## Republic of the Union of Myanmar National Reconciliation and Peace Centre Announcement on Multiparty Democracy General Election

11 November 2020  
11<sup>th</sup> Waning of Thadingyut, 1382

1. The National Reconciliation and Peace Centre is making strenuous effort into national reconciliation, Union peace, democratic reform and establishment of a federal Union. The four sessions of Union Peace Conference—21<sup>st</sup> Century Panglong have been held, and agreements have been made on the implementation of phase by phase concrete work plans for building a Democratic Federal Union in the post-2020. Informal meetings were also held with ethnic armed organizations in the post-conference.
2. The centre has formed 'Committee on Coordination with Ethnic Armed Organizations in Measures against COVID-19' in order to closely work with the EAOs in line with the policy of 'No one to be left behind' amid the outbreak of the pandemic.
3. The Multiparty Democracy General Election was successfully held nationwide on 8 November 2020 in accordance with the rules and guidelines of COVID-19 preventive measures. The ethnic armed organizations cooperated constructively in the elections for the safe voting of ethnic people.
4. The successful holding of multiparty democracy general elections is a crucial step for the establishment of a Democratic Federal Union. The centre gratefully acknowledges the cooperation of the EAOs and is sorry to know that the elections were postponed in some areas due to the lack of security for holding the free and fair elections. Relevant individuals and organizations are requested for their cooperation for immediate holding of the elections in these areas.
5. It is announced that the National Reconciliation and Peace Centre has determined to make future negotiations with the NCA-S EAOs and with the other potential signatories for the establishment of a Democratic Federal Union expected by all the national people.

# UEC holds press conference on 2020 General Election

**U**NION Election Commission held a press conference on its organizing 2020 General Election at its headquarters in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday.

UEC member U Myint Naing and U Than Htay, together with its Director-General U Khin Maung Oo, explained the successful holding of the elections and issuing election results.

### Transparency of elections

Speaking to the media, U Myint Naing confirmed transparency of elections, the voting hours from 6 am to 4 pm for normal conditions on the Election Day, counting of votes after all the voters cast their ballots before 4 pm, voting of the remaining voters, who have already reached the polling stations before 4 pm, the announcement of vote results in front of the representatives of Hluttaw candidates and independent voting of the voters.

## Vote counting

Vote counting was carried out in front of electoral candidates of Hluttaw candidates, 10 voters at least and election observers; some media organizations broadcast live the vote-counting; objections can be made during the counting and polling station officers made decisions on cancelled ballots with sound reasons.

The number of supporting votes for respective candidates are registered in Form-16 which was then signed by polling station officers and representatives of the candidates; the five copies of this document are also distributed to the relevant officials—1 to Township election sub-commission, 2 to ward/village sub-commission, 1 to polling station officer and one at the polling station. And that, the vote results can be checked transparently after counting the ballots.

## Advance vote counting

The respective township sub-commissions counted the advance ballots which reached the polling station before 4 pm, and it was witnessed by the Hluttaw candidates, their representatives or their designated representatives; the counting and registration of advance votes in Form-18 are transparently done like in the regular ballots.

## Clear results in Form-19

The number of ballots in Form-16 from polling stations is combined with those in Form-18 from township election sub-commissions for registration in Form-19 which clearly mentioned the elected candidates and their parties.

## Process of Announcing Election Results

The Region and State Election Sub-commissions have to announce the election results in accordance with Section 46 of the relevant Hluttaw Election Law. The number of votes received by the respective candidates except for the winning candidates were recorded, and the total number of votes and calculate the percentages before the results have been announced. The process will take time; that's why the results could not be announced immediately. After calculations, the respective Region and State Election Sub-commissions will announce the results. After their announcements, the Union Election Commission will announce nationwide results. We conducted a similar process in 2015, and the process lasted for 10 days. Region and State Election Sub-commissions are working hard to announce the results as soon as possible. The Union Election Commission is also taking great efforts to announce the nationwide results as soon as possible.

## Welcoming the election results

At present, several lists of winning candidates have been announced. All results will be announced within a week. The election results became obvious within a short time because they are transparent. Major parties welcomed the election results and issued statements acknowledging the results. Some parties have issued statements to say that they had some inconveniences during the election process, but they accepted the results. A major party that was established not too long ago said it was pleased with the elec-

tions and it accepted the results. Some other parties and candidates also welcomed the results.

## Five criteria

We are happy to see that there are many political parties that welcome the winning candidates. These are very good habits in the practice of the democratic system. Some political parties encountered difficulties of accepting the results, but it occurred in a democratic way. The Union Election Commission announced that the general elections must meet the five criteria—free, fair, trustable, transparent and the results must reflect reality—in accordance with the election laws. The commission did not have any bias against/in favour of any party in holding of the general elections successfully with the five criteria.

## Free election

The media also observed that the election was free. The election we held was really free. During the advance voting process, advance ballot boxes were obtained in the presence of relevant candidates, election commission officials and polling station staff members and the ballot boxes were kept in a secure manner and guarded by special security police. It was also announced that relevant candidates, relevant political parties and observers could visit the places to observe them at any time. The election was held as fairly as possible in accordance with the laws. The media has seen that the general elections were held in a transparent manner. Some major parties also acknowledge that the general elections were acceptable to the people. It is found that candidates and political parties also can accept the reliability of

the election.

When foreign diplomatic organizations observed the electoral processes, they said they trusted in the reliability of the processes.

## Saying thanks

The UEC officials expressed thanks to all the voters, who eagerly cast their votes despite the COVID-19 pandemic and to the teachers working at the polling stations, polling station chiefs and polling station staff for their great efforts to hold the election successfully. They also expressed thanks to health workers, officials and staff members from the General Administration Department and volunteers who also work hard in the electoral processes. Special thanks to responsible officials and the media for their cooperation in making the elections reliable. Special thanks to the election security officers and special police officers who took care of the advance ballot boxes at polling stations. Special thanks also went to all the stakeholders who took great efforts together to make the election smooth. The Chairman of the Election Commission will hold a meeting with the media after announcing all the election results.

## Questions by Media

Local and foreign media asked the UEC about the delay in announcing the election results, the matter related to candidates' refusal to sign Form 19 by claiming that the election was not fair, how the Union Election Commission will respond to allegations that people under aged 18 voted in Mong Ton in Shan State, allegations that the number of people who actually voted was larger than the number of eligible voters in

some constituencies, whether the advance voting processes were fair, allegations of electoral frauds, the delays in counting votes, the number of polling stations that have controversies, the demand for re-election, how the current election disputes will be resolved and other issues related to the general elections. The UEC member U Myint Naing answered the questions in detail.

Regarding the question about candidates' refusal to sign Form 19, UEC member U Myint Naing said that according to the law, all the candidates have the responsibility to sign the Form 19, and the commission will take actions against them in accordance with the law. Allegations that the election was not fair are groundless allegations, and the commission has no plan to respond to them. Three major parties have issued statements welcoming the results. Such allegations can occur, and it is a nature of the practice of democracy.

Regarding the issue about the demand for re-election, the UEC officer said that the Union Election Commission has already held a free and fair election in accordance with the five criteria, and the election is acceptable to major parties and some parties.

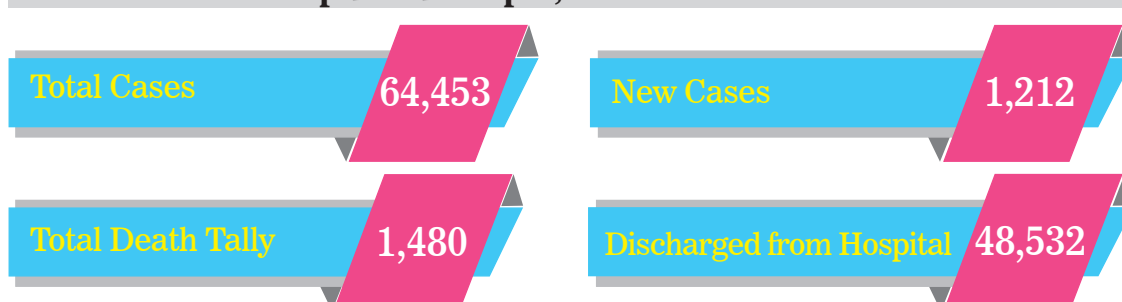
Regarding the issue about allegations that the number of people who actually voted was larger than the number of eligible voters, the officer remarked as groundless allegations based on unreliable figures. He added that if the figures are reliable, it can be handled in accordance with the laws. —Myo Min Naing-MNA

(11-11-2020)

1. U Kyaw Soe Khaing, who lives in Kabo Village, Kabo Village Tract, TadaU Township, Kyaukse District in Mandalay Region, cast his votes at polling station No 1 in Kabo Village and then he voted again at polling station No 1 in Kya Swel Village. It was found that he voted twice.
2. U Kyi Zin, who lives in Ayo Gone Ward, Tamway Township, Yangon (East) District in Yangon Region, cast his votes at polling station No 5 in Ayo Gone Ward and then he voted again at polling station No 8 in Quarter No 22, Dagon Myothit (South) Township. It was found that he voted twice.
3. Daw Phyu Phyu Win, who lives in Hlegu Township, Yangon (North) District in Yangon Region, cast her votes at polling station No 1 in Wah Yone Soon Village Tract and then she voted again at polling station No 4 in Inn Tine Village Tract. It was found that she voted twice.
4. U Soe Lwin, who lives in Shwepyitha Township, Yangon(North) District in Yangon Region, cast his votes at polling station No 5 in Quarter No 12 and then he voted again at polling station No 3 in Quarter No 5. It was found that he voted twice.
5. U Myint Win, who lives in Daunt Chaung Village, Kokko Village Tract, Labutta Township, Labutta District in Ayeyawady Region, cast his votes at polling station No 2 in Kha Naung Village and then he voted again at polling station No 3 in Malay Kyi Gone Village, Kanyin Village Tract. UNION Minister for Investment and Foreign Economic Relations U Thaung Tun yesterday attended a Preparatory Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) Ministerial Meeting in advance of the 4<sup>th</sup> RCEP Summit via videoconference.

The meeting was chaired by Mr Tran Tuan Anh,, Minister for Ministry of Industry and Trade of Viet Nam.

During the meeting, Trade Negotiating Committee (TNC) Chair, Mr Iman Pambagyo, Director-General of International Trade Negotiations, Indonesia, presented the RCEP TNC Chair's report to the Ministers. The Ministers congratulated the TNC and all working groups for their considerable efforts to bring 8-years of RCEP negotiations to a successful conclusion. The Ministers, then, considered and endorsed the TNC Chair's

report.

Ministers agreed to organize an interim RCEP Joint Committee that will be primarily responsible for preparing for the RCEP Agreement's entry into force. Ministers reaffirmed their readiness to sign the RCEP Agreement at the upcoming 4<sup>th</sup> RCEP Summit on 15 November 2020 and agreed upon the text of

both a Joint Leaders' Statement and a Ministers' Declaration on India's Participation in the RCEP which will be adopted as the outcome documents at the 4<sup>th</sup> RCEP Summit.

The Union Minister commended Viet Nam for its leadership as ASEAN Economic Ministers' Meeting (AEM) Chair, ensuring the successful conclu-

sion of RCEP negotiations in 2020. The Union Minister also thanked the Secretary-General of ASEAN and team for their tremendous support as well as the TNC Chair and all the members involved.

The RCEP is set to become a mega-trade agreement comprised of 15 participating countries representing almost 30%

of the world's population, 30% of global gross domestic product, and, when signed, will account for nearly 28% of global trade.

As the RCEP Agreement involves a diverse mix of developed and developing countries, Myanmar's signing of the RCEP Agreement is expected to unlock significant new opportunities for Myanmar products to penetrate into global high-end markets. In addition, RCEP is expected to contribute to increased responsible and quality investment into Myanmar, contributing to enhanced economic and technical cooperation.

The meeting was attended by RCEP Ministers from the 10 ASEAN Member States, Australia, China, Japan, Korea and New Zealand, the Secretary-General of ASEAN, the TNC Chair, TNC leaders, and officials from the ASEAN Secretariat.—MNA

# Seeking legal remedies is key to solving electoral disputes

WITH the successful completion of the 2020 General Elections on 8<sup>th</sup> November, the results are emerging daily. The Union Election Commission has made Myanmar proud by ensuring that the 2020 general elections meet five standards: they are free, fair, transparent, reliable, and harmonious with the people's desire.

Free and fair elections are the foundation and at the heart of a democracy.

It is found that every legally cast vote was properly counted under the eyes of election observers, representatives of candidates, witnesses and media, reflecting that the 2020 General Elections is transparent, inclusive, and accountable.

It is worth noting that the UEC is working hard to declare all the results of the nationwide elections in seven days though it took 10 days for the previous UEC to announce all results in the 2015 General Elections.

The election results are posted and broadcast on state-run newspapers, TV, and the UEC website in a timely manner.

Political parties including three major parties have welcomed the success of the 2020 General Elections while one major party made allegations that the 2020 General Elections are not free and fair. It also rejected the emerging results and also demanded that the general elections are held once again.

In response to the allegations made by the party, the UEC refuted at the press conference saying that the allegations were groundless, without any supporting evidence.

We would like to remind all candidates that if they believe that electoral process had violated any part of the election law, they could challenge it in the courts with evidence in support of their claims. It is their right guaranteed by law.

In a democratic system, there are often allegations about voting following elections. However, we should note that there are courts to apply the nation's laws and resolve disputes.

At the same time, we should avoid making groundless accusations because they can damage trust and tarnish the dignity of others, especially the UEC which held the General Elections.

All sides observed the electoral process in the General Elections. If they have evidence supporting their claims, they need to seek a judicial remedy for their claims according to the law.

# Independent UN experts decry COVID vaccine hoarding: 'No one is secure until all of us are'

The only way to fight the COVID-19 crisis is to make affordable vaccines available to everyone, independent UN human rights experts said on Monday, underscoring that in an interconnected and interdependent world, "no one is secure until all of us are secure".

"This pandemic, with its global scale and enormous human cost, with no clear end in sight, requires a concerted, human-rights based and courageous response from

all States", four UN experts together with members of a human rights working group said in a statement on universal access to vaccines.

### Spiking ahead

Last month, the World Bank estimated that the pandemic would push between 88 and 115 million people into extreme poverty

this year, potentially climbing to a total of 150 million during 2021.

And the UN World Food Programme (WFP) has doubled its pre-COVID-19 estimates of hungry people, to project that 265 million would face crisis levels, unless direct action is taken.

### 'No room' for nationalism

Engaging in a coordinated global effort to share vaccines across borders is the only means of effectively beating the coronavirus.

The UN experts stressed, "there is no room for nationalism in fighting this pandemic".

"Unfortunately, some Governments are trying to secure vaccines only for their own citizens", they detailed, adding however, that this would "not achieve their intended purpose" as a successful fight against the pandemic

depends on mass immunization.

### Equitable access call

The independent experts called on countries to support the COVAX initiative for global equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines led by Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) and the World Health Organization (WHO).

"Under international human rights law, access to any COVID-19 vaccine and treatment must be made available to all who need them, within and across countries, especially those in vulnerable situations or living in poverty", the experts spelled out.

They also called for international cooperation and assistance between developed and developing countries to ensure widespread sharing of technolo-

gies and know-how on COVID-19 vaccines and treatment.

Additionally, the experts said that pharmaceutical companies have a responsibility not to put profits ahead of people's rights to life and health and should accept restrictions on the patent protection of vaccines they develop.

"This pandemic has affected the whole world", they reminded. "Now the world must put aside misplaced individual initiatives to monopolize vaccines and supplies, and work together to defeat it".

Independent experts are appointed by the Geneva-based UN Human Rights Council to examine and report back on a specific human rights theme or a country situation. The experts are not UN staff, nor are they paid for their work.

# Vaccine innovation sparks hope, questions

REPORTS that one of the vaccines for Covid-19 has shown highly promising results are a ray of hope for a world in the shadow of surging virus cases.

But does it mean the pandemic is coming to an end? Not so fast, experts say, with many questions remaining about who it will protect and for how long.

On Monday American pharmaceutical giant Pfizer and its German partner BioNTech said that their vaccine candidate has been 90 per cent effective in preventing Covid-19 infections in ongoing Phase 3 trials.

One of dozens in development, it is based on innovative technology that has never been approved for use before.

While its apparent efficacy sparked intense excitement, with only partial data so far released, we don't yet know how long it will last, whether it will protect the most vulnerable and how it could be distributed across the world.

90 per cent

Pfizer and BioNTech are basing their announcement on interim results from the last step in their clinical trial before making an application for approval.

They said that the vaccine was found to be "more than 90 per cent effective" in preventing participants from being infected.

This was based on 94 Covid-19 cases being found at this stage in the trial, which has enrolled 43,538 people.

But the announcement does not break down those figures to show how many infected patients were in the group that received the vaccine and how many were in the one that was given a placebo.

This points to the deeper issue that the results were distributed in a press release -- sending stock markets surging -- rather than in a detailed peer reviewed paper in a scientific journal.

"These results are extremely interesting," said French virologist

Marie-Paule Kieny, who leads research at Inserm and is a former director at the World Health Organisation.

"But we need to wait to see the data, which is not yet available," she told AFP. Other data is still being collected, notably on safety, although the firms said "no serious safety concerns" have been raised.

### Long term protection?

Another unknown is how long the vaccine's protection may last.

Effectiveness was measured seven days after patients received the final injection of the two-dose vaccine, 28 days after the initial jab.

This means we cannot yet know the duration of protection, Penny Ward, Visiting Professor in Pharmaceutical Medicine at King's College London, told the Science Media Centre.

"Longer periods of follow up are required during an ongoing outbreak to determine need for

repeated booster doses."

With a view to possible authorisation by the United States Drug Agency (FDA), the two companies have indicated they will also publish results measured 14 days after the second injection.

Bruno Pitard, of France's CNRS national scientific research centre, told AFP that one of the challenges is knowing how the effectiveness of the vaccine changes over time.

"After three weeks, then a month, then two, then three, then four, we will see if the protection is still the same," he said.

### What does it do?

Does this vaccine stop people from catching Covid-19, or does it just reduce the severity of their symptoms? And can it prevent someone from spreading the virus?

There is no published data to tell us either way.

This is a crucial point, said

Ward, because if a vaccine can protect against infections then we could theoretically ease the restrictive measures put in place to halt the virus' spread.

If, however, it mainly reduces the risk of disease but not infection, then restrictions would be needed "until sufficient numbers of individuals have been vaccinated to protect those at most risk of

needing hospital care or of dying from disease from becoming very unwell by catching the infection from a vaccinated, asymptotically infected person".

### Who does it protect?

After ten months we have a better idea of who those most at risk are.

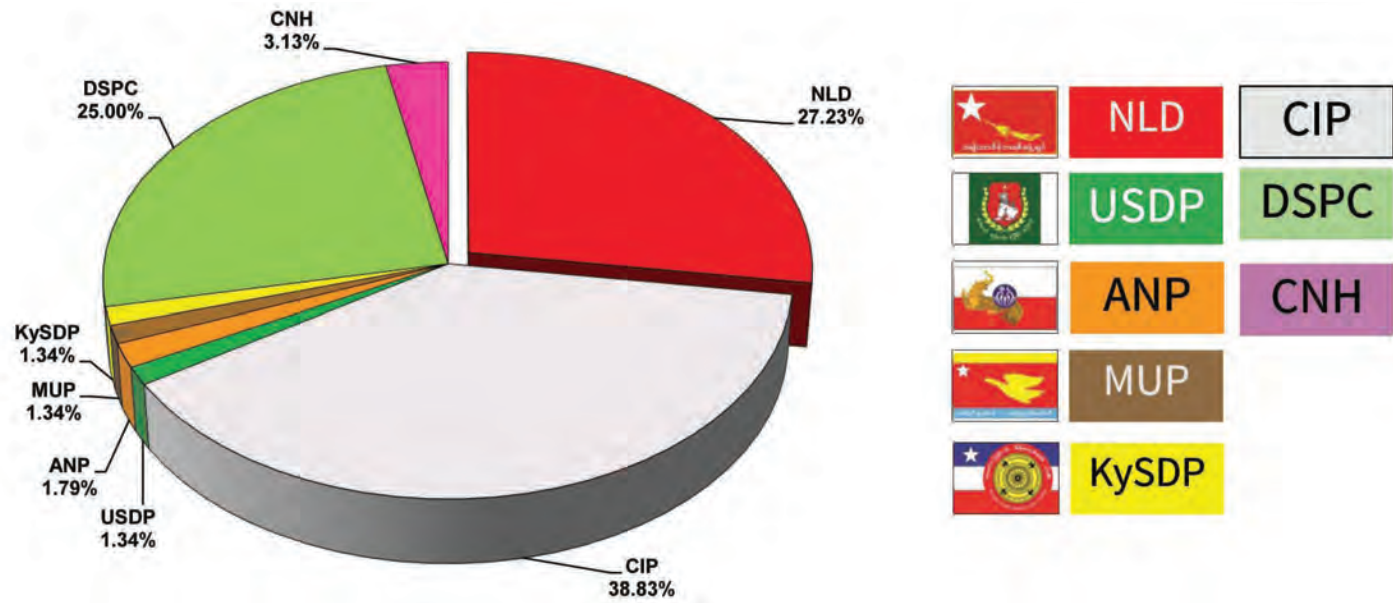

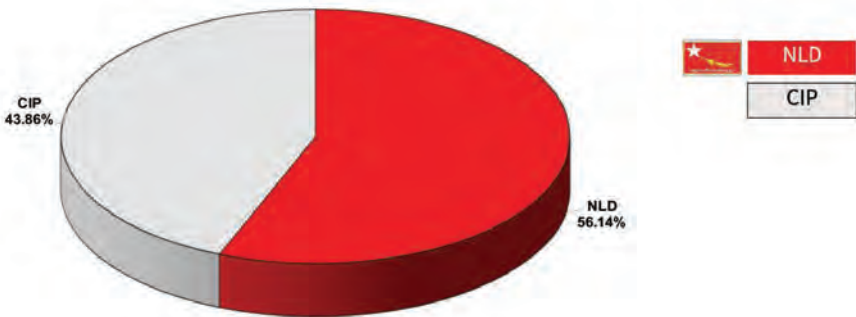
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 34 constituencies of Yangon Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



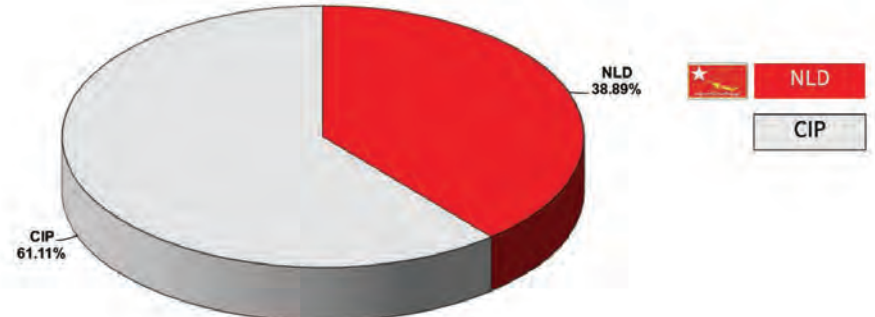
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 22 constituencies of Mandalay Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



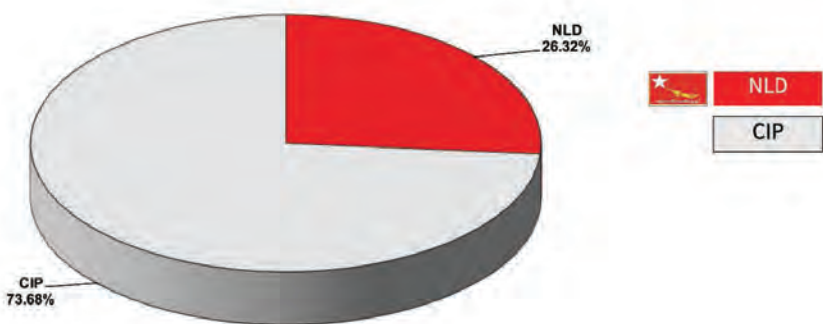
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 32 constituencies of Bago Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



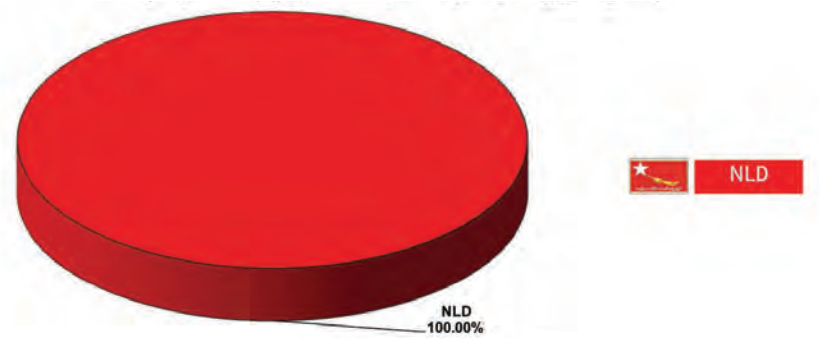
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 21 constituencies of Ayeyawady Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



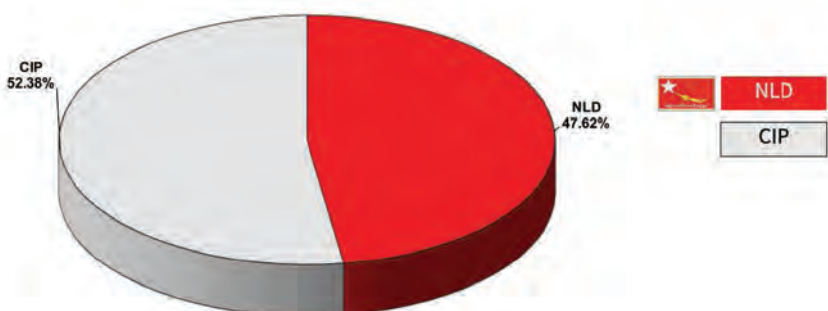
Votes of Regional Hluttaw MPs in 20 constituencies of Sagaing Region in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



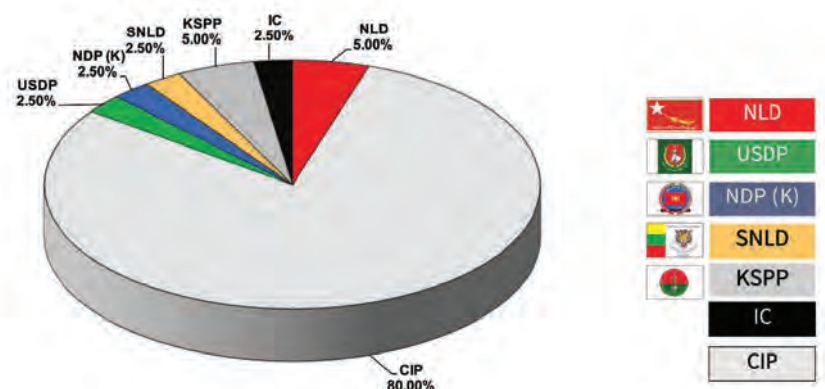

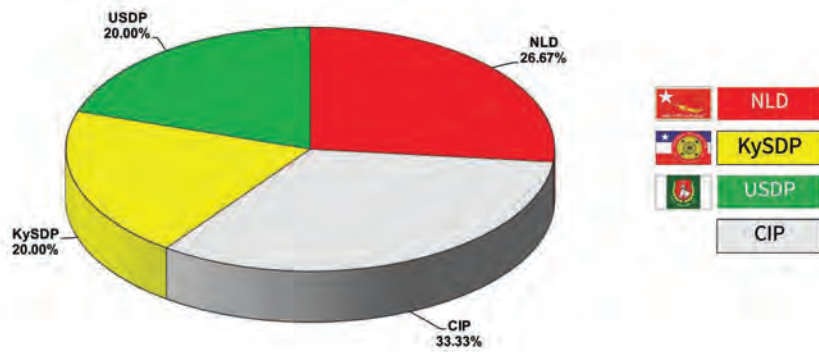

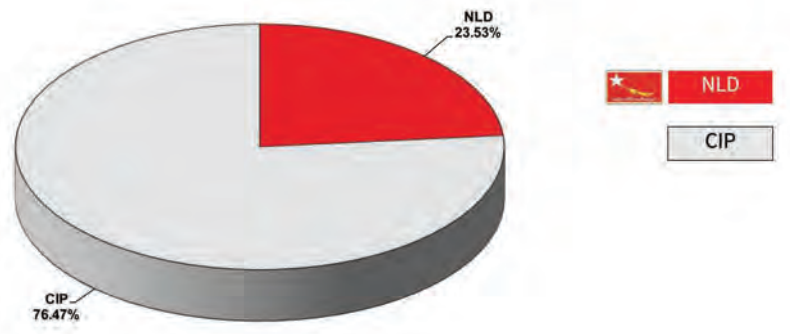

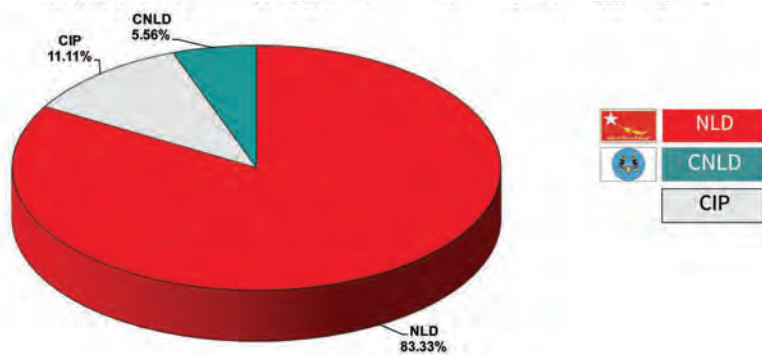
Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 10 constituencies of Kayah State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



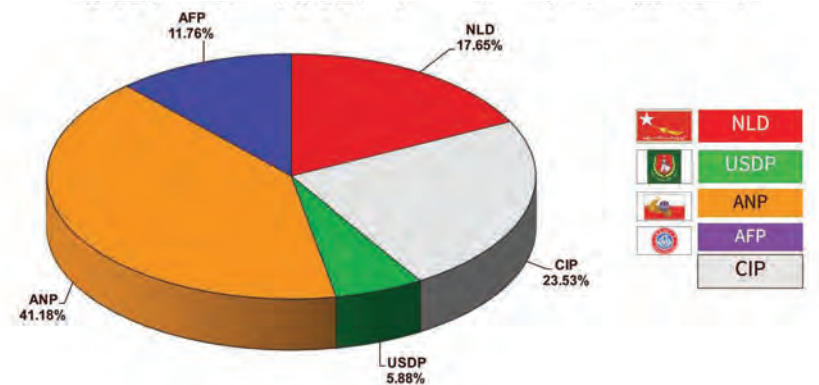
Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 4 constituencies of Kayin State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



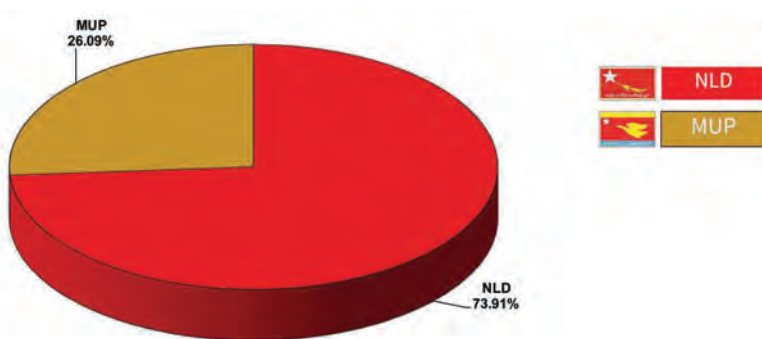
Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 16 constituencies of Chin State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election



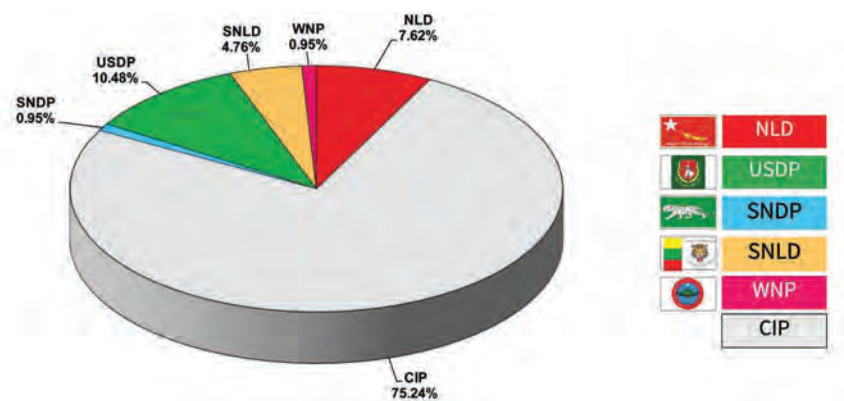
Votes of State Hluttaw MPs in 13 constituencies of Rakhine State in 2020 Multiparty Democracy General Election

# Bahrain PM, world's longest-serving, dies at 84

BAHRAIN'S Prince Khalifa bin Salman al-Khalifa, the world's longest-serving prime minister who had held the post since independence in 1971, died Wednesday at the age of 84, state media announced.

Prince Khalifa was a controversial figure during his long time in office -- and deeply unpopular with the Sunni-ruled kingdom's Shiite population.

When Shiite-led protesters occupied Manama's Pearl Square for a month in 2011, before being driven out by Saudi-backed security forces, their main demand was for Khalifa to step down. He played a key role in Bahrain's political and economic affairs for more than three decades

after setting the stage for a referendum that put paid to the Shah of Iran's claims to the tiny Gulf archipelago. But the prime minister, who was accused

by dissidents of opposing political reforms and cracking down on activists, took a lower profile after his nephew King Hamad ascended the throne in

March 1999. Prince Khalifa passed away at the Mayo Clinic Hospital in the United States, the official Bahrain News Agency said.

# UK launches bill to stop 'malicious' foreign takeovers

BRITAIN on Wednesday unveiled plans for new powers to prevent foreign companies snapping up strategic assets in "malicious" takeovers that are deemed to threaten national security.

The UK government said that its new National Security and Investment Bill will "protect (the) UK from malicious investment" and strengthen its ability to investigate and intervene in mergers, acquisitions and other types of deals.

The new powers come as increasing Chinese investment has sparked calls from UK lawmakers for Prime Minister Boris Johnson to take a stronger stance on Beijing.

The draft law is aimed at updating 20-year-old leg-

islation that is no longer sufficient to tackle modern threats, according to a statement from the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy.

The bill, which will be introduced before parliament on Wednesday, will compel companies to inform the government of merger and acquisition activity in sensitive sectors such as defence, energy and transport.

"The UK remains one of the most attractive investment destinations in the world and we want to keep it that way," Business Secretary Alok Sharma said in a statement.

"But hostile actors should be in no doubt — there is no back door into the UK.

# Cuba reopens Havana airport after 8-month virus closure

HAVANA'S airport will resume commercial flights from Sunday, nearly eight months after authorities shut Cuba's main international gateway to shield the island nation from the

coronavirus pandemic.

This year's global public health crisis has dealt a tough blow to the communist country's sclerotic economy, which was already struggling with

fresh U.S. sanctions and declining tourism revenues.

Foreign arrivals will be subject to a temperature check and coronavirus diagnostic test on arrival and

will not be allowed to move freely until the results of the test around 24 hours later, according to a report on the official news portal Cubadebate.

## Georgia and North Macedonia in sight of Euro 2020 berth

PARIS — Neither Georgia nor North Macedonia have come close to qualifying for a major tournament before but both stand just one game away -- against each other -- from securing a spot at the postponed Euro 2020.

They meet in Tbilisi on Thursday in one of the qualifying play-off finals which will decide the last four spots in the 24-team tournament which was delayed to next year because of

the coronavirus pandemic.

It is a remarkable opportunity for two of the world's smaller sporting countries, one offered to them via the new UEFA Nations League.

That competition provided a route here even for the continent's minor nations, grouped together in League D where Georgia and North Macedonia beat teams like Andorra, Gibraltar and Liechtenstein.

The main Euro qualify-

ing tournament saw Georgia, ranked 86th in the world, take just eight points and win only twice, both times against Gibraltar, although they did hold Denmark and the Republic of Ireland in Tbilisi.

North Macedonia, who are 65th in the FIFA rankings, fared better as they came third in their group, but they have twice had to come from behind to draw with Georgia in the Nations League in the last two months.—AFP

## Liverpool say farewell to historic Melwood training ground

LONDON — Jurgen Klopp said an emotional farewell to Liverpool's historic Melwood training ground on Tuesday as the Premier League champions prepare to move into a new headquarters.

Melwood has been the club's base for more than 70 years, with generations of Anfield players honing their craft on the training pitches.

But, unable to develop the site any further, the Reds will move the first team into the new £50 million (\$66 million) AXA Training Centre in Kirby, on the outskirts of Liverpool, next week.

Their new 9,200-square-metre (99,000-square-foot) training base is a state-of-the-art facility including three pitches, an indoor sports hall, two gyms, a swimming pool, hydrotherapy and sports rehabilitation facilities.

Melwood was sold last year to a company who will build homes on the site.

Klopp and his coaching staff were on site to close the gates on one of football's most famous training grounds.

"Mixed emotions, really mixed emotions. I am happy about going to Kirkby and very sad about leaving Melwood, to be honest," Klopp told Liverpool's website.—AFP
