Taw yesterday morning.

Diplomatic Relations Established between the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and the United Arab Emirates (UAE)

THE Republic of the Union of Myanmar and the United Arab Emirates (UAE), desirous of establishing friendly ties and cooperation guided by the principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations and the norms of International Law in accordance with the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations and the Vienna Convention on Consular Relations, have established diplomatic relations at the level of Ambassadors with effect from 9

November 2020.

The Joint Communiqué on the Establishment of Diplomatic Relations was signed by Ambassador U Kyaw Moe Tun, Permanent Representative of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar to the United Nations and Ambassador Ms. Lana Zaki Nusseibeh, Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates to the United Nations in New York, on 9 November 2020 at the Permanent Mission of the United

Arab Emirates to the United Nations. The agreement to establish diplomatic relations between Myanmar and the UAE was approved by the Fourth Regular Session of the first term of the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw held on 17 July 2012.

The United Arab Emirates is the 125 country with which Myanmar has established diplomatic relations. The UAE has already established diplomatic relations with all the ASEAN member states.—MNA

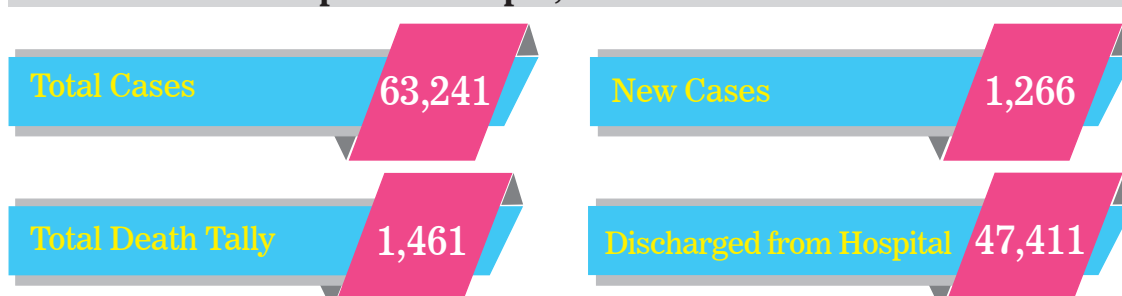
It also said that Myanmar people confirmed the commitment to democracy and progress through their active participation in the Election.

The Embassy of the Russian Federation wished peace and prosperity to friendly people of Myanmar.—MNA

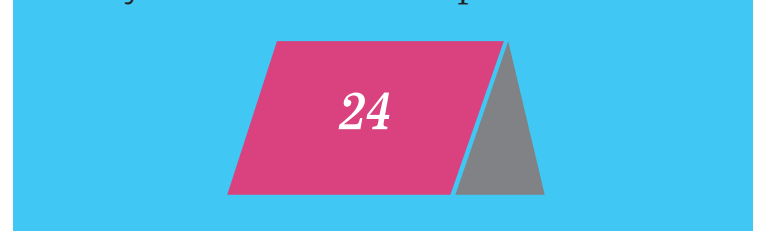
1,266 new cases of COVID-19 reported on 10 November, total figure rises to 63,241

A new hall at the United Pentecostal Church (UPC) in Haka, Chin State was inaugurated with Vice President U Henry Van Thio yesterday morning.

Nay Pyi Taw, 10 November

The 2020 General Election was held on 8 November. In accordance with Section 77 of the respective Hluttaw Election By-law, all Hluttaw representatives who contested the election must submit their election expenditures using Form 20 to their respective sub-commissions within 30 days from the date of announcing the names of the elected MPs by the Region/State Election Sub-commission.

If they and their representatives fail to submit their election expenditures, they will be declared disqualified under section 84 of the respective Election By-law. So, we would like to call on the elected MPs and their representatives to submit their election expenditures by the deadline.

Order 147/2020

(10 November 2020)

The Ministry of Health and Sports issued this notification in the exercise of the power conferred under section 21 (b) of the Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases Law.

1. The Ministry issued a new notification, taking effect on 16-8-2020, that did not allow for the gathering of 30 and above, increasing from the previous number of 15, except the matters included in the orders on banning of occasions in the effort to prevent and control the spread of COVID-19.
2. However, the public gathering is still found although the Multiparty Democracy General Election was completed on 8 November 2020.
3. As the risk of COVID-19 spread remains high, effective actions will be taken against any violation of orders and directives issued by the Ministry in accordance with the existing rules and laws.

Social distancing is mandatory to prevent COVID-19

IN the face of challenges brought by the COVID-19 pandemic, we concluded the 2020 General Elections successfully.

The people voted in it following health guidelines amidst the COVID-19 pandemic and helped the country to maintain the integrity of the democratic process.

After the elections, have a lot of work ahead of us. The post-election period has brought calls for us to work together to contain, prevent and treat the coronavirus infection, as well as to address other challenges, such as working hard to achieve economic recovery during the post-COVID-19 period.

However, there are some crowds celebrating the results of the elections without following the social distancing regulations. This negligence in following the health guidelines released by the Ministry of Health and Sports can threaten the success of our fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Ministry of Health and Sports has banned the gathering of 30 or more people since 6th August, 2020, except for the events mentioned in the order, in a bid to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus.

This limitation is difficult, but it is necessary to prevent the spread of the coronavirus across our country.

According to the Ministry, anyone violating the order could face fines or other punishments, as set out in the Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases Law.

Those who violate the restrictions imposed by the health authorities under the

Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases Law can face six month jail term or Ks. 50,000 or both

We would like to remind the people that the Ministry of Health and Sports has warned again yesterday that those who do not follow social distancing rules would face legal punishment.

It is not a normal situation when crowds are celebrating without following mandatory social distancing rules while the country is seeing over 1,000 positive coronavirus cases daily.

The fight against coronavirus stands or falls on whether the people follow the health guidelines. It is the duty of good citizens to follow the directives of the health authorities.

The current situation, with crowds on roads without following social distancing, makes it challenging for enforcement on the ground.

To effectively stop the source of infection, we need to put in place aggressive, adequate and immediate measures.

Can 'Open Science' speed up the search for a COVID-19 vaccine? 5 things you need to know

The UN is calling for authoritative scientific information and research to be made freely available, to accelerate research into an effective vaccine against the COVID-19 virus, help counter misinformation, and "unlock the full potential of science".

ARGUING that no-one is safe until everyone is safe, the World Health Organization (WHO) has, for several months, been urging countries and scientists to collaborate, in a bid to bring the pandemic under control. This has involved the creation, alongside governments, scientists, foundations, the private sector and other partners, of a groundbreaking platform to accelerate the development of tests, treatments and vaccines.

In October, the head of the agency, Tedros Ghebreyesus Adhanom, alongside human rights chief Michelle Bachelet, and Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of science, culture and education agency UNESCO, issued a call for "Open Science", describing it as a "fundamental matter of human rights", and arguing for cutting-edge technologies and discoveries to be available for those who need them most.

But what exactly does Open Science mean, and why does the UN insist on making it more widespread?

(1) What is 'Open Science'?

Open Science has been described as a growing movement

aimed at making the scientific process more transparent and inclusive by making scientific knowledge, methods, data and evidence freely available and accessible for everyone.

The Open Science movement has emerged from the scientific community and has rapidly spread across nations. Investors, entrepreneurs, policy makers and citizens are joining this call.

However, the agency also warns that, in the fragmented scientific and policy environment, a global understanding of the meaning, opportunities and challenges of Open Science is still missing.

(2) Why is Open Science important?

Open Science facilitates scientific collaboration and the sharing of information for the benefit of science and society, creating more and better scientific knowledge, and spreading it to the wider population.

UNESCO has described Open Science as a "true game changer": by making information widely available, more people can benefit from scientific and technological innovation.

(3) Why is it needed now?

Because, in a world that is more inter-connected than ever

before, many of today's challenges do not respect political or geographic borders, and strong international scientific collaboration is essential to overcome the problems. The COVID-19 pandemic is a prime example.

We also have the tools to make it happen: with digitalization becoming ever more widespread, it is far easier than ever before to share scientific knowledge and data, which are needed to enable decisions that can lead to overcoming global challenges to be based on reliable evidence.

(4) What is the impact of Open Science on the pandemic?

In this global health emergency, thanks to international collaboration, scientists have improved their understanding of the coronavirus with unprecedented speed and openness, embracing the principles of Open Science. Journals, universities, private labs, and data repositories have joined the movement, allowing open access to data and information: some 115,000 publications have released information related to the virus and the pandemic, and more than 80 per cent of them can be viewed, for free, by the general public.

Early in the pandemic, for example, Chinese scientists readily shared the genome of the virus, jumpstarting all following research into the virus, and the diagnostic testing, treatments, and vaccines that have since been developed.

Finally, the crisis has underlined the urgent need to bring science closer to decision making and to society as a whole. Fighting misinformation and promoting evidence-based decision-making, supported by well-informed citizens, has proven to be of vital importance in the fight against COVID 19.

(5) What is the UN doing to promote Open Science?

To ensure that Open Science truly meets its potential, and benefits both developed and developing countries, UNESCO is taking the lead in building a global consensus on values and principles for Open Science that are relevant for every scientist and every person independently of their place of origin, gender, age or economic and social background.

The future UNESCO Recommendation on Open Science is expected to be the international instrument to set the right and just standards for Open Science globally, which fulfil the human right to science and leave no one behind.

In a statement released on World Science Day for Peace and Development, celebrated on 10 November, Ms Azoulay said that widening the scope of Open Science will help science to "unlock its full potential", making it more effective and diverse by "enabling anyone to contribute, but also to bring its objectives in line with the needs of society, by developing scientific literacy in an informed citizenry who take responsibility and are involved in collective decision-making".

SHUFENG JIEDU CAPSULES, A PATENTED HERBAL DRUG COMPOSED OF EIGHT MEDICINAL PLANTS

Chinese, German researchers find "promising" herbal therapy for moderate COVID-19

IN a recently-published study, Chinese and German researchers have suggested that Shufeng Jiedu capsules,

a patented herbal drug composed of eight medicinal plants, might be "a promising herbal therapy for moderate COVID-19."

The scientific paper was published online on Oct. 22 by Phytomedicine, a monthly peer-reviewed medical journal. The research team included Xia Lu of Shanghai Public Health Clinical Centre affiliated to Fudan University, Shi Yujing of the China Academy of Chinese Medical Sciences, Su Jie of Shanghai Tech University, and Thomas Friedemann of HanseMercur Centre for Traditional Chinese Medicine at the University Medical Centre in Germany.

There is currently no confirmed cure or vaccine for COVID-19. But the use of Traditional Chinese Herbal Medicine (TCM) to combat COVID-19 got international attention because it was regularly used during the pandemic,

the authors said in the study. TCM was used successfully for the treatment of SARS in 2003 and influenza A (H1N1) in 2009, they said.

Shufeng Jiedu capsules, consisting of eight medicinal plants, are recognized for the treatment of different viral respiratory infectious diseases based on their antiviral, anti-inflammatory and immunomodulatory activities against acute lung injury, the authors said.

The antiviral and anti-inflammatory properties of Shufeng Jiedu capsules were confirmed by the mouse model. The decreased inflammatory factors in the lung tissue of coronavirus-infected mice can be explained by attenuation of pro-inflammatory pathways by bioactive compounds

of the capsules, they said.

Network analysis showed that 11 inflammation and immunomodulation-related pathways were influenced by bioactive compounds of the capsules, they said.

The authors had investigated data from a clinical pragmatic empirical study of patients diagnosed with COVID-19 to assess the clinical effectiveness of the capsules and to determine the optimal time to initiate treatment, according to the study.

Clinical data showed that Shufeng Jiedu capsules, added to standard antiviral therapy, significantly reduced the clinical recovery time of COVID-19 and fatigue as well as cough days, compared to standard antiviral therapy alone.

The herbal therapy was significantly more effective when used within the first eight days after the onset of COVID-19 symptoms, the authors said.

"Clinical data provided some promising evidence that the capsules might shorten the symptomatic course of COVID-19 in patients with mild and moderate symptoms. The results indicated that it is beneficial to administer the capsules immediately from the onset of the first symptoms," the authors said.

However, a large-scale randomized, double-blinded and placebo-controlled clinical trial is necessary to confirm the effect of this real-world study of Shufeng Jiedu capsules for the treatment of COVID-19 patients, they added.

Election results to be announced four times each day

THE 2020 General Election was successfully organized on 8 November and the Union Election Commission (UEC) has been announcing the list of elected Hluttaw representatives since 9 November.

states and regions continuously update results to the UEC who announce it on television, radio, newspapers, the UEC's website and Facebook page after careful scrutiny.

"It's important for the information the UEC is releasing to be accurate and correct," said U Khin Maung Oo. "We gather the results from polling stations at the township level or at the district level for Amyotha Hluttaw seats. Then we compile them at the state or regional level and analyze them before distribution. The state and regional sub-commissions are allowed to announce their results, and they forward them to the UEC simultaneously."

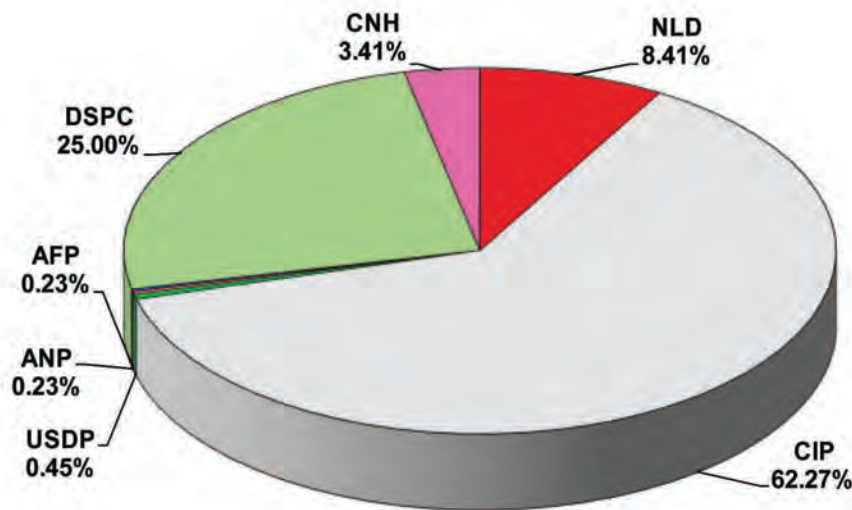

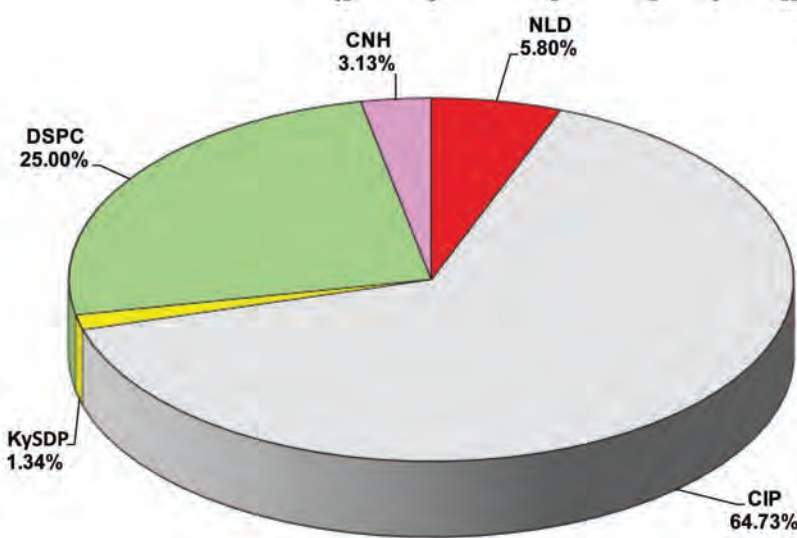
Elected Pyithu Hluttaw Representatives in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election

Elected Amyotha Hluttaw Representatives in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



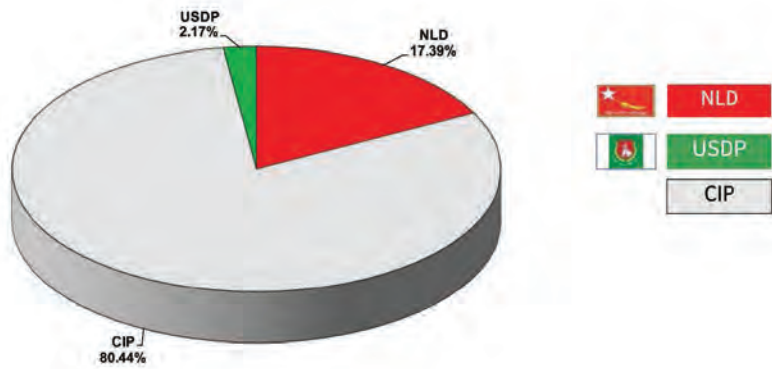

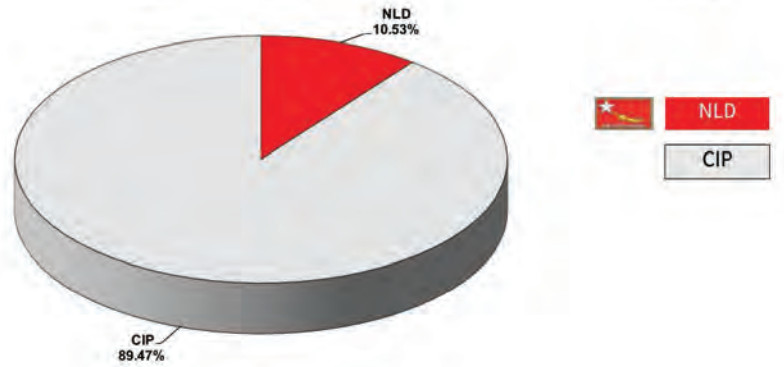

Elected Region/State Hluttaw Representatives in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election

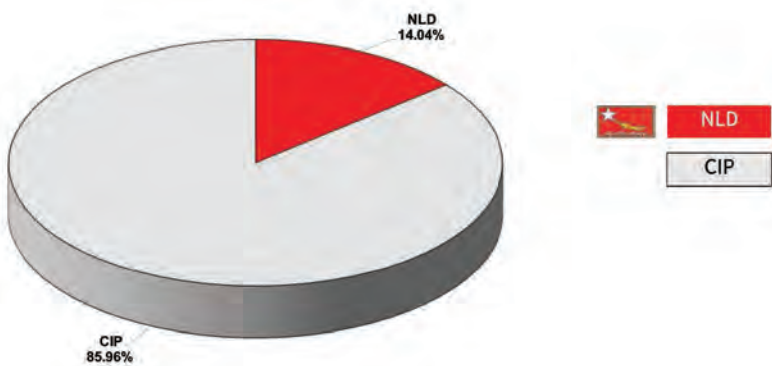
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 18 constituencies of Yangon Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



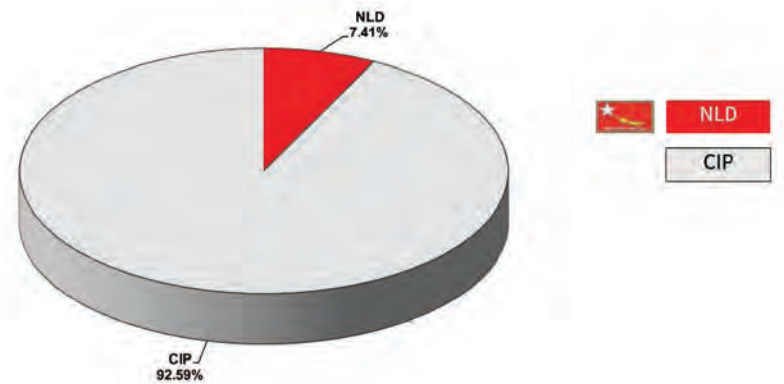
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 6 constituencies of Mandalay Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



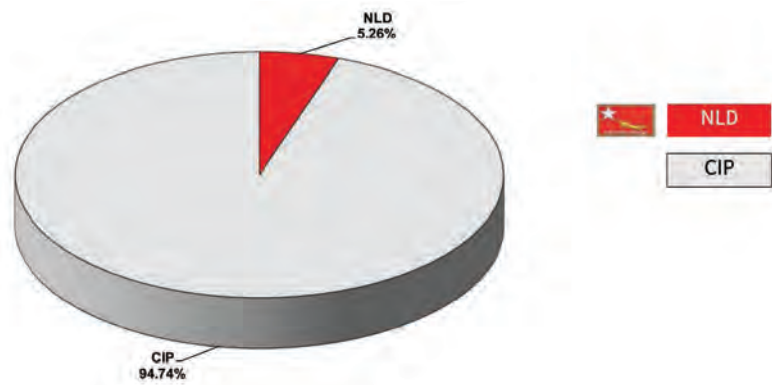
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 8 constituencies of Bago Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



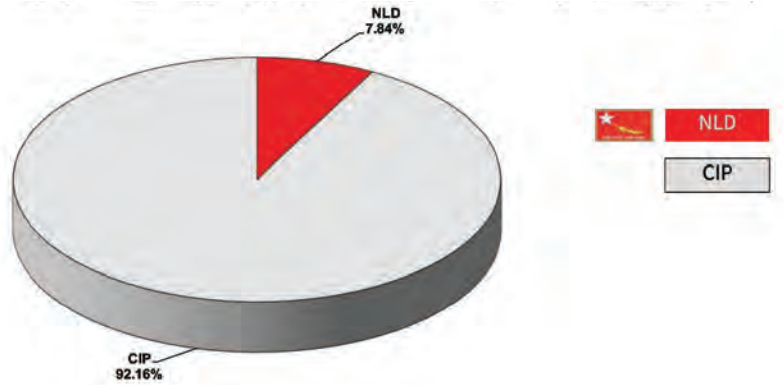
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Ayeyawady Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



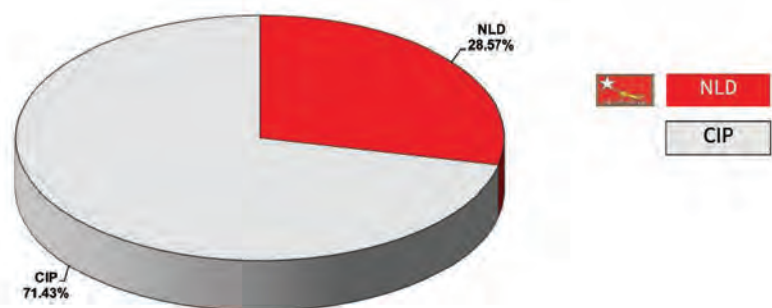
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Sagaing Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



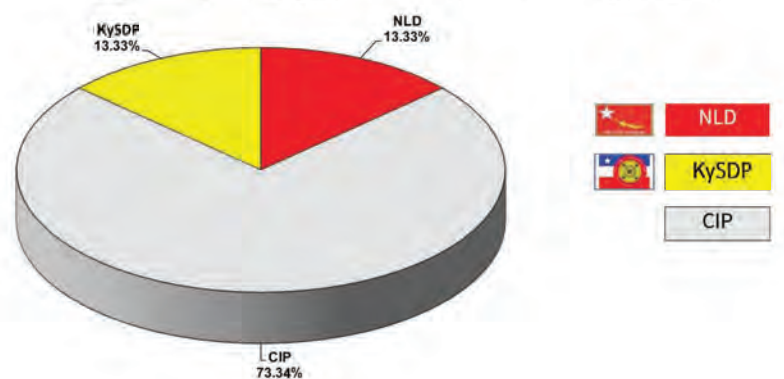
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Magway Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election

Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Kayah State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



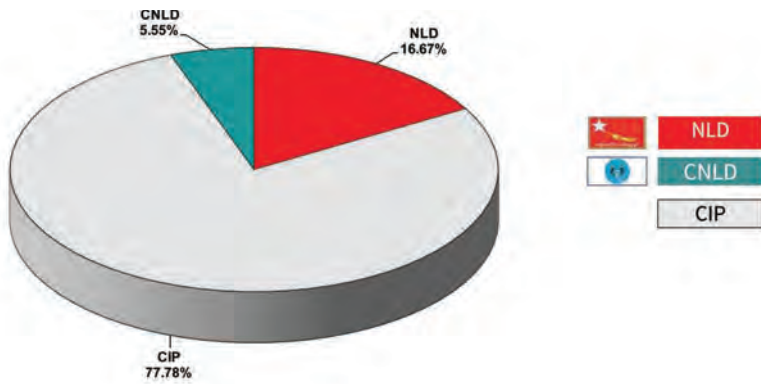

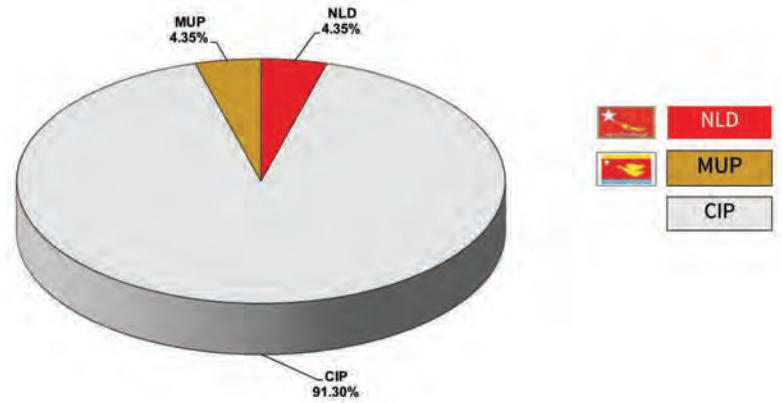

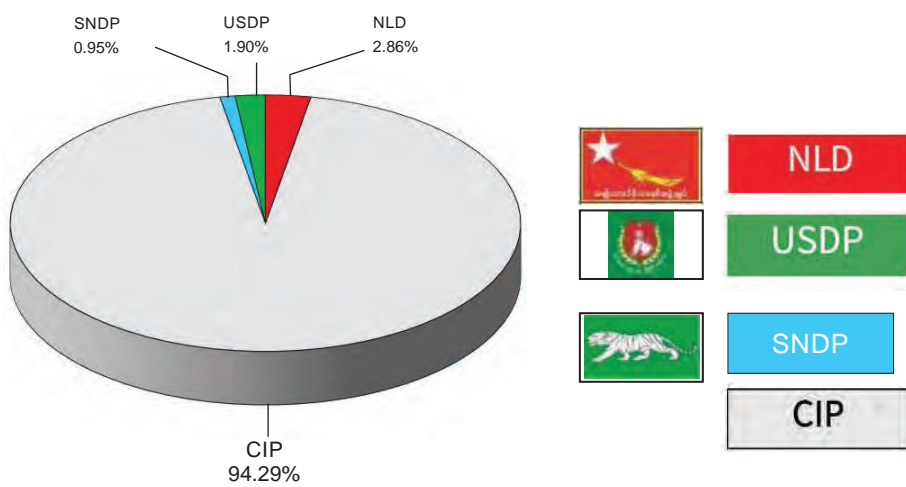
Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Chin State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election

Big Tech welcomes Biden presidency

SILICON Valley is welcoming the election of Joe Biden as US president even as it girds for a series of battles over tech policy in Washington.

The transition comes amid a growing "techlash" as lawmakers and policymakers struggle over antitrust enforcement, social media regulation, immigration and other contentious issues.

"Tech companies

are happy with the outcome but there is some trepidation as well," said Bob O'Donnell, analyst at Technalysis Research.

O'Donnell said scrutiny of tech giants will likely continue or even intensify in Washington regardless of which party is in power.

Darrell West of the Brookings Institution's Centre for Technology Innovation said "both Republicans and Dem-

ocrats have complaints about how the sector is operating and there is going to be more oversight and regulation."

Nonetheless, praise poured in for Biden after his victory from key tech leaders including Amazon founder Jeff Bezos, Microsoft president Brad Smith and Facebook's number two Sheryl Sandberg.

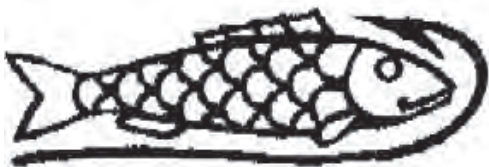

Russian peacekeepers head to Nagorno-Karabakh after peace deal

HUNDREDS of Russian peacekeepers were deploying to Nagorno-Karabakh on Tuesday after Armenia and Azerbaijan agreed to a peace deal to end weeks of fierce fighting over the disputed region.

The Moscow-brokered agreement, which saw a ceasefire take effect at 1:00 am local time (2100 GMT), came after a string of Azerbaijani victories in its fight to retake the ethnic Armenian enclave. It sparked celebrations in Azerbaijan but fury in Armenia, where protesters took to the streets to denounce the country's leadership for losses in the territory, which broke from Azerbaijan's control during a war in the early 1990s.

English FA chairman Clarke apologizes for 'coloured' remark

LONDON — English Football Association (FA) chairman Greg Clarke was forced to apologize for using the term “coloured” in reference to black footballers on Tuesday -- prompting a senior lawmaker to question the body’s commitment to diversity.

Clarke was giving evidence to the House of Commons Digital, Culture, Media and Sport committee (DCMS) on the future of English football.

The 63-year-old, who is a vice-president of world governing body FIFA, also attracted criticism for suggesting the lack of professional players in England from a South Asian background was due to “different career in-

terests”, comparing the situation to the IT department at the FA.

Clarke also described being gay as a “life choice” when quizzed over the lack of openly gay male players in England and said that young girls were often put off playing the game because they did not want to be hit hard by footballs.

In a statement the FA said: “Greg Clarke is deeply apologetic for the language he used to reference members of the ethnic minority community during the select committee hearing today.

“He acknowledged that using the term ‘coloured’ is not appropriate and wholeheartedly apologized during the hearing.”

However, Conservative MP Julian Knight, who chairs the DCMS committee, questioned the FA’s record on the matter.

“It’s right that Greg Clarke apologized before the committee,” he tweeted. “However, this isn’t the first time that the @FA has come to grief over these issues. It makes us question their commitment to diversity.”

When asked by another member of the committee, Kevin Brennan, about whether he wished to withdraw the use of the word “coloured” in one of his earlier answers, Clarke apologized and said the American use of the phrase “people of colour” was the reason for his mistake.

Tokyo Olympics organizers hail COVID-19 vaccine news as ‘relief’

TOKYO — Tokyo Olympics organizers said news of a coronavirus vaccine was a “relief” on Tuesday (Nov 10) but insisted their bio-security planning for the postponed Games remained unchanged.

Olympic officials have regularly said that a coronavirus vaccine is not a precondition for staging the Games, now scheduled to open a year late in July 2021.

But they have acknowledged that a successful shot would make their task significantly easier, and welcomed the 90 per cent effectiveness shown by one trial vaccine.

“The organizing committee is not disconnected from society... and I heard the vaccine news,” Tokyo 2020’s Games de-

livery officer Hidemasa Nakamura told reporters at a briefing.

“And the organizing committee is feeling the same as you probably felt, positive sentiment and relief,” he added.

But he added: “What we are doing right now is not thinking about the vaccine, because we don’t have a vaccine yet, but rather focusing on testing, social distance and also the cooperation between the athletes and the other stakeholders.”

“I think that is what we need to do to create a safe Games.”

Global markets and sentiment soared after US pharmaceutical giant Pfizer said tests involving more than 40,000 people had provided results that were a “critical milestone” in the search for a vaccine. —AFP

Garcia withdraws from Masters after Covid-19 positive

AUGUSTA (United States) — Sergio Garcia, the 2017 Masters champion, withdrew from the 84th Masters on Monday after announcing he has tested positive for Covid-19. Garcia, who took his only major title at Augusta National three years ago by defeating England’s Justin

Rose in a playoff, tested positive on Sunday after missing the cut at the US PGA Houston Open.

“On Saturday night after driving back from the Houston Open, I started feeling a bit of a sore throat and a cough,” Garcia tweeted. “The symptoms stayed with me on Sunday morning so

I decided to get tested for COVID-19 and so did my wife Angela. Thankfully she tested negative, but I didn’t.” The 40-year-old Spaniard won his first US PGA title since the Masters last month at the Sanderson Farms Championship in Jackson, Mississippi. —AFP

Arteta frustrated as Arsenal thrashed by Villa

LONDON — Mikel Arteta admitted Arsenal were unrecognizable from the side that has made plenty of progress in his first year in charge as Aston Villa stormed to a comprehensive 3-0 win at the Emirates early yesterday.

Bukayo Saka’s own goal and a double from Ollie Watkins took Villa up to sixth, just three points off the top of the table

with a game in hand.

Arsenal had beaten Manchester United at Old Trafford for the first time in 14 years last weekend in what appeared to be the latest sign the Gunners are heading in the right direction under Arteta.

But the Spaniard suffered the joint heaviest defeat of his managerial career in a chastening evening for the hosts, who

were second best from start to finish.

A second consecutive home defeat for Arsenal sees them slip to 11th, four points off their major target for the season of a top-four finish.

“We performed below our standards and I have to say it’s the first time I’ve seen us play and we weren’t a team,” said Arteta.—AFP
