UNION Minister for Border Affairs Lt-Gen Tun Tun Naung inspected the construction work of the new RC double-storey annexe at Nagmon People's Hospital in Kachin State on 29 December, comprising the outpatient department and intensive care unit, and comforted the patients receiving medical treatments.

After that, the Union Minister gave the instruction to officials that the patient who is being treated at the hospital with chronic kidney disease be transported to the general hospitals for medical examination and treatment.

At Kasanthi suspension bridge in Nampandam village, he fulfilled requirements for the necessary maintenance.

At the Basic Education High School (Nagmon), the Union min-

ister donated laptop computers and printers and inspected city water supply works.

In the afternoon, the Union minister visited the historic Kaunghmulon Pagoda in PutaO and discussed the maintenance and repair of the pagoda premises. The ministry is carrying out construction of the passage rounded at Kaunghmulon and replicas of Shwezigon and Shwedagon pagodas.

After that, Union minister viewed progress of a concrete road undertaken by the Ministry of Border Affairs in the PutaO

The PutaO Plain circular road is 25 miles long and connects 28 villages and farms. The concrete road, which was implemented by the Ministry of

Monastic Education School, he donated foodstuffs and others to the Sayadaw for convenience of students. On 30 December, the Union Minister visited the 24-mile and 7-furlong road upgrading work for Upper Samkhaung-Lonnadam-Ziyadam road and the 240-foot bridge over the Mular Creek,

which will effectively contribute to the development of tourism in PutaO.

Let's Search for A Common Platform to Walk on Together

'e humans are mysterious beings with inconceivable potentialities. Noble characteristics and criminal tendencies are latent within us. These may rise to the surface of our life at any time unexpectedly without using strength and power. These are dormant within us in various degrees. Within the powerful complex machinery of man's mind, we find a treasure storehouse of virtue and rubbish heap of wickedness. By developing these respective characteristics, we may become either a blessing or a curse to humanity. If we wish to sublimate ourselves to the noble service of humanity, we must endeavour our best to remove the latent evils and cultivate the dormant seed of virtue. To discover invaluable treasure latent within us, righteous patience and persistent effort are essential. Even the poorest people can accomplish this task. Thus, wealth and power are not essential prerequisites to the accumulation of human


One powerful destructive vice within us is anger (Dosa). The constructive virtue that can eliminate this evil force and ennoble mankind is loving-kindness (MettÈ). Cruelty (HiÑsa) is another vice that is responsible for many horrors and atrocities prevalent in the world today. Compassion (KaruÓÈ) is its antidote. Jealousy (IssÈ) is another vice that is a poison to every system of the world. The poisonous jealousy leads to unhealthy rivalries and dangerous competitions. The most effective remedy for this poisonous drug is appreciative joy (MuditÈ). Two other universal characteristics that upset the mental equipoise of a man are attachment to the pleasurable things and aversion to the un-pleasurable things. Developing equanimity (UpekkhÈ) can eliminate these two opposite forces. These four sterling virtues may be rendered by modes of Noble Conduct or Noble Abodes. These four noble conducts are capable of elevating the world if mankind is so wills on them. If all mankind tries to cultivate these conducts, irrespective of creed, colour, race or sex, the world can be transformed into a supreme paradise where we all can live in perfect peace and harmony as ideal citizens of one world. So, we should also extend these four noble virtues towards all living beings without exception. Consequently, these virtues can be called boundless noble spirit. Irrespective or religious beliefs, everyone should cultivate these sweet virtues and be a blessing to oneself and all others.

The development of loving-kindness softens people's hearts. In the organization of nations, instead of providing military aid, we should give the pure aid of loving-kindness to the helpless world. It is defined as the sincere wish for the welfare and genuine happiness of all mankind without making distinction between ourselves and others. "Just as a mother protects her only child even at the risk of her own life, even so one should cultivate boundless loving-kindness towards all living beings". Therefore, loving-kindness of mothers is not the passionate love towards her child. Even so, our love towards other nations or other countries must be a sincere wish and pure love for the genuine peace and welfare of the

world. We should extend the boundless universal brother-hood and sisterhood spirit without barriers in the differences of political views and religious beliefs.

The loving-kindness, which is a sincere wish for the genuine peace and welfare of the world, is not political, racial, national, or even a religious brotherhood. Political brotherhood is confined only to those who share similar political views, such as the partial brotherhood of Democrats, Socialists, Communists, and so on. Racial brotherhood and national brotherhood are restricted only to those of same race and nation. Very often to assert their racial or political superiority, they resort to brutal warfare and killing of people by mercilessly raining bombs from the sky above. The pathetic incidents of the Second World War are striking as examples, which can never be forgotten by mankind. Acts of violence and terrorism should be denounced, and harmonious relations should be established with the people of different background and faiths.

Loving-kindness (MettÈ) is not mere religious brotherhood either. Owing to the limitations of religious brotherhood, religious disputes and so called holy wars are waged without the least compassion; sincere outspoken men and women have been roasted and burnt alive. Many atrocities have been perpetrated which baffle description. Cruel wars have been waged, marring the historic pages of world history. To establish genuine peace and happiness amongst mankind, a sincere religious awaking and harmony are necessary in this morally bankrupt world. So we



must carefully establish a pure and useful life of love, reason and justice based on the noble principle of their respective teachers and leaders.

The Buddha addressed, "Hatred never ceases through hatred, but hatred ceases by love alone. This is the essence of the ancient and eternal law." As loving-kindness is a constructive peaceful force, it has the power to counteract destructive influences. Just as hateful thoughts can produce toxic effects in any system or policy, even so loving thoughts can produce healthy, wealthy mental and physical effects. The Buddha emphatically stated the importance of morality as a means to overcome tensions and difficulties, to solve the problems of humanity. We should exercise right thought of selflessness, loving-kindness, compassion and harmlessness or non-violence.

Today's world is full of a chaos, miseries, war-weariness, and violence; the na-

tions are arming themselves to the teeth. Human lives are in danger and frightened by the arms race between great countries or G countries. These weapons are always ready to release and to kill many human lives at any moment. In fact, the world is absolutely in need of this universal loving-kindness, measureless compassion, sympathetic joy, great tolerance and right vision in order for all of us to live in one world in perfect peace and harmony like brothers and sisters.

We should develop sincere love to kill the enemy of the world, which is hatred. We should develop invaluable compassion to remove the woe of nations, which is cruelty. We should develop appreciative joy to protest from the poisoning of all systems, which is jealousy. We should develop the mental equipoise of man to eliminate attachment to pleasurable situations and aversion to un-pleasurable situations.







An extensive body of research you to make meaning out of a shows benefits to writing about a traumatic experience or difficult situation in a manner that psychologists refer to as "expressive writing." According to psychology professor James Pennebaker, people who do this, recording their deepest thoughts and feelings, often show improved mental and physical health. Pennebaker pioneered the scientific study of expressive writing as a coping mechanism to deal with trauma in the 1980s.

Professor Pennebaker says that hundreds of studies over several decades have looked at the potential benefits of expressive writing and found that it can strengthen the Immune system, including for people with illnesses such as cancer, depression, asthma and arthritis. Research also found that it can help reduce chronic pain and inflammation and improve mood, sleep and memory. And it may even help reduce symptoms

Experts say that expressive He is in good company. writing works because it allows painful experience. Jotting down your thoughts can be good for your health. Recognizing that something is bothering you is an important first step. Translating that experience into language forces you to organize your thoughts. And creating a narrative gives you a sense of

He uses an expressive writing protocol he helped design, called Written Exposure Therapy, with war veterans.

Why write?

Thinking and talking about an event can lead to ruminating, where you get lost in your emotions. But writing focuses you on slowing down, says Dr Joshua Smyth, distinguished professor of biobehavioral health and medicine at Pennsylvania Street University, who studies expressive writing. The mere acts of labelling a feeling of putting words to emotion can dampen the neural activity in the threat area of the brain, says psychology professor Dr Annette Stanton. Her research suggests that expressive writing can lead to lower depressive symptoms, greater positive mood and an enhanced appreciation for life." of the exercise is to find meaning in an unsettling event. Yanatha Desouvre initially

turned to expressive writing about 15 years ago, after the break up of what he says was an unhealthy relationship. He wrote to understand why it made him feel vulnerable and sometimes physically ill. "You can keep things bottled up," he says. "It will make you sick."

The writing brought up an older trauma as well. When he was nine, he says, he survived a shooting in a barber shop in New York. He had nightmares about it over the years but tried look at emails or social media. not to focus on it. He started writing about it, then kept going. It helped. As he wrote, Desouvre asked himself how he felt about the traumas of his life and what they revealed. It was painful, he says. "But when I acknowledged the pain, I was able to see the courage I did not know I had," Pick your medium

HE commodity prices have highly fluctuated and broken records with the highest prices in the Yangon commodity market in 2023 compared to recent years.

Prices of black gram, pigeon pea, rice, Kyukok garlic, Shan garlic, sugar, jaggery, sugarcane, and potato skyrocketed with record-breaking prices this year.

Chilli, which reached the highest price in 2022, encountered very low prices in 2023 which led the traders to experience net losses.

There was an unusual encounter with the palm oil market in mid-2023.

The prices of tamarinds have been stable for three consecutive years.

Although the traders who keep stocks of the varieties of the commodities gained

profits in 2023, chilli and tamarind traders experienced losses.

Moreover, the year 2023 will yield more profits for the crop farmers.

Onion

Although the prices of old onion, on 2 December 2022, once peaked at K4,000-K4,700-K5,100 per viss and on 9 December 2022, the prices of rainy Myittha new onion were K3,700-K4,300-K4,500-K4,700 whereas Myingyan onion was K3,100-K3,900-K4,200-K4,400 per viss, prices of old onion on 12 December 2023 increased to K3,300-K4,300-K4,800-K5,100 per viss.

On 21 December, prices of Mying-yan rainy onion (new) K2,000-K3,200-K3,400-K4,000 whereas Myittha onion was priced at K3,100-K3,900-K4,200-K4,700.

Summer onions were priced at K1,350-K1,575-K1,600-K1,350 per viss in late April 2023. Traders who keep onions gained fewer profits in 2023 rather than in 2022.

The farmers who grow monsoon onions gained more K1,500 per viss this year compared to that of 2022.

Before 2022, the peak prices of onions in the Yangon market were K3,700/3,800 per viss for large sizes in early December of 2015 and 2019. Onion exports in 2023 are fewer than that in 2022.

Garlic

The garlic prices skyrocketed at peak on 3 November 2023 as Kyukok garlic was priced at K16,000/K17,000 per viss whereas Shan Aungban garlic was priced at K12,000-K13,000-K14,000-K15,000 per viss. On 29 November, Kyukok garlic was priced at K10,000 per viss while Shan garlic (special size) was increased at K16,500-K17,000 per viss.

Thus, wholesale prices of both types

of garlic in 2023 peaked at K17,000 per viss. It was four times higher than that of the highest prices usually trended in regular years.

Potato

It is unusual that in the daily reference rates for potatoes at the Yangon commodity market, Shan potato prices were not shown up to the middle of the year; only the prices of Chinese potatoes were displayed.

Chinese potato peaked at K4,200 per viss on 15 November as the record-breaking price for the whole potato market.

In late 2023, the potato prices were downward trending as the sandy old potato was priced at K2,600 per viss whereas red soiled new Chinese potato was priced at K2,450 per viss.

Chilli

The chilli, which marked a peak price in 2022, declined prices in 2023 despite skyrocketing prices of many commodities in 2023. Those who kept stocks of chilli in 2022 gained K10,000 per viss in profit.

However, many chilli traders encountered fewer profits in 2023.

In late 2022, both bell peppers and chilli with cold storage were priced at K31,000 per viss; Moehtaung chilli with cold storage was priced at K19,500 per viss; and long chilli with cold storage was priced at K21,000 per viss. In late 2023, bell pepper with cold storage was priced at K23,000/ 24,000 per viss and another type was priced at K19,500 per viss.

In the middle of 2023, the price of the Moehtaung chilli with cold storage was K16,000 per viss; the new Moehtaung chilli was priced at K9,500 in late November, K10,500-K11,000 on 29 December. The price of Shan Moehtaung chilli (new) was priced

at K11,500 per viss in late December.

The Sinphyukyun bell pepper in late 2022 was K29,000 per viss in the market. However, it declined to K19,000 per viss in late 2023.

In late 2023, prices of bell peppers were Chinese bell pepper K19,500 per viss, zee bell pepper K14,500 per viss while Tharzi bell pepper (new) was K16,000 per viss.

Long chilli processed with cold storage was priced at K15,500 per viss in late 2023 whereas reddish pink long chilli from the Salin region was at K13,500 per viss on 29 December.

The Shan long chilli (new) was priced at K9,500 per viss in early December. However, it increased to K12,000 per viss on 29 December.

Rice

Prices of both smooth rice and rough rice skyrocketed this year.

In late 2023, a bag of Pawsan rice (old) from Ayeyawady Region was K150,000; from Shwebo was K170,000-K180,000; Pawsan rice (new) from Ayeyawady Region was K110,000-K120,000; from Shwebo was K140,000.

A bag of Pawkywe rice (new) was K100,000; (old) was K105,000; 90-day rough rice (old) was K95,000; double-cropping rice (old) was K82,000; monsoon rough rice (new) K68,000-K78,000.

In early January 2023, a bag of rough rice (new) was – 90-days rice (K49,000) and Pawkywe (K56,000); Pawsan in late 2022 was K72,000.

Pawsan rice from Ayeyawady Region was K65,000 per bag in late 2022. Therefore, the rice prices doubled in 2023.

The prices of reasonable rice that were sold by the rice NGO in early August

2022 to the consumers were – rough rice (K35,000-K37,000) per bag; Pawsan rice from Ayeyawady Region K52,000/K55,000, and Shwebo rice K75,000-K77,000.

However, the prices of rice sold by the rice NGO in early August of 2023 were – rough rice K60,000/K65,000, Ayeyawady Pawsan K94,000-K97,000 and Shwebo K110,000-K120,000.

Consumers encountered high rice prices in 2023; traders gained more profits than farmers in 2023.

Sugar/jaggery

In early 2023, sugar price was K2,550-K2,650 per viss; raw jaggery from Pakkoku was K3,200 per viss; Yesagyo white jaggery was K3,700 per viss; and sugarcane K2,800 per viss. On 29 December, prices of sugar were K3,930 per viss; raw jaggery from Pakokku was K5,000 per viss; Yesagyo white jaggery was K5,800 per viss; and sugarcane K4,300 per viss.

Palm oil

Authorities took action against those who sold the palm oil at higher prices than the reference wholesale rate. The domestic distribution of palm oil was changed in the system commencing from early December. The palm oil for states and regions was directly offered by Yangon edible oil tanks to the respective districts.

The long queues that were waiting to purchase palm oil at Yangon Bayintnaung and Lanmadaw Nyaungpinlay market are observed vanishing. The reference wholesale price of palm oil in early 2023 was K4,770 per viss while it was K4,955 per viss in late 2023.

In early 2023, the palm oil price at the external market was K5,250 per viss. It was K9,000 per viss in the middle of the year. However, palm oil price at the external market was not publicized in late 2023 since selling at the external market was taken action.

The price of palm oil in the international market was US\$965 per ton in early 2023. It was US\$840 in late 2023.

Beans and pulses

On 23 December, black gram RC was K3,010,000 per ton; the price of pigeon pea was peaked at K4,150,000 per ton on 8 September.

However, black gram RC one ton was priced at K2,962,500 on 29 December 2023; red pigeon pea was at K3,250,000 per ton; green gram from Pakkoku was at K2,660-K2,920 per viss; Khayan Shwewah K3,750 per viss; and the price of chickpea was at K6,050-K6,250 per viss.

On 8 August, the price of green gram from Pakokku was at K3,660-K3,750 per viss; the highest prices in 2023 were Khayan Shwewah K4,000 on 9 June; and chick pea was K6,050-K6,250 per viss on 29 December.

Significant events and news diary in 2023

- The YCX marine product transportation process that links four ASEAN countries including Myanmar was launched. The service is available for Singapore-Port Klang-Yangon-Yangon-Port Klang-Singapore-Sihanoukville-Singapore routes. Along the route, it will connect Singapore, Port Klang of Malaysia, Yangon, Port Klang, Singapore, Sihanoukville Port of Cambodia, and Singapore.
- Green Power Energy announced the completion of the Taungtawkwin solar power plant established in Thanywa village of Myitha of Mandalay Region. The plant will generate 25 Megawatts per year and a total of 45,980 solar plates are installed. The solar tracking system is also installed to maximize photovoltaic (PV) energy from the sun.

Google agrees to settle \$5 bln consumer privacy lawsuit

Google has reached a preliminary settlement in a consumer privacy lawsuit that sought a minimum of \$5 billion in damages over allegations of tracking user data during private browsing.

GOOGLE has agreed to settle a consumer privacy lawsuit seeking at least \$5 billion in damages over allegations it tracked the data of users who thought they were browsing privately.

In a court filing, the judge confirmed that lawyers for Google reached a preliminary agreement to settle the class action lawsuit — originally filed in 2020 — which claimed that "millions of individuals" had likely been affected.

Lawyers for the plaintiffs

were seeking at least \$5,000 for each user it said had been tracked by the firm as they visited Google Analytics or Ad Manager in "private browsing mode" while not logged into their Google account.

This would have amounted to at least \$5 billion.

Google and lawyers for the consumers did not immediately respond to a request for comment

The lawsuit, filed in a California court, claimed Google's

practices had infringed on users' privacy by "intentionally" deceiving them.

The original complaint alleged that Google and its employees had been given the "power to learn intimate details about individuals' lives, interests, and internet usage."

"Google has made itself an unaccountable trove of information so detailed and expansive that George Orwell could never have dreamed it," it added. No figure was given for the preliminary

settlement between the parties.

A formal settlement is ex-

pected for court approval by 24 February 2024. — AFP

Spain extends some anti-inflation measures into 2024

The extended measures include a continued reduction or elimination of the value-added tax (VAT) on essential food items like fruits, vegetables, pasta, and cooking oils for the first half of 2024.

SPAIN'S leftist government on Wednesday extended into 2024 some of the measures it put in place to help households cope with a surge in living costs, including lower tax on food.

Socialist Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez, who was reappointed to another term in November, said the measures aim to "improve people's lives" at a time of uncertainty caused by Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the Israel-Hamas conflict.

Among the measures which will be extended is the elimination or reduction of the value-added tax on certain basic food items such as fruits and vegetables, pasta and cooking oils during the first half of 2024, he said.

The government will also extend free commuter rail travel until the end of next year but will start phasing out a reduction in the VAT on electricity and gas bills during the first half of 2024 since energy prices have fallen, he added.

Sanchez's government first

put in place a series of measures to help households cope with soaring prices in 2022 after Russia's invasion of Ukraine that year sent consumer prices soaring.

Spanish inflation hit a record 10.8 per cent in July 2022, its highest level since 1985, but has since eased. It stood at 3.2 per cent in November although the cost of food continues to rise at a much faster pace.

The measures, which will cost

state coffers around 2.5 billion euros (\$2.8 billion) in 2024, will not deter Spain from reducing its debt and public deficit, Sanchez said.

To help pay for them, the government will extend a controversial windfall tax introduced in 2023 on banks and energy companies by an extra year.

The tax, which is set to raise about three billion euros this year, will now also be payable in both 2024 and 2025. — AFP

PIA privatization plan fails due to its financial obligations

THE privatization plan of Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) has faced setbacks for the upcoming year as the privatization commission couldn't resolve issues related to loan repayments and legal matters, ARY News reported on Thursday.

It reported citing sources that the interim federal minister for privatization, Fawad Hussain Fawad failed to implement to transfer of PIA to the private sector by January 2024.

PIA has borrowed more than Pakistan rupee (PKR) 270 billion from the commercial banks on government guarantee. The Ministry of Finance will decide to meet the financial requirements of the PIA for the next three months. — ANI


Xi says to continuously consolidate, develop China-Russia ties serves fundamental interests of both countries

THE development of China-Russia relations in the past three-quarters of a century has shown that to continuously consolidate and develop bilateral relations featuring permanent good-neighbourly friendship, comprehensive strategic coordination and mutually beneficial cooperation serves the fundamental interests of the two countries and peoples, meets the expectations of the international community and conforms to the trend of the times, Chinese President Xi Jinping said on Sunday.

Xi made the remarks as he exchanged messages of New Year greetings with his Russian counterpart, Vladimir Putin.

On behalf of the Chinese government and people, Xi extended sincere congratulations and best wishes to Putin and the Russian people.

Xi said that in the face of changes unseen in a century and volatile international and regional situations, China-Russia relations have always maintained healthy and stable devel-

Under the two leaders' joint guidance, the two sides have further deepened political mutual trust, strengthened strategic coordination and achieved new results in mutually beneficial cooperation, Xi said. — Xinhua

Türkiye hopes to reap benefits of economic U-turn over 2024

AFTER years of wrestling with soaring inflation and a battered currency, Türkiye hopes the turnaround of the economic policy in 2023 will pave the way for a sustained recovery in 2024. But experts warn the journey will be long and arduous.

The country lurched from ultra-loose monetary policy to fiscal orthodoxy this year, with a new financial team led by Treasury and Finance Minister Mehmet Simsek taking the helm in early summer.

Aggressive interest rate hikes since June have sent the policy rate skyrocketing from 8.5 per cent to 42.5 per cent in just seven months, offering a glimmer of hope for the country to rein in the rampaging inflation.

"The tightening we've seen since June sets the stage for what's next," said Arda Tunca, an independent economist from Istanbul. "We can expect these measures to start impacting inflation in the second

half of 2024 finally."

He warned, however, that monetary policy alone won't suffice, adding that structural reforms are crucial to building resilience against inflationary pressures and addressing Türkiye's stark income disparities.

Thousands protest in Serbia alleging election fraud by governing party

IN the largest protest over this month's parliamentary and municipal elections, thousands of protesters have gathered in Serbia's capital, calling for the annulment of the results and accusing President Aleksandar Vucic's governing party of perpetrating an election fraud, according to Al Jazeera.

The massive gathering in the heart of Belgrade on Saturday capped almost two weeks of protests in the streets over major irregularities that were reportedly observed during the vote on 17 December and were also observed by foreign observers.

Preliminary results from the state election commission showed that the ruling Serbian Progressive Party (SNS) had 46.72 per cent of the votes and was proclaimed the election winner. — ANI

India-UAE joint military exercise 'Desert Cyclone' to be held in Rajasthan

THE Joint Military Exercise 'Desert Cyclone 2024' between India and UAE will be held from 2 January to 15 January in Rajasthan.

The joint drills under 'Desert Cyclone 2024' will aim to enhance interoperability by learning and sharing best practices in urban operations.

India and the UAE enjoy strong bonds of friendship which are founded on millennia-old cultural, religious and economic intercourse between the two regions.

According to the Ministry of External Affairs, potential areas of bilateral cooperation in the defence field are the production and development of defence equipment; joint exercises of armed forces, particularly naval exercises; sharing of information on strategy and doctrines; technical cooperation in respect of Intermediate Jet Trainer etc. — ANI

Brazil unveils national cybersecurity policy

BRAZILIAN President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva signed a decree on Thursday establishing the National Cybersecurity Policy (PNCiber) to promote national security related to cyber or virtual reality.

According to the decree published in the Official Gazette, the National Cybersecurity Committee (CNCiber) holds the responsibility of proposing updates to both the PNCiber and its mechanisms, including the National Cybersecurity Strategy and the National Cybersecurity Plan.

CNCiber will also be in charge of suggesting collaboration strategies for international technical cooperation on cybercrime.

"The PNCiber is a proposal aimed at unifying the existing regulatory mosaic, minimizing the growing number of incidents that affect the country, which cause huge losses for Brazilian society," the decree said.

The policy will include the adoption of regulatory measures and oversight mechanisms to promote cybersecurity in the country, as well as the development of national products, services and technologies oriented toward cybersecurity. — Xinhua

"I'm really proud of that performance".

In other first-round matches, there were wins for Ukraine's Marta Kostyuk over Romanian Ana Bogdan 4-6, 6-3, 6-3, and Italian Camila Giorgi, who beat American Peyton Stearns 5-7, 6-2, 6-3.

Australian wildcard Arina Rodionova upset higher-ranked Italian Martina Trevisan 6-3, 6-2, while Anna Kalinskaya downed American Bernarda Pera 6-2, 6-1. Russian teenager Mirra Andreeva beat countrywoman Diana Shnaider 6-2, 6-3. Former world number one Naomi Osaka begins her comeback on Monday when she plays Germany's Tamara Korpatsch. — AFP

The 37-year-old was France's first-choice 'keeper when they won the 2018 World Cup by beating Croatia in the final and also played in the epic 2022 final which the French lost to Argentina on penalties. Lloris fell out of favour at Tottenham last season after a series of poor performances. — AFP

Nadal leaves door open to playing beyond 2024

Rafael Nadal hints at the possibility of continuing beyond the 2024 season but acknowledges a high likelihood that his current visit to Australia may be his last as a player.

RAFAEL Nadal left the door ajar Sunday to continuing after the 2024 season, but conceded there was "a high percentage" that he was on his last trip as a player to Australia.

Speaking ahead of his comeback from a 12-month injury absence at the season-opening Brisbane International, the 37-year-old Spaniard said he did not know for sure what the future held.

"The problem about saying that's going to be my last season is I can't predict what's going on 100 percent in the future," he said.

"That's why I say 'probably'. It's obvious it's a high percentage that it's going to be my last time playing here in Australia.

"But if I am here next year,

don't tell me, 'You said it was going to be your last season', because I didn't say it.

"You never know what's going on, you know? I can't predict how I'm going to be in the next six months. I can't predict if my body will allow me to enjoy tennis as much as I enjoyed the past 20 years. — AFP

Iran to work on dedollarization of trade transactions within BRICS

Joint missions and work with other BRICS nations are planned, focusing on dedollarization of trade, economic transactions, and financial cooperation.

IRAN, like other BRICS members, will work on the dedollarization of trade, economic and financial transactions within the group of major emerging economies, and some efforts in this direction are already underway, Iranian Deputy Foreign Minister Ali Bagheri Kani told Sputnik.

"We have planned many missions and joint work with other BRICS members within the framework of this organization. One of the most important tasks is the dedollarization of trade and economic transactions and financial cooperation. Activities in this field of work of BRICS have already started, we hope to strengthen and expand these activities in order to achieve this goal as soon as possible," the diplomat said.

BRICS, established in 2009, is a group uniting the world's largest de-

veloping economies, which currently includes Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa. In August, the 15th top-level BRICS summit in Johannesburg extended invitations to Argentina, Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia to join the bloc. Their full membership, except for Argentina, is scheduled to take effect on 1 January 2024. — SPUTNIK

Netanyahu says Israeli operation in Gaza Strip will last for many more months

ISRAELI Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said on Saturday that the military operation in the Gaza Strip will last for many more months, as well as warned Lebanon's Hezbollah movement against expanding the scale of its attacks on Israel.

"The campaign in the Gaza Strip will last for many more months," Netanyahu told a press conference.

He added that the Israeli operation will last until all its goals, including the destruction of the Hamas movement, are achieved.

"If Hezbollah expands the scale of the confrontation, we will carry out strikes that neither Hezbollah nor Iran can imagine," Netanyahu stated.

Earlier this month, White House National Security Council spokesman John Kirby said that the United States agrees with the Israeli assessment that the ongoing conflict in Gaza could go on for several months, adding that it is important that Israeli strikes become more targeted and precise.

On 7 October Palestinian movement Hamas launched a large-scale rocket attack against Israel from the Gaza Strip, while its fighters breached the border, opening fire on the military and civilians. As a result, over 1,200 people in Israel were killed and some 240 others abducted. — SPUTNIK

Eurostar to resume normal services Sunday after cancellations

Eurostar assures normal services on Sunday after a full day of cancellations due to flooded tunnels, causing distress for New Year travellers.

EUROSTAR trains will run as normal Sunday, the company said, hours after an entire day's services had to be cancelled, causing misery for tens of thousands of New Year travellers.

Saturday's massive disruption left some travellers in tears as they arrived at London's St Pancras Station to discover that two flooded tunnels in southern England had blocked the high-speed rail line to the continent.

Other travellers were left stranded in mainland Europe.

Earlier, High Speed 1 (HS1), which runs the railway line, had warned the volume of water in the tunnels was "unprecedented" and would take time to clear.
