### Support persons with disabilities

To promote an awareness of disability issues, the year 1981 was proclaimed the International Year of Disabled Persons and the period from 1982 to 1993 as the International Decade of Disabled Persons by the United Nations Development Program.

The 48<sup>th</sup> UN General Assembly held in 1993 marked the 3<sup>rd</sup> of every December as the International Day of Persons with Disabilities. In practical, those disabled persons do not need sympathy of other persons, and they can show their capabilities though they are disabled.

In accord with this year's motto "Together for a better world for all: Including Persons with Disabilities in development", everybody is to march towards the Millennium Development Goals by showing sympathy for life of the disabled persons to be able to enjoy the opportunity in equal term with other persons in the society.

### Self-reliant electricity supplied to Shan Village in Kangyidaunt Township

### Clinton holds “candid, productive” talks

YANGON, 2 Dec—The United States will support more aid for Myanmar and consider installing an ambassador after an absence of some two decades, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton said on Thursday, offering the first rewards for reform. Clinton said she had “candid, productive” conversations with President U Thein Sein and other Myanmar ministers and told them Washington stood ready to support further reforms and possibly lift sanctions.

Clinton’s landmark visit to the country marks a tentative rapprochement after more than 50 years of estrangement from the West.

After the talks with U Thein Sein and other officials, Clinton unveiled incremental steps to improve ties and said Washington would consider returning an ambassador to the country. Clinton also said the United States would support World Bank and International Monetary Fund assessment missions to help Myanmar jumpstart its economy, and new UN counter-narcotics and health cooperation programmes. Clinton invited Myanmar to become an observer to the Lower Mekong Initiative, a US-backed grouping discussing Southeast Asia’s major waterway.

Clinton also said the United States and Myanmar would discuss a joint effort to recover the remains of Americans killed during the building of the “Burma Road” during World War Two — mirroring steps taken with Vietnam as Washington and Hanoi sought to put their differences behind them. Clinton’s trip follows a decision by President Barack Obama last month to open the door to expanded ties, saying he saw “flickers of progress”. Clinton said it was up to Myanmar’s leaders to decide what came next.

### Suicide lorry bomb rocks Afghan town, killing bomber, wounding five

PUL-E-ALAM, (Afghanistan), 2 Dec—A suicide lorry bomb rocked Mohammad Aga District in Logar Province, some 60 km south of Afghan Capital Kabul, on Friday, killing the bomber and wounding five others, provincial police chief Rogh Lewanai confirmed.

“A terrorist riding an explosive-laden lorry and attempting to take the vehicle inside a military camp of foreign troops in Mohammad Aga District but failed and detonated it outside the compound, killing himself and injuring five others including a civilian and four policemen,” Lewanai told *Xinhua*.

There were no casualties on foreign troops, he said. However, he added that windowpanes of several houses around were smashed due to the heavy blast.—*Xinhua*

### Thailand cleans up, but some areas remain flooded

BANGKOK, 2 Dec—As Thailand’s floodwaters continue their slow journey to the sea, large swaths of the country have drained and dried, leaving behind a stinky, thick grime on everything touched by the nation’s worst deluge in more than a half century.

In many areas, people are returning to their houses armed with cleaning brushes, rubber gloves and masks to endure the sewer-like stench. But others whose homes are still inundated complain they’ve been forgotten, especially by residents of the capital

who escaped the flooding.

Nicha Rakpanichmanee, a 28-year-old graduate student, invited a group of friends to help clean her town house on Bangkok’s northern edge.

“I didn’t expect it to be like this ... the smell!” she said. Room by room, the cleaning team sprinkled disinfectant powder on everything covered by the thick filthy film, which spread 30 inches (80

centimetres) high during the three weeks Nicha’s neighbourhood was inundated. Other parts of Thailand were covered by more than 6 feet (2 metres) of water for two months.

Just down the street, her neighbours were not as lucky. “We haven’t even started cleaning yet. We’re just throwing things out. We’ve been throwing stuff out for three days now,” said Yai Kupatanorratt, 50, who sells women’s clothes at the popular Chatuchak weekend market. He threw out several bags and boxes of new clothes that he had stored at his home, as well as cabinets and other furniture.

### Los Angeles wind storm disrupts flights, cuts power

LOS ANGELES, 2 Dec—A powerful wind storm with gale-force gusts left much of the Los Angeles area strewn with toppled trees and downed power lines on Thursday, slowing traffic, damaging homes and knocking out electricity to over 350,000 customers.

An hourlong power outage at Los Angeles International Airport forced nearly two dozen inbound commercial flights to divert to other airports, and flight delays lingered even after electricity was restored, LAX spokeswoman Nancy Castles said.

Damaging high winds also extended into other regions of the West, including Utah, where power was cut to an additional 55,000 residents, and 10 tractor-trailer trucks were tipped over by crosswind gusts north of Salt Lake City.

Los Angeles County declared a state of emergency as a result of the winds, a move that hastens the ability of state and federal authorities to provide assistance, said Tony Bell, a spokesman for county Supervisor Mike Antonovich. Classes were cancelled for thousands of public school students in the area, and utility crews worked to restore electricity and remove uprooted trees and fallen limbs that littered

neighbourhoods, blocking streets in many places. Widespread power failures left traffic lights on the blink at many intersections.

Homes and parked automobiles were clobbered by fallen trees, with 42 damaged houses and apartment units declared unsafe for habitation by early afternoon in hard-hit Pasadena, but no serious injuries have been reported. —*Reuters*

### Navy detains seven suspected pirates in Seychelles

VICTORIA, 2 Dec—The navy has detained seven suspected pirates in the Seychelles, using a team of police dogs to detect the presence of firearms or explosives on their ship, officials said. “The seven suspected pirates are alleged to have been involved in an attempted act of piracy on a vessel that supplies the Seychelles tuna fleet,” the Foreign Office said in a statement.

They were detained by Royal Marines accompanied by a police

## UNSG's Message on the International Day of Persons with Disabilities

*"Together for a better world for all including persons with disabilities in development"*

**3 December 2011**

It is thirty years since the United Nations first observed the International Year of Disabled Persons under the theme "Full Participation and Equality". During that period, there has been significant progress in raising awareness about the rights of persons with disabilities and in strengthening the international normative framework to realize those rights – from the World Programme of Action (1982) to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2006).

More and more countries are committing to protecting and promoting the rights of persons with disabilities. However, many challenges remain. Persons with disabilities experience higher rates of poverty and deprivation and are twice as likely to lack health care. Employment rates of persons with disabilities in some countries are as low as one-third of that of the overall population. In developing countries, the gap in primary school attendance rates between children with disabilities and others ranges from 10 per cent to 60 per cent.

This multi-dimensional exclusion represents a huge cost, not only to persons with disabilities but to society as a whole. This year's International Day of Persons with Disabilities reminds us that development can only be sustainable when it is equitable, inclusive and accessible for all. Persons with disabilities need therefore to be included at all stages of development processes, from inception to monitoring and evaluation.

Addressing negative attitudes, the lack of services or ready access to them, and other harmful social, economic and cultural barriers will benefit all of society.

On this International Day of Persons with Disabilities, I call on governments, civil society and the global community to work for and alongside persons with disabilities to achieve inclusive, sustainable and equitable development worldwide.

## Oil hovers at \$100 ahead of key US jobs report **Business**

SINGAPORE, 2 Dec— Oil prices hovered above \$100 a barrel Friday in Asia as traders awaited a US jobs report for evidence about the strength of the US economy and demand for crude.

Benchmark crude for January delivery was down 4 cents to \$100.16 a barrel at midday Singapore time in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange. The contract fell 16 cents to settle at \$100.20 on Thursday.

In London, Brent crude was up 33 cents at \$109.32 on the ICE futures exchange.

Crude has jumped from \$75 during the last two months amid signs the US economy will likely avoid a recession. Investors will be closely watching the Labour Department's November unemployment report later Friday for evidence economic growth is strengthening, which could justify higher crude prices.

Analysts expect the economy added about 120,000 jobs last month.

Traders are also concerned about rising tensions over possible sanction against Iran, OPEC's second-largest producer, because of its nuclear programme. Some analysts, such as JP Morgan, say that Iran may pre-emptively cut oil exports if sanctions are imminent, a move that would send oil prices soaring.

"This would undoubtedly shock the oil market, and the initial market shock could be in the \$20 to \$30 per barrel range," JP Morgan said in a report. "The risks of such a disruption have materially increased."

In other Nymex trading, natural gas rose 0.2 cent at \$3.65 per 1,000 cubic feet. Heating oil added 3.2 cents to \$3.00 a gallon and gasoline futures gained 5.5 cents to \$2.61 a gallon.

## Gucci sales not slowing yet, has plan B ready **Business**

PARIS, 2 Dec— Luxury brand Gucci has not seen any impact on its business from global economic woes but it would be prepared to react quickly and cut costs if sales slowed, its chief executive said in a newspaper interview.

Patrizio di Marco told Le Figaro that Gucci, part of French luxury and retail group PPR, had a "Plan B" that could see it delaying store improvement work while sticking to its store opening programme.

"We are not seeing a slowdown in our growth at this time...(But) we cannot rule out an impact (of global economic woes) on our local markets," he said. "2012 may be difficult, but we must keep on investing for the medium and long-term."

Asked whether he was satisfied with Gucci's performance in France, di Marco said: "France is a difficult market. The brand is not known as much as it should be. Gucci must be the first Italian luxury brand that the French have in mind. We still have a growth potential."

To boost brand awareness, Gucci plans to open seven selling points in Galeries Lafayette stores across France.

## Zynga plans up to \$1 billion in IPO **Business**

NEW YORK, 2 Dec—Facebook games developer Zynga Inc will sell about 15 percent of its common stock in an initial public offering, Bloomberg said, citing a person with knowledge of the matter. Zynga plans to sell shares for \$8.50 to \$10 apiece in its initial public offering to raise as much as \$1 billion, valuing the company at as high as \$7 billion, the agency said.

Dani Dudeck, a spokeswoman for Zynga, declined to comment to Reuters on the Bloomberg report. Zynga rose to prominence on viral games such as "Farmville," which is still among one of the most popular games on the Facebook social network. While its games are free, Zynga makes money from selling virtual items such as tractors and weapons that people use in its game worlds.—Reuters

Port is under construction with the investment of Thailand, and on completion the water course will be shorter due to that fact that it is not necessary to pass Malacca Strait. Likewise, he added that Kyaukpyu Deep Sea Port is under construction at the

western coast of Myanmar. He said that a plan is underway to establish Thilawa Deep Sea Port Special Economic Zone in port city Yangon. In this regard, he said that investments were invited from neighbouring countries to cooperate in construction tasks.

## David Duke arrested in Germany

COLOGNE, (Germany) 2 Dec—David Duke, a former Louisiana legislator and leader in the Ku Klux Klan, was arrested in Germany, he confirmed on his Web site. While not releasing details, the former grand wizard of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan said he was arrested for a “gross twisting of travel laws.” *The (New Orleans) Times-Picayune* reported Wednesday.

The incident, Duke’s Web site indicated, involved a private, peaceful gathering of about 100 German citizens “eager to hear my message of heritage and freedom.” *The Huffington Post* said his arrest could be tied to Duke’s expulsion from the Czech Republic in 2009, where he was detained on suspicion of denying the Holocaust, which is a crime in many

European countries, including Germany. A statement by the Cologne police said Duke “was not entitled to stay in Germany” because of a travel ban against him in another European country, the newspaper said. Duke spent a year in a US prison in 2003 after pleading guilty to tax fraud and using supporters’ donations to pay gambling debts.—*Internet*

## Thousands flee communal clashes in central Nigeria


ABUJA, 2 Dec—Security forces have deployed in central Nigerian Villages after communal clashes killed at least eight people and forced thousands to flee their homes, officials said on Thursday. The clashes broke out last week pitting a local farming ethnic group known as Tivs against Fulani nomadic herdsman in Africa’s most populous nation. Police in Benue State said they recorded five deaths, while in neighbouring Nassarawa

state police said three clashes. Local media people were killed in the speculated that 50 people

Both the military and police were involved. “For now the situation is absolutely calm and security forces have been deployed to ensure the problem does not escalate,” said Benue state police spokesman Ejike Alaribe.—*Internet*

## VW Chattanooga plant gets green award

CHATTANOOGA, 2 Dec—Volkswagen AG's new assembly plant in Chattanooga, Tennessee, is the first auto plant to receive the top environmental award from the US Green Building Council, the company said on Thursday.

Frank Fischer, chief executive and chairman of Volkswagen Chattanooga, said that being green saves VW money on energy and water costs. The plant's paint shop alone will save 50 million gallons of water over 10 years, VW said.

The plant makes the Passat sedan. VW reported November US sales of about 6,000 of the cars, up from only about 300 a year earlier. The new Passat took the place of a sedan imported from Germany. Volkswagen's November US sales rose 41 percent to about 28,400 vehicles. VW was ninth among automakers in US sales through October, up from 10th in 2010.

The Chattanooga plant uses power from a local hydroelectric dam, and insulation of its walls will save 720,000 kilowatts per year on power, VW said.

The US Green Building Council awarded the plant its highest rating, a LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) green building certification.

## Germany plans to attract more foreign skilled workers

BERLIN, 2 Dec—Germany plans to lower its threshold for attracting more skilled workers and professionals from other countries to fill in its increasing deficiency, an expert commission's report said on Thursday.

A joint action plan, which was drafted by the cross-party and independent commission, made it clear that immigrants are soon to be exempted a work contract upon their entrance into Germany, only if they conform to the specific criteria for their expertises are truly in need.

"More and more German citizens become increasingly aware of the fact that immigration of alien talents into Germany bears positive effects on the country," according to the expert commission, led by former North Rhine-Westphalia integration minister Armin Laschet and former defence minister Peter Struck.

It vows to offer more generous and attractive appeal to overseas university students to stay to work in Germany after

their graduation, by providing more conveniences for their residency permits and ensuring that they feel being welcomed in Germany.

The ban on non-European Union workers should be compromised to some degree, like the USA, from where the skilled workers can be in favor of to work in Germany, in terms of their targeted and managed immigration, according to the report.

The German government will also cut down the minimum income as a prerequisite for a permanent residency from 66,000 euro to 48,000 euro a year, as foreign students shall be more likely to stay after graduations.

**US carmakers post strong November sales in US**

CHICAGO, 2 Dec — The three US largest carmakers, namely General Motors (GM), Ford and Chrysler, on Thursday reported strong vehicles sales in Nov this year on the US market with Chrysler leading the rise by a 45-percent year-on-year increase. Chrysler Group LLC reported that it sold 107,172 vehicles in the month, up 45 percent from Nov 2010, which represents the sixth consecutive month of sales gains and the company's best year-over-year sales gain this year.

The company saw its Chrysler, Jeep, Dodge and Ram Truck brand each post sales increases in

Nov, among which, the Chrysler brand's 92 percent sales increase was the largest percentage gain and was its best Nov since 2008. "Chrysler trucks and SUVs proved popular this month as winter began to hit the snow belt. The company has a range of relatively new vehicles including Durango and Compass, so there is appeal for many consumers," said Jessica Caldwell, a senior analyst with Edmunds.com, a leading market research company. Ford reported total sales of 166,865 vehicles in Nov, up from 147,338 a year earlier but down 0.6 percent from October's total.—Internet

**Researchers find new pool of stem cells in heart**

WASHINGTON, 2 Dec — Researchers have identified a new and relatively abundant pool of stem cells in the heart. The findings in the December issue of Cell Stem Cell, show that these heart cells have the capacity for long-term expansion and can form a variety of cell types, including muscle, bone, neural and heart cells. The researchers say the discovery may lay a foundation for much needed regenerative therapies aimed to enhance tissue repair in the heart. The damaged heart often doesn't repair itself well because of the incredibly hostile environment and wide-scale loss of cells, including stem cells, after a heart attack.

"In the end, we want to know how to preserve the stem cells that are there and to circumvent their loss," says Richard Harvey of the Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute in Australia.

**Action Comics Superman debut copy sells for \$2.16m**

NEW YORK, 2 Dec — A copy of the first issue of Action Comics, featuring Superman's debut, has become the world's most expensive comic, fetching \$2.16m (£1.4m). It was auctioned online for a starting bid of just \$1, with a reserve price of \$900,000.

The buyer or seller's name was not disclosed, but there is speculation it was owned by actor Nicolas Cage. It is the first time a comic book has broken the \$2m barrier. The issue was published in 1938 and cost 10 cents.

About 100 copies of Action Comics No 1 are thought to be in existence, and only a handful of those are in good condition. Another copy of the same issue sold for a then record-breaking \$1.5m in March last year.

REYKJAVIK, 2 Dec — Hundreds of metres under one of Iceland's largest glaciers there are signs of an imminent volcanic eruption that could be one of the most powerful the country has seen in almost a century. Mighty Katla, with its 10km (6.2 mile) crater, has the potential to cause catastrophic flooding as it melts the frozen

surface of its caldera and sends billions of gallons of water surging through Iceland's east coast and into the Atlantic Ocean.

"There has been a great deal of seismic activity," says Ford Cochran, the National Geographic's expert on Iceland. "There have been more than 500 tremors in and around the caldera of Katla just in the last month, which suggests the motion of magma. And that certainly suggests an eruption may be imminent." Scientists in Iceland have been closely monitoring the area since 9 July, when there appears to have been some sort of disturbance that may have been a small eruption.—Internet

**Motorbike stunt rider escapes with life after high-speed act goes disastrously wrong**

LONDON, 2 Dec — This is the astonishing moment a daredevil motorcyclist cheats death after smashing head-on into an oncoming car during a disastrous stunt.

The rider is filmed pulling off a series of impressive stunts with a fellow biker at the Beto Carrero World theme park in south-east Brazil when the performance goes horribly wrong.

After revving his motorbike with his colleague

at one end of the arena in front of a large crowd, the biker puts his foot down and speeds towards three oncoming red cars with the intention of dramatically weaving between them.

But while accelerating towards the cars, the rider misjudges his path during a wheelie and strays into the path of the vehicle. To the horror of spectators and his fellow stuntman, the biker ploughs headlong into the car, sending his body spinning 80ft through the air before slamming into the ground and rolling a further 40ft.

**How animals predict earthquakes**

LONDON, 2 Dec — Animals may sense chemical changes in groundwater that occur when an earthquake is about to strike. This, scientists say, could be the cause of bizarre earthquake-associated animal behaviour.

Researchers began to investigate these chemical effects after seeing a colony of toads abandon its pond in L'Aquila, Italy, in 2009 — days before a quake. They

suggest that animal behaviour could be incorporated into earthquake forecasting. The team's findings are published in the *International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health*.

In this paper, they describe a mechanism whereby stressed rocks in the Earth's crust release charged particles that react with the groundwater.

Animals that live in

or near groundwater are highly sensitive to any changes in its chemistry, so they might sense this days before the rocks finally "slip" and cause a quake.

The idea, which has not so far been

officially endorsed by Paris City Hall or the company that operates the Eiffel Tower, would transform the three-floor edifice of more than 300 metres (yards) into something akin to a very tall, and growing, Christmas tree.

Javaid, who used all denominations of coins for the car, which he dubbed "Pride of the Emirates," said he hopes his feat makes it into the *Guinness Book of World Records*.



After signing the basic bilateral agreements, the two nations would achieve greater success in cooperation in all sectors between the two countries.

In his address, the President said that China puts investments in laying of pipelines for transport of oil from Middle East to China through Yunnan Province via Myanmar and construction of railroads. Moreover, he said that other countries invested in deep sea port and other businesses. For example, he said that Dawei Deep Sea
