Two killed, nine injured in Iraq's violence

BAGHDAD, 6 Nov—Two people were killed and nine others injured in separate bomb and gunfire attacks in central Iraq on Saturday, the police said.

A sticky bomb attached to a minibus carrying passengers detonated in Mudhafar Square in Baghdad's eastern District of Sadr City, killing one civilian and wounding four others, an Interior Ministry source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

In a separate incident,

three civilians were injured when a bomb went off inside a residential building in Baghdad's south-western neighbourhood of Eilam, the source said.

Also in Baghdad, two civilians were wounded when a sticky bomb attached to their car detonated in the northeastern District of Benoug, the source added.

In Salahudin Province, gunmen broke into the house of a policeman in the city of Tuz-Khurmato, some 90

km east of the provincial capital city of Tikrit, and shot him dead before they fled the scene, a local police source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Salahudin Province, located in northern-central of Iraq, is a mainly Sunni Province. Its capital city of Tikrit, some 170 km north of Baghdad, is the hometown of the country's former President Saddam Hussein.

Death toll from Thailand floods rises past 500

BANGKOK, 6 Nov—The nationwide death toll from flooding in Thailand climbed past 500 on Sunday, as the polluted black water continued its march through northern Bangkok, pouring across major intersections and a road underneath the capital's elevated train line.

Floodwaters were also approaching a main road near the city's Mo Chit bus terminal, a major gateway to northern Thailand. But the bus station remained open, traffic police chief Uthaiwan Kaewsard said.

Three months of intense rainfall have fueled Thailand's worst flooding in half a century, swamping much of the country since July and leaving 506 people dead, according to the government. Floodwaters have begun receding in some provinces north of Bangkok, but they have built up around the city, which stands in the way of the water's natural flow south toward the Gulf of Thailand.

So far, authorities have ordered evacuations in eight of Bangkok's 50 districts, while seven others are either heavily or partially flooded.

On Saturday, floodwaters began lapping at Bangkok's largest outdoor shopping zone, the famed Chatuchak Weekend Market, a major tourist attraction north of the city's central business district. Water was flowing past the market's eastern side.

In the last few days, it has also begun moving southward in adjacent Lad Phrao, a district studded with office towers, condominiums and a popular shopping mall.

Four killed in rocket attack in northwest Pakistan

ISLAMABAD, 6 Nov—At least four security personnel were killed and five others injured in a rocket attack launched Saturday by unknown militants in Pakistan's northwest tribal area of North Waziristan which borders Afghanistan.

A convoy of Pakistani security forces patrolling in a village in Spina, North

Waziristan came under rocket attack, reported local Urdu TV channel Express. Three rockets were fired at the convoy and four security personnel were killed on the spot and five others injured in the attack have been shifted to nearby hospital.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack. North Waziristan is

considered one of the safe havens for militants to launch cross-border attacks on the US-led coalition forces and Afghan army in Afghanistan. carried out a number of military operations against the militants hideout in northwest tribal areas such as Orakzai, Kurram and Bajaur.—*Xinhua*

Sitting without breaks ups cancer risk

WASHINGTON, 6 Nov—Sitting for long periods of time is associated with health risks — even for people who are regularly physically active, an Australian researcher says.

Neville Owen of Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Institute in Australia said key indicators of cancer risk are lower when prolonged sitting is interrupted with brief breaks of 1 or 2 minutes.

“Sitting time is emerging as a strong candidate for being a cancer risk factor in its own right. It seems highly likely that the longer you sit, the higher your risk. This phenomenon isn’t dependent on body weight or how much exercise people do,” Owen said in a statement. “In our studies, we’ve measured waist circumference, insulin resistance and inflammation —

indicators of cancer risk common to many physical activity-cancer studies. We found that even breaks as short as 1 minute can lower these biomarkers.”

One study found 60 percent of a study subjects’ waking day — 9.3 hours — was spent sedentary, including meals, commutes and computer/television time, while another 35 percent — 6.5 hours — was spent engaged in light activity

such as walking to a meeting, Owen said.

Office workers can spend over 75 percent of their working hours sitting, with bouts of 30 minutes or more of unbroken sedentary time common.

The findings were presented at the American Institute for Cancer Research’s annual research conference in Washington.

High blood pressure robs sufferers of ‘emotional understanding’

WASHINGTON, 6 Nov—People with higher blood pressure have a reduced ability to recognize angry, fearful, sad and happy faces and text passages, a new study has found.

James A McCubbin and his colleagues from the Clemson University have said that some people have “emotional dampening” that may cause them to respond inappropriately to anger and other emotions in them.

“It’s like living in a world of email without

smiley faces,” McCubbin said. “We put smiley faces in emails to show when we are just kidding. Otherwise some people may misinterpret our humour and get angry,” he said.

McCubbin said that the “emotional damp-ening” may often lead to miscommunication and poor job performance.

“For example, if your work supervisor is angry, you may mistakenly believe that he or she is just kidding.

“This can lead to

miscommunication, poor job performance and increased psychosocial distress. “If you have emotional dampening, you may distrust others because you cannot read emotional meaning in their face or their verbal communications.

“You may even take more risks because you cannot fully appraise threats in the environment,” he said.

He also said that the

link between dampening of emotions and blood pressure is believed to be involved in the development of hypertension and risk for coronary heart disease, and may also be involved in disorders of emotion regulation, such as bipolar disorders and depression.

The study has been published in journal *Psychosomatic Medicine*.

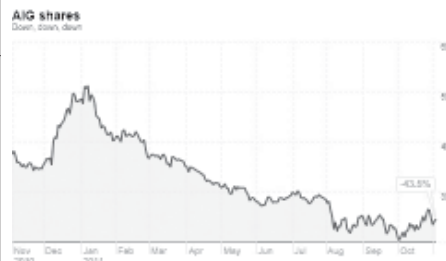

AIG posts \$4.1 billion loss

NEW YORK, 6 Nov—American International Group is back in the red. Way in the red.

The bailed out insurer posted a net loss of \$4.1 billion on Thursday, a

loss per share of \$2.16 for the third quarter. While analysts hadn’t expected the company to post a profit, the size of the loss exceeded expectations.

The outsized loss sent

AIG (AIG, Fortune 500) shares lower after the closing bell, with prices dropping more than 1% to \$24.35.

And that’s bad news for taxpayers, since the US Treasury still owns a substantial chunk of AIG.

Back in 2008, the government agreed to help the giant insurer get back on its feet with a \$180 billion lifeline. AIG has been slowly working toward paying back that loan.

But declining profits,

and a recent drop in share price make that a much tougher task.

If the government is to be made whole, AIG will have to find a way to boost its share price. Shares now sit well below \$28.72 — the breakeven point for Treasury’s investment.

Separately, AIG announced Thursday that its board of directors had authorized a \$1 billion share buyback, a sign the company views its stock as undervalued.—*Internet*

People with autism superior in many areas

MONTREAL, 6 Nov—Many people with autism have qualities and abilities that may exceed those of people who do not have the condition, Canadian researchers say.

Dr Laurent Mottron at the University of Montreal’s Center for Excellence in Pervasive Development Disorders strongly established and replicated the abilities — and sometimes the superiority — of people with autism in multiple cognitive operations such as perception and reasoning.

His research group includes several people with autism, and one, Michelle Dawson, makes major contributions to understanding of the condition through her work and her judgment, he said. “Dawson challenged

my scientific perception of autism,” Mottron said in a statement. “It’s amazing to me that for decades scientists have estimated the magnitude of mental retardation based on the administration of inappropriate tests, and on the misinterpretation of autistic strengths. Recent data and my own personal experience suggest it’s time to start thinking of autism as an advantage in some spheres, not a cross to bear.”

Mottron said many with autism end up working repetitive, menial jobs, despite their intelligence and aptitude to make much more significant contributions to society.

The findings were published in the journal *Nature*.—*Internet*

Cuba signs contracts worth over 300 million US dollars at trade fair

HAVANA, 6 Nov—Cuba signed contracts worth over 300 million US dollars at the International Fair of Havana that ended Saturday, officials said.

Cuba also initiating negotiations and contacts for other business transactions, said Abraham Maciquez, president of the trade fair organizing committee.

The Cuban Ministry of Transport signed four documents with companies in Canada and the Netherlands aimed at providing resources for the recovery of railroads, motor transportation and ports on the island.

The fair was attended by about 1,500 foreign companies and official delegations from some 20

countries.

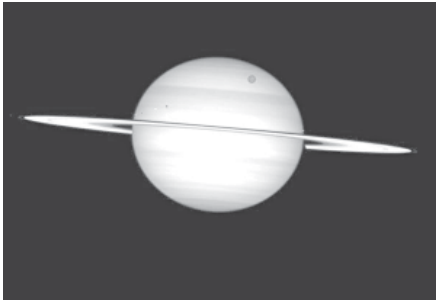
The fair also involved more than 350 Cuban companies in areas such as health, food industry, electronics, construction, and services, a sector representing currently 70 percent of the national income. The “fair is not a bilateral event between Cuba and foreign companies involved, but an international meeting of trade relations,” Maciquez said.

“It is a bridge, aimed at linking our continent with the rest of the world to promote trade and relations of all kinds in a climate of peace, tranquility and security.”

Cassini to photograph Enceladus Science

PASADENA, (Calif), 6 Nov—NASA’s Cassini spacecraft will take high-resolution radar image of Saturn’s moon Enceladus during a flyby of the icy

moon, the US space agency said.

The spacecraft will come within 300 miles of Enceladus at its closest point Sunday, which will allow Cassini’s synthetic aperture radar to sweep across a long, narrow swath of the surface just north of the moon’s south pole. NASA said the mission’s visible-light cameras will take images of Enceladus and its famous jets, and the composite infrared spectrometer will make new measurements of hot spots from which the sprays of icy particles and water vapor emerge.

Bright, young pulsar spotted by Fermi Science

WASHINGTON, 6 Nov—The Fermi space telescope has spotted a powerful millisecond pulsar that is only 25 million years old, a team of US and international scientists said.

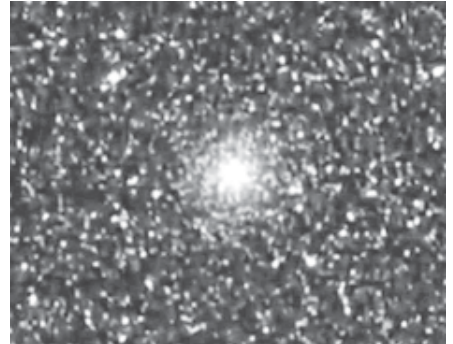
A pulsar is a type of neutron star that emits electromagnetic energy at periodic intervals and is the closest thing to a black hole that astronomers can observe directly, crushing half a million times more mass than Earth into a sphere no larger than a city, NASA researchers said.

Millisecond pulsars are generally around 1 billion years old, so

researchers say the pulsar J1823-3021A is an unusual discovery. It is located within a globular cluster about 27,000 light-years away in the constellation Sagittarius. The cluster itself is about 10 billion years old, researchers said.

“It’s amazing that all of the gamma rays we see from this cluster are

coming from a single object. It must have formed recently based on how rapidly it’s emitting energy. It’s a bit like finding a screaming baby in a quiet retirement home,” researcher Paulo Freire of the Max Planck Institute for Radio Astronomy in Bonn, Germany, said in a statement.—*Internet*

Siri is “Google search’s rival” Tech

NEW YORK, 6 Nov—The voice-activated Siri assistant on Apple’s iPhone 4S is a direct challenge to Google’s search engine, chairman Eric Schmidt said.

“Apple has launched an entirely new approach to search technology with Siri, its voice-activated search and task-completion service built into the iPhone 4S,” Schmidt acknowledged in a written response to lawmakers released Friday by the Senate antitrust subcommittee.

He also pointed to challenges from social networks like Facebook, micro-blogging website Twitter and traditional competitors such as Microsoft’s Bing.

“Social networking

sites like Facebook and Twitter also allow users to leverage their social networks to find answers to their questions. Google is therefore competing with all methods available to access information on the Internet, not just other

general search engines,” Schmidt wrote.

“The source of Facebook’s competition with Google is not only through using Bing to search the Internet but, also by offering users a fundamentally different

way to discover and connect with information on the Internet.”

Respected technology site TechCrunch has already described Siri, introduced last month, as Apple’s “entry point” into the search engine business, while a Forbes commentator has called the service a “Google killer.”

Schmidt’s response comes as Google, which according to Internet marketing research firm ComScore has a 65.3 per cent share of the US search engine market, is under investigation by US and European antitrust bodies.

But he insisted that Google was not “dominant” in Internet search, as lawmakers have contended.

Turning back clocks can disrupt sleep Science

CHICAGO, 6 Nov—The end of daylight saving time can be disruptive and dangerous, sleep experts at Chicago’s Northwestern Memorial Hospital said.

Clocks in most of the United States will get pushed back 1 hour at 2 am Sunday when daylight saving time officially ends. Dr Hrayr Attarian, a neurologist at Northwestern Memorial, said people should use take the opportunity to reset their sleep habits. He said people should go to bed at the same time they usually do this weekend, even though they’re gaining an hour on the clock, so that they are well-rested on Monday.

Dr Phyllis Zee, director of the hospital’s Sleep Disorders Center, warns that drowsy driving can lead to more accidents on the road.

“There is a significant increase in the number of car accidents in the days following the end of daylight saving time, which many attribute to lack of alertness from insufficient sleep,” Zee said.—*Internet*

Apple takes more than half of handset industry’s profits Tech

SAN FRANCISCO, 6 Nov—With its popular iPhone series, Apple seized more than half of the profits generated by the top eight mobile phone manufacturers during the third quarter, said a monthly market analysis released on Friday. Apple generated a remarkable 52 percent of handset industry operating profits for the top eight OEMs (original equipment manufacturers) in the third quarter, up five percent over the same period of 2010, said Canaccord Genuity technology analyst Michael Walkley.

The number was down from 57 percent in the second quarter, due to a drop in iPhone sales as customers held out for the upcoming iPhone 4S. Apple’s major rival in the mobile industry is Samsung. The two companies together represented 81 percent of the handset industry’s operating profits last quarter. Other major mobile phone manufacturers are Nokia, Motorola, Sony Ericsson, HTC, Research In Motion and LG.

Calling it “an epic reversal of fortunes,” Walkley

noted that in 2007, Nokia had 67 percent of operating profits while Apple had just 4 percent. Compared with Apple’s 52 percent of industry profits in the third quarter of 2011, Nokia has been relegated to its rival’s former position with just 4 percent of operating profits.

The analyst said he has conducted “channel checks” that show strong demand not only for the new iPhone 4S but also for the previous models of iPhone 4 and iPhone 3GS. He told technology news website AllthingsD that Apple is believed to be able to gain further value share in the December quarter and capture over 60 percent of industry profits. In a Bloomberg report on Friday, several technology analysts said the two-year-old iPhone 3GS, whose price has been slashed to zero if it is purchased with a contract, will become one of Apple’s big weapons in the coming holiday season against smartphones running Google’s Android system.—*Xinhua*

Hu's speech at G20 summit draws positive international comments

BEIJING, 6 Nov— Chinese President Hu Jintao's speech at the sixth Group of Twenty (G-20) Summit has drawn positive comments from the international community, which praised the address for proposals for efforts to maintain world economic growth and financial stability.

In the speech delivered at the 3-4 Nov summit in Cannes, France, Hu put forward a

package of proposals urging the world's major economies to work together to promote growth and financial stability.

"It is imperative that we stand on a higher plane, transcend differences on specific issues, move beyond short-term considerations, and jointly seek ways to overcome the crisis and sustain development," Hu told the summit.

"At this critical moment, the G-20 must

work to address the key problems, boost market confidence, defuse risks and meet challenges and promote global economic growth and financial stability," Hu said.

Reporting developments at the G-20 summit, the Reuters news agency quoted Hu as saying in the speech: "As the premier forum for international economic cooperation, the G20 must continue to demonstrate the spirit of

standing together in times of adversity and pursuing win-win cooperation. At this critical moment, the G20 must work to address the key problems, boost market confidence, defuse risks and meet challenges, and promote global economic growth and financial stability."

Reuters also said Hu hopes to send a clear message of ensuring economic development and boosting stability to the international community.

EU bailout "must be ratified by year-end"

ATHENS, 6 Nov— Greece must ratify an EU bailout package designed to haul the near-bankrupt country out of its debt crisis by the end of the year, a Greek

government spokesman said on Saturday.

"According to the non-negotiable timetable... of the European Summit (where the plan was agreed), the new agreement needs to be ratified in parliament by the end of 2011," Ilias Mossialos said in a statement.

"Our European partners will not wait. We have only seven weeks and we cannot lose a single day," he added, ratcheting up the pressure on Greece's top politicians to find common ground in order to form a unity government.

Earlier Saturday, Greece's president said he would hold talks with politicians in a bid to break the stalemate as Prime Minister George Papandreou seeks to forge a consensus administration.

Papandreou has said that a national unity government must be formed to implement the terms of the bailout plan, clinched last month in Brussels after marathon talks. But the main opposition party has resisted the offer, calling for Papandreou to resign and for "immediate" elections.—Internet

GM to recall 38,400 Pontiac G8s on airbag issue

CHICAGO, 6 Nov — General Motors Co is recalling more than 38,000 Pontiac G8 models in order to reprogramme airbag modules for the front passenger seats, the US automaker said in a release on Saturday.

The airbag modules for vehicles built for the 2008 and 2009 model years may not be in compliance with federal standards for head injury protection of some passengers, according to a National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recall notice.

The recall affects 38,444 Pontiac G8 models, which were manufactured in Australia and imported to the United States. The issue was discovered in Australia during testing.

There have been no crashes, injuries or complaints related to the airbag issue, the statement said.

New strain of HIV found in Singapore

SINGAPORE, 6 Nov—A new and possibly more aggressive strain of the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) has surfaced in Singapore, evolving from the two existing strains.

Researchers from the Department of Infectious Diseases at Tan Tock Seng Hospital

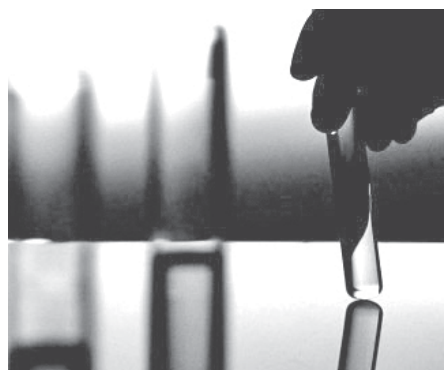
discovered the new strain AE-B after studying more than 200 HIV patients between 2008 and 2009.

Around the world, there are currently 50 other known recombinant forms of the HIV virus. While the new strain can be treated with existing medication, doctors are concerned

because it suggests high-risk behaviour among HIV patients - with some having had sexual intercourse with at least two people who carry different strains of the HIV virus.

Preliminary evidence also shows that the new strain could be more aggressive and cause more serious diseases in infected patients. However, larger studies are needed to ascertain this.

Speaking at a press conference on Friday, Dr Ng Oon Teck, one of the researchers who carried out the study, said the new strain may suggest some within the population had sexual intercourse with at least two people who carry different strains of the HIV virus.—Internet

Nepal Army to use MI-17 helicopter to rescue stranded tourists

KATHMANDU, 6 Nov— Nepal Army (NA) agreed Saturday to use its MI-17 helicopter to rescue stranded foreign tourists in northeastern Nepal.

More than 100 flights have been cancelled due to bad weather in the Himalayas region since Tuesday, leaving around 2,000 tourists stranded

at Lukla airport, most of them coming from the United States and Europe.

The small airport located at an altitude of 2,860 meters is the gateway for tourists visiting Mount Everest (Mt Qomolangma).

The Nepal Tourism Board appealed the NA to help rescue the tourists.

The NA helicopter with 18 seats will leave for Lukla after the weather condition gets slightly improved. It will rescue the patients and the tourists who have to arrive in Kathmandu to catch their international flights in first priority, said Anjan Kumar Thapa, treasurer of the Trekking Association of Nepal.—Xinhua

The epicenter of the quake, which was of tectonic origin and struck from a depth of 588 kilometres, was traced 58 kilometres southwest of Dulawan,

Cotabato province, said the institute, adding no damage or aftershocks were expected.

The United States Geological Survey (USGS) put the quake at magnitude-4.9.

The Philippines sits in the so-called Pacific Ring of Fire, an area where continental plates collide, producing frequent quakes and volcanic activities.—Xinhua

M'sian hacker jailed in US

WASHINGTON, 6 Nov—A US District Judge sentenced a Malaysian national Friday to 10 years in prison for hacking into the US Federal Reserve and other banks.

Lin Mun Poo, a Malaysian citizen, had admitted earlier this year to hacking into the US central bank along with various other private financial institutions and

possessing stolen bank card and credit card numbers, officials said.

He also admitted to have hacked a Fed computer server and installed a malicious software code there.

Poo travelled to the United States in October last year "for the purpose of selling stolen credit card and bank card numbers" but a purchaser was in fact an

undercover US agent, according to prosecutors.

When he was arrested, the Malaysian citizen held over 122,000 stolen bank card and credit card numbers.

The US Justice Department said Poo's "cybercrime activities also extended to the national security sector," including hacking into the computer system of a Pentagon contractor that provides systems management services for military transport and other military operations.

"Today's sentence sends the message to hackers around the world that the United States is no place to conduct their business," US Attorney Loretta Lynch said in a statement.

Police seize large amount of hashish in Turkey

ANKARA, 6 Nov—The Turkish police on Saturday seized a large amount of hashish in several provinces in Turkey, the semi-official Anatolia news agency reported.

The police stopped a truck at a checkpoint on the Bitlis-Diyarbakir road and found 43.7 kg of hashish stashed in the vehicle in the eastern province of Bitlis, said the report, adding that the driver of the truck

was arrested. Meanwhile, acting on a tip-off, the Turkish police searched two cars and found 51 kg of hashish in the vehicles in Yeni Mahalle district in Turkey's central province of Konya, according to the report.

Four people were detained in the operation, said the report.

In another operation, the police stopped a car on Tarsus-Adana-Gaziantep highway, and

seized 24 kg of hashish stashed in the vehicle.

In other operations in the districts of Kiremithane, Sakirbaba, Daglioglu and Ulubatli Hasan in Adana Province, Turkish police seized 60 kg of hashish, said the report, adding that 11 others were detained.

Turkey is a key transit route for drug smuggling from Asia and the Middle East to Europe.

War relics discovered at construction site

Girl, three, eats leftovers for two days after mom dies

WELLINGTON, 6 Nov—A 3-year-old girl comforted herself with her favorite toy and ate cheese, leftover lasagna and milk for two days after her mother died unexpectedly in their New Zealand home.

The girl's uncle, Pete Silbery, told *The Associated Press* on Friday that Shylah Silbery managed to open the fridge and comfort herself with a teddy bear named "Possum" after Lauren Silbery, 28, died.

The family last spoke to Lauren Silbery on 19 Oct, he said. Two days later, they were worried enough to call a friend who lived near her Wellington home. The friend could see the girl inside the home, but not the mother, prompting the family to call police, Pete Silbery said.

Police coaxed Shylah to drag a coffee table to the door so she could reach the lock and unlock the door, before she told them, "Mummy won't wake up," Silbery said.

"I can only imagine her in there for that long, trying to wake Mum up as well," he said.

Shylah spent several days in a hospital recovering from dehydration and diaper rash.

"She's doing OK now. She's still bubbly," he said. "When we lowered the coffin into the grave at the cemetery, though, she pointed at it and said 'Mummy's in there.' It was pretty heartbreaking."

Authorities are awaiting the results of an autopsy but don't believe Lauren Silbery's death was suspicious, Wellington police spokesman Victoria Davis said.

Montreal apartment fire kills two

MONTREAL, 6 Nov—A fire broke out Saturday in an apartment building on Montreal's West Island, leaving two people dead, firefighters say.

The fire broke out early Saturday inside the building and spread to the roof, *CBC News* reported. Firefighters found two bodies in one of the apartments. Their identities have not been released. About 100 residents were forced to leave their apartments. Some who took refuge on their balconies were saved by firefighters.

Residents of the building were taken to the Bob-Birnie Arena where Red-Cross workers were on hand to assist. No injuries were reported during the rescue mission.—Internet



Britons among 2,000 hikers stranded near Mount Everest


KATHMANDU, 6 Nov — British tourists are among up to 2,000 hikers stranded near Mount Everest with food running low after fog and cloud forced the area's only airport to shut down for four days. Trekkers from the UK, as well as the US and Germany, are among those stuck in the Nepalese hill resort of Lukla with hundreds living in tents and in the dining halls of local hotels. With aircraft currently unable to take off or land and the treacherous weather not expected to clear until tomorrow, it was reported yesterday that the Himalayan Rescue Association and the Tourism Crisis Cell had called an emergency meeting to find a way to rescue the tourists.

Large helicopters are likely to be called into action, officials have said. "Visibility is almost nil. Fog and clouds have covered the entire area making flights by fixed-wing small aircraft impossible,"

Stayin' alive - does music have a role in CPR?

LONDON, 6 Nov — Can a bit of the Bee Gees help people perform CPR after someone's heart has stopped beating? Following the beat of Stayin' Alive has been recommended in the past to help people perform the correct number of chest compressions each minute - as has Nellie the Elephant. However, using these tracks can lead to compressions which are too shallow, studies show. Experts now argue that better alternatives are now available. They want research into the field to come to an end. Correctly performed CPR (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation - or mouth-to-mouth) is lifesaving and is thought to triple survival rates.

The UK Resuscitation Council recommends that the chest is compressed by 5-6 cm and at a rate of 100-120 compressions per minute. Performing CPR to Stayin' Alive was recommended in the US as the song contains 103 beats per minute. Nellie the Elephant had been recommended in the UK. A study published in 2009 showed that using the song as an aid did increase the number of people getting the right rate. —Internet

Major berg forming in Antarctica

LONDON, 6 Nov—Scientists are monitoring the birth of a monster iceberg in West Antarctica. A rift has formed in the shelf of floating ice in front of the Pine Island Glacier (PIG). The surface crack in the PIG runs for almost 30km (20 miles), is 60m (200ft) deep and is growing every day. US space agency (Nasa) researchers expect the eventual berg to cover about 880 sq km - an area the size of Berlin. It should break away towards the end of the year or early in 2012.

Pine Island Glacier is one of the largest and fastest-moving tongues of ice on the White Continent and drains something like 10% of all the ice flowing out of the West Antarctic Ice Sheet into the ocean. In recent years, satellite and airborne measurements have recorded a marked thinning of the PIG, which may be related to climate changes. But the team working on Nasa's IceBridge project say this latest birthing of a giant berg is part of a natural cycle seen every 10 years or so on the glacier.

"The last big calving event occurred in 2001 so in general people have been expecting something like this to happen fairly soon, and for us it is very exciting to see this while it is happening," said IceBridge project scientist Dr Michael Studinger.

An iceberg of the size expected will need to be monitored carefully, and not just because it could eventually become a hazard to shipping. The biggest bergs can have a major impact on their surroundings. —Internet

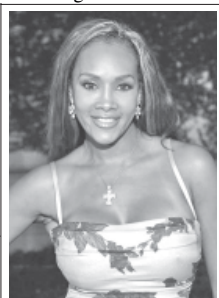

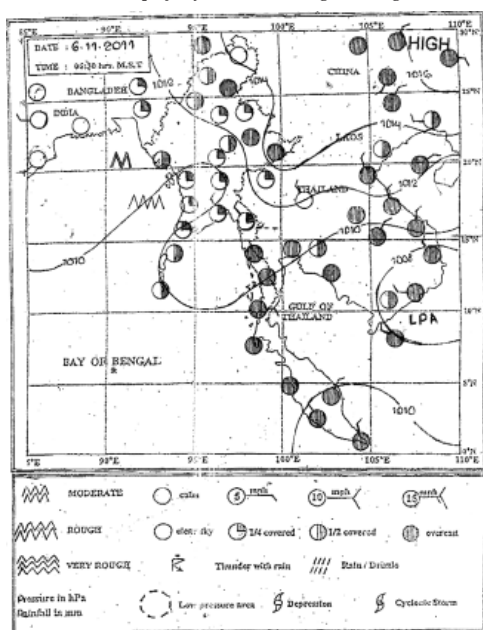

South Africa rising star gets six golds at World Cup Singapore

SINGAPORE, 6 Nov — South African teenager Chad Le Clos won another three gold medals on the second day of the FINA/Arena World Cup in Singapore, raising his gold total at the game to six. Le Clos finished men's 200-meter freestyle in one minute 43.80 seconds, and won the 100-meter butterfly title in 50.63 seconds. He eventually made it to six by winning the 200-meter individual medley in 1:54.06.

The 19-year-old said the success of American phenom Michael Phelps showed it was possible to compete in multiple events, though his foremost strength was still in the butterfly races. "So I am just trying to maximize my potential. You know, just to see how many events I can swim. It is not easy swimming a lot of events back to back. I am preparing myself for the future," he said.

Le Clos has been tipped to be a potential star at the London Olympics next year. He said he was trying to use the Singapore World Cup as an opportunity to teach himself how to race several events and race when he was tired. He said he would try

to compete in seven events at London, including two butterflys, two individual medleys and three relay events.

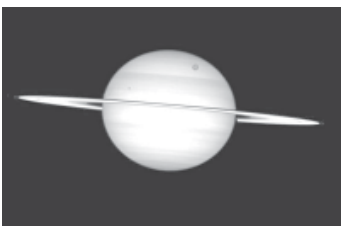
