## Yangon Electricity Supply Corp opens 33/11 kV-5 MVA substation in Twantay

**Y**ANGON Electricity Supply Corporation opened its 33/11 kV-5 MVA substation in Twantay Township, the south district of Yangon Region, yesterday morning.

Union Minister for Electricity and Energy U Win Khaing attended the opening ceremony, and made a speech on power distribution in the region.

He emphasized the importance of public collaboration while the ministry is working for more distribution of electricity for socioeconomic development of people.

Out of 1,031 villages in the south district of the Yangon Region, electricity from the national grid has reached to 598 villages amounting 58 per cent

of the total villages in 2018-2019 fiscal year, increasing from 475 villages of 46 per cent in 2018.

For the entire area of the Yangon Region, 64 per cent of the villages have access to electricity in 2018-2019 fiscal year, and is expected to increase to 87 per cent in 2019-2020 FY. The Ministry has also targeted 100 percent power supply to the

whole region by December 2020.

Yangon Region Chief Minister U Phyo Min Thein also delivered a speech and Twantay Township Pyithu Hluttaw MP U Myint Lwin and Khettiya New Village' Administrator U Wunna Soe expressed thanks for the substation. — MNA

First, the Union Minister was briefed by Director-General U Kyaw Oo Lwin of the Department of Archeology and National Museum on the history of ancient Fort Danubyu, which was primarily constructed by the Mon kings and renovated by General Maha Bandoola to defend the British attacks; on the measures to maintain the fort by keeping its ancient style and avoiding the losses of its brick parts across the Ayeyawady River, with 2019-2020 financial year funds; and on

the measures to construct the necessary landscapes around it.

Next, the Union Minister and party watched the General Maha Bandoola Memorial Statute at the place within the compound of the State Pali University Uphill Monastery in Danubyu and gave instructions to make efforts to attract foreign visitors as well as to uplift morale of the next generations. He also paid homage to the Kyaikalunpun Pagoda and met members of the Pagoda's board of trustees. —MNA

## Yangon Nursing University holds graduation dinner

A total of 306 newly graduated nurses from Yangon and Mandalay will be employed soon at relevant hospitals for public healthcare services.

In 2017, Myanmar introduced a new nursing science curriculum which was designed with assistance of experts from the World Health Organization.

More midwives training schools were opened in the country, and recruitment rates were increased to 3,700 in each academic year of 2018-2019 and

the following year, expecting an increase to 4,500 in the upcoming academic year.

The 9-month courses are being conducted to generate 300 assistant nurses at the hospitals in Yangon and Mandalay, and at the 1,000-bedded hospital in Nay Pyi Taw.

At the 26<sup>th</sup> graduation ceremony of University of Nursing (Yangon), master degree certificates were conferred to 42 nurses, emergency nursing diploma to 4, bridge course to 199, bridge course (on campus) to 210, nursing science bachelor (regular) 123 and speciality nursing diploma to 74.—MNA

# MoHS receives donations of masks, personal protective suits

THE Ministry of Health and Sports received donations of face masks and protective suits from global Red Cross societies on 8 February to prevent infections of 2019-nCoV acute respiratory disease.

Union Minister Dr Myint Htwe attended the donation ceremony held at his office in Yangon.

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement partner groups, such as Myanmar Red Cross Society, Norwegian Red Cross, German Red Cross, Danish Red Cross, Turkish Red Crescent and Swedish Red Cross, donated 250 pairs of personal protective suits and 5,000 face masks worth about US\$16,500.

At the donation ceremony, MRC Chairman Dr Maung Maung Myint and officials said

their humanitarian group is coordinating with the MoHS to screen and control the transmission of coronavirus at the border crossings, and will also distribute educative posters and pamphlets published by the ministry and WHO.

The MRC has formed rapid response teams with 300 well-trained members to take action against acute infectious diseases.

## Alaungdaw Kathapa pagoda packed with pilgrims for Tabodwe Festival

PILGRIMS thronged the Alaungdaw Kathapa cave shrine at the Alaungdaw Kathapa National Park in Kani Township of Sagaing Region for the Tabodwe Festival.

Hundreds of pilgrims could be seen at the pagoda on 7 February, the day before the full moon day of Tabodwe, and on the night of the full moon on 8 February.

Alaungdaw Kathapa, an enlightened monk, passed away on the Tabodwe full moon day. On 7 February, local visitors flocked to the cave where the remains of Alaungdaw Kathapa have been preserved.

"The pilgrims visited the cave. Earlier, only 50-100 pilgrims were seen per day. This time, every guest house was filled with visitors.

The number of pilgrims on the full moon day was estimated at over 7,000-8,000," said U Aung Ko Lin, chair of the Alaungdaw Pagoda board of trustees.

It was attended by the MJA Chairman and executive members, professors and department heads of relevant universities, students chosen for the scholarship and their parents, and former scholarship recipients from 2014-2018.

During the ceremony, MJA Chairman U Saw Hla Min explained the reasons for providing the scholarship and its programme. He then conferred the allotted amount from the first-year stipend of K17,100,000 to each of the 57 students of 6 universities in Yangon Region.

## External trade crosses \$13 bln as of Jan-end

MYANMAR external trade between 1 October and 31 January in the 2019-2020 financial year reached US\$13.1 billion, an increase of \$1.78 billion compared to the corresponding period of the 2018-2019 fiscal, according to the Ministry of Commerce.

During the same period in the previous FY, trade stood at \$11.3 billion, according to data released by the ministry.

Myanmar foreign trade has shown a 10 per-cent increase, year over year, under the incumbent

government's term, said an official from the ministry.

Both maritime and border trade showed an increase in the current fiscal compared with the year-ago period, with exports estimated at over \$6.1 billion, and imports valued at \$6.98 billion.

Myanmar exports agricultural products, animal products, minerals, forest products, and finished industrial goods, while it imports capital goods, raw industrial materials, and consumer goods. The country's export sector

relies more on the agricultural and manufacturing sectors. Export earnings from the CMP (cutting, making, and packaging) garment businesses are rising, while reliance on natural resources, such as natural gas and jade, is lessening. The government is trying to reduce the trade deficit by screening luxury import items and boosting exports. Higher exports have helped trim the trade deficit in the current fiscal, according to the Commerce Ministry.—GNLM (Translated by Ei Myat Mon)

## Number of 24-hour ABC convenience stores to reach 300 in two years

THE ABC Group plans to increase the number of 24-hour convenience stores it operates across the country to 300 in two years. Small and medium enterprises will play a pivotal role in the expansion of ABC convenience stores, said officials.

"At present, SMEs are still struggling to grow in Myanmar. ABC convenience stores will allow SMEs to sell their products using special offers. Our retail business is expecting to expand the number of outlets to 300 in two

years across the country. The operator will cooperate with SMEs. Some products from SMEs are of good quality, but the enterprises do not know how to penetrate the market. We will help SMEs develop," said Mr Syed from ABC Convenience.

Currently, ABC convenience stores are located in Yangon, Mandalay, Nay Pyi Taw, and other big towns. The food suppliers for ABC stores are based in Mawlamyine, Myingyan, Heho, Kyaukpadaung, and other cities.

The food products are sold in line with the rules.

SMEs wishing to place their products in the stores are required to have an SME license and FDA certification. After obtaining an FDA certificate, the enterprises can tie up with ABC stores to sell products. The products can be sold under their logo or the ABC logo, according to ABC Convenience.—Myint Maung

## Annual inflation rate remains above 8% in Dec

THE annual rate of inflation in Myanmar, based on the Consumer Price Index, stood at 8.81 per cent in December, according to a report released by the Central Statistical Organization, under the Ministry of Planning, Finance and Industry.

The figure has remained above 8 per cent since June, 2019, while core inflation, which strips out volatile food and energy prices, has touched 9.96 per cent.

Last year, the inflation rate stood at 6.94 per cent in January, 7.07 per cent in February, 7.28 per cent in March, 7.51 per cent in April, 7.82 per cent in May, 8.08 per cent in June, 8.35 per cent in July, 8.53 per cent in August, 8.61 per cent in September, 8.6 per cent in October, 8.59 per cent in November, and 8.81 per cent in December.

The inflation rate began to climb gradually after January. It reached a peak in September, dipped slightly in November, and then jumped to its highest level in December.

In the month of December, the Myanmar Kyat strengthened against the US dollar. The price of imported oil dropped, but domestic fuel oil price remained on the higher side as locals headed out for vacations.

There was a remarkable increase in CPI in the food, household goods and maintenance, transportation, other commodities, clothing, health, education services, recreation, culture, non-food, and tobacco and beverages groups. The price of telecommunications stayed flat.

In December, Magway Region recorded the highest inflation rate of 12.23 per cent, followed by Sagaing Region (11.98 per cent), and Ayeyawady Region (11.03 per cent). The rate fluctuated with a maximum rate of 15.38 per cent recorded in Mandalay Region and a minimum of 3.16 per cent reported in Rakhine State.

Earlier, the inflation rate was calculated based on a 2006 survey. The base year was later changed to 2012. The Central Statistical Organization conducted a Household Income and Expenditure Survey in 82 townships in November 2012. To reduce inflation, the concerned authorities have been making efforts on the basis of policies on finance, trade, and foreign currency control, in keeping with the second five-year National Development plan.— Htet Myat

# Illegal drugs seized in Laukkai, Hsenwi, Mabein Tsps

A combined force containing police officers from the Drug Enforcement Division arrested a Chinese citizen named Lau Yi Xu in Laukkai Township on 8 February after discovering 24,000 psychotropic tablets on his person. He was walking along the Laukkai-Yanlonkyaing

Road when police apprehended him.

Similarly, officers arrested three people named Shauk Kyein Shone (a) Tarte, Kyauk Pi Shwin and Lauk Hua in the same afternoon after discovering 22,000 psychotropic tablets in the car they were driving on

the Muse-Mandalay Road near Oriental Tollgate, Hsenwi Township of Shan State.

Then on the evening of the same day, police arrested two people identified as Lapar and Zaw Yaw for illegal drug possession on the Mabein-Momeik Highway in Mabein Township. They were transporting 104,000 psychotropic tablets worth an estimated K208 million in their vehicle when they were apprehended.

Myanmar Police Force reports they have opened cases against all suspects under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law. —MNA

# As nations bicker, a greener future evolves in finance

LONDON— Away from the toxic atmosphere at climate summit talks, in boardrooms, banks and trading houses, a transformation in green finance is under way.

Its backers hope it could profitably help save the planet.

Regardless of the politics of climate change, there is real money to be made today in the exploding market for bonds and other instruments invested in environmentally sustainable projects.

But in the final analysis, uniform regulation derived from collective political action will be vital both for the markets and for the planet itself, observers ac-

knowledge.

Hard-nosed US investors in fields such as solar panels are not necessarily

driven by anxiety about global warming, Climate Bonds Initiative chief executive Sean Kidney said.

“Most of them are Republicans for god’s sake,” he said at a conference on climate finance organised

by the European Bank of Reconstruction and Development (EBRD) in London.

“They care only about price,” he added, predicting the transition to a low-carbon future would generate \$90 trillion investment by 2050 in areas including low-energy cooling, urban farming and greener transport.

Kidney’s independent organisation certifies “green bonds” issued by governments, municipalities and companies whose proceeds are devoted to sustainable development.

Notable issuers last month included the Metropolitan Transportation Authority in New York, one of

a slew of US cities unwilling to wait on President Donald Trump’s climate-sceptic administration as they vie to adapt their creaking infrastructures to a low-carbon future.

### Tipping point

The investment community more broadly is running ahead of climate politics, which have been stymied by the refusal of the United States and other major economies to chart a way forward on the 2015 Paris accord.

BlackRock, the world’s biggest asset management fund, shook the industry last month by announcing it would transition out of coal-based investments.—AFP ■

## Scientists race to develop vaccine for new coronavirus

BRISBANE— Scientists from the United States to Australia are using new technology in an ambitious, multi-million-dollar drive to develop a vaccine in record time to tackle China’s coronavirus outbreak.

The new virus has spread rapidly since emerging late last year in China, killing more than 800 people in the mainland and infecting over 37,000. Cases have been reported in two dozen other countries.

Coming up with any vaccine typically takes years, and involves a lengthy process of testing on animals, clinical trials on humans and regulatory approvals.

But several teams of experts are racing to develop one quicker, backed by an international coalition that aims to combat

emerging diseases, and Australian scientists hope theirs could be ready in six months.

“It is a high-pressure situation and there is a lot of weight on us,” said senior researcher Keith Chappell, part of the group from Australia’s University of Queensland.

But the scientist added he took “some solace” knowing several teams around the world were engaged in the same mission.

“The hope is that one of these will be successful and can contain this outbreak,” he said.

But even a timeframe of six months looks agonisingly slow with the virus, believed to have emerged from a market selling wild animals, killing close to 100 people every day in mainland China.—AFP ■

## Food-share apps seeking to help environment

LONDON — Jack Convery pops into a London branch of Italian eatery Coco di Mama to grab a cut-price lunch ordered on his smartphone’s food-sharing app Karma.

The 27-year-old Amazon employee with an eye for a bargain and for helping the environment uses a mobile phone app that sells surplus food from hundreds of UK restaurants at discounted prices.

“Anything I can do to help the environment and look after the budget as well is beneficial, so yeah, it’s a win-win,” Convery tells AFP after collecting his bag from the counter near Old Street Tube station. “It ends up working out much cheaper than to go to (British supermarket) Tesco and buy a meal for one,” he adds, noting that he can usually source his daily dinner for about £3.50 (\$4.54, 4.10 euros) via the app.

Decomposing food waste is a key source of greenhouse gases — and a staggering one third of all food is thrown away, according to industry estimates.

### Environmental danger

Amid growing public outcry over the climate emergency, consumers are

switching on to the environmental danger of carbon dioxide and methane emissions.

Britain’s cafes and restaurants are also embracing apps that generate some revenue from rescued food that would otherwise be destined for landfill.

However some restaurants

happily give unsold food to homeless charities on a daily basis.

Swedish start-up Karma was founded in Stockholm in 2016 and its app now helps serve 1.0 million users in Britain, France and home market Sweden. In the UK alone, it offers 2,000 outlets.—AFP ■

## Four rare mountain gorillas ‘killed by lightning’ in Uganda

KAMPALA — Four endangered mountain gorillas, including three adult females, have been killed by an apparent lightning strike in a Ugandan national park, a conservation group has said.

A post-mortem examination has been performed on the four, including a male infant,

who died on February 3 in Mgahinga National Park in southwest Uganda.

“Based on the gross lesions from the post-mortem... the tentative cause of death for all four individuals is likely to be electrocution by lightning,” the Greater Virunga Transboundary Collaboration (GVTC)

said in a statement Saturday, although laboratory confirmation will take two to three weeks.

The four were members of a group of 17 known as the Hirwa family which had crossed into the Mgahinga National Park in August last year from Volcanoes National Park in neighbouring

Rwanda.

“This was extremely sad,” GVTC executive secretary Andrew Seguya told the BBC.

“The potential of the three females for their contribution to the population was immense.”

The other 13 members of the group had been found.—AFP ■

# Cooperation, consensus key for IDP resettlement success

ARMED conflicts uprooted scores of people from their homes in Myanmar and forced them to take shelter in camps for the displaced in Kachin, Shan, Kayin, and Rakhine states.

Even after the armed conflicts ceased, the issue of internally displaced persons (IDPs) remained unresolved for years.

At present, to close IDP camps and resettle the internally displaced with dignity, a National Strategy, written in keeping with current requirements and international standards, has been adopted.

The government will keep open some IDP camps where they are still needed, such as Kachin and Shan states. It will close some camps which are no longer needed or deemed necessary.

The policy of the government would ensure the displaced people rebuild their lives with safety and dignity, without depending on others.

To achieve this, the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement is implementing a strategy after listening to the voice of the displaced people. For the resettlement of IDPs, their place of origin, any site near their place of origin, or a site proposed by them is being given priority.

The Union government has guaranteed that it would implement projects to provide IDPs sheltering at camps with a place to resettle and job opportunities.

There are many children living in IDP camps. For the progress of the country, the future of our next generation is very important. For the successful implementation of its strategy, details about the government's plans need to be provided at IDP camps in Kayin, Kachin, Rakhine and

Shan states till inmates gain confidence to return to their place of origin or a place of their choice in future.

At the meetings held so far between IDPs and the authorities, the IDPs have expressed their worries about jobs, dwellings, and health services. Hence, the government is obliged to address their worries by systematically implementing its strategy in cooperation with the people, donors, and civil society organizations.

At the same time, the cooperation of IDPs is sine qua non for making the implementation a success.

Since the government took office, it has been focusing on ethnic affairs and ending armed conflicts. Peace and development are intertwined.

For the development of the people, ethnic armed groups are obliged to ensure long-lasting peace. In fact, the resettlement of IDPs can be considered as part of the efforts for building a Federal Democratic Union desired by all ethnic people.

Hence, participation by the people with the Union Spirit is a must for all of us.

# ONE HEART, ONE WAY

WHEN we were very very small, before we had even learned to read, we loved to listen to the tales grandpa or teachers told us. As far as 'Unity' is concerned, they told us a story about an old man and a bundle of sticks.

"Once upon a time, there was an old man who was troubled because his sons were always quarrelling. He was afraid that the family would be quite broken up when he died. So one day, he called his sons together and showed them a bundle of sticks, and asked them to break it. They tried in turn but they failed. Then the old man untied the bundle and told them to break each stick. The sons broke the sticks easily. In this way, he taught them that UNITY IS STRENGTH."

The story is very short and very simple. However, it shows the essence of unity that has to be conveyed to generation by generation. The story, indeed, is and will be true for a country like Myanmar which is home to over one hundred national races.

Besides, when we were in the primary standards, teachers usually told about the great French general, Napoleon, who used to say, "Divide and Conquer". He won victories by attacking one of his enemies when alone before the others could come up to help. He would weaken a whole nation by dividing it up into quarrelling

parties. The lesson that we have learned is "United we stand, divided we fall".

Now, we are going to celebrate the 73<sup>rd</sup>. Anniversary Union Day. Actually, Union Day is the symbol of unity which is the strength of all the nationalities. Every year in February, whenever the Union Day draws near, one cannot but help calling to mind the past events leading to the signing of the Panglong Agreement.

A look into history reveals that the people of this republic have lived in harmony and unity, sharing joys and sorrows, in weal or woe, despite subjugation and hardship under foreign rule and in time of war. Myanmar's feudal history saw her indigenous peoples caught in the iron grip of feudal forces, too strong for them to repel or reform. Besides, under the imperialist yoke, our history also recorded that all the national races of Myanmar had far lagged behind.

"...Breed within self since upon the union spirit, democracy federal citizen spirit that was in accordance with a democracy political system and federal system. Recognize the diversities within the union-born ethnic nationals. Our youths are urged to display mutual respect, sympathy and provide assistance to establish the nation's unity of strength.

Regarding the nation's unity of strength, President U Win Myint said so at the Youths All-Round Development Festival (Magway) held on 14 December, 2019. We should not forget it.

The 12<sup>th</sup> February, 1947 on which the Panglong Agreement was signed as a vivid manifestation of the unity and solidarity among the national races has been designated as "Union Day". The Union Day celebrations have been held every year with full political

## Thai city holds vigil for 30 victims of ‘unprecedented’ mass shooting

NAKHON RATCHASIMA (Thailand)— Holding candles and writing condolences as monks chanted prayers, hundreds of Thais held an evening vigil Sunday for the 30 victims of an “unprecedented” mass shooting carried out by a soldier.

Sharpshooters killed the gunman on Sunday morning after a 17-hour ordeal, including a night of firefights and terrifying dashes for mall exits by shoppers trapped in the Terminal 21 mall in Nakhon Ratchasima, also known as Korat.

The provincial governor told reporters that the death toll stood at 30 with dozens injured.

The dead include civilians -- one of them a 13-year-old boy -- and security forces going after the rogue soldier, who was upset over a debt dispute, according to Thailand’s prime minister Prayut Chan-O-Cha.

“It is unprecedented in Thailand, and I want this to be the last time this crisis happens,” he said earlier outside a hospital where victims -- some

in critical condition -- were being treated.

Those who attended the somber vigil scrawled messages on white sheets of paper laid out

on the ground, including “Remember Forever” and “I wish you a good afterlife”.

Prayut, a former army chief, blamed a “personal prob-

lem” over the sale of a house for the soldier’s rampage, which began on Saturday afternoon near an army barracks and was for several hours relayed by the gunman via Facebook posts.

The attacker, identified as Sergeant-Major Jakrapanth Thomma, used a stolen M60 machine gun and rifles from one of Thailand’s largest barracks as well as a military humvee to carry out the attack.

Prayut said the gunman overpowered security at the barracks’ arsenal and that “carelessness” was not a factor.

“We don’t leave the arsenal depot alone -- we had people guarding it.”

Volley of gunfire rang out as the siege ran into dawn, hours after Thai security services stormed the ground floor and freed scores of terrified shoppers.—AFP

## Surrendered Pakistani Taliban spokesman escapes custody: official

ISLAMABAD — A leading member of the Pakistan Taliban has escaped custody more than two years after surrendering to authorities, a senior security official said Sunday.

The confirmation comes days after Ehsanullah Ehsan -- the former spokesman for the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) -- released an audio message claiming he had escaped detention and was now in Turkey.

A senior security source told

AFP Ehsan was “one of our major assets in identifying and later tracking down militants”.

The source was unable to confirm claims that Ehsan was in Turkey, or provide details of how he escaped.

Ehsan was infamous for issuing chilling claims following TTP attacks and has been linked to some of the country’s most bloody attacks -- including the bombing at a park in Lahore during Easter 2016, and the tar-

geting of education activist and Nobel Peace Prize winner Malala Yousafzai.

Ehsan surrendered to authorities in 2017 and later gave high-profile interviews on Pakistani television, angering many in the country who believed he was being pampered by authorities after years of helping lead the bloody insurgency. Pakistani security officials argued, however, that he had supplied valuable intelligence in the fight against militants. Pakistan has been battling a homegrown Islamist insurgency for over a decade, with thousands of civilians and security personnel dying in extremist attacks, especially after the TTP began their campaign of violence in 2007.

Overall levels of extremist-linked violence have dropped dramatically last year, with 2019 seeing the fewest deaths since 2007 when TTP was formed.

Analysts have credited the fall to military offensives against the Taliban in the tribal areas of North Waziristan and Khyber where they were headquartered, as well as operations in the country’s largest city of Karachi.—AFP

## China virus deaths rise past 800, overtaking SARS toll

BEIJING — The death toll from the novel coronavirus surged past 800 in mainland China on Sunday, overtaking global fatalities in the 2002-03 SARS epidemic, even as the World Health Organization said the outbreak appeared to be stabilising.

With 89 more people dying -- most in Hubei, the province at the centre of the outbreak -- the toll is now higher than the 774 killed worldwide by Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), according to official figures.

The latest data came after the WHO said the last four days had seen “some stabilising” in Hubei, but warned the figures

can still “shoot up”.

Almost 37,200 people in China have now been infected by the virus, believed to have emerged late last year in Hubei’s capital Wuhan, where residents are struggling to get daily supplies.

The epidemic has prompted the government to lock down whole cities as anger mounts over its handling of the crisis -- especially after a whistleblowing doctor fell victim to the virus.

With much of the country still not back at work after an extended Lunar New Year holiday, cities including financial hub Shanghai ordered residents to wear masks in public.—AFP

## Japan launches, puts in orbit new intelligence-gathering satellite

TOKYO — Japan launched Sunday a rocket carrying a government intelligence-gathering satellite which was successfully placed into orbit after the previous takeoff attempt was scrubbed due to a glitch during the countdown.

The H2A rocket, operated by Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Ltd. and the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency, lifted off from the Tanegashima Space Center in the southwestern prefecture of Kagoshima at 10:34 a.m.

It is the 35th time in a row that an H2A rocket has been launched successfully.

The launch, previously set for Jan. 28, was pushed back due to a leak in piping used to supply the rocket with nitrogen gas.

The optical satellite will take over from one of seven reconnaissance satellites believed to be monitoring developments at North Korean missile sites, among other tasks.

#### UK cat and dog food market to hit 3.8 bln USD in 2020: report

LONDON — Britons are predicted to spend 2.9 billion pounds (about 3.8 billion U.S. dollars) on cat and dog food this year, with the market value rising by 16 percent over the past five years, a market research firm has said. Premiumization and overall inflation have been the driving force behind value growth, said London-based Mintel in a report released Friday.

About 60 percent of Britons own some kind of pet, according to the report. Meanwhile, data from Mintel also revealed that some 27 percent of dog owners cooked from scratch or served leftovers to their pets in 2019, up from 22 percent in 2018. The scratch cooking and serving leftovers among cat owners represented 21 percent in 2019, higher than in 2018 with 13 percent.—Xinhua

## German transportation company to build Luanda Surface Metro

LUANDA — German transportation company Siemens Mobility will build the "Luanda Surface Metro" in Angola under a Public-Private Partnership this year, according to a memorandum of understanding (MoU) signed on Friday.

Michael Peter, chief executive officer of the company, signed the MoU with Angola's Transport Minister Ricardo de Abreu during the Angola-Germany Economic Forum held in the capital city of Luanda.

The minister said the Surface Metro line will cover a dis-

tance of 149 km, and the cost of the project is estimated at 3 billion U.S. dollars, with 30 percent of the cost to be assumed by Angola.

The German government has also made available a loan valued at 1.06 billion euros (about 1.16 billion dollars) to finance the construction of the Caculo Cabaca hydroelectric dam in the northern Cuanza Norte Province.

A total of four MoUs on cooperation were signed between the two countries during the forum.—XINHUA

## Hong Kong border towns welcome virus controls, despite trade hit

HONG KONG — Traders in Hong Kong's border towns are lamenting plunging business during the coronavirus outbreak but some residents say they are enjoying the absence of crowds of Chinese mainlanders.

The influx of migrants, tourists and traders has long been a controversial topic as the financial hub increasingly chafes under Beijing's authoritarian rule and the ever-rising cost of living.

The polarisation is especially stark in towns along the city's

border with mainland China.

They have become huge draws for "parallel traders" who buy up tax-free goods for re-sale in China, a booming trade but one that worsens over-crowding and spiralling commercial rents.

However, the coronavirus outbreak has closed all but two of the city's land borders with the mainland.

And on Saturday officials rolled out plans attempting to ensure -- with spot checks and daily phone calls -- that all arrivals

from the mainland undergo 14 days of compulsory quarantine.

Parked next to one of the shuttered checkpoints earlier

this week, a minibus driver said he had waited for three hours without picking up a single passenger.—AFP

Being producer of the event, The Toy Association will present its latest global market research on Japan as one of the highlights of this year's Fair, aiming to provide in-depth analyses to help companies expand their business in the Japanese market, according to the website of the Fair.

"Due to declining birthrates, children represent just under 13 percent of Japan's population of about 126 million - far less than leading markets such as the United States and China," said Anne McConnell, The Toy Association's senior director of market research & data strategy. Xinhua



## Cameroon elections overshadowed by violence, boycott

YAOUNDE — Cameroon voted Sunday in polls overshadowed by a partial opposition boycott and separatist violence that has displaced hundreds of thousands of people.

Elections for the central African country's legislature and local councils are taking place for the first time in seven years, after two postponements.

They are unlikely to ruffle the enduring rule of President Paul Biya, one of the world's oldest and longest-serving leaders, who has held a tight grip on power for 37 of his 86 years.

As voting began large numbers of police and soldiers were seen deployed on the streets of Buea, the capital of the Southwest Region, one of two provinces gripped by bloody separatist violence.

But polling stations in the city were quiet with no violence reported about four hours after they opened at 8am (0700 GMT).

Most of the morning's voting appeared to have been done by members of the secu-

rity forces, deployed to keep the peace.

The main opposition party, the Movement for the Rebirth of Cameroon (MRC) is refusing to field a single candidate.

The boycott will all but guarantee a crushing victory for the ruling Cameroon People's Democratic Movement (RDPC in its French initials), which in the outgoing legislature had 148 out of 180 seats.

The other large opposition

party, the Social Democratic Front (SDF), which currently has 18 seats, will take part in Sunday's vote, going back on a threat to snub it.

In the capital Yaounde, it appeared that enthusiasm for the vote was subdued, with no crowds outside polling stations in the district of Briqueterie.

"People went to mass first, there'll be more coming in the afternoon," said one election official.—AFP ■

## Iran unveils ballistic missile, 'new generation' engines

TEHRAN— Iran's Revolutionary Guards unveiled Sunday a short-range ballistic missile that they said can be powered by a "new generation" of engines designed to put satellites into orbit.

The Guards' Sepahnews website said the Raad-500 missile was equipped with new Zohair engines made of composite materials lighter than on earlier steel models.

It also unveiled Salman engines made of the same materi-

als but with a "movable nozzle" for the delivery of satellites into space.

The Raad was "a new generation missile that has half the weight of a Fateh-110 missile but with 200 kilometres more range," it added.

The Fateh-110 is a ballistic ground-to-ground missile first unveiled in 2002. Its latest generation has a range of 300 kilometres (186 miles).

Islamic Revolutionary

Guard Corps commander Major General Hossein Salami unveiled the missile and engines alongside IRGC aerospace chief Brigadier General Amirali Hajizadeh.

"The complicated achievements on the bleeding edge of global technology that were unveiled today are our key to entering space," Salami said.

Salami noted the movable nozzle on the new engine allowed "manoeuvrability beyond the atmosphere" and amounted to a "leap in modern missile technology".

The new technologies that made the missiles "cheaper, lighter, faster and more precise" could be applied to all of Iran's missile classes, he added.

Tensions between Iran and its arch foe the United States have soared since May 2018 when US President Donald Trump withdrew from a nuclear deal that offered Tehran sanctions relief in return for curbs to prevent it acquiring nuclear weapons.—AFP ■

## Greek asylum to refugees 'not indefinite' and reversible: minister

ATHENS — Greece will only grant refugee protection for three years as it struggles to integrate foreigners, the conservative government's migration minister Notis Mitarachi said in remarks published Sunday.

Greece last year was the first EU port of entry for migrants and has struggled to manage the influx, with many kept in overcrowded camps on the Aegean Greek islands near the Turkish coast.

"The asylum we grant has a duration of three years, it is not indefinite," Mitarachi told *To Vima* weekly.

"If conditions change in a country (of origin), asylum may not be renewed," Mitarachi added.

"It is difficult to integrate different populations," he said.

More than 36,000 asy-

lum-seekers are currently crammed into camps on five islands, where the official capacity is for 6,200 people and in conditions repeatedly condemned by aid agencies.

Overpopulation in migrant camps on Lesbos and other islands near Turkey has led to an outpouring of anger in recent days among island residents and asylum-seekers.

Since the migration crisis erupted in 2015, mainly fuelled by the war in Syria, Greece has granted asylum to around 40,000 people, Mitarachi said.

Another 87,000 asylum applications are pending, he added.

Repatriation of asylum-seekers whose applications are rejected are to be discussed in an overhaul of EU migration policy next month, the minister said.—AFP ■

## Germany stresses importance of confidence-building measures in Libya

TRIPOLI — German Ambassador to Libya Oliver Owczar on Saturday stressed the importance of confidence-building measures in Libya, which is witnessing deadly armed conflict between the eastern-based army and the United Nations-backed government.

"Respect to all participants of this first round of intra-Libyan ceasefire talks. Encouraging signal that a date for continuation has been set," Owczar tweeted.

"Any confidence-building measures are to the benefit of all Libyans. Likewise progress on the political and economic tracks (is) necessary," said the

ambassador.

The United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL) on Saturday said that the country's rival parties said they are trying to maintain the truce in and around the capital Tripoli at the conclusion of the first round of talks of the Libyan 5+5 Joint Military Commission (JMC) in Geneva.

"UNSMIL takes note of the existing consensus around the importance of maintaining the truce that had been announced on 12 January this year, of the necessity to respect it and refrain from violating it," UNSMIL said in a statement.—Xinhua ■



## Port chaos leaves Liberian fuel pumps dry

MONROVIA — Liberians have faced long queues at petrol pumps for nearly two weeks as sloppy bookkeeping and poor port infrastructure have triggered economically damaging fuel shortages.

Incorrect fuel-reserve figures in the impoverished West African country partly led to the shortage, which has dragged on since late January, an industry official said.

But an undredged port in the capital Mon-

rovia has also prevented large fuel tankers from docking, according to port and government officials.

Liberia's Commerce Minister Wilson Tarpeh told AFP the shortage has caused an "economic downtrend", without giving precise figures.

Consumers are spending less on household items as fuel prices rise, he said, and businesses are operating under capacity.

Liberia suffers fre-

quent fuel shortages, but the current one has lasted an unusually long time. Queues forming before dawn at petrol stations are now commonplace, and scarcity has forced taxis and buses to hike fares.

"I have been here since 5:00 am but until now I am yet to receive gasoline," said Victor Gray, 45, at a Monrovia petrol station at 8:00 am this week.

"I think the kids will miss class today," he added, exhausted after he and his children slept in the car.

The shortage is another blow to President George Weah, who is under increasing pressure to improve living conditions in the country of some 4.8 million people.

He inherited an economy already devastated by back-to-back civil wars from 1989 to 2003, and by the 2014-2016 West Africa Ebola outbreak.—AFP ■

## India's railway project with Japan faces \$4.5 bil. budget shortfall

TOKYO — Japan plans to discuss how to proceed with a high-speed railway project in India employing Japan's shinkansen technology after its estimate found a budget shortfall of some 500 billion yen (\$4.56 billion), a source close to the matter said Saturday.

The cost for the project connecting around 500 kilometers between Mumbai and Ahmedabad rose from the previous budget of 980 billion rupees (\$14.68 billion) after India called for building a reinforced elevated bridge and using shield machines for excavations, the source said.

The shortage is the latest setback for the iconic project in Japan-India partnership after the commercial operation was pushed back by five years from originally scheduled 2023 following a site acquisition delay.

Minister Shinzo Abe and his Indian counterpart Narendra Modi plan to discuss the matter at a summit.

The two leaders agreed in December 2015 on the introduction of the bullet train technology to India, which would be the country's first high-speed railway project.

Under the agreement, Japan pledged to provide

loans of up to about 1.46 trillion yen for the railway construction led by Indian companies.

Japan International Consultants for Transportations Co., a subsidiary of East Japan Railway Co., has taken part in the project to help provide trains, while the parent company looks to offer maintenance and driver training services.—Kyodo News ■

## Judo champion Riner loses after nine years undefeated

ONE of sport's longest winning runs came to an end on Sunday when two-time Olympic and serial judo world champion Teddy Riner was beaten for the first time in over nine years.

After 154 successive wins, the 30-year-old Frenchman, who competes in the 100-kilogramme heavyweight category, was beaten by ippon by the Japanese Kokoro Kageura in the third round of the Paris Grand Slam.

Riner's last defeat was back in September 2010 when he was controversially beaten by another Japanese Daiki Kamikawa in the openweight final at the world championships in Tokyo.

The defeat comes five months before the Tokyo Olympics when Riner will hope to emulate the lightweight judoka Tadahiro Nomura in winning gold at three successive Olympics.

"If this happens at the

Games I'll be annoyed. Better this happens now than then," a light-hearted Riner said afterwards.

"But I'll tell you another thing too. It's a relief in a way. Counting wins as I closed in on (Yasuhiro) Yamashita's record (203 wins) was really heavy."

Yamashita, whose run began in 1977, won four world titles and gold at the Los Angeles Games in 1984 before retiring in 1985 with his record intact.

He did not take part in the 1980 Olympics in Moscow because of a Japanese boycott over the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan.

Ten-time world champion Riner's record still ranks alongside some of the greats of the sporting world.

American hurdler Ed Moses won 122 consecutive races over a 10-year period from 1977 to 1987, and Pakistani squash legend Jahangir Khan won 555 successive matches from 1981

to 1986.

Boxing has also thrown up at least two remarkable winning streaks.

Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano never lost a fight in his professional career, winning 49 in a row between 1947 and 1955 while the Mexican Julio Cesar Chavez, a world champion at three different weights, won 87 consecutive fights before drawing with Pernell Whitaker in 1993.—AFP ■
