The Republic of the Union of Myanmar State Administration Council: Five-Point Road Map

1. Priority will be given to fully realizing peace, stability and rule of law throughout the Union to safeguard the socioeconomic life of the people.
2. People-centred development work that enhances socioeconomic well-being will be undertaken to ensure the country's prosperity and food security.
3. Processes will further continue to consolidate a genuine, disciplined multiparty democratic system and build a Union based on democracy and federalism.
4. Priority will be accorded to work aligned with the agreements set out in the Nationwide Ceasefire Agreement, in order to achieve enduring peace for the entire nation.
5. Upon accomplishing the provisions of the state of emergency, free and fair multiparty democratic elections will be held in line with the 2008 Constitution, and further work will be undertaken to hand over State duties to the winning party in accordance with democratic standards.

ACCORDING to the observations at 16:30 hrs M.S.T today, the Low Pressure Area over the Northeast Bay of Bengal further intensified into a Well Marked Low Pressure Area.

Due to the Well Marked Low Pressure Area, occasional squalls with rough seas will be experienced off and along Rakhine Coasts. Surface wind speed in squall may reach about 40-45 mph. Wave height will be about 9-13 feet off and along Rakhine Coasts from today evening to 11-6-2023.

Due to the Well Marked Low Pressure Area, rain or thundershowers will be widespread in Nay Pyi Taw, Sagaing, Mandalay and Magway Regions and Kachin, Shan, Chin and Rakhine States with likelihood of regionally and isolated heavyfalls in some Regions and States with strong wind from today evening to 11-6-2023.

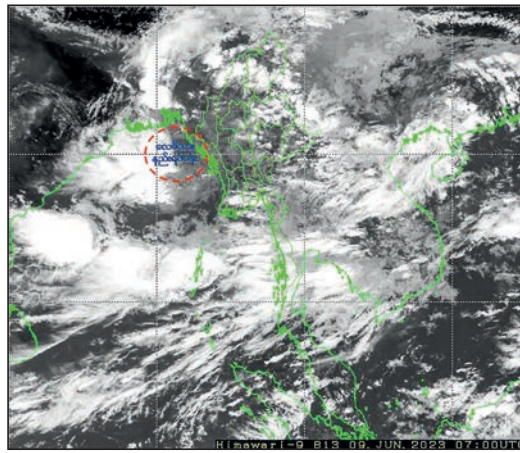

BAY INFERENCE: According to the observations at 15:30 hrs M.S.T today, the Low Pressure Area over the Northeast Bay of Bengal still persists. It may further intensify into a Well Marked Low Pressure Area during next 24 hrs. Monsoon is vigorous over the Andaman Sea, South Bay, Eastcentral Bay and Northeast Bay of Bengal. Weather is cloudy elsewhere over the Bay of Bengal.

FORECAST VALID UNTIL MORNING ON 10 June, 2023:

Rain or thundershowers will be scattered in Nay Pyi Taw and Kayah State, fairly widespread in Lower Sagaing, Mandalay, Magway, Bago and Ayeyawady Regions and widespread in the remaining Regions and States with likelihood of regionally heavyfalls in Taninthayi Region and isolated heavyfalls in Upper Sagaing Region and Kachin, Northern Shan and Mon States. Degree of certainty is (100%).

THE CONDITION OF CUMULONIMBUS CLOUD: The Cumulonimbus clouds are developing in the Sagaing, Mandalay, Magway, Bago, Yangon, Ayeyawady, Taninthayi Regions and Kachin, Shan, Chin, Rakhine, Kayah, Kayin and Mon States. The area along the Cumulonimbus clouds movement, the weather phenomena such as strong winds accompanied with rain, thunder, lightning and hail may occur and therefore it is recommended to be aware in advance these phenomena.

STATE OF THE SEA: Occasional squalls with rough seas will be experienced off and along Myanmar Coasts. Surface wind speed in squalls may reach 40 mph. Wave height will be about 9-12 feet off and along Myanmar Coasts. — DMH

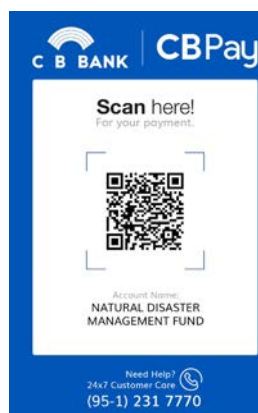
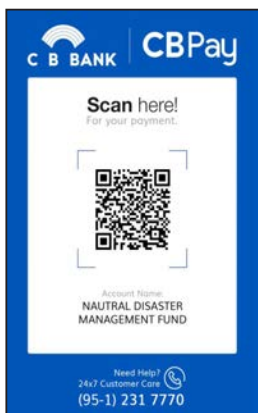
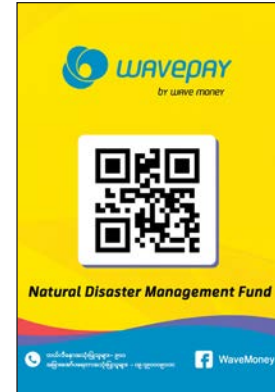

THE 29th Pakokku U Ohn Pe Lifetime Literary Awards, Pakokku Literary Award, Scholarships and Pakokku U Ohn Pe Library Book Awards giving ceremony was held at Horizon Lake View Resort in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday.

UNDER a three-year working plan of the ADMM-Plus Experts' Working Group on Counter-Terrorism, the Planning Conference of ADMM-Plus Experts' Working Group on Counter-Terrorism co-chaired by Myanmar and the Russian Federation was held via the hybrid system at Khabarovsk on 6 and 7 June 2023.

Delegations from Myanmar, Russia, Cambodia, China, Thailand, Laos, Indonesia and India attended the meeting while representatives from the ASEAN Secretariat, Brunei, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, the Philippines, and Viet Nam joined it through videoconferencing.

Myanmar and the Russian Federation, co-chairs of the conference, made opening remarks at the meeting. Next, partici-

pants frankly discussed measures pertaining to cooperation in counter-terrorism operations among the countries and future cooperation plans for regional counter-terrorism operations.

Myanmar delegation distributed publications on which the current political situation of Myanmar, terrorist attacks and evidence of acts of violence committed by the terrorists called NUG and PDF on civilian targets, factors to declare the NUG group as a terrorist group and counter-terrorism measures of the State Administration Council (SAC) are written in English, Russian and Chinese languages as well as memory sticks, that contain the said-content, to the attendees in order to convey the true stories in Myanmar; it is reported. — MNA

76 new cases of COVID-19 reported on 9 June, total figure registers 639,551

MYANMAR'S COVID-19-positive cases rose to **639,551** after **76** new cases were reported on 9 June 2023 according to the Ministry of Health.

Therefore, a total of **10,719,065** laboratory samples were examined to date and the confirmed COVID-19 cases reached **639,551**.

The total number of patients who have recovered from COVID-19 in the country reached **618,460** including **62** new recoveries.

AN on-duty team at the Myanmar Industrial Port container checkpoint impounded 224,875 ceramic tiles (worth K76,502,475) from a container on 6 June. The action was taken under Customs procedures.

In addition, a combined

team under the Mandalay Region Illegal Trade Eradication Task Force conducted unexpected inspections at the 19th Mile post on the PyinOoLwin-Mandalay Road on 7 June and nabbed three kinds of goods (worth K3.52 million), 10 kinds

of goods (worth 10.18 million) including motorcycle headlights without official documents from a Win Myanmar bus (estimated value of K20 million). The action was taken under Customs procedures.

Similarly, the combined team captured a total of 2.144 tonnes of illegal teak and illegal timbers (worth K792,192) in Bago district and a Plantana car (approximately K3.52 million) without official documents in Nyaunglebin township on 7 June. The action was taken under the Forest Law and Export and Import Law.

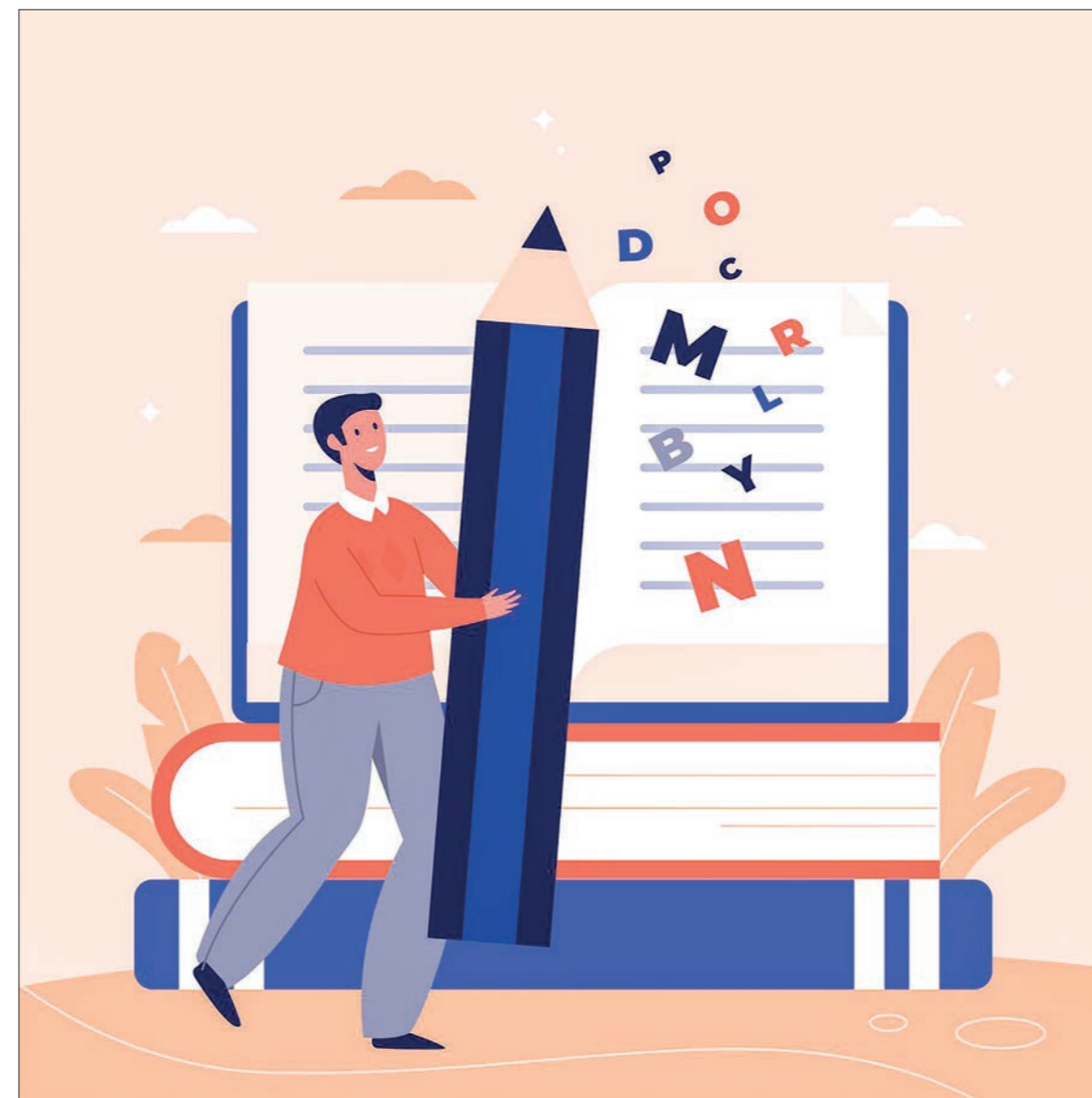

Next, the expressions 'Suddenly', 'pulled myself up carefully by the rope, keeping a foot in a coracle', 'dare not hold myself in the coracle any longer', and 'locked together in a deadly fight, each with a hand on the other's throat' is expressing the thrills and spills of an adventure story. Then, the usages 'hanging over the side near', 'with a red cap', 'in a deadly fight', 'two furious faces' and 'under the smoky lamp' plays the living story words in that distinctive story of a brave boy who took risks.

Literary Study on the Language

The expression 'a sullen, patient child, hardened perhaps to ill-treatment' has strengthened due to such these lettering as 'stand Hindley's blows without shedding a tear', and 'my pinches moved him only to draw a breath and open his eyes as well as indicating the dead character trait of the protagonist Heathcliff. Plus, the writings 'as if he had hurt himself by accidents' and 'nobody was to blame' can manage to make readers' hearts go out to Heathcliff. In addition, the participle clauses 'made old Earnshaw furious when he discovered his son Hindley persecuting the poor, fatherless child', 'believing all he said', and 'petting him up far above Cathy' point out the living character trait of Earnshaw, a minor character in the story.

Thirdly, the following paragraph is from *The Last Leaf* by O. Henry, depicting the very artist's life of making the final sacrifice, as a nice example of the writer's grammatical usages.

Old Mr Behrman was a painter who lived on the first floor beneath them. He was more than sixty years old. Behrman was a failure in art. He had always wanted to paint a masterpiece, but he had never yet begun to paint it. For many years he had painted nothing, except now and then something in the line of commercial or advertising work. He

earned a little money by serving as a model for those young artists who could not pay the price for regular models. He drank a lot of whisky and when he was drunk always talked about the great masterpiece he was going to paint. He was a fierce, intense little man who considered himself as a watchdog and protector for the two young artists living above him, of whom he was very fond.

Since the story is a past event, the tenses of the verbs used are all in the past, that is to say, 'was', 'lived', 'had always wanted to paint', 'had never yet begun to paint', 'had painted', 'earned', 'could not pay', 'drank', 'talked about', 'was going to paint', and 'considered'. What is more, in the form 'had always wanted to paint', the frequency adverb 'always' means 'for a long time', not 'at all times', for the adverb 'always' often refers to the meaning of 'for ages' if it goes with the perfect tenses. Also, care should be taken that in the form 'had never yet begun to paint', the adverb 'yet' can follow the negative word 'never' and the original sentence can be even rewritten as 'he had never begun to paint it yet' if we wish. The form 'could not pay' shows young artists' past general ability, but this form must not be written as 'were not able to pay' for the reason that the pattern 'was/were able to' is normally used for something in a specific situation. Besides, the form 'was

going to paint' says the decisive arrangement of Behrman painting his masterpiece.

Let me draw a conclusion for this article. Many readers and writers tend to think it boring or difficult to conduct a literary study, especially owing to outdated thoughts or archaisms, to my mind. Even some experienced authors, to my certain knowledge, like to advise little writers that just reading a daily newspaper is adequate to meet the basic needs of writing for a newcomer to the world of literature. That would be right to some extent for a person who has decided to earn a living as a journalist or so, as I see it. Even so, it is noticeable that every successful writer has got a mastery of both classic literature and modern literature, and they will be able to create a new way of literature or their own writing styles on condition that they have known classical ways of literature in their use in depth. When I said so, I do not mean that young writers must not read daily newspapers at all. Actually, the literary study will certainly become pleasant and enjoyable after readers have seen that universal theories from literature are still true until now, to say nothing of the writer's thoughts, or after they have studied enough literature, or after they have understood the literal meanings and connotations of archaisms. Above all, not only readers but also writers can perceive how on earth a writer's thought descriptions, vocabulary choices, and grammatical usages help his literature reach its respective subject matter and main theme. Only this perception is the essence of literary study, really.

World Oceans Day: Oceans warmer last month than any May on record

GLOBAL oceans were warmer last month than any other May in records stretching back to the 19th century, the European Union's climate monitoring unit reported Wednesday.

Sea temperatures at a depth of about 10 metres were a quarter of a degree Celsius higher than ice-free oceans in May averaged across 1991 to 2020, according to the Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S).

Year-round, long-term trends have added 0.6C to the ocean's surface waters in 40 years, said C3S deputy director Samantha Burgess, noting that April had also seen a new record for heat.

Temperatures over the ocean could be further boosted in coming months "as we are seeing the El Nino signal continuing to emerge in the equatorial Pacific," she said in a statement, referring to a periodic, natural shift in ocean winds that enhances warming globally.

Above water and over land, meanwhile, Earth's surface temperature last month tied as the second hottest for May, according to C3S.

The Copernicus finding are based on computer-generated models that draw on billions of measurements from satellites, ships, aircraft and weather stations worldwide.

Oceans, which cover 70 per cent of Earth's surface, have kept the planet liveable as global warm-

ing caused by human activity -- mainly the burning of fossil fuels -- has accelerated. The surface of the planet is, on average, 1.2C hotter than pre-industrial levels, a level which has already unleashed devastating climate impacts.

Oceans absorb a quarter of the CO2 we spew into the atmosphere, and 90 per cent of the excess heat generated by climate change. But at a terrible price.

Widespread marine heatwaves are decimating coral reefs

and the ecosystems that depend on them, including more than half a-billion people.

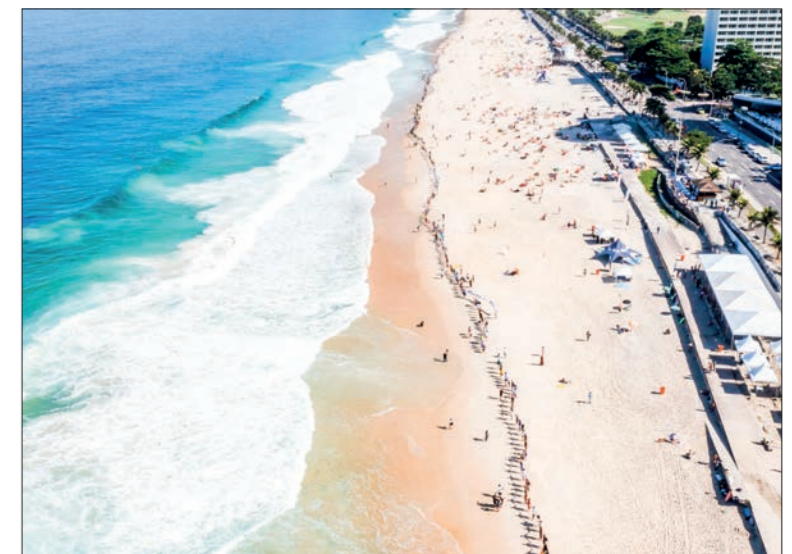
The accelerated disintegration from below of giant ice sheets could lift oceans by a dozen metres, and ocean acidification is disrupting life cycles and food chains from the tropics to the poles.

Moreover, oceans -- along with forests and soil, which soak up an even larger percentage of human-generated greenhouse gases -- are showing signs of battle fa-

ture, and their capacity to soak up CO2 could diminish.

Copernicus also reported that temperatures in several parts of the world were higher than normal, including Canada, where wildfires over the last several weeks have so far decimated more than three million hectares (eight million acres). There are 413 wildfires burning across the country from Pacific to Atlantic, including 249 deemed "out of control".

Two licencing systems for importers activate on 22 June

Over 80,000 foreign tourists visit Myanmar since early 2023

MORE than 80,000 foreign tourists have entered Myanmar since the beginning of 2023, the statistics of the Directorate of Hotels and Tourism indicate.

There were 32,992 foreign tourists with business visas, 12,402 with tourist visas, 34 with official visas, and 35,304 with other visas who entered the

country.

The monthly foreign tourist inflows in 2023 showed that 75,401 foreign tourists arrived in January and February, 2,581 tourists in March, and 2,750 tourists in April, totalling 80,732.

Over 230,000 foreign tour-

ists visited Myanmar in 2022.

Most of them were business visa holders and there were only about 11,000 entering on tourist visas, according to the 17th Annual General Meeting of the Myanmar Tourism Entrepreneurs Association on 25

February.

Cambodia begins building second expressway with assistance from China

CAMBODIA has begun building its second expressway, linking Phnom Penh to the Viet Nam border, with assistance from China, the country's largest investor. — Kyodo

The 135-kilometre-long highway is a joint project between Cambodia and China Road and Bridge Corp, a Chinese state-owned enterprise, according to the government.

The company also built Cambodia's first expressway, which connects Phnom Penh to the southern port city of Sihanoukville. Prime Minister Hun Sen attended the second highway's groundbreaking ceremony in Kandal Province, near the Cambodian capital Phnom Penh, on Wednesday and expressed his gratitude to China, adding the highway would bring "great advantages" to Cambodia and other countries in the region. — Kyodo

UK clamps down on cryptocurrency sector

BRITAIN'S financial regulator on Thursday tightened rules over the promotion and selling of cryptocurrency as it seeks to protect consumers.

The Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) unveiled a package of measures for the industry, which has long faced criticism over the lack of oversight – and promises of high returns in a volatile marketplace.

Under the new rules, companies promoting crypto products or services in Britain must from

October give a "clear warning" that customers could lose money in "high risk" investments. Marketing firms must also introduce a cooling-off period for first-time crypto investors. And the watchdog will also ban "refer a friend" bonuses that are designed to incentivise crypto investing.

"Our rules give people the time and the right risk warnings to make an informed choice," said Sheldon Mills, head of consumers and competition at the FCA. — AFP

move, following a vote on Thursday.

A parliamentary commission of inquiry will be established to shed light on how the Swiss authorities

rapidly stitched together the merger of the wealthy Alpine country's two biggest banks over a weekend in March. After the lower house of parliament voted

unanimously Wednesday in favour of creating the rare commission of inquiry, the upper chamber, or Council of States, voted 37-5 for it on Thursday. — AFP

Eurozone in recession at start of 2023

THE eurozone entered into a technical recession at the start of the year, shrinking by 0.1 per cent for a second consecutive quarter, figures from the EU's statistic agency showed Thursday.

Eurostat revised down an earlier forecast

that had predicted slight growth, after economic powerhouse Germany said last month it had fallen into recession. The worse-than-expected figures come as inflation and higher interest rates have curbed demand in Europe's largest econo-

my. Eurostat slashed its earlier prediction of 0.1 per cent growth in the final quarter of 2022 and 0.2 per cent in the first quarter of 2023 to 0.1 per cent contractions in both periods. Two consecutive quarters of shrinking gross domestic product is the threshold for a technical recession. The bad news comes after a painful year for European economies as surging energy prices sparked by Russia's war on Ukraine sent inflation spiralling.

US banks look to cut ties with UK hedge fund after sex assault claims

JPMORGAN Chase and Morgan Stanley are mulling cutting ties with British hedge fund boss Crispin Odey after allegations of sexual assault, sources familiar with the matter told AFP on Thursday. JPMorgan Chase is "reviewing our relationship with Odey Asset Management in light of the allegations in the Financial Times", said a source close to the US bank. A source close to Morgan Stanley confirmed media speculation that it wanted to sever ties. The Financial Times on Thursday pub-

lished claims from eight women alleging they had been sexually assaulted by 64-year-old Odey, a vocal Brexit supporter and Conservative party donor. A further five women alleged they had been abused or harassed by Odey, according to an FT investigation. Odey, well known for making huge sums from betting heavily against the British pound and UK government bonds in recent years, has described the allegations reported by the FT as "rubbish" and has strenuously denied them.—AFP

Govt to request Tokyo area to save power again this summer

THE Japanese government decided Friday to request households and businesses in the Tokyo area to save electricity in July and August, with the supply-demand balance forecast to become tight in the area this summer. The reserve power capacity ratio in the metropolitan area in July could drop to 3.1 percent, slightly above the lowest level for maintaining a stable supply, if a once-in-a-decade level of extreme heat grips the region served by Tokyo Electric Power Company Holdings Inc., the indus-

try ministry said. Since electricity demand could swing about three per cent from the anticipated level, it is necessary to secure at least a three-per-cent reserve, according to the

industry ministry. The government issued a nationwide power saving request from July to September last year, but the latest request only targets the area served by TEPCO.

The reserve capacity rate is projected to improve to 4.8 per cent in the Tokyo area in August while the rate in other regions is expected to stay above five per cent in July and August, a ministry official said. Economy, Trade and Industry Minister Yasutoshi Nishimura told a press conference that the government will ask for power saving efforts, such as turning off lights in unused rooms and hallways, while also calling on the public to avoid extreme measures hazardous to their health. — Kyodo

ChatGPT opened the world's eyes to the idea that computers can churn out complex, human-level content using simple prompts, giving amateurs the talents of tech geeks, artists or speechwriters.

Apple has laid low as Microsoft and Google raced out announcements on how generative AI will revolutionize its products, from online search to word processing and retouching images.—AFP

Palestinian president to visit China next week

PALESTINIAN president Mahmud Abbas will make a state visit to China next week, Beijing said on 9 June, after China expressed readiness to help facilitate Israeli-Palestinian peace talks.

Beijing has positioned itself as a mediator in the Middle East, brokering the restoration of ties in March between Iran and Saudi Arabia — rivals in a region where the United States has for decades

been the main powerbroker.

“At the invitation of President Xi Jinping, president of the state of Palestine, Mahmud Abbas will pay a state visit to China from 13 to 16 June,” foreign ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying said on Friday. “He is the first Arab head of state received by China this year, fully embodying the high level of China-Palestine good relations, which have traditionally been friendly,” ministry

spokesman Wang Wenbin told a regular briefing later.

Abbas is an “old and good friend of the Chinese people”, he added. “China has always firmly supported the just cause of the Palestinian people to restore their legitimate national rights.” Beijing has sought to boost its ties to the Middle East, challenging long-standing US influence there — efforts that have drawn rebukes from Washington. — AFP

A self-driving electric ferry set sail in Stockholm on Thursday, making the Swedish capital the world's first city to put the technology to use, the company behind it said.

A captain oversees the autonomous craft but doesn't need to touch the controls, and from

Monday, the MF Estelle will begin plying short routes between islands in Stockholm.

Torghatten CEO Stein Andre Herigstad-Olsen said that eventually, the idea is to make the vessel “fully autonomous”, with no need for an onboard supervisor.

The system already “sees like a captain”, he said.

The boat is fitted with radar, cameras, lidar laser and ultrasonic systems, compiling the data to steer its course, the Norwegian company's operative chief Erik Nilsson said. — AFP

Indonesia's Anak Krakatoa volcano erupts, spews huge ash column

INDONESIA'S Anak Krakatoa volcano erupted on Friday, belching a column of ash more than three kilometres into the sky, officials said. The volcanic island emerged from the sea at the beginning of the last century from the crater formed after the 1883 eruption of Mount Krakatoa — one of the deadliest and most destructive in history. Anak Krakatoa, which means “Child of Krakatoa”, spewed thick ash over the strait that separates the islands of Java and Sumatra. There were no immediate reports of damage or casualties after the eruption at 8:46 am (0146 GMT).

“The height of the eruption column was observed to be 3,000 metres (nearly 10,000 feet) above the summit,” Deny Mardiono, an official from the Krakatoa monitoring station, said in a press release. — AFP

Sudan declares UN envoy Volker Perthes 'persona non grata'

THE Sudanese government has declared United Nations envoy Volker Perthes “persona non grata”, two weeks after the army chief accused him of stoking the country's civil conflict and sought to have him removed from his post. Since late last year, Perthes and the UN mission he heads in war-torn Sudan have been targeted by military and Islamist-backed protests denouncing perceived foreign interference.

In a letter to the UN last month, Sudan's de facto leader General Abdel Fattah al-Burhan blamed the envoy for exacerbating fighting between his army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) led by commander Mohamed Hamdan Daglo. — AFP

Active combat' in southern Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia region

FIGHTING raged between Ukrainian and Russian troops on Friday in the southern Zaporizhzhia region, according to Russian sources.

The reports come amid expectations of a major Ukrainian offensive, with some analysts saying it had already begun. “At

the moment, active combat is ongoing in the region between Orehovo and Tokmak,” Vladimir Rogov, an official with Russian occupation authorities, wrote on the Telegram messaging service, referring to a locality known in Ukrainian as Orikhiv.

Alexander Sladkov, a Rus-

sian conflict correspondent, wrote on Telegram of “intense fighting” in the area. — AFP

Havana denies report of plans for Chinese spy base in Cuba

THE Havana government on Thursday denied US news reports that it has reached a deal for China to set up a spying base in Cuba, just off American shores.

Cuba's deputy foreign minister said the reports by The Wall Street Journal and CNN were "mendacious and unfounded". The White House called them inaccurate.

The reports said Beijing and Havana have entered into a secret agreement for a Chinese electronic eavesdropping facility to be set up on the Caribbean island that could monitor communications across the south-eastern United States.

The region includes the US Southern and Central Command

headquarters, both in Florida.

China will pay Cuba "several billion dollars" to be able to construct the facility, the Journal said, citing unnamed US officials.

But Cuban Deputy Foreign Minister Carlos Fernandez de Cossio, reading a statement to journalists, called the reports "totally mendacious and unfounded".

He said Cuba rejects all foreign military presence in Latin America, "including the many US bases and troops."

"Slander of this kind is often fabricated by US officials," the official said.

White House national security spokesman John Kirby characterized the Journal story as inaccurate. — AFP

New Madrid museum showcases Spain's royal treasures

A new museum packed with hundreds of treasures collected by Spain's monarchs over the past five centuries is set to open in Madrid this month.

Located just across from the Royal Palace, the Royal Collections Gallery, which opens on 29 June, will showcase paintings, tapestries, furniture and elaborately decorated carriages.

Most of the 650 works that will go on display have not previously been accessible to the public or were sitting in quiet corners of historic sites across Spain. "There are works that come from palaces or monasteries and here we promote another way of looking at them,"

the museum's director Leticia Ruiz Gomez said.

Among the highlights is a painting by one of Spain's most emblematic historical masters, Diego Velazquez, depicting a horse rearing up without a rider.

"White Horse" was last shown to the public in 2015 during a temporary exhibition in Paris.

The rest of the time "it sat in a corner of a room in the Royal Palace," said Ruiz Gomez.

Nearby is a massive 16th-century tapestry once owned by Spain's Queen Isabella which the culture ministry bought in February for one million euros (\$1.1 million). — AFP

EU refugee reform deal 'unacceptable': Hungary PM

HUNGARIAN Prime Minister Viktor Orban on Friday slammed as "unacceptable" a European Union agreement to revise the bloc's rules on member states hosting asylum seekers and migrants.

"Brussels is abusing its power. They want to relocate migrants to Hungary with force. This is unacceptable, they want to forcefully turn Hungary into a migrant country," Orban wrote on Facebook.

The agreement reached by EU interior ministers in Luxembourg on Thursday revised the bloc's rules on sharing the hosting of asylum seekers and migrants more equitably.

The deal — which needed approval from a majority of countries representing at least 65 per cent of the bloc's population — comes after years of wrangling

over asylum policy.

The proposal introduced at the meeting on Thursday called for compulsory help between EU countries, but with an option of doing that in one of two ways.

The priority is for EU countries to share the hosting of asylum-seekers, taking in many that arrive in nations on the bloc's outer rim, mainly Greece and Italy.—AFP

Japan revises law to ease deportation of failed asylum seekers

JAPAN enacted an immigration law on Friday allowing the government to deport failed asylum seekers, despite pushback from opposition parties and rights groups.

Until the revised legislation was passed, applicants could stay

in Japan during the decision process, regardless of the number of attempts they made to secure refugee status.

Now they can be deported after three rejections. The revised law will "protect those who must be protected while strictly

dealing with people who have violated rules", Justice Minister Ken Saito has said. "There are many people who misuse the application system to avoid deportation," even if they are not fleeing danger or persecution, according to Saito.—AFP

The Republic of the Union of Myanmar State Administration Council: Twelve Objectives

- (b) To respect and promote the customs and traditions of all National people and preserve and safeguard their faiths, beliefs, culture, and characteristics of patriotic nationalism.
- (c) To strengthen basic health care in order to achieve the emergence of a health system that enhances the longevity and health of the entire nation.
- (d) To comprehensively promote the education sector to make it capable of producing the human resources necessary for building a modern, developed, and progressive democratic nation.

Fans face wait for Messi in Miami shirt

LIONEL Messi is unlikely to make his debut for Inter Miami before late July and fans will have to wait some time even for the formal presentation of the player.

Messi announced on Wednesday that he had made his mind up over his next destination after letting his contract with Paris Saint Germain expire.

His words that "I've taken the decision that I am going to Miami" set off a wave of excitement among fans in the United

States.

But Messi followed up that bombshell by stating "I don't have (the deal) 100 percent sealed" and that caveat, along with existing commitments to the Argentine national team, is why his fans in the States will have to be patient.

While ticket prices for upcoming games that could involve Messi are already rocketing and the player's global fan base flocks to the social media accounts of Inter Miami, plenty of work remains to be done on the deal, a person familiar with the negotiations told AFP.—AFP
