuesday after destroy-ing about 170 hectares of forest.

The fire in the east of Lozere Province was under control Tuesday early morning, but some 200 firefighters working there remained on alert during the day in case the fire flares up again.

Local media said the fire started Sunday afternoon in the less populated Province of Lozere in southeast France. Recent hot and dry weather increased the difficulties in extinguishing the fire, the cause of which is under investigation but human-related factor is said very likely to be the reason.

During the past days, a total of over 200 firefighters and 13 aircraft were mobilized in the operation against the fire. The accident didn't left heavy casualty except five firefighters suffering slight injury.

Human fertilization process discovered

BEIJING, 24 Aug—Researchers have discovered how a human egg captures an incoming sperm for fertilization, paving the way to help couples suffering from infertility, according to media reports on Monday.

An international team of researchers found that a sugar chain known as the sialyl-lewis-x sequence (SLex) makes the outer coat of the egg "sticky," which has proven to be helpful in binding the egg and the sperm.

As a result, this observation has filled in a huge gap in the understanding of fertility and provides hope for ultimately helping couples who currently cannot conceive.

Finland develops disposable heart rate indicator

HELSINKI, 24 Aug—The Finnish company Spektikor has recently developed a novel type of disposable heart rate indicator, local media reported on Sunday. Different from a conventional heart rate monitor, it is a speed heart rate indicator designed for first aid professionals and specially used in first aids in major accidents, disasters and other crises.

According to Spektikor, the product is consisted of a heart rate sensor with two EKG elec-

trodes and a LED indicator, which are connected by a 35-cm-long wire. In operation, the sensor is placed on a patient's chest and the LED indicator is stucked to the patient's cheek. If the heart rate is within the normal range, the LED indicator will flash green with each beat. If the heart rate is dangerously low or high, the light will turn red.—Xinhua

Women get fatter after marriage... men after divorce

EDINBURGH, 24 Aug—Marriage and divorce are both bad for your waistline, new research suggests. But while women tend to gain weight after their wedding day, men are most affected by marital breakdown. Both kinds of "marital transition" can act as "weight shocks" that put on the pounds, a study has found. "Divorces for men and, to some extent, marriages for women promote weight gains that may be large enough to pose a health risk," said study leader Dmitry Tumin, from Ohio State University in the US.

The likelihood of major weight gain after marriage or divorce increased most for people past the age of 30. "For someone in their mid-20s there is not much difference in the probability of gaining weight between someone who just got married and someone who never married," said Mr Tumin, a doctoral student in sociology.—Internet

'Simple bacteria' key to blocking breast cancer

LONDON, 24 Aug—A naturally occurring molecule in bacteria can block the development of breast cancer, scientists have discovered, paving the way for the design of more potent and selective drugs.

The molecule, thioestrepton, clamps FOXM1, a cancer-causing protein present in greater amounts in breast cancer cells. It switches on genes regulating the growth and division of cells, causes tumours to spread and triggers the growth of blood vessels.

Blocking this protein may prevent the development of cancer at an early stage as well as blocking its growth and spread according to the study published in 'Nature Chemistry'. Its lead author, Professor Shankar Balasubramanian, based

at Cancer Research UK in Cambridge, said: "Before this research we weren't aware of any natural product which could directly target a protein that controls gene activity. Yet intriguingly a molecule in bacteria -- which also has strong antibiotic effects -- does this very well, switching off cancer-causing genes in breast cancer cells."

Fossil find reveals when life began

LONDON, 24 Aug—The fossilised remains of the oldest known lifeforms on earth have been discovered in samples of rock collected near a remote watering hole in the middle of the Australian Outback. Scientists said that the microscopic fossils belonged to primitive bacteria that lived more than 3.4 billion years ago, when the earth had emerged from a period probably too hostile for life.

The primitive microbes used sulphur instead of oxygen to generate energy from food and, the scientists said, could be the closest that science will ever get to the mysterious origin of life on earth.

The fossils were found in rocks formed in shallow seas near a coastline and suggested that beaches may have been the key habitat where the earth's first lifeforms thrived, said David Wacey, of the University of Western Australia.

The suit, displayed at Vancouver's SIGGRAPH 2011 interactive technology conference, simulates nine months of weight gain, breast enlargement and baby kicking, allowing men to feel the physical sensations of pregnancy.—Xinhua

Baby delivered with brother's help

A 12-year-old Canadian boy says he was able to adroitly help deliver his baby brother because he watched "a bunch of medical shows" on television.

Danielle Edwards of Campbell River says she woke up "in hard labour" about 2 am Saturday and realized she wasn't going to make it to a hospital, the Canadian Broadcasting Corp reported Tuesday.

"I couldn't even get up. I was already in the process of pushing," she told the news network. "There was nothing I could do."

Her son Gaelen was awakened by her calls for help and when the 12-year-old walked into her bedroom he saw the baby coming out of her womb.

"I grabbed him by the shoulders and his head was resting on my wrists," he said. "Then I gently pulled him out and laid him on the bed."

Next, he went to the kitchen to grab scissors to cut the umbilical cord. He clamped off the cord and cut it himself, the CBC said.

How did he know what to do?

"I watch a bunch of medical [TV] shows," Gaelen explained.

The boys' father, Kendall Strong, called his older son a hero.

"He saved his brother's life," Strong said. "He was calm. He didn't freak out. It was awesome."

The mother and newborn were then taken to the hospital where both were doing fine. The baby weighed in at 7 pounds, 9 ounces.

Diane Mayers, who has worked with Child Safety Services in the past, said she was so "horrified" when she saw the boy that she immediately notified the department.

"A lot of people walked past and were laughing at him, including boys who would have been his age," Mayers said. "At one point, the boy had taken off the Shrek ears. My daughter walked past and heard the mother say, 'Put them back on or I'll smack your head in.'"

Mayers said she feared the long-term effects from the public humiliation would be worse than the potential effects from physical abuse.

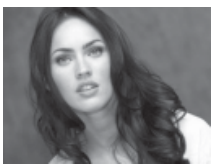

Velez lose striker Silva to Fiorentina

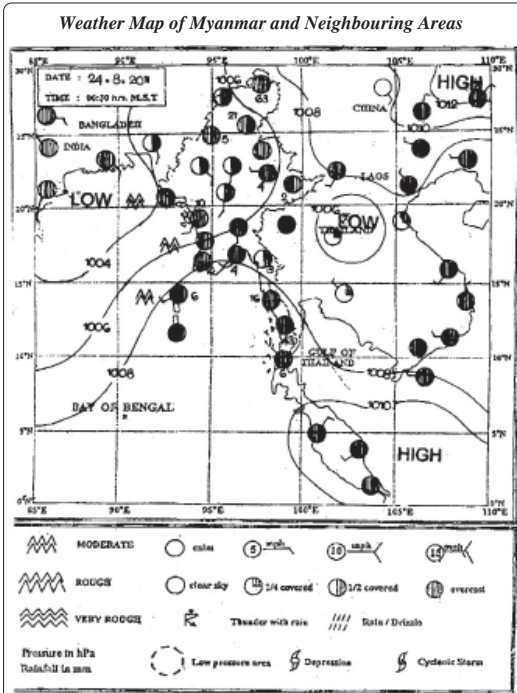

Located in Miyun County some 150 kilometers east of Beijing, Wuling Mountain is a national-level forest reserve. What distinguishes the reserve from other similar mountain resorts in suburban Beijing is its many creeks, waterfalls and moisture-rich air. Hikers visiting Wuling Mountain can always find tumbling creeks and occasional waterfalls as they make their way up the mountain. The most magnificent water feature of the resort is the Dragon Pond Waterfall. A broad curtain of water, 56 metres high, pours over the canyon, with the sound created by the rushing water resonating throughout the valley.

hundred kilometer stretch of Ming dynasty Great Wall. The mountain used to be the natural defensive barrier protecting Beijing from invasion. Today, all that remains of the Great Wall is debris from the watch towers and collapsed walls. The peak of Wuling Mountain is 2118 meters above sea level, and the scenery differs depending on your altitude. The best season to visit Wuling Mountain is in the summer and autumn. Tourists can reside in one of the family-run hotels or hostels at the foot of the mountain.

Power supply to Chin State discussed, proposals for enhancing standards of universities and healthcare services submitted at Amyotha Hluttaw

NAY PYI TAW, 24 Aug—The second regular session of the First Amyotha Hluttaw continued for the third day at Amyotha Hluttaw Building here at 10 am this morning.

Speaker of Amyotha Hluttaw U Khin Aung Myint and 208 Hluttaw representatives attended the today's session.

First, the Speaker

announced that anyone wishing to discuss the President's address on the first day of the second regular session of the First Pyidaungsu Hluttaw may register.

U Hla Swe from Constituency No. 12 of Magway Region put a question about when Gangaw, Htilin and Saw townships can see the national grid, U Htay Yei

from Constituency No. 7 of Kayah State asked whether there is any plan for supply of electricity from Lawpita Hydropower Plant to Shadaw and Meisei, two remaining townships without electricity, Ywathit sub-township and Mawchi station, an important station in Kayah State and the estimated date of supply

if there is any, U Manar Nai from Constituency No. 10 of Chin State asked whether there is any plan for electricity supply to Kanpetlet Township in Chin State from on going national hydropower projects at Manipur and Myittha rivers flowing from Chin State and the date of supply if there is any, and whether the State can supply electricity with other small and medium-scale hydropower projects if there is no such plan.

In his reply to those questions, Union Minister for Electric Power No. 2 U Khin Maung Soe said that the Kyaw-Gangaw-Haka (66) KV power grid is underway to distribute the electric power from national grid through Kyaw power station; that Kyaw-Gangaw section is due to be completed in 2012-2013 fiscal year; that electric power is provided to Htilin with two department-owned diesel generators; that if power from national grid is to be distributed to Htilin, it will

have to be distributed through (66) KV power lines via Pauk power station and about 45 miles of power lines will have to be linked for it; that power is supplied to Saw Township with one department-owned diesel generator and another generator is kept as a spare one; that power from national grid can be distributed only through Pauk-Mindat (66) KV power lines.

The Union Minister continued that according to current domestic production and consumption of power, it is still unable to provide electric power to Htilin and Saw from national grid but measures will be taken for the two townships when the nation sees increased power production in future.

The Union Minister explained that of the seven townships in Kayah State, power is supplied to Loikaw, Dimawhso, Prusho, Bawlake and Pasawng from national grid and Shadaw and Meisei and Ywathit Sub-

township with diesel generator; that staff of Mawchi Mines constituted Mawchi Station, in which electric power is generated with 280-kilowatt small-scale hydroelectric generators of the mines; that measures will be taken to provide power to the two remaining townships, the sub-township and the station.

Although Chin State has not enjoyed power from national grid, it still has access to electricity as power is supplied by 11 state/district/township/sub-township/town electrical engineer offices in Kanpetlet, Haka, Falam, Tiddim, Tonzang, Thantlang, Kyikha, Reedhorda, Mindat, Matupi and Yezwa with the help of generators and mini hydroelectric turbines; that according to potential of increased amount of the national grid, power supply from national grid to Chin State is projected, for which construction of 30-mile long power lines linking Kyaw and Gangaw (See page 9)

Warning of high tide

YANGON, 24 Aug—The public are here by informed that exceptionally high Spring of from (20.5) feet to (21.6) feet high above the datum are expected to occur in Yangon River during the period 28 August to 3 September 2011. That it is not serious because the high tide have reached up to (21.8) feet high above datum in the year 2009 and 2010, and that the warning is issued only because high tide reaches over (20) feet high above datum.—MNA

Personal hygiene and foods of street vendors to be checked
